Hold on Jagdeo's pension bill

Guyana's major opposition coalition has withdrawn a court case challenging a hefty pension package for Bharrat Jagdeo, to allow the Caribbean Community nation's parliament the privilege of chopping the former president's remuneration to a more reasonable sum; but the work of the opposition could be stymied in the long run if Jagdeo's successor refuses to assent to the bill, making it law as is widely expected.

Filed earlier this year in the name of opposition legislator Desmond Trotman, of A Partnership

Barbados

Barbados is poised to create history this month, when it becomes the first Caribbean island to take over the chairmanship of the World Health Organization (WHO).

According to reports, Barbados taking over the chairmanship will mean that citizens from small island states will have a greater presence within that body.

Minister of Health, Donville Innis, said he wanted to see more West Indians working in international organizations.

"Barbados is a member of the executive board of the World Health Organization. We are tipped to take over as chair of the World Health Organization," he said.

Grenada

Grenada Finance Minister Nazim Burke has remained optimistic that an agreement could be reached with Taiwan regarding the repayment of a multi-million dollar loan to Grenada.

Taipei Burke said remains receptive to a new proposal presented to the Tillman Thomas government regarding the US\$30 million loan.

"We believe that some kind of resolution is present," he told report-

Grenada has proposed the consolidation of the Taiwanese loans and a new schedule of payments that starts with the first down payment of what is called a substantial part of the loan.

Billions of foreign dollars flowed into Caribbean in 2011

The United Nations' Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) says that the region received US\$153.448 billion from foreign direct investment (FDI) last year.

In a new report, "Foreign Direct Investment in Latin America and the Caribbean 2011," released in Santiago, Chile on May 3, ECLAC said the new figure represents 10 percent of the global total flows.

It said this is about the largest amount of FDI received by the region so far.

In 2010, ECLAC said the region received US\$120.880 billion, whereas in 2009, due to the international economic crisis, investments decreased to US\$81.589

Until then, the highest record had been registered in 2008. when investments amounted to US\$137.001 billion, ECLAC said.

In 2011, the main foreign direct investment recipients in the region were Brazil (US\$66.660 billion, representing 43.8 percent of the total of flows into

the region), Mexico (US\$19.440 billion), Chile (17.299 billion), Colombia (US\$13.234 billion), Peru (US\$7.659 billion), Argentina (US\$7.243 billion), Venezuela (US\$5.302 billion) and Uruguay (US\$2.528 billion).

Of these countries, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Peru and Uruguay reached "historic records," ECLAC

In Central America, ECLAC said FDI incomes increased by 36 percent compared to 2010, where the amounts received by Panama (US\$2.790 billion), Costa Rica (US\$2.104 billion) and Honduras (US\$1.014 billion) stand out.

In the Caribbean, flows soared by 20 percent compared to the previous year, with the Dominican Republic at the head with US\$2.371 billion, ECLAC said.

"In spite of the prevailing uncertainty in global financial markets, Latin American and Caribbean economies attracted important amounts of foreign direct invest-ment during 2011," said Alicia Bárcena, ECLAC's executive sec-

"These amounts should remain

high in 2012," she added.

In 2011, ECLAC said 46 percent of the net income deriving from FDI was due to profit reinvestments, whilst the remaining percentage was due to capital contributions and loans among

According to the organization, this denotes the "trust of transnational companies in the region and important business opportunities within it."

As shown in the report, ECLAC said this tendency, which started in 2002, is a result of the amount of assets accumulated by transnational companies in the region and an increase in their profitability due to the good economic performance of the countries and to high international prices of exported raw materials.

Nevertheless, ECLAC identifies a current phenomenon that is increasingly relevant since 2004: the growing repatriation of profits by transnational corporations investing in the region, "a fact that reminds that FDI is not a unidirectional flow."

Jamaican gets the ok to sue **Barbados**

The Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) has granted special leave to 24-year-old Jamaican, Shanique Myrie, to begin proceedings against the Barbados government after she alleged she was sexually assaulted by a female immigration officer, insulted and then denied entry to Barbados on March 14 last year.

The five-member panel of the CCJ, headed by its president, Sir Dennis Byron, approved the application during a special sitting in Barbados, the first time the regional court, which was established in 2001 to replace the British Privy Council, sat outside its Trinidadbased headquarters.

Attorneys for the Jamaican will now have 21 days to file the necessary documents.

She wants the court to determine what is the minimum standard of treatment to be given to CARICOM nationals moving within the region under the Revised Treaty of Chaguaramas that governs the CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME) allowing for the free movement of skills, labor. goods and services across the community.

Earlier, Myrie's attorney Michelle Brown, told the court her client was subjected to "forceful brutish language" by immigration officials at the Sir Grantley Adams International Airport on her arriv-

She said they were attempting to get Myrie to agree "she was doing something illegal, like having drugs" and had even threatened to have her jailed and twice made her bend over in order to carry out a cavity search.

The attorney argued that there was "no justification for the increasing level of the intrusion that she faced," noting that "initially Barbados claimed she (Myrie) was a victim of human trafficking.'

But she told the court that if that was the case "then the role of the government was to protect her" and not brutalize her.

The Jamaican-born attorney said her client is "still not certain what laws of Barbados she broke" resulting in her being refused entry into a CARICOM country that had signed on to the 2007 declaration allowing for the free movement of people within the region.

Trailblazer Awards from Manhattan **Borough President**

Borough President Scott Stringer presented awards recently at the seventh annual Trailblazers Program and Award Ceremony of Manhattan that recognizes members of the community that have blazed a trail for others to follow.

This year's recipients reflect civil rights activism and two very different areas in criminal justice. One of the youngest female champions of the civil rights movement, Tamika Mallory of the National Action Network (NAN), founded by the Rev.Al Sharpton, received the first award. Introduced to the world of advocacy through rallies, marches, vigils and protests by her parents, founding members of NAN, Mallory rose through the ranks of responsible positions in the organization.

At the age of 30, she is the national executive director and Rev. Sharpton's second in command. She has worked closely with the Obama Administration as a civil rights advocate in areas of education, women's rights, health care reform, gun violence and police misconduct.

Thirty-year veteran New York Times journalist (now retired) Shelia Rule's volunteer work with Riverside Churches

Prison Ministry led to correspondences with people in prison, which eventually led to her founding Think Outside the Cell Foundation and its publishing arm. Resilience Multimedia.

"Spotlighting on their humanity can make a difference," Rule said at the ceremony after receiving the award. The foundation, co-founded with her husband Joseph Robinson, seeks to end the stigma of incarceration and help those who've been in prison and their families.

"Trailblazer, no!" said third recipient Norman Seabrook, labor activist and president of the New York City Corrections Benevolent Officers Association since 1995.

"I stand on the shoulders of those before me. We have to continue to make strides for those who follow." He pointed out the eradication of representation with the Wisconsin unions and how the South is working to take away voting rights. "It's coming, a tsunami that will affect all of us," he said as he spoke of the importance of staying vigilant and being awake and

Seabrook said of Rev. Sharpton, "We don't agree on everything, but we agree that the struggle continues.'



Developing states commit to reduce reliance on fossil fuels

The United Nations said on May 9 that 20 Small Island Developing States (SIDS) have announced new actions to reduce dependence on fossil fuels and end poverty, as they wrapped up a sustainable energy conference in Barbados, organized by the U.N. and the Barbados government.

The "Barbados Declaration" calls for universal access to modern and affordable renewable energy services, while protecting the environment, ending poverty and creating new opportunities for economic growth, said the U.N. Development Program

The declaration – adopted ahead of next month's U.N. Conference on Sustainable Development (Rio+20) - includes an annex with voluntary commitments of 20 SIDS to take actions toward providing universal access to energy, switching to renewable energy and reducing dependence on fossil fuels.

It emphasizes that there are commercially feasible options in many SIDS for providing energy such as wind, solar, geothermal, and oceans energy.

"However, these technologies must be made accessible, affordable

and adaptable to the needs and particular circumstances of SIDS communities," declaration said.

"In this regard, we strongly urge the international community, particularly developed countries, to ensure the provision of financial resources, technology transfer and capacity building to SIDS," it added.

The U.N. said Barbados also announced its plan to increase the share of renewable energy in the country to 29 per cent of all electricity consumption by 2029.

Among other commitments, the Maldives plans to achieve carbon neutrality in the energy sector by vear 2020, while Sevchelles will seek to produce 15 per cent of its energy supply from renewable energy by

The declaration also recognized the importance of the Sustainable Energy for All initiative, launched by Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon last September, which seeks to ensure universal access to modern energy services, double the rate of improvement in energy efficiency and double the share of renewable energy in the global energy mix, all by 2030.

The two-day conference, which ended on May 9, brought together more than 100 heads of state, ministers, leading development experts, civil society activists, business executives and U.N. officials from 39 SIDS.

governors of New York and Massachusetts and immigrant groups, the Obama administration was expected to extend Secure Communities this week.

In a letter sent over the weekend to U.S. Attorney General Eric Holder, de Blasio warned of the risks Secure Communiites poses to public safety.

"The Secure Communities program takes fingerprints of suspects in jail and sends them to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), which, in turn, shares the information with the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)," he wrote.

"The program has resulted in the deportation of thousands of people accused—but never convicted—of committing a crime," he added.

"As a law enforcement strategy, Secure Communities has backfired, eroding the trust between immigrant communities and law enforcement—making our communities less safe," de Blasio continued.

He said local law enforcement requires the "active and sustained cooperation of immigrant communities to effectively fight crime. "The implementation of this program intimidates immigrants, reducing the likelihood that they will report crimes or come forward as witnesses for fear of risking deportation," de Blasio said.

"The Secure Communities program sends exactly the wrong message to our immigrant communities, at the expense of public safety. For the sake of our security, I urge you to stop the expansion of this program at once," he told Holder, the son of Barbadian immigrants,

In e-mails dispatched late last week to officials and the police in Massachusetts and New York, ICE officials said Secure Communities would be activated "in all remaining jurisdictions" on May 15.

"Secure Communities has proven to be the single most valuable tool in allowing the agency to eliminate the ad hoc approach of the past and focus on criminal aliens and repeat immigration law violators," said Barbara Gonzalez, an ICE spokeswoman, in a statement.

"At the end of the day, this is a federal program," she added. "We have to make our own decisions based on our law enforcement operational needs."

Last June, Massachusetts Gov.

Deval Patrick refused to sign an agreement with ICE to expand Secure Communities beyond a pilot program in the Boston area since 2006.

At the same time, New York's Gov. Andrew Cuomo, said he wanted to suspend the program, which had already been initiated in a number of counties in his state.

Critics say Secure Communities is an "overly wide dragnet" that seeks to deport a significant number of illegal Caribbean and other immigrants with no criminal record.

They also say these immigrants were arrested for minor infractions, and that the policy fosters racial profiling.

For National Unity (APNU), Trotman's lawyer Christopher Ram filed papers withdrawing the court writ, after parliamentary Speaker Raphael Trotman ruled during debate last week that the House could not debate the pension package while matter is in the court.

Oposition parties APNU and the Alliance For Change (AFC) have a one-seat majority in the 65-seat assembly and have vowed to cut Jagdeo's pension package worth \$15,000 a month, to just over a third of that amount, saying that at age 48, Jagdeo is able-bodied and has a long work life and earning possibilities ahead of him. Both had made the issue major campaign themes, and are under pressure to deliver, given public abhorrence to the bill.

The PPP had used its simple majority in the last parliament to approve the humungous pension for Jagdeo, but legislators remind constituents that the shoe is now on the other foot.


Debate on the APNU motion was suspended until the house meets again on May 30, by

which time the court case would have been withdrawn, allowing for debate of Jagdeo's controversial package, which includes tax-free salary plus benefits. However, Donald Ramotar who succeeded Jagdeo as president and is as well from the East Indian-dominated governing party, has to assent to any amended bill to make it law

The party has already signaled in the negative. Trotman said that if he fails to sign, the bill will be returned to the house for a two-thirds vote, meaning it will never become law, as government legislators won't back the opposition.

"Therefore I will have to go back to the court for a ruling as parliament would be tied up," said constitutional expert Raymond Gaskin.

Public anger at the remuneration package is directly linked to the widespread belief that the former head of state is already well off and is widely believed to have a hand in several businesses run by close associates; charges that he has denied. Critics have identified EZ Jet as one, but its front owners so Jagdeo is not linked.

"FDI revenue transferred back to the countries of origin has increased from US\$20 billion per year between 1998 and 2003 to US\$84 billion between 2008 and 2010 per year," Bárcena said.

The document also points out that FDI strengthens the specialization of production in Latin America and the Caribbean.

In 2011, it says 57 percent of foreign direct investments received by South America (except Brazil) were directed to the natural resources sector, 36 percent to services and 7 percent to manufacturing. In exchange, 7.8 percent of FDI received by Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean

were oriented to natural resources, 39.7 percent to manufacturing and 52.5 percent to services.

Meanwhile, 46.4 percent of foreign direct investments received by Brazil were directed to manufacturing, 44.3 percent to services and 9.2 percent to natural resources, the report says.

"In this context, it is urgent to promote policies to guide FDI and leverage its potential benefits, among which are the knowledge and technological exchange and the increase of local capacities by strengthening national innovation systems, creating production chains, building human capacity and fostering local entrepreneurial development,"

Bárcena said

Investments made by Latin American and Caribbean transnational corporations -also known as trans-Latins-decreased to US\$ 22.605 billion in 2011 - having amounted to US\$44.924 billion in 2010, ECLAC said.

In spite of this decrease, ECLAC underlined that these corporations are still in an expansion phase.

The ECLAC report shows that the European Union (EU), as a bloc, is the largest investor in Latin America and the Caribbean.

In the last decade, the EU invested an average of US\$30 billion per year in the region, representing 40 percent of the total received, ECLAC said.

Bronx residents respond to racial profiling in schools

Bronx residents are protesting the current New York City Department of Education (DOE) disciplinary polices that have moved children from school directly into the criminal justice system.

On Thursday, May 10, the New Settlement Parent Action Committee assembled more than 100 Bronx parents, students, educators, faith leaders, community organizations, and advocates in a large community march entitled "Education, Not Incarceration!"

The stops of the community march itself illustrated the trajectory of the school-to-prison pipeline: an early childhood education center; elementary, middle, and high schools; the Bronx Suspensions Hearing Center, and finally Horizon Juvenile Detention Center, all within blocks of each other.

Aminata Sillah, a 15-year-old freshman at local high school Green Dot, reflected on how close to home the issue of youth criminalization hits for her: "Sometimes from school, I can hear the orders given on the bullhorn at Horizon where students like me are jailed, and it makes me think what it would be like to have them in classes here with me instead."

The Bronx-based groups argue that harsh and punitive disciplinary measures that remove children from the classroom for minor incidents only exacerbate the problem of school pushout, and differentially impact youth of color.

In the last school year, there were more than 73,000 suspensions, with Black students receiving over 50 percent of all suspensions, a rate nearly double their enrollment figures within New York City public schools.

Similarly, in just three months of the current school year, there were 279 school-based arrests made citywide, with an average of more than five arrests of school children per day. The Bronx tops the list, possessing the highest rate of both school-based arrests

and summonses.

The DOE's subcontracting of school safety under the New York Police Department (NYPD) has drawn serious questions about the relationship between the two city agencies as it relates to matters of student discipline.

It is important to understand the magnitude of the NYPD's current jurisdiction over school safety. The DOE has allotted \$300 million annually to the NYPD's School Safety Division; with more than 5000 agents, the School Safety Division alone is the fifth largest police force in the country.

The prioritization of resources towards school policing as opposed to student social and emotional support, and the most current set of statistics from the Student Safety Act depict the disproportional impact of schoolbased arrests upon youth of color.

"I think there's a bit of racism in here – a rose by any other name is still a rose, and in this case, it's


called racism. The DOE needs to get the message that we as parents and community members are responsible for the welfare and the future of our children, and we're not going to sit back and allow them to be pipelined to prison," noted Joseph Ferdinand, a leader with the New Settlement Parent Action Committee.

The Bronx-based groups are demanding that the DOE take seriously the urgency around disciplinary practices that are leading students towards incarceration instead of graduation. They are calling on the DOE to do the

following:

- Fund and implement positive discipline programs like conflict resolution and peer mediation in all Bronx public schools.
- Invest in social and emotional supports for students by having a sufficient number of guidance staff at least one guidance counselor per 100 students as well as a licensed, full-time social worker in all Bronx public schools.
- Reduce the number of suspensions and arrests by 50 percent by September 2013.



Exports from hell

Anyone who has witnessed the coal extraction process known as mountaintop removal (MTR) has been shocked. The name is perfectly descriptive—tops of mountains are blasted away and bulldozed into valleys to expose underlying coal seams that can be cheaply and efficiently extracted. MTR is violence and destruction on a scale we associate with war, not industrial activity.

As in any war, there are lots of explosions—every day in central Appalachia thousands of tons of high explosives are detonated. And there are casualties—dozens of people have been killed by floods, mudslides, and overloaded coal trucks. One three-year-old boy was crushed in his bed when a boulder from an MTR site crashed through his home as he lay sleeping. The mining company called the death an "act of God" and paid a \$15,000 fine for illegally operating the equipment that dislodged the boulder.

These are the obvious casualties. It's much harder to count the number of premature deaths from cancer, kidney failure, liver failure and birth defects caused by breathing the polluted air and drinking the contaminated water that are the natural byproducts of MTR.

By the end of this 2012, it's estimated that more than 1,200 square miles of Appalachian forests will have been wiped out by MTR-that's an area the size of the state of Rhode Island. The impact on human health, biodiversity, air, and water quality is so extreme that you have to assume that the U.S. is permitting MTR only because we simply cannot keep our utilities and factories running without it. But in fact, the acceleration of MTR over the past two decades has accompanied a robust coal export market that has expanded rapidly in the past five years. It turns out that we are destroying entire regions of our country to meet the energy demands of other nations. Welcome to America, the new third world.

It's astonishing that the tragedy of MTR continues to be ignored by our political leaders and the press. If more than a thousand square miles of America had been laid waste by a foreign enemy, or some cataclysmic act of nature, it would be the media story of the century. But coal corporations are systematically obliterating central Appalachia, and it's as if the destruction is invisible, or is happening somewhere else, not in our own backyard.

Now, rather than moving to stem MTR,

the U.S. is about to embark on another ruinous enterprise, one that will also pollute the air, poison drinking water, and may trigger an unprecedented health crisis. And once again, it's all about exports. That is to say, it's all about money.

High-volume hydraulic fracturing (HVHF, or fracking) is a relatively new technology first tested in the Barnett Shale fields of North Texas in the late 1990s. The basic principle is simple—and frightening. Inject millions of gallons of toxic fluids underground and create enough pressure to pulverize the rock that contains the deposits of oil or gas. In MTR, the rock is smashed in the open air; in HVHF, it's smashed thousands of feet below the surface.

The underground injection of vast quantities of toxic fluid has obvious risks, and HVHF has already been linked to over a thousand instances of water contamination around the nation. A peer-reviewed scientific study has shown that the extraction and transmission of shale gas releases so much methane into the atmosphere that it actually has a greater greenhouse emissions footprint than coal. Another peer-reviewed study has shown drinking water wells near shale gas wells are seventeen times more likely to be contaminated with methane than other wells in the area.

The industry is waving the flag of energy independence to get Americans to overlook the risks and buy into fracking, but the rush to produce shale gas has little to do with domestic energy needs. At the same time, the industry is sounding patriotic themes, it is also planning to build the infrastructure that will allow it to ship huge quantities of shale gas to overseas markets, where it will command prices that are five, or six, or seven times higher than they are here at home.

In a few years the U.S. will go from being an importer of natural gas to being a major exporter. In fact, we may end up exporting shale gas to countries, such as France, that have decided that fracking is much too risky to be permitted. But France doesn't have to worry, it can always protect public health and its environment by relying on shale gas from that sacrificial energy colony across the Atlantic—the United States of America.

Obama, bin Laden and Mitt Romney

The partisan squabbling over the killing of Osama bin Laden is a typical election-year distraction, effectively squelching discussion of more important matters one year after the execution of the al-Qaeda chief

Aided by cable-TV talking heads, Americans are spending too much time speculating over whether presumptive Republican presidential nominee Mitt Romney would have given the order to get bin Laden, and also issuing paeans to President Obama's "courage." (We have a strange notion of courage. Did Obama risk his own life? Of course not. He was safe in the White House Situation Room. Perhaps he "risked" his political career, but even that isn't certain. A failed operation might have won him sympathy for a good try. On the other hand, the men under his command were ordered to risk their lives and the lives of oth-

While the commentators are engaged in trivialities, big foreign-policy questions are ignored.

For instance, although bin Laden is dead, his strategy of sucking the United States into bloody, expensive imperial wars in the Muslim world has worked like a charm. In a video released in 2004, bin Laden said, "We are continuing this policy in bleeding America to the point of bankruptcy. Allah willing, and nothing is too great for Allah." He compared what was happening in Afghanistan then to the previous Soviet debacle there. "We, alongside the mujahideen, bled Russia for 10 years until it went bankrupt and was forced to withdraw in defeat."

Ironically, President Jimmy Carter's national-security adviser, Zbigniew Brzezinski, has bragged that he helped draw the Soviet Union into Afghanistan in 1979 precisely to mire the Russians in their own "Vietnam." That experience failed to deter President George W. Bush from blindly following in the Soviets' footsteps; nor did it keep Obama from redoubling this futile effort, including a major expansion of drone attacks in Pakistan, which have killed at least 1,400 people since Obama took office. The U.S. government has been fighting the same people it helped fight the Soviets.

"All that we have to do is to send two mujahedeen to the furthest point east to raise a piece of cloth on which is written al Qaeda, in order to make generals race there to cause America to suffer human, economic and political losses without their achieving anything of note other than some benefits for their private corporations," bin Laden said.

Right he was. The Obama administration ruthlessly drone-bombs Yemen and Somalia to eradicate the "threat" from real or potential al-Qaeda affiliates in those countries. Even American officials are aware that this policy creates anti-American militants. This is not rocket science. Bomb people, and they will dislike you — and perhaps seek revenge.


Bin Laden got his wish. America's fiscal house couldn't be more disorderly. The debt is over \$15 trillion, larger than the GDP. The Congressional Research Service says that from 2001 to 2011 the Afghan war cost \$443 billion. Tens of thousands of civilians have been killed, and many more maimed. American deaths total more than 1,800, with well over 15,000 wounded. The number of survivors whose lives have been effectively destroyed is uncountable. And that leaves the Iraq war out of the account. Al-Qaeda wasn't even in that country until George W. Bush invaded in 2003.

The point is that we let bin Laden take our eyes off the ball. He and al-Qaeda were creatures of American policy, though not in the sense that U.S. agents funded him or set up his organization. Rather, he turned his wrath toward America (and away from U.S.-backed Middle Eastern oppressors) as it became apparent that so much of the misery inflicted on the Muslim world had its origins in Washington, D.C.

The sources of misery include the decade-long economic sanctions on Iraq, which killed half a million children — a price pronounced "worth it" in 1996 by President Clinton's then-UN ambassador and later secretary of state Madeleine Albright; the stationing of U.S. troops near holy places in Saudi Arabia; and the continuing subjugation of Palestinians by U.S.-backed Israel. In the absence of those and related policies, bin Laden would have had no interest in seeing U.S. territory attacked.

To be sure, bin Laden is gone. But the abominable foreign policy goes on.

Justice for Black farmers realized

The 180-day period for monetary claims by Black farmers against the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) expired on May 11.

When these farmers filed their class-action lawsuit in the mid-1990s (Pigford vs. Glickman), they were but acting on what had been known for decades. Namely, that Blacks had always been systematically discriminated against by the USDA.

The history has been bleak. When Congress created the USDA's Farmers Home Administration in 1942, it was supposed to be the "lending institution of last resort" for farmers. It was created to save America's family farmers as they struggled after the devastating 1930's depression. But Black farmers then and up to now have never been able to access the loans and other program services at the USDA in an equitable fashion. In fact, in 1982 the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights reported that the primary reason Blacks had lost land was because of the USDA itself and lack of services.

In the USDA regulations, in fact, it states that the USDA offices are supposed provide loan applications and assistance to farmers in filling out the applications. The USDA is supposed to offer loan servicing advice and opportunities for farmers who are having trouble making their payments. If approved for a loan, the payments are supposed to be provided in a timely fashion. These are just some examples.

For Black farmers, however, in most instances the USDA office would not even provide a loan application. And if the farmer did receive an application and was approved for a loan, in many instances the loan came too late to plant that year's crop. Black farmers were also in many instances given a "supervised account" where they

did not receive the money outright but were required to go to the USDA for the loan officer or supervisor to write the check for supplies, etc.

The consequences of all of this has been costly for Black farmers because invariably they would have to get loans from supply houses or banks at exceptionally high interest rates or they went without and sought other jobs to make a living. Often land was lost and marriages destroyed.

A settlement agreement for the class action lawsuit was approved on April 14, 1999, and the deadline for submitting a claim as a class member was October 12, 1999.

Because it became clear that many Blacks where not aware of the settlement, on July 14, 2000 Judge Paul Friedman in the U.S. District Court ruled that individuals could file a petition explaining why they missed the 1999 deadline. Close to 90,000 individuals filed a late petition up until June 18, 2008.

Further, thanks to the Congressional Black Caucus a provision was inserted in the 2008 Farm Bill permitting individuals who had submitted a late-filing request under Pigford to submit a claim form. This portion of lawsuit for the "late" claimants became known as Pigford II.

Thankfully, in November 2010, Congress appropriated \$1.25 billion for those Pigford II claims.

Like the original Pigford case, the Pigford II settlement provides both a fast-track settlement process and higher payments to potential claimants who go through a more rigorous review and documentation process. A moratorium on foreclosures of most claimants' farms will remain in place until after claimants have gone through

the claims process

In some states, there are meetings being held suggesting, unfortunately, that it's still possible to get into this lawsuit. This has led to considerable misinformation circulating around the South about who is entitled to seek an award. One thing's for sure: No one should have to pay money to be part of the Pigford lawsuit. Class counsel lawyers will help fill out claims at no cost. There is also assistance from community advocates, like the staff of the Federation of Southern Cooperatives/Land Assistance Fund and other farmers' groups in the Network of Black Farm Groups and Advocates.

Many original claimants are now deceased. There are provisions in the settlement for their next of kin or heirs to file a claim on their behalf. Persons filing on behalf of a deceased relative must furnish a death certificate for the claimant and must know the details and circumstances of their farming operation and USDA loan or non-loan program denial.

As there is a finite sum of money for the settlement, which has to be used to pay all legal, notice and administrative expenses, as well as pay the farmers, the judge has ruled that no funds for successful claims will be distributed until after the claims period and the evaluation of all claims. This means that funds won't be distributed until late 2010 or early 2013.

For years African-American farmers were denied access to USDA funds and services. Now we have an opportunity to correct this wrong.

policies on discipline and the joke that suspensions have become.

No mention on how difficult it is to have dangerous/disruptive and even violent students in the schools involuntarily transferred.

No mention of how the systems in place to deal with truancy have failed and the government agencies in place to address them are ineffective (ACS on Education Neglect, PINS petitions at Family Court).

No mention on how the DOE has failed to implement remediation programs at the junior high level to help to produce high school ready students.

No mention of the fact that English language acquisition may mean students take longer to graduate. We are all being rated on our four-year graduation rates but the City is not taking fairly enough into account the fact that truancy, suspensions, English Language Learners, students with disabilities, literacy level, socio-

economic status, socialemotional issues, etc., are harsh realities in all these neighborhoods and that the majority of these students will need extra time to meet NYC graduation requirements.

Changing the names of the school and playing musical chairs with teachers are not going to solve the problem of low acheivement. There is a happy medium out there. Fund the schools, support them, use demographics sensitive criteria to rate these schools, adjust the city's failing policies and develop a teacher evaluation method that is more accurate and thorough so that the 10 percent of low performing eduators can be identified and either supported or dealt with accordingly.

This "turnaround model" is disregarding and disrespectful of the students and the relationships they have formed with their teachers.

counselors, coaches, club and team leaders, mentors in their second home and in some cases, their only real sense of family. The senior and junior class of students will be thrust into the chaos and uncertainty that this "turnaround model" promises and it is not fair. This is not the time for them to be experiencing any form of uncertainty. They deserve better consideration.





Tips for women to prevent common health problems

You may not realize it, but your lifestyle could be putting you at risk for common health problems that afflict women. National Women's Health Week, observed May 13-19, is a great reminder to brush up on some facts that can help you stay healthy.

Breast Cancer

The causes of breast cancer are complicated, but some significant risk factors are preventable. Obesity is one such risk, and even moderate weight loss helps protect you. Cutting down on alcohol will also improve your chances of staying breast cancer-free.

It's impossible to eliminate your risk entirely, but early detection will improve your prognosis. Conduct regular self-breast examinations and let your doctor know if you detect anything unusual. Follow the National

Cancer Institute guidelines and get a mammogram annually when you turn 40.

Toxic Shock Syndrome

You may regard Toxic Shock Syndrome (TSS) as rare, but one in 700 women will experience tamponrelated TSS, according to You ARE Loved, a non-profit working to educate girls and women about the disease. TSS is a bacterial infection characterized by sudden high fever, diarrhea, rash, muscle aches and headache. You can significantly reduce vour risk of this life-threatening disease with a trip to the drug store.

"Historically, tampon use has been linked to half of all TSS cases, so simply switching to a safer product is a terrific safeguard against this disease," says Dr. Christine Ko, an expert in women's

health. You likely are familiar with pads, but there are alternatives you may find more convenient. For example, Softcup is a flexible cup worn internally around your cervix. It's hypo-allergenic, latex-free and has never been linked to TSS. There's an added benefit too: products like Softcup can be worn for up to 12 hours and don't leave behind the residual fibers and traces of bleach, dioxins and other residues that tampons can. It won't change your body's natural pH or bacteria levels either, reducing your risk for infec-

Doctor, Doctor Questions Often Asked

Swelling of the feet and legs

Most people, when they notice swelling of their feet and legs are keenly aware that something is wrong. The problem is that there are so many medical conditions that can result in such swelling, the average person is at a loss to understand the specific cause of their problem. Often the first thing that comes to mind is the salt content of the food thay ate at the Chinese restaurant the night before.

Leg swelling is a fairly common symptom of both heart or kidney failure, which can be considered central causes as opposed to local causes, such as venous insufficiency of the legs, where, the swelling is limited only to the legs and feet. In other words, the mechanism is local and not central. With venous insufficiency, the edema decreases by the morning, but does not move elswhere.

Diuretics (water pills) are often mistakenly prescribed for the treatment of edema of venous insufficiency. The mistake is that in venous insufficiency. there is not an excessive amount of water trapped in the body, such as might occur in cardiac or renal failure, but rather an abnormal distribution of a normal amount of water due to leaking venous valves.

A third type of edema, fortunately rare but often confused with the edema of venous insufficiency of the legs is lymphedema. Lymphedema is retention of lymphatic fluid in the soft tissue. To understand this, you must first be aware that arteries and veins are

not the only fluid carrying conduits or vessels in our bodies.

There is another complete system of conduits known as the lymphatic system. If you could measure all the arterial blood pumped into the legs over the course of a day and at the same time, measure all of the venous blood being returned from the legs during that same day, you would find that the volume of the blood being pumped into the legs daily through the arteries was greater than the volume of blood being returned through the veins. The reason the legs don't inflate like balloons is because the extra fluid, known as lymph is constantly being drawn off by the lymphatic system. This complex system of lymphatic vessels passes through many lymph nodes and ends up redepositing the lymphatic fluid into the venous system high in the chest close to the heart.

Obstructions to the flow of lymph may occur as a result of scarification from surgery, radiation, cancerous obstruction to lymph nodes, and vascular injuries. Further there is another broad group of people who suffer with leg swelling related to a lack of protein, specifically albumin in the blood. This is by no means a complete description of all the conditions that can cause swelling of the legs. Should your legs become swollen, see your doctor for guidance as to the best way to proceed.

Free training for entrepreneurs

Jessie Lee is the director of Small Business Services, a program of Brooklynbased CAMBA, a multi-service non-profit agency. The Business program offers free business training and counsel to the community.

This division sees 2000 individuals a year, helping them start businesses that range from food-based, to childcare, to retail products, to services (like photography and graphic arts). CAMBA serves primarily low-income, minority persons and women.

Often, those that come to CAMBA have difficulty getting a living-wage job because they may have children at home or struggle with English. Many who turn to the program have a good skill or an idea, and they say, "I want to be my own boss."

"One of the biggest issues for a potential business," Lee explains, "is targeting your market, knowing and finding your niche. For example, you might have a product, a tee shirt that lights up at night." Lee asks, "but who are you going to sell this to?" She mentioned that a number of other good ideas come through the door with out planning how to market the item. CAMBA helps all kinds of businesses.

It's not just about having a good idea. Says Lee, "A business is more than just a good idea. It takes management."

Lee recommends seeking business counseling before putting your savings into the business idea. An experienced business counselor can guide you through the business process.

And where do you find a business counselor? CAMBA has three counselors in its economic development division.

Counseling services are also available at the SBA (Small Business Administration-a federal government program) (archive.sba.gov/services/counseling/index.html) and

the New York State Business Development Center (www. nyssbdc.org/). The organization SCORE provides free local mentoring from experienced "older" business people who volunteer their time (www.score.org).

CAMBA's free start-up workshop series includes business basics (and choosing a business legal structure), planning that gets funding, marketing, access to capital, credit repair, how to start and operate a home based business and how to become a licensed childcare provider.

Each course is offered every month.

Business practices the novice might be unaware of are how to create a profit/loss (cash flow) statement or which necessary business licenses are needed (e.g. business registration or incorporation).

Its three-session series offered each month called "entrepreneurial finance module" —the beginner, learning Basic Excel spreadsheets, or intermediate level—is intended for existing or startup businesses with a need to develop, manage and understand basic financial statements. Skills learned at these sessions are essential if applying for a loan.

Also, the third Thursday of every month, CAMBA offers a two-hour course in writing a business plan.

Lee says that a high percentage of CAMBA's small business clients turn to them only after problems arise "when they need help and want to revamp the business" and often when it's too late to rescue the business

One successful, but challenging client was a woman who had started a business making party favors. She had a small store and taught classes. When the economy plummeted, her retail business followed suit.

By the time she came to CAMBA, she was two months overdue on rent and facing possible eviction. CAMBA encouraged her to put the retail on hold, give up the physical store and concentrate on giving classes, which required little overhead. CAMBA enrolled her in its social media business courses and taught her how to market her classes online -- thus lowering


her marketing expenses and growing her teaching income.

She is now getting back on her business back on its feet.

CAMBA works closely with local banks, and many referrals come through the banks' small business services, typically when a bank client can't qualify for a conventional loan. CAMBA will work with the clients to create business plans, and then provide small loans.

Succeeding in business, starting and running a small business, takes hard work, planning and a strong knowledge of the nuts and bolts of solid business practices.

De Blasio to City Hall: Don't privatize parking meters

In a letter to Mayor Bloomberg, Public Advocate Bill de Blasio warned that privatizing the City's 40,000 parking meters could lead to higher parking costs and wasted taxpayer dollars. De Blasio called on the Mayor to halt privatization plans announced earlier this week, citing Chicago's costly experience.

The full letter follows:

Dear Mayor Bloomberg:

I write to oppose your Administration's plan to privatize nearly 40,000 parking meters across New York City. As we have seen in cities like Chicago, privatization can lead to higher costs for drivers and small business owners at a time when they can ill afford it. The pitfalls of this proposal far outweigh its benefits-and we must prevent it from advancing any

Privatization risks exposing out small businesses and residents to:

Higher Costs: I am particularly concerned by your Administration's refusal to come clean about potential rate hikes accompanying privatization. Given the experiences of cities across the country, struggling business owners and residents in New York have every right to worry about higher costs--and no reason to trust


in the current process to protect their interests.

Disruption and Waste: Given the City's poor track record with CityTime, the overhaul of 911, NYCHA's "NICE" computer software and malfunctioning water meter readers, I fear that the ill-considered rollout of yet another new technology could lead to significant disruption and spiraling costs for taxpayers. Current oversight of these projects is simply not sufficient.

Loss of Accountability: Ceding authority over parking spaces and meters to a private company would place a matter of City policy into the hands of a private company, and reduce the system's accountability to the people who use our streets every day. If achieving better performance from our streets and parking are the objectives and they should be-privatization is not the way to achieve them.

Our streets are not assets to be sold, nor are parking spaces simply a revenue tool. They are an essential public good that millions of New Yorkers rely upon. I urge you to halt this process now, before walking any further down the path of privatization.

has been demanding the full payment, arguing that Grenada, which a few years ago dumped Taiwan in favor of China, defaulted on the loans.

Taiwan has been successful in a United States court to get companies operating withhold the payments of fees to the statutory bodies. However, Grenada contends that the ruling is illegal since the statutory bodies operate independent of the Central government.

Guyana

Guyana is looking to assist cash-strapped low-cost carrier REDjet.

REDjet's Chief Executive Officer Ian Burns met recently with Guyana's Ministry of Public Works and Transport and the Ministry of Tourism to discuss financial assistance to get back into the air.

REDjet's proposals are now on the desk of President Donald Ramoutar.

While acting Tourism

Minister Irfaan Ali declined to comment on how much money the Barbados-based airline has requested, he confirmed that their recommendations would be engaging

the attention of Cabinet.

Ali said that government officials had indicated that the issue of the airline not having a valid Air Operator's Certificate also needed a resolution.

The certificate was suspended by the Barbados Civil Aviation Department recently following the March 16 suspension of services announcement.

Jamaica

In a statement, Caribbean Airlines Ltd. (CAL) said it informed the Jamaican Airline Pilots Association and the pilot body of its intention to offer contracts of employment with CAL.

"The employment of the pilots to CAL will see the company using a transparent process to ensure a smooth and seamless transi-

tion. All benefits remained unchanged," it said.

CAL's acting chief executive offer Robert Corbie said the pilots will be offered contracts under CAL, but it was too early to say if all 55 would apply for the jobs.

Jamaica

Human rights lobby group Jamaica for Justice (JFJ) was joined recently by other civic organizations to stage a peaceful protest outside the Ministry of National Security to bring attention to the increasing number of police killings this year.

Since the start of the year 47 civilians have been killed by members of the Jamaican Constabulary Force.

The latest victim was a 16-year-old Immaculate High School student Vanessa Kirkland. She was shot and killed in what police claim was a confrontation with criminals. However, residents say Vanessa and four friends were on their way to a party in Greenwich Farm

when police opened fire on the vehicle.

Jamaica

Police in Jamaica have arrested six persons accused of stealing tens of thousands of dollars from U.S. citizens through a lottery scam.

Investigators said in a statement that one of the men had more than US\$60,000 in an account believed to belong to the victims. Police also seized computers, information on the lottery scam and lists of U.S. victims with their addresses and other personal information.

The arrest came after police contacted a U.S. victim they say lost \$120,000 through the scam.

Jamaica has long operated as a center for international telemarketing frauds that target elderly Americans and rake in more than US\$300 million a year.


St. Vincent


As the duo got older, they found the faith of Rastafari and created songs which expressed their spiritual beliefs.

Kwaxicolor(Martinique). Traditional Guadeloupe Lewoz, Christian Laviso, FM Laeti and others.

Sugar cane plays a prominent role in the history of Marie-Galante, called the island of a hundred windmills at one time. Today, for the most part, untouched by tourism development, it offers much to visitors who are interested in that history. Many argue the rum made here is the best in Guadeloupe or the pink sand beaches that ring the island.

Terre de Blues, the name suggests roots music, and implicitly acknowledges the African slaves who labored in the sugar plantation and left a rich musical legacy. Friday will be an evening of Lewoz, the Guadeloupe music that is a direct descendant of these roots. Passions rising and falling with the collective rhythm of the drums and the swirl of the dancers' skirts, it brings listeners into the rural village an unforgettable experience for those who have not experienced it.

Lura opens Saturday's show with a set of batuku, funana, coladeira, and morna, the folk rhythms of the Cape Verdean islands, When Lura walks into the spotlight she embodies the beauty, strength and vulnerability of the small chain of islands in the Atlantic. She delivers these local songs with a succinct directness of a country girl when she does a Batuku, such as "Rabolta Ruben Manuel." The music came about as a way for women to sing and dance during the colonial period when drumming was banned. She sits and pounds out the rhythm on a tightly rolled tchabeta (loincloth) just as women did in a circle while pounding laundry.

We jump to the contemporary era when FM Laeti takes the stage. Born into a musical family, the Guadeloupe native has also lived in Europe, Canada, and the USA. Her distills her global experiences into a powerfully simple soulful approach as expressed on "Rise in the Sun" and "Out of My Hands" from her sparkling debut album "It Will Come Around," released in October. As a soul singer on the rise, she makes a triumphant return to her Caribbean roots.

Richie Spice headlines the evening featuring music from "Book of Job" his 2011 release. The title signifies his commitment to Rastafarian values and roots reggae culture. The album is an expression of these beliefs delivered in the mellow easy listening style for which he is known.

Jazz to Blues to Reggae is the musical journey, Sunday, beginning with a robust set of Kreyol Jazz from Guadeloupean jazz guitarist Christian Laviso. Christian will be joined by saxophonist David Murray. Murray returns to Guadeloupe, he has also performed there with the Gwo Ka masters, follows with his latest project the Heritage Blues Orchestra, a twelve piece ensemble playing traditional and original blues, featuring James "Blood" Ulmer on guitar. Capping the show will be a set of high energy hard hitting Ivorian Reggae from Alpha Blondy. Blondy whose 30 year career speaking out on issues of injustice carries forward Bob Marley's enormous influence on the African continent.

Monday, begins with Albita, the Grammywinning Cuban vocalist, followed by Martiniquan Zouk artists Kwaxicolor and Dominica's Triple

Superheroes unite to save the planet

"The Avengers"
Excellent (4 stars)
Rated PG-13 for intense violence and a drug reference.

"The Avengers" is the sixth installment in the Marvel Cinematic Universe franchise launched in 2008 with "Iron Man," and followed by "The Incredible Hulk," "Iron Man 2," "Thor" and "Captain America." What makes this adventure unique is that it's the first in the series to revolve around a team of comic book superheroes.

The actors playing those

title characters reprise their roles with the excention of Edward Norton who has been replaced as The Hulk by Mark Ruffalo. Otherwise, we again have Chris Hemsworth as Thor. Robert Downey, Jr. as Iron Man, and Chris Evans as Captain America. The film also features the return of Jeremy Renner as Hawkeye and of Scarlett Johansson as Black Widow, who appeared in Thor and Iron Man 2, respectively.

Since we've already met all the members of "The Avengers," director Josh Whedon doesn't have to waste time familiarizing us with their unique abilities. Instead, the plot unfolds right on the heels of the post-closing credits scene of the previous sequel which



had Nick Fury (Samuel L. Jackson) ominously enlisting the assistance of Captain America for a dangerous mission with global ramifications.

So, it's no surprise that, at this picture's point of departure, we find Fury assembling "The Avengers." After all, as the director of the top secret espionage agency, S.H.I.E.L.D. (an acronym for Strategic Home Intervention, Enforcement and Logistics Division), it is his job to protect humanity, especially from a diabolical villain bent on world domination.

In this case, that would be Thor's evil, presumablyexiled brother, Loki (Tom Hiddleston), who has managed not only to escape from an outer space abyss on Asgard but has gotten his hands on the Tesseract, a cosmic cube containing the key to limitless, sustainable energy. With Loki en route to Earth, it falls to Fury to plan a coordinated defense of the planet.

That task proves easier said than done, since it calls for cooperation among individualistic superheroes with fragile egos who aren't used to sharing the limelight. Thus, we are treated to pre-showdown posturing when Iron Man teases Thor about both his accent and costume by asking, "Doth mother know thy wear her drapes?" Or when he sarcastically compliments Dr. Bruce Banner (aka The Hulk) by saying, "I'm a big fan of how you lose control

and turn into a giant green monster."

Of course, such witty banter subsides in favor of camaraderie once Loki arrives with his army of alien warriors called Chitauri. Each Avenger's talent comes in handy, of course, during the ensuing, eye-grabbing fight sequences, including Hawkeye's bow-and-arrow, Thor's hammer, Captain America's shield, and so forth.

Test cricket in the West Indies is boring, according to a recent study.


Test matches played have produced the fewest percentage of results and lowest scoring rates in world cricket since the beginning of the 2000s.

This was revealed on the website Cricinfo.com recently.

According to the research, there have been 37 results in 61 Tests in the region during the period, making for a rate of 60.65 percent is marginally lower than India (63.16 percent), New Zealand (68.63 percent) and Pakistan (68.75 percent).

Meanwhile, at the top of the list (excluding minnows Bangladesh and Zimbabwe) are Australia (86.11 percent) and England

Red Bulls Win


The Red Bulls (7-3-1) continued their winning ways at PPL Park in Chester (PA) with a

With a Rate Per Over (RPO) of 2.98, they trail Zimbabwe (3.03) and Sri Lanka (3.10) at the bottom of the list while England (3.44), Australia (3.36) and South Africa (3.30) again occupy the three top spots.

The West Indies is the only nation in which the average run rate in Tests has been less than three per over

The website was unflattering in its assessment of Caribbean wickets.

"There used to be a time when cricket in the West Indies used to be about quick pitches, which encouraged bowlers to bowl fast and batsmen to score quickly - in the 1980s the West Indies was the only region in which the average scoring rate in Test cricket was more than three runs per over.

Those were the golden days of West Indian cricket, when most of the batsmen were aggressive and bowlers bowled fast, according to the research.

"Now, cricket in the West Indies is often characterized by slow pitches and slow outfields, which means batsmen do not get value for their shots, fast bowlers don't get much out of it, and bowlers in general struggle to get batsmen out quickly."

The website noted that the recent series marked the first time since 2000 that Australia's run rate in a series was less than three runs per over.






