Green energy efficiency

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts, (IPS/GIN) - The tiny federation of St. Kitts-Nevis and its larger neighbor to the north, Jamaica, are leading the Caribbean's search for new ways to become more energy efficient by installing new solar streetlights, a green alternative to traditional ones.

In St. Kitts, the project is a collaborative effort between the government of Denzil Douglas and Taiwan, which have had diplomatic relations for the past 28

Jamaica fiscal squeeze

The government of Prime Minister Portia Simpson Miller in Jamaica has urged nationals to accept the austere measures that will accompany a multi-million dollar stand-by agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) that would include increases taxes and the launch of a national debt exchange offer.

In a joint nation-wide address on Monday, Simpson Miller and Finance Minister Dr. Peter Phillips defended the decision to enter

Obama proposals face quick opposition in Congress

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Barack Obama set up high-stakes clashes with Republicans over guns, immigration, taxes and climate change in a State of the Union address that showcased his determination to mark his legacy. Rep. Paul Ryan said Obama could better achieve his goals if he would get out of "campaign mode."

At the center of looming confrontations in Washington is a fight over the very role of government, with Obama pushing a raft of new initiatives to improve preschool programs and voting, boost manufacturing and research and development, raise the minimum wage and lower energy use. "It is our unfinished task to make sure that this government works on behalf of the many and not just the few," he said.

Republicans who control the House and hold enough votes to stall legislation in the Senate were just as quick to declare that the government helps best by getting out of the way.

Ryan, the GOP's vice presidential candidate last fall, said Wednesday morning that Obama's leadership style stands in the way of bipartisan efforts to resolve problems like the ballooning deficit. "He seems to always be in campaign mode, where he treats people in the other party as enemies rather than partners," the Wisconsin Republican said in an interview on "CBS This Morning."

Ryan was asked if he supported House Speaker John Boehner's remark Tuesday that he didn't believe Obama "has the guts" to stand up to liberals in his own party on spending cuts.

"That's why the congressman makes remarks like that," Ryan said of Boehner.

Ryan's comments came just hours before Obama was to set off on a three-state trip, starting in North Carolina, to sell to voters the programs he outlined in his address. Obama hit the road fre-

Caribbean

The 15-member Caribbean Community (CARICOM) grouping and Chile have pledged to continue working together to further strengthen their relationship.

A communique issued at the end of talks between Chilean President Sebastain Pinera Echenique and CARICOM leaders noted "a commitment was also made to work together with the aim to achieve regional integration objectives set out by the new hemispheric architecture represented by CELAC, the Community of Latin America and Caribbean cooperation."

Several CARICOM leaders attended the two-day summit in

Chile that the Guyana-based Secretariat said were aimed at strengthening



and consolidating Latin America and Caribbean cooperation

The meeting, which was also attended by regional foreign ministers and the CARICOM Secretary General Irwin La Rocque heard President Pinera expressed his appreciation and gratitude to CARICOM for its support for "the Chilean candidacy to the UN Human Rights Council and the Inter-American Commission of Human Rights" in 2011.

The communique said he also thanked them for the endorsement of the Council for Foreign and Community Relations (COF-COR) to the Chilean candidacy to the UN Security Council, for the period 2014-2015.

Antigua

Contrary to the belief emanating from some quarters, deportees do not head the list of crime perpetrators in Antigua & Barbuda.

National Security Minister Dr. Errol Cort said these individuals are not at the forefront of the criminal activities that "we are currently experiencing."

He said based on reports from various law enforcement agencies

"the suggestion is that perhaps they might be more behind the scenes organizing and arrang-



ing, but they are certainly not at the forefront."

In 2012, 62 citizens of Antigua and Barbuda were deported back to the state.

Of that number, 20 were from the USA, 20 from the United Kingdom and 20 from Canada, with the remainder from the Caribbean.

The category of offenses which caused their deportation includes, aggravated felony, child molestation, denied entry, narcotics, overstaying, rape, robbery, larceny and working illegal.

He said upon their return to the island "serious offenders are monitored by the respective agencies to ensure they don't break the law.

Dominica

Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrrit says he intends to write

to Britain later this month to permission get for Dominica to sever ties with



the London-based Privy Council.

He said the country wants to join the Trinidad-based Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ).

The prime minister said the country will seek to make the CCJ its final court in 2013, as the island has been paying for the regional court established in 2001 to replace the Privy Council.

CARICOM countries have taken

a US\$100 million loan from the Barbados-based Caribbean Development Bank to meet the operation of the CCJ and ensure its financial independence.

Grenada

Grenada's oldest political party has pulled out the race in the

next general election carded for Feb. 19, effectively making it a two-way con-



test between the ruling National Democratic Congress (NDC) and the main opposition New National Party (NNP).

Interim leader of the 63-yearold United Labor Party (GULP), Wilfred Haynes said: "We decided at a meeting recently that we will not contest because we have some things to get done...we are just not ready to contest the elections."

But former opposition leader Michael Baptiste, who had earlier indicated that he would have led the party's candidates into the elections, appeared on an NDC platform with Prime Minister Tilman Thomas and vowed to campaign on behalf of the incumbent.

This is the first time the GULP, which once formed the government for 27 years under the late eccentric leader Sir Eric Gairy, will not be contesting an election since its formation in 1951. The last time the GULP won a seat was in 1995 when two of its candidates were successful.

Guyana

The search for victims in last month's boat collision on the Mazaruni River, Guvana has been called off, according to Transport Minister Robeson Benn, who said maritime officials are now looking to reconstruct what happened in the deadliest river accident in decades.

Following the collision it was reported that nine persons missing, were



however a tenth body was later found. Reports later surfaced that an eleventh person has been unaccounted for.

The accident between two boats that were reported to have been carrying at least 20 people occurred on the Mazaruni River. Shortly after rescue workers found

the bodies of six persons.


Several persons were taken to the Bartica Hospital with minor injuries.

The accident coms more than a month after six people died in another collision between two boats on the Pomeroon River.

Jamaica

Deputy President of the Senate, Angela Brown-Burke, says Jamaica should legalize the use of marijuana for medicinal reasons.

Brown Burke, contributing to a debate on plant genetics in the



juana, represents a worthwhile economic opportunity that the country should seek to tap.

Brown-Burke expressed the hope that very soon the list of products covered by the plant genetic resources for food and agriculture treaty would be expanded by the research and work of Jamaicans and that cannabis should be added.

"These are discussions that we need to have. There are other states and other countries that are way advanced than we are because they have taken that bold step forward," Brown-Burke said.

"I believe we need to put it in a framework that allows them to participate legally in the economy and I believe that is an opportunity that we should not miss," she added.

The call for the legislation or marijuana in Jamaica has got stronger in light of several states in the USA moving to decriminalize its use.

St. Kitts

St. Kitts Deputy Prime Minister Sam Condor continued with a war of words with Prime Minister Dr. Denzil Douglas by publicly oppos-

ing his decision to fire senior government minister Dr. Timothy Harris recently.



In a statement, Condor who has sided with Harris to oppose several government measures and policies in the past, said he found, "no justification in the reasons postulated by the Prime Minister for the dismissal of Dr. Timothy Harris,"

He said Harris, as an elected

Antigua wins legal battle against agricultural firm

A United States federal district court has dismissed as breach of contract lawsuit brought by an Antigua-based agriculture company against the government of Antigua and Barbuda to the tune of US\$750,000.

The case was filed on Jul. 19, 2010 by Dan Abraham Sarfati, the son of Maurice Sarfati, of Roydan Ltd., regarding the payment of three promissory notes issued to Roydan Ltd. and signed by Hilroy Humphreys as Minister of Agriculture in June 1990 and guaranteed by the Ministry of Finance.

According to an Antigua and Barbuda government statement, issued in New York on Feb. 11, Dan Sarfati, who was eight years old in 1990, alleged that the monies had never been repaid, and that because of "threats and coercion by persons associated with the Bird administration, made to his father who was fearful for his safety,

no legal action had previously been taken."

The statement said the current administration of Prime Minister Baldwin Spencer engaged the professional services of two Antigua lawyers, Monalie E. Bledsoe and Conrad Airall, practicing attorneys in the U.S. to act on its behalf.

Following the filing of a defense in the District of Columbia and the taking of depositions in Antigua and Barbuda, the lawyers filed a motion to dismiss the claim on two grounds, the statement said.

Firstly, it said the lawsuit was barred by the statute of limitations, "notwithstanding the alleged threats which were pleaded were baseless."

Secondly, the statement said the issue of the promissory notes "did not constitute a commercial activity by the government because Hilroy Humphreys had no legal authority to issue or sign the promissory notes."

Victory for Worldwide Web shop owners

Web shop owners in The Bahamas scored a major victory recently when a judge issued an injunction to prevent them from being shut down until the legality of the industry is determined by the courts.

Senior Justice Jon Isaacs granted the preliminary order, the day after Prime Minister Perry Christie ordered web shop operators to cease business or face prosecution.

The order prevents the attorney general, the commissioner of police, minister of national security and minister of tourism, who has the responsibility for gaming, from interfering with the operations of

gambling houses.

The jobs of thousands of web shop employees appeared in jeopardy when Christie ordered the shutdown of web shops after the majority of citizens voted in the Jan. 28 gaming referendum opposed regulating and taxing the industry.

Bahamians voted overwhelmingly in a national referendum last month to reject proposals legalizing web-shop gambling and a national lottery.

The referendum had been conducted in a campaign similar to a general election with the ruling Progressive Labor Party (PLP) urging supporters to give the thumbs up to the initiatives.

Delta coy on Georgetown cancellation

Delta Airlines General Manager for corporate communications for Latin American and The Caribbean, Sara M. Lora, was a bit coy about reports that the airline giant is about to cancel its JFK -Georgetown route.

In a telephone conversation with Caribbean Life from her Atlanta, Georgia office, Lora argued that Delta has not made a statement of its intention to sever ties with the Guyana government.

"Delta continues to monitor the Georgetown route and has not made a decision as to its Georgetown schedule," said the Delta official, who was quoted as saying that the airline "had not made an official announcement" concerning the New York to Guyana route..

"We have not confirmed flights beyond the month of May, but we expect to have a decision and will communicate the flight's status as soon as possible, added Lora, who promised to contact Caribbean Life if a decision is made to confirm the airline's pull-out from Guyana.

The flurry of news reports by Guyanese online sites claiming that the carrier would end its service in May of this year sent Guyanese travelers into a mass of confusion, worried that their summer season travel with Delta would be inter-

The were reports that the airline, which added the South American destination to its roster five years ago, was pulling out of Guyana in favor of a more lucrative route. Other reports stated that the airline giant could not compete with lower airfares offered by Caribbean Airlines, which enjoyed the advantage of a fuel concession offered bynthe Trinidad and Tobago government.

The ∑news medium Website Demerarawaves.com reported that despite Guyana Tourism Minister Irfan Ali's belief that Delta is ceasing operations, he was still in the process of arranging talks with top officials from the airline.

quently in campaign-style trips in December to appeal directly to voters for the approach that he favored, including new taxes, to avoid the so-called "fiscal cliff."

Republican critics have said the president should stay home and focus his attention on dealing directly with Congress on these issues.

In the formal Republican response to Obama's address, Sen. Marco Rubio, R-Fla., said, "More government isn't going to help you get ahead. It's going to hold you back. More government isn't going to create more opportunities. It's going to limit them."

"And more government isn't going to inspire new ideas, new businesses and new private sector jobs. It's going to create uncertainty," said Rubio, a rising star in the party.

Uncompromising and aggressive, Obama pressed

his agenda on social issues and economic ones, declaring himself determined to intervene to right income inequality and boost the middle class. He called on Congress to pass comprehensive immigration reform with a pathway to citizenship for 11 million illegal immigrants, far-reaching gun control measures and a climate bill to cut greenhouse gas emissions. He threatened to go around Congress with executive actions on climate change if it fails to act.

But Obama cannot count on willing partners on those issues, any one of which could tie Congress in knots for months with no guarantee of success. Gun control, which Obama made a focus of his speech, faces dim prospects on Capitol Hill. The prospect for immigration legislation is better, but no sure thing. Climate change legislation is given no chance of success.

And Obama addressed relatively briefly the looming

fiscal crises confronting the nation and inevitably sucking up oxygen on Capitol Hill — the deep automatic spending cuts or "sequester" to take effect March 1, followed by the government running out of money to

fund federal agencies March 27. He made clear he will continue to press for the rich to pay more in taxes, a position Republicans have rejected.

Republicans, meanwhile, made clear they're in little

mood to cooperate.

"We are only weeks away from the devastating consequences of the president's sequester, and he failed to offer the cuts needed to replace it," Boehner said in a statement. "In the last election, voters chose divided government which offers a mandate only to work together to find common ground. The president, instead, appears to have chosen a go-it-alone approach to pursue his liberal agenda."

Earlier Tuesday, in a meeting with television correspondents and anchors, Boehner, R-Ohio, said immigration is about the only item on Obama's list that has a chance of passing this year. He said the president is more interested in getting a Democratic majority in both chambers next year.

Obama did reiterate his willingness to tackle entitlement changes, particularly on Medicare, though he has ruled out increasing the eligibility age for the popular benefit program for seniors.

"Those of us who care deeply about programs like Medicare must embrace the need for modest reforms — otherwise, our retirement programs will crowd out the investments we need for our children and jeopardize the promise of a secure retirement for future generations," he said.





into the agreement with the Washington-based financial institution, telling citizens that the national debt now stands at 140 per cent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP).

"As long as our debt as

a percentage of our economy remains this high, our capacity for growth and development will be severely limited," said the prime minister, stating that the negotiations have underscored the point that sustained growth will not materialize with Jamaica's present level of debt.

She said, with such high debt, no administration will be able to provide and sustain the quality health care service; nor will it be able to modernize and maintain the country's infrastructure at the appropriate levels to facilitate increased economic activity.

"In short, if the debt is not reduced, Jamaica faces a dismal future," Simpson Miller warned. "My administration is determined to implement the sound management practices our economy requires, and we have already begun.

The prime minister said the centerpiece of the IMF agreement that she we will sign is a commitment to significantly reduce the debt from the current level

of over 140 per cent.

"This is critical to our Economic Reform Program," she said, adding that it is also fundamental to job creation and will provide the social services for citizens.

On the heels of the national address, Jan Kees Martijn, Head of the IMF mission to Jamaica, said, over the last three decades, the Jamaican economy has experienced "very low economic growth, declining productivity and reduced international competitiveness.

"An important factor behind these problems has been Jamaica's unsustainable debt burden, which has undermined confidence and elevated risks to economic stability," he said.

Additionally, Martijn said Jamaica's high debt service has limited the government's potential to provide the services needed to achieve sustained rates of growth and increased welfare for its citizens.

"The IMF mission continues to work assiduously with the Jamaican authorities on an economic program that can help address these challenges and can be supported under a Fund arrangement," he said.

"We have made significant progress in reaching key understandings on strengthening macroeconomic policies, including through achieving and sustaining higher primary fiscal surpluses, which can help underpin debt sustainability; on structural reforms that can pave the way for private-sector led growth; and on social protection for the most vulnerable," he added.

The mission head said the mission welcomes the debt exchange announced by the Jamaican authorities for their domestic debt, stating that it is "an important element aimed at helping to put public debt firmly on a downward trajectory, reduce the stock of debt, and provide fiscal space for other needed government initiatives.

"In that regard, a successful debt exchange will require high participation from creditors to help secure financing assurances for a Fund-supported program," Martijn said.

Meantime, Jamaica's political and business communities have cautiously responded Simpson Miller's call for nationals to accept the stringent measures.

Financial analyst David Wan said, while the choice of a debt exchange meant that banks, bondholders and pensioners would do "the heavy lifting", it was a less unpalatable option "than a straight tax package".

He said overt tax package would have been "much more painful than this interest rate reduction on the bonds".

years. The Federation of St. Kitts-Nevis is one of a handful of Caribbean Community (CARICOM) countries to have diplomatic relations with Taiwan, as most of the others have diplomatic relations with mainland China.

"During the past year, we have successfully placed solar panels on the roof of government headquarters and set smart LED lights on the Kim Collins Highway and Frigate Bay Road," the resident Taiwanese ambassador, Miguel Tsao, told IPS. "Both ventures are significant and important. Also these projects were initiated with our joint efforts to tap into the unlimited clean energy source."

Instead of relying on fossil fuel, Tsao wants to see citizens doing their part to harness renewable energy to help make the vision of a green island a reality. The diplomat added that there are other important initiatives planned for the island, including the establishment of the first-ever solar farm and the second phase of an Agro-Tourism Demonstration Farm early in 2013.

Benefits of solar lights

The solar streetlights were installed by the Taiwanese company Speed Tech Energy. "It's a unique Cobra design. The lamp pole is solid steel and type and it can resist wind speeds of up to 250 kilometers per hour," Lucas Chiu, the company's general manager, told IPS.

Solar panels convert the sunlight into electricity during the day, and the generated electricity is stored in a battery.

Chiu explained that in cloudy or rainy days the batteries will still charge at 15 to 30 percent. Streetlights will function for three nights (for 13 hours each night), even during periods of continuous rainy days.

me it's a benefit to the communities where the lights have been installed because before the lights there were extremely dark spots," he said.

"I am a driver and I have always been concerned that when you are driving through those areas at night people could jump out into the road and put road blocks or there could be very serious accidents. I was particularly concerned for the bus drivers because criminals could hold them up at those dark spots at knife point or even at gunpoint," Liddie added.

Nevis, the smaller island in the twin-island federation, is also showing its neighbors in the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) that it is a leader in the area of generating clean and efficient energy and reducing energy costs, in spite of its small geographic and population size.

In 2010, the 13-kilometre-long island with a mere 12,000 residents, launched the first wind farm ever to be commissioned in the OECS with a promise to provide jobs for islanders, a reliable supply of wind energy, cheaper electricity and reduction in surcharge and the use of imported oils.

The island has been lauded by officials of the Bill Clinton Climate Change Initiative for its efforts towards a "Green Nevis." During a recent visit, a delegation from the Clinton Climate Change Initiative led by Councilor Jan Hartke and Ambassador Paoli Zampolli held discussions with

island officials on work that has already been done to move from fossil to alternative energy on Nevis.

"We have been delighted to see how the government has taken the lead and has mobilized the endeavor to bring geothermal to Nevis, and we will help the government with consultation in an effort to make alternative energy a reality on the island," said Hartke.

He noted that the Bill Clinton Climate Change Initiative aims to bring down the enormous electricity rates in small island states through alternative resources, with the assistance of wind, solar or waste energy.

Jamaica is implementing its streetlight energy-saving initiative jointly with the United States-based technology and engineering solutions firm, Green Energy RG LLC.

A government statement said the aim is to significantly reduce the cost to the budget to maintain the country's approximately 93,000 streetlights, which totals upwards of 2 billion Jamaican dollars per year (more than 2 million U.S. dollars).

On Jan. 8, the first set of solar-powered light emitting diode (LED) fixtures were installed at Osbourne Store, a community in the central parish of Clarendon.

"We hope to be able to proceed to install lights all over Clarendon and then into other parts of Jamaica. We hope that we will be able to complete the program... by midyear, and then we can evaluate the results and determine where we go from there," the country's local government and community development minister, Noel Arscott said.

Arscott said the pilot phase will see some 5,000 LED panels being installed in Clarendon as well as sections of St. Catherine and Kingston and St. Andrew. Additionally, he said the ministry's offices at Hagley Park Road in the capital Kingston would also be retrofitted with energy saving solutions.

Belizeans should vote 'no' in ICJ referendum

The more the country of Guatemala continues with its map, its rhetoric and its aggressive attitude towards Belize, the lesser the chances are that Belizeans will support the government with a "yes" vote to take the Belize-Guatemala dispute to the International Court of Justice for final resolution.

I agree with Maurice that our country has failed miserably in educating our people about this conflict. In the beginning, I was very supportive of the ICJ proposal to take this matter to the ICJ; but now I am giving it a second thought. I am not convinced that Belizeans can trust the UN, the OAS, Guatemala or any other organization to guarantee Belize's security and territorial integrity, because many court rulings have been made in the past and countries still act in their best interest and ignore them.

Plus there are many Belizeans who have mixed feelings about this dispute, because some of them have relatives in Guatemala and others are doubtful about Belizeans' legitimate claim to Belize. Due to the failure of our governments to educate our people about this dispute.

Many Belizeans have told me that their counytry does belong to Guatemala and it hurts to hear a Guatemalan saying, "Belice is Nuestros."

I am Belizean 100 percent and I'm more than willing to do

anything to defend my country. This, despite the fact that my grandmother is Guatemalan by birth, from Livingston "Labuga." My reason for taking this position is because as a Garifuna person, my people have moved from Saint Vincent to Honduras, Nicaragua, Guatemala and then Belize. where I have family up to this day. Out of all these countries, Belize provides the best hope for the future my children and grandchildren.

Even though I live in the United States, there is a certain feeling towards the place where a person was born and grew up as a child. It brings back memories that I cannot forget and will remain with me until I die. When Guatemala needs soldiers, they just go around and pick up anybody and forcefully take them to training camp. They do not care whether you are Garifuna, Creole, Mestizo or Maya. Who are the people that the Guatemalan army have a history of slaughtering over the years? The native indigenous Maya people, who they continue to abuse up to this day. The Garifuna people are not given their full autonomy in Guatemala and have had their own experiences with the military in Honduras and Nicaragua. The United States is the home for a significant number of Black Belizeans who would prefer to be in Belize if they could afford it.

Minimum wage increase makes good business sense

When Governor Cuomo called for raising New York's minimum wage, he expressed not only his own view, but also the convictions of 80 percent of New Yorkers who agree that the state's lowest-paid workers are in urgent need of a raise. As a business owner, I support the effort to raise the minimum wage because it makes good business sense.

Raising New York's minimum wage is a critical priority for accelerating the state's economic recovery. When lowpaid workers struggle to purchase necessities on inadequate wages as the cost of living rises, it undermines our economy. As said in a Business for a Fair Minimum Wage statement I signed along with business owners throughout our state. "With far less buying power than it had four decades ago, today's minimum wage means poverty for working families and weakens the consumer Minimum wage workers and other support staff are long overdue for a raise that reflects current living standards.

demand at the heart of our economy."

Raising the minimum wage will put more money in the pockets of workers who most need to spend those dollars. It will boost consumer spending at local businesses across the state. And nothing drives business owners like me to hire additional workers more than increased consumer demand.

Higher wages also benefit businesses by boosting employee productivity, retention and customer satisfaction, and reducing the high costs of employee turnover. Moreover, increasing the minimum wage

will reduce the strain on our social safety net caused by inadequate wages.

The Governor proposes raising the state's minimum wage from its current rate of \$7.25 per hour, which is just \$15,080 a year for full-time work, to \$8.75 per hour. This minimum wage increase would benefit nearly 1.6 million low-paid workers across the state, according to the nonpartisan Economic Policy Institute. The increased wages received by these workers would generate more than \$840 million in new economic activity.

Minimum wage workers in retail, restaurants, hospitality, the service industries and other support staff are long overdue for a raise that reflects current living standards. Rent, food, transportation and other keys of life can't wait for more time to go by.

UNHCR Refugee Appeal

To The Editor:

UNHCR reiterates concern about persons in need of international protection and fear of deportation in Caribbean waters. In the first two months of 2013, there has been a dramatic rise in the number of boats, particularly from Haiti, transporting individuals in Caribbean waters.

The UN refugee agency (UNHCR) reiterates its call for all countries in the Caribbean region, and the United states, to screen all individuals intercepted at sea to determine if they have a fear of persecution, or other protection concerns, before they are returned to their countries of origin.

Since the beginning of the year,

at least 217 Haitian and Cuban nationals have been intercepted in Caribbean waters. There have been interception reports off the coasts of Puerto Rico, Jamaica, The Bahamas, and the Cayman Islands. UNHCR is urging the governments of Jamaica and The Bahamas to refrain from returning any Cuban or Haitian nationals scheduled to be deported this week without individual screening.

"Elementary considerations of humanity and the fact that many countries in the region are granting asylum to Haitian and Cuban nationals when applying on land, demonstrates the absolute need for these basic procedural safeguards to be applied at sea," said Vincent Cochetel, UNHCR's Regional Representative in Washington.

UNHCR has repeatedly urged all countries involved in interdiction, and rescue at sea, operations to put in place screening procedures to ensure protection for refugees and asylum-seekers of all nationalities caught in mixed migration flows.

The agency stands ready to provide support to the states confronted by these maritime movements to ensure that all individuals intercepted or rescued at sea are properly screened in accordance with international human rights principles.

In Act II, foreign policy could be more dicey

Perhaps the most improbable thing about Barack Obama's first term - excepting his occupying the White House to begin with - was his overseeing a foreign policy that many times gave rise to the charge among progressive types that the policy seemed to be channeling that of George W. Bush. All things considered, one would hardly have anticipated this of an Obama, given the label of communist, socialist, liberal, etc with which he was variously tarred, all of them polar opposites of what Bush was all about. Although it's all academic now, the president having handily won a second term, maintaining a hawkish demeanor is something that sells much better among Republicans, where the Obama support was guaranteed negligible, than among Democrats. Which is by way of saying political survivability calculations couldn't possibly have driven the hard-line look of much of the first-term foreign policy record.

But true to form, hawkish moves and notable successes notwithstanding, the president has been the target of some on the right for one thing or another of his foreign policy game plan. Frequently partnered with Senator John McCain in these assaults on the administration's direction, Senator Lindsey Graham was recently seen in full anti-Obama stride, with the unfortunate Benghazi episode as his issue du jour for the umpteenth time. He would use procedural tactics, he said, to block Senate confirmation of the president's nominees for secretary of defense and head of the C.I.A, Chuck Hagel and John Brennan respectively, if he did not get information on what went down in Benghazi about which he thinks the administration has not been forthcoming.

It matters not whether there's really anything of significance still to be revealed about Benghazi, what matters is the opportunity the situation provides for theater, as we noted in connection with McCain's guestioning of Hagel during the latter's confirmation hearings. Graham getting on a Sunday TV soapbox and saying his piece, more so when having dramatic headline-making stuff to "drop" -- like threatening to derail the president's nominations -- that's bonanza writ large for one constantly on a spotlight search. Carrying through the threat of that reckless action would be something else entirely, though. You hope that Graham, who has been known on


occasion to remind party colleagues that there are consequences in losing an election, gets right with himself and acknowledges that, barring the uncovering of some irredeemable malfeasance or some other stark disqualifier, this or any other president is entitled to the nominee of his choice. But there was so little on the foreign policy front that the president offered for Republicans to reasonably pick apart, that Benghazi, with its tragic cover story of American diplomats killed on the job, looked to be a veritable feast for bloodthirsty hounds.

It's fair to assume that once the situation in Syria continues its protracted, grinding course – an obstinate leader without the capability to swiftly annihilate the opposition and rebels determined not to quit – that Middle East powder keg figures to be one of the thorny issues with which the second-term Obama must contend. It recently came to light that the Syrian conflict had already been

the cause of dissension, even within the administration, before the first term ended, with most of the president's top advisers reportedly favoring supplying arms to the Syrian insurgency and Obama balking because of the fear of arms falling into the wrong hands. The president may well have had Libya in his thoughts when he put the brakes on any plan to arm Syrian rebels. But as a prelude to Obama Act II, such intra-Democratic tension practically guarantees that a still-simmering Syria will provide fodder for the second-term opposition.

There are those, of course, who believe there's hardly a situation involving political change, revolution or what-have-you in any country around the world in which the U.S. shouldn't become an active player. One guy whose track record and utterances would place him to be squarely of that ilk is Dick Cheney, who was just heard from, sounding off about the president's secretary of defense nominee. The acerbic former veep's deep analysis of Obama's selection of Hagel is that the president deviously wants a Republican to take the fall for the decimation of America's military capability that the commander in chief has in mind. Cheney has long since qualified for what we choose to call the "isolate and ignore" group, sharing space there with the likes of buffoons named Trump and Limbaugh. Why are the trashy mutterings of these characters allowed entry into the realm of serious discourse?

But Cheney's wing-nut theories aside, it's a good bet that current administration thinking about the size of the military will generate some incoming heat. The president has made clear his view that the military's focus should be on fighting smarter, given a totally different primary threat to America's national security than a couple of decades ago. On the Republican side the unending fixation on deficit consciousness and the need for massive spending cuts always seems to bypass the military when the budget axe is being swung, favoring instead even greater spending in that area. Some slight pushback the president has gotten from the progressive side - some recent noises made about the use of drones, for example – pales by comparison to what's waiting in the wings to make the second go-round less foreign policy smooth than the



Against closure of a key Hospital

To The Editor:

I am profoundly concerned about the devastating effects the closure of Long Island College Hospital (LICH)/University will have on the greater Brooklyn community, which is experiencing an ongoing health care crisis. The closure of this major hospital will exacerbate existing problems with access to health care services in Brooklyn, while damaging our already fragile economy. Furthermore, LICH's closure will eliminate all emergency services from that immediate area. Brooklyn simply cannot afford to lose this major health care institution. I am committed to the urgent efforts to keep LICH open and I urge the SUNY Board of Trustees to reconsider its decision and New York State Health Commissioner, Nirav Shah, to take a stand.

As an elected representative for the 42nd Assembly District, I am deeply worried about district residents who rely on LICH's primary care clinics, as well as the health care professionals in

our community who work at LICH. The situation is of even greater urgency, as numerous Brooklyn hospitals have closed their doors in the last decade, and six Brooklyn hospitals are facing major financial problems along with the threat of bankruptcy. There are vast areas of Kings County in which primary care is either not available or severely lacking in quality, causing residents to use local emergency rooms for those services.

Moreover, LICH's closure has the potential to bring a crippling blow to Brooklyn's economy, which is still struggling to recover from the recession. Over 2,000 health care jobs could be lost if LICH closes, and local businesses in proximity to the hospital are expected to lose a tremendous portion of their customer base in the event that LICH shuts its doors.

We are at a critical moment in the future of Brooklyn's

health care - the SUNY Board of Trustees and Commissioner Shah have the opportunity to do the right thing for Brooklyn families who rely on LICH's services by reconsidering their decision to recommend the hospital's closure. Once again, given the grave ramifications of closing this vital health care institution, I urge the SUNY Board of Trustees to reassess its decision and to instead recommend that SUNY Downstate attempt the financial reorganization of LICH before taking this irreversible step.

As always, I remain dedicated to preserving jobs, keeping our hospitals open while fighting for improved access to quality, affordable medical services in Brooklyn, and shaping a comprehensive health care system in conjunction with fellow community leaders and health care providers.



parliamentarian, "stood in duty and in conscience to articulate deep concerns regarding the impact that certain Bills before Parliament could have on our nation and nation's people.

"Dr. Harris stood in accordance with his oath, as he was obligated to do without fear or favor. Indeed, the law of the land protects him in that regard," Condor said.

Prime Minister Douglas fired Harris because of his opposition to two recent pieces of government-sponsored legislation, including one to increase the number of senators in the National Assembly.

Trinidad

A High Court judge has

said Trinidad and Tobago "is producing cold-blood-



ed killers" because of the proliferation of guns.

Saying that T&T is in crisis, Justice Anthony Carmona also said the cemeteries were filled to capacity, mostly with young men killed by guns.

He said the guns were responsible for the murders and the mayhem currently taking place. Recalling when he was attached to the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) office, the judge said people used to

shoot other people in the chest, which opened up the possibility of some of them actually surviving those attacks. Today, however, he said, people are being shot in the head.

"Brains are splattering all over the place. It takes a cold-blooded person to do something like that," Carmona said at the San Fernando High Court recently.

He made the comments after a U.S. deportee pleaded guilty to possession of two guns and a large quantity of marijuana.

Jerome Kendell Barker, who was recently freed on a charge of murder will know is fate on Feb. 20.

The murder toll for the first month of the New Year stands at 35.

Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago Central Bank Governor Jwala Rambarran says that declining aid resources to the Caribbean has prompted many of the region's governments to engage in more expensive commercial borrowing to fill funding gaps.

In making the observa-

tion, Rambarran said this state of affairs was neither socially or

was neither socially or politically feasible and there was "no silver-bullet solution to the deep-rooted financing

those in the Caribbean.

He was at the time speaking at the recent opening of a joint Commonwealth Secretariat and United Nations Development Program Workshop at the Eric Williams Financial Complex, Port of Spain, Trinidad.

"It is no secret that small vulnerable economies in the Caribbean have grappled with external shocks of varying magnitudes and duration, over the past two decades.

"More recently the Caribbean has been gradually recovering from the shock of the global financial crisis, which originated in the United States and spread to Europe, the region's two closet trading and investment partners," he said.

Faced with declining aid resources, Rambarran said, "many Caribbean governments resorted to more expensive commercial borrowing to bridge financial gaps.

"This combined with the growing inability of regional governments to generate high enough primary fiscal surpluses for debt serving, contributed to a large public debt," he said

He said the gross public debt in the Caribbean climbed rapidly from 65 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 1998 to a peak of almost 100 percent of GDP in 2002, before falling to a still elevated 80 percent of GDP in 2012.



Resources for Nassau County Sandy Victims

By Kingsley Dougan

As Hurricane Sandy victims continue their struggle to rebuild. Nassau County Executive Edward P. Mangano announced a network of programs and financial assistance opportunities to assist residents while State and Federal programs are developed to help residents with Federal aid. These programs are in addition to the STEP program offered by Nassau County and services offered by the Business Recovery Center within the Nassau County Industrial Development Authority

The Community Development Corporation of Long Island offers an emergency home repair loan fund to assist eligible homeowners, whose incomes are under 120 percent of area median income (AMI), with loans of up to \$5,000. Income eligibility would be at or

below \$129,000 annually for a family of four. Those interested should call 631-471-1215 ext. 125 or email homeloan@cdcli.org.

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSER-DA) has a free energy efficiency program for income eligible New Yorkers whose income is at or under 60 percent of the state median; which are guidelines under the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP). EmPower NY has received funding to expand its work scope for eligible homeowners who experienced flooding during Sandy. It offers no-cost energy services on Long Island and in the Rockaways relating to oil, gas and propane. Those seeking assistance can call 1-800-263-0960.

Natural Grid offers customers on Long Island, who have been seriously impacted by Hurricane Sandy but whose homes have not been declared uninhabitable by the Federal Emergency Management Association (FEMA), three levels of assistance:

A one-time bill credit which entitles eligible customers with \$150 to assist with repairs/and or replacement of damaged boilers, water heaters or furnaces. The customer's equipment must have been "tagged" indicating a relight was necessary.

Assistance for HEAP-eligible customers which entitles the customer to additional assistance as well as the \$150 bill credit. These customers, who have previously been approved for the 2011 and 2012 HEAP program, may receive help with gas equipment inspections, repair or replacement completed by a licensed plumber.


In the Kings and Queens of the Band competition, Trini Revellers', Ted Ustace

Marcus Garvey pardon still pending

A call to help exonerate Marcus Mosiah Garvey and pardon him for a 1923 mail fraud conviction is again being amplified.

According to advocates relentlessly pursuing attention from the President Barack Obama administration, a long overdue pardon and clemency from the fraudulent conviction should be erased from the legacy of Jamaica's first national hero. To that end they are aiming for 25,000 signatures to create "the buzz needed to get a positive response from the White House."

Petitioner Geoffrey Philp is calling for Rep. Frederica Wilson to reintroduce a revised resolution that could exonerate the Pan-African proponent, clear his name and affirm his innocence of crimes they say he was unjustly prosecuted and convicted.

The resolution, titled H. Con. Res. 24, was first introduced to the 110th Congress in 2007 by New York Congressman Charles Rangel.

Philp is calling for one revision to H. Con. Res. 24: "We, the undersigned, are requesting the assistance of our representatives in reintroducing the resolution with the following change in the wording: 'Expressing the sense of the Congress that the president should exonerate Marcus Mosiah Garvey to clear his name and affirm his innocence of crimes for which he was unjustly prosecuted and convicted," he wrote at a web portal. At www.causes. com supporters are able to add a note of advocacy to

this lingering cause for a presidential pardon.

"Marcus Garvey stands as the catalyst of the century," a Jamaican living in the USA said.

"His contribution to the self awareness of a nation is not limited to the little island of Jamaica but the great country of the United States of America where we currently reside."

Allegedly, Garvey's teachings have been resurrected in Jamaican classrooms. School officials there have mandated a civics program for students from kindergarten through high school to study Garvey's values (e.g. self-esteem, respect for others, accountability).

The exoneration will further show respect to his contributions to the advancement of Black people.

Although winter is still in full blast and spring seems a distant climate change, the islands' spokespersons and organizers are planning a welcome relief and plenty of fun to start the summer.



cert in Port-au-Prince and a special invite show at the U.S. Ambassador's residence.

Petionville's Quartier Latin and Garden Studio music clubs were the site of many of the scheduled "Afterhours" performances.

Following those, musicians and locals mixed it up with jam sessions playing far into the night. And things got hot, fueled by the abundance of talent.

An enthusiastic audience of Haitians and foreigners, imbibing the local Barbancourt rum and Prestige beer, listened to grooving musician friends creating melodic and rhythmic explosions on the stage.

High-energy Mexican guitarist and Bushwick resident Ilan Bar-Lavi and his band Los Sonox (playing the musical genre Son Jarocho mixed with other styles) jammed with Cuban piano virtuoso, Washington Heights resident Axle Laugart, a member of singer Melanie Charles' band, "The Journey." Even downpours didn't halt the "Afterhours" shows.

Alternately, when the main concerts took place in Petionville, Yanvalou restaurant/gallery that had just opened weeks before in Pacot, Port-au-Prince, hosted more than


one night's rendezvous.

Eleven partnering foreign embassies underwrote the costs of their respective musicians, who also often gave special invite performances. The Ministries of Culture and Tourism trimmed some financial support due to the impact of recent Hurricane Sandy.

During jazz week, Festival musicians also gave morning music workshops–9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.— at FOKAL: performing, demonstrating techniques, and dialoguing with Haitian music students (ages, late teens to twenties). Many of the attending students came from church music traditions. After all, the churches in Haiti often nurture music performance—it's a part of the service. Those present at the workshops clearly were not solely embedded in this genre.

The teaching artists would usually start by playing a couple numbers. Local guitarist Claude Carre, who translated the words of English-speaking musicians into Kreyol, recognized how valuable it was for the students to listen close-up to many different types of music within the jazz genre. They were also given the opportunity to ask an unlimited number of questions.

At one workshop, the Chilean

string players Sagere Trio including a mandolin explained that their music came from a folk tradition in the north of Chile. They answered very specific questions related to technique: why do you use your nail and not a pick (a softer sound) followed by demonstrations of alternate and sweep picking. They fielded questions about harmony and arranging.

Louis Winsberg's workshop included a demonstration of Flamenco dance.

In a packed auditorium, Brooklyn's own Melanie Charles backed

by her musicians moved the handful of attending females to the front row when she gave a voice lesson to eager students.

Following the formal presentation, students gravitated to musicians playing their own instrument of study, flooding them with questions of technique. Drummer Gashford Guillaume and singer Charles loved the eager interaction with the students.

The Festival also screened three music related films including Spike Lee's Mo Better Blues at a nearby venue.

invitation was also prompted by a controversial advertizing campaign by the German manufacturers of Volkswagen amplifying his song "Get Happy." The commercial allegedly garnered five million viewers on the internet before debuting during the Superbowl football game. Its message voiced in Jamaican patois suggested that happiness should prevail against adversary.

That the individual making the claim does not fit the Jamaican stereotype appearance or race quickly created a controversy in the USA. Prior to the anticipated football show-down, prime-time, morning television shows spotlighted the ad perceived by many to be racist. The island's prime minister and government officials did not hesitate to defend the campaign.

"I urge persons all across the globe to do exactly what the commercial portrays, which is to tap into your inner Jamaican and get happy," Tourism Minister Wykham McNeill said.

According to McNeill, the ad

is very creative and truly taps into the mass appeal that brand Jamaica and its hospitable people seem to have cultivated globally.

"I believe the commercial is also a tribute to the popularity of reggae music worldwide and I salute Jimmy Cliff for being a true Jamaican ambassador through his outstanding music."

Two days after the New Orleans game, the guitar strumming, recording artist stopped into New York to reprise his rendition of the song first popularized by the theme song for "The Partridge Family" television show decades ago.

'hello world here's a song that we're singing

come on get happy

a whole lot of loving is what we'll be bringing

we'll make you happy'

The lyrics and music bolster the message of Jamaica being a happy place where a positive disposition could provide the formula and solution when one drives the German vehicle.

Since the ad aired, record sales of Cliff's music has benefited.

Bittersweet biopic of late New York City mayor

Ed Koch (1924-2013) was the mayor of New York from 1978 to 1989, a three-term tenure over the course of which the city was beset by everything from racial strife to urban decay to the AIDS epidemic. To some, a feisty leader like Koch was precisely the right remedy for that mix of urban maladies. To others, he was simply too divisive a figure to forge a diverse coalition representative of every ethnicity.

To his credit, Koch did clean up Times Square and bring the city back from the brink of bankruptcy, even if he did irreversibly alienate the black community ab initio by closing Sydenham Hospital in Harlem right after entering office. That controversial move motivated Calvin Butts, pastor of the Abyssinian Baptist Church, to say: "He's worse than a racist. He's an opportunist!"

Ever the optimist, Koch was nevertheless fond of always asking his constituents: "How'm I doing?" Although the feedback he received was generally positive, another African-American detractor, Reverend Tim Mitchell was prompted to respond, "You're not doing well, you're racist, and the people know it!"

So unfolds "Koch," a wartsand-all documentary directed by Neil Barsky.

Overall, the movie might strike the viewer as a bit of a hatchet job, but that's only because it opened in theaters on the very day he passed away. And when somebody dies, that's a time for obituaries, which tend to focus on the positive, not on "the evil

that men do."

Therefore, fans of the film's recently-deceased subject might be distressed to see their beloved hero posthumously pilloried. For, the tough-talking politician frequently takes it on the chin here, from the gay slurs "Vote for

Cuomo, not the homo!," which surfaced during the 1977 campaign to the allegations of corruption, which sank his futile attempt to win a fourth term in office.

At one juncture, when asked his sexual preference, Koch sort of loses it, responding, "It's none of your [bleeping] business!" To deflect rumors from spreading, especially after a longtime associate, Richard Nathan, claimed to be his spurned lover, he began making plenty of public appearances with Bess Myerson, the first Jewish Miss America on his arm.

Ultimately, the coup de grace was delivered to Koch's career when many Democratic machine bosses holding powerful positions in his administration were exposed as crooks. This forced the voters to face the fact that the man who had originally run as a reformer on a platform promising to clean up City Hall had himself tragically morphed like the characters in Orwell's "Animal Farm" into just another hack politician with his hands in the cookie jar.

The rise and fall from grace of a good Jewish boy gone bad who ostensibly sold out the Big Apple but never summoned up the courage to come out of the closet.

'The Amistad Rebellion' - A horrifying, triumphant tale

History is filled with halftruths, especially about our heroes.

Lincoln, for instance, wasn't the stern, humorless man that old photos lead you to believe. Queen Victoria was very definitely "amused" quite often. Roosevelt made mistakes, Boudica had her fears, even Churchill undoubtedly had his doubts.

Or so we hope, because we want our heroes to be human, too. And for that, author Marcus Rediker dug deep to present a few surprises in his new book "The Amistad Rebellion."

It should've been a routine trip for Ramon Ferrer, captain of the Amistad. He was hired to accept cargo, sail it from Havana to another port in Cuba and drop it off, where it would be sorted and sold. Routine, but it cost him his life because the cargo, 49 men and four children, had other ideas.

Up until then, the journey for these men and children had been like that of every other slave who came through the Middle Passage: most had been snatched by slave hunters (although some had been taken in exchange for a family member's debt), they were crammed beneath the deck of the ship, stacked on shelves with little-to-no room to move, often with less than three feet of headroom. Food was scarce, water was often denied, the stench of bondage choked them, and many died. Of those who did not, it was said that their bodies sometimes never recovered from the voyage.

But on the moonless

night of July 2, 1839, the Amistad Africans, as Rediker calls them, had had enough. One broke a padlock that held them below deck and, through the leadership of four men from various tribes who shared membership in a cultural society, they snatched cane knives, snuck up from below, and immediately killed the ship's slave-cook, who had been taunting them for days. They attacked other crew members, slashed at the captain, seized the ship, and forced their Spanish "owners" to sail back to Sierra

But the surviving Spaniards tricked the Africans and kept the Amistad near American shores, hoping that U.S. authorities would help. And they did – which ended in a major trial, political wrangling, and a 19th-century media circus that changed history.

JOBS:

Partner with businesses and communities to invest in American-made technologies through a network of Manufacturing Innovation Institutes, three of which Obama said he would create by executive order while asking Congress to create 15 more. Eliminate tax breaks that encourage companies to move jobs outside the U.S., and rewrite the tax code.

HOUSING:

Spend \$15 billion to help communities awash in foreclosed and vacant properties rebuild while creating construction jobs.

MINIMUM WAGE:

Increase the federal minimum wage, currently \$7.25 an hour, to \$9 in stages by the end of 2015, and allow for automatic increases to

keep pace with inflation. Republican presidential candidate Mitt Romney supported the idea of indexing the minimum wage to inflation.

GUN CONTROL:

Ban assault weapons and ammunition magazines that can hold more than 10 rounds, require background checks for all firearms purchases and increase access to mental health services.

AFGHANISTAN:

Withdraw 34,000 U.S. military forces, just over half the 66,000 troops still there, within a year.

IMMIGRATION:

Continue to tighten the border, crack down on employers who knowingly hire illegal immigrants, establish a pathway to citizenship for the estimated 11 million immigrants in the country, and streamline the immigration system for families, workers and businesses.

WOMEN:

Renew the Violence Against Women Act to help protect victims of domestic violence and help law enforcement investigate and prosecute sexual assaults. The Senate voted Tuesday to renew the law; Obama called on the House to quickly send him a bill.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION:

Work with states to provide access to a high-quality preschool for all 4-year-olds from families with low or moderate incomes.

TRADE:

Begin talks on a comprehensive trade agreement with the European Union to promote the exchange of goods across the Atlantic. Complete negotiations on a

Trans-Pacific Partnership.

FEDERAL BUDGET:

Continue to work toward the goal of \$4 trillion in deficit reduction and stabilizing the debt as a percentage of the economy, both over 10 years.

INFRASTRUCTURE:

Spend \$50 billion on a "Fix It First" program for urgent repairs to roads, bridges and railways, and attract private capital to upgrade ports, pipelines and schools.

ENERGY-CLIMATE CHANGE:

Make permanent and refundable a tax credit for renewable energy to help double the production from wind, solar and geothermal sources by 2020. Help states cut energy waste and increase efficiency through a competitive grant program modeled after a similar program for education.



President Barack Obama

Direct Cabinet secretaries to identify additional executive steps to deal with climate change. Urges Congress to write legislation giving polluters market-based incentives to reduce the gas emissions blamed for global warming.

EDUCATION:

Launch a competition to help redesign and modernize high schools, and create a corps of 10,000 of the nation's brightest science and math teachers to improve instruction in the fields of science, technology, engineering and math. Introduce a new "College Scorecard" to help parents and students compare schools based on where they can get "the most bang" for their "educational buck."

CYBERSECURITY:

Signed executive order Tuesday to increase information-sharing and develop standards to protect national security, jobs and privacy. Calls on Congress to pass legislation to help the government secure its computer networks and deter cyberattacks.

VOTING:

Create a commission to help improve the voting experience, a response to widespread complaints about lengthy waits, requirements to show photo ID before voting and shortened periods for early voting.





Jamaica draws with Mexico in qualifier

Jamaica faced the daunting task of getting even the minimum one point against host Mexico at Azteca Stadium in Mexico City on Wednesday night, Feb. 6, in its first game of the final round of CONCACAF qualifying for the 2014 FIFA

World Cup in Brazil. Mexico breezed through the semifinal round undefeated and had players who were part of its first Olympic Gold win in defeating Brazil last summer. Jamaica, on the other hand, was recently dethroned as Caribbean Champion, a title it held the past two years, after

a very dismal performance in the tournament. Compounding Jamaica's plight was its current seven-game losing streak in Mexico. But as the old adage goes, every game is different – and this one was.

land Timbers, MLS), in the 67th minute, was in a one-versus-one situation with Corona and shot straight at the Mexican goalkeeper. In spite of Mexico's dominant ball possession, the Reggae Boyz created the better chances.

Jamaican goalkeeper Donovan Rickets was at the heart of the visitors' gutsy performance and clearly was the man of the match.

will play two Test matches, three ODIs and two Twenty20 games against the World Twenty20 champions.

The tour runs from Feb. 20 to March 20 and will feature matches in Grenada, Antigua, Barbados and Dominica.

The month-long tour will be Zimbabwe's first competitive assignment since the World Twenty20 tournament in Sri Lanka and their first tour since New Zealand in January last year.

The tour will get underway with a three-match ODI series, which will see international cricket returns to the

The three-match ODI series will take place from Feb. 22-26. Antigua will play host to the two Twenty20 matches on consecutive days, March 2-3. The reigning ICC World Twenty20 champions have only met Zimbabwe once before in Twenty20 matches.


