Modest economic growth for Caribbean

By Nelson A. King

Caribbean Community (CARICOM) countries recorded modest economic growth last year, as they sought to address the global economic and financial fallout. So says the Barbados-based Caribbean Development Bank (CDB).

The bank, however, is projecting economic growth of between one and 1.5 per cent this year.

In its annual review on May 22, the CDB said growth ranged from a downturn in countries like Trinidad and Tobago, Antigua and Barbuda and St. Vincent and the Grenadines to marginal growth in Barbados,



Grenada PM survives a no-confidence vote

A large number of Grenadians turned out for a rally on May 20 to "give thanks and to celebrate the government's defeat of an opposition no-confidence motion in Parliament," according to a government release.

Prime Minister Tillman Thomas described the no-confidence motion and related events of the past two weeks as an "unwelcomed distraction" which attracted "much negative attention," and reaffirmed his commitment to the values he set out prior to assuming office in July 2008.

"Many of you were apprehensive about your government," Thomas said, adding: "I was never in doubt, because I firmly believe that God is in full control. So today, we give thanks to the Almighty for taking us thus far."

Speaking to a crowd estimated by police to be more than 2,000-strong, Thomas stressed that his administration will maintain its core values of integrity, honesty, accountability, transparency, good governance, respect for law and order, love and concern

"for all our people."

"These are the values that I subscribe to, and I will remain committed to them."

The Grenadian leader also used the opportunity to thank his parliamentary colleagues for voting against the no-confidence motion.

S. Korea urged to share ideas with region

The executive secretary of the U.N. Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), Alicia Bárcena, has urged South Korea to share its "enormous" production and consumption processes with Latin America and the Caribbean.

"Current patterns of economic growth in Latin America and the Caribbean are not consistent with a sustainable development," said Bárcena on May 17 at the conclusion of an official visit to the Republic of Korea, during which she met with authorities of the Asian country and participated in the 2012 High-Level Forum on Korea-Latin American and Caribbean partnership.

"The magnitude of the efforts needed to change this situation implies significant modifications to current production, consumption and distribution patterns, as well as transforming the technological paradigm and the existing relative prices structure," she

"Cooperation is crucial for accelerating this transition, and Korea's experience is invaluable in this regard," Bárcena contin-

She urged Latin America and the Caribbean and Korea to capitalize on the "vast potential of South-South cooperation to 'green' their economic links."

Bárcena said actions that can be adopted for achieving this goal include diversification of trade and the promotion of regional exports, "with increased added value and knowledge," as well as the creation of incentives for bi-regional foreign direct invest-

In addition, she called for the participation of firms from both regions in global and regional value chains, the creation of bi-regional business alliances, improvement in cooperation on research and development, and the promotion of innovation, human capital and trade facilita-

Bárcena said she specified emerging cooperation opportunities between Latin America and the Caribbean and the Republic of Korea "due to structural changes in the Korean economy and the country's accumulation of knowledge on good practices."

Combating acts of violence against Caribbean women

The Organization of American States (OAS) and Chile recently signed a Letter of Intent to strengthen capacities in the area of violence against women in the Eastern Caribbean.

OAS Secretary General Jose Miguel Insulza, said combating violence against women is among the priority areas for the hemispheric organization as evidenced by the follow-up provided to the Convention of Belem do Para, the agreement signed in 1994 by the countries of the hemisphere to protect women's human rights and eliminate cases of violence against them.

"The problem still exists, but we are working very hard to reduce it," he said, adding that "it is very important that we continue providing technical assistance to countries to improve their legislation" in order to address the problem with better legal instruments.

Chile's Foreign Affairs Minister Alfredo Moreno, said that his country has enjoyed a good relationship with the Englishspeaking Caribbean and recently made a US\$1 million contribution for social development in the region.

He said \$113,000 of the funds would be used to strengthen capacity in the area of combating violence against women in the Eastern Caribbean.

'The ability of Caribbean countries to act together with the international community and to create a common market of 16 million people is a lesson for all of use," said Moreno, making reference to the regional integration movement, CARICOM.



Tribute to Our Ancestors

On Saturday, June 9, from 12 noon to sunset, the 23rd Annual Tribute to Our Ancestors of the Middle Passage will be held on the boardwalk at West 16th St. (Ancestors Circle) in Coney Island, Brooklyn, the site where some of the earliest slave ships once docked.

Sponsored by Akeem Productions and the People of the Sun Middle Passage Collective in conjunction with Medgar Evers College Student Government Association, this annual tribute is in remembrance of the tens of millions of Africans who, after being kidnapped from their homeland, died during the Middle Passage - the voyage across the Atlantic Ocean to the Caribbean

and North and South America.

Prayers for all ancestors will start precisely at noon, rain or shine, in coordination with other gatherings around the world carrying out this same rite at exactly the same time.

The tribute will begin with a libation ceremony, followed by a drum invocation led by Guyanese Master Drummer Menes De Griot and his Shanto Troupe. He will be playing the ancestors' Ngomas, made for him in South Africa by the Venda people. These drums are played only three times a year, and the trinity drum - so named because it can be played on all three sides - is the only one in the

world.

Special drum tributes

will also be made to those in our families who are no longer with us, including Professor Charles Jones, Gil Noble and Louis Reyes Rivera, with a special remembrance for Dr. Mary Umolu.

The tribute will feature performances by many singers, drummers, dancers and spoken word artists, including Ngomo, KowTeff African Dance Company, Crown Heights Youth Collective and the Congo Square Drummers and Dancers.

The event will culminate at sundown with the final Ancestral Offering, during which the Ancestral Drummers will lead participants to the water's edge where each person will place flowers into the Atlantic Ocean, the largest

African burial ground in the world.

Attendees are asked to wear white or African attire and bring flowers to place in the ocean in honor of those lost in the Middle Passage. If you do not have a drum, bring a shekere, whistle, cowbell, or shac shac. No vendors please.

Braata singers prepare for world festival

70 countries competing for gold, silver and bronze medals in several categories.

Braata will be bringing their unique performing style of "choral theater" to two categories-'Scenic Folklore' and 'Music of the Religions.'

A collection of renowned Jamaican folksongs will comprise their suite in the Scenic Folklore category while several gospel songs in the Jamaican 'revival' tradition will form the repertoire in the Music of The Religions category.

The games were first held in 2000 as the World Choir Olympics, and were organized by German organization Intercultur, to spread peace through music The event has been held bi annually ever since, in various exotic locations around the globe including Bremen Germany, Graz, Austria and, most recently, Shaoxing, China in 2010.

Artistic Director of the folk singers Andrew Clarke is aware of the enormity of the occasion, not only because it will be Braata's first time at the games- but because of the rich tradition of excellence that has been established by other Jamaican choirs at the event over the years.

"We have some pretty big shoes to fill," Clarke says, "Because the list of choirs that has represented Jamaica includes the Glenmuir High School Choir, The Carifolk Singers and Nexus Performing Arts Company- huge names in the pantheon of Jamaican choral music. The Carifolk Singers earned two silvers and one gold medal in Germany, 2004 while Nexus walked away with one gold, one silver and two bronze medals in Austria 2008. In this fiftieth anniversary of Jamaica's independence, we are aiming to fly our flag high and hopefully claim some silverware for our country prior to our athletes doing the same at the Summer Olympics in London just weeks later."

To that end, Clarke and his creative team, including Musical Director Garnett Mowatt and choreographers Chris Walker and Jermaine Rowe have been putting the group through their paces for several weeks.

"You are competing against the very best choirs in the world," says Clarke. "Every point we can extract from the judges is tremendously vital in a competition where the difference between gold, silver and bronze medals- or no medals at all- can be fractions of a point."

As always, funding for the undertaking has not been easy to come by but with three months to go before the trip, Clarke is optimistic that they will cross the finish line.

"Our 2012 concert season next month will be our major fundraiser so we are obviously hoping that the show will be well supported. We have also been doing several performances for various organizations and corporations. But every little bit helps, so anyone who wants to learn more about how they can help us get there can go to our website www.braataproductions.org . We also have

an online campaign going at www. indiegogo.com where persons can search Braata Folk Singers and donate as little as \$10 US to our effort from anywhere in the world. While so doing, they will be thanked with wonderful prizes from the Braata family.

Interestingly enough, the Braata Folk Singers will not be the only Jamaica choral group carrying Jamaica's flag at this major event. The Jamaican Youth Chorale (JYC) under the Artistic Direction of Gregory Simms will also be in attendance.

Clarke is delighted that the JYC-- who will compete in separate categories one week before Braata takes the stage- will be present.

"The unique rules of the World Choir Games allows several groups from the same country to participate, and we embrace the opportunity to be part of this event along with the JYC. Victory for any of us is a victory for Jamaica, and there would be no better way to cap our 50th anniversary independence festivities."

St. Lucia and the British Virgin Islands.

The CDB said The Bahamas, Belize Dominica, Jamaica and Grenada recorded "stronger than marginal growth", while Haiti and Guyana had economic growth in excess of five per cent last year.

The CDB said emerging and developing economies have been the key drivers of the global economic recovery, as advanced economies, the region's main trading partners, have continued to struggle with "lingering weakness in financial, labor and housing markets".

It said the recovery in the bank's borrowing member states in the region "has, therefore, lagged behind", pointing to preliminary estimates that indicate that 12 of the 18 countries registered expansion in real output during the year.

Delta to boost service

Delta Air Lines announced plans on May 21 to launch new or expanded service to 10 destinations in the Caribbean and Bermuda from New York's LaGuardia and John F. Kennedy International (JFK) airports, continuing its program of service expansion in New York.
The airlines said that

the new flights, which will begin in late 2012 and early 2013, are in addition to Delta Air Lines' announced previously expansion at New York LaGuardia, where the airline is adding more than 100 new flights to 26 new destinations this summer.

When its full schedule is implemented, Delta said it will operate more than 260 daily flights between LaGuardia and more than 60 cities, exceeding any other carrier operating at the airport.

Delta said it is also optimizing its schedule at New York JFK to facilitate convenient connections to

international flights. JFK is a major global gateway for Delta, which operates non-stop flights to more than 45 international destinations from the air-

"We're excited to be announcing new and expanded service to these popular leisure destinations at the same time we're building our new domestic hub at LaGuardia Airport,' said Gail Grimmett, Delta's senior vice president - New York.

"It's another step toward achieving our goal of becoming the preferred airline in New York," she added.

In conjunction with its expansion at New York LaGuardia, Delta said it is investing US\$160 million to modernize two terminals at the airport and construct a new walkway connecting the facilities.

At JFK, Delta is currently under way on a US\$1.2 billion program to enhance and expand Terminal 4, adding nine new gates and creating a state-of-the-art gateway. That facility will open in spring 2013.

Grimmett said new and expanded Delta Air Lines service to the Caribbean and Bermuda will include new daily year-round service between LaGuardia and Bermuda, with Boeing 737s; new Saturday flights between JFK and St. Maarten's Princess Juliana International Airport (SXM) with Boeing 757s; and from Dec. 15, Delta's LaGuardia-Nassau flights will be expanded from seasonal to year-round serv-

addition, effective Dec. 15, Grimmett said Delta will increase its JFK-Montego Bay, Jamaica seasonal service from Saturday-only flights to daily service.

Grimmett also said, beginning on Dec. 15, that Delta Air Lines will increase its Saturday seasonal JFK-Aruba schedule to daily year-round serv-



Carib, Mexico to collaborate for growth

Caribbean Community (CARICOM) leaders and their Mexican counterpart, Felipe Calderon, ended their one-day summit in Barbados on May 21, deciding to collaborate on a range of issues, including tourism, transport, trade, investment and national security.

"We have agreed to share experiences and strategies in an effort to develop small and medium size enterprises in the private sector," Surinamese President Desi Bouterese, the current chairman of the 15-nation regional bloc, told reporters at the post-summit news conference in Bridgetown, the Barbados capital.

"We have also agreed to work together as part of gains in transnational crime and for citizen security," he added, stating that Mexico's cooperation will go a long way in helping CARICOM address some of the ramifications of the current economic climate.

Earlier Mexico and CARICOM signed two agreements to boost cooperation on largely high-tech education and rebuilding earthquake-ravaged Haiti.

"Mexico and CARICOM will also be working closely with our member state Haiti as we seek the reconstruction process of that country following the 2010 earthquake," Bouterse said.

"The community used the opportunity to thank Mexico for its assistance. The community is looking forward to working with Mexico and Haiti to fulfill the objectives of the memorandum of understanding and cooperation towards Haiti, which was signed on Sunday (May 20)," he added.

CARICOM Secretary General, Amb. Irwin LaRocque, and Mexican Foreign Minister, Patricia Espinosa, signed two memoranda of understanding (MOU), as foreign ministers wrapped up talks in preparation for the second CARICOM-Mexico Summit at the Barbados Hilton.

Host foreign minister Maxine McClean, who chaired the foreign ministers' meeting, said a technical cooperation agreement covered "critical areas for the development of our respective cooperation biotechnology, health, engineering, environment, nanotechnology, tourism, natural disasters, trade and energy.

"That cooperation would involve exchange of academics and graduate students," she said.

In the second MOU, McClean said CARICOM and Mexico also agreed to work together with its poorest member state in its reconstruction.

"We know that, since the tragic earthquake, we've had several promises of support internationally, but Mexico has actually engaged Haiti and has contributed in several significant ways to that effort to rebuild," she said.

"And we believe that, as CARICOM seeks to play its part, we could more closely with Mexico," she added.

Calderon has also pledged to aid the region in combating natural disasters and climate change.

"In the environment, we committed to continue to fight climate change and to take into account in particular the impact of climate change on small island states, global warning and growth of the level of the sea, as well as to renew serious international long term action in terms of mitigation and adaptation." he said.

CARICOM leaders also pressed Calderon to support their call for reform of international financial institutions, such as the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank, when Mexico hosts the G-20 summit on Jun. 18 and 19.

"Barbados and members of CARICOM are not members of the G-20. We are seen as middle income, but we are highly vulnerable, highly indebted," McClean said.

"It is important that we have persons who can articulate our case," she added.

"And, therefore, countries like Mexico who would have indicated that there are very happy to do so, we will sit and dialogue and ensure that there is a full appreciation of the very vulnerabilities that we face notwithstanding our successes to date," the Barbados foreign minister continued.

Assembly passes minimum wage

Assemblywoman Rhoda Jacobs (D-Flatbush) announced on May 15 that the Assembly passed legislation to increase the minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$8.50 per hour beginning January 2013, while also increasing the minimum wage for food-service workers who receive tips from \$5.00 to \$5.86 per hour.

Both wage rates would then be indexed to inflation beginning January 2014 (A.9148). The bill now awaits action in the Senate.

"During this difficult economic time, raising the minimum wage is the right thing to do," said Ms. Jacobs. "Simply put, people who work full time shouldn't be poor. The Assembly's legislation would help make sure that New Yorkers living on minimum-wage salaries can actually survive on the minimum wage. I strongly urge the Senate to pass this crucial measure."

"Over the past five years, New York's minimum wage has only increased 10 cents per hour, which is not enough for Brooklyn families to pay for things like rent, heat, gas, food and prescription drugs," Jacobs said. "By increasing the minimum wage, the quality of life for more than 1 million New Yorkers will be improved."

Currently, the neighboring

states of Vermont, Connecticut and Massachusetts – as well as 15 other states across the country and the District of Columbia – all have higher minimum wages than New York.

"This measure is a win-win for New Yorkers," said Assemblywoman Jacobs. "Not only are we helping working families afford basic necessities, we are also putting money in the pockets of those most likely to spend it right here in our community, helping boost the economy and create jobs."

Smokers' rights group challenges smoking ban

On April 9, the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation announced it was instituting a new policy that bans smoking within state parks, including beaches, playgrounds and pools.

After consulting with legal counsel, NYC C.L.A.S.H. has been advised that this agency has likely exceeded its authority and is ripe for legal action should it decline our request for reconsideration in the letter (copy upon request) we have submitted to the agency.

"These bans were imposed by bureaucratic fiat, not legislated law," says Audrey Silk, founder of C.L.A.S.H., "and on that basis alone, they're unconstitutional."

In fact, the New York State legislature has repeatedly declined to pass this specific law for over a decade, as proposed by both houses. At least nineteen bills have been rejected.

The Parks Office, therefore, not only exceeded its administrative mission, not only assigned itself legislative powers, but in fact went against the legislature's will.

That the process by which these bans were imposed is unconstitutional has already been determined in two other identical cases.

In Boreali v Axelrod (1987), where the state agency Public Health Council expanded restrictions on smoking as set forth by the legislature in Public Health Law, the court found:

We hold that the Public Health Council overstepped the boundaries of its lawfully delegated authority when it promulgated a comprehensive code to govern tobacco smoking in areas that are open to the public. While the Legislature has given the Council broad authority to promulgate regulations on matters concerning the public health, the scope of the Council's authority under its enabling statute must be deemed limited by its role as an administrative, rather than a legislative, body.

In fact, one of the linchpins for the court

in Borealiwas that the legislatures themselves had previously rejected exactly what the Health Council took it upon itself to impose.

The repeated failures by the Legislature to arrive at such an agreement do not automatically entitle an administrative agency to take it upon itself to fill the vacuum and impose a solution of its own. Manifestly, it is the province of the people's elected representatives, rather than appointed administrators, to resolve difficult social problems by making choices among competing ends.

In Justiana v Niagara County Department of Health (1999), where a local health board attempted the same, the United States District Court upheld the same points, asserting that the Health Department "violated the non-delegation doctrine of New York State law."

The Court finds that under the principles set forth in Boreali, the Board violated the non-delegation doctrine of New York State law in enacting the regulations...[and] exceeded its authority by writing "on a clean slate" rather than using its regulatory powers to fill in the details of a legislative scheme. ...Defendants argue that... the present case is distinguishable from Boreali because since that case was decided, the State Legislature passed the Clean Indoor Air Act, and the Board was simply filling in the interstices of the Act's provisions. This argument, however, is not persuasive in the context of smoking regulations, an area which the Court of Appeals described in Boreali as one especially suited for legislative determination as it involves "difficult social problems" which must be resolved ...

In this context, even where the state legislature has provided some guidance for the restriction of smoking, the enactment of further substantive restrictions is a task properly left to the legislative arm of government. By adopting regulations that are substantially more restrictive than existing legislation, the Board went beyond interstitial rule-making

JPMorgan Lesson: End government bank guarantees

It's widely believed that JPMorgan Chase's recent \$2 billion—plus loss proves we need the comprehensive banking regulation called for by the 2010 Dodd-Frank law

That belief is wrong.

In thinking about the loss, remember that the future is always uncertain. It's easy to look back on a bad decision especially someone else's bad decision – and claim the mistake was preventable. The notion that regulators have knowledge superior to that of people acting in the marketplace is ridiculous. Economic activities are based on local and often unarticulated knowledge that regulators could never acquire. It's a fallacy to think that because imperfect human beings make mistakes, government oversight is necessary. Government also is populated by imperfect human beings, and, on top of the usual fallibility, they also suffer from this particular "knowledge problem," as identified by Nobel-laureate economist F.A. Hayek.

But that is not all they suffer from. Even if we ignore the knowledge problem, we must confront the incentive problem. What reason do we have for believing that government regulators would do the right thing even if they knew what it was? Political economists have been aware of the principle of "regulatory capture" for many years. This refers to the near inevitability that a regulated industry will have far more influence over a regulatory body than anyone else. Often the industry has a hand in writing the rules, which is what is going on with the writing of the myriad Dodd-Frank rules now underway. Regulators cannot be assumed to be as pure as the driven snow. Many come out of the regulated industry and plan to return when they retire from government "service." Regulation is fraught with such perils, which those who see government as an all-knowing, all-good deity routinely overlook.

A further error made by those who see a panacea in regulation is the belief that banks can harm us because government has kept its hands off. This couldn't be less true. Throughout American history governments at all levels have partnered with banks, ostensibly in the public interest but actually in the interest of the bankers.

Commenting about JPMorgan's loss, President Obama stumbled onto the truth

— but didn't realize it — when he said that, since the taxpayers could be on the hook for large bank mistakes, vigilant regulation is needed. But why are the taxpayers on the hook?

The most important thing to understand about the banking industry is that the government maintains a safety net of guarantees in case a big bank stumbles. And it is that safety net which makes the stumbling more likely. This is known as moral hazard. A bank with a government guarantee will be less careful than a bank without one. The crisis of 2008 is a text-book case study in banking moral hazard.

One government guarantee has mostly been overlooked: federal deposit insurance. It's the sacred cow of banking programs, which originated in the New Deal, even though Franklin Roosevelt feared it would encourage bank irresponsibility. (Unfortunately, he signed the bill anyway.) The FDIC is usually thought of as a guarantee for bank depositors, but in reality it is a massive privilege for banks. If government assures depositors that they cannot lose a penny in their bank accounts, they no longer need to be wary about their banks' conduct. Why worry, if the FDIC will make good? But that guarantee eliminates the customer scrutiny that would otherwise keep banks prudent. No promises by regulators can match depositor vigilance in reining in banker recklessness. (In a competitive market, nothing would prevent the offering of private insurance or other devices to prevent bank runs.)

Roosevelt was right:

The general underlying thought behind the use of the word "guarantee" with respect to bank deposits is that you guarantee bad banks as well as good banks. The minute the government starts to do that the government runs into a probable loss... We do not wish to make the United States government liable for the mistakes and errors of individual banks, and put a premium on unsound banking in the

The only way to minimize systemic damage from banking without stifling productive innovation is to end all guarantees and all barriers to competition.

High price for taking a stand

The issue of the timing of President Obama's statement in support of same-sex marriage is intriguing. In that what's being reported is that Vice President Biden's earlier remark that he was comfortable with gay marriage is what forced the president's hand to make his position known earlier than he intended. Which begs the question: What was the consensus among Obama and his inner core of advisers as to when was the perfect time to announce that he had come around to being supportive of same-sex marriage? For that matter, one would be curious if there was unanimity or anything close to it among that crew about the announcement being done prior to the election, period.

What, exactly, was thought to be the payoff in waiting until the election was that much closer to spring the news? Whenever the president chose to let on that his former "struggling" with the issue had now evolved to this, it was inevitably going to be a political bombshell and calculated risk. The wisdom of yesteryear was that scheduling those bulletins guaranteed to have some downside effect for earlier rather than later in an election cycle was the practical way to go. Time and distance, went that logic, would take care of business. With the mega-bucks marketplace that current-day electioneering has come to be, a rule of thumb that says, "Give it some time and it will go away" clearly no longer has relevance. The means exist to bombard the public ad nauseam with whatever is believed to be election-winning ammunition.

The media was full of innuendo about coolness between Biden and Obama following the vice president's disclosure on that TV interview. But if in fact the White House was less than thrilled when Biden made that bit of news, was it really because it was forcing the president to address the

gay marriage thing earlier than he had planned, or simply because the president didn't like being one-upped on the issue? Maureen Dowd in the New York Times thought it underscored a tendency toward equivocation on Obama's part. Whatever, the president did the obligatory show of making nice with his vice president a few days later to convince the public that reports of friction between the two were grossly exaggerated.

All well and good, but as an election-year issue, there's no escaping the power packed by same-sex marriage. Obama's formal commitment to the progressive side of the debate sets up a classic confrontation with Christian conservatives and gives that side a rally point and energy boost, albeit hardly did they seem in need of one. In battleground states, where small voting blocs could be so critical, it's anyone's guess how Obama's new stand will scramble the numbers. Even the African American vote, could turn out decisive in toss-up situations. One recalls that in 2004, George Bush's faith-based initiatives won over some blacks and could have provided the margin of difference for Bush in places like Ohio. Same-sex marriage clearly has the potential to have similar play among the African American electorate, even with an Obama now in the equation – not dramatically changing black support for the president but altering the Obama vote tally just enough to cause a problem.

It's at times like these that our view that you have to be nuts to opt for a career in politics gets reinforced anew. There is at times a certain constitutional fiber required to survive the cauldron such as the one into which Obama has climbed (or been thrown into). On the one hand, the gay community, activist as they are, pressing the president to throw his support behind same-sex marriage. On the other, the hard-right element salivating in anticipation of just such a move by Obama, which provides them with firepower to die for. A rock and a hard place may not adequately describe the conundrum.

Years ago, Gerald Ford, as president, tried appealing to the public's allegedly soft emotional side by reminding them that America was indeed a nation of immigrants, when he sought support for some displaced Vietnamese who he felt should be given sanctuary in the U.S. Of course it didn't fly. Immigration is one of those social issues that inspires hardened positions on either side. Same-sex marriage, if anything, outpaces immigration on the wedge-issue front. Maybe the calculus on the Obama side is that the religious and other social conservative votes were never going to break for the president, so why not make sure, with this move of his, that support among progressives won't go soft on him.

The bottom line is that with these blasts, first from Joe Biden and then Obama, same-sex marriage is guaranteed a place front and center in this presidential election campaign. Very recent polls showing a slight lead (statistical dead heat) for Mitt Romney may already be reflecting impact among voters of these Obama-Biden revelations. Obama, with his team of advisers wise in the ways of newage analysis, may have figured this to be a risk well worth taking, given the landscape. He may be right. It would be perfectly understandable, though, if he did what politicians are wont to do, and prevaricated some more...until after votes were cast in November.



New World's first freedom fighters

U.S. autism rates reach new height

About one in 88 children in the United States has autism or a related disorder, the highest estimate to date and one that is sure to revive a national argument over how the condition is diagnosed and treated.

The estimate released recently by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention represents an overall increase of 25 percent since the last analysis in 2006 and a near-doubling of the reported rate in 2002.

Among boys, the rate of autism spectrum disorders is one in 54, almost five times that of girls, in whom the rate is one in 252.

"One thing the data tells us with certainty - there are many children and families who need help," said CDC Director Thomas Frieden. "We must continue to track autism spectrum disorders because this is the information communities need to guide improvements in services to help children."

Advocates for people with autism seized on the apparent spike in the prevalence of the disease to call for more research to identify its causes and more services for those affected by it.

"This is a national emergency and it's time for a national strategy," said Mark Roithmayr, president of the research and advocacy group Autism Speaks. He called for a "national training service corps" of therapists, caregivers, teachers and others who are trained to help children with autism.

Some researchers have guestioned whether the increases over the last decade are real or reflects greater awareness that has led parents and teachers to see symptoms of autism in children who would not have received the diagnosis a generation ago.

Changes in how the disease is diagnosed explains a large fraction of the reported increase in prevalence, even advocates acknowledged. **Examining Records**

"Inevitably when these statistics come out, the question is, what is driving the increase?" said Roithmayr. Better diagnoses, broader diagnostic criteria and higher awareness, he said, account for about half the reported increase.

The new estimate from the CDC comes from the Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring Network, which operated in 14 states.

To determine whether a child has autism or a related disorder, what CDC calls "clinician reviewers" examined the medical and school records of eight-year-olds in the 14 states and also conducted screening. Children whose records included either an explicit notation of autismspectrum disorder or merely descriptions of behavior consistent with the disorder were counted as falling on the autism spectrum.

CDC investigators warned. however, that the 14 sites are not "nationally representative." As a result, the rate of autism being reported on Thursday in CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report, "should not be generalized to the United States as a whole."

Autism spectrum disorders are marked by a suite of symptoms, all arising from atypical brain development that results in problems with socialization, communication, and behavior.

Although the disorder can be mild or severe, in general children with autism have difficulty communicating and making friends. Many find it painful to look other people in the eyes, which impairs their ability to understand what others are thinking and feeling.

New approach to an old problem

Benjamin Franklin, an American icon and one of the most respected of America's founding fathers was, despite having only two years of formal schooling, a prolific inventor and scientific investigator. His inventions included the lightning rod, the "Franklin stove," bifocal eyeglasses, the odometer, the "Glass Armonica" and the silk woven catheter.

Franklin's new musical instrument, "Glass Armonica" with its "heavenly sound" was an instant European sensation and even Beethoven and Mozart composed music for it. But it was the silk woven catheter that brought him into urological history. He and his brother suffered with prostate enlargement and urinary tract stone forma-

The agonizing pain of prostate and stone obstruction led him to improve on the previous rigid and irritating catheters of that day by weaving one out of silk and a type of shellac. This gave the catheter smoothness and flexibility and permitted efficient and repeated drainage of urine from the obstructed bladder. In those days, prostate surgery had yet to be invented.

Advances in anesthesia, intravenous therapy, blood transfusion and antibiotics finally permitted a surgical approach to this common male problem. The surgical approach remained the principal method of treatment for many years, culminating in the various relatively modern procedures as TURP, TUNA, and LASER of the prostate. Then effective drug therapies such as Avodart to shrink the prostate and Flomax to relax the muscle within the prostate became available. As a result, the

surgical approach has receded as the treatment of choice and is no longer considered the best initial approach for the patient suffering with symptomatic prostate enlargement.

There are times, however, when for any one of a variety of reasons the patient suffering with any combination of a slow, hesitant, or interrupted flow, urinary frequency, urgency, incomplete emptying, prolonged urination with dribbling, incontinence, the need to push or strain and sleep deprivation, caused by night time urination cannot or will not take the medication required.

The need for a better

alternate to a surgical approach was met with the development of "TUMT," Transurethral Microwave Thermotherapy. This office treatment does not require anesthesia. architects and driving forces behind the CCJ's formation, said a lot of work went into the establishment of the regional appellate court.

"We've been toiling in the vineyard, toiling for a long time," he said.

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar recently announced in Parliament that Trinidad and Tobago is moving to abolish criminal appeals to the London-based Privy Council and place this jurisdiction to the CCJ, which is celebrating its seventh year. The regional appellate court was established on April 16, 2005 and is headquartered in Port of Spain, Trinidad.

The CCJ has two jurisdictions – an original jurisdiction to interpret and apply the Revised Treaty of Chaguaramas and an appellate jurisdiction.

Barbados, Belize and Guyana have replaced the Privy Council with the CCJ. Jamaica is also expected to sign on to the CCJ this year.

Dominica

Prime Minister of Dominica Roosevelt Skerrit has defended his government's decision to grant a license to regional casino chain Ma Pau, to operate slot machines on the island.

Ma Pau Entertainment Center is the trade name of the gaming establishment located at the popular Krazy Koconut Recreation Center in the capital Roseau.

Moments before the official opening recently, Skerrit called on citizens to re-think their objection to the latest revenue generating enterprise.

The prime minister made it clear that he had no plans to bow to public pressure on the issue when direct foreign investment was critical to the improvement of the lives of citizens.

Ma Pau is a subsidiary of the Sunny Group of Companies, with operations across the Caribbean that also includes the Sweet Lime Restaurant chain (in

Trinidad and Tobago and St. Kitts) in addition to its interest in the distribution of educational products.

Dominica

Dominica's ambassador to the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) Charles Maynard has died. He was 78 years old.

Maynard, who was also special adviser to Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit, died at the Princess Margaret Hospital recently. The cause of his illness was not disclosed.

Prime Minister Skerrit said, "This country has lost a great patriot, a nationalist, a regionalist, an integrationist and someone who dedicated his life to Dominica's development."

Former OECS Acting Chief Justice Brian Alleyne, a former attorney general and ministerial colleague of Maynard, said he had made a signification contribution to the socio-economic development of Dominica.

Maynard held a variety of

ministerial portfolios during the 15-year rule of the Dominica Freedom party (DFP).

Jamaica

Jamaica dancehall star David "Mavado" Brooks was fined a total of J\$100,000 or six months in jail on an assault charge of malicious damage of a car.

Almost a year after he was arrested for assaulting a St. James man and his son and damaging their car in an apparent case of road rage, Brooks was found guilty on the two charges by Resident Magistrate Wilson Smith in the Montego Bay Court recently.

Brooks, who hails from West Armour Heights in St. Andrews, was charged in connection with an incident on July 22, 2011, in which he and members of his entourage allegedly attacked Henry Cunningham and his son, Oshane and damaged their car along the Belmont road in St. James.

Brooks' attorney Martyn

Thomas told the court that his client accepted the ruling and that he was remorseful for the events that led him to being arrested.

St. Lucia

St. Lucia may have to wait a while longer to know if Taiwan would heed Castries' call to demand the recall of Ambassador Tom Chou.

Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony government has repeatedly called for the Ma Ying-jeou administration to return Chou to Taipei, after accusing him of interfering in the country's internal affairs under the previous United Workers' Party (UMP) government.

Anthony, whose St. Lucia Labor Party (SLP) was returned to office in last November's general elections after five years in opposition, said his administration out of respect for Taiwanese law, was willing to wait until after the presidential elections last January for Chou to be recalled.

The law prohibits this movement of diplomats within three months of presidential elections.

Anthony said in a recent television interview that his government would demand the removal of Chou after he is sworn in for his second term on May 20.

St. Kitts

St. Kitts and Nevis and Turkey has signed a mutual visa waiver agreement that will allow nationals of both countries with valid passports to enter the territory of the other without visa requirement for a stay of up to 90 days.

"This is part of our government's ongoing initiative to increase the number of countries to which our citizens have visa-free access, to foster greater opportunities, people-to-people and commercial contacts, said St. Kitts and Nevis High Commissioner to the United Kingdom, Kevin Isaac.



It is with that same lighthearted spirit in mind that master of the macabre Tim Burton apparently approached the screen version of "Dark Shadows."

The movie marks the Oscar-nominee's (for Corpse Bride) eighth collaboration with Johnny Depp, a string which has included Edward Scissorhands' (1990), "Ed Wood" (1994), "Sleepy Hollow" (1999), "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory" (2005), "Corpse Bride" (2005), "Sweeney

Todd" (2007) and "Alice in Wonderland" (2010). And the two have reportedly already agreed to work together next on a remake of the Vincent Price classic, "The Abominable Dr. Phebes" (1971).

Set in 1972, "Dark Shadows" is a costume dramedy that offers a walk down Memory Lane courtesy of such best-forgotten staples of the era as Lava lamps, macramé and plastic fruit. It also features bell-bottomed Flower Children driving a Volkswagen bus while listening to rock anthems like "Nights in White Satin," and "Season of the Witch."

At the point of departure,

we meet Victoria Winters (Bella Heathcote) en route to Collinsport, Maine to apply for a position as governess at Collinwood Manor. Meanwhile, elsewhere in the quiet coastal village, construction workers at an excavation site unwittingly unleash an undead monster by cutting the bolts keeping Barnabas' (Depp) cast-iron casket sealed tight.

Both Barnabas and Victoria descend on the sprawling Collins estate, only to find the mansion in a dire state of disrepair due to the decline of the family's fortune. The place is presently presided over by imperious matriarch, Elizabeth (Michelle Pfeiffer) who lords it over an assemblage of oddballs: her spoiled-rotten daughter, Carolyn (Chloe

Moretz); her ne'er-do-well brother, Roger (Jonny Lee Miller); his troubled son, David (Gulliver McGrath); a live-in shrink (Helena Bonham Carter); and a couple of creepy servants (Jackie Earle Haley and Ray Shirley).

The ensuing mix of slapstick violence and tonguein-cheek humor is often amusing, nostalgic and clever but never really rises to the level of laugh out loud funny. This Johnny Depp vehicle benefits most from his bloodthirsty character Barnabas' deadpan delivery, as when he mistakenly salivates over gobs of red goo undulating around a Lava lamp.

and into the realm of legislating.

Additionally, it's quite curious that the state Parks Office, in its press release on April 9, more than implied that this was a done deal -- even reported by the media as "implemented." One would think that such an act -- legitimate or not -- would be at least subject to the rule making process pursuant to the provisions of the State Administrative Procedure Act. Yet no rule proposal notice was filed with the Division of Administrative Rules (DAR) for publication in the State Register (pg. 14) until April 18. According to the notice, public comment is open until 45 days after publication of the notice.

"How can state Parks Commissioner Rose Harvey release a statement that boasts about the initiation of a policy when no rule had even yet been proposed? And now the public is supposedly allowed to weigh in until the beginning of June when the policy is supposedly effective by the end of April?" asks Silk.

According to the DAR's manual, "The rule making process is constructed around the fundamental belief that the people of this state have a right to participate in the development of its laws"

"Aside from the primary legal constitutional question, this course of events furthermore makes a mockery of public participation. Parks have demonstrated that this is already a done deal, public comment period or not.

"Such behavior certainly gives rise to the suspicion that something absolutely inappropriate is going on... or that when it comes to 'those damn smokers,' otherwise cherished democratic constructs need not apply and no one will care," Silk says.

Lastly, and most fundamentally, if these conditions are allowed to persist among our state agencies we might as well render the election of lawmakers, the legislature and its process obsolete. You don't have to be a proponent of anything to do with smoking or tobacco in order to agree it's contemptible when the bedrock of our system is being tossed away.

In this particular case, C.L.A.S.H. doesn't intend to stand idly by.

Runners prep for the big NYC Marathon

This is the time of the year when long distance runners are training hard and stepping up their mileage for the upcoming New York City Marathon this November. They are not only running in the streets and in various communities and parks, but they are also entering into numerous races on weekends.

Uncertainty about Gayle's future


More doubts have surfaced that could prevent Jamaican opening batsman Chris Gayle from representing the West Indies on their tour of England.

The year-long impasse between Gayle and the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) seemed to be over when they signed an agreement in March that would pave the way for Gayle to be considered for selection to the regional team.

But reports have surfaced suggesting that some uncertainty over his participation on that tour has arisen, as Gayle reportedly wrote to the WICB seeking clarification on whether he would be selected for the limited overs series in England.

Dane Richards got the better of his fellow Jamaican when he scored the winner against goalkeeper Donovan Ricketts to help the New York Red Bulls (8-3-1, 25 pts.) beat expansion team and

hosts Montreal Impact, 2-1, Saturday night at Olympic Stadium.

Richards and Ricketts soon would be suiting up side by side when Jamaica takes on Guatemala on Friday, June 8 in the opening game of the semifinal round of CONCACAF World Cup qualifying, but last Saturday night, it was a different story; Richards was on a mission to help the Red Bulls get their fifth straight win to stay atop the

Eastern Conference standings, while Ricketts was attempting to preserve a shutout and help Montreal (3-6-3,12 pts.) win its fourth game in its last six.

"I was just in the box, lurking around, and the ball popped out to me and I just knocked it home," Richards said. "I know my countryman, Donovan Ricketts, he's unhappy with me right now but I had to do it."

What was probably more frustrating for Ricketts was the fact that he inadvertently gave Richards the assist on the gamewinner; Richards' goal came in the 67th minute when Ricketts parried a Roy Miller cross into the path of Richards, who wasted no time in registering the goal. The moment surely will be a talking point when the pair joins forces in June to help Jamaica in its World Cup qualifying effort.

The New York Red Bulls, undermanned again with injuries to former French international Thierry Henry, Mexican international Rafael Marquez and defenders Stephen Keel and Jon Gunnar Solli, rallied from a 1-0 deficit to tie the score at 1-1 in the 37th minute from a Kenny Cooper penalty kick: Montreal defender Tyson Wahl committed a handball infringement on a Richards cross and it allowed Cooper his team-leading 10th

Montreal got off to a quick start when Bernardo Corradi scored from the penalty spot in the 22nd minute to give Montreal the lead. Richards, always the hard-working and speedy midfielder, was the difference in the game with the assist and the winner; the contest surely is one that Richards and Ricketts will reminisce about well into their retirement years.

New York has done well to rack up five consecutive wins with a very inexperienced squad, particularly on defense. During the streak, the first for the Red Bulls in nine years, New York climbed atop the Eastern Conference, discovered defenders Connor Lade, Brandon Barklage and Tyler Ruthven, while firstvear player and European import Markus Holgersson, who got off to a slow start in MLS, seemed to have grown into his defensive role. The youth movement also has seen rookie goalkeeper Ryan Meara come into his own very quickly and afforded much playing time to midfielder Mehdi Ballouchy, who missed Saturday's game due to immigration matters.



"Consumers must also question legitimacy of vague because too could be a scam. Be-fore responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an

You will not know what direction to go in unless you examine your likes. What do you really like doing when you are working, when you are at home, and in your spare time? What excites you and energizes you? What is your passion?

•Research new careers

Once you have discovered your passion, spend some time researching the types of careers that center on your passions. Do not worry if you are feeling a bit unsure or insecure; it is a natural part of the career-change process.

Transferable skills

There are many skills that are transferable and applicable to what you want to do in your new career. You may be surprised to see that you already have a solid amount of experience.

•Training and education

If the skill you need to learn is one you could use in your current job, see if your employer would pick up the tab. Take a course or two to ensure you really like the subject matter.

If you are going for a new degree or certification, make sure you check the accreditation of the school. Get some information about placement successes.

Networking

One of the real keys to successfully changing careers will be your networking ability. People in your network may be able to give you job leads, offer you advice and information, and introduce you to others.

You can also broaden your network through joining professional organizations in your new field and contacting alumni from your college.

Set positive goals for yourself, but expect setbacks and change. Do not let these things get you down. You might also consider a lateral move that could serve as a springboard for a bigger career change.




