Billion\$ sent home last year

A report released on Mar. 8 by the Multilateral Investment Fund (MIF). a member of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) group, said that Latin American and Caribbean migrants sent US\$61 billion in remittances to their home countries last year.

The report said the latest figure represents a 6 percent increase from US\$57.6 billion in 2010, confirming the upward trend in migrants' money transfers that started in mid-2010.

The IDB said there was a "double digit drop" in remittances in 2009 as a result of the global economic crisis.

"In 2011, nearly every country in this region received a greater dollar amount in remittances than the previous year," the report said.

"For the remittance market in Latin America and the Caribbean, 2011 was a year of renewed growth after the 2008-2010 period, despite persistent economic uncertainty in Europe," it added.

ANGUILLA FEARS U.K. **TAKEOVER**

Leaders sense a London coup

By the time Easter rolls around, a delegation of Caribbean Community prime ministers should be in Anguilla on a mission to show support to the government and its people who say they fear that "mother country" Britain, is preparing to retake full control of the colony and impose direct rule from London, in much the same way it has done in the Turks and Caicos islands.

As an associate member of the 15-nation trade bloc, Anguilla does not have full voting rights in Caricom but Chief Minister Hubert Hughes used the opportunity at last week's two-day summit in Suriname to sound alarm bells about

what he termed as ominous signs from London that it wants full control of daily life on the island of less than 17,000 people.

He said Britain has already made it clear that it has no plans to grant greater executive autonomy like self-governance to the island, much less full independence as some islanders seem to want, because "they believe we have an abundance of oil, gas and fish life. They have deemed Anguilla now to be a valuable British asset that should not be let go, and that is the problem," he told Caribbean Life in Paramaribo.

His lobbying of the meeting has result-Continued on page 4

International leaders will give US\$65 million in concessionary loans to 18 Caribbean nations to help the islands defend their coasts and fragile economies from the impact of climate change.

The European Investment Bank will channel its lending through the Barbadosbased Caribbean Bank, Development which recently announced the initiative.

The program will provide low-cost funds for public and private sector projects that deal with climate change adaptation or help reduce carbon emissions.

The U.N. network of climate scientists projects that seas might rise as much as 1.924 feet (0.59 meters) by 2100, expanded by heat and runoff of melting land ice. Few regions in the world are as threatened from rising seas as the Caribbean.

Bahamas

The Bahamas unveiled a national stadium that China built for more than US\$50 million as the Asian country ramps up investment in the Caribbean region.

Government officials from both the Bahamas and China recently inaugurated the 15,000-seat Thomas A Robinson stadium. Sports Minister Charles Maynard said the stadium was a gift, with no strings attached.

The stadium was built using only Chinese Continued on page 18

Caribbean Disaster Relief Clusters

Groundbreaking for emergency operations center in Haiti

Haitian officials say earthquake-rav-French-speaking Caribbean county has received a significant boost with the Mar. 6 groundbreaking ceremony for a new emergency operations center, disaster relief warehouse and fire station.

Haiti's Ministry of Interior said the center, in Fort-Liberte, is the first of 10 such emergency operations centers and disaster relief warehouses, eight community clusters and 14 fire stations to be constructed throughout the country.

The Fort-Liberte facility marks the beginning of the next phase of construction under the auspices of the U.S. Southern Command's Humanitarian Assistance Program in partnership with the Government of Haiti, the statement said.

Haiti's Minister of the Interior, Thierry Mayard-Paul, who presided over the ground-breaking ceremony, said that functional emergency operations centers and disaster relief warehouses "are not only critical in saving lives and minimizing damage during disasters, they also enhance institutional capacity throughout Haiti so we can increase safety in all parts of the coun-

Daniel Foote, deputy chief of mission, U.S. Embassy, representing the U.S. Southern Command, said Haiti's civil preparedness projects have entered construction phase and are one step closer to helping the government of Haiti provide vital services to communities in the Nord-Est Department.

"This emergency operations center will allow local emergency response personnel to collect and

analyze reported information, make decisions, and manage Haiti's collective response to emergencies or natural disasters," he

By providing additional fire-fighting and emergency service capabilities to the Fort Liberte area, Foote said the fire station facility will play a "significant role" in the event of a larger-scale emergency within Haiti.

"The new facilities will also enable us, through the Civil Protection Agency (DCP), to improve the quality of life of our communities, providing vital safety services," Mayard-Paul said.

"We could not do this without the unwavering support of our friends in the United States who, through Southern Command, the embassy and USAID (United States Agency for International Development), along with the United Nations Development Program, World Food and others in the international community, help us turn necessities into plans, and plans into reality," he added.

Mavard-Paul said the new facilities will be used as soon as available, with plans to hold community first aid trainings as part of the DPC's recently-launched annual campaign, "Civil Protection is Everyone's Responsibility."

"At the Ministry of the Interior, we are following through on our commitment to identify the most pressing needs of the Haitian people, and turn those needs into plans that materialize into actual infrastructure, tools and programs that will benefit communities across the country," he said. "That is the essence of our community-based decentralization program."

G'da raises

Grenada has called for international collaboration and cooperation to effectively combat "cyber terrorism."

addressing Washington-based Organization of American States' (OAS) 12th annual meeting of the Inter-American Committee Against Terrorism (CICTE), on Mar. 7, Grenada's Permanent Representative to the OAS, Gillian Bristol, the outgoing chair of the CICTE, stressed the need for such collaboration.

"The question is no longer whether our system will get attacked, but rather when," she said. "We must be prepared.

"Responding to cyber threats does not require one government, agency or department, but cooperation and communication between entities domestically and internationally, and both in the public and private sectors, and at home, and in schools, and in centers of recreation," the envoy added.

"We must, therefore, unite in our assessment of risk and vulnerability in order to determine the potential impact of an attack on critical infrastructure, and ensure that such infrastructure is properly protected," she

Bristol said the theme of the 12th regular session "encompasses priorities, action and collaboration necessary to face this terrorist threat at the national and hemispheric levels."

OAS Secretary General José Miguel Insulza, who inaugurated the meeting to discuss and adopt a declaration on "Strengthening Cyber Security in the Americas," underscored the power of rapid technological advances to provide new and valuable services to citizens. But he noted that they also offer criminals new ways to attack.

Royalty still a hit in Jamaica



Hundreds of visitors and nationals gathered to watch the royal couple.

In Jamaica, Prince Harry honored his challenge to the Olympic sprinter and technically beat him twice at his race. In actuality, Bolt yielded to the crown prince when an

During a second attempt, Bolt coasted slowly allowing the prince victory and at least a story for the BBC to tout in his

Vincies pay tribute to favorite son

A large number of Vincentian calypsonians in New York were among the general population of expatriots in shock and sorrow over the sudden passing of Gerard "Rasum" Shallow. on the night of March 4.

Shallow, a school teacher, former calypsonian and parliamentarian, was reportedly found dead in the yard of his home in the Marriagua Valley on mainland St. Vincent.

Reports indicate that the erstwhile senator died of a heart attack. He was 52.

"It's very sad to hear about his passing," said John Dougan, president of the Dynamite Calypso Tent, the lone Vincentian calypso tent in New York, in a Caribbean Life interview.

"He was a very good writer and singer," added Dougan, who also hails from the Marriagua Valley. "Everyone was surprised about his death. He was a young fellar (fellow) and very friendly, too.'

Dougan disclosed that the Dynamite Calypso Tent will pay a special tribute to "Rasum" during the preliminary round of the calypso competition in New York on June 1.

calypsoni-Another an. Franklin "Supadex" Richards, a former president of the Dynamite Calypso Tent, said "Rasum" was one of the better calvpso writers in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

"The only person next to him is 'De Man Age' (former national calypso monarch, whose real name is Errol Winston Rose)," said Richards, who currently serves as public relations officer of the Dynamite Calypso Tent.

"His song, 'Perseverance,' is one of those songs that'll never die," he added. "The guy was a visionary.

"He'll be a great loss to St. Vincent and the Grenadines," Richards continued. "He spent most of

his life in public service giving back one way or the other.

"De Man Age," who, like "Rasum," was also a school teacher, said "Perseverance" was one of the better calypsos to be produced in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

"He ('Rasum') will be remembered for that song," he said. "It's just unfortunate that a calypsonian, like him, passed so quickly. "He was one of the best we had. He could sing. He had a good voice. He could deliver.

"Even though he stayed out (of the calypso arena for a while), he was still a top calypsonian," 'De Man Age' told Caribbean Life. "He must be remembered for his contributions in teaching and calypso."

Another calypsonian, Earl "Exposer" Isles, said he had looked up to "Rasum."

"It's sad to hear about his death," he said. "It's a great loss. He was still a young man."

Ainsley Primus, another former president of the Dynamite Calypso Tent, said "Rasum" succeeded him in becoming a member of the defunct, popular band,

"It's a great loss," said the organizer of the New Sound Calypso Competition for the Brooklyn, New York-based entertainment group, Level Vibes.

"He 'Rasum' was an intelligent guy who wrote conscious lyrics," Primus added. "When you look at 'Perseverance', it's a heavy

An online biography quoted Amos as saving that her achievement was the harbinger of a new, 21st Century era. She told a South African audience that the last vestige of colonialism had vanished and the fact "it is me standing here as a British minister, a descent of those colonized, is surely demonstration of this."

Samuel (Sam) Walton was born on Dec. 13, 1948, to Symera and Joshua Walton, in Harlem and raised on 137th St. and 8th Avenue (also known as Frederick Douglass Blvd.). He died of a kidney infection at Mt. Sinai Hospital on Fifth Ave. on Feb. 21,

Sam's life passion was documentary filmmaking and oral history of the Harlem community. He and his friend Sam Gaynor started a program called, "We Care for Self Help" in 1968 by young people who were mentored by Ken and Mamie Clark, directors of

Northside Center for Child Development.

Its mission was to foster community solidarity by bridging the intergenerational divide among Harlem residents. Over the years, he renamed the incorporation, "We Care Media Arts" and partnered with Columbia University, through its internship program in film and oral history, to record the memories of Harlem's local leaders and its older generation with Columbia film students.

His work includes a documentary celebrating the past 100 years of *Crisis* Magazine (2010); a documentary celebrating the work of Mamie and Ken Clark regarding Brown v. Board of Education (2004), a documentary honoring Ella Baker, civil rights leader (2000), and many wonderful interviews with Harlem's elite leadership over the past 30 years.

Sam also worked for the New York City Human Resources Administration for over 30 years helping others attain housing, welfare and Medicare, but his passion and reason for existence was documentary filmmaking and oral history of his beloved community of Harlem -- a craft he mastered so well.



He is survived by his loving wife Sonia, his son Songhai A. Walton of Fort Myers, Florida; two brothers. James Walton of Columbia, South Carolina and Joseph Walton of New York City; three nieces, one nephew and a host of very special family and friends.

Barbados removes visa restrictions for select Haitians

Barbados has became the latest Caribbean Community (CARICOM)-member country to remove visa restrictions for Haitian diplomats and business people seeking to travel to the island on business, according to media reports.

To date, 10 of the CARICOM-member states have signed the agreement with Haiti, aimed at helping the earthquake-ravaged country, French-speaking Caribbean country rebuild by growing its economy.

"Haiti is a member of CARICOM, and we, as members, have to facilitate our regional people," the *Miami Herald* quoted Barbados' Foreign Minister Maxine McClean as saving.

"Certainly, a good place to start is with businessmen, especially at this time," she added. "It is important that they be able to move around the region."

The paper said McClean signed on behalf of Barbados, while Haiti's CARICOM Special Envoy John P. Alexis, signed on behalf of his country, during the just-concluded CARICOM summit in Paramaribo, Suriname.

It said the agreement is part of a larger one by CARICOM in aiding Haiti rebuild by allowing free movement of diplomats and business people with a United States, French or United Kingdom visa seeking to do business.

According to the Herald, Alexis said, overall, the summit was a success for Haiti, stating that in addition to the visa waiver agreement with Barbados, Haiti received an extension for the Haiti-CARICOM Office to stay open for the next six months.

remittances to this region to grow at a similar rate as last year.

The report said most of the money continued to be sent from traditional host countries, such as the United States and Western Europe.

In the United States, source of about three-quarters of remittances to Latin America and the Caribbean, foreign workers saw improving employment and wage levels, the report said.

As a consequence, it said migrants made more transfers for higher amounts than the previous year.

In contrast, the report said uncer-

tain employment prospects in Europe resulted in drops in remittance flows to the region in the fourth quarter of 2011.

The report said remittances remain a major source of income for many countries in this region.

"In several of the smaller and poorer nations, they far exceed external aid and net foreign direct investment," it said.

"The importance of these flows lies in the vital role they play for millions of recipient families that depend on remittances for basic needs, even in countries with higher GDP (Gross Domestic Product) levels," it added. "In the absence of this regular source of income that these families receive from their family members abroad, many would fall below the poverty line," the report continued.

The IDB said, in recent years, as regional economies improved, remittances have become a smaller share of the GDP.

It, however, said that, in several countries, remittances are still more than 10 percent of GDP.

For example, in Haiti, which last year received nearly US\$2.1 billion, remittances represented more than one quarter of the national income, the report said.

ed in leaders agreeing to send a fact-finding delegation in early April to sound out the situation for themselves. Hughes said Britain recently banned his cabinet and legislature from naming high-ranking officials like permanent secretaries and heads of department" as it gradually takes control of our daily affairs."

Heargued that Anguilla's geograph-

ic position allows it to be the only island with enough marine space to have a 200-mile Exclusive Economic Zone (EEC), because "there is nothing else north of us until Bermuda. So other than Guyana, we have the largest fishing grounds available to any island in Caricom and that is another reason the Brits want to take full control."

Roosevelt Skerritt, the prime min-

ister of Dominica says that the leaders are serious on the issue, having seen London retake full control of daily life in the Turks (and Caicos Islands), "so a delegation of heads of government will go to Anguilla in the first week of April, because our fear is that we will have another TCI in Anguilla.

"We want to send a clear message to the governor that we are serious."



Health dispartities and financial burdens

Health disparities are creating economic burdens for families, communities and the nation's health care system. Across the country, infant mortality and chronic diseases continue to affect people of color at rates far higher than those for whites. In recent years, the focus has increased on the impact of disparities on minority communities, with public officials, community activists, civic leaders and health care experts proposing ways to improve access to medical care and raise awareness of positive benefits of preventive care. But health experts say the economic toll of health disparities and substantial costs associated with lost productivity are being overlooked.

"Racial and ethnic groups have higher incidences of diabetes, high blood pressure and cancer, et cetera," says Brian D. Smedley, vice president and director of the Health Policy Institute at the Joint Center for Political and Economic Studies in Washington, D.C. "That prevalence [of chronic diseases] comes with a price tag in terms of excess direct medical costs, nearly \$230 billion over a four-year period that we studied."

The study found that between 2003 and 2006, 30.6 percent of direct medical care expenditures for African-Americans, Asians and Hispanics were excess costs

due to health inequalities. The study estimated that eliminating health disparities for minorities would have reduced direct medical expenditures by \$229.4 billion and slashed indirect costs associated with illness and premature death by more than \$1 trillion for those years.

The 2010 National Healthcare Disparities Report documented that racial and ethnic minorities often receive poorer care than whites while facing more barriers in seeking preventive care, acute treatment or chronic disease management. The report is produced by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).

According to the report, minorities also experience rates of preventable hospitali-

Women leading the green economy

Optimistic environmentalists believe that future generations will view the first half of the 21st century as the birth of a global green economic revolution. Indeed, investment and advances in technology, coupled with anxiety regarding climate change, are already pushing global leaders to embrace a sustainable future. Unfortunately, that optimistic vision is clouded.

The stark fact is that almost all greenrevolution investors and decision-makers – those who are defining and designing the green economy – are from a single demographic: men. International Women's Day presents a timely and important opportunity to examine why women should be leaders in the green economy.

Like any revolution, a substantial risk exists that the green revolution will move in unpredictable or wrong directions. All economies are stronger when the people leading them bring diverse points of view. Certainly, creating a sustainable economy and breaking habits of overconsumption and fossil-fuel dependency are difficult tasks. Let's examine some of the reasons why including women in the construction of the green economy is a good idea:

·Women make the vast majority of consumer choices. Stimulating women's enterprises is critical to taking advantage of this important commercial opportunity.

Women are driving economic growth. The increase in women's employment in rich nations of the world has contributed more to global GDP growth in the past two decades than new technology or new economic giants China and India.

The proportion of women in a country's legislature significantly reduces the level of corruption in the country. Less corruption benefits not only women entrepreneurs but also all businesses.

·Women are better at putting resources back into the community. Women usually reinvest a much higher percentage of their earnings in their communities than men, accelerating development.

·Women's repayment rates are higher. When women are direct beneficiaries of credit, their repayment rates are higher throughout all regions of the world.

Despite these facts, real barriers to women's full participation in designing and developing the green economy exist. For example:

·Women-owned companies face problems in bringing their businesses to scale, including lack of access to capital and business networks. While women own about 30 percent of U.S. businesses, only about 5 percent of all equity capital investments go to businesses headed by women, and just 3 percent get investments from venture capital.

· Women have less access to the global supply chain. Only a fraction of governments and large corporations actively source from women-owned businesses.

·Women entrepreneurs face discriminatory laws in many places around the world.

How do we fix this? To start, corporations, governments and international institutions should adopt quotas for participation – from board rooms to national forums to multilateral negotiations.

Once the initial problem of representation is taken care of, we can get down to the business of breaking down legal barriers to women's full participation in the green economy. We need a comprehensive examination of national and international law and protocol dealing with the economy, energy and environment for bias against women. Then, we need to alter the language to promote inclusiveness.

Once problems in the system are fixed, we can go further. For example, formal policies and legal mechanisms should be adopted to support preferential treatment for loan guarantees; promote women's full participation in science, technology, engineering and mathematics education; and create investments and market incentives to enhance women's entrepreneurship.

In the meantime, we also have to fix how women as leaders of the green economy are perceived. We need training for journalists that includes heightened awareness of the gender gap. And we have to make gender, development, the green economy and climate change "hard" issues — and not perceived as "soft" issues only for women journalists.

As the world tries to recover from its financial crisis and, at the same time, recognizes the lack of sustainability of the existing economy, we cannot afford to let barriers to women's participation stand. The facts are clear: Bringing women into the design and development of the green economy will result in a better, more sustainable, more just economy. Let's ensure that happens.

Keeping the wackos where they are

No matter the extent of mainstream outrage when Limbaugh comes up with one of these hoof-deep-in-mouth performances, you get a sense of Limbaugh's influence among the vahoos. Worse, some politicians whose calculations cater heavily for support from that element, do all sorts of balancing acts for Limbaugh and his flock to avoid the doghouse. As if Mitt Romney didn't already look pathet-

ic enough in his full-court press to suddenly be Mr. Ultra Conservative, there was the pasty declaration from him that Limbaugh's ignoramus rant was "not the language I would have used." Behavior so obviously demanding strong condemnation but which gets instead this pussyfooting nonsense is indicative of the stranglehold Limbaugh types have on poor saps like Romney.

As is so frequently the case, the real reaction was to be found well beyond the arena where political mind games are the offered fare. David Letterman called applause received from his studio audience, "as sincere as a Rush Limbaugh apology." There can be little doubt about this having been a moment to take a stand for decency.

What we cannot allow to become too deflating about these poison darts hurled by Limbaugh and kindred spirits

is that instances, such as this latest, of pushing the envelope well past the outer limits of taste and class aren't about to change the order of things. Provocateurs they are, after a fashion, and the mission guidelines evidently don't include any hint of hewing, for instance, to a model akin to the PBS commentary of Mark Shields and David Brooks. Shields is supposedly the more progressive of the pair, Brooks the conservative. Yet these guys manage to uniformly have a discourse on matters mainly political, that is marked by a striking civility. So, okay, replication of the Shields and Brooks formula is too pie-in-the-sky. But does the alternative have to be the Limbaugh type screamer?

And what of the Republican Party establishment? Does that assessment of Limbaugh's strength in GOP circles that Cheney made still hold? In wake of the latest Limbaugh crash-and-burn imitation, David Brooks was suggesting that Limbaugh's juice isn't what it used to be. The tepid response to Limbaugh's crock this time around hardly would suggest influence on the wane...unless Romney perhaps just can't avoid walking that particular road these days.

Too much of a focus on what kind of influence Limbaugh still has within the corridors of GOP power probably shouldn't be option one for those of us concerned that these periodic meltdowns of his are apparently destined to be part of the business-as-usual package. Limbaugh is paid oodles of cash to do these performances of his that obviously resonate with a hard core of benighted souls. Attempting to process what renders a Rush Limbaugh appealing to anyone might well be the ultimate brain teaser for many on this side of the sanity line. Better to just thank our lucky stars that Limbaugh (and others like him) junkies aren't representative of the American whole. And do our utmost to keep the equation from any further tilt in the direction of wacky.



zation that, in some cases, are almost double that of whites; African-Americans have higher hospitalization rates from influenza; and black children are twice as likely to be hospitalized and more than four times as likely to die from asthma as white children.

Thomas A. LaVeist, director of the Hopkins Center for Health Disparities at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health in Baltimore, says increased health risks for minorities are directly related to where they live and work.

"The fact is that we have an inequitable distribution of opportunity," he says. "Where you live determines what schools your children get to attend. It determines if your house will appreciate or de-appreciate and whether you can create wealth. It also determines whether you are exposed to environmental inequalities and the type of health care facility that is available to you. Where you live, work,

play and pray affects quality of health care."

Jennifer Ng'andu, deputy director of the Health Policy Project at the National Council of La Raza in Washington, speaks even more pointedly: "If we look at communities of color, we see that many racial and ethnic groups live in unsafe environments, there is poor housing and there is loss of productivity because of illness.

"Essentially, every time a person of color goes to the doctor, 30 percent of their bill is due to health disparities so they end up paying more in the doctor's office because over time they receive health care that is not appropriate or effective," she says. "They become needlessly sicker and are more likely to die prematurely, so they end up paying more medical expenses."

Health experts and civic leaders say financial strains are adversely manifested in varying ways in communities and have a huge impact Op-Ed

on children, often involving academic performance.

"There are direct biological consequences in that a child who does not have good access to health services will experience developmental setbacks because they are sick or their parents are sick,' Ng'andu says. "It makes it harder for them to achieve in school and can have serious consequences on their future. We have to invest in children early, their health early, their education, making sure they have healthy communities to grow in."

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta, the percentage of children and adolescents with a chronic disease swelled from 1.8 percent in the 1960s to 7 percent in 2004. The increase has an adverse impact on childhood education. For example, a report by the American Lung

Association says asthma is a leading cause nation-wide of youngsters missing school. Asthma affects Puerto Rican and African-American children more often, perhaps because they often live in communities

with poor air quality.
"Studies show a spread
of diabetes among children,
but particularly among
black and Latino children,"
says Sinsi HernandezCancio, director of health
equity at Families USA in
Washington.

"There are long-term effects. You are more likely to lose a limb, have a heart attack or lose a kidney, and the longer you have the disease, the greater the toll on life quality. We can expect to see this as these children grow older. There is also an impact on children when other family members have a disease because they sometime miss school to care for an ill family member."

Because racial and ethnic health care disparities can hinder a breadwinner's earning capacity, the entire family is often affected adversely.

"Kids are forced to be translators at the doctor's office," Hernandez-Cancio says. "That has an enormous toll, so they see firsthand all this information on how mommy or daddy is not doing well. We have had stories of children staving home to take care of their parent or another sibling. Stresses such as these affect their ability to develop into an independent, productive individual in the future."

Ng'andu agrees. "When kids are hungry, when they are exposed to serious nerve stress and environmental stresses," she says, "it affects them and their ability to learn and perform well academically. Investment in their health is very important to their future success and achievement and also their ability to work and contribute to

their communities."

Hernandez-Cancio says disparities in infant mortality rates also take a toll on minority families. While the 2010 rate for whites was 5.63 per 1,000 live births, it was 13.31 per 1,000 live births for African-Americans, 9.22 for American Indians or Alaska Natives and 7.71 for Puerto Ricans, according to the

The infant mortality rate is considered a very basic measure of how a country's health care system is working, and it is an indication of other symptoms," she says. "We rank 41st globally. As an advanced, wealthy nation, we are not doing well."

HIV among Black MSMs

Dear Dr. Eva.

Can you tell me whether it is true that more Blacks. and especially Black gay men, are infected with HIV than whites? If it is true, what do you think are the reasons for this? I'm a voung Black guv who wants to stay negative. From what I've seen, I don't think that Black gav men have more risky sex than white gay men, in fact I think Black guys may be more conservative (have fewer partners). BJ

Dear BJ,

Despite some spread in the heterosexual population, HIV remains mainly a disease of men who have sex with men (MSM). MSM make up about 2 percent of the United States population, but they have 61 percent of all new HIV infections. MSM in the United States are 19 times more likely to have HIV than people in the general population.

African-Americans in general (not just gay and bisexual men) also have a disproportionate burden of HIV infection. Although only 14 percent of the



United States population is African-American, African-Americans make up 44 percent of all people newly diagnosed with HIV.

Unfortunately, it is true that young African-American MSM have the highest rates of HIV infection of any group, and it is even worse in Baltimore where I practice than in the rest of the country. A 2008 Johns Hopkins study in Baltimore showed that 45 percent of a sample of Black MSM were HIVpositive. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) announced last August that more than 25 percent of all new cases of HIV are in young black MSM, even though this group makes up less than 0.5 percent of the population.

Nationally, 28 percent of African-American men (one in 3) who have sex with men (MSM) are positive, and 59 percent of these HIV positive African-American men do not know they are infected. By comparison, 16 percent of white MSM (one in 6) are positive and 26 percent of them do not know that they are positive. Among HIV-positive African-American under age 30, the most sexually active group, 71 percent do not know they are infected.

As far as the reasons for the higher rates of infection in African-American MSM·

You are correct that African-American MSM do not have more risky sex than white MSM. Some studies show that African-American MSM have fewer sexual partners than white MSM. African-American and white MSM have the same rates of unsafe sexual behaviors, such as failure to use condoms and having anal intercourse.

Gays and bisexuals, like heterosexuals, most often choose sex partners (and life partners) of their own ethnic group. African-American MSM make up a smaller group than white MSM. Infections spread more quickly in small groups.

There is (still) greater stigma related to being gay or bisexual in the African-American community than in the white community. The General Social Survey, a survey that asks people their opinions about homosexuality, found in 2008 that 72 percent of Blacks thought "homosexuality is always wrong" as compared with 52 percent

Doctor, Doctor Questions Often Asked By Herbert Okun, M.D. Diplomate American Board of Urology

Diagnosing prostate problems correctly

Most men, arriving at the urologist's office for the first time do so because they're convinced that they have a prostate problem. In many, probably most cases, they are right. However, the doctor's job is to evaluate their problems by classifying their symptoms into one or more of three major categories to definitively establish a complete diagnosis, essential to selecting the most appropriate treatment.

The first category of symptoms are those related to the storing of urine in the bladder and these include frequency and sleep interruption caused by the need to urinate as well as urgency causing that sudden rush to the toilet, not always in time to avoid embarrassing incontinence.

The second category of urinary symptoms are those involving voiding. These include a slow, often split intermittent stream with hesitancy in starting, sometimes requiring pushing to maintain a continuous flow but still ending in dribbling that seems to go on forever.

The third category of symptoms are those that occur soon after our man leaves the toilet, which require him to make a bee line right back because instead of feeling satisfied and empty, he feels that he has to urinate again and unfortunately, urine will very often run down his trouser leg before he can make it back in time. What often happens is that an enlarged and obstructive prostate can cause these symptoms as can an overactive bladder and what's more is that both conditions may be present at the same time. Furthermore, the prostate obstruction can lead to bladder wall thickening and irritation causing the symptoms of an overactive bladder.

The medications that have been developed to treat over-activity of the muscles of the bladder, bladder neck and urethra don't work only where we want them to work. They also have an effect on various other parts of the body far away from the urinary tract. For example, the muscles in the wall of the arteries throughout the periphery of the body, which have a strong effect on blood pressure.

In addition, the spinal cord, and the nasal passages can all be affected by the same medication that might be used to relieve the symptoms of the urinary tract. If it relieves the symptoms of prostatic obstruction, it may stuff up your nose and the medicine that unclogs your nose may very well make it more difficult to urinate. Retrograde ejaculation can also be expected to occur in about one of five men using such medica-

Proper diagnosis can be accomplished by careful history, physical examination, time and amount records, uroflowmetry, sonography, and urodynamic studies. Surgery is best reserved for cases complicated by any of the following: bladder stones, persistent heavy bleeding, complete urinary retention and renal failure. Otherwise the appropriate medications will be chosen and if necessary, a minimally invasive procedure such as TUMT, transurethral microwave thermother-


Falling in love with your health

of whites. Even MSM often agreed that "homosexuality is always wrong." Fifty-seven percent of African American MSM and 27 percent of white MSM agreed with that statement. People who believe their sexuality is wrong are likely to have low self-esteem, especially related to their sexuality, and less likely to take precautions to protect themselves and their partners.

There is (still) greater stigma attached to HIV infection in the African-American community than in the white community. People who may be cut off from family and friends if they become infected with HIV are less likely to get tested.

Perhaps because of the stigma, African-American MSM get tested for HIV less frequently than white MSM. Because of this, African-Americans find out about their HIV positive status later in their disease. Once people are aware that they are HIV-positive, they take more precautions to prevent transmitting the disease to their partners. If

they do not know until later in the disease that they are HIV-positive, infected people go on transmitting the virus to others for a longer period of time.

Once they are aware of being infected, African-Americans with HIV tend to wait longer to start on HIV medications. Once on a successful HIV medication regimen, people have far fewer HIV virus particles in their bodies and so are much less likely to pass on the virus. The longer a person with HIV goes untreated, the more their virus count (viral load) rises and the more likely they are to pass infection on to others.

A May 2011 interview study of young African-American MSM, done by researchers from Johns Hopkins, found that these young men preferred masculine partners and believed that masculine appearing men were most likely to be free of HIV.

materials and labor and further cements the growing relationship between the two countries. China also expects to build a US\$50 million sports and recreational village around the stadium.

China's state-owned Export-Import Bank is building the US\$2.6 billion Baha Mar resort complex in New Providence and has agreed to provide a US\$41 million loan to build a new port and bridge in the Bahamas.

Barbados

The Sunday Sun newspaper in Barbados has reported that forensic auditors are seeking a second investigation in the failed Clico insurance giant's Eastern Caribbean operations in a bid to find millions of dollars in missing funds.

The paper said it had obtained a 37-page audit report, dated Dec. 5, and at the end of the eightmonth-long probe found unexplained dead-ends in the company's money trail.

The report revealed "shocking inter-company" transactions amounting to 376 million Barbados dollars involving the Barbadosbased Clico International Life's and the Barbados subsidiaries of CIL's parent, CL Financial, in addition to further details of the employment contract of its former executive chairman, Leroy Parris, the Sunday Sun said.

The paper said the auditors reached the conclusion that the insurance company had become the "banker" for its related companies. The auditors, Deloitte Canada, said their valuation of CIL's assets did not hold out much hope for a full recovery of the insurance company's assets.

Guyana

Suriname's President

Desi Bouterse recently headed a three-member Bureau of CARICOM leaders and the bloc's special envoy to Haiti PJ Patterson on a two-day mission to Haiti, the CARICOM Secretariat in Guvana said.

Bouterse was joined by immediate past CARICOM chairman and St. Kitts and Nevis Prime Minister Dr. Denzil Douglas and St. Lucia's Deputy Prime Minister Phillip J Pierre, who stood in for Prime Kenny Minister Dr. Anthony.

The three leaders. together with CARICOM Secretary General Irwin LaRocquemake, make up the Bureau of Heads of Government, a special super-committee of CARICOM leaders.

Also on the mission was former Jamaica Prime Minister PJ Patterson. CARICOM's special representative of the heads of government to Haiti,

"The purpose of the visit is to engage with the government of Haiti with respect to its priorities, which would assist in determining the nature of assistance required of the Community to that member state," the statement said.

The delegation met with Haiti's President Michel Martelly and cabinet ministers.

"The visit also served to emphasize continued support for the country in its reconstruction and development efforts following the 2010 earthquake and explore ways for strengthening Haiti's participation in CARICOM, the secretariat said.

Jamaica

Jamaica is developing a new policy to battle crime as gang violence drives the homicide rate higher, the country's National Security Minister Peter Bunting

He noted that 165 killings have been reported by police so far in 2012, compared to 135 slavings for the same period last year.

Violent gangs are deeply entrenched in Spanish Town, just west of Kingston, and in some residential sections of the northwestern parish of St. James, which includes the resort city of Montego Bay.

Fighting between gangs for control of drug trafficking and extortion rackets have long been blamed for the majority of Jamaica's

Police Commissioner Owen Ellington said at a news conference that much of the security forces' resources are now focused on trying to contain 42 active gang conflicts.

Nevis

Premier of Nevis Joseph Parry has reassured its people and visitors that the island was still "very safe" in the wake of the home robbery of a United States Supreme Court justice and his family who were holidaying there recently.

Parry said he personally visited Justice Stephen Breyer the day after the robbery in which the judge was robbed, along with his wife and guests.

Nevis, the tiny Leeward Island southwest of St. Kitts, its federal partner, has been the Brever's vacation home for the last 16 years.

"I want to reassure evervone that it is very safe on the island of Nevis, and the police and government have taken as many steps to ensure security of our people and our visitors," Parry, who is also the island's tourism minister said.

He said the Nevis Island administration will now offer "the highest level of protection" to visiting dignitaries in the future.

What an anniversary present!

Happy couple is remodeling their home and saving money too, thanks to the HRA program

Iris Escobar is a coupon clipper, proud to be frugal. But you don't usually clip coupons for home improvement, so when she and her husband, Victor, decided to remodel their home, she had to find another way to save.

But Iris didn't have to look far. The answer arrived in her mailbox one day last summer: a card advertising the Housing Rehabilitation Assistance program.

Thanks to the HRA, the Escobars are getting a world-class makeover to their kitchen, dining room and downstairs bathroom, along with a new roof and energyefficient windows - all without spending a dime in cash, and without increasing their mortgage payments a penny. Taking advantage of the program is letting them save thousands of dollars on a project that would have cost \$103,000, and thanks to refinancing, they're making the same monthly payments they were before on their Baldwin home but now \$200 each month is going toward the principal.

They couldn't be happier — not about the savings, not about the work that's being done, and especially not about the full range of services HRA is providing as their home is transformed.

"It's been a great ride," Victor said. "I can't say enough about the HRA program. I can't say enough about everybody involved with the program."

His wife agrees, "I'm excited, I'm very excited," she said. "I'm glad I met this team; they're great!" Speaking to Carlos Fontanez, the couple's HRA representative, she added, "I told my sister about you, I told my coworkers about you.— I tell everyone about you."

What Iris is telling everyone is how the HRA guides clients through every step of the home remodeling process, from helping decide what work should be done to how it will be financed, from securing financial assistance to overseeing the work and making sure the contractors are not paid until the homeowner is satisfied.

A fan of "The People's Court," where she sees a lot of irresponsible contractors sued over jobs that weren't done correctly, Iris said she was especially glad that the HRA holds clients' money in escrow until they certify that they're satisfied.

Carlos described how he starts a project with clients like the Escobars: "I explain to them what HRA does and show them the different options for how we can accomplish what they want to do to reach their goals, help them get financing and a reduced interest rate on their mortgage."

"After the first 10 minutes speaking to him, I was sold on the program," Victor said. "All through this, he's been great."

An HRA administrator explained the program's basic approach: "The services offered by the HRA extend beyond just financial assistance for home improvement projects. We have implemented numerous processes to ensure that projects completed by HRA-approved contractors are done so to the homeowner's satisfaction."

Just take a look at some of the program's requirements for contractors. They all must be:

- licensed, bonded and insured for at least \$100,000 per incident;
- registered with the Better Business Bureau, with a rating of an A or higher;
- in business for at least 10 years;
- able to provide the names and addresses of eight clients they have done home improvement projects for in the past year; and
- able to perform four test projects for the HRA prior to work-

ing for any clients.

With that kind of screening, it's no surprise that only the best contractors get to do HRA-sponsored jobs.

At the Escobars' house, it's a big job that's underway. First the roof and windows were replaced, and new gutters and leaders installed. The couple is thrilled with the result. There's a stunning new bay window in the dining room that measures about 8 feet wide by 5 feet high. The kitchen features a garden window, an especially deep one with a glass shelf so her plants can be surrounded by light from all sides.

Next the interior of the kitchen and bathroom were completely gutted, with everything from new gas lines and plumbing to new sheetrock and insulation going in. The door to the basement was moved from one wall to another to make room for all the cabinetry surrounding the garden window.

The new kitchen is going to feature only the best equipment and materials, including a six-burner stove with a pot-filler faucet, double sink with pullout faucet, beautiful real-wood cabinets, granite countertops and floor tiles.

A new two-level peninsula with a granite top will serve as a bar, or just another place for family and friends to gather.

There will even be a tilt-out drawer for sponges and brushes in front of the sinks.

"I'm a hoarder," Iris said.
"They're giving me lots of drawers and shelves to put away my

Even more of her and her husband's "stuff" will go in the new pantries that will be built in an area just off the kitchen. Those will be done in the same deep finish as the kitchen cabinets, and feature modern conveniences like pullout drawers behind the doors.

The bathroom also will be allnew. The shower will feature a bench and a modern rain shower head. The tile walls will be accented by a mosaic design running around the whole room. The hardware will be bronze, and the contractor even found a toilet in Mexican sand, a cream-like color, that will complement the decor perfectly.

In the front of the house, the contractor replaced all the windows in the foyer and added insulation. Not only will the Escobars earn tax credits for energy efficiency, but Iris says she felt the difference immediately. Drafty for years, the foyer is now cozy, she said.

After all the interior work is

done, the project will go back outside, as a new deck and patio get installed.

Iris likes to entertain, but for the last three years hadn't bothered because she wasn't happy with how the house was looking. But now she's looking forward to holding a big bash in June, to show off the renovations made possible by the HRA program and to celebrate the couple's 10th anniversary. Queens small business owners support paid sick days

A group of local small business owners, City Council members and community leaders stood together Tuesday, March 13, to announce their support for paid sick days at Terraza 7 Live Music, a restaurant and music venue in Jackson Heights, Queens.

The group launched a "Conscious Consumer Initiative" to highlight and promote local businesses that already provide paid sick days.

Supporters are calling on City Council to pass the Paid Sick Time bill, which would ensure that 1.5 million New Yorkers without access to paid sick days are able to take time off when they or their families are ill. In addition to the support of small businesses, the bill has 35 Council sponsors and is supported by a diverse coalition of labor unions, women's rights organizations, healthcare providers and community organizations.

"I know how important it is to take time off when you are sick to prevent disease from spreading," said Freddy Castiblanco, owner of Terraza 7 Live Music, who was trained as a physician in his native Colombia before immigrating to Queens. "As a business owner I believe giving paid sick days is not only the right thing to do, it also builds a stronger business."

Leni Juca, owner of the Oxium Copy Shop in Jackson Heights, which provides paid sick days, left his job at a large chain to start his own business. "I left corporate America to start a small business because I wanted to be treated like a full human being, not a number," said Juca. "In my business I treat my employees like family. Everyone gets sick, and that's why I provide paid sick days. People come back to work more committed because they know I'm there for them."

Juca and Castiblanco are both members of Small Business United. They joined with Make the Road NY, which has over 4,000 Queens members, to announce the creation of a "Conscious Consumer Card" and a grassroots mobilization and education campaign to highlight and promote responsible businesses in the community such as Terraza 7 and Oxium that provide paid sick days to their employees.

Council Member Julissa Ferreras, representing Jackson Heights, Corona, Elmhurst and East Elmhurst, is a sponsor of

a proposal in the New York City Council to guarantee paid sick days, joined the rally to announce her support for the initiative.

"Make the Road's Conscious Consumer initiative is a great way to let the community know which businesses offer paid sick days to their workers," said Council Member Ferreras. "Paid sick time is a small measure that can have an immediate, positive impact on business productivity, reduce


unemployment, and strengthen financial security for families who desperately need relief."





Definitive 'Marley' flick premieres

"I think what's great about the film is though there have been a lot of things done on Bob, I think this one will give people a more emotional connection to Bob's life as a man - not just as a reggae legend or a mythical figure, but his life as a man.'

Bob Marley's eldest son Ziggy describes the new documentary about his iconic, musician, father as 'the most definitive."

Credited as co-executive producer with Chris Blackwell, Ziggy along with his sister Cedella are among a long list of insiders who offer reflections on their associations with the musician.

Through a much-too long 145-minute documentary, the collaborative feature unites Magnolia Pictures, Tuff Gong Productions, Shangri-La Entertainment and Cowboy Films for a biopic on Jamaica's most celebrated musician/singer.

Marley's adult life is relayed by his widow, lovers, associates, collaborators and individuals who associated with the legendary Rastafarian, songwriter, singer, musician, husband, father and son.

Much of the reflections are recycled interviews or restated comments by his widow Rita, lover Cindy Brakespeare. Island Records label head Blackwell, back-up singers Judy Mowatt and Marcia Griffith, and music partner, associate producer Neville "Bunny Wailer" Livingston.

Allegedly more than 60 individuals were interviewed.

However, most engaging, refreshing and new are statements made by relatives Constance and Peter, who are identified to be a half sister and cousin from Bob's paternal side.

Of the interview, his cousin Peter said, "Nobody had thought to speak with me before."

And Constance after listening to her brother's record-

ing of "Cornerstone" was informed the significance of the lyrics to her family.

McDonald may have scored a winner with interviews by African Princess Pascalene, the daughter of Gabon's President Omar Bongo.

Her revelations about Marley and his band performing in the renowned African dictatorship is perhaps one of the most interesting of the document.

Along with reflections from a nurse who tended to the ailing musician while he sought treatment in Germany; 'baby mother' Pat Williams, who birthed a son named Robert Marley; and Dudley Sibley, a studio janitor whose exclusive in the film reflected on his friendship with Marley during a one-year period they shared a room living in a back space at Studio One Recording Studios.

"Nobody had ever interviewed him before," McDonald

Others include Marley's eldest child, Cedella, his mother Cedella Booker, graphic artist Neville Garrick and attorney Diane Jobson who gleaned revealing nostalgia that may enlighten fans of the acclaimed first Third World superstar.

Ziggy spoke candidly about his childhood memories of his famous father.

He was able to impart a human aspect to the individual most regard as a prophet, revolutionary, superstar, legend and iconic personality.

How Marley relentlessly tested his mettle against his youths'; that he fiercely engaged his children in competitive athletic practices by racing or playing soccer and how he rarely portrayed the compassionate, 'daddy' perhaps more prevalently projected.

His sister Cedella lauded her mother for the tolerance and grace she exhibited despite her husband's flagrant disregard for their marriage vows.

"I said to her, 'mom they don't make women like you anymore,' Cedella said. "I guess, back in the 60's, when you fall in love like that, you fall in love, you know?"

None of the reported 20 offspring or nine legally acknowledged are featured in the film.

However, a notation that Bob Marley had 11 children by seven different women punctuated details not included in the biopic.

Fans will enjoy the concert footage, imagery, music and dialogue. Subtitles provide interpretation to the Jamaican patois that prevails throughout.

Snippets of Lee "Scratch" Perry in his studio, the One Love peace concert and the arrival of Ethiopian Emperor HIM Haile Selassie to Jamaica are vividly repeated.

Initially announced in February 2008 for production by director Martin Scorcese, the documentary arrives two years later than its initial release date and without the effort of the famous filmmaker. At that time Scorcese said the document would be completed in time for release on Marley's 65th birthday anniversary in 2010.

But Scorcese bowed out of the project and was replaced by Jonathan Demme.

That association also proved short-lived when reportedly, Demme cited creative differences with producer Steve Bing during the beginning of editing.

La Sonora Ponceña was formed in Puerto Rico in 1954 by Enrique "Quique" Lucca, who named the band after the famous Cuban band Sonora Matancera and his home city of Ponce, thus Sonora Ponceña. By 1956 the group included pianist Vicentico Morales, with Quique's ten-year-old son, Enrique "Papo" Lucca Jr., already at the piano writing arrangements. Papo recorded his first piano solo at age 12.

The band's early recordings featured various popular vocalists of the time, until Tito Gomez joined the band, staying until 1974. By 1960, the band had performed in New York, catching the attention of Fania/Inca Records owner Jerry Masucci. After studies at the Puerto Rico Conservatory of Music, Papo was an accomplished pianist and arranger, and in 1968 Quique stepped down as musical director.

Under Papo's direction, the band's sound became a fusion of traditional Cuban and modern Latin styles. In 1969 they released their first Inca LP, with all arrangements by Papo, Hachero pa' un palo, whose hit title song established them as salsa pioneers. They recorded 30 more albums for Inca and by 1980 were a huge success. As salsa romántica became popular, they adjusted to commercial forces without deserting their trademark sound. The band's most recent albums are 2011's El gigante del sur and A Band and their Music.

8 Y Más is the cooperative effort of internationally recognized Latin musicians/producers Bobby Allende and Marc Quiñones, who have embarked on a mission to preserve the genre of hard-core salsa music as well as to expose new generations to the music which is a staple of the Latin culture. In addition to Bobby and Marc, the band includes Eddie Rosado (lead vocals), Victor Baro, Samuel

Baretto, Arturo Ortiz, Jose Tabares and Manuel Ruiz. The members have played individually, and collectively, with a "who's who" of greats from many genres of music including Tito Puente, Celia Cruz, Rubén Blades, Ray Barretto, Tito Nieves, Marc Anthony, La India, Ricky Martin, Dave Valentín and Willie Colón. In November, 2006, the band released its first CD Juega Billar, which rose quickly to the top of many "best of" lists, including the Descarga Review and Salsa Picante. With their astonishing renditions of compositions by Lalo Rodriguez, Ismael Miranda, Rubén Blades and Ray Barretto, the band rapidly gained attention worldwide. In August 2011 the band released its follow-up CD, Que Mas, which includes collaborations with Eva Ayllón ("Saca la mano") and Herman Olivera ("Lllanto de cocodrilo). The album has already been featured on Sirius XM's three-hour salsa program, Caliente.



Twelve-year-old Ted (Zac Efron) has such a big crush on the girl next-door (Taylor Swift) that he makes up lame excuses to ring her doorbell just so he can see her. He finally realizes he actually has a chance with adorably-cute Audrey the day she mentions that she'd marry on the spot the first boy to bring her a real, live tree.

She's never seen one, since their hometown of Thneed-ville is an artificial environment where everything is plastic except for the citizens. What the kids don't know is that their idyllic community is also walled-off from a contaminated outside world which has been turned into a vast wasteland as a result of pollution.

Intent on impressing Audrey, Ted asks his Grammy Norma (Betty White) where he might find a Truffula, the species of tree that once thrived in Thneedville. She, in turn, suggests he meet with the Once-ler (Ed Helms), a reclusive elder who resides way past the city limits



"The Lorax."

So, Ted hops on his scooter and ventures out of town for the first time, and is shocked to see the widespread blight he's been shielded from his whole life.

Worse, it's apparent that the desolation is due to the smog and sludge being spewed by an operation owned by Thneed-ville's avaricious Mayor O'Hare (Rob Riggle).

That discovery conveniently dovetails with Ted's consulting the wise, old Once-ler who, in a series of sobering tete-a-tetes, proceeds to teach the idealistic lad a valuable lesson about the importance of protecting the environment from greedy corporations. And the Once-ler even 'fesses up about the role he played in the destruction of the forest when, over the objections of a tiny, planet-protecting creature called the Lorax (Danny DeVito), he harvested all the trees to make a quick buck.

Loosely-based on the Dr. Seuss children's classic of the same name, The Lorax is an eco-friendly

parable about the urgency of preserving the Earth's natural resources. The animated adventure is blessed with a sweet story of puppy love, too, although Ted and Audrey's budding romance tends to take a back seat to the picture's primary agenda of indicting big business for putting profits ahead of people and the planet.

While the movie's dire, apocalyptic scenario might scare some impressionable young'uns, most members of the target tyke demo are likely to take it all in stride, especially given the film's fairy tale ending. An action cartoon featuring typical kiddie fare plus a timely message about conservation.







Surgical Procedures

Surgical procedures involve removing the inner part of the prostate through a special instrument inserted into the urethra. If the prostate has greatly enlarged, an open prostatectomy is necessary, where an incision is made in the abdomen from which the inner layer in the prostate is removed.

'Aryè' tells a tale of three women

Women's History Month tailing behind Black History Month finds the Hadley Players winter production and contribution of "Aryè," featured at the Harlem School of the Arts, located at 647 St. Nicholas Avenue (off 142nd Street) in Manhattan, ended March 11.

I wish it could run longer so that everyone can see this play and feel the pride, joy and sorrow of a family as it existed in Africa, endured slavery in America and later American apartheid, only to prevail in current time, remembering its history and family tradition.

Although I have reviewed several plays, I cannot recall in some time feeling the excitement I felt after viewing "Aryè," a play written by actress Louise Mike. Ms. Mike's play takes the viewer through three generations of women, all telling the familial tale of the warrior Aryè. Aryè was a proud son of Africa, strong and vital, a leader who was raised by his culture and mother to respect women, nature, family, tradition, and his God.

This play is a true light in the darkness and performed with warmth, passion and great skill by actress Kimberlee Monroe, who does a superb job depicting each generation of woman: grandmother, mother and daughter within their historic era. The performance is uplifting in spirit and truly a play for the heart.

Ms. Monroe carries her audience back to Africa through the grandmother who serves as a griot since it is through her, we come to know her son, Aryè, and along the way get to know her as well. She was the healer in the family as was her mother. She knew the ways of the land and of nature and how the birds were the foretellers of death. We feel the link to our ancestors in Africa and learn of a people who understood the earth's rhythms, and their soul connection with the animals, the land, and nature. In fact, so connected were they that oftentimes it was by observing nature and taking heed of nature's warnings, that Africans saved their own lives.

Via the play "Aryè," viewers are

reminded of a time when we as a people combined our forces and worked together as one, sharing what we had with one another, so that no one went without. And, through this tradition of unselfishness our ancestors built a strong and united community. It was a time when men hunted and provided for the family, took pride in their women and led with strength and purpose. Mates were equal partners. The women cared for the home, the sick and wounded, and even became warriors if need be, putting the family community survival first and foremost. Ms. Monroe weaves the fabric of this lifestyle with such agility that one doesn't even need to close their eves to be taken back as witness to our ancestral past.

Through a simple change of costume we are transported to a plantation wherein the daughter of Aryè continues the tale of his life, introducing the lives of Aryè's children under the rigors of slavery. Audiences feel the pride Aryè held, the suffering he endured, having to take on a chained life

after having lived a free life in Africa. We realize the cruelty of having to endure another man's rule, Will and heartlessness, yet find a way to live throughout it all and still believe in God. Still hope, still rise. This play shows us that although at times we falter we have always found a way to go on.

The director, Ward Nixon, who also did the set designs, made each time period realistic. The symbolism of the tree and flowers was a brilliant indicative of the branches of family and the blossoming of each lifetime that continued the tradition of keeping Mother Africa alive. Through Ward's efforts and that of everyone involved in this production, the line of African American descent is brought to life. Via the women storytellers in this play, each generation passes down an enlightened culture via the male line of Aryè. In so doing, the importance of knowing who we are as a nation and people and the origins of our beginnings, is instilled in each child inculcating a common bond.

There is something we as a people of color here in America and

throughout the Diaspora need to remind ourselves of in modern day -- That is, the line of Africa exists in each one of us and should not be negated, disrespected or discarded because others malign us and try to instill in us a sense of self-revulsion. We are not inferior because others say so, nor are we powerless. Only by ingesting the rhetoric and condemnation of the fearing others, have some among us swallowed the negative programming hatefilled groups systematically enforce. Let's stop the violence toward one another, and lack of appreciation of our race. Attempting to be a mirrored reflection of Euro-culture only brings about the extinction of our own. Think about it!

Kimberlee Monroe is a graduate of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts and has performed with the Hadley Players in the productions "Nobody Knows Where They Was" and "The Winter View." She appeared in Layon Gray's award winning play "All American Girls," about a team of African American women baseball players set in the 1940s.

Black tie gala at PS 15

PS 15Q in Springfield Gardens held their first Gala Black Tie Affair on Friday, March 9 to celebrate children and school parental and community involvement.

The school gymnasium was transformed with the use of table cloths and ribbon tied cloth chair covers. More than 60 PS 15 students attended dressed in special occasion dresses and dark suits. Dancers from the school provided entertainment.

Archie Spigner, Bill Briggs, executive director and founder of Youth and Tennis, officers Patt Kahan and Tasia Jordon of the 113th Precinct and Sgt. 1st Class Anthony Brewer. Students who showed the most improvement and parent and staff leaders as well as educational leaders were honored.

Keynote Speaker Assemb. William Scarborough talked about cut backs at all levels of government. The money that the state was ordered to pay NYC in 1996 as a result of the Campaign for Fiscal Equity Law Suit was supposed to run from 2008 - 2013, but because of the economic recession and budget shortfalls, was pushed up to 2011 - 2013. School budgets have been decreased while class size has grown. He urged parents to

demand more from their legislators, so that as legislators we can demand more.

Scarborough also talked about the push by this administration for charter schools. "Charter schools will never educate more than 20 percent of our children," he said. We need to support and strengthen our public schools. "We need to create smaller class sizes in public schools," he added.

He raised another point of dissension - forcing schools together in an existing school facility. The administration, parents and children are adversarial to the schools that are there. The Dept. of Education needs to put together a better way of doing this.

Runaway children in Southeast Queens

Runaway and missing children are a major problem in the U.S. Statistics vary. According to the U.S. Department of Justice, 1.7 million children run away from home each year.

According to the National Runaway Switchboard, between 1.6 and 2.8 million minors run away every year. There are one to three million runaways living in the streets. The dangers children face as runaways include the risk of being kidnapped, sold into sex trafficking, being physically abused. Each year 50,000 runaways die.

Southeast Queens resident Erica Carr's 15 year old daughter went missing on Jan. 13 in Southeast Queens. She never came home from school. Erica Carr has been worried sick and contacted Assemblyman William Scarborough and D.L. Archie Spigner for help.

Scarborough, who has passed Safe Harbor legislation to help runaways involved in prostitution, has been able to help reunite other mothers with their missing teens by involving Joe Mazzilli. A retired NYPD detective and now a private investigator, Mazzilli created his own team to find and rescue endangered runaways and bring them home safely. The team is called the Runaway Squad and actually became a reality show on A & E TV.

Mazzilli believes in acting quickly when search-

day. Unless police suspect foul play is involved, they don't have the resources to get involved with finding runaways. Mazzilli said they get so many cases a week and many could be solved quickly if they had subpoena power.



Sunday afternoon, and although it may be foolhardy to speculate on the Red Bulls' chances of reaching the MLS Cup final after only one game, a contest certainly is enough to spark questions about aspects of the team that will have a direct impact on a successful season.

New York's defense was a major worry last year during a season in which the Red Bulls drew a record number of games before backing into the playoff via a wild card berth. It was this Dallas team that the New Yorkers knocked out of the 2011 playoffs to advance to the short-lived first round series versus eventual champion Los Angeles Galaxy.

In this season opener, it seemed as though the defense continued its error-filled ways as two defensive mistakes led to the Red Bulls' downfall. Dallas' Zach Lloyd's 11th minute goal came when new defender Markus Holgersson failed to clear the ball from the goalmouth; the

Swedish Holgersson was brought in to shore up a defensive unit that lost stalwart defender Tim Ream to Bolton of the English Premier League. Ricardo Villar's 61st minute goal was the result of another defensive error.

Also added to the defensive lineup was Colombian Wilma Conde, a past MLS all-star player with the Chicago Fire, but Conde seems injury prone and was absent from the game. Secondyear player Stephen Keel made a credible showing teamed at central defense with Holgersson and left defenseman Roy Miller and Soli complete the starting defense, which, except for Holgersson, were there last year. This defense should have done a much better job at protecting newcomer goalkeeper Ryan Meara, who was one of the bright spots in the game. Another bad omen for New York is Mexican international defender Rafael Marquez, who was suspended for the first two games of this season as a result of an incident at Red

Bull Arena in the last game there versus the Galaxy. Will Marquez continue to find ways to be absent from the defense? Will Conde stay healthy throughout the season? How improved, really, is Keel?

New York's midfield lacks creativity. There are too many defensive journeymen and not enough skill to maintain possession for substantial periods and dictate the tempo in the game. Estonian Joel Lindpere and Jamaican international Dane Richards manned the flanks, while Dax McCarty and Teemu Tainio were the central tandem that were supposed to control the middle of the pitch, which did not happen. Mc Carty and Tainio are defensive players who lack the necessary creativity to be effective schemers: Lindpere is a tireless worker and Richards, coming off his most productive year as a professional, uses his speed effectively to get behind defenses. The Red Bulls need a creative midfielder in the middle of the park who can spray accurately weighted and timely

passes to dissect defenses.

Thierry Henry, who adds much scoring experience to the front-line, and Juan Agudelo started for New York, but it took new acquisition Kenny Cooper, a veteran MLS forward, to put New York on the score sheet late in the contest. A more effective midfield would have solved some of New York's scoring problems. The

talented Agudelo came into the league last year with much promise; he did exceptionally well for the U.S. national team last year, but Red Bulls coach Hans Backe has slowed his progress by using the talented player sparingly. Agudelo should have been much further ahead in his development had he been credited with the playing time that he deserved.

Last November he was named Pre-season Player of the year in the circuit by the member coaches and committee. Every body is high on Brickman.

"Having a point guard like Jason is amazing," said Jamal. "He makes the team go. He knows how to push the ball 'out."

"We are lucky to have a point guard like him leading us," Ferry added.

They got the home court advantage for all three tournament games because of the final standings which gave them an advantage in the playoffs.

How to survive in an uncertain job market

Frustrations in your job, industry, or life may make you feel like jumping ship some days. swimming toward whatever job seems the most promising at the moment. Not so fast. If you want to improve your situation long term, you need to step back, take a breath, and approach a career change thoughtfully and deliberately.

"Switching careers takes some effort," said Dr. Mary Hawkins, president of Bellevue University, 'You need to figure out what experience and skills you need and the level of education required to enter and excel in a new field."

Determine where the jobs are

Hawkins suggests starting with a website that provides data about expanding and contracting industries. The Monster Employment Index is another good resource that provides a monthly gauge of U.S. job demand.

Earn a relevant degree

According to Education Dynamics, 60 percent of U.S. jobs will require much more than a college degree by 2018.

"If you want to qualify for the jobs of tomorrow, completing a bachelor's degree is a wise move," Hawkins said.

Instead of enrolling in a degree program because you find it interesting, Hawkins recommends choosing a field of study that will translate into a job in a growth industry. She shared the following tips:

- · Check job sites to see how many jobs are available in specific industries.
- Use listed educational and skills requirements for these positions as guidelines for researching degree programs.
- · Figure out what you will actually be learning in individual courses and how you can apply this.
- · Call schools directly and ask directors of the programs vou've identified if you'll be engaged in hands-on experience while you learn.

"If you are one of the 38 million Americans with some college credit, finding a school with generous transfer policies may significantly decrease the time required to complete your degree," she continued.

Specialize to stand out

As bachelor's degrees become more the norm, job seekers will need more specialized expertise to stand out. For example, adding a concentration in logistics management or marketing will take you much further than a general business degree sans concentration.

"Employers are looking for people who have relevant skills that are specifically tailored for the job," said Hawkins. "Job seekers must find the degree and learning environment that enables them to develop the specialized skills they will need to get that job."

The workplace is changing and by starting now, vou'll have achieved the education vou'll need to succeed in the next decade.




