Ready For A Fight



Determined to extract millions from European nations which were involved in the cruel and humiliating Trans Atlantic slave trade, Caribbean trade bloc nations Wednesday equated the compensation fight for reparations as equal to the struggle for political independence in the 1960s in the clearest sign yet that they are bracing for a protracted fight with their former colonizers.

The governments communicated this in the final communiqué of a reparations and genocide conference they organized in St. Vincent last week. The final document communicating decisions taken and the thoughts from the key inception meeting were released by the Guyana-based bloc headquarters early Wednesday.

It said that the region has not "embarked on a journey of such magnitude and import for the future development of the people and region since the Caribbean struggles for independence," calling the three-day conference the first step in a long road to win compensation for the genocide and cruelty suffered by Africans during the slave trad-

Antigua

Recently, Minister of National Security, Dr. Errol Cort, revealed in the Upper House of Parliament his ministry's intention to address several issues at the prison in Antigua, following a protest by inmates.

A meeting took place recently, between Prison Superintendent Percy Adams, the prison matron, chief officer, a junior prison officer, and a delegation of six inmates who represented the prison population.

During the meeting several grievances were voiced, such as concerns about the amount, and type of food being served, the lack

of proper sanitation, increased monthly visitation, recreation and rehabilitation programs.



Speaking in parliament, Cort said the prison superintendent is open to adjusting the visitation situation and finding ways in which special recommendations can be made.

It was also decided that the prison superintendent will deal with all matters of convicts' infringements of prison rules rather than having officers administer punishment.

The move by security officials follows a protest at the prison in reaction to a routine search of the prison's cell Block C. Reportedly, 113 inmates became displeased with the way in which the search was conducted and called for a meeting with Adams in the prison yard.

Barbados

Barbados is one step closer to improving domestic violence legislation.

Minister of Labor, Social Security and Human Resource Development, Senator Dr. Esther Byer-Suckoo, disclosed that the Freundel Stuart-led Cabinet recently accepted rec-

ommendations to update the Domestic Violence (Protection Orders) Act.



Her disclosure has come in the wake of recent deaths which have been a consequence of domestic violence. She explained that the much needed changes are expected to bring that piece of legislation in line with current best practices,

and will offer greater protection for all victims of domestic abuse, including children.

The labor minister made the comments while delivering an address at the start of the International Labor Organization's Sub-Regional workshop on gender equality for judges in the Caribbean, which is taking place at the Hilton Hotel until Friday.

The minister added that those points were among several made in the recent review of the Domestic Violence (Protection Orders) Act. She explained that the recommendations accepted by the Cabinet emanated from that review, which was done by a Committee comprising members of the judiciary, nongovernmental organizations, the Welfare Department, the Institute of Gender and Development Studies, the Barbados Bar Association and legal consultants.

Dr. Byer-Suckoo further explained that among the deficiencies which have been identified by the committee, are that the Act does not make provision for persons in visiting relationships, or for the sexual orientation of the partners. Moreover, she noted that there are some definitions in the

present legislation which need to be expanded, for there to be better application of the law by the relevant authorities.

Guyana

Guyana and Suriname say they will jointly patrol a disputed river border to crack down on piracy and smuggling.

The announcement comes after military and police officials met in Suriname to talk about an increase in crime along the Corentyne River on South America's shoulder.

Guyana Revenue Authority Director Kurshid Sattaur says officials have collected only about \$5

million in taxes in the past three years. He says he believes millions of dollars are lost because



boats carrying large smuggled goods such as top-shelf liquors and flat screen televisions do not pay import duties.

Guyana Defense Force Chief Rear Admiral Gary Best said recently that the patrols will also extend to the Atlantic Ocean. He says piracy has claimed more than a dozen lives in the past two years.

Haiti

Haiti moved closer recently to reconstituting a military that was abolished in 1995.

In a small ceremony in the farming village of Petite Rivere de L'Aritibonite, Defense Minister Jean – Rodolphe Joazile greeted the first 41 recruits who recently returned from eight months of training in Ecuador. They will be the first members of a national military force that the government of President

Michel Martelly wants to revive.

Joazile said they will spend

three months working alongside Ecuadorean military engineers among the rice fields in central Haiti to repair roads and work on other public service projects in their impoverished country, which was hit by a devastating earthquake three years ago.

"Almost all of those in the new unit are recent high school graduates. They include 30 soldiers, 10 engineers and one officer and will report to the Defense Ministry. They won't carry weapons for now but could carry handguns, in three to four years, if either the recruits pay for the weapon themselves or the government receives financing to do so," he said.

The military support from Ecuador is part of a broader effort to help Haiti to rebuild from the 2010 earthquake, Ecuadorean Maj. Marco Nayas said.

Navis said Ecuador has given more than \$30 million to Haiti since the disaster to develop the country's infrastructure.

Brazil has expressed interest in training 1,500 more recruits, Joazile said.

Five hundred would go to Brazil, and a 1,000 would stay in Haiti. Martelly pledged to restore the National Armed Forces of Haiti while he was a candidate in the 2011 election, but he has backed off the plan as president. Some foreign diplomats have said the Haitian government rather should focus on strengthening its police force, for which there are only 10,000 officers in a country of 10 million people.

The government abolished the military under President Jean-Bertrand Aristide after years of military coups and human rights abuses. It would require a vote by Parliament to officially reconstitute an army.

Jamaica

Politicians, lawyers and academics gathered recently to advance a united effort by more than a dozen Caribbean nations to seek slavery reparations from three European nations.

The regional conference in St Vincent was the first major step at advancing the reparations effort since the Caribbean Community organization announced it in July. Representatives from all the 15 member nations and territories are attending the gathering.

St. Vincent Prime Minister Ralph Gonsalves told attendees

recently that the matter of reparations is a "fundamental, defining matter of our age."



British lawyer Martyn Day says the Caribbean nations are seeking to negotiate a settlement "based on the impact of slavery on Caribbean societies today." But he says if that does not succeed they will go to the International Court of Justice.

Vigil for woman left to die in Brooklyn cell

It was the pure insensitive mindset of the NYPD that may have caused the death of 37-year-old Kyam Livingston in a Brooklyn Central Booking Cell on July 21, 2013. NYPD's persistent insensitive and reckless behaviors towards people of color fuel deaths and as long as people are continuously being treated like cattle and herded into these institutions these enisodes will occur.

these episodes will occur. Several cases of unnecessary deaths at the hands of NYPD continue to permeate the news and showcase a blatant disregard for Black and Hispanic life. And that gut wrenching, blood curdling wail of a mother, symbolizing the affect of death and pain, pierced the core of every human soul and filled the air around the courthouse at 120 Schermerhorn St., as family, friends and clergy held a vigil on Aug. 22 and again in the Flatbush community on Saturday afternoon, to mark the one month and two anniversary of Kyam Livingston's death. Anita Neal mourned for her daughter Kyam who was arrested on July 20 by officers from the 70th Precinct. According to witnesses, Kyam was processed and taken to Central Booking. While there, she became increasingly ill with stomach pains, diarrhea and eventual convulsions over a seven hour period. Cell mates pleaded for hours with NYPD for someone to come to her aid. Kvam

Nobody will rest until I get justice for Kyam. My daughter will not die for nothing...Sorry I wasn't there Kyam, I would have helped you...I love you Kyam....

Family Attorney Elliot H. Taub and Criminal Defense Attorney Jay Schwitzman talked about the abhorrent conditions in central Booking. Attorney Schwitzman, who worked with clients in the building for twenty-five years, was appalled at the labels that are being used to describe their deceased client. She is accused of being an alcoholic and one who suffered from seizures, which the familv vehemently denies.

for countries with high debt to reduce their fiscal and external imbalances, the private sector must take a lead role in investment and growth," said the Washington-based financial institution in a statement.

"The Caribbean has inherent strengths and comparative advantages in key sectors that have not been fully exploited and that hold considerable potential as sources of economic growth in the near term," it added.

The statement comes on the heels of the just-concluded 2013 High Level Caribbean Forum, "Building Growth into the Caribbean Sustainability Agenda," in Nassau, Bahamas.

At the conference, highlevel Caribbean officials and representatives from international and regional financial institutions stressed the importance of private-sector led activity, furthering economic integration and continued efforts in structural reforms to kick-start growth in the region.

The forum, a follow-up to the 2012 conference in Trinidad and Tobago on rethinking policy priorities, brought together policymakers and officials from the region.

Hosted by the government of the Bahamas, the conference was convened by the IMF in collaboration with the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB), the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), the International Finance Corporation (IFC) and the World Bank.

"The theme of this year's conference is a direct response to feedback at the 2012 Forum where policymakers underscored the need for renewed growth as the necessary anchor to a viable future and to fiscal sustainability," noted Alejandro Werner, director of the Western Hemisphere Department at the IMF.

Werner said the forum also responded to the request of Caribbean authorities for international financial institutions (IFIs) and other development partners to

collaborate and ensure consistent policy advice, "so as to forge a coherent, holistic approach to reviving growth."

The IMF said the first priority for policymakers is to implement measures to enhance the business environment, such as reducing bureaucratic processes, and lower costs.

"Public private partnerships (PPPs) can play a role in raising much needed investment and funding of infrastructure projects," it said.

"While the political will exists, the region will need more information on cost and benefits of PPPs, in some cases reforms to the legal frameworks, and greater effort to build consensus among key stakeholders and the public," it added.

"The end goal should be to achieve the best risk sharing between public sector balance sheets and the private sector," it continued.

The IMF said reforms to the labor market hold "considerable potential," stating that research has showed that "removing rigidities to wage-setting could have important positive effects on employment and growth.

The IMF said a key element in the path forward is to strengthen integration to help share and lower fixed costs, and to increase trade integration.

"The IMF, together with its sister institutions, is committed to working with member governments on many of these constructive ideas," it added.

As expressed by the Bahamas Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, Perry Christie, "the IFIs and the IMF need to be flexible in their surveillance and lending operations with small states given their special characteristics and needs."

In, this regard, IMF Deputy Managing Director Nemat Shafik reiterated that the Washington-based financial institution is pursuing analysis and policy work "tailored specifically to the needs of small states."

He said IMF staff will work with small states to "ensure more focus on growth" in their Fund-supported programs.

Leaders had announced plans to throw the backing of regional governments for the very first time behind the fight for reparations at their main annual summit in July saying the time had come to face up to the issue once and for all.

The final conference documents said that the meeting ended with a resolve to have follow-up sessions "within a reasonable time-frame to ensure that the momentum started in St. Vincent could be accelerated."

It also said that countries which have not yet fully set up their national reparations committees should do so quickly. The governments also indicated that they plan to formally write European countries by year end "to at least seek to begin a conversation on the issue with them."

Twelve countries including the US Virgin Islands attended the key first meeting in addition to representatives from France's colonies in the Caribbean, Guadeloupe and Martinique as well as Canada, Britain, the US and The Netherlands.

The communiqué stated that based on a presentation from a UK law firm as to how tough it would be to fight such a case, it has now become obvious that "this effort would require a regional consortium of experts in law, research and academia. It was also emphasized that any legal effort must be coupled with the mobilization of our people and an intensification of the political and diplomatic outreach," it said.

Some conference attendees gave credit and praises to host prime Minister Ralph Gonsalves, the regional Rastafarian movement and respected Caribbean academics like Sir Hilary Beckles of the University of the West Indies for helping the region to reach this stage through their intense lobbying over the years and academic research that will not be used by the reparations movement.



PORT OF SPAIN, Sept. 23. 2013 (IPS) - Dalchan Singh, a root crop farmer and board member of the Agricultural Society of Trinidad and Tobago, says the past year has seen drastic changes in the weather of this twin-island Caribbean nation.

Normally, the rainy season starts in June and continues during the months of July and August, he explained, then eases up until November when the rains start again.

"As a region we do little to collect, preserve and improve our local germplasm." -- Dr. Humberto Gomez of IICA

"But this year was not so," Singh told IPS. "For two months, we had a lot of sun and very little rain. It is only about August that we started to get rain." He added, "This year when you

get rain, it is very powerful, and when you get sun, it is very dry, hot sun. This year is very different."

Crops grow more slowly when they do not get enough rain at the correct time, he said. Conversely, the heavy, powerful showers the country experienced this year killed some of the crops such as the pigeon peas and caused some of the root crop to rot.

Local farmers say the unpredictability of the weather is making it almost impossible to determine what crops can safely be planted when.

Climate change is also creating an additional challenge in terms of the pests farmers have to deal with. Khemraj Singh, president of the Felicity Farmers Association in Chaguanas, Trinidad, explains that when there are two or three weeks of steady rain, any

attempt to eradicate pests using chemicals is useless since the rain washes away the pesticides.

At the same time, said farmer Hudson Mahabir, "there are some positives to climate change" in controlling pests, since "heavy rainfall reduces thrips", a winged insect that feeds on

However, when there is a mix of heavy rainfall and hot sunshine, "it creates the ideal situation for fungus and bacteria to multiply," he added.

Farmers throughout the Caribbean are seeing changes in seasonal weather patterns, which began to become apparent about eight years ago, and now find themselves battling more intense flooding, on the one hand, and dry hot weather, on the other.



Go Red Multicultural scholarships

To The Editor:

Tuition hikes at colleges and universities and across the nation are forcing many students to find new ways to pay for higher education.

In an effort to ease the burden and increase the number of underrepresented minorities in medicine, the American Heart Association's Go Red For WomenTM and Macy's, its national sponsor, offer the Go Red^{TM} Multicultural Scholarship Fund.

The fund — now in its third year — provides 16 \$2,500 scholarships for multicultural women pursuing college or graduate school degrees in healthcare fields. Besides easing the financial burden for students, the American Heart Association and its supporters are striving to increase the number of underrepresented minorities in medicine and increase culturally-sensitive, patient-centered care.

Candidates must be an African-American, Hispanic, Asian or other female minority college student pursuing a medical, nursing or allied healthcare degree. Candidates must complete an application, personal essay and submit two letters of recommendation. Online applications are available now through Dec. 31, 2013.

The number of minority medical school graduates is increasing steadily, according to the Association of American Medical Colleges. However, the figures are still low compared with the population at large.

Only 5.4 percent of African-American and 3.6 percent of Hispanic nurses in the nation are registered nurses, according to the 2010 Bureau of Labor Statistics. In contrast, minorities make up 36.6 percent of the U.S. population.

Numerous ethnic groups including African-Americans and Hispanics — are disproportionately affected by cardiovascular disease and risk factors. They also face barriers to diagnosis and care and experience worse health outcomes than Caucasians.

Patients like to receive medical care by providers who can speak their same language and understand their cultural background. Meeting the needs of ethnically diverse patients leads not only to better quality of care, but it also provides opportunities to improve the health of underserved minorities.

The Go RedTM Multicultural Scholarship is made possible by the Macy's Multicultural Fund, which was created in 2009 to focus on increasing diversity in the medical field.

Who's To Blame

To The Editor:

Partnership for National Unity blames the People's Progressive Party/Civic for the current wave of criminal violence, social unrest and an impending constitutional crisis. The violence and unrest have occurred largely because of the PPP/C's chronic mismanagement of public security. Social unrest has been triggered by failures in public works, public health and public schools. The constitutional crisis is arising out of the Executive attitude to the decisions of the Legislature.

Public security and human safety are deteriorating, as recent Guyana Police Force statistics confirm. The PPP/C must bear responsibility for the 10 per cent increase in the number of armed robberies involving the use of firearms and the six per cent increase in serious crimes at the end of August.

The rise in crime is the direct result of the PPP/C's failure to implement the UK £4.9M Security Sector Reform Action Plan, the National Drug Strategy Master Plan and the recommendations of the Disciplined Forces Commission. The PPP/C has failed to recruit, retrain, re-equip and reform the Police Force and provide it with adequate aviation and maritime assets.

The public education system is plagued by problems. Many children were unable to start classes on the first day

of the new school term. Public protests at La Parfaite Harmonie, Moblissa, Port Kaituma, St Agnes and elsewhere have called attention to the poor preparations made for the new academic vear.

Sporadic protests by citizens continue to erupt to condemn chronic abuses and grievances. Irate residents blocked access to the 58 km-long Ituni-Kwakwani road to protest its deplorable condition. Minibus drivers in Bartica expressed their anger after a key road became almost impassable.

The failure of the public health system has resulted in the death of a child from diarrhoea at Masakenari, a Wai Wai village in the Rupununi Region. That death is a reminder of the still un-investigated deaths of ten other children from gastro enteritis earlier this year in the Barima-Waini Region.

The PPP/C Executive, in light of its attitude over the past 20 months, seems bent on precipitating a collision with the Legislature. The President, as early as June 2012, uttered prejudicial remarks with regard to his preparedness to assent to bills and act on resolutions of the National Assembly. The Leader of the Opposition has now written to the Clerk on this matter. The Speaker has also written to the President in an attempt to avert a grave constitutional

The PPP/C administration continues to delude itself into thinking that it can impose an obsolete, over-centralised model of governance and direct management of local communities. This is exemplified by the central government's arrogant attitude towards the National Assembly and its atrocious treatment of municipalities, regional democratic councils and neighbourhood democratic councils.

The PPP/C, evidently, has underestimated the consequences of its policies over the past 20 years. It seems not to understand that an unprecedented number of people in this country are now living in slums, squatter settlements, shantytowns and depressed villages. The poorest people particularly the unemployed youth – and the poorest parts of the country are generally badly served by poor security and poor public services. It is a result of its misguided policies and misplaced priorities that the administration has created an unacceptably unstable, unsafe and unhappy situation in the country today

Not a very flattering legacy to leave

We can at best hope that there will come a time when generations, perhaps yet unborn, will look back on the current state of the country's politics with utter disdain and thankful that this run of sick behavior among the political class burned itself out, although not before the landscape had been hideously scarred. To contemplate the alternative – that the descent into our present hell will be a condition sustained for the long haul – is to commit those generations yet to come to an unremitting bleakness.

It's ironic that the meltdown bringing us face-to-face with the soggy mess that is what now passes for the conduct of affairs of state, has come just when the nation trotted out, for the world to bear witness, the choice plum in defense of its boast as the supreme embodiment of democracy in action. That being, of course, the election of Barack Obama five years ago. But in the wake of which, whoever may have held a conviction that this was an accident of history that wasn't supposed to occur when it did, must think their instincts may have been right after all.

In this age of Obama we have been forced, like never before, to

zero in on the whole concept of representation of the people, given its all too frequent slide into travesty. We have had to question whether, across the board in the society, respect for the presidency is indeed a given. We have seen the business of governance reduced to reckless pursuit of extreme, irresponsible actions, with scant regard for potentially catastrophic consequences.

The Affordable Care Act has been passed by the Congress, signed into law by the president and even reaffirmed as the law of the land by the Supreme Court. Republicans in the House of Representatives have, on 42 occasions now, passed legislation in that chamber to delegitimize the Affordable Care Act, knowing full well said legislation was going nowhere in the Democratic controlled Senate and, in the unlikely event it did, that it would face the president's certain veto. Republicans alone, presumably, could come up with the answer for what makes this puerile indulgence a valid use of the time they sought voters' consent to spend on Capitol Hill. The re-write that was done for performance No. 42 last week, though, made for better theater, supposedly. At the very

least, threatening to shut down the government would tend to guarantee a larger and more engaged audience.

Some have suggested that maybe it is a fear of how positive and necessary the new healthcare measure will prove to be that has triggered this high-octane blowback against it. Polling on the Affordable Care Act has come up with the curious finding of an apparent kneeierk objection to it, but support for its core constituent elements - a clear indication of the public not being in tune with what the Act entails. Whether or not there is in fact a creeping suspicion among Republicans that a public embrace of the measure will build following the October 1 rollout, what's obvious even to many Republicans is that attempting to hold the new program hostage over a government shutdown threat is self-defeating political strategy.

But we've seen this movie before:

renegade Republicans in the House aggressively assuming the role of tail wagging the dog that is the full caucus. There is constant comment about the House leadership's inability to control this rump, whose fondness for extremist positions on matters up for consideration has become a staple of the GOP's way to go, ever since they gained majority status in 2011. More concerning about this hard-line posse is that they represent districts that have been sliced and diced to become fitting extensions of the obstructionminded lot sitting in Washington. Nothing more loudly speaks to the need for reform in the process of drawing Congressional Districts.

Shutting down the government is a reckless action that not only impacts the U.S., but has world-wide repercussions. The push for a move of such callous indifference, coming reportedly from the Tea Party Republicans who probably take comfort in being accurate barometers of their districts' prevailing sentiment, only underscores how misguided (or worse) is their understanding of informed representation. Seeing as how a plausible circumstance justifying the shutdown of government isn't

very likely, the member of Congress opting to go there is clearly quite a bit less than the ultimate patriot he or she purports to be. Ditto, the member of Congress proffering the "reflecting my district" line as cover. If constituents don't have it right, the representative's responsibility to be a torch bearer, provide enlightenment, is part of the deal. If he can't or won't, that's another story.

Regrettably, we've had way too much of the latter narrative. Irreverence for civility and compromise in the conduct of government business has become much the norm. Two GOP-authored government shutdowns in a period of divided government in the 1990s. Multiple eleventh hour escapes from meltdowns since the current divided government chapter commenced in 2011, with the threats of similar drama attending Washington's functioning very much on the radar right now. There's a level of meanspiritedness that has made its way into the forum, the perpetrators of which should rightly be banished. Not just for the sake of today's witnesses to this routine lack of grace. But for its unflattering imprint for the ages.





Early detection key to fighting breast cancer

Statistics show that one in eight women in the United States will develop invasive breast cancer in her lifetime, and of these women, 85 percent will have had no family history of the disease. Therefore, regular breast cancer screening is important to ensure that if cancerous cells develop, they are identified early enough for effective treatment. Early detection often means that the cancer is still confined to the breast and has not yet spread throughout the body, offering a greater opportunity for a successful outcome.

There are several types of breast cancer screening exams: breast self-examination, mammograms, and sonograms.

Breast self-examinations should be performed on a monthly basis by all adult women, beginning in their early 20s. Many women find it helpful to perform a breast self-exam in the shower the week following their menstrual cycle. Regular breast self-exams help women to learn what is normal for their bodies, so if there is ever a change, they can imme-

diately report it to their doctors for further examination.

Mammograms are recommended annually for women ages 40 and over. A mammogram is an X-ray examination that usually takes two pictures of each breast. It requires a woman to place her breasts between two plates, in order to flatten them and obtain a sharper image.

"Women who receive mammograms at New York Methodist Hospital can trust that they will work with a compassionate medical staff using the most advanced breastimaging technology available," said Dr. Steven Garner.

Women under the age of 40 may have breasts that are too dense for an accurate mammogram screening. However, younger women with a family history of breast cancer who need annual screenings can be tested using a sonogram exam. Sonograms of the breast use sound waves that provide an image of the tissue inside the breast. They also limit early exposure to ra-

diation



Brooklyn loves books and their writers

"There are over a dozen Caribbean or Caribbean-Americans in this book fair." beamed E. Wayne McDonald, artistic director of the Caribbean Cultural Theatre, as he finished up his conversation with Jamaican author Diana McCaulay outside of Brooklyn Borough Hall.

On this bright and inviting Sunday, the eighth annual Brooklyn Book Festival chalked up another extraordinarily successful

The festival attracted thousands who perused the 200-plus booths of publishers, independent authors, writers' associations and bookstores, snaking along the paths outside of Borough Hall. The readings, discussions and panels at the Festival's outdoor stages and surrounding indoor venues were more popular than ever.

Earlier that day, writer McCaulay spoke on the panel entitled "Rolling the Dice" where the authors' fictionalized main characters do risky business. In McCaulay's book Huracan (hurricane god of Mayan mythology), the main character returns to Jamaica and grapples with: where does she fit and is this still home?

Concepts of power were addressed in the novels by the authors on the Idols, Gods and Kings panel where Cuban-American author and former journalist Cristina Garcia spoke of a fictionalized Fidel in her "King of Cuba." From her imagination, she explored the substance of life behind the scenes. "People's lives are their secret lives, not just those in public," she said. Writer Teddy Wayne and renowned octogenarian author Tom Wolfe also dia-

logued with her.

Other Caribbean authors prominent on their respective panels included Guyanese, now from Grenada, Oonya Kempadoo (All



Decent Animals) who is teaching this year in Connecticut as a Fulbright Scholar and Jamaican Colin Channer (Lover's Rock) who combines political affairs of

the day and sensuality.

Antiguan writer Jamaica Kincaid, her fifth novel "See Now and Then" published this year, was a no-show due to personal emergencies.

A festival regular, former Brooklynite and MacArthur Foundation (Genius Award) recipient Edwidge Danticat participated on two panels. In the second one, Writers Against the Surveillance State, she, as did the five other writers, WNYC radio journalist Leonard Lopate, and whistle blower Tom Drake, read others writings on this subject.

Danticat read from Bertolt Brecht's essay, We, Nineteen, referring to the Hollywood nineteen called before the Congressional Committee on their communist affiliations. After having testified, Brecht reflects that the publicqueried writers had "a Cold Execution" in the form of the black list and while not deprived of their life, they were prevented from working in the film industry, their means of life. He wrote that his colleagues were protected by the Constitution but the Constitution was not protected, as those called to testify and the public learned.

More than 250 authors participated at 13 presentation venues including a teen stage and a children's tent.

comprehensive improvements, championed by BSRC and financed by a \$20 million investment from the City of New York, include the renovation and redesign of Restoration Plaza, milelong streetscape improvements, and the creation of new wi-fi accessible public plazas with public art. The revitalization also generated an additional more than \$100 million in housing and commercial investment by the private sector to create close to 300 mixed-income housing units and over 40,000 square feet of commercial space on the major thoroughfare of Brooklyn within Bedford-Stuyvesant.

"Restoration has always been at the forefront of improving Bedford-Stuyvesant and providing opportunities for its residents," said Colvin W. Grannum, CEO & President of BSRC, "This neighborhood revitalization project will not only provide Bed-Stuy residents with an opportunity to enjoy the neighborhood's beauty and culture, but will also provide housing, business opportunities and shopping destinations for the people of our community and its visitors. Rooms are divided into nooks and crannies, making dining cozy and fun. One room includes a garden-like setting, where greenery dangles from above, and sunlight streams through the windows of the ceiling.

Even if you are not seated inside this lovely area, a windowed wall towards the back of the restaurant allows the beautiful view.

Tables are adorned with bright green table cloths and napkins, contributing to the spring-like ambiance.

The Greenhouse Cafe has been around for more than 30 years, and it has long been the restaurant to go to for an outstanding meal, at a reasonable price. It still is.

Incredibly, the Greenhouse Cafe offers an Early Bird \$19.95 menu, Mondays through Saturdays, from 11:30 am to 6 pm. It includes

appetizer, entrée, dessert & coffee. Portions are generous, so it's a real steal.

Select from appetizers that include options such as zuppa de mussels in a red or white sauce, eggplant rolletini, stuffed mushroom, Caesar salad, fresh fruit plate, garden salad, or an incredible seafood salad.

The latter is a heaping plate of mussels, the most tender calamari rings, huge shrimp, and clams. Sprinkle on some hot sauce, and the feast begins. Even the garden salad is no small dish of leaves — it's a generous mix of greens, sliced cucumbers, olives, and radishes, served with your choice of dressing.

A delicious sliced steak, cooked with a bordelaise sauce, is one of the entree options. The meat is tender and juicy. Select a side of mashed or baked potatoes, French fries, or rice. A mix of fresh vegetables is also included. You couldn't prepare a feast like this at home for \$19.95

— and Greenhouse does all the shopping, chopping, and cooking for you.

Other options tempt, too a roast loin of pork with baconkraut, cooked in a bass ale gravy; sauteed shrimp scampi; and favorites such as chicken parmesan and française. On the lighter side, indulge in an avocado salad, surrounded with slices of mango, tomato, and sliced peppers, topped with a lavish piece of grilled salmon. Or, enjoy a broiled tilapia; or perhaps a balsamic grilled chicken, served with broccoli rabe and Yukon gold potatoes.

When it comes to dessert there's a warm brownie, drizzled with chocolate, and surrounded by whipped cream awaits — one of many possibilities.

Counting calories? No problem. A dessert of fresh fruit is served on a clear dish, so the colors of the red strawberries, green grapes, oranges, watermelon, cantaloupe, and pineapple, shine.

Should you prefer to dine at a later hour, the Greenhouse Cafe offers a \$26 menu, Mondays through Saturdays, that starts at 4 pm; and on Sundays, starting at 2 pm. You'll enjoy three courses: appetizer, entree, and dessert. A number of the options from the \$19.95 menu are on this menu as well, along with additional choices such as vegetable lasagna; seafood linguini; veal scaloppini; boneless shell steak; and fried shrimp.

When it comes to desserts, there's apple strudel, cheesecake, chocolate mousse pie, fresh fruit plate, ice cream, and sherbets. Oh la la.

The elegant mahogany bar remains the central focus of the main room, an inviting place to enjoy a drink before or after dinner. It's also a gathering spot for those looking for some good conversation and a nightcap.

There's live music on the weekends. On Wednesdays, come for karaoke.

Sunday brunch is always

a favorite. For \$25, you'll get unlimited brunch cocktail, appetizer, entree, dessert, and coffee or tea. Crepes, omelets, salads, pancakes, and steak and eggs are among the options.

Murder rise in the Bahamas

In the face of the recent dramatic rise in murders and violent attacks, National Security Minister Dr. Bernard Nottage announced that all police officers on New Providence will immediately be placed on 12 hour shifts

Additionally, he said 150 Defense Force Marines will be immediately deployed to assist with the crime fight.

"This will have the effect of doubling the number of officers on the frontline," he said during a press conference at police headquarters.

"Secondly, all officers on the police band, as a consequence of this, have been deployed to front line policing. Further, I wish to advise members of the public that for the time being, all requests for the use of the police band have been suspended."

The announcement of the initiatives, which took effect recently, came as Nottage acknowledged that gang and turf wars have fueled the recent increase in violence. In the past two weeks, 13 people have been murdered.

Nottage added that police officers serving in administrative and support service capacities will also be deployed to the front line.

"We must and will flush out from among us the criminals along with their illegal firearms and drugs which seem to be fueling crime."

The minister said significant resources have been added to the Homicide Unit of the Central Detective Unit (CDU). The Armed Robbery Unit and Drug Enforcement Unit (DEU) has also be adjusted and enhanced, he said.

The initiatives will result in an increase of up to 350 officers on the front lines, Nottage said.

"We must and will flush out from among us the criminals along with their illegal firearms and drugs which seem to be fueling crime," he said.

As it relates to resources, Nottage said the government has ordered additional patrol cars and has pledged to provide the force with additional man power and resources as needed.

"The government of The Bahamas is deeply troubled by the murders that have taken place in our country and what appears to be the wanton disregard for human life, law and order," Nottage said. "The violence and lawlessness poses a very real danger to our peace and stability.

He said the government is currently in talks with the judiciary in an effort to determine how it can keep criminals off the streets.

The national security minister noted that the government also started the process to increase the judiciary's capacity to try cases.

There is going to be no letup in the fight against crime,"Nottage said.



Official state funeral set for Mayor Charlton

The Jamaican cabinet unanimously decided to honor the legacy of Cecil Charles Charlton, CD, JP -one of the island's most popular mayor and city champions by sending him off with a state funeral.

Reportedly, Governor General Sir Patrick Allen, Prime Minister Portia Simpson Miller, the opposition's Member of Parliament Audley Shaw as well as dignitaries and representatives from both political parties are expected to speak.

The much loved former mayor of Mandeville died Sept. 12 and will be buried Oct. 6 in his beloved parish.

Of the 32 parishes throughout the nation, in no other city is a mayor is as revered as Mayor Charlton. Long after his retirement more than two decades ago, the title remains a first-name and permanent fixture.

How such an indelible title became a fixture might be fodder for a biopic or feature

The number one citizen of the city of Mandeville, lived a



kind of rags to riches existence Hollywood reveres.

And for a Caribbean man -13th child born – and raised on the generosity of the Salvation Army to emerge a millionaire is certainly a script worthy of high definition and even 3-D viewing.

He was the last of 13 children born to a humble couple on April 6, 1925.

He attended public school but dropped out at the age of 11 allegedly due to low finances.

Introduced to horse-racing at the age of 12, the young Charlton immersed himself deeply in the business of the sport. His gamble paid off handily and in the process he operated a chain of outlets he named Charles Off-course betting.

In and out of the city of Mandeville his betting shops

grew opening in many towns throughout the country.

Legend claims he acquired many race-horses, numbering at peak to 45 equestrian winners conditioned by five different trainers in 1977. In 1976 he was crowned a champion owner with 33 wins and repeated the feat in 1977 with 44 victories. He was inducted into the Racing's Hall Of Fame in 2006.

He named many of his horses, with tongue in cheek, after himself and other family members - "Mr. C," "Call Me Ces," "Maas Charles," "The Mayor Himself," "Lover Boy Ces," "Cecil's Boy," "Mr. Mandeville," "Miss Manchester," "Cecil's Darling," "I Shall Return," and "Miss Muff" (named for the nickname he called his daughter Winsome).

reader Charlton introduced himself to a new word each day through a dictionary that he often took on road trips from Mandeville to the principal race track located closer to the Kingston capital in Spanish Town.

Simultaneous to his successes on the track, he spiraled up winning election as mayor the same year Jamaica achieved independence. From 1962 through the 70s and 80s he served under both the Jamaica Labor Party and the People's National Party.

Mayor Charlton was hailed in life as super and a long list of exemplary adjectives.

achievement in the 1960s Mayor Charlton owned the Green Heights entertainment club and a fleet of eleven radio-controlled Windsor taxicabs based in his home-

He taught himself plumbing by keen observation of skilled artisans at the craft. Among the plumbing jobs that he undertook was the installation of gutters around the Mandeville courthouse. His personal crowning glory might be construction of a 10-bedroom, 10-bathroom, octagonal, hilltop glasshouse he resided. Visible for miles, from the outside winding through the living room, a swimming pool centers the flora and fauna to attract tourists and locals he invited to tour.

The house remains a landmark and one of Mandeville's must-see attractions.

In the city he ruled for decades, a park, library, hospital, schools and children are named in his honor. Mayor


In this cozy atmosphere, Ms. Holiday used her melodious voice and belted out some

Keller Dover (Hugh Jackman) is a rugged outdoorsman and family man with deep roots in rural Pennsylvania. He and his wife, Grace (Maria Bello), are raising their kids, six-year-old Anna (Erin Gerasimovich) and teenage Ralph (Dylan Minnette) in the tiny town of Dover, an idyllic oasis seemingly far removed from big city afflictions

It is Thanksgiving morning, and the doting dad has decided his son is ready to shoot his first deer, a rite-of-passage he'd shared with his own father upon coming-ofage a generation earlier. And after a telling tableau dripping with Christian symbolism reflected in a recitation of the Lord's Prayer and a cross dangling from their pickup truck's rearview mirror, we find the two deep in the woods where the boy does, indeed, bag his first buck.

"Be ready," Keller ominously advises Ralph on the return trip, not because he has a premonition about any impending disaster, but due to the vague sense of paranoia he has cultivated over the years as an amateur survivalist. Still, a basement stocked with years' worth of provisions would prove to be of no use in the calamity about to unfold later that day.

First, the Dovers travel to the home of Nancy (Viola Davis) and Franklin Birch (Terrence Howard), neighbors with a couple of kids around the same age as theirs. However, after sharing a satisfying Thanksgiving dinner, youngsters

Anna and Joy (Kyla Drew Simmons) vanish without a trace while playing outside unsupervised.

The only lead is a suspicious RV parked down the street which the police trace to Alex Jones (Paul Dano), the mentally-challenged village idiot (Paul Dano)

ostensibly incapable of pulling off such an abduction. With no other clues to follow, the investigating officer (Jake Gyllenhaal) puts the case on a back burner, much to the chagrin of the missing girls' anguished parents.

Given that time is of the essence,

it is no surprise when a very desperate Keller takes the law into his own hands, with his manic behavior cutting a sharp contrast to the relatively-measured approach of deliberately-paced Detective Loki. Will the frustrated father or the laid-back cop crack the case first? Or will they join forces and pool their resources? Will Anna and Joy be rescued alive, or found too late to save them? Or will the whodunit simply go unsolved.

That is the mystery at the heart of Prisoners, a mesmerizing, multi-layered masterpiece brilliantly directed by Dennis Villeneuve. Screenwriter Aaron Guzikowski deserves equal credit for the film's intricately-plotted script which oh so slowly ratchets-up the tension in a compelling fashion guaranteed to keep you on the edge of your seat every step of the way.



Charlton became legendary because of his ambition and achievements.

He remained legendary because of his service and generosity.

He adored the parish he was born and ensured its reputation of being the coolest and most clean parish.

A popular story often repeated lauds Mayor Charlton for relocating -- to another parish --the first homeless man he spotted in Mandeville. Allegedly, the mayor personally escorted the individual to a border town by driving him out with a threat never to return in the condition he had subsided.

And while he was strict on keeping up appearances, Charlton's philanthropy has been legendary. He bought Mandeville's first ambulance with his own funds and handed it over to the health authorities. He donated his mayor's salary to the Salvation Army, in which his mother had brought him up. He was a generous contributor to a wide range of causes that he considered worthy. When a Manchester policeman was killed in the line of duty, Charlton offered to finance the education of his daughter provided that she performed satisfactorily at school and he monitored her school reports and honored his pledge. He financed the education of many other children of the

Mayor Charlton was visited by some of the world's supreme leaders, among them Emperor Haile Selassie I, Britain's Princess Margaret and prime ministers from many countries.

The mayor, businessman, millionaire and Mandeville ambassador departed recently in the beloved parish he spent most of his 88 years.

A public funeral will accommodate thousands wishing to bid him farewell on Oct. 6.

Slated to be held at the Northern Caribbean University, Manchester Road, Mandeville at 10:00am., interment will follow after a viewing.

The viewing is also set for the previous day, Saturday, Oct. 5, at the Cecil Charlton Hall.

"He loved the people and they loved him therefore we will be having an outdoor service where residents of Mandeville can all see him," his daughter Winsome said.


A memorial service will also be held in south Florida at a date which has not been decided.


Mayor Charlton was preceded in death by his first wife Louise who was the mother of Donald, Cecil (Junior) and Winsome 'Lady C" Charlton.

It was hard not to. A sixty-something, "five-foot-



minimise these negative effects of climate change.

When Ramgopaul Roop started to work his small farm in North Freeport, Trinidad, the soil was very acidic, sterile and compacted. During the rainy season, he had to contend with flooding and during the dry season with the challenge of drought.

Roop decided to lime his farm's soil and increased the amount of organic material in it to improve its fertility. He also made a pond and adjusted the farm's topography in such a way that during the rainy season the excess water flowed smoothly into the pond, thus preventing flooding; during the dry season, he began using that same water to irrigate.

The result is that Roop now makes a good living out of farming.

Though Roop's work in sustainable agriculture began before the impacts of climate change became noticeable, Dr. Humber-

to Gomez, a technological innovation specialist of the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA), cites it as an example of what can be accomplished when farmers take a proactive approach to dealing with the problem.

"For example, with improved soil and water management practices, such as irrigation and drainage," he told IPS. "Also, crop varieties can be bred to require less water, complete their cycle faster or slower, to have tolerance to pests and diseases.

"Plants could also be bred to use smaller spaces, to absorb and metabolise nutrients more efficiently, etc." Gomez said.

The Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security (CCAFS) report, "Farming's Climate-Smart Future: Placing Agriculture at the Heart of Climate-Change Policy," also suggests growing crops under cover as a useful technology specifically for farmers in the Caribbean.

The Trinidad and Tobago government offered to subsidise such technology, known as shade houses, promising to pay half of the cost of building them, according to Khemraj Singh.


However, Singh said, those promises were not fulfilled. He said that he began the project of building shade houses to protect his crops. However, such construction is expensive: two and a half acres required 10 shade houses covering roughly 10,000 square feet each, at a total cost of approximately 340,000 dollars.

Failure by government to subsidise the construction made the shade houses untenable. "A shade house is a long-term investment," he said. "I cannot take TT two million dollars and say that the shade houses would make enough money to pay for themselves." Singh has since abandoned his efforts to implement this technol-

He said that local farmers also see the value of drip irrigation and plastic mulching to help cope with local climatic conditions.

Basketball time




