FEAR GRIPS TRINIDAD

MURDER, MAYHEM IN PORT OF SPAIN

The "execution" of Senior Counsel Dana Seetahal a prominent Trinidad and Tobago attorney has sent shock waves in the legal fraternity, the wider society and among jurists in the English-speaking Caribbean.

The country woke up to the news on Sunday morning that Seetahal, 58, was assassinated in true mafia-style while on her way home just after leaving a popular casino around midnight on Saturday.

She was a former Independent senator, newspaper columnist and author and was described as a fearless prosecutor involved in several high profile cases.

Apart from serving as a State prosecutor, she served as a Magistrate and Assistant Solicitor General. She was also a former lecturer at the Hugh Wooding Law School and held the position of Course Director in Criminal Practice and Prosecutions.

At the time of her killing, Seetahal was one of the lead prosecutors in the case involving a well-known woman in the business community, who was kidnapped and shot dead, with her dismembered body dumped in the sea some seven years ago.

Twelve men are currently on trial for her murder in the Port of Spain High Court.

Police described the current brutal killing as a "well-orchestrated hit" a few miles off the City of Port of Spain.

According to police reports, Seetahal was driving north along Holder Street, Port of Spain on her way home, a short distance away at One Woodbrook Place when two vehicles pulled alongside her car,

LOSS OF A MEDIA DARLING

Fear gripped this normally feteloving Caribbean island of Trinidad in the past week following the precision but widely unexpected assassination of one of the region's most respected attorneys and law professors with colleagues weeping openly, some magistrates expressing fears for their own lives and some of the lower courts suspending sessions to allow lawyers to grieve.

Dana Seetahal, 58, was gunned down in the trendy Woodbrook District in the capital on Friday night as she was returning home from a nearby casino that she frequented, plunging the country into a state of mourning and sparking fears that armed gangsters who have been roaming the country for the past 20 years are now targeting people in the higher echelons of society.

Seetahal was widely respected in the region as a law professor at the Trinidad Campus of the University of the West Indies, teaching and producing many of the state prosecutors, attorneys general and other highly regarded lawyers practicing in the regional trade bloc today. She was also the favorite person local and regional media would consultant for a legal or political

opinion in events where a quick but neutral reaction was required.

Caribbean

The World Bank has expressed concern about what it described as the exorbitant cost of sending remittances to the Caribbean and other places, saying that forcing migrant workers to pay as much as US\$50 to send US \$200 is "wrong."

The Washington-based financial institution said this is especially so when workers are "sending salaries they have earned in the hope of supporting families back home."

It said US\$200 often is a very

significant sum for migrants' family income.



"There was little transparency

and no global effort to address this problem until the World Bank helped form a coalition to monitor the process and create a 'one stop shop' information system to help remittance-senders compare services and costs," the statement said.

The World Bank said the high cost of sending remittances internationally has typically been caused by a combination of obstacles in each local market, both in sending and receiving countries.

Antigua

Newly-appointed CEO of cashstrapped regional airline LIAT British-born David Evans, who took up his job recently, is promising to listen to "those closest to the customers and who have the best insight into what the customers want."

Evans, who succeeds Trinidadian Ian Brunton, who resigned in September 2013 — has spent

decades in senior roles within the aviation industry.



"The years I have spent in the airline business have taught me that there is no monopoly of wisdom in the CEO's office," Evans said in underscoring the value of listening to the various stakeholders.

The former Caribbean area manager for British Airways, Evans said he plans to begin his duties by listening to those "who definitely know the airline much better than I do."

The company, with the assistance of a loan from the Barbados-Based Caribbean Development

Bank, is engaged in a re-fleeting exercise, and Evans said the new ATR aircraft represent a major opportunity to enhance the inflight experience.

Bahamas

Authorities in The Bahamas recently detained 132 Haitian migrants in a boat that broke down off a remote, sparsely populated island.

Police said 107 males and 25 females were intercepted off the Coast of Ragged

Island.
Local fishermen alerted authorities about the disabled boat



in the archipelago's southern waters.

Bahamian officials flew the migrants to the main island of New Providence for processing by immigration officials.

Recently, another 89 Haitians migrants aboard a boat were seized in Bahamian waters.

Barbados

Barbados has over the past five years destroyed 13 million of the

dangerous invasive species of the Giant African Snails.

This was revealed by Ian Gibbs, chief entomologist with Ministry of Agriculture, while speaking at a seminar hosted by the U.S. Embassy in Barbados at Jackman Prescod Polythenic, where American entomologist Trevor Smith

outlined Florida's efforts against the giant African land snail.



"In many parishes on the island the snail population is significantly down," Gibbs said.

He revealed that the giant African snail, where is not indigenous to Barbados, first came to the island on a shipment from St. Lucia.

The snails are native to Africa, particularly Kenya and Tanzania. They were first discovered in the U.S. in 1966.

They are one of the most damage-causing pests to crops and can eat almost 5000 species of plants.

Grenada

Grenada says Venezuela has

given an undertaking that it will fund projects to eradicate hunger and poverty in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Minister of Economic Development, Trade, Planning and Cooperatives, Oliver Joseph, said the pledge was made during a meeting of PetroCaribe recently in Caracas.

"They clearly outlined what needs to be done in order to eradicate poverty and



Venezuela will offer support to member states for this initiative," Joseph said.

"Grenada is part of this initiative and we stand to benefit from this drive to eradicate hunger and poverty in Latin America and the Caribbean" he added.

Joseph, who led a two-member delegation to the meeting, said five areas had been identified for support.

Jamaica

Jamaicans are protesting against a decision of the Portia Simpson-Miller administration to introduce a tax on bank withdrawals.

Finance Minister Dr. Peter Phillips said the government intends to raise J\$6.6 billion during the fiscal year, as he led off the recent debate on the J\$539.3 billion national budget.

The government says it intends to receive J\$2.5 billion in revenue from the new levy on the use of ATMs/ABMs, electronic banking, point of sales, checks and internet transfers when the measure goes into effect in June.

The new levy on withdrawals from deposit-taking institutions and security dealers will be calculated on a graduated rate system, with withdrawals less than

\$1 million being subjected to a 0.01 percent tax.



Dr. Phillips said the measure was expected to

bring in revenue estimated at J\$2.25 million this fiscal year and would provide the bulk of the revenue in new taxes.

In a statement, the Citizens Action for Principle and Integrity (CAPI) said it would also launch an online protest initiative against the tax, which becomes effective June 1, 2014.

CAPI said it opposes government's move to impose the "withdrawal tax", deeming it "oppressive, unconscionable and will prove inimical to its own growth agenda as it will send the wrong message to potential investors".

CAPI added that it is inviting the participants of churches, trade unions and all civil society stakeholders to join in its "civil protest against a tax, which will prove deleterious to the economic health of the country and family."

St. Lucia

St. Lucia has announced the imposition of a 70 percent tax on Barbadian goods, effective May, 1, 2014 and Barbadian authorities

said there must be open to frank discussions on the matter.

New York May Day celebration

Steel drum rock music livened up the early evening rally as feisty union retirees stood in the front row near the stage thrusting out their arms and belting out solidarity chants. On May 1, New York workers were celebrating May Dav.

Thousands of union workers representing over 45 of NYC's leading labor unions with dozens of immigrant and community organizations gathered near City Hall to celebrate worker and labor

Behind the retirees stood

waves of union members. They represented all aspects of the workforce that keep New York running: service and communication workers, builders, car washers and teachers, ironworkers, teamsters, farm laborers, taxi drivers, transportation workers and civil servants.

Workers held high their signs proclaiming their unions with messages: Solidarity United; It's About Freedom; Job Security, Fair Pay, Better Teaching; Pass the Dream Act; and The Union That Makes the City Run. Carlos Gomez's sign was in the shape of a green card emblazoned with an image of the Statue of Liberty.

Mirroring a workforce that populated unions at their start, the rally reflected faces from recent waves of immigration; the labor movement and immigrant rights movement are sharing concerns.

Unions were organized to join workers together to improve working conditions and their lives. From the stage, Mario Cilento, president of the NYState AFL-CIO reminded, "Union members, immigrant activists and community leaders come

together on May 1 to fight for worker rights, comprehensive immigration reform and the vital services all New Yorkers rely on."

At the rally, union leaders demanded an increase in the minimum wage, fair contracts for city employees, construction projects using union labor for building, and preserving the state's "scaffolding law." Protecting workers form wage theft, building affordable housing, expansion of jobs in the green energy and high-tech fields were issues also voiced from the

beries, gangsters involved in turf wars or people who hire them to settle grievances. Her assassination has set tongues wagging that this night well not be the case anymore.

The murder told up to mid week stood at 160 for the year so far placing the twin-island republic with Tobago on court for one of its bloodiest years to date. The recent average has been about 450 per year, proportionally among the highest in the world.

Shaken to the core like virtually everyone else in the oil and gasrich island, Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar called her murder "a direct attack on the justice system" while offering a reward of US\$600,000 for information about her assassins and vowing that everything humanely possible would be done to find her attackers.

Senate President Timothy Hamel-Smith said Trinidad will return to "the law of the jungle" if the judicial system is not overhauled and violent crime abated. The opposition Movement For Social Justice likened the situation to the wild west of old noting that "the execution of an individual of Ms. Seetahal's profile is

a clear attack on the institutions of the State and public figures. We are now in a new situation where public officials are, like in Colombia and Mexico, subject to the danger of assassination." The governments of Grenada, Barbados and Guyana reacted to her death

Meanwhile, security officials examining CCTV footage of her murder say they have identified three suspects, one of whom is known to be linked to an unnamed radical Muslim organization embedded in the country. He recently beat a murder charge and has gone into hiding after police began searching for him hours after Seetahal's path was blocked by two vehicles and bullets pumped into her head and upper body.

She was executed just as she was participating in the trial of a gang for the murder of local supermarket magnate and was a special prosecutor in the sedition case against Jamaat leader and former 1990 attempted coup maker Abu Bakr but few in Trinidad have so far made any connections to Seetahal and the plethora of cases against the expoliceman.

blocking her from moving as she nearied the Woodbrook Youth Center.

Other vehicles described as a panel van, then moved alongside her car and the occupants of that vehicle drew high-powered guns and opened fire on the SUV. The two vehicles then sped off.

Seetahal was found dead slumped behind the wheel of her car when police arrived. She was shot multiple times in the head and upper-body.

Among the high-profile cases she prosecuted was one against attempted coup leader Yasin Abu Bakr, which enabled the state to sell the former insurgent's property and was currently involved in the Coolman murder trial.

She also defended star entertainer Machel Montano recently in an assault case, which but he was convicted of the offence.

Seetahal, who was made a sen-

ior counsel in 2008, also acted as a criminal justice consultant to governments across the region and various international bodies.

The government has offered a TT\$2.5 million to add to the \$1 million (TT\$3.5 million) Crime Stoppers has offered for information leading to the arrest and successful conviction of those involved in the murder of the attorney.

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar described Seetahal's brutal murder as "an abyss of loss and sadness," saying she was "a sister, a friend, legal luminary and fearless, independent thinker on national issues."

Persad-Bisssessar in her capacity as chairman of the National Security Council had called an emergency meeting at her in Port of Spain to discuss coordination of various arms of national security to investigate the murder.

Seetahal was the second attorney to be murdered over the past few months. The murder rate had sky-rocketed to 160 since the start of the New Year.

Just last week a man, who won a shooting case was gunned just after he walked out the courthouse in Arima, about 26 miles east of Port of Spain.

The killing spree in the country has escalated over the past two months, with two and three people being murdered in one day in certain parts of the country.

So far the police have only been able to solve 20 of those killings.

Trinidad to probe unethical business ventures

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar has instructed Attorney General Anand Ramlogan to meet with various stakeholders to address concerns of "unethical business ventures," which involved his ministry and lawyers in prison litigation cases.

There are calls from various quarters in Trinidad and Tobago for Ramlogan to step down from office to facilitate a probe into the controversy since it involves his Ministry.

Opposition Leader, Dr. Keith Rowley, former Attorney General Ramesh Lawrence Maharaj, the Law Association and Prison Service Association have called for an independent investigation

into former Solicitor General (SG) Eleanor Davidson-Honey-well's concerns over "unethical business ventures," which existed between attorneys and inmates involved in prisoners seeking monetary compensation through the courts for alleged beatings at the hands of prison officers.

The former SG, who resigned in January this year, said the "unethical husiness ventures" may amount to breaches of professional ethics by the attorneys involved and may have the effect of perverting the course of justice in litigation against the State.

However, Ramlogan said he had addressed all the concerns of the former solicitor general which were encapsulated in another letter dated Oct. 28, 2013, which stated there was no further need for investigation by the prime minister.

UK-to-Caribbean air-fare increase

Air fares from London to the Caribbean has been raised just weeks after Chancellor George Osborne announced Air Passenger Duty (APD) on flights from the United Kingdom to the Caribbean would be reduced.

British Airways confirmed that it has added £10 to ticket prices to six destinations — Barbados, Antigua, St. Lucia, Grenada, and Kingston, Jamaica.

It said the move was "in response to market conditions." Virgin Atlantic is believed to have followed the move with a similar increase on some Caribbean routes, with immediate effect.

BA said fares to its other Caribbean destinations, St. Kitts and Nevis and Port of Spain remained unchanged.

A spokesman for the airline said that even with the increase, lowseason fares to the Caribbean were "well below" the levels of two years ago.

Elizabeth Fox, Jamaica Tourist Board regional director for the UK and Northern Europe, told industry website Travel Mole: "Following the recent APD victory for the Caribbean, it seems a real shame that BA and Virgin are looking to increase fares to destinations in the West Indies like Jamaica."

"Fares have been known to go up at this time of the year, but it seems that the Caribbean is singled out when other destinations are not being targeted for an increase," she said.

In March the Chancellor announced that all long-haul passengers would pay the same tax as those flying to the U.S. from April 1, which represents a saving of £64 for a family of four flying to the Caribbean.

Further extension of TPS for Haitians

The United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) says the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is extending the re-registration deadline from May 2, 2014 to July 22, 2014 for Haitian nationals who have already been granted Temporary Protected Status (TPS) and seek to maintain that status for an additional 18 months.

USCIS, therefore, said on May 2 that it "strongly encourages Haitian TPS beneficiaries to apply as soon as possible."

The DHS began accepting re-registration applications on March 3, 2014 from TPS Haiti beneficiaries when it announced an 18-month extension of the TPS designation for Haiti, from July 23, 2014, through Jan. 22, 2016.

USCIS said about 51,000 TPS Haiti beneficiaries are expected to file for re-registration.

It said TPS is not available to Haitian nationals who have not continuously resided in the United States since Jan. 12, 2011.

In the March 3, 2014 US Federal Register notice announcing the extension of TPS for Haiti, DHS also automatically extended—by six months, through Jan. 22, 2015—the validity of Employment Authorization Documents (EADs) for eligible Haitian TPS beneficiaries.

USCIS said this will allow sufficient time for eligible TPS beneficiaries who reregister on time to receive an EAD without any lapse in employment authorization.

To re-register, USCIS said TPS beneficiaries must submit Form I-821, Application for Temporary Protected Status, and Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization.

It said individuals seeking to re-register do not need to pay the Form I-821 application fee.

However, all re-registrants 14 years of age and older must pay a biometric services fee or submit a fee waiver request, USCIS said.

It said all re-registrants seeking employment authorization through January 22, 2016, must also submit the Form I-765 fee (or a feewaiver request).

USCIS said re-registrants who do not want employment authorization must still submit a completed Form I-765 but do not need to submit the I-765 fee.

"Failure to submit the required filing fees or a properly documented fee-waiver request will result in the rejection of the reregistration application," it warned.

The U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security may designate a foreign country for TPS due to conditions in the country that temporarily prevent the country's nationals from returning safely, or in certain circumstances, where the country is unable to handle the return of its nationals adequately.

USCIS said it may grant TPS to eligible nationals of certain countries, or parts of countries, who are already in the United States. Eligible individuals without nationality who last resided in the designated country may also be granted TPS.

The Secretary of Homeland Security may designate a country for TPS due to the following temporary conditions in the country: Ongoing armed conflict, such as civil war; an environmental disaster, such as earthquake or hurricane, or an epidemic; and other extraordinary and temporary conditions.

The U.S. first granted TPS to undocumented Haitians living in the United States shortly after the Jan. 12, 2010 massive earthquake in Haiti.

USCIS warned that TPS is a temporary benefit that does not lead to lawful permanent resident status or give any other immigration status.

However, it said registration for TPS does not prevent one from applying for nonimmigrant status; filing for adjustment of status based on an immigrant petition; and applying for any other immigration benefit or protection for which one may be eligible.

This week in Albany

This week, the State Assembly returned to Albany following the Easter and Passover Holidays to begin work on important legislative priorities of the 2014 Legislative Session. The legislative session continues in Albany until the end of June.

Some of the key proposals and activities happening in the Assembly this past week include:

Legislation to Protect Domestic Violence Victims

Seeking to stem the prevalence of domestic violence incidents and repeat omestic violence offenses throughout the state, the Assembly passed a legislative package aimed at strengthening protections for victims of domestic violence and enhancing health care professionals' ability to aid these victims in the recovery process.

The package also includes measures that would:

- * Strengthen the enforcement of orders of protection by permitting victims to recover non-economic damages from any or all defendants found liable for failure to obey or enforce domestic violence orders of protection or temporary orders of protection (A.899);
- * Require hospitals to maintain policies to effectively aid victims of domestic violence (A.2562-A);
- * Require police to promptly translate domestic violence incident reports that are filled out in a language other than English, as well as provide the notification of victims' rights in such victim's

native language (A.9251);

- * Include the unauthorized tracking of an individual, with a GPS or other device, within the meaning of "following" in the crime of stalking in the fourth degree (A.7720B);
- * Require wireless telephone companies to allow victims of domestic violence to opt-out of shared or family plans without incurring any penalties (A.7964-B):
- * Enact a Domestic Violence Escalation Prevention Act, which makes it illegal for an individual to possess a firearm if he or she has committed a familv offense (A.6390). Earlier this legislative session, the Assembly passed legislation that would prohibit discrimination against victims of domestic violence in employment while also requiring reasonable accommodations for victims (A.898, Weinstein) and would require the interpretation of orders of protection in court proceedings where an interpreter has already been appointed (A.1084-A.).

Maximum Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) Award Increased First Time in 14 Years

For the first time in 14 years, New York State will increase funding for the maximum Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) award. With this increase, New York State has allocated more than \$1 billion for grants and scholarships for New York students who pursue higher education at a public or independent college or university in the State.

Pending public school promotion policy changes

Schools Chancellor Carmen Fariña recently announced changes to the Department of Education's promotion policy for students in grades 3-8 with standard promotion criteria. The proposed new policy, upon approval of the Panel for Educational Policy (PEP), would go into effect this school vear in order to comply with recent changes in State law and to allow educators to make decisions about the students they know best while maintaining high standards. The policy will be voted on at the PEP meeting in May.

"We have listened and worked closely with families, teachers and principals to establish a new promotion policy that complies with State law and empowers educators, takes the temperature down around testing, and keeps rigorous standards in place," said Schools Chancellor Carmen Fariña. "This new way forward maintains accountability, but mitigates the unintended consequences of relying solely on a single test. Through a comprehensive evaluation of student work using multiple measures, our new policy is a step forward for students, parents, and schools."

"It's absolutely vital that students are ready to succeed in the next grade when they are promoted. The best way to do that, as the governor and legislature have affirmed, is to use multiple measures to make sure students are ready for promotion," said New York Education Commissioner John King. "We'll work together with NYCDOE to make sure all our students are on the path to college and career readiness."

Ten years ago, the DOE implemented a student promo-

tion policy based on State exam scores. That approach, while intended to raise expectations for all students, often led to teachers "teaching to the test" and caused a great deal of anxiety in school communities.

Going forward, instead of having student promotion from one grade to the next based solely on exam results, teachers and principals will now determine which students are at risk of not making sufficient progress based on a more comprehensive, authentic review of their classroom work in addition to their test scores. This shift to multiple measures represents another important step toward aligning our teaching with the more rigorous Common Core standards. This new approach will bring New York City in accordance with other districts in the State and with the recent changes to the State law.

To develop the new policy, the Department consulted with and gathered feedback from families, teachers, principals, and education advocates. Many identified that, under the current policy, a student's body of work over the course of the entire year was overlooked in favor of a single, standardized exam. To remedy those concerns and incorporate multiple measures in accordance with State law, the DOE plans to implement several important changes:

Empowering Educators -

Based on a review of student work from the year, teachers and principals will identify the students they believe may be at risk of not being able to succeed in the next grade, even with support. State test results for the lowest-performing students will continue to be shared with schools in June. Schools may use this information as one of multiple pieces of evidence to assess student readiness for the next grade level, but they may not use it as the primary or major factor in those decisions.

Authentic Student Work – Teachers will complete promotion portfolios for students identified for possible retention. The guidance provided to schools about this process will be revised so that student promotion portfolios align to the Common Core, represent real classroom learning, and incorporate student work already completed throughout the school year.

Consistent, Rigorous Standards – The reviews of student portfolios in schools across the city will be judged against clear, consistent, criteria aligned to the Common Core. Superintendents will oversee this process for their schools.

"The NYC Department of Education's new promotion policy reflects the best available research and is good common sense," said Dr. Linda Darling Hammond, Professor of Education at Stanford Graduate School of Education. "Students are more than test results, and this sound policy reflects that fact. Promotion decisions will be based on multiple measures and will consist of a comprehensive review of the skills they've learned in the classroom. In addition, children will receive more useful supports

Former party stalwart's son should be booted out

The People's National Movement (PNM) in Trinidad and Tobago, the party of which Dr. Eric Williams was the primary founding figure, is generally referred to as drawing most of its support from among Afro-Trinidadians. But although such core support has always come from this sector, it clearly wasn't Williams' intent, when crafting the PNM model for its 1956 launch, to create an "African people's party." The very first roster of winning PNM candidates, from the election in '56 that allowed the party to form its first government, was reflective of a cosmopolitan mix of which Williams would frequently boast. Although Afro-Trinidadians formed the largest bloc, the lineup included individuals of Indo-Trinidadian, Chinese and Caucasian stock. One of the two Caucasians who had become a big crowd favorite in those early days of the party seeking to make its mark in the country's political history, was Gerard Montano.

Years later, Montano would become a sacrificial lamb when Williams, in the face of the socalled Black Power unrest gripping the country as the 70s dawned, dispatched both Montano and fellow Caucasian John O'Halloran from the cabinet, in what was evidently a placating gesture. I have remained unconvinced of there having been true justification for that move, tending to see it more as a Williams overreaction than a response prevailing circumstances dictated. Whether in the next politically active Montano generation is to be found an indication of lingering anger over Williams' offering up Gerard back then is speculative. But two Montano sons who've followed their father as jousters in the political arena, Robin and Danny, have given different signals, as far as loyalty to the party Williams founded.

Robin Montano, whose politics has often had somewhat of a loose-cannon look, has shown no desire to be aligned with the PNM, quite the contrary in fact. Party affiliation-wise, brother Danny walked the PNM path of his late father and served in cabinet during Patrick Manning's run as prime minister. But Danny Montano has lately been in the news in a manner that rightly should terminate his tenure in the PNM camp.

The political temperature in Trinidad and Tobago today is elevated, and figures to be even

more so in upcoming months. Elections are due by May, 2015, when the government of Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar will have completed its five-year term. There is widespread expectation that whenever that election is called, the Bissessar government is likely to be turned out of office, following an accumulation of abuses of power that has at times looked contemptuous in its brazen arrogance. In the midst of this sizzling narrative is scheduled, in a few days, the PNM's internal election, which for the first time will be conducted via a one-person-one-vote system introduced by current leader Dr. Keith Rowley, as opposed to the delegate bloc voting heretofore in place.

Dr. Rowley is being challenged for the PNM leadership post (improbably, some believe) by Penny Beckles-Robinson, a former senator and member of cabinet. Montano, for whatever reasons, has linked up

with Beckles-Robinson in her bid to become party leader, which is all perfectly in order. The walk on the wild side that should earn Montano his dishonorable discharge is recent comment he made, reported in the press, that the people of Trinidad and Tobago should not vote for a PNM of which Rowley is leader. It would be wimpish beyond belief for the party leadership to countenance such in-vour-face disloyalty as Montano demonstrated in his venting, obviously for public consumption. And it certainly begs a revisiting of the question about lingering feelings of who-knowswhat arising from Gerard Montano's being thrown under the bus decades ago.

For sure, opposition to Rowley as party leader, such as it is, would seem to stem from some visceral dislike, rather than his track record since being voted into the position in 2010, following the last (truncated) Manning stint as prime minister that left the PNM quite demoralized. Apart from the above-referenced opening up of the election process within the party and other organizational reforms, Rowley led the party to three victories in elections held last year and,

for the most part, seems to have acquitted himself well as Leader of the Opposition. Yet, there are those who consider Rowley's even more significant contribution to have been his having the guts to stand alone among the PNM brass in protesting Manning's pattern of out-of-control stewardship of party and country, preceding his premature calling of the general elections four years ago. For the party faithful, the leadership question will be soon gone as an issue.

But first things first. Rowley and the PNM executive should forthwith address that unacceptably bilious utterance from Montano. The party's general secretary was quoted in the media commenting that if Montano wanted to join the United National Congress (Bissessar's party), he should go ahead and do so. It seems here that, rather than any show of interest in which party Montano is or isn't looking to join, the PNM high command should be focused on appropriately responding to this guy's open display of hostility and disrespect for a party to which he allegedly belongs. Any formal party response different from a "Get lost!" missive to the perpetrator would make no sense.

Continued from page 10 to improve their skills so they can progress on a solid foundation."

"The new promotion policy recognizes the scientific consensus that promotion and retention decisions should never be based solely on a child's performance on a single standardized test," said Dr. Aaron Pallas, Professor of Sociology and Education at Teachers College at Columbia University. "This change returns the responsibility of assessing a child's readiness for the next grade to the educators most knowledgeable about his or her academic performance throughout the school year -- the child's teacher and principal."

"Although the old policy was designed to end social promotion through grade retention, thousands of students were still entering

high schools throughout New York City unprepared academically." said Dr. Pedro Noguera, Professor of Education at Steinhardt School of Culture, Education and Development at New York University. "The Chancellor's proposal will provide schools with a broader range of tools with which to assess a student's performance. If these can be combined with effective, early interventions, we should see a significant increase in the number of students who graduate from high school college ready."

As in past years, students whose promotion portfolios demonstrate that they are not ready for the next grade level, even with support, will be recommended for summer school. Superintendents will review schoollevel decisions before they are finalized. In the past,

when students completed summer school, their promotion was ultimately tied to a second standardized test in August. This year, student work from summer school will be incorporated into the promotion portfolio. Principals will review these portfolios in August and make a holistic promotion decision for each student. Superintendents will continue to review promotion appeals for cases in which a parent disagrees with the principal's deci-

Students with disabilities and English language learners who have different promotion criteria will not be impacted by this change in policy. Moreover, the promotion policy for students in grades K-2 and high school will remain consistent with previous years.

The new policy requires a revision to the Chancellor's Regulation A-501, which will be voted on by the Panel for Educational Policy at its May 29, 2014 meeting.

Continued from page 10 Last year, TAP served nearly 400,000 students across the State.

The maximum TAP award is now \$5,165, available to New York State residents who attend any public or private college or university in the State. This represents a \$165 increase in the maximum award, from \$5,000 per student since 2000.

Additionally, students who qualify as an orphan, foster child or ward of the court for the purposes of federal student financial aid programs will now be considered dependent students for the purpose of determining their TAP awards, making them eligible for the maximum award. This means some of the highestneed students will receive an additional \$2,140 per year.

In 2012-2013, more than 372,000 New Yorkers attending college were awarded

\$931 million in TAP funds to help pay their college tuition costs, averaging \$3,049 per student. To learn more about New York's Tuition Assistance Program and other scholarships, grants and loan forgiveness programs offered by the State, visit the HESC website at HESC.ny.gov.

Women Legislators Rally for Raising the Minimum Wages

Assemb. Jacobs joined dozens of women legislators and labor leaders this week in Albany for "RaiseupWomen" to call for the passage of legislation that would allow local governments to increase the minimum wage. Citing data that show women disproportionately represent minimum wage workers, allowing local governments in New York State to increase the minimum wage would particularly

benefit women. Women represent 53% of all low-wage workers in New York State and 40% of workers paid less than \$15 an hour are also women. Men make up 34% of workers earning less than \$15 per hour. The bill is currently being considered by the Assembly Committee on Labor.

Compassionate Sentencing for Domestic Violence Survivors

Assemb. Jacobs joined members from the Legislative Women's Caucus, domestic violence survivors and key women's rights and criminal justice organizations this week to urge passage of the Domestic Violence Survivors Justice Act (A.4314-c/S.3337-C). Prostate cancer — Don't let it change your life

There are about 300,000 people suffering from prostate cancer in the United States right now.

But the good news, according to the American Cancer Society, is that more than 2 million men here are prostate cancer survivors.

The odds of surviving this type of cancer are favorable — as long as it is discovered in time. A simple blood test is all it takes.

Dr. Vitaly Raykhman of The New York Urologic Institute says men over the age of 50 need to be pro-active. They should be screened for the disease annually, and The New York Urologic Institute, a modern facility with state-of-the-art equipment, can provide this comprehensive testing and diagnosis.

Prostate cancer happens to be one of the most common cancers in men over age 50.

Yet, one of the reasons the fatality rate is declining is because of the Prostate-Specific Antigen (PSA) blood test. It provides doctors with a five-year lead time to battle cancer. That's a good head start.

Make an appointment to be tested, especially if there is a history of prostate cancer in the family. Men of Caribbean ancestry are also prone to the disease.

Don't panic if initial testing indicates that blood levels of PSA are elevated. This doesn't necessarily mean cancer is present. Other factors, such as a urinary tract infection, can cause levels to rise. Further blood testing, urine testing, and an ultrasound can help define what is going on, and Dr. Raykhman will determine if a biopsy is necessary

If so, The New York Urologic Institute performs biopsies under local or gen-

eral anesthesia, right at the office. An experienced anesthesiologist and pathologist are at hand to offer patients a high level of care. It is re-assuring, too, that Dr. Raykhman takes the extra pre-caution of administering intravenous antibiotics before the procedure. This minimizes the risk of infection.

If the biopsy is positive, there are two options — radical prostate treatment, which involves surgery, or radiation treatment.

"Most patients get radiation," says the doctor. "Surgery is appropriate in some situations, but carries risk of impotence, incontinence, post-opt pain, blood loss, and missed days of work." These risks must be weighed.

Radiation is often advantageous because intensity-modulated radiation therapy (IMRT) is well-tolerated.

"There is no nausea, no vomiting, and no hair loss,"


says Dr. Raykhman. This means patients can come in for treatment before or after work, and can keep up with daily activities. "When delivered safely and effectively, there is zero risk of incontinence, after the procedure," he says.

A radiation oncologist is also at the New York Urologic Institute to assure that every patient receives topnotch care.

If you don't speak the language, that's no excuse. The staff speaks English, Spanish, Hindi, Urdu, Russian, Bengali, Polish, Albanian, Mandarin, and Cantonese.

to implement the duty on products from the regions' more developed countries.

Barbados International Business Minister Donville Innis says it will use the May 6-10 Council of Trade and Economic Development (Coted) meeting to iron out a possible trade dispute with St. Lucia.

While Barbados has not commented officially on the matter, Innis maintained his government will not allow the situation to escalate into a trade war.

Suriname

Police have arrested a 24-year-old woman after a "cocaine ball" had been found in her vagina as she was preparing to board a flight from Suriname to Amsterdam.

Investigators said the cocaine weighed 2.317 grams and was discovered after

members of the Anti-Narcotics Squad carried out a search.

The Surinamese national, has appeared in court and was granted bail to reappear later this month.

Police have caught several women in recent months trying to use this method to smuggle cocaine.



The Caribbean region has been has an "unacceptable high" rate of murders, averaging around 30 per 100,000 citizens.

This was disclosed by Trinidad and Tobago National Security Minister Gary Griffith at the opening of the Association of Caribbean Commissioners of Police at the Hyatt Regency, Port of Spain last week.

The four-day conference was titled: Working in partnership to combat transnational organized crime."

Griffith said the crime situation in Trinidad and Tobago was an unfortunate mirror

image of what was happening in the wider Caribbean. T&T recorded 153 murders up to the end of April this year.

"In our country, while we have seen a massive drop in total serious crimes, over recent years reaching a 29-year low in 2013, we are still challenged with the unacceptable high rate of murders."

He said statistics show that more than 70 percent of all murders in T&T and the Caribbean region were committed by firearms as the weapon of choice of criminals.

Griffith said it was imperative that Caribbean law enforcement leaders used conferences, like this one, to explore innovative alternatives to the traditional law enforcement approach, to develop workable solutions and new methods to reduce the vulnerabilities commonly exploited by trans-national organized crime.





(StatePoint) If you are the parent of an older child or teen, you may not think about his or her day-to-day medical needs as often as you did during early childhood. But older kids also are dependent on you, especially when it comes to emotional health and wellness.

"Life transitions, romantic situations, stress and exposure to drugs and alcohol are just a few of the challenges facing teens and young adults," says James Perrin, MD, FAAP, 2014 president of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP). "As a parent, you can help ease these transitions and encourage positive choices."

May, which is Mental Health Month, is a good time to take stock of your child's emotional well-being. The AAP offers these tips for parents to foster good mental health:

- At each new stage in your child's life, be extra vigilant for signals that he needs extra support. Be ready to provide it.
 - Check in often and keep the

lines of communication open. If your child is away at college or has moved out, speak regularly by phone. Children should know that they can talk to you about anything. Be committed to broaching tough topics. Talk about your own experiences and fears when you were an adolescent.

- If your teen has a mental health diagnosis, he or she will need extra support. Pediatricians, school counselors and mental health professionals are important resources.
- Watch for mental health red flags, such as excessive sleeping, personality shifts, excessive moodiness, noticeable weight loss or gain, excessive secrecy or signs of self-harm.
- Don't skip the annual physical. Not only are teens still on a vaccination schedule, but checkups are a crucial opportunity to

talk to your pediatrician about any concerns, as well as diagnose any potential physical and mental health issues. It's also a great time for teens to seek confidential advice.

- Safeguard your home against prescription drug abuse by keeping your own medications locked. According to the AAP, prescription drug misuse by adolescents is second only to marijuana and alcohol misuse. The most commonly abused prescription drugs include Vicodin and Xanax.
- Provide logistical support for young adults like completing health forms and physicals for college; setting up accommodations at school if they have a mental health diagnosis; finding physicians to care for their adult needs; and signing up for health insurance. Your pediatrician's office can help.
- Help limit teens' stress. Don't encourage them to take on excessive time-consuming extra-curricular activities. Avoid compar-

ing your children. Every child has his own strengths.

- Encourage habits that reduce stress and promote physical and mental health, such as a well-balanced diet, getting at least seven hours of sleep a night, and regular exercise.
- At this age, it's important for parents to arm their older children with coping skills that

will serve them throughout life, rather than handling everything for them.







Hard-hit CDM Carbon Market seeks new buyers

PORT OF SPAIN. Trinidad, April 6, 2014 (IPS) -Since they first emerged as a result of the 1997 Kyoto Protocol, carbon offset markets have been a key part of international emissions reductions agreements, allowing rich countries in the North to invest in "emissions-saving projects" in the South while they continue to emit CO2.

The biggest is the U.N.'s Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) for verifying carbon emissions reduction projects in developing countries.

According to Dr. Hugh Sealy, chairman of the Executive Board of the CDM, it has generated 396 billion dollars in financial flows from developed to developing countries.

"We are fairly proud of that. Very few development banks can say they have had that kind of investment," Dr. Sealy told IPS.

The CDM, which operates under the auspices of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), validates and subsequently certifies the effectiveness of projects in reducing carbon emissions.

Such certification can then be used as a basis for obtaining Carbon Emission Reduction (CER) credits that are sold to developed countries seeking to meet emissions reduction targets under the Kyoto Protocol.

The big problem for local entrepreneurs is that the market for CER credits has

collapsed in recent years.

emissions.

In the Caribbean, many of the emissions reductions projects tend to be in the area of windfarming, said Dr. Sealy, since wind technology is proven and banks understand the risks.

The Caribbean's North-East trade winds make it a very viable one as well. Guyana also has a bagasse project for generating steam and electricity.

In the Caribbean, there are 18 CDM projects, but only one, the Wigton Windfarm project in Jamaica, has made an application for CER certification. Dr. Sealy said that Wigton, which was registered as a CDM project in 2006, reduced carbon emissions by more than 52,000 tonnes per year in its first phase, and then by 40,000 tonnes per year in its second phase.

The challenge facing the Wigton project, as with all CDM projects currently, is the steep decline in the value of CER credits over the past couple of years. Four years ago, Dr. Sealy

said, the credits were worth about 104 each dollars. Now they are worth about 50 cents.

He said the actual value the Jamaican company obtains for its CERs "will depend on the contract between it and the buver."

Dr. Sealy said the UNFC-CC's Conference of the Parties agreed at a recent meeting to the sale of CERs to entities that do not have obligations under the Kyoto Protocol, in an effort to widen the market for CERs. Under this new arrangement, "anybody, whether private or government, if they are going to voluntarily cancel the CER credits" can buy them as their contribution to the fight against climate change, he said.

The Brazilian government bought 40,000 CER credits to "green" the Rio+ 20 United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development and has done the same for the upcoming World Cup Football championship in that country.

Microsoft has done something similar under a different UNFCCC scheme for reducing emissions, known as REDD+, by buying an unspecified number of carbon credits from Madagascar generated by a rainforest conservation project in that country, according to a report by environmental news website Mongabay.

According to the report, attributed to the Wildlife Conservation Society, Microsoft bought the credits as part of its carbon neutrality programme.

Dr. Sealy attributes the steep decline in CER values to the downturn in the developed countries' economies since 2008 that led to a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions and thus to a decline in the need for carbon offsets. At the same time, the target set by developed countries for carbon emissions reductions was too low in the first place, he said.

Women graduates can take control of careers

More females are graduating from college than ever before, but does gender still play a role in career success? Does the so-called glass ceiling still exist? The truth is females face unique considerations when it comes to growing and navigating a career.

Rachel Thomas, president of LeanIn.Org, still remembers her first negotiation. Heart pounding and palms sweaty, she sat across the table from her boss-tobe armed with tips from her dad and a nervous smile. She ended up with a salary increase so modest, she said, "I could barely afford an extra tank of gas each pay cycle."

Many negotiations and years later, it finally dawned on Thomas that her dad gave her bad advice. It turns out that what works for men in the workplace often doesn't work for women.

It's critical that young women learn how to manage their careers as women. Yet they often don't have access to the right information. For example, search for "negotiation" in the books cat-



egory on Amazon, and you'll find nine out of the top 10 books were written by men. A co-ed writing team penned the 10th.

Yet seemingly small missed opportunities can significantly impact a woman's bank account and career trajectory. Women are four times less likely to negotiate than men. Now consider the difference between a woman who accepts a \$25,000 starting salary and a man who negotiates for \$5,000 more: when they're 60, the man will have made \$361,171 more in salary. And it's not just about money, according to one recent study, employees who negotiate are promoted 17 months earlier than those who don't.

"Lean In for Graduates," the new edition of Facebook COO Sheryl In," offers recent graduates practical advice for choosing a path, finding a job, negotiating a first salary. and positioning themselves for success at work all through the lens of gender. Here are three tips taken from the book that all graduates, especially women, should know as they transition from school to the workplace:

Adopt the mantra "Proceed and be bold"

Being bold is especially important for women because they often fear putting themselves out there. "Men will apply for jobs if they think they meet just 60 percent of the job requirements, while women will apply only if they think they meet all of them," Thomas said. Now who's got a better chance of getting that job, the man who applies for it or the woman who doesn't?

Adopt the same principle for opportunities at work. Let your manager know you're interested in stretch assignments and keep your eyes open for projects that will allow

you to make your mark. Shift from thinking "I'm not ready to do that," to thinking "I want to do that, and I'll learn by doing it."

Negotiate wisely

"You won't get what you don't ask for, so make it a rule to negotiate," Thomas said. "But before you do, understand how stereotypes impact negotiations." Research shows that we expect men to be assertive and look out for themselves, so there's little downside when they advocate on their own behalf. In contrast, we expect women to be communal and collaborative, so when they advocate for themselves, we often react unfavorably.

One strategy to combat this, Thomas said, is to use communal language. As she explains, "women get better results when they emphasize a concern for organizational relationships." For example, you might say, "If I join the team, I will do my best to contribute to its success. It's important that my salary reflects the education and skills that will enable me to do this."

As Rev. Al Sharpton refers to her, "Mother Baker," I honor and congratulate vou.



man, 48, told Caribbean Life in a post-show interview after entering the competition for the first time.




"I was very happy to see that the

crowd (was) enjoying the song and my performance," continued the exlead vocalist with the bands Energy (five years), Blaksand (11 years) and X-tract (three years).







"The EU is saying it will aim for 20-30 percent reduction in emissions by 2030. Science is saying we must peak emissions by 2020" in order to reach the target of less than two degrees global warming, Dr. Sealy said.

"At some point the developed countries will wake up to that and turn back to the one legal, internationally recognised, functioning market mechanism for reducing carbon emissions," he said.

In the meantime, however, he said, the carbon reduction projects in the region are still bringing the Caribbean many benefits. He pointed out that the increase in renewable energy projects means the energy generation mix is more diverse, making the region more resilient to the effects of natural disasters.

Landfill gas mitigation projects in the region are bringing health and environmental benefits, and projects such as one in Haiti for improved cooking stoves are resulting in less soot and less smoke that saves lives.

The UNFCCC's Regional Collaborating Centre (RCC) in Grenada is working to create awareness in the region of current opportunities available to the region through CDM, said Karla Solis-Garcia, the RCC's team leader.

So far, she told IPS, the RCC has provided support "to at least 60 CDM stakeholders with renewable energy (wind, solar and biomass), energy efficiency (improved cooking stoves, and efficient buildings) and landfill gas technology projects.

The RCC in Grenada is active in 16 Caribbean countries.

Solis-Garcia said the solid waste management sector and electricity sector were particular focuses of the RCC.

The solid waste sector was of particular interest since "Caribbean states share common challenges

on how to deal with waste, considering especially the geographical limitations," she said. "The waste challenge also represents an opportunity for investors, as emission reductions from landfill gas – methane gas – are significant."

Regarding electricity, she said, the key issues are "the significant dependency on fossil fuels to generate electricity, the increase of electricity demand, and the potential for renewable sources of energy such as solar, wind, geothermal, hydro and wave/tidal."

Dr. Sealy said that the region was in a good place with regard to deriving benefit from CDM projects, since it is accepted that failure to deal with climate change means that many islands will cease to exist.

For that reason, he said, countries with obligations under the Kyoto protocol "are quite willing to assist the small islands in any reasonable way they can." Caribbean islands can, therefore, negotiate for a good price on CER credits, he said, especially if these are from renewable energy projects.




The MLS initiative to have Americans, particularly ex-MLS players, coach its teams is successful. The latest evidence of the initiative's success was seen in last Sunday's nationally televised Sporting Kansas City-Columbus Crew game. The

contest was an intelligently well-played game, with two Americans, both former U.S. national players from New Jersey working the sidelines: MLS defending champion and host Sporting KC was led by Peter Vermes, while Greg Berhalter patrolled the sideline for the Columbus

Crew. Kansas City won the contest, 2-0.

Vermes and Berhalter aren't just coaches: both are in charge of all soccer operations for their clubs - overseeing player acquisitions and development and in charge of the clubs' youth academies. The

high standard of play made the game very exciting; the technical skills of the players and the tactics employed by both teams revealed two well-prepared coaches at work, which bodes well for the game in the U. S.

Vermes took over the coaching reins in Kansas City in 2009 and immediately showed his ability to build a successful team. He drafted defender Matt Besler that year, now a starter for the U.S. World Cup team, also later drafted C.J. Sapong, who was the 2011 Rookie of the year and also added defender Aurelien Collin. who was the MLS Cup MVP when Sporting won its second MLS Cup in 2013 in a shootout over Real Salt Lake. This season, Sporting (4-2-2-, 14 pts.) leads the Eastern Conference with 14 points and has given up only six goals, second lowest to Los Angeles Galaxy's five, and has scored 11.

The Sporting coach

learned his soccer in neighboring New Jersey, where he was the New Jersey Player of the Year in high school, which led to before an all-American career at Rutgers University. Vermes went on to play in MLS and ended his career with Kansas City in 2002 after earlier stints with New York/New Jersey MetroStars and the Colorado Rapids. He joined Kansas City in 2000 and helped the team win the Supporters Shield and the MLS Cup that year and was named the MLS Defender of the Year. Vermes parlayed his MLS playing experienced into a very successful MLS coaching career.

Berhalter is in his first year with the Crew (3-2-3, 12 pt.) and has led the team to fourth in the Eastern Conference to date. He gained some managerial experience with Swedish club Hammarby IF and at 1860 Munich FC in Germany for two years. He broke into to the MLS coaching

ranks in 2011 with the Los Angeles Galaxy and helped the team to two consecutive Supporters' Shield titles.

The coach was a prominent defender with a stellar career at the University of North Carolina. He embarked on an 18 year playing career that saw him play with the Crew and teams such as Holland Second Division team Sparta Rotterdam and teams in the English League Championship and the German Bundesliga before returning to MLS in 2009 for two years with the Galaxy. He played 44 times for the USA.

Berhalter brought stability to a team with a winning tradition but experienced lean years recently. Columbus won the MLS Supporter's Shield in 2004, 2008 and 2009; won the 2008 MLS Cup and captured the U.S. Open Cup in 2002.

Both Vermes and Berhalter were products of U.S. soccer throughout the different stages of their play-

soccer in New Jersey, through the college ranks and MLS. Their MLS playing experience obviously played a big part in their current success. Emphasizing coaching opportunities for deserving Americans is crucial to the survival of the game in the U.S. Among other ex-players coaching in the league are Mike Petke (New York), Jay Heaps (New England), Ben Olson (DC United), Pablo Mastroeni (Colorado), Dominick Kinnear (Houston) and Jason Kreis (former Real Salt Lake and now New York FC in 2014).

Originally from North Carolina, he never hit a tennis ball until he was in the second year of college while going to football practice and he eventually received his BA from Montclair State University.

He was involved in many aspects of tennis including going to West Africa. He also went to the Caribbean because Arthur Ashe wanted him to help the Trinidadian team. Elaine Williams was from Trinidad.

"Ashe really didn't know

what I was supposed to do," Dent recalled. "He couldn't go. It was six or seven months I was there (in Trinidad). In the time there I had to develop and coach the Davis Cup teams and in Trinidad and Tobago organize all the teachers in the country and 200 principals and athletic directors and coaches to initiate tennis in the school system so some of the kids would have an opportunity for scholarships in the USA.

ships in the USA.

"And I had to organize the coaches so that

they would have a common goal and to develop a patrons group among the parents so that they could develop a league.

"Being on the island and having to play ITF tournaments travelling was such a big deal. One can't learn to play a tournament here and lose in the first round."

Dent decided to develop a neighborhood league within the country just like there was one in Australia. Both turned out to be very successful.

The people in Trinidad wanted to name the league after Dent. Instead Dent told them to name it after Arthur Ashe. Ashe was the reason he was in Trinidad.

At the time they did not compete as one country. They competed as a Commonwealth. They would play in the Brandon Cup and Phillips Cup to see which players among the island countries would represent the entire Commonwealth. Since the Commonwealth was not a member of the ITF, it posed a problem. The ITF demanded that they have a division team from each country.

We are still in touch with many of the other children — we get calls and visits on Christmas and birthdays. Now we have an extended family that has enriched our lives. Many of them tell us, "You are the greatest." And we respond, "We love you even more!"




