# Inquiry into police shootings

The Guyanese commission of inquiry into the July 18 fatal police shooting of three opposition supporters and injury to more than 20 in the bauxite mining community of Linden began in earnest this week with chief cop Leroy Brummel swearing that he never ordered officers to use live rounds on citizens and that the action of his ranks amounted to an unnecessary overkill to peaceful protestors.

Testifying before the commission that comprises retired Jamaican Chief Justice Leslie Wolfe, former Jamaican Foreign Minister and Senior Counsel K. D. Knight, Trinidad Law Professor Dana Seetahal and two Guyanese jurists, Brummel said live fire was uncalled for but he is aware that National Security Minister Clement Rohee had long developed the habit of calling junior officers directly and in doing so bypassing his authority.

He, however, denied directly knowing whether Rohee did in fact call Supt. Clifton Hicken, the interior commander, or Asst.

### Ineligible for the 2014 Round

The United States says Haitians and Jamaicans are among nationals not eligible to apply for the 2014 Diversity Visa (DV) Program.

The U.S. Department of State said those nationals are ineligible because their countries "sent more than 50,000 immigrants to

the United States in the previous five years."

Other countries ineligible are: Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, China (mainland-born), Colombia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, India, Mexico, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, South Korea,

### **Antigua**

The government of Antigua and Barbuda is likely to follow Belize and allow for a debate on the decriminalization of marijuana.

Speaking on a local radio program, National Security Minister Dr. Errol Cort said there were strong arguments in favor of changing the existing laws and would welcome a debate.

"I am aware, however, there is a push in various quarters to decriminalize marijuana. Persons have made the argument that there is medicinal usage from marijuana and others have said marijuana is part of a whole religious entity especially from the Rastafarian movement," he

He said another set of arguments indicate

that, notwithstanding the facts about marijuana, the illegal drugs trade continues to flourish.

But he warned that any change to the existing laws would only come following widespread public consultation.

### **Bahamas**


A 44-year-old man from the Dominican Republic was jailed for four years by a magistrate in the Bahamas court for having \$2.5 million worth of cocaine.

Police charged Jose Cabrera, of Santo Domingo, on suspicion of drug smuggling at North West Cay, of Great Inaugua, on Aug. 30, 2012.

Law enforcement officers dug up six crocus bags containing 140 kilos of cocaine after Cabrera showed them the hiding spot on the cav.

The court heard that Cabrera and others buried the drugs on the Cay several months ago when they encountered bad weather. Cabrera said that he did not know he was

in Bahamian territory because he was lost.



his boss sent him to retrieve the drugs when he was arrested, the court was told.

He pleaded guilty to the charges of conspiracy to possess drugs with the intent to supply and cocaine possession when he appeared before Chief Magistrate Carolita Bethell on Sept. 4, 2012.

Sean Pratt, 41, the second defendant in the case, faces charg-

Pratt, of the Turks and Caicos Islands, has pleaded not guilty to the charges. He was denied bail and remanded in custody until April 25, 2013.

### **Barbados**

Cuban Raul Garcia, who remained in jail despite having completed

20-year jail sentence on drugrelated charges in Barbados is to be

Recently, Prime Minister Freundel Stuart said the government is considering two options with respect to the future of Garcia, telling reporters that the options have to be carefully examined given the national security concerns of the island.

Garcia has remained incarcerated because of complications associated with his immigration status.

Stuart said "the nature of the offence for which he was convicted is an offence that has grave implications. Or would had have grave implications for Barbados had he not been nabbed and prosecuted."

Garcia was arrested on Sept. 28, 1994 on drug charges. He was sentenced to life imprisonment, along with a US\$500,000 fine.

But he successfully appealed the sentence and five years later he was given a 20-year term.

### Cayman Islands

Premier McKeeva Bush, who is also minister of Finance, has announced that JetBlue Airlines will soon begin service to the Cayman Islands.

JetBlue is expected to serve Grand Cavman's Owen Roberts International Airport with three

weekly times service on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays from New York



JFK Airport beginning November

The airline will also include a Saturday-only service to the Cayman Islands from Boston's Logan International Airport, which it plans to start from Nov. 17.

Bush said this development has been part of his government's undertaking to expand the catchment area of the tourist market.

"We are prepared to work with the air carriers through the Cayman Islands Airports Authority," he said.

### Guyana

The Guyana economy grew by 2.8 percent during the first six months of this year. Finance Minister Dr. Ashni Singh said.

In a review of the country's mid-year performance, Singh said that "this growth reflects continued progress on the diversification of the productive sector where we have now arrived

at a point where we are no longer as we were 10 years ago, entire-



ly dependent on one, two or three dominant sectors."

He said there had been significant strides in diversifying the economy resulting in the 2.8 percent growth even though there had been a contraction in sugar production.

Singh said that total export

earnings grew by 9.2 percent totaling US\$592.1 million.

In addition, the bauxite sector recorded an increase of 41.9 percent, earning US\$79.4 million and production in the rice industry expanded by 1.4 percent to 210,395 tons earning US\$84.6 million.

### Jamaica

A 27-year-old Jamaican has appeared in court in connection with a highly-publicized case in which nude pictures of hundreds of women were posted on local websites.

Ronald Oates was recently arrested and slapped with several charges under the Cyber Crime

Act and the Larceny Act, including unauthorized access, unauthorized obstruction.



unlawfully making available data for the commission of an offence and obscene publication. He is also charged with conspiracy to extort, extortion under the Larcenv Act.

The crime, which was first brought to the attention of the police last March, is said to involve 25 victims.

Police say the accused would hack into the email accounts of his victims, gaining access to their nude photographs. He would then contact the women threatening to upload the photographs to a local website if he is not paid a certain sum of money, or he would upload the photos and then demand money for them to be removed from the website.

According to the police, he often demanded between J\$10,000 and J\$20,000 from his victims. Police say those targeted were mainly from Kingston and St. Andrew and St. Catherine, but the crime also stretched as far as Manchester. Oates will re-appear in court next month.

### Jamaica

Undaunted by the operating woes of Air Jamaica and the recent demise of Barbados-based

RedJet. the investors behind Fly Jamaica Airways are pushing ahead with their



plans to be fully operational before the start of the tourist high season in December.

# **Mystery New York landmarks**

### Architecturally interesting public school buildings

Throughout autumn, the New York Landmarks Conservancy celebrates the beginning of the new academic year and explores New York City's historic public schools. To better appreciate New York City's extraordinarilv rich architectural heritage. the Landmarks Conservancy urges New Yorkers and tourists alike to take a walk past these New York City treasures, and visit www.nylandmarks.org for a two minute vacation on your computer, iPad, iPhone or smartboard as a "Tourist in Your Own Town" and guess the "Mystery Landmark," both focused on public schools.

In Brooklyn, walk by Erasmus Hall High School at 899 Flatbush Avenue. Founded in 1786 as a private academy, Erasmus Hall High School became the first secondary school chartered by the State of New York. At the turn of the 20th century, the need for a larger school was met

with an architectural design by Charles B. J. Snyder to build a series of Collegiate Gothic style buildings surrounding the original federal style building to form a quadrangle. Both the Federal and Gothic buildings were landmarked by the City in 1966 and the original building was also listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1975.

With more than 1,700

schools and 1.1 million students, the NYC Department of Education is the nation's largest and one of the oldest school systems. The Conservancy has long championed the preservation of New York's historic schools with a special emphasis on those by the legendary C.B.J. Snyder, Superintendent of School Buildings from 1891 to 1922.

He believed that schools should be "civic monuments

for a better society" and oversaw the construction of more than 350 "Snyder" schools during his tenure, many of which he designed. They offered light, air, beauty and dignity at a time when waves of immigrant children poured into the school system. Today, many of these buildings remain vibrant places of discovery and learning, others have been converted to new uses, and some await restoration.

Through the Landmarks Conservancy's monthly series of "Mystery Landmarks" and "Tourist in Your Own Town" videos at www. nylandmarks.org, visitors to the website will discover many architecturally interesting public school buildings. "Brooklyn has arrived as a center of entertainment and sports," Mayor Michael Bloomberg told a VIP crowd at the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Barclays Center on Friday. "Today is a great day for Brooklyn," he added.

The No 1 citizen of New York City rode the subway from Manhattan in order to join Borough President Marty Markowitz, NY Nets co-owner Bruce Ratner, New York Police Department Commissioner Ray Kelly. MTA Chairman Joseph J. Lhota, politicians, sponsors, attorneys, civic and social leaders, clergy and myriad international and local media anxious to see the city's newest and most celebrated landmark.

"I am here to celebrate Brooklyn," Bloombertg said.

The mayor could not



resist resorting to a surewinning line by first asking: "Is Brooklyn in the house."

The deafening response which followed voiced by formerly-defected, reconverted, authentic and Brooklyn-born natives proudly boasted the occasion and

United Kingdom (except Northern Ireland) and its dependent territories, and Vietnam. It was also announced that natives of Guatemala are now eligible to enter the program.

The 2014 Diversity Visa Program (DV-2014) opened at noon, Eastern Daylight Time, on Oct. 2 and will close at noon on Nov. 3.

Applicants must submit entries electronically during the registration period using the electronic DV entry form (E-DV) at <a href="https://www.dvlottery.state.gov">www.dvlottery.state.gov</a>. Paper entries will not be accepted.

"We strongly encourage applicants not to wait until the last week of the registration period to enter," the State Department cautioned, adding: "Heavy demand may result in Web site delays." It also warned that: "No entries will be accepted after noon, EDT, on Nov. 3, 2012."

The congressionally-mandated Diversity Immigrant Visa Program is administered on an annual basis by the Department of State and conducted under the terms of Section 203(c) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA).

Section 131 of the Immigration Act of 1990, amended INA 203,

provides for a class of immigrants known as "diversity immigrants."

Section 203(c) of the INA provides a maximum of 55,000 Diversity Visas each fiscal year to be made available to persons from countries with low rates of immigration to the United States, the State Department said.

It said 55, 000 immigrant visas are set aside for DV immigrants. However, since DV-1999, the U.S. Congress has reserved 5,000 visas from this annual allocation to be made available for use under the Nicaraguan and Central American Relief Act (NACARA).

"The annual DV program makes visas available to persons meeting the simple, but strict, eligibility requirements," the State Department said. "A computer-generated, random drawing chooses selectees for Diversity Visas," it added.

The visas are distributed among six geographic regions, with a greater number of visas going to regions with lower rates of immigration, and with no visas going to nationals of countries sending more than 50,000 immigrants to the United States over the past five years.

"No single country may receive

more than seven percent of the available Diversity Visas in any one year," the State Department said, adding that it implemented the electronic registration system, beginning with DV-2005, "in order to make the Diversity Visa process more efficient and secure.

"We utilize special technology and other means to identify those who commit fraud for the purposes of illegal immigration or those who submit multiple entries," it said.

For DV-2014, the Department of State said it will once again implement an online process to notify entrants of their selection, and to provide information about the immigrant visa application and interview.

Beginning May 1, 2013, the department said DV-2014 entrants will be able to use their "unique confirmation number" provided at registration to check online through Entry Status Check at <a href="http://www.dvlottery.state.gov">http://www.dvlottery.state.gov</a> to see if their entry was selected.

It said successful entrants will receive instructions for how to apply for immigrant visas for themselves and their eligible family members. Confirmation of visa interview appointments will also be

Supt. Patrick Todd, the officer in charge of the riot police unit on the ground on July 18, but telephone records to be tendered to the commission in the coming days will show that the normally combative minister did speak to Hicken on his mobile telephone more than a dozen times in the minutes before police opened fire, according to a reliable source.

How Rohee and Hicken will be able to deny direct involvement and responsibility for the killings with tendered records is left to be seen even as Rohee is well aware that he will be called as a key witness before the commission, as his future in the government Cabinet clearly hangs on the outcome of the current deliberations.

In fact, the commissioners have already indicated plans to subpoena the records of Rohee and others directly involved in the shooting while Lindeners were protesting against steep

hikes in electricity rates.

Lawyers for the deceased and the two main opposition parties that had much to do with the protests, say such records are crucial to prove the case of political orders to kill, since Hicken on the stand on Wednesday vehemently denied that the minister had called him directly while he was in command at Linden, 65 miles southwest of the city.

To the chagrin of the courtroom, Hicken, a highly favored
senior officer in the eyes of
the Donald Ramotar administration, even denied being in
charge of the riot units on the
ground, saying they were the
responsibility of Chief Brummel even though he was the
overall boss of all other units
on duty that fateful week.

"I did not have any authority to give the riot unit coming from the tactical services unit any orders to shoot," he said to loud grumbling in the hearing room and to gawks from retired officers.

The name Kirani James will not soon be forgotten. Not in his homeland, Grenada.

Nicknamed "the Jaguar" James won the 400 metres race, a distance usually guaranteed by athletes from the

Not only did he win the race but in the process won the first gold medal at an Olympic competition for his country.

### **Decline in police killings**

Jamaica Police Commissioner Owen Ellington says police killings have declined in recent years but the government and opposition have expressed support for the embattled top cop.

Recently the People's National Party (PNP) Youth Organization called for Ellington to be removed from the post citing a high rate of extra-judicial killings and police

But in a statement, Ellington said "the records will show that fatal shootings by the police have been on the decline in recent years.

"Indeed, the figures for 2012 show continuing decline, which, if it holds, could see this year ending with the lowest figures in seven years," he said, noting that the figures will for the period 2006-2012 there was an average of 253 fatal shootings annually, with 2010 and 2008 recording the highest and lowest figures respectively, 320, in 2011 and 225 in 2008.

## **Trinidad justice minister fired**

Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar on Thursday fired Justice Minister Herbert Volney for misleading Cabinet about the opinions of the chief justice and the director of public prosecutions over the early proclamation of the controversial Clause 34 of the Administration of the Justice (Indictable Offences Act, which was recently passed in both houses of Parliament.

The prime minister said that she had met with Volney and he admitted the error.

Speaking to the nation in a live television broadcast, Persad-Bissessar said: "On behalf of my government I express sincere apologies to the people of T&T, the president, the Parliament, the chief justice and director of public prosecutions."

Stating that Volney had

given erroneous advice to Cabinet, she said; "The minister had a duty to faithfully and accurately represent the position and views of the CJ and the DPP and he failed so to do and the Cabinet relying in good faith, acted on his assurances.

"His failure to do so is a serious misrepresentation and amounts to material non-disclosure of relevant facts to the Cabinet from making an informed decision.'

Volney is the third senor minister to be fired in the People's Partnership 28-months tenure.

Her statement came two days after Opposition Leader Dr. Keith Rowley and other groups staged a march to President's House demanding and explanation from her and called for the firing of Volney and Attorney General Anand Ramlogan.

The controversial section 34 would have allowed accused people to have their cases thrown out ten years after the commission of the offence, once no trial had begun.

The move created public condemnation when two party financiers Ish Galbaransing and Steve Ferguson became the first to apply to be discharged after it was proclaimed on Aug. 31, 2012.

### Improve exports, reduce deficits: IMF

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has pledged to assist Caribbean countries to deal with their economies, urging governments to continue focusing on improving exports and reduce external current deficits.

In a communique issued recently after a two-day high level forum attended by CARICOM foreign ministers and central bank governors in Port of Spain, Trinidad, the Washington-based financial institution said the region had "important strengths" on which it could

build on.

"Reforms to address structural impediments will also help in that regard although the implementation of such reforms is challenging in the short term, in the long run they could bring undoubted benefits for the economies of the Caribbean and help create jobs.

"Political stability, strong investor protection and observance of the rule of law have made it an attractive destination for investment," the communique noted.

The IMF said that countries with high debt ratios will benefit from pursuing fiscal adjustment in the contest of weak growth can be difficult to sustain, the cost of pursuing unbalanced policies can be more disruptive economically and socially then gradual and credible adjustments.

According to the IMF, there has been an increase in financial-interconnectedness in the region and this is an issue which presents large benefits but also carries risks.

### Cuban sugar looks to rebound after bitter decline

JARONU, Cuba (AP) — Cuba's signature industry is showing signs of life two years after the worst harvest in more than a century.

Hulking processing plants are coming back online and production is rising, a boon to rural towns like Jaronu where producing sugar has been a way of life for generations.

Officials recently said that the harvest is expected to increase by 20 percent in the coming season after jumps of 7 percent and 16 percent in the last two harvests.

At the Brasil refinery in the steamy central province of Camaguey, a \$6 million makeover is under way. During a recent visit, bulldozers were busy re-grading the floor, operators were laying foundations for new machinery and workers buzzed about, hammering and welding amid a deafening mechanic roar and a pervasive oily odor.

"I've never seen as much money being spent here as there is now," said Alodia Campo, a 54-year-old plant engineer and among the few employees still remaining from the Brasil's glory days.

With world market prices rebounding, sugar is suddenly more profitable, and a radical reorganization of the sector could offer a blueprint for how to lift the rest of the island's inefficient command economy.

"The Cuban sugar industry is tied to the culture, history and identity of this country," said Liobel Perez, spokesman for Azcuba, the largely autonomous state-run company that replaced the Sugar Ministry in late 2011. "Sugarcane will not define Cuba's future, but it will have to be a part of it."

Just two years ago, the sugar industry was on its knees.

The sugar minister had been sacked. State-run newspapers lambasted rampant inefficiency and thousands of workers were moved to other sectors. Eventually, the powerful Sugar Ministry itself was eliminated.

Even with the current reorganization, sugar revenues are far outpaced by sectors such as tourism and nickel mining.

Last year, sugar earnings were \$333 million, while nickel brought in \$1.25 billion, according to a study compiled by Rafael Romeu, a U.S.-based economist and former president of the Association for the Study of the Cuban Economy. Tourism brought in \$2.5 billion in revenue in 2011, according to government figures.

President Raul Castro created Azcuba as part of his effort to stimulate the farm sector and streamline a fossilized Marxist economy that even he says doesn't work anymore.

Unlike virtually every other part of the state-dominated economy, Azcuba gets to keep 65 percent of its revenues and make decisions about reinvesting without having to ask permission from the central government.

At the Brasil refinery, the mammoth rust-covered sheds installed by American Sugar Refining Co., which launched the plant in 1921, still stand. Although surrounded by the twisted carcasses of machinery ripped out of the structures, the Brasil is expected to be ready for the upcoming annual harvest and start milling cane by February.

# UN marks Jamaica's 50-year membership

A flag raising ceremony, to mark Jamaica's 50th anniversary as a member of the United Nations (UN) was held Tuesday at the auspicious site of the headquarters of the world governing body.

On a rainy Sept. 18, the event was attended by the president of the General Assembly, political officials of Jamaican heritage, and diplomats including those of countries that co-sponsored the G A resolution providing for Jamaica's admission half a century ago.

Jamaica became a member of the world body of nations on Sept. 18, 1962.

Fourteen countries cosponsored General Assembly resolution 1750 (XVII) entitled: 'Admission of Jamaica to membership of the UN.

They are Australia, Canada, Ceylon (Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka), Cyprus, Ethiopia, Malaya (Malaysia), Ghana, India, New Zealand, Nigeria, Pakistan, Sierra Leone, Tanganyika (United Republic of Tanzania), and the United Kingdom.

In reflecting on Jamaica's 50 years of membership, the country's ambassador to the UN, Raymond O. Wolfe, noted that along with other members of the global community, Jamaica seeks to bring renewed attention to the most pressing challenges facing the world today, including the impact of the global financial crisis, climate change, human rights, and sustainable development.

Over the past 50 years, Jamaica has served on several influential bodies within the UN system, including the Security Council.

## Easier access to health care

Because of a new health care law which took effect on Sept. 23. millions of Americans will have access to standardized, easy-tounderstand information about health plan benefits and coverage. Insurance companies and employers are now required to provide consumers in the private health insurance market with a brief summary of what a health insurance policy or employer plan covers, called a Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC). Additionally, consumers will have access to a Uniform Glossary that defines insurance and medical terms in standard, consumerfriendly terms.

These tools will also assist employers in finding the best coverage for their business and employees.

"Thanks to the health care law, Americans will now get clear, consistent and comparable information when shopping for health coverage," said Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Kathleen Sebelius. "These new tools empower consumers to make informed decisions about their health coverage options and to choose the plan that is best for them, their families, and their

business.'

The SBC includes a new comparison tool, called Coverage Examples, which is modeled on the Nutrition Facts label required for packaged food, that helps consumers compare coverage options by showing a standardized sample of what each health plan will cover for two common medical situations—having a baby and managing type 2 diabetes.

The SBC will include information about the covered health benefits, out-of-pocket costs, and the network of providers. The glossary defines terms commonly used in the health insurance market, such as "deductible" and "co-pay," using clear language.

Before Sept. 23, people often lacked uniform and comparable information when shopping for coverage, often relying only on marketing materials to make decisions. Starting this fall, consumers will receive the SBC free of charge and in writing from the consumers' insurance company or employer. This information can be requested at any time, but it will also be made available when shopping for, enrolling in or renewing coverage. It will also be provided whenever information in

the SBC changes significantly.

The SBC is now available for consumers in the individual health insurance market. For enrollees in group health plans enrolling during an open enrollment period, it will be available during the next open enrollment period that started on Sept. 23, 2012. For enrollees who enroll outside of an open enrollment period, it will be available at the start of the next plan year that began on or after Sept. 23, 2012.

The SBC and Glossary were developed in collaboration with the Department of Labor, Department of Treasury, consumer groups, the insurance industry, State Insurance Commissioners, and other stakeholders.

# In Trinidad, rapid depletion of people's goodwill

The government of Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar of Trinidad and Tobago has lurched from one disaster, one scandal, one embarrassment to the next with an all-in-a-day's-work regularity that surely must give pause even to seasoned observers of state-sponsored misadventure. Approaching the midpoint of her term, the evidence has mounted rapidly that precious little remains, if any at all, of the reserves of goodwill Bissessar rode to a comfortable electoral plurality in May, 2010. Those expectations among the citizenry of brand-new possibilities for the country, with the historic election of its first female prime minister heading a coalition government, seem now a wispy indulgence, well more than two and a half years

Bissesar's administration is, at the moment, battling head winds from an episode that will no doubt soon elicit from her, if it hasn't already, the "Let's move on" salve she readily applies whenever there's been this big-screen projection of misconduct. There are some signs of greater resistance this time to the "move on" line. This latest infamy – in which a section of a criminal justice bill passed by the parliament

was surreptitiously extricated and presented to the country's president for early proclamation -- appears to have touched some raw nerves beyond the usual talk radio diatribes, press sniping and blowback from political adversaries. For one thing, a huge crowd heeded the call of Opposition Leader Keith Rowley to hit the streets in protest against this wanton abuse of power and to demand the ouster of the two cabinet members seen as handson orchestrators of the perfidious action, the attorney general and the minister of justice.

Unshakably of a piece with the early-proclamation gambit is the appearance of dirty dealing arising from the potential benefit it held for two financiers of the ruling party, who have for years been under indictment for fraud in the construction of the Piarco Airport terminal. Because they are wanted for related offences in the U.S. as well and a judge in Trinidad some

time ago blocked their extradition, the plot surrounding the nimble pair has grown ever thicker, including this latest governmental sleight of hand with the legislation which, some contend, provided a loophole for the two men to walk free.

Keeping an uncanny silence for a good while after these shenanigans became a cause célèbre, the prime minister finally announced recently that the justice minister had been dismissed, she having concluded that he was solely responsible for leading the government onto the prickly ground it now occupied. If some, perhaps allies of or favorably disposed to Bissessar, found this appeasement attempt acceptable, it's clear that many do not.

Getting rid of a guy who ought never to have been in anybody's cabinet in the first place is small comfort to a public enraged by not only the "in your face" diss from the government in the instant matter, but an accumulation of them. This latest volley, though, may have "last straw" potential. The "loose cannon" handle frequently affixed in press reports to Herbert Volney, the fired justice minister who is the one sacrificial lamb so far, is, if anything, somewhat charitable. Volney was a


sitting high court judge with a history that included some eyebrow-raising rulings and many a preposterous popping off, who abruptly quit the bench to become, almost instantaneously, a candidate for political office in Bissessar's party. Bissessar, in claiming the cabinet was duped by a fellow as beset by issues as Volney seems to be, apparently doesn't much care how this comments on the crew she leads. A more likely reaction in the public square to the prime minister's Volney maneuver is that offering him up was the least onerous path to containing the hubbub.

Volney, like a few others who have been cut loose from the cabinet, was expendable. Others, much less so. There are those who are dead certain, for example, that Jack Warner, even with all the international notoriety that attaches to his name, is securely of "untouchable" ranking. Who would dare doubt? That Warner would be installed as the country's minister of national security is probably the biggest affront yet to the governed by the folks now bearing the responsibility of governance.

Most concerning is that the continuing eruptions of highhanded, devil-may-care action of one kind

or another seem to have produced no awareness whatsoever of such a behavioral arc being noxious, to be altogether avoided. Ideally, Bissessar's "move on" intonation would suggest plowing arduously forward, experience having delivered the tools for more skillful navigation ahead. Instead we have here a saga of the repetitive strut, where enjoying authority status and the rule of law are polar opposites, where preening and posturing under the rubric of power is the stylebook's foremost performance dictum and where how all of this looks from the other side doesn't count for squat.

So there's been a junior unqualified officer brazenly positioned to assume a top intelligence post; there's been the odious presence of Warner; there's been a channeling of calypsonian Mighty Spoiler's "Magistrate Try Himself" classic, this time Bissessar arranging for themselves "bigging-up" themselves in the award of the celebrated silk (senior counsel status) for herself and her attorney general...a litany of other abhorrent stuff. Given all of which. no one should expect this sneaky early-proclamation ruse, dastardly though it be, to rise even to bumpin-the-road level for these players.





Chief Operating Officer Lloyd Tai said that following a satisfactory demonstration, the airline will be given its license to operate.

He said this is the first time that an airline in Jamaica has had to go through the full certification process.

He said Fly Jamaica Airways would likely start with a three-on-three flight schedule to each destination, with one-day downtime for maintenance.

Fly Jamaica was set to begin operations in August but Tai said with the remaining processes it would likely take another month before the airline officially takes to the skies.

### **Trinidad**

The United States is still seeking to extradite two Trinidad and Tobago businessmen, Ishwar Galbaransingh and Steve Ferguson to the United States to face charges of fraud and money laundering.

The U.S. Embassy Public Affairs Department in Port of Spain issued a statement saying "The United States continues to seek their extradition despite the ruling last year by the Trinidad and Tobago High Court. They remain under indictment in the United States."

The statement followed legal action taken by the two businessmen to have their cases dismissed from the courts under the contentious Section 34 of the Administra-

tion of Justice (Indictable Proceedings Act 2011), which was proclaimed by President Max Richards on August 30, 2012.

Following an outcry over the proclamation by the opposition People's National Movement (PNM) and other sectors of the society, the Kamla Persad-Bissessar

administration was forced to hurriedly summon parliament to repeal the Act last week.


The US said it was concerned that the fraud cases would be dropped.

The two were indicted in 2005 in a Miami Federal Court on numerous fraud and money-laundering charges stemming from alleged bid-rigging between 1996 and 2005 on contracts for the TT\$1.6 billion Piarco International Airport project.

The High Court had ruled that Galbaransigh and Ferguson could be tried in Trinidad and Tobago for the offences and quashed the extradition warrants for the two men. Attorney General Anand Ramlogan did not appeal the ruling, promising that both accused would face a "speedier trial in T&T."

Had the section 34 of the Act not repealed Galbaransingh and Ferguson would have had their cases dismissed since they had fell under the l0-year time limit stipulated for cases to be dismissed under the section.

# Coping with everyday aches

As a woman, you most likely experience aches and pains from your daily activities no matter what your lifestyle entails. In fact, a recent study shows 89 percent of women experience some type of muscle or joint pain every year, and 63 percent experience it weekly, according to ProAct, an independent marketing research firm.

"If you suddenly spend the whole day cleaning out your basement, or climbing ladders to clear gutters, muscle strain or overexertion is highly likely," says family physician Elena Klimenko, M.D. "You have to let muscles build up gradually."

Don't let everyday household chores be painful. Treat aches right away.

Consult a physician or fitness professional to build an exercise routine safely.

• Relax: Hot baths, gentle stretching and meditation can help prevent and relieve stress-related muscle tension and stiffness. Even if it means putting the kids to bed early or turning your phone off for an hour, incorporate stress-free down time into your busy day, every day.

• Relieve: Next time you experience pain, avoid popping conventional painkillers that masks symptoms. "A homeopathic medicine works with your body to relieve not only pain, but also swelling, which is a common reason for pain," says Dr. Klimenko. "It does so without the risk of drug interactions or complications, even if combined with pharmaceuticals."

For example, Dr. Klimenko recommends Arnicare Gel from Boiron, an over-the-counter gel that can be applied anywhere on the body to reduce muscle pain and stiffness, swelling from injuries, and bruises. # Babies in N.Y. aren't screened for heart defects

Small hearts can sometimes conceal big challenges, especially when it comes to congenital heart defects. The arrival of a new baby to a family is usually a time of anticipation and excitement. However, some babies come into the world with congenital heart defects.

"We could potentially save these tiny lives by screening newborns for heart defects before being discharged from the hospital," said Merle Myerson, M.D., American Heart Association New York City Board of Directors.

The simple, low-cost test, pulse oximetry, or pulse ox, consists of sensors placed on a baby's hand and foot to check low blood oxygen levels - a significant indicator of heart issues in babies. With congenital heart defects considered to be the leading cause of birth-defect related deaths in the U.S., new research suggests wider use of pulse ox screening could help identify more than 90 percent of heart defects. Congenital heart disease causes up to three percent of all infant deaths in the first year of life.

In September 2011, U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services Kathleen Sebelius suggested that critical congenital heart defects screening be added to the "Recommended Uniform Screening Panel" for newborns before they are released from a hospital or birthing facility.

Pulse ox screenings are strongly supported by the American Heart Association as this non-invasive test detects life-threatening congenital heart defects, which otherwise go undetected by current screening methods.

New Hampshire, New Jersey, Maryland and Indiana have all recently passed laws requiring newborns to have this simple screening prior to being discharged from the hospital. The American Heart Association believes that with legislation, the same can be done in New York.

"One life lost is one too many especially when we have simple proven methods to detect for potentially fatal conditions," said Myerson.



Jean claims the reason the Fugees broke up was because of a betrayal.

He told Vibe magazine that Hill lied to him.

He told the music publication that she led him to believing that he fathered her first born son, Zion.

He later found out that the true father was Rohan Marley, one of Bob Marley's sons who toured with his brother's Ziggy Marley & the Melody Makers who were the opening act for The Fugees. Reportedly, Jean stated: "In that

moment something died between us. I was married and Lauryn and I were having an affair, but she led me to believe that the baby was mine, and I couldn't forgive


"She could no longer be my muse. Our love spell was broken."

Jean further said that the betrayal he felt from Hill led to the band's breakup.

# Small cars may be the future



The Resident Evil film franchise is proving to be every bit as enduring as the hordes of flesh-eating zombies featured in its every episode. The movies are based on the popular series of high body-count computer games which has also spawned some comic books, graphic novels, cartoons, and a line of merchandise with action figures and

This fifth screen adaptation marks yet another collaboration between writer/director

Paul W.S. Anderson and his wife, cover girl-turned-actress Milla Jovovich. She, of course, reprises her lead role as Alice, the pistol-packing protector of a planet once again threatened with extinction.

As usual, Anderson does his best to exploit his supermodel spouse's good looks, between keeping her clad in form-fitting latex for the duration of the adventure and seizing on any excuse to take a pause in the action for a lingering, extreme close-up of her flawless facial features. Otherwise, RE 5 offers formulaic zombie fighting fare, with Alice and an intrepid team of defenders (Michelle Rodriguez, Boris Kodjoe, Bingbing Li, et al) representing the last hope of humanity.



The MLS play-offs race is heating up as the regular season nears its end. There are 10 play-off positions available in MLS, five from each conference, and to date, only three teams, in the West, have offi-

cially clinched play-off berths.

In the Eastern Conference, first-place Sporting Kansas City (55 pts.), Chicago Fire (53 pts.) and New York Red Bulls (50 pts.) are the top three teams likely to see post-season play, while the two other

play-off spots still up for grabs are being contested by DC United (47 pts.), Houston Dynamo (46 pts.) and the surprising first-year expansion club Montreal Impact (40 pts.), which has a long shot.

In the Western Conference, leader San Jose Earthquakes (60 pts.) officially clinched a play-off berth over a week ago, and the late-surging defending champion Los Angeles Galaxy (49 pts.) and Real Salt Lake (49 pts.) are also officially assured post-season play. The fourth play-off spot most likely will be occupied by the Seattle Sounders (48 pts.), while either the Vancouver Whitecaps (37 pts.) or FC Dallas (36 pts.) will be the fifth team in the post-season.

Last Saturday, there were two crucial draws that kept teams ahead in their Eastern Conference play-off quests. Montreal Impact's goalless draw with Sporting Kansas City kept the Canadians in the hunt for one of the last two Eastern Conference berths. Kansas City also certainly treasured the point as well as it stayed two points ahead of the Chicago Fire. The other draw, a 1-1 result, involved the New York Red Bulls and the New England Revolution. New England (29 pts.) is out of the play-offs, but the Red Bulls are still in a tight battle; the tie helped the Red Bulls to stay within reach of second place Chicago and maintain a slim three-point margin ahead of DC United.

The Red Bulls blew the chance to come away with three points in New England Saturday to be within a point of Chicago. Leading the game 1-0 after Joel Lindpere's second-half stoppage time goal in the 91st minute, the Red Bulls failed to secure the lead as the Revolution came the other way three minutes after Lindpere's tally to tie the game from a header by Darrius Barnes. Chicago maintained its second place position with a 2-1 victory over the Columbus Crew (45 pts.), which has a slim chance of making the play-

In the Western Conference, Juninho and Irish international Robbie Keane each scored two goals to help the Los Angeles Galaxy beat Toronto FC, 4-2, to win its fourth straight game and clinch the play-off spot.

Terry Dunfield and Luis Silva scored for Toronto FC (22pts.), which is out of the play-offs. Meanwhile Javier Morales and Fabian Espindola scored to give to give Real Salt Lake a 2-1 victory over the Portland Timbers to also ensure post –season play. Despite Seattle Sounders' 2-1 loss to San Jose Earthquakes, the Sounders are virtually assured the fourth spot in the West.

Once the five play-off teams in each Conference are official, the fourth and fifth place teams in each conference will face-off to create a four-team semifinal bracket in each Conference. In the semifinals,

the fourth-place teams will

play their respective Conference winners, while the second and third-place teams in their respective Conferences will play each other. The four semifinals and the two Conference finals will be two-game series with the most aggregate goals producing the winners. In case of draws after the two-game series, two 15-minute periods then penalty kicks if needed will determine the winners. The first games in each series are hosted by the lower seeds. The 2012 MLS Cup, the championship final, is a one-game affair hosted by the higher seed and the same resolution to determine draws will

"We are in discussions with an investor. Once we have an understanding, we can move forward with it," he said.

Hilaire did not elaborate on the structure of the Twenty20 league and if it would be a mirror image of other popular domestic leagues such as the Indian Premier League (IPL). He did make it clear though that the existing Caribbean Twenty20 will be played next year.

"We will be having the Caribbean Twenty20 in January as scheduled. The board will meet later this month to make some decisions on its structure and how it will be organized," the WICB CEO added.

He said the WICB directors are scheduled to meet to discuss the governance structure of the board. Hilaire said the board will also discuss the planned Twenty20 league and finalize its structure.

Hilaire said he would be bringing on board both the Federation of International Cricketers' Association and the West Indies Players Association to discuss issues pertaining to players to make sure there were no hurdles.

well known in the running community, migrated to the United States from Panama in 1965. He started his running career during the days of Frank Shorter, Alberto Salazar, and Bill Rodgers in the early 1980s. At the time, with the growth of the New York City Marathon, McFarlane decided to pick up the running sport more seriously than over previous years.

"All the three great runners made me run even more," he said after he completed the Chris Hoban race in a time of 38:24 for 99th place overall in Brooklyn. Now 56-years of age. McFarlane is still going strong.

A day prior to the Chris Hoban run, he tested another race this one at a distance of 5K at Eisenhower Park conducted by Hofstra University. Over this 3.1 mile distance, he was timed in 20:31 which earned him 22nd place overall and first position in his age group (55-59).

At this age, it becomes a little more difficult running back-to-back.

During the 24th annual Hoban event, his strategy was to get to the bridge and use the rolling hills on Third Avenue in Brooklyn going north to the finish line.

"But I had a car get in front of me and a pedestrian dashed out between cars and I almost collided in front of him," he said. "The next thing I knew I started to feel a tweet in my hamstring. I wanted to finish because I wanted the Michael Hanley award for the Sanitation Department so I could mail it to the commissioner to put it on display.

The weather was a little on the warm side for the Hoban event as it was very favorable to the runners.

"I love coming here (to the Chris Hoban race)," he continued. "I've been running in this race for maybe 20 years. I believe the directors of the race then gave us sweaters for winning. I have a lot of them

The directors of the race marked the first time electronic chips were used on the bibs for scoring and timing purposes.

"The scoring was done properly instead of (the officials) taking off tags," McFarlane said. "If someone ran in front of us at the finish line it doesn't matter because the chip time is already recorded. The chip time is better than the hand time, except when it is on the sneaker...."

Host Sri Lanka started off their world cup Twenty20 match with a swinging victory over Zimbabwe. Sri Lanka came back from 82 runs for 3 wickets in the twelfth over to score 182 runs for 4 wickests after 20 overs. Kumar Sangakkara and Agantha Mendis responded well with a partnership of 94 runs for the third wicket. Mendis scored 43 runs not out from 30 balls and Sangakkara 44 runs from 26 balls.

When Zimbabwe batted, they were bowled out for 100 runs with Jeewan Mendis picking up three wickets and Agantha Mendis 6 wickets for 8 runs.






