G4 praise for Haitian farmers

WASHINGTON, Aug 14, 2013 (IPS) - Work by the Group of 4 (G4) union of Haitian peasant organisations, along with assistance from the Dessalines Brigade – South American peasant leaders and agroecology experts supported by La Via Campesina - has been singled out for promoting "good farming practices and advocat[ing] for peasant farmers" in Haiti.

The two network organisations, it was announced Tuesday, will be awarded the 2013 Food Sovereignty Prize, an annual award given to groups that promote a more democratic, community-based food system.

The G4 alliance represents over a quarter-million Haitians. Its relationship with the South American peasant leadership is intended "to rebuild Haiti's environment, promote wealth and end poverty" in that country, which continues to feel the devastating effects of the major earthquake that struck the island in 2010.

"We wanted to honour that relationship," Charity Hicks, of the Detroit Food Justice Task Force, one of the groups behind the Food

Guyana Pols kill hydro project

Guyana's main opposition party has virtually killed and buried a controversial hydro electric project that government had built up as its infrastructural showpiece but which many in the opposition and professional communities have said is riddled with overpricing and millions in kickbacks for those with power and political connections.

The Amaila Falls Hydro Power Project in the central Potaro Region was slated to come on stream in about 10 years, providing clean hydro power from the

Bahamas

A 64-year-old United States citizen is recuperating in hospital after he was bitten on the left hand by a Nurse Shark, the police said in a statement recently. The man from Fort Lauderdale, Florida was clean-

ing fish in Exuma, an area known for Nutse sharks, when the incident occurred recently.



"He was taken to the local clinic and later air lifted to the capital where his injuries are described as non-life threatening," the statement said without naming the victim.

Barbados

The Barbados government will table legislation next month to promote green energy, Finance and Economic Affairs Minister Chris Sinckler has said.

Sinckler said the Freundel Stuartled government has devised practical ways to build out the alternative energy sector through policy, leg-

islation and fiscal incentives, which will ensure that in terms both of supply and demand,



there are reasonable and cost effective solutions available.

"In the short term, our energy conservation activities are critical, but in the medium to long term, if we want to have a sustainable reduction in the amount of foreign exchange we spend on fuel oil, it would mean that we would have to employ strategies to build out a strong, vibrant and productive alternative energy sector," he said.

Sinckler said that the new legislation would be predicted on a set of initiatives which were outlined in last year's budget, but took some time to finalize because the government wanted to ensure that it was as close to perfect as possible.

The minister said that the legislation would provide 10-year tax

holidays for any developer, manufacturer or installer of renewable energy systems and energy efficient products and this measure will be covered by the Income Tax Act.

Guyana

A Guyana court has acquitted two men accused of killing 11 peo-

ple in one of the worst mass murder cases in the South American nation's recent



history. Twentyfour-year-old Anthony Hyles and 28-year-old Mark Williams were freed recently.

Prosecutors accused them of using high powered rifles and shotguns to slay 11 people in the coastal farming village of Lusignan in 2008. Several of the victims were children killed as they slept.


Officials said the killings were meant as revenge for the disappearance of gang leader Rondell Rawlins' girlfriend. Rawlins allegedly blamed the government and regarded people in Lusignan as government supporters.

The two defendants had said they acted as lookouts during the killings but did not actively participate. Soldiers killed Rawlins a few months after the massacre.

Jamaica

The main opposition Jamaica Labor Party (JLP) recently condemned the murder of a man at a church alter saying the gunmen were not even deterred by the fact they were committing the crime in a church.

Police were searching for gunmen who chased a man identified by



shot and killed him at the church altar in the community of Bull Bay in the eastern parish of St. Andrew recently.

Police said that a child attending Bible studies at the church was also shot twice in the back and has been taken to hospital for treatment

Law enforcement officials said that the gunmen had earlier shot the man in his leg as he sought to escape from them and although he entered the church the venue did not deter them as they cornered him on the altar and shot him several times, killing him instantly.

JLP spokesman on National Security and Justice, Delroy Chuck, described the killing as shocking to the conscience, horrific and deserving of widespread condemnation, adding that the gunmen were not even prepared to stop their actions in a place of worship or in the presence of children participating in the church's annual "Vocation Bible School" series.

St. Kitts

St. Kitts and Nevis will receive US\$6.4 million from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) after the Washington based financial institution said it had completed an economic performance of the twin-

island federation under a 36-month Standby Agreement (SBA).



The IMF said

that total funds now disbursed to the island is US\$71.5 million and that it had also approved waivers of applicability for the end June 2013 performance criterion on the ceiling of external arrears accumulated on debt contracted or guaranteed by the central government, and re-phased disbursements under the SBA.

In 2011, the IMF approved the US\$79.35 million SBA for St. Kitts Nevis and according to the fund's managing director, Min Zhu, the local authorities "have continued the successful implementation of their Fund-supported program, in particular making progress toward achieving fiscal objectives and debt restructuring.

The IMF official said the 2013 budget is aligned with the authorities' dual objectives of redeploying resources towards growth enhanc-

Vincentian lawyer 'battered, bruised' by NYPD

A prominent Vincentian lawyer and former senator in the incumbent Unity Labor Party has confirmed his arrest by officers of the New York Police Department.

After a court appearance and his release, Ronald Marks told Caribbean Life on Monday that he was arrested late Sunday night in Brooklyn while viewing netball matches between Caribbean teams and meeting friends at the Lincoln Terrace Park in Crown Heights.

In recent years, the Lincoln Terrace Park has become a central meeting place on summer weekends for Caribbean nationals, particularly Vincentians, during netball matches, organized by the Brooklynbased Caribbean American Netball Association (CANA).

"I'm a bit battered and bruised, but I'm alright," said Marks, stating that police had charged him with resisting arrest, attempted assault, being in a park after sunset and disorderly conduct.

Marks, who is vacationing in New York with his wife, the court registrar in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, said the presiding judge at Brooklyn Supreme Court "adjourned (the case) in contemplation of dismissal."

His lawyer, Colin Liverpool, told Caribbean Life that once there is "no reaction (falls afoul of the law) in six months, the case is dismissed."

On seeing one of his former clients, Darren Dopwell, handcuffed and thrown into a police squad car, Marks said he had inquired about the matter from a female police officer.

He said Dopwell had also shouted to him: "Ronnie, I ain't do anything, and they lock me up."

Marks said the police

responded that an officer had asked Dopwell to "move, and he didn't move, and he had an attitude."

Marks further said that since he has not been admitted to practice law in New York, he inquired about the whereabouts of Liverpool, who is allowed to practice law in the state, whom he had seen at the location a few minutes before.

Marks said as he turned around, he felt his feet "removed from under me" by two police officers, and their knees jammed to his back after he dropped, chest down, on the pavement.

Marks said he did not "hoist a stroke," adding that, after the police manhandled him badly, they came up with the "trumped up charges."

"If a client had told me about such an attack, it would be hard for me to believe," Marks said. "I couldn't believe the police in New York could act so wickedly."

Marks said former St. Vincent and the Grenadines' junior calypso monarch, Orande "Man Kemmie" Christopher, a popular DJ in Brooklyn, was also arrested after he questioned the police's actions.

"It's another story how they treated us in the cell, not allowing us to use the bathroom," he said. "They slammed Darren (Dopwell) against the wall on the same shoulder he had surgery on."

Marks said when Christopher questioned the treatment meted out to Dopwell, "they told him to shut up and put him in a different cell.

"From that, I learned to shut up," said Marks, who has since posted images of bruises, sustained at the Lincoln Terrace Park, on the social network, Face-

He is appealing to the public for video footages to help bolster a potential lawsuit against the NYPD.

heart of the country's Amazonian jungles all the way to the city with its transmission pylons hopping over streams and rivers, mountains, dirt roads and thick forest, connecting with the national grid system at Linden town, about 65 miles from the city.

But with a price tag of \$840 million dollars an counting and with a highly complex financing scheme involving the Chinese government, the Inter American Development Bank (IDB) U.S.-based Sithe Global LLC and others, neither of the two main opposition parties, the APNU and the AFC, nor a growing band of Guyanese citizens say they are comfortable with the project in the way it is currently configured.

And even though the Alliance For Change (AFC) has been giving mix parliamentary signals on whether

it will support the project or not, the APNU of former army commander Brig. Gen. David Granger has vowed to continue opposing it until the project is retendered internationally, parliament is brought fully up to date with every detail and until it is convinced that Amaila will not be an expensive white elephant as the barely functioning \$200M Chinese-built Skeldon Sugar factory near the border with Suriname.

Shaken up by the growing opposition to the project, Sithe Global announced at the weekend that it was walking away from both the project and the country, blaming the rising political temperature and the lack of political unanimity for its decision.

"Unfortunately not all parties were willing to set aside politics for the broader public good and as a result today we reluctantly announce our withdraw-

al from the project," said Sithe.

The move has put the administration of President Donald Ramotar on the defensive and has clearly embarrassed him domestically and internationally, leading to a clamor among governing party faithful for fresh elections to reverse the one-seat parliamentary advantage of the APNU and the AFC.

Ramotar has vowed to find new international partners to get the project up and running, to help end 40 years of rolling blackouts and to provide clean electricity in keeping with the low carbon emissions thrust of the administration.

Sovereignty Prize, told IPS, referring to the partnership between G4 and Via Campesina.

Hicks' organisation is just one member of the U.S. Food Sovereignty Alliance (USFSA), the group offering the award. USFSA aims to "end poverty, rebuild local food economies, and assert democratic control over the food system", as well as to connect "local and national struggles to the international movement for food sovereignty".

Hicks lauds the partnership between the Haitian peasant union and the South American groups as an example of food sovereignty organisations from different regions "sharing knowledge and skills, respecting ecologies and creating food democracy".

Food democracy, she explains, refers to "bottomup, communal and cultural approaches to deal with hunger and poverty."

In addition, the G4 union stood out for a decision made in 2010 by one of its member groups, the Peasant Movement of Papaye, to reject a substantial donation of hybrid seeds by U.S. mega-producer Monsanto following the earthquake.

"Denying the [Monsanto] seeds represented significant opposition to what the corporate food system is doing by trying to control our food," Lisa Griffith, of

the National Family Farm Coalition, another member group of the USFSA, told IPS.

The opposition to Monsanto was especially important in the decision to award G4, Griffith says, because the Food Sovereignty Prize acts as an alternative to the World Food Prize. That annual award was given this year to, among others, Robert Fraley, a high-ranking Monsanto executive.





NYC mayor lambastes stop-and-frisk ruling

NEW YORK (AP) — A federal judge's stinging rebuke of the police department's stop-and-frisk policy as discriminatory could usher in a return to the days of high violent crime rates and end New York's tenure as "America's safest big city," Mayor Michael Bloomberg warned.

The ruling strikes at the heart of the legacy Bloomberg aims to leave when his third and final term ends this year. He said he would appeal but likely won't be around long enough to deal with the repercussions.

"This is a dangerous decision made by a judge who I think does not understand how policing works and what is compliant with the U.S. Constitution as determined by the Supreme Court," Bloomberg said. "I worry for my kids, and I worry for

your kids. I worry for you and I worry for me. Crime can come back any time the criminals think they can get away with things. We just cannot let that happen."

Big corporations pay their fair share

President Obama is right to address the urgent need to modernize our once grand infrastructure. Unfortunately, the president's corporate tax reforms would leave us in a deeper hole down the road.

The President's plan to cut corporate tax rates responds to the tireless mantra of U.S. multinational corporations that America's tax rates hurt their global competitiveness. In reality. American corporations are enjoying their highest level of profits in 60 years while their federal income taxes are close to the lowest level. The Government Accountability Office recently reported that large profitable U.S. corporations paid an effective federal tax rate of just 12.6 percent in 2010, a rate lower than many small businesses and middle-class fami-

Large corporations like Pfizer, Bank of America and Google have avoided paying their fair share of U.S. taxes by abusing offshore tax havens and using accounting gimmicks to disguise U.S. profits as foreign profits. U.S. corporations are holding about \$2 trillion offshore to shield it from U.S. taxation. These corporations have gamed the tax system, contributing mightily to the deficit while leaving small businesses and households to pick up a greater share of the cost of public services and infrastructure –

from schools and police to roads and safe drinking water.

While the details aren't clear, the President's plan includes a one-time fee on offshore profits - much lower than the regular corporate tax rate - that he wants to use for investing in our country's aging infrastructure and other priorities. Small businesses applaud increased investment in bridges, ports and other needed infrastructure that will also create jobs and put money on Main Street. However, history shows that rewarding corporate tax dodgers with hundreds of billions of dollars in tax breaks – as happened with the 2004 tax holiday that promised job creation and delivered a windfall to CEOs and shareholders instead - only accelerates tax haven abuse in the future. It would incentivize the armies of corporate accountants and lobbyists to create and exploit new loopholes even as old ones may be closed.

Ending corporate tax dodging is not a Republican issue or a Democratic issue; it's an American issue. In a nationally representative poll, in which Republicans outnumbered Democrats, more than 90 percent of small business owners said it is a problem when large corporations use accounting gimmicks to shift their U.S. profits to foreign tax havens in order to avoid taxes pay. Whether called a one-time fee or a tax holiday, a corpo-

Caribbean lags on reproductive rights

WASHINGTON, Aug 6, 2013 (IPS) - In the last decade, several countries in the Latin America and Caribbean (LAC) region have had the opportunity to experience economic growth and establish redistributive fiscal policies aimed at reducing poverty, reducing inequality and improving the coverage and quality of health, education and social protection services.

And yet significant gaps exist in the area of reproductive health and rights, both between countries and as a whole, when it comes to some of the key objectives of the Cairo Programme of Action.

Let us take one of the basic indicators of reproductive health, the maternal mortality ratio. The decline overall in the region is not enough to guarantee the achievement of the target set for 2015.

Abortion is only legal in six countries, and together, these countries account for less than five percent of the region's women aged 15-44.

The average maternal mortality rate in LAC is 80 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births, according to estimates by WHO, UNFPA, UNICEF and World Bank, 2011. Moreover, there are significant inequities between countries.

For example, the estimated maternal mortality rate in Uruguay was 29 deaths per 100,000 live births in 2010, while it was 120 in Guatemala; Haiti exhibits the highest ratio in the region, with 350 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births.

A significant proportion of

maternal deaths are caused by unsafe abortions, which represent a serious public health concern in the region.

In 2008, the annual rate of unsafe abortion estimated for the region was 31 abortions per 1,000 women aged 15-44. In 2008, 12 percent of all maternal deaths in Latin America and the Caribbean (1,100 in total) were due to unsafe abortions, according to the World Health Organisation.

Abortion is only legal in six countries, and together, these countries account for less than five percent of the region's women aged 15-44. (Guttmacher Institute, 2012).

In addition to the discrepancies noted in regard to maternal mortality and access to safe abortion between countries, there are also intra-country disparities.

Stop-and-Frisk reeks of racial profiling

United States District Court Judge Shira A. Scheindlin issued a groundbreaking decision declaring that the New York City Police Department (NYPD) implements its controversial stop-and-frisk policy in an unconstitutional manner and violates the rights of hundreds of thousands of New Yorkers. Judge Scheindlin ordered sweeping reforms – including an independent monitor to oversee the NYPD – to fix the problems.

The NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. ("LDF"), with co-counsel the Legal Aid Society, has filed a related lawsuit, Davis v. City of New York, on behalf plaintiffs challenging the

constitutionality of the NYPD's policy and practice of stopping and arresting public housing residents and their guests for the purported crime of trespassing. LDF's case is scheduled for a jury trial before Judge Scheindlin in October.

In her decision, Judge Scheindlin found that the NYPD encourages the targeting of young Black and Latino men based on crime statistics, which is a form of racial profiling in violation of the Fourteenth Amendment. Between January 2004 and June 2012, 83 percent of all individuals stopped by NYPD officers were Black and Latino despite the fact that they comprise only 52 percent of New York City's population. Judge Scheind-

lin also found that NYPD officers routinely stopped New Yorkers without reasonable suspicion in violation of their Fourth Amendment rights. Only 12 percent of all stops led to an arrest or summons

"Judge Scheindlin's ruling is a historic recognition of the NYPD's entrenched discriminatory practices that have violated the rights of Black and Latino New Yorkers for decades," said Sherrilyn Ifill, LDF's president and director-counsel. Although the ruling does not abolish the practice of stop and frisk, it mandates major changes in the way the policy is implemented to ensure that police

Navigating tall challenges in foreign policy

As if he didn't already have a full plate and more to contend with from obstructionist congressional Republicans about his domestic agenda, President Obama finds himself, early in this second term, with tall challenges on the national security/ foreign policy front that threaten to make the rest of his tenure an obstacle course not for the faint of heart. The thorny issues just keep piling up. Recent brouhahas like the chill in the US-Russia relationship and Edward Snowden's role in this or rumblings at home over people's right to privacy being compromised by post-9/11 realities add to longerstanding perplexities like Iran, Iraq and Afghanistan. And what seemed like pretty smooth sailing in the first term, even policy moves that looked to be undeniable pluses, now

come in for second guessing.

The positive vibe radiating from Obama's vow to pursue and eliminate bin Laden and other key al Qaida figures, to terminate a heavyduty presence in Iraq and wind down the commitment in Afghanistan served him well at a time he most needed to demonstrate the muscular resolve those issues demanded. Some indeed thought he tended to over-compensate on the macho

thing. But a not easily ignored deficit side to these as well as other policy directions has manifested itself, making for a more cloudy outlook.

Although Iraq was an undertaking Obama, like millions of others, saw as a war the U.S. should never have initiated, how the American invasion and occupation has left Iraq gets laid at the feet of not the trigger-happy crew who orchestrated the colossal mess, but the guy overseeing the pullout. At this point there appears to be little doubt that Iraq will remain in chaos for a long time to come."Damned if you do, damned if you don't" might well be the caption for Obama's decision to make a clean break from the hellhole created when some folks in Washington took a Saddam fixation to unseemly extremes. In Afghanistan, where Obama was supportive of the U.S. invasion, the country is proving to be just as ungovernable under an American-designed road map as with any of the previous foreign powers who've tried and failed to bring stability to that place. One hardly expects that things in Afghanistan will be in measurably better shape by the 2014 exit date the president has set.

objective of taking out known terrorist operatives, this too hasn't been without pushback. Drone attacks, the method of choice for hitting known players in the terror business, have come under much criticism for alleged collateral damage and unintended killings they've caused. Relations between the U.S. and Pakistan have become frayed, and drone attacks are supposedly a major sticking point. Pakistani resentment must be growing over Big Brother perhaps exacting too heavy a price for the substantial aid annually sent Pakistan's way. Surprisingly perhaps, there have been some homeland voices as well making negative noises about the need for the drone program to be revisited.

But whatever homegrown opposition the use of drones has generated, it of course pales by comparison with the ruckus over domestic surveillance that's in vogue now. The leaking of classified material


by former National Security Agency contractor Snowden has turned the spotlight big time on the need, as the president said last Friday, "to strike the right balance between protecting our security and preserving our freedoms." Obama reassured the public again that the national security establishment's access capability for all phone calls made doesn't mean the government is spying on average Joes. He announced some tinkering with the process, all supposedly in the interest of giving the program greater transparency. But not up for debate was that the president remained fully committed to the government's access to phone records as a necessary tool in the ongoing struggle to keep the country safe. Hardly a surprise, the policy doesn't pass muster unanimously across the American landscape.

Obama's response in trying to give some reassurance to Americans fearful of maybe having reached the "nothing is sacred" point, presents one heck of a contrast to what one would pretty much expect the response to be, in similar circumstances from the Bush-Cheney tandem, for instance. "The hell with transparency" would be the overriding imperative there for sure.

The spat with Russia's Vladimir Putin over the grant of temporary sanctuary to Snowden may not exactly be a tempest in a teapot, but it's not the opening salvo in a new Cold War either. Russia's potential brokering capability with the likes of Iran and Syria simply means the Obama administration has to find a way to re-set the table in wake of this Snowden imbroglio, so that some semblance of normalcy in the U.S. engagement of Russia could resume. Failure to make this happen would be another hiccup the president doesn't need.

It has been Obama's lot to see some key U.S. allies flame out, most spectacular probably being the fall of Egypt's Hosni Mubarak. Who knew that this man, reputedly close second-in-command and successor to Sadat, was such a terrible dude, as Egypt's masses claimed? Whatever, a critical go-to guy for America in the Middle East fell and Egypt has since been a powder keg.

The president must navigate his way through all these national, tribal or other agendas, or the intransigence that's a given with conflicting vested interests. And suddenly, handling first-term foreign policy looks like a cakewalk.

fertility rate has reduced considerably, in Bolivia (DHS, 2008), the total fertility rate of women with no education was 6.1 compared to 1.9 for women with higher education, and the urban-rural difference is 2.8 to 4.9, respectively; in Panama, maternal mortality is five times higher among indigenous women.

What is even more tragic is that Latin America and the Caribbean has the second highest rate of adolescent pregnancy in the world, with approximately 70 live births per 1,000 women aged 15-19. On an average, 38 percent of women in the region become pregnant before they reach the age of 20 and nearly 20 percent of live births in the region are by adolescent mothers.

The conclusion is clear: universal access to reproductive health is still far from being a reality in the LAC region.

Looking specifically at the seven components of the programme of action, the LAC countries have achieved much higher rates of contraceptive prevalence than Africa or Asia as a whole. For example, in 2012, the average contraceptive prevalence rate (CPR) among married women in Africa was only 26 percent and 47 percent in Asia (excluding China); in Latin America and the Caribbean it was as high as 67 percent of married women [Population Reference Bureau].

As I said before, the LAC countries have brought down their collective maternal mortality rate to 80 deaths per 100,000 live births – a striking improvement over the Sub-Saharan African average of 500 per 100,000 live births and the South Asian average of 220 per 100,000 live births (UNICEF, 2010).

However, in other key areas of the Programme such as expression of and protection for sexual and reproductive rights including access to safe abortion, post-abortion care, and expression of gender identity or sexual orientation, the LAC region continues to be challenged.

The reasons for the progress in this region were mentioned earlier – development as a whole, higher rates of education and access to contraception have helped considerably.

Let us not forget however, that the lack of progress in ensuring reproductive rights and access to safe abortion in particular comes from the fact that a large number of LAC countries stated formal reservations to many of the rights components in the Programme of Action, including concern over abortion, a national belief and/or laws asserting a need to protect life from the moment of conception, and concern over alternate expressions of family beyond that of formal marriage between a man and a woman.

In contrast, while several other countries in other regions expressed similar reservations (notably many Islamic and Catholic countries), only one African and one Asian country (Djibouti and Philippines) presented formal reservations to this effect. These reservations have continued to hamper progress in these areas and produced the situation we see today in this region.

rate tax amnesty policy is completely unacceptable to small businesses.

The President could close offshore tax loopholes without temporarily or permanently cutting corporate tax rates through a number of bills currently pending in Congress. These include bills to end deferral of taxes on corporate profits held offshore so that corporate income is taxed as it is earned and requiring offshore transactions to have an economic purpose beyond simply avoiding taxes.

Moreover, lobbyists who could not prevent the topbracket Bush tax cuts from being reversed are saying that the President's plan for reducing corporate tax

rates to 28 percent, with a lower 25 percent rate for manufacturers, should be accompanied by a reduction in top tax rates for individuals in order to be fair to small business owners – most of whom report their business profits on their personal tax returns. This is another effort to use middle-class small business owners as a foil to help hedge fund managers, wealthy lawyers and big businesses like Bechtel, the nation's largest engineering firm, that are formed as pass-through income organizations. These are the two to three percent of high-income "small business" owners who would reap a big windfall if income tax rates for those at the top were reduced: the rest of the real small business owners

would not be affected.

The reality is that what small businesses really need is dependable modern infrastructure and more demand for their goods and services, not tax breaks for big corporations and wealthy individuals. We can strengthen this demand by making big corporations pay their fair share of taxes and investing the new revenue in economic development.

Tax reform should be about building a vibrant 21st century economy for all businesses, not rewarding big corporations for free loading on the rest of us.

ing outlays and continuing fiscal consolidation through significant budgetary primary surpluses.

St. Lucia

Stephenson King was swept out of the leadership of the main opposition United Workers Party (UWP) after his former tourism minister Allen Chastanet scored a convincing victory in a recent poll.

King, who led the UWP into defeat

in the 2011 general elections, was defeated by a 264-99 margin with Chastanet's "A" Team also securing a clean sweep of all the executive posts at stake.



Party officials said that the polls were pleased with the voting procedures and the 364 delegates representing the island's 17 constituencies were allowed to cast their ballots in an

orderly manner.

There had been rumors of planned disruptions by supporters opposed to Chastanet did not materialize.

Former foreign affairs minister, Rufus Bousquet, who sought the position of chairman, also suffered defeat at the polls. In his acceptance speech, Chastanet, a hotelier, said that his

first task would be to unite the party.

"The process of reconciliation begins immediately, and I am making a special appeal to every supporter to reach out and embrace one another, extend a handshake or exchange a smile, remembering we have one common purpose and one goal, to remove the St. Lucia Labor Party from the backs of the suffering people of this country.

King, who initially refused to shake his opponent's hand, later addressed party supporters urging them to unite for the task ahead. "I know what it is to be down and out but I also know what it is to keep fighting until the end, as the task ahead would require the energy, effort and drive of all UWP supporters," King told the convention, recalling the death of his mother over the past few weeks.

St. Vincent

Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves says he played no role in the decision by the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) to lay nine

charges against an opposition legislator last week.

In fact, Gonsalves believes that Vyn-

nette Frederick is being prosecuted because her "lies caught up with her."

The main opposition New Democratic Party (NDP) says it will hold a protest march and two public protest meetings in support of Frederick.

She was slapped with the nine charges relating to making false declarations, swearing falsely, and fabricating evidence, hours after a magistrate dismissed six charges against her.

The initial charges stemmed from a private complaint that Frederick had made against Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves following the December 2010 general elections.


Gonsalves, in a radio program, suggested that Frederick's attempt to bring down his government in the wake of the 2010 general elections has backfired.

He also distanced himself from the arrest of the opposition legislator saying "that is a matter within the domain of the Office of the Director of Public Prosecution and the police."

"The Office of the Director of Public Prosecution is independent of any political interference," Gonsalves said.

Gonsalves recounted the genesis of the saga, which began in 2011, when Frederick brought private criminal complaints against him and other ULP election candidates, concerning comments made in the lead up to the December 2010 general elections.



THE CARIBBEAN BUSINESS REPORT

In Canarsie, a hidden jewel that rode out of town

Way down at the end of the Paerdegat streets and at the end of Seaview Park, lies one of Canarsie's most prized possessions, a family center tucked into the pocket of Brooklyn. From the sky (Google maps if you can't afford a space station of your own) you can see the four pools shining like sapphires in PacPlex back yard, but there are more treasures beneath the surface of the sprawling tin roof.

"PacPlex" is a new name to the quiet neighborhood but it refers to a facility that has stood since 1974. What was originally a massive tennis center has evolved over the years to better serve the community. Before taking on new partners and management in 2012, PacPlex was known as the Paerdegat Athletic Club. The new name brings with it new energy and of course renovations as the club continues to morph.

Trinidadian-born Nigel Ryan who has been with the company for the past 10 years is now its marketing director for the past 18 months. "As I look at the improvements to the club, to the facility itself and to the programming, I am excited about the prospects of PacPlex," said Ryan.

Today, the facility houses among other things, a full health club, which boasts a new free weight room, or power gym as the members call it. This space is for serious buffs such as Kai Greene. There is no intimidation though as the club has an easy

family atmosphere that exudes most especially from the friendly staff. The gym has all the amenities one would expect, such as the cardio machines, group exercises, personal training and a few extra things like a jogging track and PurMotion training system. Mike Silva, an industry leader joined the team in 2012 and brings his expertise in hopes of putting Pac-

Fitness on the map.

One of the biggest features of PacPlex is the water. Apart from the four outdoor pools, PacPlex has two indoor pools and a hot tub. The pool club with the bar and grill open makes for a great family outing on the weekend. The indoor pools are open year round and facilitate a thriving swim academy for beginners and

expert swimmers alike.

There is a separate management team dedicated to serving the children. PacKids offers early childhood education all the way up to Universal Pre-Kindergarten, after school program, holiday camps, sporting instruction and enrichment programs for kids. Drama and music are the latest additions to the program-

ing. Ronny Schindler who has been very successful with his Park Slope Day Camp brought his expertise to PacKids last year also.

PacPlex caters to the Caribbean and European communities with the biggest indoor soccer field in Brooklyn. Even through the winter, the matches often go on into the wee hours of the morning. "If that 's not your cup of tea, Pacplex also has racquetball courts, saunas, steam room, a licensed massage therapist, a restaurant and bar with private dining room, event spaces and catering," said Ryan. This year Pac Plex hosted Sesame Flyers launch.

Since Hurricane Sandy, which forced PacPlex to rebuild everything on the ground floor, PacPlex has been without a proper basketball court. But construction is almost complete on three indoor basketball courts, which management expects will be the "talk of the town." Another big addition to come soon to PacPlex is boxing. PacPlex will have not just a training center and world class coach, but the ability to host matches

"Our facility has seen good days and not so good, it has ridden out the storm, that's for sure but the prospects looking forward for PacPlex are bright. If you want to discover this Brooklyn treasure, go to www.pacplex.com, and check out the satellite image too, it's quite nifty," said the marketing director.

'We're in Danger of **Losing our Salvation'**

Church of England admits wrongs

Making biblical references to slavery, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Justin Welby, has said that the church must own up to past wrongs in the Caribbean.

"In this part of the world there is the history of the church in the past acting in oppression. It is no use covering that up, pretending it did not happen, making excuses, it is true," he

Welby, who spoke to hundreds of Barbadian Anglican worshippers last Friday night, August 9, during a two-day visit to the island on his way to Latin America, at the same time courted acceptance and understanding by saying the



church comprises humans who are not without fault.

This principal leader of the Church of England and the Anglican Communion of some 80 million spread over 165 countries, added, "We cannot forget that every age and every place we live in today the church is human, and humans make terrible mistakes, and do terrible wrongs, but it is still the family of God".

Describing the church as God's building, he said, "The church is under construction in the hands of God... and buildings under construction always look a

He spoke of the Prophet Isaiah in the first reading, with mention of a lost and scattered people suffering politically, economically, culturally, and religiously, but when all hope is gone God answers. "He says I hear you and will save you, and by the way I will also turn the world the other way up, so that those who were slaves will rule and the arrogant rulers will follow all those who were slaves," Welby said to a packed to overflowing Parish Church of Christ Church.

This prelate is the 105th in a line of succession of over 1,400 years who is enthroned in the name of the Queen or King of Eng-

never followed up) led to Dr. Dixon giving ultrasound trainings—his undergraduate specialty—in Jamaica.

Ultrasound is the first diagnostic tool for unstable patients, gunshot, knife, blunt trauma, and ectopic pregnancy. Hospitals, there, had the equipment but didn't know how to use them. Dr. Dixon also helped obtain two more ultra-

sounds for the country's hospitals.

During that time, Dr. Dixon observed and was appalled at how dilapidated the emergency rooms (ER) were at Kingston Public Hospital, the country's main hospital.

"The problem is the equipment and the infrastructure," he explained, further clarifying, "The issue isn't the amount of doctors. There is a good ratio and they're well trained locally at the University of the West Indies." There are 10 major hospitals for the population of 2.7 million.

A fundraiser last year, with the newly established JAHJAH (Jamaicans Abroad Helping Jamaicans At Home) Foundation, raised \$8,000 to refurbish the worn-out rooms. The Jamaican government matched these funds and eight ER rooms were renovated, boosting morale for doctors and patients alike.

Last Saturday, JAHJAH held its second major fundraiser, to continue the work and assist in the areas of health care. Supporters such asLyndon Williams who traveled from Toronto attended. "We make sure the money goes to its intended purpose," he said, pointing out photographs of the new ER rooms and enumerating, "new tiles, cabinets, examining tables and other equipment."

The monies collected this year will go to the trauma center at the Southern Trelawny's Ulster Spring Medical Clinic.

After cocktails, light fare and lots of summertime greetings, an Appreciation Award was given to Irwin Clare, founder of Team Jamaica Bickle. He is also very involved with the Jamaican Diaspora.

During the progress report phase of the evening, some exciting breaking news were reported. JAH-JAH is facilitating collaboration between Columbia University Medical School and the Bustamante Children's Hospital, Kingston, in their Pediatric Oncology unit. By an amplified phone call, Dr. Fenton Ferguson, Jamaica's minister of health, told the attendees how thrilled he is to have JAHJAH Foundation to join forces with.

JAHJAH continues to grow partnering with other non-profit organizations such as Caribbean and Jamaican nurses associations and the Coalition to Preserve Reggae Music.

The foundation welcomes professions from all walks of life, social workers, law enforcement, business and scientists, Jamaicans and "friends of Jamaica" who want to give a helping hand.

The fundraiser turnout was substantial and supporters were rewarded with Chef Decka's jerk chicken, escovieted fried fish, peppered shrimp, and Jamaican style vegetable fried rice.

Three ceramic pieces, donated by the artist Homer Brown formerly of Wassi Art, were auctioned off during the evening.

Health Care Reform in N.Y.

You're probably starting to hear more and more about Health Care Reform these days. Health Care Reform may seem complex, but it's important to understand so that you can take advantage of these changes.

First, let's look at what Health Care Reform is called. You may have heard it referred to as "Obamacare" or "the Affordable Care Act (ACA)."

Under the ACA, each state will have an "exchange" or "marketplace"* —. where health insurance companies will offer various health plans on the New York health insurance marketplace. These plans are known as Qualified Health Plans (QHPs), and they will be available to individuals, families, and small businesses. Starting Oct. 1, 2013, you will be able to use the marketplace to find insurance options, compare costs, and buy health plans online, in person, over the phone, or by mail. Coverage begins as soon as Jan. 1, 2014. (*New York will soon announce the name for its health insurance

marketplace).

Starting Jan. 1, 2014, most people will be required to have health insurance or pay a tax penalty, or fee, if they don't. It's important to know that if you can't afford health insurance, you may be eligible for Medicaid. Or, you may be able to get help from the federal government to pay for health insurance. This help is called a "subsidy."

Here's an example. Individuals and families with incomes up to 400 percent of the federal poverty level may be eligible to receive subsidies to help with the cost of health insurance. This income level is currently \$45,960 for an individual and \$94,200 for a family of four.

The great news is that insurance through the online exchange or marketplace is for just about anybody who doesn't have insurance or who is underinsured. This includes documented immigrants, even those who have

five years. Plus, undocumented parents can apply for health insurance for their child or children. You will be able to go online and easily find insurance options, compare costs, and buy health insurance online, in person, over the phone, or by mail. Health insurance companies will have representatives available to assist you, and there will also be Navigators who can help you, too. Navigators will be funded by state and federal grants. They will be trained and able to help you apply for insurance coverage

Between now and Oct. 1, discover more about Health Care Reform and the Exchange by exploring www. ExchangeFacts.org. Be sure to check back there often to get the most up-to-date information on Health Care Reform!



According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics's 2004 "Occupational Outlook Handbook," heating and airconditioning technician is the fastest-growing occupation for job seekers with a technical degree or formal apprenticeship training. What are the hours? What does it pay? What's an HVAC? Here's what you need to know to land this in-demand position.

The work

Picture Orlando, FL, without air conditioned office buildings, or Minneapolis, MN, minus heated homes, and you'll understand why this job is in demand. Heating and cooling technicians, also called HVAC (heating, ventilating and air conditioning) technicians, install commercial and residential systems, including: fuel and water supply lines, air ducts, vents and pumps. Furnace maintenance is a summer job to replace filters, ducts and other system components that accumulate harmful impurities during the winter. In the late fall, air conditioning mechanics complete essential upkeep, such as overhauling compressors and

checking Freon levels. Technicians generally specialize in installation or maintenance and repair, however, most are adept at both.

The training

Equipment is expensive, so employers hire candidates with a technical degree from a postsecondary trade school, junior/community college, or the U.S. Armed Forces. Programs run six months to two years, and students study design, electronics and the basics of installation, maintenance and repair. Apprenticeship programs are run in cooperation with the Arlington, VA,-based Air Conditioning Contractors of America, the National Association of Plumbing-Heating-Cooling Contractors in Falls Church, VA, or similar local groups. Running three to five years, these programs combine on-the-job training with classroom education.

business boom and technicians swoon: employers are looking for those who are able to work in extreme heat and cold, as well as those able to work in awkward and cramped spaces. Safety is the biggest issue, so make sure to emphasize a cautious nature and diligent use of proper safety equipment.

Nearly half of the 249,000 technicians worked for heating and cooling contractors in 2002, while another 15 percent were self-employed.

The hours


Forty hours a week is expected, but during summer and winter peaks, expect plenty of overtime. On-call technicians will work evenings and weekends — people won't wait on comfort.

The pay

Per-hour wage ranges between \$10.34 and \$26.20 an hour, with a national average of \$16.78 per hour.







Haiti-born Arnaud-Carr is an East Flatbush resident and social worker/family therapist and is one of a com-


mittee of 13 organizers of this brand new Mas Band that will compete in the small Band category.

Hispanic men.

She appointed an outside monitor to oversee major changes to the tactic, including reforms in policies, training and supervision. And she ordered a pilot program to test body-worn cameras in the some of the precincts where most stops occurred.

"The city's highest officials have turned a blind eye to the evidence that officers are conducting stops in a racially discriminatory manner," she wrote. "In their zeal to defend a policy that they believe to be effective, they have willfully ignored overwhelming proof that the policy of targeting 'the right people' is racially discriminatory."

But Bloomberg said police have done exactly what the courts and constitution allow to keep the city safe, reiterating the tactic was one tool that has helped drive down crime to record lows. The ruling could result, he said, in a return to the days of crime and mayhem, when murders hit an all-time high of 2,245

in 1990. Killings hit an all-time low of 418 in 2012.

Scheindlin refused to hear testimony on crime rates, and her ruling skewered the city's defense of the practice and argument that it effectively polices itself.

Stop and frisk has been around for decades in some form, but recorded stops increased dramatically under the Bloomberg administration to an all-time high in 2011 of 684,330, mostly of black and Hispanic men. The lawsuit was filed in 2004 by four men, all minorities, and became a class-action case.

About half the people who are stopped are subject only to questioning. Others have their bag or backpack searched, and sometimes police conduct a full pat-down. Only 10 percent of all stops result in arrest, and a weapon is recovered a small fraction of the time. Scheindlin noted she was not putting an end to the practice, which is constitutional, but was reforming the way the NYPD implemented its stops. The judge presided over a 10-week bench trial this year that included testimony from NYPD brass and a dozen people — 11 men and one woman — who said they were wrongly stopped because of their race. She found that nine of the 19 stops discussed in court were unconstitutional, and that an additional five stops included wrongful frisking.

In her long ruling, she determined at least 200,000 stops were made without reasonable suspicion, the necessary legal benchmark, lower than the standard of probable cause needed to justify an arrest. She said that rank-andfile officers were pressured by superiors to make stops and that police brass ignored mounting evidence that bad stops were being made. Witness Nicholas Peart, who wept on the stand during the trial as he described a frightening encounter with police, said Monday that he hoped the ruling would mean "tremendous steps forward."

Brooklyn celebrates Jamaica's 51st birthday

Jamaica's black, green and gold dominated the colorful plaza outside Brooklyn's Borough Hall on Aug. 6 when the distinctive banner raised above the New York City colors to mark the 51st anniversary of independence.

Nationals dressed in patriotic colors sported the distinctive brand wearing head to toe, designs which ranged from headscarf, eye-wear, neck-ties, jewelry, blouses, dresses, jackets and skirts, shoes, purses, clutch bags, handbags, umbrellas, fans etc. But the one that held the highest posture were the colors hoisted high above borough hall.

Positioned in the afternoon during a ceremony emceed by Ewayne McDonald, the consul general, a congressional representative, assembly-member and representatives for the bp's



office lauded the island for being first "in the Americas in the 20th century to claim independence from Britain."

On a sunny but breezy afternoon, visitors from as far away as Slovakia listened as McDonald quoted a poem by H.D. Cadbury before launching into the day's significance. He explained the significance of each color, lauded the island's national heroes, and praised military service-members for their contributions.

"We are the largest concentration of Jamaicans outside of Jamaica and for 51 years we have raised our own flag," he said.

About the presence of

Jamaicans here he lauded the contributions of everyone saying "wi nah kotch; wi neva cum fi drink di milk, wi cum fi own di cow."

His patois resonated with expats who identify with the unpretentious presentation he delivered.

According to McDonald, along with successes, Jamaicans have suffered set-backs – one being, the tragic loss of lives when the island was named the fifth largest victimized in 2001 when the World Trade Center's Twin Towers toppled.

"We are a proud people, and today, we are celebrating wi birthright."

With that said McDonald

introduced Consul General Herman G. Lamont, Congresswoman Yvette Clarke, Assemblyman N. Nick Perry, Deputy Borough President Sandra Chapman and Sophia Jones, the Caribbean liaison.

Prime Minister Portia Simpson-Miller sent personal salutations, and performances by the Brawta folk company entertained and titillated nostalgia with dialect verses composed by Louise Bennett.

From its debut earlier this year, Huggins-Jackson said the exciting, yet introspective, play has received "wonderful reviews" from Theatre- goers and critics alike. The play has its setting on a lush Caribbean island with birds, bees, radiant sun and sandy beaches, where a tragic story unfolds.

Huggins-Jackson said it's a story of greed, sexuality, incest and betrayal; a husband with a checkered past; a mother with riveting secrets beyond one's wildest imagination — secrets that took her from her once luxurious lifestyle in an affluent Caribbean neighborhood to the footholds of the underworld.

"As the story unfolds, you'll

be the judge of who is wrong or who is right, who is good or who is bad, or simply to the real meaning of 'never look down on a man unless you're picking him up' – the real meaning of 'never judge a book by its cover,'" Huggins-Jackson said.

He said "Truth B Told" will be played Off-Broadway on Aug. 30 and 31, and Sept. 1, 6, 7 and 8 at 7:30 p.m. each day.

Huggins-Jackson said the play will also premiere at Howard University in Washington, D.C. on Sept. 14.

He said he also plans to have the play premiere in Detroit and Atlanta, before heading to Tortola, British Virgin Islands, on Oct. 5, and St. Kitts and other Caribbean islands later on.

Huggins-Jackson said regional air carrier LIAT is sponsoring the cast's Caribbean air travels.

The playwright said partial proceeds from the Off-Broadway premiere will go towards construction of the Argyle International Airport in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

An emotionally-searing Civil Rights saga

"The Butler"

Eugene Allen (1919-2010) served eight presidents over the course of an enduring career in the White House during which he rose from the position of Pantry Man to Head Butler by the time he retired in 1986. In that capacity, the African-American son of a sharecropper felt privileged to be an eyewitness to history, since his tenure coincided with the implementation of most of the landmark pieces of legislation dismantling the Jim Crow system of racial segregation.

Directed by two-time Oscarnominee Lee Daniels, The Butler is a father-son biopic relating events in Allen's life as they unfolded against the backdrop of the Civil Rights Movement. This fictionalized account features Academy Award-winner Forest Whitaker in the title role as Cecil Gaines, and his A-list supporting cast includes fellow Oscar-winners Cuba Gooding, Jr., Jane Fonda, Vanessa Redgrave, Robin Williams and Melissa Leo, as well as nominees Terrence Howard and Oprah Winfrey.

The point of departure is a plantation in the Deep South, where Cecil witnesses his father's (David Banner) murder on the cotton field for protesting his mother's (Mariah Carey) rape at the hand of an overseer. Because the perpetrator was never brought to justice, the youngster gets the message at an early age that "Any white man could kill us at any time and not be punished for it"

Therefore, eager to avoid the same fate as his dad, he skips town as a teenager, settling in Washington, DC where he lands steady work

as a bartender in a hotel catering to an upscale clientele. There he also meets Gloria (Winfrey), the maid he would one day marry and start a family with.

Cecil's sterling reputation as a polite and deferential black man eventually reaches the White House,

where he takes a position on the express understanding that "You hear nothing. You see nothing. You only serve." Although he manages to maintain an inscrutably apolitical façade on the job, the same can't be said for the home front, where current events are freely debated.

There, Cecil finds himself increasingly at odds with his elder son, Louis (David Oyelowo), a civil rights activist inclined to participate in voter registration marches, sit-ins at segregated lunch counters and freedom bus rides. The simmering tension between the two builds over the years to the boiling point when Louis derisively refers to his as father an Uncle Tom.

At that juncture, Cecil's protective spouse intervenes to slap her son before uttering the moving line likely to land Oprah Winfrey another Academy Award nomination: "Everything you have, and everything you are, is because of that butler." However, Forest Whitaker is even more deserving of accolades, delivering a nonpareil performance as a humble provider understandably reluctant to rock the boat.

Kudos to Lee Daniels for crafting such a gut-wrenching tour de force which never hits a false note while chronicling critical moments in the African-American fight for equality.



Bringing her wealth of experience from Goddess International Mas, Kimber-


ley Simmons will unleash a barrage of skimpy twopiece ensembles decorated with tons of beads, feathers and glitter to dazzle the judges.

MOSCOW (AP) — Make room, Carl Lewis. You too, Michael Johnson.

Usain Bolt could join your elite company by the time these 2013 world championships are finished.

The hard-charging, fun-seeking Jamai-

can will chase two more world titles this week that could give him eight in his career, tying him with Lewis and Johnson for most all-time.

These days, Bolt hardly takes a backseat to them, or anyone else. Plus, he's in charge of rescuing a sport that's been recently riddled with doping offenses. Tyson Gay, Asafa Powell, Veronica Campbell-Brown and Sherone Simpson all tested positive weeks before the competition. Then, Trinidad and Tobago sprinter Kelly-Ann Baptiste withdrew from the 100



because she's involved in a doping case, her federation said Monday.

Another doping cloud hovering over track.

"Every time drugs are brought up, it's hurtful to the sport. I hate it," said former sprinter Maurice Greene, who has won five world titles. "Track needs stars like Bolt. But he's not the only person in this sport that's a star. We have plenty of stars. But it's good that he shows his personality. He's able to have fun with the crowd. That's why people gravitate to him. That's why they love him.

"More than that, you need to have great races to overcome all of that (bad) news."

Bolt's rain-soaked performance Sunday night certainly qualifies as a memorable race.

Usually, Bolt provides the magnetism on the track. This time, Mother Nature took care of it with flashes of lightning off in the distance.

In stormy conditions, Bolt rallied after falling behind Justin Gatlin to recapture his 100 title. Sun, rain, heat, whatever, the conditions really don't matter because the fastest man on the planet always seems in his element whenever he sets foot on the track.

"I continue to work on my aim to become a legend by collecting gold medals and athlete of year titles," Bolt said.

He may already be there.

"For right now, yeah, you have to say he is the best," said Greene, who stood at a booth and signed autographs for nearly an hour, just across from a giant cutout of Bolt that had fans lining up to take photos. "Look at his race last night. He showed why he's a champion, because he's able to overcome everything and come

This also was a form of redemption, considering he false-started during the final in South Korea two years ago.

"I wanted to do a better time, but was not able to because of the weather," Bolt said of Sunday's race. "Not singing in the rain, but running in the rain."

Jamaican sprinter takes gold at world championships

By Raf Casert

MOSCOW (AP) — This U.S.-Jamaican sprint rivalry is turning into a rout at the world championships.

With her long hot-pink hair slashing in the air behind her, Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce captured the 100 meters Monday with a winning margin of Boltesque proportions.

Fraser-Pryce sped to an early lead that kept growing and finished in a world-leading 10.71 seconds. She even had time to clench and pump her fist as she crossed the line

Silver medalist Murielle Ahoure of the Ivory Coast trailed by a massive 0.22 seconds, more than double the previous top margin in 30 years of world championships. Defending champion Carmelita Jeter of the United States took bronze the in 10.94.

Like the mighty Usain Bolt, who won the 100 on Sunday, Fraser-Pryce now has two Olympic and two world titles in the 100 at the same age of 26

"I am Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce. I compare myself to nobody," the Jamaican said. "What Usain has, he has. What I have is hard work."

What Bolt certainly doesn't have is hair extensions sent over from a Jamaican hairdresser: "It makes me pretty prettier."

Before a sparse crowd at Luzhniki Stadium, she gave Jamaica a 2-0 lead over the Americans in the sprint duel, showing the Caribbean island produces the fastest runners on the planet.

While Bolt is a slow starter and the greatest of finishers, Fraser-Pryce reacts to the gun like few others.

"Most persons in the race are closers, when they get to 70 and 60 they are opening up," Fraser-Pryce said. "But I knew I had an advantage. And that was my start. And that

was what I focused on."

By the end, the others could only watch her tresses flap across the line, pretty in pink.

The U.S. got its part of the glory, too, when David Oliver led a 1-2 finish in the 110 hurdles with Ryan Wilson second. It would have been a clean sweep had defending champion Jason Richardson not stumbled near the end and fell back to fourth.

Unlike Fraser-Pryce, Christine Ohuruogu never led in her race until the last moment of the 400 final to beat defending champion Amantle Montsho by fourthousandths of a second. She set a British record to regain the world title she first won in 2007, dipping at the line to cap a great comeback.

"When I finished I didn't know if I'd won it. I didn't want to get over-excited until my name came up," Ohuruogu said.

Montsho said she was beaten by an elementary error thinking she had won before crossing the line.

"I did not see Christine coming from behind," Montsho said. "If I knew that I would push my chest forward and would have made it."

At the end of Day 3 at

the championships, the U.S. leads the medals standings with three gold and six overall. Germany is second with four medals overall after Raphael Holzdeppe upset Olympic champion Renaud Lavillenie of France on a countback to win the pole vault.

In the shot put, Valerie

Adams became the first woman to win four straight individual world titles.

The Olympic champion from New Zealand won with a toss of 68 feet, 6 inches. She has now won 38 straight events and has won every major championship at least twice.





Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges "Consu-mers must also question legitimacy of classifieds because too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party.
