Plan to tackle poverty

The Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) has launched the second call for proposals for civil society organizations that carry out activities focused on poverty reduction and social inclusion and development in Latin America and the Caribbean.

The announcement was made in Panama City, Panama by Yasuhiro Atsumi, the bank's executive director, for the government of Japan, at the IDB annual meet

Water is key to tourism

PORT OF SPAIN, Trinidad, Apr 24 2013 (IPS) - Tourism, widely regarded as the mainstay of Caribbean economies, is being challenged to remain sustainable in an era of climate change and its impact on beaches, rivers and other attractions.

Carlos Vogeler, regional director for the Americas United Nations World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO), speaking at a four-day Sustainable Tourism Development conference held here last week, said that World Tourism Day on Sep. 27 will be dedicated to tourism and water.

Questions over his finances

Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar said she decided to accept the resignation of controversial former National Security Minister Jack Warner after speaking with the U.S. State Department about a federal probe into his international financial dealings while he was a top world soccer executive during a recent trip to the U.S. capital.

Warner, 69, who until this week considered the second most powerful person in the Trinidad and Tobago government after the prime minister, quit his cabinet position and that of chairman of the ruling United National Congress (UNC) in disgrace less than a week after an international investigatory team released a damning report pointing to the alleged siphoning off of millions of dollars into private Warner family companies when he was a vice-president of the world soccer body, FIFA.

Warner who will now become

Caribbean

International Press Institute executive director will lead a six-party delegation to six Caribbean countries later this month as part of the institute's regional campaign for the repeal of defamation laws.

The institute will visit Trinidad and Tobago, Guyana, Suriname, Curacao, the Dominican Republic and Antigua and Barbuda.

In a press release, the institute said it would seek to win support from

journalists, editors, civil society organizations and government and non-governmen-



tal officials for the repeal of criminal defamation and insult laws, as well as discuss protection for journalists in Antigua and Barbuda, Guyana and Suriname.

In Trinidad and Tobago, "the delegation will encourage further progress on efforts to modernize the country's defamation laws, as well as consolidate partnerships, including training initiatives, with both the Trinidad government and national media houses that began with IPI's 2012 World Congress in Port of Spain," the release said.

Antigua

The United States says despite recent improvements as a "significant" offshore center, Antigua and Barbuda "remains susceptible" to money laundering.

In its 2013 International Narcotics Control Strategy Report on money laundering and financial crimes,



the U.S. Department of State said that Antigua and Barbuda's status stems from its offshore financial sector and Internet gaming industry.

"Illicit proceeds from the transshipment of narcotics and from financial crimes occurring in the United States are laundered in Anti-

gua and Barbuda," the report stated. During the past year, it said the Office of National Drug Control and Money Laundering Policy (ONDCP) in Antigua had "compiled evidence that money laundering related to drug trafficking takes place through local financial institutions."

According to the State Department, the ONDCP's analysis shows that "criminals abuse the system and financial institutions in some instances, fail to apply sufficiently rigorous due diligence in relation to transactions that should be seen as questionable."

The report said the funds involved include Eastern Caribbean dollars "traced to the sale of local property by at least one person US authori-

ties identified as trafficking drugs through Antigua and Barbuda to U.S. territory."

The report said Antigua and Barbuda receives approximately US\$2.8 million annually from license fees and other charges from the industry.

Guyana

Authorities in Guyana say 10 citizens have been selected to form a panel charged with helping improve the South American country's police force.

National Security Minister Clement Rohee says the panel was created based on recommendations that civilians should administer certain police functions such as project coor-

dination and strategic planning. The selected panel includes former police officers.

The announcement comes amid criticism that the 3,500-strong police force is inefficient, overly bureaucratic and corrupt.

Rohee said Cabinet will review the selections and make a final announcement later this month.

St. Lucia

Officials from the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) recently met in St Lucia to examine the issue of credible data from social development programs to further inform policies for reducing or eliminating juvenile delinquency in the sub-region.

The OECS Secretariat's Juvenile Justice Reform Project, which is being funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), is collaborating

with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and UNICEF hosted the four-day work-



shop which aimed to provide participants with the methodology and tools for measuring the effect of juvenile justice programs.

Project Coordinator of the OECS Juvenile Justice Reform Project Dwight Calixte believes the effective Juvenile Justice Information system can ultimately influence better resource allocation and management and with greater fiscal responsibility member states can create a better environment that may contribute to economic development.

Through a coordinated approach, Calixte said data from the juvenile justice information system will bring all such agencies together to allow them to look at where they have invested, what will be the ultimate outcome of the program that they are undertaking and how far they have reached those targets to help ensure that all juveniles are diverted away from the court system.

St. Vincent

Teenage pregnancy continues to be a major concern for the Ministry of Health, with eight girls between the ages of 11 and 14 years giving birth in 2012, Health Minister Clayton Burgin told Parliament recently.

He said that teenage pregnan-

cy remains high even as the nation recorded a constant decrease in the number of

because it is our very success which can threaten our most valuable assets."
-- CTO Chair Beverly Nicholson-Doty

The goal is to shine a spotlight on water both as an asset and as a resource and on the actions needed to face up to the water challenge.

"Water is one of tourism's main assets. Each year, millions of people travel around the world to enjoy water destinations both inland and in coastal areas and Caribbean destinations play a key role in this," Vogeler said.

"Water is also one of tourism's most precious resources, and as one of the largest economic sectors in the world, it is the responsibility of the tourism industries to take a leadership role and ensure companies and destinations invest in adequate water management throughout the value chain

"If managed sustainably, tourism can bring benefits to the national and local communities and support water preservation." Vogeler added.

In his message for World Tourism Day 2012, U.N. Secretary-General Ban Kimoon recalled that "one of the world's largest economic sectors, tourism, is especially well-placed to promote environmental sustainability, green growth and our struggle against climate change through its relationship

with energy."

Vogeler told IPS that UNWTO has been supporting better energy use in the tourism sector for years.

"We have been thrilled with the response we received from the international tourism community," he said.

"The hotel industry accounts for 21 percent of the carbon emissions from tourism and in 2008, UNWTO launched the Hotel Energy Solutions Project for the accommodation sector and today we can provide hoteliers across the world with a free electronic software to assess their energy consumption and propose them the most profitable investment alternatives in terms of energy efficiency and renewable energies."

The Sustainable Tourism Development conference was facilitated by the region's tourism development agency, the Caribbean Tourism Organisation (CTO).

Chairman Beverly Nicholson-Doty says devoting resources to develop and maintain a sustainable tourism industry for the future has a very strong potential for a high return on investment.

She told IPS that as one of the most tourism dependent regions in the world, it is crucial to ensure Caribbean residents and visitors fully understand that the preservation of its natural resources will determine its success in the future.

Top Tourism award winners

For the second consecutive year, Guyana has emerged as the biggest winners at the 2013 Caribbean Tourism Organisation (CTO)/Travel-Mole Sustainable Tourism Awards, winning won three of the six awards at the annual ceremony held recently at the Hatt Regency Hotel in Port of Spain, Trinidad.

The 2013 awards comprised six categories covering all aspects of sustainability; from overall excellence, to accommodation, community, heritage and biodiversity.

The Caribbean Excellence in Sustainable Tourism Award was won by Guyana's Karanambu Lodge Inc., an eco-tourist destination providing guests with the opportunity to experience the wild-life of Karanambu.

The Puerto Rico Tourism Company copped the Destination Stewardship Award, with Conservation International Guyana receiving special mention in this category. Guadeloupe's AQUARIUM de la Guadeloupe; Aruba's Amsterdam Manor Beach Resort; and Sandals Resorts International were also commended in this category.

Winner of the Sustainable Accommodation Award was Tryall Club and Villas in Jamaica where members and guests enjoy the beauty of nature in its many forms: from lush hillsides and

vibrant seascapes to abundant plant life and local species. Almost Paradise Cottages and Restaurant in Grenada; Community and Tourism Services Ltd., Guyana; and Accra Beach Hotel and Spa in Barbados received special mention.

The Community Benefit Award was won by Bowden Pen Farmers' Association in Jamaica, a community-based organization in the Upper Rio Grande Valley in the eastern parish of St. Thomas with a membership of 27 people who are divided into two livelihood streams: agriculture and tourism. Guyana's Aranaputa Community Based Tourism and The Bahamas Cape

Eleuthera Island School were also highly commended.

National Trust of Guyana took home the Heritage Protection Award for its work in preserving and promoting the nation's patrimony so that present and future generations will access and enjoy the richness of Guyana's heritage. The National Art Gallery and Educulture Bahamas Ltd. both of The Bahamas were also recognised in this category.

The Biodiversity Award went to the Guyana Marine Turtle Conservation Society with the Jamaica Conservation and Development Trust; Atlantis Paradise Island in The Bahamas and the Association Evasion Tropicale Guadeloupe all receiving special mention in the category.

In 2012, Guyana won the Caribbean Excellence in Sustainable Tourism Award, the Community Benefit Award and the Biodiversity Conservation Award.

The submissions were judged by an esteemed panel of tourism specialists: Ena Harvey, the hemispheric specialist for agro tourism at the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA); Seleni Matus, the senior advisor on destinations at Sustainable Travel International and Gail Henry, the CTO's sustainable tourism product specialist.

U.S. court limits marijuana deportations

WASHINGTON (AP)

— The Supreme Court on
Tuesday ruled in favor of
a longtime resident of the
United States from Jamaica
who was deported from the
United States over possession of a small amount of
marijuana.

The justices said in a 7-2 decision that Adrian Moncrieffe should have had the opportunity to contest his deportation.

Justice Sonia Sotomayor said in her opinion for the court that marijuana offenses must involve either the sale of the drug or possession of more than a small amount to count as serious

enough to warrant automatic deportation.

Justices Samuel Alito and

Clarence Thomas dissented.

Moncrieffe had lived legally in the United States

since he was 3. In 2008, police pulled him over and found 1.3 grams of marijuana in his car, the equivalent of two or three marijuana cigarettes, Sotomayor said. He faced the charge of possession of marijuana with an intent to distribute, which under Georgia law encompasses a range of conduct from social sharing to distribution of larger amounts.

Moncrieffe accepted a plea with no jail time in which the charge would be expunged if he complied with his probation. Two years later, immigration agents jailed him and began deportation proceedings, citing the mari-

juana arrest. For deportation purposes, it was as if Moncrieffe had been a major drug dealer.

In the government's eyes, Moncrieffe's crime was serious enough to count as an "aggravated felony" and that it fell into a category that made his deportation automatic and deprived even the attorney general of the ability to step in and cancel it.

But Sotomayor said that under immigration law, a conviction that "fails to establish that the offense involved either remuneration or more than a small amount of marijuana" is not an aggravated felony.

a governing party parliamentary backbencher, said this week he will give a full account of his dealings to the assembly when it meets on Friday and to his political constituency of Chaguanas a day before.

His departure from government was welcomed across the political divide and the business community in Trinidad as even the prime minister said that government was glad to see the back of him, as daily media reports about his financial dealings and the political fallout from such had become too tough a political cross the bear.

"After a careful, meticulous review of the facts brought before me, having just returned, you will remember I was in Washington and I met with the State Department, and having come back from that visit and meeting with my colleagues, counter-balancing the interest of the Cabinet and having considered all of this I accepted the res-

ignation of Minister Warner as Minister of National Security," Persad-Bissessar said.

The fact that the issue

was raised with the Obama administration appears to lend credence to local and international media reports that Warner is being investigated by the FBI and that his two older sons who are in Florida are also under federal probe and are cooperating with agents about their family's business connections with international finance connected to FIFA activities over decades.

The former works and transport minister and leading UNC financier, has hardly traveled out of Trinidad since he was forced to resign from FIFA two years ago apparently for fear of arrest by Interpol or U.S. agents.

Warner's His downfall

was triggered and hastened by the cash for votes deal that exploded in his face at home in Trinidad when he hosted then Asian soccer chief Mohamed bin Hammam in Port of Spain at a special regional congress where Hammam was known to have doled out brown envelopes with \$40,000 each to help them vote for him for the top FIFA position.

During recent UNC internal elections, Warner pulled in more than 16,000 votes, sealing his place as the UNC boss and reiterating perceptions that he is one of the island's most popular but not necessarily now, most respected politicians.

How he will bounce back from his most recent humiliation and whether he will face time in a jail overseas is left to be seen, but for now the nation is awaiting words from his mouth as to the history of his financial dealings.

Meanwhile Trinidadians expect "fireworks" in Parliament Friday, as Warner faces questions from opposition parliamentartians, according to one local news source.

delegates.

The call is for projects that support development through sustainable solutions in education, social protection, gender and rural community development in vulnerable communities in the 26 borrowing countries of the region.

According to the IDB, winning organizations will be awarded a total of US\$5 million in non-refundable technical cooperation; each project will receive between US\$500,000 and US\$1 million.

The funds come from the Japan Special Fund for Poverty Reduction administrated by the bank. Proposals must be submitted before May 15, 2013 through IDB's website.

"We believe civil society organizations that have key technical capacity and community reach are natural operational partners for the IDB and in that they can provide innovative solutions and participative meth-

ods to solving development problems and in a sustainable manner", said Roberto Vellutini, vice president for countries at the IDB.

During the meeting, he said opinions were exchanged and presentations of experiences and proposals from civil society, governments, private sector and IDB were made regarding the creation and implementation of innovative partnerships for sustainable, inclusive development.

In their role of social leaders and public figures, the panelists discussed lessons learned and best practices in projects with high social impact.

The IDB said Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) are key partners in the development of the region, adding that it "highly values" the contribution these organizations make as technical experts, knowledge generators, project implementators, defenders of vulnerable communities and promoters of transparency.

IDB said it works direct-

ly with CSOs in the execution of projects that impact development. In this regard, it said organizations have contributed greatly to IDB's work, and with their technical contributions.

The Japanese trust funds are the result of the cooperation and contribution efforts between IDB and Japan for the development of Latin America and the Caribbean.

The IDB said the resources of the Japanese Trust Funds have been directed to support small countries with few resources in social sectors, such as the environment, infrastructure, and productive activities.

The IDB said the call for proposals is specifically related to Community Development Programs of the Japan Special Fund for Poverty Reduction. "This fund has an ample trajectory in the implementation of community development programs in varied sectors of many countries with the contribution of many local community development organizations," it said.

Grenada education system shows progress

The World Bank says Grenada's educational system has significantly improved in recent years because of more classrooms and better trained teachers under an education initiative.

"Between 2004 and 2011, Grenada improved both the equity of access and quality of its secondary education program," said the Washington-based financial institution in a statement on April 17.

With its support, the World Bank said the "Grenada Education Development Project" "successfully expanded secondary schools, with the addition of 420 school places, increased enrollment in three underserved areas by an average of 10 percentage points, provided instructional materials, trained counselors and teachers. and helped to increase the Caribbean Examinations Council pass rates by 6 percentage points."

Before 2004, the World Bank said access to education in Grenada was "inequitable with transition rates to secondary education in the three underserved parishes averaging 51 percent.

"The quality of secondary education was deficient, teach-

ers' qualifications were poor, and instructional materials were not sufficient to support studentcentered learning approaches," it said.

"Some secondary schools were overcrowded," it added. "Student violence in schools contributed to high dropout rates."

The World Bank said the "Grenada Education Development Project" supported priorities identified in the Strategic Plan for Education and Development, which sought to achieve universal secondary coverage.

It said the plan focused on improving the quality of learning, in particular in the areas of literacy and numeracy.

It also concentrated on school improvement, through construction and rehabilitation of education infrastructure following Hurricane Ivan, as well as student-led school improvement projects.

The bank said the project contributed to "improved equity of access and quality of secondary education." It said key outcomes include improvement of transition rates to secondary education in the proportion of students sitting Common Entrance Examinations in the three underserved parishes

by an average of 10 percentage points between 2004 and 2008.

The bank said there is also improvement in the proportion of students passing at least five subjects, including Mathematics and English, at the Caribbean Examinations Council, from 13 percent in 2004 to 19 percent in 2008.

It said introduction of a new curriculum policy, "which is better aligned with the Caribbean Examinations Council, and meets the diversified learning needs of students," is a key factor in the enhanced education system in Grenada. In addition, the bank said improvement of the availability of textbooks and other instructional materials for 3,000 students, and placement of trained counselors and peer counselors in all secondary schools, leading to reduced school violence and improved attendance based on information from focus group discussions with counselors, school principals and education officers, contributed to improvements in education.

The World Bank said about 2,000 students benefited from the increased number of schools and set-up of school shades and canteens.

It said teachers also benefit-

ed from training in literacy and numeracy and the increased availability of resources, and that students developed a greater interest in mathematics and reading.

"The project reiterates government commitment to reforms and initiatives addressed under the project, many of which have been institutionalized under the strong leadership of the Ministry of Education," the statement said.

"Grenada continues to participate actively in the review of the Education Strategy by the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS), which will guide future development of education in the region," it added. "Grenada is also addressing the challenges of school infrastructure maintenance through a monthly subvention to schools."

The World Bank said it provided funding to the tune of US\$8 million to the "Grenada Education Development Project" in 2004.

In 2008, it said an additional US\$1.9 million grant was provided to allow for implementation of activities that had been curtailed when funds were reallocated to address the emergency rehabilitation following the passage of Hurricane Ivan.

Prez Maduro reshuffles **Cabinet**

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — Newly elected Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro has shuffled his Cabinet, putting allies of late president Hugo Chavez in positions to tackle pressing problems including widespread power outages and double-digit inflation.

Maduro tapped Jesse Chacon to take charge of government initiatives aimed at upgrading Venezuela's power grid, which has been plagued with problems stemming from lack of investment and maintenance.

Many Venezuelans are fed up with blackouts that have been occurring for years around the South American country.

Maduro also announced late Sunday that Nelson Merentes, who had served as president of the central bank, would take the helm at the finance ministry.

Merentes will face the daunting task of reducing inflation, which reached topped 20 percent last year.

Barbados establishes ties with Morocco

Barbados and the Kingdom of Morocco formally established diplomatic relations on Wednesday, April 17, 2013 at a ceremony at the Permanent Mission of Morocco to the United Nations.

The signing took place in New York at the Morocco Mission, 866 Second Ave., Manhattan..

A joint communiqué to this effect signed by the Permanent Representative of Barbados to the United Nations, Joseph Goddard, and his Moroccan counterpart, Mohammed Loulichki.

During the ceremony, Ambassadors Goddard and Loulichki held talks on bilateral issues.

Ambassador Goddard welcomed the signing of the joint communiqué as the first step in developing closer cooperation between Barbados and the Kingdom of Morocco in areas of mutual interest.

The joint communiqué signifies the establishment of economic, trading (rum prod-

ucts, International financial business, ship registry, tourism and cultural industries) between the Kingdom of Morocco and Barbados.

In addition, said Ambassador Goddard: "It also entails improved multilateral relations as well as engagement in cultural exchanges and generally to deepen bilateral relations."

According to Joyce Bourne, deputy representative for Barbados, "The communiqué expresses the desire of governments of Barbados and Morocco to establish diplomatic relations in accordance with the provisions of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations, guided by the principles and objectives of the United Nations."

Election council to audit recent Venezuela vote

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — Venezuela's electoral council announced Thursday night that it would audit the 46 percent of the vote not scrutinized on election night in a concession to opposition candidate Henrique Capriles, who said he believed the stolen votes that cost him the presidency are among the unaudited.

"We are where we want to be," Capriles, looking satisfied but wary, told a news conference after the announcement. "I think I will have the universe of voters needed to get where I want to be."

Capriles had demanded a full vote-by-vote recount

but said he could live with the National Electoral Council's ruling, an apparent turnaround for President-elect Nicolas Maduro, whose government had looked all week to be digging in its heels.

Maduro, the late President Hugo Chavez's anointed successor, is being inaugurated on Friday and was in Lima, Peru, on Thursday night for an emergency meeting of South American leaders to discuss his country's electoral crisis."We know where the problems are," said Capriles, referring to the votes cast in the 12,000 voting machines that council President Tibisay Lucena said would be audited beginning next

week and would take a

month to complete.

The 40-year-old state governor called on his supporters to back down from confrontation and play music, preferably salsa, instead of banging on pots, as they have been nightly all week since the council ratified Maduro's victory in order to protest what they considered a stolen ballot.

Venezuela's opposition had been battered for years by Chavez and many say political repression has only increased under Maduro.

Capriles said he will insist that every single vote receipt be counted and compared to voter registries as well as to voting machine tally sheets. In announcing the audit, Lucena did not say whether authorities would do that.



Too much emphasis on high-stakes tests

This week, New York City students in grades 3 through 8, with their No. 2 Ticonderoga pencils nervously in hand, struggled through the math portion of the annual New York State tests. Once again, these scores -- along with their English Language Test results from last week, will determine crucial educational outcomes in their lives.

In this elementary- and middle-school equivalent of "who will live and who will die," these tests often decide whether a child can advance to the next grade, be held back or be required to attend summer school.

But this high-stakes testing has enormous implications for teachers and entire school communities as well. Mayor Bloomberg has repeatedly and publicly called for teachers to be evaluated based on these test scores. And his Department of Education has closed down more than 100 New York City public schools predominantly because their students did not perform well on the high-stakes tests. All this, despite the fact that high-stakes testing results have been criticized as unreliable.

Tests are an important measure of student knowledge and the success that a teacher has had in getting concepts across to his or her class. But they are by no means the only way to measure teacher performance. Report cards that cover an entire quarter's performance and sev-

eral month's worth of teacher commentary are also good evaluators.

High-stakes tests have become problematic because they now hold such a heavy sway in determining a child's, a teacher's and even a school's future. Yet they occur so infrequently as to be obviously susceptible to a bad day, a stomach-ache or getting up on the wrong side of the bed.

The New York State tests in Math and English Language Arts are given over a two-week period once a year. The New York City Specialized High School Admissions Test (SHAT), which determines which students get selected to attend one of the city's elite public high schools, is given on one day every winter.

The SATs have taken on too big a role in deciding whether a student will attend a good college. Too much power is invested in these tests and the price that our students, educators, and school communities pay because of their outsized influence is embarrassingly high.

I favor more frequent, lowstakes testing: the Friday spelling test with papers folded in half and a list of 10 words, five on each side, that are put on the black board the previous Monday; the history pop quiz that gets handed out as the high schoolers walk into their classroom. How about the impossible math problem up on the board that takes an entire period to unravel? These are all

DREAM Act doesn't go far enough

"Today's Immigration Bill fails so many in the Black Immigrant population and we must make changes now, as history has taught us that once this Bill goes to the house, it is going to get worse not better," Bertha Lewis, President of The Black Institute said. "Our communities will not thrive under this new compromise because of the DREAM Act provision, backlogs and triggers, and the elimination of the Diversity Visa Program. This first attempt at Comprehensive Immigration Reform is a valiant effort. But, it is clear that there is a lot of work ahead. Immigration Reform cannot be comprehensive nor common sense if it is exclusive and unfair."

• The DREAM Act provision is a step in the right direction. However, the Bill states that one must enter the U.S. before the age of 16 and have completed high school in the U.S. to qualify for the Dream Act and be put on

an expedited pathway to citizenship. This leaves out many Black Immigrant youth dependents who came to the US with their parents after the age of 16 and who finished high school in their home countries before coming to the US. These undocumented individuals, many of whom came to the US legally with their parents and fell out of status, should also be put on an expedited pathway to citizenship.

• This bill proposes a 13-year wait to become a citizen. However, this is after the borders are secured, one of the three triggers imposed in the legislation by Senator Marco Rubio which will take at least five years; hence the path to citizenship will be

a minimum of 18 years. This is a multibillion-dollar task even though the White House has consistently argued 'our borders are more secure than ever.' This indefinite length of time is unacceptable and far too long especially for those who have been stuck in the backlog system for 10+ years. This is a call for efficiency and an expedient timeline; a heightened effort needs to be made to make the administrative process of our Immigration system just.

• However, what is most alarming is the total elimination of the diversity visa program. The United States makes available 50,000 Diversity Visas (DV) annually to individuals from countries with low rates of immigration to the United States. Immigrants from Africa benefit the most from this program, with over 25% of African immigrants entering the US through the DV program in 2010.

Gun-rights bullies can't have the last word

"Not this time," we confidently said here a few months ago, following the slaughter in Newtown that incredulously included those helpless young innocents. We were quite convinced that there was enough of a collective sense of decency in the legislative branch in Washington to take a principled stand against the madness that has surrounded the gun ownership issue in this country. So, a horror of horrors it was recently, seeing the disgraceful conduct in the Senate that brought about defeat of background checks and other measures, causing majority leader Harry Reid to suspend deliberations on the gun control issue.

What a commingling of mood swings wash over us, resulting from what's done or not done at the apex of power in these United States. A couple of outsize crazies create mayhem at the end of the Boston Marathon, and the marshalling of public and private resources nails them in a matter of days, bringing the nation to a comfortable place, somewhat at peace with itself and proud, after the initial revulsion. All of this, however, comes blended in, sharing calendar space, with folks wondering who are these characters in Washington who could so brazenly thwart the

wishes of an overwhelming majority of citizens supportive of such nobrainer items as background checks for firearms purchases and other common-sense measures?

Who votes against so self-evidently useful a provision as looking into the profile of anyone seeking to own a gun? And why? Is it simply because the NRA shills for the gun industry issue an edict which the supposedly independent-minded exemplars of the lawmaker elite countermand on pain of utter destruction? Charles Grassley, the Iowa Republican, came up with what he no doubt thought was clever rationalization for his "no" vote: criminals do not now submit to background checks; they won't submit to expanded checks down the road. So because of a perceived scenario in which "criminals" won't be willing participants, all other would-be gun owners of questionable status have earned themselves a pass. Give us a break, senator, that's just a crock. But probably good for another handsome campaign contribution, courtesy the gun lobby.

The United States Senate gets touted as the foremost deliberative body in the country, in the world, even. There are times, though,

when a quizzical reaction to this hype is much in order. As with the good old filibuster routine - someone's brainchild that, experience has largely shown over the years, should have been still-born. Debate on the gun control measures was a target for filibustering, but enough members apparently thought this was beyond-the-pale despicable to ensure clearing that hurdle. But almost as offensive as the filibuster move was agreement between the parties to designate the legislation as requiring 60 votes for passage. Such maneuvers, indicative of an embrace of gun-law reform that must be in many instances quite tepid, only serve to remind us that it wasn't too long ago, until Newtown, that gun violence as a matter of national concern was fixed in thumbs-down position in Washing-


With the Senate treating us to what the president called "a shameful day in Washington," we cannot

but feel, anew, for the kin of Newtown victims who, even with last December's hurt still raw, bravely joined the front lines, determined to make losers of the gun-rights loonies. Others, too, who had suffered personal loss in earlier episodes of gun carnage, showed up to be counted. They would be present to hear a U.S. senator pretty much dismiss them with a rap about emotion having no place in making policy. The gun-rights bullies have office holders in tow, evidently programmed to spout the same hardline, insensitive rhetoric, in league with stuff out of the NRA playbook.

Those who have known the ravages of gun violence up close obviously have a true comrade-at-arms in Mayor Michael Bloomberg. The mayor gives every indication of being committed to spare no effort in pursuit of sensible laws governing the availability of firearms. Bloomberg's apparent readiness to reach into his deep pockets to whatever extent to neutralize the storm trooper tactics of the NRA and their ilk has to be reassuring to folks who, since Newtown, have been emboldened to crusade for sanity. Bloomberg has become arch enemy number one for the NRA. To which we say, it's about time the good guys had some fatwallet support on their side.

The NRA, for its part, hews to the well-worn script: Hit the bunkers, America. They're coming to take away your guns! For the recently concluded first-round debacle in the Senate, the NRA's ammunition included an ad imploring followers to listen to America's police, instead of Obama and Bloomberg. Which immediately invites speculation as to which police departments or organizations are on record as favoring widespread availability of guns in any given community. The smart money says the position of "America's police" on guns among the population isn't quite as portrayed by the NRA to its adherents. For stuff like this, presumably, the NRA's loose cannon leader Wayne LaPierre, wound up on some list recently as one of the most influential persons in America. Heaven help us.

Ultimately, though, what transpired in the Senate may have been just as well. It averted what probably would have been a more sickening scenario in the House. And it stiffened resolve, hopefully, that gun-loving maniacs must not have the last word.

The Gang of 8's proposal would cancel the diversity visa (DV) program, which would have a hugely disproportionate effect on natives of African countries.

Goals of The Black Institute for the Outcome of Comprehensive Immigration Reform:

• Comprehensive reform of Immigration policy to include protections for recruited immigrant professionals and their children (e,g, an expedited pathway to Green Card status, a special category that includes recruited professionals from non-STEM disciplines, etc.).

- Fulfill the promises of citizenship, education and job opportunity to recruited immigrant professionals and their families, including "aged-out" immigrant children.
- End the criminalization and detention of Black immigrants, and implement safeguards to protect against racial profiling and ensure due process for all immigrants.
- Reunite families torn apart by current Immigration policy by expanding benefits to include extended family, and altering the current DACA guidelines to allow children up to the age of 20 to enter the US.

- Lessen the economic burden caused by current Immigration policy by investing resources and decreasing processing fees.
- Expand the focus of the Immigration reform discourse to include the needs of Black immigrants and their children, who are often marginalized and ignored. This includes amending the language of the DREAM act to include children of immigrant professionals, and allowing the voices of Black immigrants to be heard.

way of the environmental movement. The wonder of that first Earth Day, held in an era of social change and action, was that it wasn't a campus movement. Not one bit. Everybody was enlisted-from mayors to garden clubs to churches to labor groups to women's organizations. As a result, it became everybody's movement.

Dirty air, dirty water, and toxic exposure translated the same way for everyone. Confronted in their daily lives with smog, oil soaked rivers, and mounting evidence that their communities were being poisoned, people reacted when they were given a chance to

belong to something. Then they went home but before they left they struck fear in most legislators' hearts who saw that the guys in suits had joined forces with the people wearing tie dye.

These days, writers complain about the lack of ground troops that seem to be available for the almost daily climate change battles; others write about a sometimes real and sometimes phantom renaissance on college campuses; still others convince us that a seismic shift is taking place just beneath the radar. Maybe. In 2010, Earth Day Network held a massive climate rally in Washington, D.C., that attracted 250,000 people. Montreal followed last year with more than 250,000 marching in the streets. An intense, dedicated and focused set of partners held a large rally this past February in Washington. And more frequently people are chaining themselves to pipelines in protest.

But the real key to a new environmental movement resides with the same sorts of people who took to the streets in 1970, the same sorts of people who pitch in each Earth Day, people with a vested interest in protecting the earth for themselves and their children. In short everybody. The ground troops for the new environmental movement are there: in the one billion people working this Earth Day in a community near you.

good methods for discovering how much our students know and whether their teachers are effective.

We need to remember that tests are merely tools; tools that are best utilized by educators to get a handle on how to do their jobs better, on a day-to-day, weekby-week basis.

High-stakes tests should not shape the destiny for students, teachers or for



entire school communities.

It is high time we break the yoke of high-stakes testing and broaden the conversation on public education in our city.

Fallout for states rejecting **Medicaid expansion**

WASHINGTON (AP) Rejecting the Medicaid expansion in the federal health care law could have unexpected consequences for states where Republican lawmakers remain steadfastly opposed to what they scorn as "Obamacare."

It could mean exposing businesses to Internal Revenue Service penalties and leaving low-income citizens unable to afford coverage even as legal immigrants get financial aid for their premiums. For the poorest people, it could virtually guarantee they remain uninsured and dependent on the emergency room at local hospitals that already face federal cutbacks.

Concern about such consequences helped forge a deal in Arkansas last week. The Republican-controlled Legislature endorsed a plan

by Democratic Gov. Mike Beebe to accept additional Medicaid money under the federal law, but use the new dollars to buy private insurance for eligible residents.

One of the main arguments for the private option was that it would help businesses avoid tax penalties.

The Obama administration hasn't signed off on the Arkansas deal, and it's unclear how many other states will use it as a model. But it reflects a pragmatic streak in American politics that's still the exception in the polarized health care

"The biggest lesson out of Arkansas is not so much the exact structure of what they are doing," said Alan Weil, executive director of the nonpartisan National Academy for State Health Policy. "Part of it is just a message of creativity, that they can look at it and say,

'How can we do this in a way that works for us?""

About half the nearly 30 million uninsured people expected to gain coverage under President Barack Obama's health care overhaul would do so through Medicaid. Its expansion would cover low-income people making up to 138 percent of the federal poverty level, about \$15,860 for an individual.

Middle-class people who don't have coverage at their jobs will be able to purchase private insurance in new state markets, helped by new federal tax credits. The big push to sign up the uninsured starts this fall, and coverage takes effect Jan. 1.

As originally written, the Affordable Care Act required states to accept the Medicaid expansion as a condition of staying in the program. Last summer's Supreme

Court decision gave each state the right to decide. While that pleased many governors, it also created complications by opening the door to unintended consequences.

So far, 20 mostly blue states, plus the District of Columbia, have accepted the expansion.

Thirteen GOP-led states have declined. They say Medicaid already is too costly, and they don't trust Washington to keep its prom-

ise of generous funding for the expansion, which would mainly help low-income adults with no children at

Concerns about unintended consequences could make the most difference in 17 states still weighing options.

A look at some potential side effects:

—The Employer Glitch States that don't expand Medicaid leave more businesses exposed to tax penal-

ties, according to a recent study by Brian Haile, Jackson Hewitt's senior vice president for tax policy. He estimates the fines could top \$1 billion a year in states refusing.

Under the law, employers with 50 or more workers that don't offer coverage face penalties if just one of their workers gets subsidized private insurance through the new state markets. But employers generally do not face fines under the law for workers who enroll in Medicaid.

In states that don't expand Medicaid, some lowincome workers who would otherwise have been eligible have a fallback option. They can instead get subsidized private insurance in the law's new markets. But that would trigger a penalty for their employer.

"It highlights how complicated the Affordable Care Act is," said Haile.

—The Immigrant Quirk Arizona Gov. Jan Brewer, a Republican, called attention this year to this politically awkward problem when she proposed that her state accept the Medicaid expansion.



babies dying before birth, prenatal mortality.

"The area that continues to worry my ministry is teenage pregnancy. The teenage pregnancy rate in 2012 remained high, standing at 17.9 percent, with eight girls between eight and ll years giving birth," Burgin said.

The age of consent in St Vincent and the Grenadines is 16 years and a person having sex with a girl under that age can be charged with one of more several crimes.

Trinidad

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar said she was very pleased with the historic legal victory for the state in the unprecedented Section 34 constitutional case.

In a press release, the prime minister said the ruling comprehensively dismissed the various grounds of challenge to the repeal of Section 34

"As noted by the court, the government moved swiftly to repeal Section 34 and draft-

ed the repeal in a manner that nullified any legitimate expectations and retroactively cleared the way for the defendants to be tried.



"The government has been vindicated by this judgment which highlighted and relied on the quick action taken to repeal Section 34.

"I was particularly pleased with the expeditious manner in which this case was heard and determined as it was obviously in the public interest to have this matter dealt with very quickly," she said.

Two businessmen, Ishwar Galbaransingh and Steve Ferguson, reportedly to be financiers of the United National Congress (UNC) party (senior coalition partner in the People's Partnership Government), had challenged the constitutionality of the repeal of Section 34.

They were both charged with a series of criminal offences arising of the Piarco Development Project more than a decade ago. They argued through their constitutional motions that repealing of Section 34 deprived them of an assurance from the State that they could apply to have their cases dismissed, on the basis that they were older than 10 years, before it was revoked by Parliament, to their detriment.

Parliament had passed the Administration of Justice (indictable Proceedings Act) and was proclaimed by President Max Richards on August 31, 2012, which paved the way for persons, charged indictably with certain offences beyond a period of 10 years, to apply to a judge to have them dismissed.

Turks and Caicos

Sixteen Cuban migrants, who were held for illegally entering the Turks and Caicos Islands (TCI) on October 2012 and were released on a court ordered

bail, have absconded and made their way to Florida.



The group reportedly left the TCI by speedboat and island-hopped through The Bahamas

and island-hopped through The Bahamas to make the approximately 650-mile trip to Miami. Among the group was the mother of U.S. baseball professional Yoenis Cepedes.

The controversial U.S. "wet foot, dry foot" rule favors Cubans who, while illegal

migrants, actually arrive on U.S. soil and are then classified as political refugees escaping from a communist country. However, if they are intercepted at sea, they are returned to Cuba.

The ruling party in the TCI, the Progressive National Party (PNP), has a poor record in dealing with illegal migrants. During a former PNP administration, some Haitian detainees died in custody from dehydration. The mistreatment of Haitian refugees in the TCI became a source of local and regional controversy recently when immigration minister Hon-Hue Gardiner called on residents to help track down illegal Haitian migrants and make their lives "unbearable"

Gardiner later tried to defuse his statement by claiming he was not referring to Haitians but to all illegal migrants.

St. Lucia

administration.

St Lucia is seeking to strengthen its existing diplomatic relations with Africa, according to Dr. Vaughn Lewis, the special adviser in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the Dr. Kenny Anthony

"We believe that we need to re-engage with the African states many of which have and continue to



emerge as important economic entities and we need in that context to engage them to assist with our own development," he said.

Speaking during a television program recently, Lewis a former prime minister said: "We have lost influence in persuading Britain and the European Union as to what we want and it is those emerging African countries that will have the influence."


He said the need to deepen relations with the world's second-largest and second-most populous continent is in keeping with a new policy direction to review and realign the country's foreign relations.

Dr. Lewis said while St Lucia may not be able to rely on aid from Africa, the island can engage the continent to stimulate investment and to lobby on St. Lucia's behalf in international circles.

Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago will sign the Arms Trade Treaty when it opens for signature at the United Nations Headquarters in New York, June 3, according to Foreign Affairs Minister Winston Dook-

On April 2, Trinidad and Tobago was among the 155 UN Member States who voted in favor of the treaty



In a statement issued by the Foreign Affairs Ministry, Dookeran said government will be taking all necessary steps to sign the Treaty when it opens for signature on June 3. He also indicated that all issues relating to TT's ratification of the Treaty would be dealt with at the earliest opportunity.





Investing in Haitian economic development

By Tequila Minsky

Two hundred-fifty Haitians, Diaspora, and earnest friends of Haiti met last month at Columbia University, hosted by the School of International and Public Affairs Earth Institute, for a full-day discussing "Investing in Haitian Progress."

Some participants are already doing business in Haiti; others have business projects in mind. Many came to gather information while others attended out of curiosity.

From agricultural production business to hopes of establishing an accounting firm, attendees were highly engaged during the day.

Co-sponsored by the Haitian Hometown Association Resource Group, (HHTARG), this was the first informational meeting for the Diaspora to learn about U.S. AID's matching fund for investment in Haiti. The panels are the first of an Informational Road Show also to take place in Boston, Atlanta, Chicago, Miami and the Dominican Republic in May and June.

The investment program is called LEAD-Leveraging Effective Application of Direct Investments, developed with the premise that the Diaspora investor has multiple interests in seeing progress in Haiti.

Difficulty accessing capital limits business growth. The matching grant program addresses this obstacle, helping to activate investment monies from the Diaspora for small and medium size businesses. LEAD will provide 1:1 matching funds with grants ranging from \$50,000 to 200,000 to help capitalize small and medium businesses.

The geographic areas being targeted are Cap-Haitien, St. Marc, and Port-au-Prince with projects focused on the industries of tourism, agriculture, textiles/garment industry, construction, new technologies, alternative energy/renewables, and other productive sectors.

Starting off the day were greetings from sponsors including the Pan American Development Foundation (PADF), the organization implementing the program on the ground.

Additionally, Minister of Haitians Living Abroad Bernice Fidelia emphasized how the Diaspora's investment is crucial to "positively contribute to Haiti."

Tatiana Wah of the Earth Institute reinforced the day's aims when she said, "Dependence on remittances to Haiti has serious limitations." (Monies to family members through remittances —up to 20 percent of the GDP-help with necessary day-to-day expenses and infuse cash into the Haitian economy but this form of Diaspora-input does little for economic growth and independence.]

A morning panel provided first-hand accounts (and challenges) from Diaspora entrepreneurs whose diverse businesses geographically span the country.

Fritz Clairvil of SIMACT spoke of the naysayers he encountered when in1996, Haitian professionals started the New York-based company initially focused on real estate opportunities. Now, SIMACT has a range of investment interests. Its showcase project is the Jacmel Cap Lamandou Hotel.

Panel participants, seventeen-vear-old Leanna Archer with mom Maritza discussed Leanna's Hair Products that sources oils from Haiti for their all-natural line. One current challenge: since the earthquake, they haven't been able to find the original source who provided the avocado, rosemary, hibiscus, and almond oils, forcing them to buy in smaller volumes from pharmacies in Haiti. These oils can be sourced from other countries but that defeats the goal of Leanna's Haiti Products, to provide jobs in Haiti.

Misick to stand trial

The head investigator in a British government probe of corruption in the Turks and Caicos Islands says that former Premier Michael Misick will stand trial.

Helen Garlick, the Turks and Caicos Special Investigation and Prosecution Team, said Misick will join 10 others, including four of his cabinet ministers, in defending allegations that they illegally sold government lands for profit and cut other sweetheart deals to enrich themselves during their tenure in office.

The trials could commence as early as September pending further appeals to the British Privy Council, said Garlick in a statement.

She had previously said that the team only wanted Misick to return to the British Overseas Dependent Territory for questioning in a criminal investigation of government coruption

But Garlick has acknowledged that British investigators, who are receiving help from the U.S. Department of Justice, have combed through about 100,000 pages of evidence,

uncovering suspicious land deals, unpaid government bills and possible fraud, bribery and money laundering by former leaders.

Misick is currently in Brazil, where he was arrested last week after the South American country rejected his claim for political asylum. He is now subject to extradition proceedngs by the British

The Turks and Caicos Islands is one of two overseas territories where the British are actively probing corruption. The other is the Cayman Islands, where former Premier McKeeva Bush was formally charged last month with corruption

Misick was first elected as chief minister in 2003 but resigned in 2009 during his second term amid the corruption allegations.

He gained international notoriety when he married US actress LisaRaye McCoy in a lavish hilltop ceremony. But McCoy later testified against her estranged husband during a 2008 British government commission of enquiry.

The corruption probe is entering its fourth year. A law firm hired to recover the land recently reported to the governor that it had recovered about 2,500 acres of land valued at about US\$100 million.



PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — Haiti has violated international human rights obligations by failing to protect people who have been forced to leave the impromptu settlements that sprang up in the Caribbean nation after the 2010 earthquake, a global advocacy group said Tuesday.

A report by Amnesty International said it found that thousands of displaced people have been evicted from public spaces and private properties. People kicked out of settlements find themselves "further marginalized and driven deeper into poverty," it said.

The government of President Michel Martelly has condoned the evictions led by mayors, police officers and others, the report

charged.

"They are tolerated by the state and carried out in total impunity by state agents and private individuals or groups (non-state actors) alike," it said.

Amnesty said it wrote to Martelly, the prime minister and mayors of two cities that have seen evictions in an effort to arrange meetings with them, but the requests were declined or went unanswered.

Haitian Prime Minister Laurent Lamothe told The Associated Press Monday night that there were "some" landowners who were responsible for forced evictions but it was not something the government endorsed.

"We don't believe in forced evictions," Lamothe said by telephone. "There are some private owners that do it, but the government itself does not condone that."

Lamothe cited a government-led effort that pays rental subsidies to camp residents. He said it has "relocated over 1.2 million people and has respected their lives and in a peaceful matter. Our policy is respecting their lives and relocating them in a peaceful manner."

Dr. Bill Cosby speaks out on family values

Dr. William Henry "Bill" Cosby Jr. demonstrated that family matters in an enthralling preacherlecture style performance where family value was the centerpiece of his comedic act before a packed house at Queens College's Kupferberg Center for the Arts.

"Whenever there was a beating you would follow," said the producer and star of "The Cosby Show," the number one sitcom for five consecutive years, which captured Black life with professional parents - was making reference, of course, to his childhood days.

The veteran stand-up performer, raised in a humble workingclass family in the projects of Philadelphia, explained that beatings during his childhood was an effective act of disciplining children, without recourse and no outside intervention.

"The social worker would beat you too," asserted Cosby, to applause from a diverse throng in the Colden Auditorium in Queens,

The producer of "A Different


World," jokingly explained the use of instruments such as a broom, an ironing cord and a switch utilized on disobedient children. Not surprising, there was a wave of support for this current prohibited act.

Even the beloved philanthropist and father of four (a fifth child, Ennis, was brutally murdered) revelation of the standard threat by parents to children of, "I am going to beat the daylight out of you," was embraced by the evening's patrons in attendance with young children.

An engaging and intelligent family moment, where likely excerpts of Cosby's dissertation on "Fat Albert" and the "Cosby Kids," as educational tools, seemed to unfold during the extended onenight attraction.

Much of the excitement generated throughout the smart and lively first-rated one-man act were first-hand accounts of portraits of God-fearing stable families striving for a better life.

"Children did not talk back to their parents," Cosby reminded

the delighted cheering contingent, as he was seated on the stage donning a Queens College ensemble and looking like a president of a university. "There was never time out," he added to nods of approval. "You were not sent to your room to think about it without help.'

As anticipated, the Kennedy Center honoree and the Presidential Medal of Freedom Awardee's inspiring humor struck a chord with the multi-ethnic and multigenerational group.

Seaga to be inducted in Reggae Hall of Fame

Former Jamaica Prime Minister Edward Seaga will receive two superlative honors on May 4 when the 32nd annual International Reggae & World Music Awards rewards him with a lifetime achievement award and also inducts him to the Hall of Fame during their gala celebration in Florida.

Although four administrations removed from leadership of his country, the nations' fifth leader is acclaimed for his early embrace and support for reggae music during its infancy. In the early 1950's established West India Records Limited (WIRL) a company which promoted local talents. The label emerged the most successful record company in the West Indies. Seaga is also credited with establishing most of the institutions that build cultural awareness and national identity, as well as develop arts, crafts and national heritage on the island. Prior to winning a seat in parliament, Seaga sought out and invested in talent in western Kingston by promoting local talent shows. When he ran for political office the region became his constituency. There he helped launch the talents of many singers and musicians. He has been credited

with launching the careers of Ken Boothe and others. He also is regarded as the champion to mentor the political career of Olivia "Babsy" Grange who was elected to parliament and also served as the island's minister of sports, culture and entertainment.

Retired from politics, Seaga is now steeped in research at the University of the West Indies.

Last year, he released a

four-disc collection of Jamaican music titled "Reggae Golden Jubilee -- Origins of Jamaican Music" which he compiled over 16 years. The recording spans music from the mid-1950s to the early 1970s.

Seaga is credited with having built more institutions and initiated more far reaching policies than any other political leader in the growth and development of Jamaica. Also named to receive similar acknowledgement are: original Black Uhuru member Derrick "Duckie" Simpson, radio personality, Denver "Jamusa" Silvera, and Lloyd Campbell of Joe Frasier Records.

Another segment of the program will distinguish three state residents with the South Florida Special Award for Extra-Ordinary Contribution to the music industry. Producer Willie Lindo, artist manager Vonnie McGowan and radio personality and Caribbean music promoter, Winsome "Lady C" Charlton are the recipients.

Slated for May 4 at the Coral Springs Center for the Arts in Florida -- the gala promises live performances from top Caribbean names who have distinguished themselves in numerous categories of the recording industry. Nominated in six categories dancehall deejay Vegas is slated to perform. Double nominees.




Grenadian Tal Pree will make his first performance in New York since dazzling crowds with a performance at the 2013 Trinidad & Tobago Power Soca finals.

Williams is well-known as the gossipy afternoon radio personality whose HOT-97/KISS-FM broadcasts attracted huge listening audiences. After a brief hiatus, that show resurfaced as a nationally-syndicated, afternoon program which aired on the competitor Black-owned, WBLS-FM. 'Kon-Tiki' an Oscar-nominated seafaring epic

At the beginning of the 20th Century, the conventional wisdom was that Polynesia had been settled by Asians arriving from the Far East. But it's one thing for a pompous professor to simply sit in an ivory tower and speculate about who might have discovered the island group some 1,500 years ago, and quite another to go about proving a theory correct by attempting to replicate the putative pioneers' perilous feat.

While doing research in the

Marquesas on the Isle of Fatu Hiva in the mid-Thirties, a Norwegian anthropologist named Thor Heyerdahl (Pal Sverre Hagen) came up with a novel idea about the roots of the natives. After studying the local fauna and flora, watching the flow of the tides, and listening to aborigine folklore about their ancestors' arduous trek towards the setting sun, he reasoned that the region must have been settled by tribes migrating there from South America.

Then, when his iconoclastic notion was roundly ridiculed by scholarly colleagues back in academia, Thor decided to prove his detractors wrong by mounting a 5,000-mile expedition from Peru to Polynesia. And although he knew nothing about sailing and couldn't even swim, he did have the sense to assemble a team capable of assisting him in the dangerous endeavor.

The plan was to build a balsa wood raft identical to the type

used by indigenous people in pre-Columbian times, painstakingly following their methods of construction down to the smallest detail. And since they would not be able to steer this vessel christened the Kon-Tiki, Thor estimated it would take about three months for the currents and winds to take them to their destination. His intrepid crew was comprised of four fellow Norwegians and a Swede, including childhood friend, Erik Hesselberg (Odd Magnus Williamson), the navigator; radioman Knut Haugland (Tobias Santelmann), a decorated World War II veteran; Torstein Raaby (Jakob Oftebro), another radio expert; Herman Watzinger (Anders Baas-

mo Christiansen), an engineer; and Bengt Danielsson (Gustaf Skarsgard), the Swedish steward.

Co-directed by Joachim Ronning and Espen Sandberg, "Kon-Tiki" faithfully chronicles their historic, transoceanic voyage. Despite the fact that most of the picture's dialogue is English, it somehow earned a well-deserved Oscar nomination in the Best Foreign Language Film category earlier this year.

The men set sail in the spring of 1947, encountering storms, shark attacks, ship rot, insubordination and a host of other challenges en route. The deliberately-paced production repeatedly harks back to a bygone era when much of the Earth's surface was yet to be explored.Replete with breathtaking Pacific panoramas shot on location, "Kon-Tiki" is worth watching for the captivating visuals alone. However, the storytelling is solid, too, with all adding up to a fitting tribute to the enviable exploits of the legendary Thor Heyerdahl.



your plate? Bring it on. An activity you've never done before? You head the line. New technology? They call vou First-Adopter.



Nia Simone Bijou was feeling restless.

It had been six weeks since she last saw her lover, Prada, and though their weekend together left her sated, it wasn't for long. She had hoped that her friendship with the soldier, Bret,

would turn into a repeat of their one-night stand, but friendship was all he seemed interested in. And so, filled with desire, Nia Simone applied for membership to Decadence, a very exclusive and private swinger's club four hours away from her



Smyrna townhouse.

Decadence fees were astonishing, the medical process was thorough, and the interview was long and deeply personal, but Nia Simone had nothing to hide. She was used to being naked in front of others and she wasn't afraid to describe her fantasies. She wanted new experiences, club rules were simple, and very little was off-limits.

On her first visit, she turned from Watcher to Doer. Decadence was a lover's playground and she wished she could bring Prada with her, though she knew he'd never share her. And since monogamy was boring, sharing was what Nia Simone really desired.

But while Decadence was everything she needed it to be, it wasn't as anonymous as she'd hoped.

Years before, when Nia Simone was in college, her heart was broken by her first love, a man who cheated on her with her pupil. It was still a fist to her gut when she thought about him so seeing him in the club, watching him please that woman, brought white-hot anger to Nia Simone, and a

need for revenge.

Looking for a different Shade of Gray? You might find it here, so bring your oven mitts.

Yes, indeed, "Decadence" is hot with a capital "H." It fairly blisters with explicitness - but it's also relentless. Author Eric Jerome Dickey starts the action literally on the fourth word of this novel and he barely lets up until the end of the book. Alas, that relentlessness sometimes made me lose interest, which is when I started noticing a handful of words that are overused to the point of silliness, and a main character that speaks in tedious, faux-poetic metaphors.

To the good, though, there's a thin plot in this book – which is better than some I've read in Dickey's erotica collection. But really, let's be honest: the plot isn't why you'd want this book in the first place, right?

In case you didn't catch on, this book is for adults only and shouldn't even be kept in the same room with kids. If you've got that covered, then go ahead and give "Decadence" a try.

Last week was an eventful one in world soccer. It demonstrated the Good, the Bad and the Ugly in the sport and reiterated the old adage that soccer is a sport of glorious uncertainties; unfortunately, all was not glorious the past week

The Good - It was wonderful to see the reaction of the fans at Tottenham Hotspurs last Sunday, April 21, when the London team rallied from a 1-0 deficit at home to beat northerners and last year's English Premier League champion Manchester City, 3-1. The win carried much importance because Tottenham edged closer to finishing in the top four of the English league in order to participate in next year's European Champions' League, the wealthiest and most prestigious club tournament around.

Tottenham was trailing well into the second half with just about 20 minutes left in the game; the fans were on

the edge of their seats anxiously awaiting the equalizer; as hope began to fade, Tottenham produce probable the most memorable seven minutes in the club's recent history. Fifteen minutes for the final whistle, American captain Clint Dempsey scored the equalizer as Tottenham Stadium erupted in a frenzy of joy; just minutes later, the much underrated Jermaine DeFoe scored the go-ahead goal after coming on as a substitute and it sent the maddening crowd wild with screams of joy, hugs and laughter; Tottenham superstar Gareth Bale later sealed the victory with one of the best goals scored in the English Premiership this season as he chipped the ball over the on-rushing City goal keeper Gary Hart. The fans, players and all watching experienced a most exciting and memorable moment that the game is meant to produce. It was a moment that the fans will never forget - a moment of glorious uncertainty.

On Monday, the day after

Tottenham's wonderful win, Manchester United, the other northern city dwellers, beat Aston Villa, 3-0, to win its 13th English Premier League title and its 20th English league championship in front of its home crowd of 75,000 at Old Trafford Stadium. Robin van Persie, whom manager Alex Ferguson bought from London club Arsenal FC last summer, scored a hat trick (83rd, 12th and 33rd minutes) to lead the team. "It is a great feeling," said the Dutch forward, who has a leaguehigh 24 goals. "It is a fantastic team and fantastic players. It is a championship for every single one of them."

Manchester United (27-4-3, 84 pts.) now have won 13 of the 21 English Premier League titles and with four games to play could finish on 96 points to eclipse Chelsea's record of 95 points set in 2004-05. United also bettered its record by being the club to win the Premier League at the earliest since it did it in 2001. "It is sweet. It doesn't matter

when you win it,"

United manager Ferguson said. "The consistency has been phenomenal. We have lived up to the expectation." Ferguson also praised Van Persie's second goal, a volley shot. "As far as I'm concerned, it's the goal of the season," said the coach. "Technique, head over the ball. Magnificent strike." Other good happenings last weekend was New York Red Bulls' 4-1 over the New England Revolution at Red Bull Arena Saturday night, and Mexico's 2-1 win over Panama to capture the CONCACAF Under-17 title.

The Bad - The chickens finally came home to roost for former CONCACAF president and FIFA vice president, Trinidadian Jack Warner. On Sunday, Warner resigned his position as minster of national security in the ruling UNC government of Trinidad and Tobago and also stepped down as chairman of the UNC (United National Congress).

After years of accusations of misappropriation of mil-

lions of dollars as head of the regional body, the CONCACAF Ethics and Integrity Committee confirmed what it termed as "corruption" by Warner and former CONCACAF secretary general, American Chuck Blazer, in a 113-page report presented at last weekend's 28th Congress of CONCACAF, held in Panama City. The Committee found that the two "enriched themselves through fraud during their terms with the organization."

Among the Committee's the findings, as stated by Committee head David Anthony Cathcart Simmons, is Warner's misappropriation of at least \$15 million by compensating himself with CON-CACAF funds without authorization and the mismanaging of nearly \$1 million in FIFA funds slated for a reconstruction project in Haiti. Warner resigned from FIFA in June 2011 after it was found out that he initiated a cash-forvotes bribery scandal to influence the FIFA presidential election. Warner was banned from any involvement with soccer.

Warner for years was an embarrassment to the regional body, more specifically to the Caribbean and to the people of Trinidad and Tobago. He was in charge of the national soccer team's successful World Cup qualification in 2006 and did not compensate the players after an agreement to pay the team a percentage of the World Cup income. The FBI and the U.S. Internal revenue Service are contemplating further investigations into the actions of Warner and Blazer. Regional soccer is better off without this pair. This may also be the beginning of the final chapter for Jack Warner

The Ugly – Liverpool Uruguayan forward Luis Suarez bit a Chelsea defender during last Saturday's English Premiership game. The player was only fined by Liverpool and is awaiting action from the English F A. Suarez has a history of bad conduct in



Classified ads are intended to help people by facilitat-ing communication and advertising available ser-vices; however, some of the hotlines & service num bers in classifieds actually hurt the people who rely on them by cheating them of their hard-earned dollars. "Most newspapers print a disclaimer in their classified ad section to warn readers about numbers that are a direct line to trouble. Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges. "Consumers must also question legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party."




