UN probes Belize humantrafficking report

The United Nations Human Rights Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights says Special Rapporteur on Trafficking in Persons, Joy Ngozi Ezeilo, will visit Belize from Dec. 12-16 "to examine the situation of trafficking of women, men and children."

It will be the first time that an independent expert of the U.N. Human Rights Council is visiting the Caribbean Community (CARICOM)-member state.


"During my visit to the Belize, I will study the situation in order to make recommendations to prevent and fight trafficking, and protect its victims," Ezeilo said.

The U.N. Human Rights Office said Ezeilo, who visits Belize at the invitation of the government, will engage with State representatives, as well as members of international and civil society organizations working on the fight against trafficking in persons "in order to assess the challenges and opportunities in Belize."

Ezeilo is charged by the Human Rights Council to promote the prevention of trafficking in persons in all its forms and to encourage measures to uphold and protect the human rights of victims.

"I look forward to this visit and the opportunity to engage with the government and stakeholders on effective and sustainable ways

MAKING UP FOR A LOST ECONOMY

Caribbean turns up the pressure on Europe

An executive committee appointed by Caribbean governments to fight Britain and other European powers to make them pay for the horrors of the Trans Atlantic Slave Trade has said that it has no choice but to demand reparations, as the effects of slavery on Black people are simply too much to bear.

Updating the region after meeting this week in Jamaica with a British law firm that won reparations for Kenyan tribesman against Britain, the group said it had identified several key areas that should attract funding, if and when it wins its case against the UK, Spain, France, the Netherlands, Portugal, Sweden and Norway in the coming years.

The group said that slavery has been so horrific on the region's African-descended population that it "has the highest incidence in the world of chronic diseases in the form of hypertension and Type 2 Diabetes that are the direct

Antigua

A mother and her two sons serving lengthy prison terms on a joint conviction for the 2006 murder of Lionel "Black Money" Farell had their sentences reduced by the Court of Appeal. Barbara Peters who was initially ordered jailed for 20 years had five years shaved off her sentence.

While her son, Junior Roberts, who was also serving a 20 year sentence, is to spend 18 years in

The Court of Appeal also reduced Shavuaghn Roberts' 18 year sentence by a year. Justices of Appeal Joyce Kentish, Mario Michel and Davidson Baptiste ruled the sentences excessive.

The killing occurred on June 7, 2006, at number 2 Armstrong Rd., not far from Farrell's home and in the presence of his family and neighbors.

Meanwhile, two Jamaican drug mules caught at VC Bird International Airport recently were convicted and



fined in the St John's Magistrates' Court, John Planter and Ricardo Mills were respectively required to pay \$35,000 and \$18,000 forthwith. Planter pleaded guilty to possession, importation, intent to transfer and intent to supply three pounds of cannabis to other persons.

Mills, who had ingested one and a half pounds of marijuana and imported it into country, admitted guilt to possession, intent to transfer and importation of the controlled substance.

Police said they admitted to ingesting marijuana-filled packages. They were taken to Mount St John's Medical Centre where they passed out a combined total of four and a half pounds of the drug. The drugs were valued at \$18,000.

Barbados

The ratings agency, Standard & Poor's (S&P) has revised downwards the long-term rating for Barbados - the second downgrade in four months.

Recently, the United States-based

credit rating agenannounced that it had moved the island's rating from BB+ to BB-

mounting external pressures associated with a persistent current account deficit and external financing challenges, as well as the ongoing high fiscal deficit largely because of a substantial fall in government revenues as a result of the weak economy," the agency said.

According to S&P due to the large fiscal deficits, it is expected that the net general government debt burden will rise to above 70 per cent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in fiscal 2013 (ending March 2014) from 67 percent in fiscal 2012 and 60 percent in fiscal 2011.

Straughn, who met with a visiting team from S&P two weeks ago, warned that tough decisions now had to be made and he called on government to "bite the bullet and make the necessary cuts now."

Cayman Islands

The Cayman Islands Development Bank (CIDB) made a loss for the second year running, according to Auditor General Alastair Swar-

Despite having assets to the tune of \$41 million, the bank made a net loss of \$766,880 which follows another loss made in 2011 when the bank lost \$777,664 according to the audited financial statements that were made public this week.

At a time when the bank should have been making a profit in order to offset the loan that is due in two years, the financial statements show that the bank has been incurring losses for the past two years.

Moreover, instead of the bank increasing its customer base so as to attract better terms in refinancing its loan portfolio,

the statements paint a picture of a situation where customers are not showing interest

Dominica

in the banks products.

Dominica says it is pursuing

efforts to get the European Union to remove the visa requirements for nationals travelling to Europe, saying that it was important to stimulate trade under the Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA) signed with Europe five years ago.

Junior Foreign Affairs Minister Alvin Bernard said Dominica has joined several countries in making the request.

"We have made some progress and we have had tremendous commitment from various representatives of the Council, but at the moment, the most recent report that we have received is that the Council is at the moment preoccupied with two other countries that have been included on the negative list," he said.

Bernard said Dominica was pursing the initiative "because we see the lifting of the visa requirement for Dominica and other affected countries, particularly signatories to the Economic Partnership Agreement as critical. Dominica and other countries of the Caribbean Forum (CARIFO-

RUM) grouping signed the EPA in October 2008 that also provides substantial EU aid for trade.



Recently, Cecilia Malmström, the European commissioner for Home Affairs said the commission was putting in place measures to allow citizens from six Caribbean Community (CARICOM) countries to travel to the Schengen area without a visa.

Guvana

Guyana has produced more than

half a million tons of rice this year, surpassing the 2012 figure by more than 107,000 tons, according to official figures released here.

The Caribbean Community (CAR-ICOM) country said rice production for the year stood at 529,384 tons, a 25.43 percent increase over the 2012 figure of 422,057 tons.

The Ministry of Agriculture gave no revenue figures for the rice production this year, but said that the production "pushes forward the possibility of Guyana possibly reaching 600,000 tons before the 2020 projection.

"The sector continues to experience yearly increase in rice production due to more land being brought under cultivation, and the provision of improved farming techniques with better seed varieties, which in turn have led to improved yields per hectare."

It said that a major incentive for the increased project has been the price for Guyana's rice improving, "which thus far has been stable"

St. Kitts

In the face of public upheaval over an Iranian turning up at Canada's border



with a St. Kitts-Nevis diplomatic passport, the local government has said it approved the Middle Easterner's passport and conferred him the status of Special Envoy to the Federation.

Minister of Foreign Affairs, Hon. Patrice Nisbett told the nation at the Nov. 26 sitting of the National Assembly that Iranian national Alizera Moghadam obtained St. Kitts-Nevis citizenship through its Investment Program, after which he was given the diplomatic appointment.

"Ministers having duly considered the content of a Memorandum dated Jan. 4, 2013, approved the appointment of Mr. Alizera Moghadam, a national of Iran who had formally acquired, following successful

completion of all the necessary due diligence, citizenship of St. Kitts and Nevis through the Investment



Program; as a Special Envoy to Azerbaijan and Turkey with the mandate to explore areas of interest to the Federation," he said.

There was also no response to media claims that Moghadam told

Clarke calls on Obama to stop deportations

Brooklyn Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke has called on President Barack Obama to stop the deportation of Caribbean and other immigrants who lack legal status in the United States.

Clarke, who represents the largely Caribbean 9th Congressional District in Brooklyn, said her appeal would help to "prevent the continued dislocation of families and children that disrupts the communities we share.

"There are thousands and thousands of family in the community I represent who are threatened with deportation," said Clarke, who is the Ranking Member of the U.S. House of Representatives' Subcommittee on Cybersecurity, Infrastructure Protection, and Security Technologies.

"These are real families – mothers and fathers, sons and daughters – who are living with the risk of separation, in some instances, permanent separation," she added.

"Until we have comprehensive reform of a failed system of immigration, we cannot in good faith allow the often irrevocable harm of deportation to continue," she continued. "With each day, we deport more than one thousand people who could potentially become citizens."

Clarke noted that, in July, the U.S. Senate passed an immigration reform bill that would allow most of the victims of "our failed system of immigration to obtain status as legal permanent residents and, eventually, to become citizens."

She said Republican leaders in the House of Representatives have "refused, however, to allow a vote on the bill.

"The people we represent have a right to expect that

Congress will enact comprehensive immigration reform based on our values, particularly the belief that families should be protected from dislocation," Clarke said.

"In the meantime, we should prevent the unnecessary separation of family members," she added.

According to estimates by the Washington-based Pew Research Center's Hispanic Trends Project, about 11.7 million undocumented immigrants were in the U.S. last year, up from 11.5 million in 2011.

The U.N. Human Rights Council said she will present a comprehensive report containing her conclusions and recommendations in June 2014.



Jamaican scientist starts medical marijuana firm

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) — A prominent Jamaican scientist and entrepreneur is launching a company that aims to capitalize on medical marijuana, a growing global industry that he asserted Wednesday could be a boon for the island's chronically limping economy.

Henry Lowe, a researcher who specializes in medicinal chemistry and the chairman of an institute that develops therapeutic and cosmetic products from various plants in Jamaica, is calling his new venture Medicanja. It will focus on isolating medicinal compounds in the cannabis plant, known locally as "ganja," and Lowe said the research will not violate any local laws or international conventions.

Lowe said Jamaica could become a powerhouse in the nascent medical marijuana industry, health tourism and the development of innovative pot-derived items. Local scientists already have a history of creating marijuana-derived

products, such as "Canasol," which helps relieve pressure in the eyes of glaucoma

"This is a big opportunity for us," Lowe said in a phone interview.

Marijuana is pervasive on the Caribbean island despite

being prohibited since 1913. It's long been used as a medicinal herb by Jamaican families and as a spiritual sacrament by Rastafarians. In 2001, a government-appointed commission said pot was "culturally entrenched" and recommended decriminalization, but the effort stalled.

Advocates for pot say it's time for Jamaica to give its moribund economy a boost by embracing cannabis-related ventures. With a growing number of U.S. states changing their marijuana laws, and voters in Washington and Colorado legalizing marijuana, the activists say Jamaica should decriminalize pot and stop worrying that might anger the U.S. The island has long been the Caribbean's biggest pot exporter to the U.S.

Influential politicians are increasingly taking up the idea. Health Minister Fenton Ferguson said last week that he is "fully on board" with medical marijuana, and the justice minister has said the Cabinet should be asked to consider changes to pot laws before the end of the year.

Some church leaders and lawmakers oppose decriminalization of even small amounts of marijuana, arguing the negative effects of the drug outweigh any benefits, especially for young people. But many of them say they have no problem with medical marijuana research.

Rep. Clarke calls on Obama to stop deportations

Brooklyn Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke has called on United States President Barack Obama to stop the deportation of Caribbean and other immigrants who lack legal status in the United States.

Clarke, who represents the largely Caribbean 9th Congressional District in Brooklyn, said her appeal would help to "prevent the continued dislocation of families and children that disrupts the communities we share.

"There are thousands and thousands of family in the community I represent who are threatened with deportation," said Clarke, who is the Ranking Member of the U.S. House of Representatives' Subcommittee on Cybersecurity, Infrastructure Protection, and Security Technologies.

"These are real families mothers and fathers, sons and daughters - who are living with the risk of separation, in some instances, permanent separation," she added.

"Until we have comprehensive reform of a failed system of immigration, we cannot in good faith allow the often irrevocable harm of deportation to continue," she continued. "With each day, we deport more than one thousand people who



could potentially become citizens."

Clarke noted that, in July, the U.S. Senate passed an immigration reform bill that would allow most of the victims of "our failed system of immigration to obtain status as legal permanent residents and, eventually, to become citizens."

She said Republican leaders in the House of Representatives have "refused, however, to allow a vote on the hill.

"The people we represent have a right to expect that Congress will enact comprehensive immigration reform based on our values, particularly the belief that families should be protected from dislocation," Clarke said.

"In the meantime, we should prevent the unnecessary separation of family members," she added.

Why can't the U.S. Congress aim higher?

Congressional budget negotiators are moving to meet a Dec. 13 deadline to produce, well, something. For weeks, we've been told to keep expectations low. There'll be no "grand bargain," negotiators say. Commentators believe that even the narrowest agreement will be a signal achievement. So here's my question: Doesn't that seem like an awfully low bar to you?

Yes, I know. The atmosphere on Capitol Hill is poisonous. The two parties — even the various factions within the parties can barely stand to be in a room with each other. Expecting a sizable budget accomplishment from Congress right now is like expecting water from a rock. It would take a miracle.

Yet there are consequences to not producing an agreement capable of clarifying fiscal affairs. Right now, government agencies cannot plan ahead; they can't consider long-term projects; they have trouble with staffing: they can't set priorities; they're forced to fund programs that have outlived their usefulness and cannot fund programs they know are necessary. And that's just the federal bureaucracy. Contractors and people who depend on federal spending can't plan, either. Our economy can't achieve liftoff, and millions of ordinary Americans remain mired by its slow growth. Washington faces tough choices about spending, taxes, and entitlements, and Congress isn't making

Things are not wholly bleak. Republican Paul Ryan of Wisconsin, the lead House negotiator, and Democrat Patty Murray of Washington, who heads up the Senate team, have been working at least to address the sequester. As you'll recall, this is the draconi-

an set of across-the-board budget cuts put in place in 2011. At first, many agencies were able to defer maintenance, spend money they'd squirreled away, and cut staff by attrition. This next year will be much tougher: agencies are out of easy options, and defense spending faces an immense, \$21 billion cut. That will be felt in every congressional district in the country, given how adept the Defense Department has been at spreading its largesse around. Not surprisingly, pressure is coming from both sides of the aisle to ease the impact.

The sequester is a cleaver, cutting good and bad government spending without rhyme or reason. If congressional negotiators can take a smarter approach. that's all to the good.

But if they're going to do that, shouldn't they address the real problems? The country needs gradual deficit reduction that avoids disrupting the economy or harming the vulnerable. It needs reforms to Social Security and Medicare that put them on a solid footing for decades to come.

These are daunting challenges, but Congress's toolbox is hardly empty. It could limit itemized tax deductions, increase Medicare premiums for the well-to-do. place caps on spending, shave federal employee benefits to bring them in line with the private sector, increase government fees, sell public assets, put more of the wireless spectrum up for bid, increase the Social Security contributions of higher-income earners, change the consumer price index.... There are literally scores of possibilities, none of them easy, but all of them offering adroit negotiators the chance to craft a long-term solution to problems that have beset Capitol Hill for years and held economic growth far below its potential.

By addressing these issues head on, Congress could move beyond the political machinations that have deeply frustrated so many Americans, and play a constructive role in the economy: promoting growth by investment in infrastructure and basic research, providing incentives for entrepreneurship and job creation. It could create a responsible framework for reducing spending as the economy grows. It could reform a tax code that everyone agrees is broken.

At some point, Congress will have to put the federal budget on "a sustainable path for the long term," in the words of the CBO. So long as it does not, the economic consequences hurt everyone. Congressional leaders seem blissfully unconcerned about this and aim only for low-hanging fruit, but Americans know that Congress can and should do better, and are rightly tired of careening from crisis to crisis. As members of Congress continue to make politically attractive suggestions that don't come close to achieving a lasting solution, let's urge them to get real. It's time for Congress to go big.

Fix or no fix of healthcare, a GOP monotone

If the early signals hold firm and the assigned fixers have indeed gotten a handle on whatever was bedeviling initial rollout of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), how much of a setback does that create for the army of navsavers who were poised to ride an anti-ACA wave all the way to the 2014 midterm elections? Coming right after the GOP-engineered shutdown of the government, the inexcusably amateurish launch of the government's ACA web site provided the Republican/Tea Party wall of defiance with an escape route from a lambasting they should, even now, not have lived down.

The full-throttle shellacking that these forces organized against the ACA (the pejorative "Obamacare" naturally being the preferred terminology in that sector) even co-opted much of the mainstream media to join in the pile-on of disabling blows heaped on the administration. So respected a news veteran as Bob Schieffer of CBS News dismissed the ACA as a "disaster" and parroted the attackers' line about "scrapping the whole thing and starting over." The ACA's would-be destroyers had the wind at their back for sure.

Should the web site be given a

new lease on life and, with it, realization by the bulk of those whose healthcare needs are intended to be addressed by the ACA, that they're now in a good place, President Obama would have played this plot sequence as statesmanly correct as could be desired. Burned by snafus in the web site's setup of which he reportedly was not previously made aware, the president proceeded to apologize, take the blame and then place his confidence in someone he thought could repair the damage. If, coming behind such unpanicked response to what would be anybody's nightmare, relatively smooth running of the site results, the president would have earned his brownie points.

It has not been all aces for the president, as he closes in on five years on the job. There have been some foreign policy calculations that, in hindsight, he may regret he made (we have previously suggested here that being drawn into intervention in Libya could well be one of them) and on the domestic front he, like every one of his predecessors, hasn't been free of missteps. But, especially in light of the depth of feeling on the other side to frustrate his every move, the president

has acquitted himself very well in the role. The Affordable Care Act was an ambitious, well-meaning initiative intended to address the issue of so many in the population being without health insurance, while simultaneously attempting to curtail the resulting drain on government resources caused by so many emergency room visits of the uninsured. Which makes it a nonstarter for today's ideologically driven Republican party. Showing that kind of concern for people isn't in the Republican style book, because that's not something government concerns itself with.

So whether or not the other side's rally cry of a busted ACA web site gets its plug pulled because of the president's having moved adroitly to engage the problem, Republican/Tea Party demagoguery to bring about the ACA's demise will not abate. In one of the more preposterous things done in the House of Representatives, Republicans voted

almost 50 times to repeal the ACA – votes the caucus knew were going nowhere. (Who is surprised that the current Congress has earned the distinction of least productive session of all time?)

Typically, though, the GOP way would be to see in a temporarily malfunctioning ACA web site a nirvana good for delivering what that colossal waste of time in House repeal votes could not. So pulling out all the stops, blanketing the space every which way with chatter about how dead in the water this thing was, became the order of the day. Not unexpectedly, too, there was no inclination whatsoever to acknowledge that although trouble on the site for persons trying to access it was widespread, an altogether different experience greeted others in states like Kentucky, California and others, primarily where the state opted to use its own insurance exchanges rather than the federal government's (Kentucky somewhat of an odd twist, being the home of ferociously anti-ACA Senate minority leader Mitch McConnell). The overwhelming concentration and unrelenting emphasis on the negative seemingly was geared toward influencing the media's unblinking focus on the negative as well.

ACA opposition forces outdid themselves in California, where they stooped to "dirty tricks" levels. Evidently none too pleased that the sign-up flow in the state had gone quite well, folks supposedly affiliated with or acting on behalf of the political opposition set up a phony "sound alike" web site intended to draw potential insurance buyers but which in reality could sell the poor saps zilch. Sadly, some have begun to see the ongoing contention over the ACA (which, lest they forget, is the law of the land) as worthy of that kind of mindless intemperance.

Through it all President Obama has charted a "steady as she goes" course as ship's captain. The Affordable Care Act, generally referred to as his signature achievement, is a proud one to own. The president's demeanor of a no-nonsense exterior couched in respect ultimately is perhaps a sober choice, given the daily round of slings and arrows sent his way — a routine in which the Affordable Care Act has emerged as bête noir of the first degree.

Cliff-hanger for 1.3 million Americans

By Nydia Velázquez Since 2008, millions of Americans have lost their iobs or had their hours cut back as a result of a financial collapse they did not cause. Democrats have consistently fought to protect individuals suffering from the effects of the recession. While our response has not been perfect, we have been able to maintain a strong unemployment insurance program to help Americans weather a broken economy.

In a few weeks, 1.3 million Americans will lose the unemployment benefits they have relied on to buy groceries and keep a roof over their heads. By the end of the first quarter, an additional 850.000 Americans will have lost their benefits. We should not be revoking needed economic assistance from job seekers while millions of Americans are fighting to get back to work and struggling to pay their

This sudden change in policy affects the worst off in this economy—the longterm unemployed. Studies show that significant time out of the labor force makes it harder for an individual to find a job. When they do find one, it is often a

lower-paying position or a step back in their career. Without the crucial lifeline that unemployment insurance provides, we leave millions of Americans without income and risk pushing them out of the job market entirely. This is just one example

of a Republican assault on social insurance programs. Their refusal to expand Medicaid, support for the reduction in SNAP benefits, and insistence on sequestration has resulted in benefit reductions for working families. As Republicans have rolled back the safety net, Americans have lost access to housing, food, education, and child care. The expiration of long-term unemployment benefits compounds an already difficult situation for many Americans.

Last year, unemployment insurance kept 2.5 million Americans and .6 million children out of poverty. If long-term jobless benefits are allowed to expire, next year there will be nothing to protect these families from long spells of unemployment. Food stamps, Medicaid benefits, and federal child care subsidies are not generous enough to make up for the loss of a reliable

unemployment benefit.

In New York City, this is a particularly pressing problem. My city has an unemployment rate of nearly 9 percent, over 1 percent greater than the national average. Already, SNAP cuts have resulted in the loss 76 million meals per year for New York City residents. Cutting New Yorkers off from unemployment insurance will not put people back to work. This expiration of benefits will make the unemployed worse off and job searches harder.

My colleagues on the other side of the aisle say they are concerned about the average person. But actions speak louder than words, and their actions tell us they are not concerned with the difficulties Americans face. I hope that the Americans they are ignoring are playing close attention to what is happening in Congress today.



Guyana to promote low-carbon growth

Inter-American The Development Bank (IDB) says Guyana, "one of the best-conserved high-biodiversity countries in the world," will advance in its efforts to implement its Low-Carbon Development Strategy with a US\$16.9 million loan.

The Washington-based financial institution said on Dec. 5 that the financing is the first of two Programmatic Policy-Based Loans to support the creation of regulatory, institutional and monitoring instruments to help Guyana implement its development plan and mainstream environmental issues into institutional strategies.

The IDB said Guyana has about 85 percent of its territory covered by forest and wooded lands.

It said the project will

support measures to update the country's regulatory framework to maintain low rates of deforestation and forest degradation caused by mining, logging and agriculture, as well as to improve the government's institutional capacity to enforce legislation.

Moreover, the IDB said the project will support measures to strengthen the institutional capacity of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment, the main entity in charge of promoting and implementing the country's low carbon development plan.

"This project is designed to foster the creation of government systems to measure, report and verify forest carbon emissions resulting from deforestation and forest degradation," the IDB said.

The IDB financing is made up of two loans of US\$8.46 million each. The first loan comes from the IDB's ordinary capital, with a 30-year maturity, and a 5.5-year grace period and a fixed interest rate (SCF-Fixed).

The IDB said the second loan comes from the Bank's Fund for Special Operations, with an interest rate of 0.25 percent a year, and a 40-year maturity and grace period.

The IDB also approved this week a US\$3.8 million non-reimbursable technical cooperation to Guyana to support measures to help the country establish an enabling framework and to build capacity for Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation (REDD+).



Canadian authorities he paid \$1 million for the passport.

St. Lucia

Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony says the island's tourism industry is on a slow but steady rebound.

The prime minister in an address at an awards ceremony at the Windjammer Landing – a leading hotel here, pointed to a four percent growth in arrivals as an important sign of light at the end of the tunnel.

He said that while the industry has been encountering an immensely challenging

period, there are important signs that health is returning to the sector and the confidence in investment has also received a boost as illustrated by plans by many properties to expand.



"After several years of decline when hotels did not invest in new plants, equipment, machinery and employees, we are now slowly beginning to see a turn around. Dr. Anthony also spoke directly to plans by Windjammer Landing to expand the 116villa property located on the islands north west coast. He said the decision to expand at this time was "critical and vital" not only to the tourism sector but to the country's economy.

Anthony, who is also finance minister, exhorted employees in the sector to continue to do their best in maintaining the world class service, which has granted the destination much acclaim.

Guyana and T&T are forging ahead with an agreement, which allows for investors from T&T to engage in large scale farming in Guyana, and will see both countries engaging in more economic activities.

Earlier this year, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed for 10,000 acres of Guyana to be made available to T&T investors and farmers for agricultural development.

During a press briefing in Georgetown recently, Guyana's Agriculture Minister Dr. Leslie Ramsammy said discussions were held

this week with Food Production Minister Devant Maharaj to push the agreement forward.

"We are at the beginning of a collaboration that will benefit both countries," Ramsammy said, "No financial investment will be made by either government but, agricultural and economic activities will be facilitated in both countries."



Wage hike in Haiti doesn't address factory abuses

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Dec 3. 2013 (IPS) - Haiti's minimum wage will nudge up 12 percent on Jan. 1, from 4.65 to 5.23 dollars (or 200 to 225 gourdes) per day. Calculated hourly, it will go from 58 to 65 cents, before taxes.

But the raise will not affect Haiti's 30.000 assembly factory workers, who are supposed to already be receiving about seven dollars for an eight-hour day - about 87 cents per hour. Recent studies have found rampant wage theft at almost two dozen of the factories that stitch clothing for companies like Gap and Walmart.

Agreed to on Nov. 29 by government-convened Council on Salaries (CSS) - made up of labour, business and government representatives – the raise falls far short of the minimum wage of 11.63 dollars (500 gourdes) that factory worker unions and others were demanding.

Last month, in the capital and in Haiti's north, the Collective of Textile Factory Unions federation (KOSIT), which represents workers in three industrial parks, mobilised for the 500-gourde wage.

On Nov. 7, to chants of "500 gourdes! 500 gour-

des!," over 5,000 workers and supporters marched outside the gates of a free trade zone on the border of the Dominican Republic in Ouanaminthe. Hundreds of others marched on Nov. 26 in the capital.

The factory owners countered late last week with an open letter which pled to "keep Haiti competitive" with what they identified as their "big rivals" – Bangladesh, Cambodia and Vietnam, countries all known for harsh conditions and

"We recognise that the clothing and assembly sectors are not ends in and of themselves, but they can be a very important stimulus and can serve as a motor to help Haiti open up and present itself as a country that is changing and modernising," said the 23 Haitian, Dominican and South Korean factory owners and industrialists from the Association of Haitian Industries

Two days later, on Nov. 29,

eight of the nine members of the CSS, including all three union representatives, approved the 225-gourde wage. (None of the union representatives were from KOSIT.)

Yannick Etienne of Batay Ouvrive (Workers Struggle), a labour group which supports KOSIT and other textile unions, said her organisation and the unions disagree with the 225-gourde salary.

"We think it is a shame that the CSS union rep-

resentatives agreed to the miserable wage of 225 gourdes. At a meeting the night before, we requested that they refuse to sign any agreement that was less than 300 gourdes," Etienne told IPS.

RAMPANT WAGE THEFT

The country's 30,000 workers – almost two-thirds of them women - in Haiti's free trade zone assembly factories stitch together clothing for Gap, Gildan Activewear, Hanes, Kohl's, Levi's, Russell, Target, VF, and Walmart. Haitian law stipulates that "the price paid per production unit... must be set in a way that permits a worker to earn at least 300 gourdes for an eight-hour day."

SALARY HIKE WAS BLOCKED IN 2009

The last time minimum wage was discussed, in 2009, the U.S. Embassy got into the game.

According to cables released by WikiLeaks and analysed by The Nation and Haiti Liberté, ADIH members worked with the embassy to prevent parliament from raising the minimum wage from nine to 62 cents an hour, or from 70 to 200 gourdes

At the time, President René Préval appeared to be supportive.

ADIH fought hard against the plan, issuing a report partially funded by USAID that claimed Haiti would be "uncompetitive" if factory wages rose.

But recent studies by three different international groups, including the U.N.'s International Labour Organisation (ILO), have documented that the vast majority of workers receive the legal minimum only rarely: about 25 percent of the time, according to the

A 29-year-old mother who works at the Multiwear factory, which makes teeshirts for Hanes, is one of those being gypped. (Like all workers interviewed for this story, she agreed to speak only on the condition of anonymity.)

"I support my four-yearold, and two sisters, and one brother," she told IPS. "Sometimes I make the quota and get 300 gourdes, but just once in a while."

In its October 2013 report, the ILO's Better Work textile factory monitoring programme found all 23 factories surveyed, including Multiwear, to be "non-compliant" with the

Running from foot problems

The subject of barefoot running has received a lot of attention as both a trend as well as a source of foot and ankle injuries. But even experienced walkers and runners who adhere to the use of more traditional footwear can be plagued by common injuries that require treatment by a foot specialist.

Dr. Robert Russo, president of the New York State Podiatric Medical Association, suggests that even the most experienced and well prepared runners and walkers need to be mindful of signals and symptoms that indicate your foot pain requires medical attention.

"A visit to the podiatrist should happen at the first sign of pain or discomfort," said Dr. Russo. "Many people will tolerate pain thinking it is normal and will go away, only to find they have a fracture or other serious injury that requires medical treatment or even surgery," he added.

START WITH PREVENTION

Warming up before starting any form of exercise is recommended. This can help prevent ankle sprains and fractures. So can wearing prop-

er shoes. A foot specialist can help determine which type of shoe is best for you. And it is good to remember that any athletic shoe should be replaced annually. Running shoes should be replaced approximately every 300-400 miles.

It is not uncommon for people to wear uncomfortable or ill-fitting shoes. After all, many people buy their footwear in a setting where there are no experts to ensure proper fit, including online or big-box retailers. So even if you are purchasing expensive athletic shoes, if the fit is not correct or the shoe does not provide adequate support, you may experience foot pain.

IS IT A SPRAIN OR A FRACTURE?

Pain, swelling, bruising and difficulty walking on the affected foot or ankle are the most common symptoms of a sprain or foot fracture. The podiatrist will examine you and take a complete medical history. Tests may be ordered, including an X-ray, ultrasound or MRI, to determine the extent of the injury. If a fracture is clearly visible from the X-ray, further tests may not be necessary. Ultrasounds and MRIs are useful for diagnosing soft tissue injuries like torn ligaments and stress fractures.

WHAT TO DO FIRST

At the first sign of injury – if it is swollen, bruised, or painful to walk there are several immediate steps recommended by Dr. Russo. The acronym RICE will help you remember:

R = Rest. Stay off the foot until it can be evaluated. Even walking on the affected area can make it worse.

I = Ice. Apply ice as soon as possible and reapply it every 15-20 minutes every three or four hours after the injury. Ice can decrease inflammation.

C = Compression. Wrap an elastic bandage around the foot. The wrapping should be snug, but not so tight as to cut off circulation.

E = Elevation. Prop up the foot and ankle using a couple of pillows, ensuring it is higher than your heart. Keeping the foot elevated also helps decrease swelling.

The bottom line: Don't take



your feet or pain of any kind for granted. A podiatrist will determine the extent of your injury and develop a plan to get you back on your feet as soon as possible. To find a foot specialist near you, visit NYSPMA.org and click on the "find a podiatrist" button or call Toll-free, 866-996-4400.





New York gun-reform measures among best

New York continues to lead among states seeking strong gun safety laws, but there is more work to be done according to a new state analysis by the Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun Violence and the Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence. New York received a B+ and ranked fifth in this year's "2013 State Scorecard: Why Gun Laws Matter," produced by both organizations.

"New York passed The New York SAFE Act in the aftermath of the Newtown tragedy because the research confirms that strong laws help keep people safer from gun violence," said NYAGV Executive Director Leah Gunn Barrett New York State has the fourth lowest gun death rate in the nation, a testament to its strong gun safety laws.

"We know state gun laws fill critical gaps in our federal law, but there is still work to be done when anyone can go to a neighboring state and evade New York's strong gun laws such as universal background checks on gun and ammunition sales," added Barrett. "We know that 90% of recovered crime guns in NYC and 68% statewide flow from states with weak gun laws. That is why we need Congress to finish the job and extend background checks to all guns sales." Currently, guns purchased at gun shows and online, roughly 40% of all gun sales, do not have to go through a federal background check. This makes it easier for anyone with intent to do harm to cross state lines and obtain a gun with no questions asked.

The deadly shooting in Newtown prompted eight states, including New York, to pass major gun reforms in 2013.

New York and four other states passed new laws requiring background checks on all gun sales. In addition, four states approved provisions requiring owners to report lost or stolen firearms to police, while three states enacted laws aimed at strengthening record-keeping and background check requirements for ammunition sales.



strong gun laws, those gun laws benefit all our citizens and send a message to Congress that is it time to act. States like New York are leading the way on gun reform and creating a safer nation," added Barrett.

The state scorecard ranks all 50 states by letter grades on laws that have been equated with reducing firearm injury and death.

States received points for having effective laws in each policy area, with stronger laws receiving more points. States lost points for irre-

sponsible measures that increase the likelihood of gun violence, such as laws that allow individuals to carry loaded, concealed weapons in public without a permit. Ultimately, every state was awarded a letter grade indicating the overall strength or weakness of its gun laws.

This collaborative report empowers advocates by putting the Law Center's indepth research on America's gun laws into the hands of the extensive networks of the Brady Campaign and States United to Prevent Gun Violence, a coalition

of 27 state groups including New Yorkers Against Gun Violence, so they can continue to fight for effective gun policies in communities across the country.

Scott Stringer delivers tenth annual Joseph Silver, MD Memorial Lecture at New York Methodist Hospital

High corruption rating for Guyana

Guyana ranked a very poor 27 out of 100 points in the Transparency International 2013 Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI).

The report was released recently. Last year, Guyana scored 28 points. Guyana is again doing worse than every other country in Caricom except for Haiti (19) which has also traditionally been one of the worst performers.

Transparency International (TI) premiered a new methodology last year where countries are ranked Guyana ranked a very poor 27 out of 100 points in the Transparency International 2013 Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI)

from 1 to 100 points with 100 representing the least corrupt. Any score below 50 indicates a serious problem and though it is not possi-

ble to meaningfully compare Guyana's performance with the previous methodology, the country remains in the bracket of those with a very serious problem.

By contrast, Barbados scored 75 points, the highest in CARICOM, The Bahamas 71, St. Lucia 71, Trinidad and Tobago 38 and Jamaica 38. Suriname came in at 36 this year. The perception of corruption has remained a big problem for the Ramotar administration over the last two years.

Violent demise for Bajan mother

Domestic violence has claimed the life of a sixth woman this year in Barbados. Krystal Lovell, 22, of St. Thomas, was reportedly stabbed to death recently in the presence of their two-year-old daughter, Skye.

Her former boyfriend, Jerrick Tudor, was taken into custody by the police after he was apprehended by Krystal's father, Roosevelt Lovell, in the backyard.

The couple broke up recently after a seven-year relationship. Guyanese-born Tudor is said to have moved out of the small wooden house that they shared in her family's back-

yard.

It was the second time in less than three years that Krystal's father lost a daughter to violence. His eldest child, Nikita Belgrave, was one of the five women killed in the Campus Trendz fire on Tudor Street, The City.

An evening stroll in winter

This time of year, one of your favorite things to do is to look at lights.

Your entire neighborhood is filled with all kinds of them. Lights on houses, lights on trees, lights on bushes, wire, decks, and steps. You might see them on boats, in the park, on a statue, or made into shapes in someone's front yard. And you might even have them inside your own house, on a tree or in a window.

They're twinkly. They're bright. And you can't stop looking at all the lights. So let's take a walk to see the lights in "Dusk" by Uri Shulevitz.

It gets dark very early in the winter, sometimes even before you get home from school. On this one winter afternoon, a boy, his grandfather, and their dog decide to take a walk around the city. By the time they got to the edge of the water, the sun was disappearing beyond the horizon.

"How sad," the boy said, "the day is no more."

But the grandfather (who had a very long beard) wasn't worried. It was only dusk, which is what happens

when the sun goes down.

On their way back to the city, they noticed that people were scurrying everywhere. Some were on their way back home at the end of the day. Others were hoping to do a little shopping at the downtown stores.

The grandfather and the boy met a lot of unusual people as they walked. One man was shopping for toys. A woman with a very fancy hat was looking for gifts for her kitten. People were looking for yummy things and weird things.

But the boy, his grandfather, and their dog kept right on walking. It was starting to get dark. "As nature's lights go out, city's lights come on" and so did the lights on all the downtown stores! The boy saw Christmas lights on the streetlamps and on Christmas trees inside and outside. He saw candles on a menorah, and children celebrating Hanukkah. He saw candles in another window, standing proud on a kinara and surrounded by children celebrating Kwanzaa.

It was beautiful. It was magnificent. It was almost as if the sun was still out.


So your child wants a read-aloud tonight, but there's not much time for it. Grab "Dusk," then, because this book won't take long.

Author Uri Shulevitz tells a story of an evening stroll on a cold night and he does it with a handful of words; some pages, in fact, hold just a half-sentence. That forces you to take a slower, ambling pace in reading – somewhat like a leisurely walk.

And maybe because those

words are so sparse, it's easy to focus on the illustrations here — which is, perhaps, what you should be doing anyhow. Shulevitz' drawings are done in gorgeous color, evoking the night chill and the warmth of the lights.

If you're looking for a Kwanzaa-Christmas-Hanukkah book that will dazzle your 2-to-6-year-old, this one's it. Read it, and "Dusk" could become one of her favorite things.



"NANNY" DOC IN THE WORKS

Not enough has been said about Nanny, Jamaica's only national heroine.


So says New Jersey-based film maker Roy T. Anderson. He recently visited Jamaica on a mission to scout locations and begin preliminary interviews for a documentary he has already titled "Nanny, Queen of the Maroons."

"The story of Nanny is a fascinating story of resistance which must be told," Anderson reportedly said, "I am also looking to develop projects looking at similar peoples in Central and South America."

"I first want to show that Nanny was a living, breathing human being, first and foremost... a lot of the books which have been written in the past have shrouded her in mystery, and for such a significant figure in the resistance movement. I want to give her, her due, and I feel this documentary is the best way to lift the legend from the text."

"A number of Maroons still believe that the spirit of Nanny still dwells among them. They draw power and strength from her spirit and it is interesting how this is seen in present-day society."

In order to complete his quest for more knowledge about the conquering female, soldier Anderson plans to venture through the terrain Nanny was familiar. According to the stuntman,

he has already scheduled a three-day trek to the hills of Old Nanny Town in the Blue Mountains. He explained that legend contends "only the bravest Maroons or those free of bad deeds" are able to challenge the sacred

land mass that "Nanny's powerful spirit still inhabits."

"Nanny is seen as such an iconic figure representing strong, Black, Jamaican women and this will also be brought out in the work."

Last month in Brooklyn, Anderson's previous film project "Akwantu: The Journey" was screened in the presence of Dr. Julius Garvey, the son of Jamaica's first national hero. Released earlier this year, in the film Anderson retraced his own

Maroon heritage from the hills of St Elizabeth to the African continent.

To complete the documentary he will travel to Ghana, Africa to examine the link between the Maroons in Jamaica and those on the

continent. While there he intends to conduct interviews. To complete the project, he also hopes to integrate interviews with intellectuals and scholars in the United States, Jamaica and the United Kingdom.

Maroons were enslaved Africans who fought for 80 years to win their freedom from the British Army.

"I will be using the next few months to attract funding for the documentary. I am set to speak to the relevant persons in Jamaica. I have already had discussions with UNESCO (The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) and they seem interested."

"During the past few days, I have been looking at locations in the Rio Grande Valley in Portland as well as interviewing Colonel Harris of the Maroons," he continued.

He expects to begin filming by the middle of next year.

The life of fledgling folksinger Llewyn Davis

It's Greenwich Village in the middle of the winter of 1961, and Llewyn Davis (Oscar Issac) is so down on his luck that he can't afford an overcoat, let alone a place to live. The fledgling folksinger's fortunes have gone into a tailspin ever since the other half of his musical duo committed suicide in spite of the modest success of their debut album, "If We Had Wings."

Nowadays, Llewyn devotes less time to launching his solo career than looking for the next place to spend the night. For, the feckless freeloader really knows how to wear out his welcome, whether by letting his hosts' (Ethan Phillips and Robin Bartlett) house cat escape onto the street, or by sleeping with the wife (Carey Mulligan) of a pal (Justin Timberlake) who let him crash on the couch.

The plot thickens when Jean lets Llewyn know she's pregnant and doesn't know whether he or her husband is the father. So, while he's constantly caught up in drama of his own making, other aspiring troubadours, like the young Bob Dylan (Benjamin Pike), are busy making the most of opportunities to impress producers and to cultivate a following at trendy nightclubs.

Written and directed by Ethan and Joel Coen, "Inside Llewyn Davis" is a genre-bending adventure that's impossible to pigeonhole. Part-musical, part-comedy, part bittersweet portrait of a lovable loser, the enigmatic masterpiece unfolds over the course of a couple of very eventful weeks in the life of a hopeless slacker who

can't seem to get out of his own way.

The film features such familiar hallmarks of a Coen Bros production as a profusion of quirky characters, a compelling storyline, humorous asides ranging from sub-

tle non-sequiturs to simplistic slapstick, and an original soundtrack by the incomparable T-Bone Burnett (O Brother, Where Art Thou?) seamlessly sewn into the painstakingly-recreated period piece.

Yet, "Inside Llewyn Davis" is

also refreshingly unique, thanks to an endlessly-inventive script which there's no reason to anticipate. Instead, just sit back and bask in the glow of a nostalgic cinematic treat best served unspoiled.


Stewart, born in 1961 on Union




West Indies legend Andy Roberts will receive a special honor next year to celebrate the 40th anniversary of his international debut.

American stronghold on MLS Cup

Sporting Kansas City won the 18th MLS Cup title last Saturday when it defeated Real Salt Lake, 7-6, in a penaltykick shoot-out at Sporting Park in Kansas City, (KS). The games ended in a 1-1 draw in regulation and prompted the ensuing

shoot-out. The win was another feather in the caps of American-born coaches who have won nine of the 18 MLS Cup titles. The result bodes well for American coaches who can argue that their success warrants more side line opportunities.

Sporting's American coach, Peter

Vermes, became the only person to win an MLS title as a player and coach with the same team: Vermes, who was inducted into the MLS Hall of Fame in October, played on the 2000 Kansas City Wizards MLS champion team coached by Ameri-

In fact, three of the finalfour teams in the MLS playoffs were led by American coaches. In addition to Vermes, Sporting's opponent in the title game, RSL, was coached by Jason Kreis, a former MLS leading scorer and MVP who won the 2009 MLS Cup as a coach with RSL. Western Conference runner-up, Portland Timbers, was led by Caleb Porter, a former college coach at the University of Akron, who turned around the faltering three-year-old Timbers franchise and was voted the 2013 MLS Coach of the Year. The Eastern Conference Houston Dynamo, which lost to Sporting Kansas City, is lead by Dominick Kinnear, who, although born in Scotland, made his mark in MLS as a player and coach, who steered Houston to MLS titles in 2006-07.

Among the American coaches who won the nine MLS Cups, New Yorker Bruce Arena leads with four titles, two each with DC United (1996-97) and the

Los Angeles Galaxy (2011-12). Bob Bradley (Chicago Fire, '98), Gansler (Kansas City Wizards (2000), Kreis, Vermes and Steve Sampson (Los Angeles, 2005) each has won a title.

The other MLS Cup winners are Dutchman Thomas Rongen (DC United 1999), Canadian Frank Yallop (2001, 2003, San Jose), Polish Peter Nowak (DC United, 2004), Sigi Schmid (Los Angeles Galaxy, 2002; Columbus Crew, 2008) and Englishman Gary Smith (Colorado Rapids, 2010). German-born Schmid is an American citizen, played college soccer at UCLA and coached in the USA at different levels of the game for many years and is considered an American coach.

NIELSEN RETIRES

Sporting's 36-year-old American goalkeeper Jim Nielsen on Monday, two days after the win, retired from the game after 19 years in MLS. Nielsen, who made a save to help Sporting stay ahead during the penalty shoot-out, thanked those

who impacted his career. "I want to thank the ownership group, my teammates, my coaches and the entire organization for the opportunity to have four of the best years of my life, not only mine but my family as well here in Kansas City," Nielsen said in a club statement.

"I will remember these years forever. To the best soccer fans: Since Day 1, they have always been behind me and I want to thank them for all the support. I made the final decision to retire today and to end this part of my life and it was the perfect timing, finishing with a great championship that the entire city deserves."

Nielsen, the MLS Goalkeeper of the year in 2012, holds the all-time club regular-season goalkeeping records for games played (128), games started (128), minutes played (11,497), wins (57), ties (32), winning percentage (.575) and shutouts (45).

MANDELA TRIBUTE

In a statement on the day former South African

President Nelson Mandela died, CONCACAF President Jeffrey Webb paid tribute to the great leader. "At CON-CACAF, we are deeply moved by the passing of Nelson Mandela today. As a token of respect and admiration to the inspiration he has infused during my personal journey, I would like to pay tribute to Madiba's legacy. plish.

"Since we don't have the facilities (in our college), we find how to develop ways to still be fairly competitive at our own track," said Coach Brown. "We train at a good facility in the Park Slope Armory. There are challenges and obstacles for him. Our field event people train both in our gymnasium and outdoors. College and high school people train there at different times," continued the coach.

Kristal Williams, a senior sprinter, another Jamaican native, and Ewart earned some school records over past years and should continue to improve.

"Our athletes from the Caribbean are hard workers," continued the coach. "The biggest thing was making the adjustment to the weather (as they were not accustomed to running from indoors to outdoors. The biggest thing is to adjust to the talent. They are coming along well. They are looking forward to a great season."

Ewart enjoys running for the St. Francis College Terriers.

"I like running for St. Francis (because) they

have been very (good to us)," the student athlete said. "It's been a great experience. I want to continue to run in college."

Ewart started running in college in Jamaica, West Indies. Eventually, he and his family moved north and landed in New York, where he transferred and began running at St. Francis, located in downtown Brooklyn.

Meanwhile, teammate Stephan Reynolds feels that he is having a great experience, too, running at St. Francis. He also competed in the 400 meters and clocked in at 56.6 seconds for the 21st position.

Reynolds also hails from Jamaica, in the Caribbean, and competed in his first 400 meters.

"It was good," Reynolds added after the race. "I tried hard in this (event) and could have done a little bit better. I need to work on my breathing. It should be better for the (regular schedule)."

The West Indies will take on England in the first of three matches on Feb. 28 before returning on March 2 and 5 for two other ODIs.

All matches will be played at Sir Vivian Richards Cricket Grounds. The teams will then travel to Barbados where they will play three Twenty20

Sunil Narine must be in West Indies Test squad

The West Indies test cricketers are on a long tour of New Zealand without some key players, including fast bowler Kemar Roach and opening batsman Chris Gavle. The team includes opening bowlers Tino Best, Shannon Gabriel and the young and inexperienced fast bowler Sheldon Cotterell. If the West Indies doesn't bowl well, it will be difficult for them to win the Test series against the New Zealanders.

Sunil Narine must be included in the Test team. He is a strike bowler and although his Test career has not been one abundant with wickets, he should not be struggling to make the West Indies Test eleven. West Indies selectors on tour will be best advised to play both Narine and Shillingford in the Test series. The combination of these two bowlers will wreak havoc against opposing teams. West Indies selectors on tour need to look at the team from a dif-

ferent perspective.

BOWLING IS ESSENTIAL IN TEST MATCHES

Wickets must be taken in order to win Test matches. Unlike limited overs, when the required overs are completed the game is over. Sunil Narine bowls appreciably well under any condition and his Test place must not be questioned. International cricket experts have found it to be unproductive not to have Narine in the Test-match line-ups. He ought to be reinstated in the Test squad.


NEW ZEALAND BLASTs ORDINARY BOWLING

On a wicket with lots of grass on it and some movement, and after winning the toss and sending New Zealand in to bat, the West Indies saw their bowlers lacking penetration and ignorant of how to pick up wickets under the prevailing condition. New Zealand scored 367 runs for three wickets on the first day with Ross Taylor scoring a century and Brendon McCullum scoring 109 not-out, with 74 runs in boundaries. Taylor was 103 not-out.

West Indies fast bowler Tino Best bowled with speed but with little effect; and picked up only one wicket on the first day. Shane Shillingford, Darren Sammy and Shannon Gabriel were also quite ineffective.

ting of the field. Catching positions must be exploited and bowlers simply must have the knowledge of where to put the ball. Many West Indies bowlers are not delivering the ball in the correct places frequently to pick up wickets.

Unfortunately, Kemar Roach is out of the series because of an injury. He would have loved to play on that type of wicket for the first day of the Test match because of the light grass.

Tino Best needs to cut his pace and control the

ball. He must try to ensure that he makes the batsman play the ball by placing it on the stumps. It is hoped that head coach Ottis Gibson will see it as a priority to bring Sunil Narine in for the second Test match.
