Call for greater roles for Carib **overseas** missions

In recognizing what he described as the very essential role that the Diaspora plays in the development of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Opposition Leader Arnhim Eustace savs he will expand the role of the country's overseas missions and consulates if the main opposition New Democratic Party (NDP) wins the next general elections, constitutionally due next year.

Eustace, who, with NDP Vice President Sen. Major St. Clair Leacock, was on a tour of North America, said, in a town hall meeting in Brooklyn last Saturday night and in an exclusive interview with Caribbean Life that he is "interested in all the missions (and consulates being)

substantially changed.

"It's critical for the missions and consulates to play a more important role for investment in St. Vincent and the Grenadines," the NDP president and leader told Caribbean Life, stating that a number of "young, bright civil servants" at home, with advanced

CARICOM lukewarm to deal

It is not that they are opposed to signing off on free-trade agreements but the smaller Eastern Caribbean islands have always told governments in the 15-nation Caribbean trade bloc that they are reluctant to get into such deals because they simply have too little

to gain by doing so.

Critics say that aptly explains why the nine-nation sub-grouping that includes island-nations such as St. Vincent and Antigua, have had no more than a lukewarm approach to negotiations with Canada for a free trade deal, in

THE NEWS FROM BACK HOME

Bahamas

Fire officials in the Bahamas say a blaze destroyed as many as 70 homes in a shantytown, leaving about 200 Haitian migrants homeless.

No deaths or serious injuries have been reported from the early morning fire that ravaged the shantytown on Great Abaco Island. Investigators suspect arson.

Abaco's fire service director Colin Albury said about 65 percent



of the Sand Banks community was destroyed before a volunteer team of 12 firefighters was able to bring the blazed under control.

He said at least 200 people are now without homes in the community of several hundred Haitians and people of Haitian descent.

Many Haitians have migrated to the Bahamas in recent years to work low-wage jobs or to try and get to the United States.

Barbados

Governor of the Central Bank of Barbados, Dr. Leslie Worrell. has banned The Nation newspaper, including all its journalists from attending any of his press conferences or other Central Bank media events.

Worrell, chief economic adviser to the Frenduel Stuart government, notified Nation Publisher and Chief Executive Officer Vivian-Anne Gittens and Editor-in-Chief Roy Morris of the unprecedented move in a oneparagraph letter

sent recently to the newspaper.



"Consequently upon the lack

of professional integrity manifest in the Nation's front page headline of Thursday, May 8, you should be aware that Nation/Sun staff will not be invited to any future press conference or media even hosted by myself as governor of the Central Bank," the letter said.

The events unfolded within hours of a Daily Nation Front Page story recently headlined; "60 To Go" in which it was revealed that hard times had hit the Central Bank and its staff were about to feel the fallout.

Guvana

A former Guyana beauty queen,

who was charged with the murder of her wealthy husband, was freed by a magistrate in the Georgetown recently.

Chief Magistrate Priya Sewnarine-Beharry said there was insufficient evidence to link Carol Ann Lynch to the murder of her 44-year-old husband Farouk Razack on May 7, 2007.

Lynch was first charged in May 2007 with killing her husband at the upscale Bel Air Park resi-

dence but the case against her collapsed in 2008 due to insufficient evidence.



2010, In the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) Shalimar Hack recommended that the charge be re-instated and during the preliminary inquiry into the matter Lynch's attorney told the court the handyman, who also had access to the house, was never charged.

The attorney said there was not even any circumstantial evidence to prove that Lynch was involved in the crime.

Grenada Prime Minister Dr. Keith Mitchell has called for more investment in science and technology saying there is a tremendous opportunity to develop agriculture in the Caribbean.

Mitchell was at the time speaking at a recent workshop jointly sponsored by the International Science and Technology and Innovation Center for South-

Coop-South eration under the auspices of UNESCO, at the Grafton Beach



Hotel, in Tobago, Trinidad.

The prime minister expressed concern that science and technology, while far from being stagnant, is underutilized in the Caribbean.

He said hurricanes Ivan and Emily did extensive damage to Grenada's nutmeg industry in 2004 and wondered why science and technology could not develop a nutmeg plant that produces fruit in four years - half the time it currently takes- as well as more nutritious rice in Guyana.

Jamaica

Jamaica will for the first time host a global sugar industry conference from May 27-29 under the theme: "Positioning for the New Market Frontiers".

More than 100 delegates from various sugar-producing countries will discuss a wide range of issues affecting the global sugar industry, including energy cogeneration, financing, research and export markets

The London-based International Sugar Organization (ISO) Council aims to ensure enhanced international co-operation, in connection with world sugar matters and related issues including ways to improve the world sugar economy; facilitate trade by collection information on the world sugar market and

other sweeteners; and encourage demand for sugar, particularly from nontraditional uses.



Agriculture and Fisheries Minister Roger Clarke said while Jamaica will still have duty-free and quota-free access for sugar in the export market after 2017, there will be no price guarantee.

The tree-day, 45th annual ISO conference will be the first for executive chairman of the Sugar Industry Authority Derick Heaven since assuming the position of chairman in January.

St. Lucia

The family of property developer and hotelier in St. Lucia, who was reported missing, has acknowledged that he is dead.

In a statement, the family confirmed the death of the 38-yearold St. Lucian born businessman, Oliver Gobat.

Assistant Commissioner of Police (Crime) Francis Henry told a news conference recently that a post-mor-

tem examination of the charred remains of Gobat presented two scenarios - blunt



force trauma to the head or possibly gunshot.

The police had relied on DNA test results before issuing a definitive statement.

Gobat's body was reportedly in his Range Rover, hours after he was reported missing to the police.

Gobat is the son of Theo Gobat, who came to St. Lucia in the 1970s and ran several hotels. About six years ago, the family opened the Cap Maison, a 49-room hotel spread out in villas that the younger Gobalt managed.

The Gobat's family took to the foreign press expressing devastation over the death of the British educated multi-millionaire who also held British citizenship.

Trinidad

A Jamaican attorney, who is a gay, has been granted special

leave by the Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) to commence proceedings against Trinidad



and Tobago and Belize after he claimed that their existing legislations impinged upon his rights to freedom.

Maurice Tomlinson is seeking special leave to invoke the original jurisdiction of the CCJ and interpret the Treaty of Chaguaramas that only member countries can invoke the original jurisdic-

degrees, can be more effective overseas in garnering investments.

"Young people at home can be more useful here," he said. "Each one can bring in at least one business a year. I see a more expansive role for the missions and consulates.

"You have these young people, use them effectively," the former prime minister urged. "We need some young people here on the ground, encourage them to come, so that they (nationals in the Diaspora) can exploit the resources at home."

Eustace said the missions and consulates in Canada and Great Britain should be used in similar expansion efforts as those in the United States (New York and Washington, D.C.).

"It think it's time that the government review its relations with the Diaspora - not simply to provide consular services but (to) getting the Diaspora involved in St. Vincent and the Grenadines to provide incentives to trade with St. Vincent and the Grenadines," he told the town hall meeting at the Friends of Crown Heights Educational Center in Brooklyn.

"We have loans in St. Vincent and the Grenadines that applies to you, but nobody knows about that," he added. You can be entitled to tax concessions (for) up to 15 years.

"To the extent (that) the economy grows, you can change the incentive laws," Eustace continued. "A new NDP administration will provide incentives for that purpose."

Both Eustace and Leacock also used the occasion to reiterate their deep concern about the state of the economy, claiming that it is in a shambles under the incumbent administration of Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves.

Eustace, an economist by training, noted that the economy did not grow from 2009-11 for the first time in its history, and that there was "very small growth" in

2012 and 2013.

"When you look at the performance of our economy, there's much to be desired," he said, adding: "Banana is in trouble."

The Opposition Leader said "in our best year in the history of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, 1992, "EC\$111 million in bananas were exported", compared to EC\$15 million in 2012.

"A lot of banana farmers are now on poor relief," he said, asserting that "it's a sign of failure", when the government boosts "the amount of money in poor relief."

In addition, Eustace told Caribbean Life that "a lot of private sector firms" has been retrenching workers, that several businesses are closing and that the private sector is "in real trouble."

Eustace said the crime situation has spiraled out of control and is affecting the tourism industry.

"The banana industry ain't good, and tourism (is) the same," he said. "The roads (are) in a terrible

Additionally, he said construction of the international airport at Argyle is saddling the economy, stating that while the NDP is not opposed to its construction, the party is concerned about how it is financed.

fear of ending up as a dumping ground for goods from a powerful and efficient producer like Canada.

Their apathetic approach to more than five years of negotiations for a free-trade deal between Canada and CARICOM clearly explains why the talks have stalled and why it has triggered fears that they two sides might not agree on a deal anytime soon, because Canada is way more poised to take advantage of tax-free export trade than a region made up largely of small island-nations with less than 150,000 citizens.

In the past week, bloc governments have written to Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper warning that Canadian "inflexibility" on several negotiating points could spell the death-knell for negotiations, even as both sides had set a June 2014 deadline to wrap up the talks, which have dragged on since 2009 when it began with much hope and fanfare of a mutually acceptable deal.

Bloc chairman, St. Vincent and the Grenadines Prime Minister Ralph Gonsalves, suggested in the letter to Harper that the state of play should be laid at the feet of authorities there "because Canada" continues to place the onus on the grouping of mostly small island-nations to show further flexibility" while calling on Canadian negotiators "to show flexibility in relation to a number of CARICOM's key interests."

As if they had to, governments in the region even bothered to remind Ottawa that there is a vast difference in geographic size, population and purchasing power when Canada is compared to all of the member states. Only Haiti, with close to nine million people and Jamaica, which is headed to three million, have any significant numbers to make for sensible discussion.

"In order to meet the June 2014 conclusion date, the ministers called on Canada to show flexibility in relation to a number of CARICOM's

key interests, taking into account the need to respect the principle of asymmetry and the differences in the levels of development and size between the two sides."

To underpin the state of no 'play' at the moment, CARICOM and Canadian negotiators are yet to even set an agreed date for the latest round of talks since

the last meeting in Jamaica in April. Officials said that there's no indication of when the sides will meet again, because governments -- as stated in the letter "are concerned at the lack of response to a request from CARICOM Chairman Ralph Gonsalves of St. Vincent for a meeting with the prime minister of Canada."



Antiguans vote on June 12

Antigua and Barbuda Prime Minister Baldwin Spencer has announced that voters will go to the polls on June 12 to elect a new government, ending weeks of intense speculation and debate as to the election date.

"I have consulted with the Almighty God to give me the vision and to tell me what to do," Spencer told thousands of supporters of the incumbent United Progressive Party (UPP) at a rally in Potters, a village east of the capital, St. John's, on the night of May 15.

"I believe that we have made the case for the UPP to be returned to office. The case has been made overwhelmingly," he added.

"Therefore, the day when the people of Antigua and Barbuda will rise to the occasion and do what is right is June 12," Spencer continued. "June 12 is Election Day when the people of Antigua and Barbuda will say UPP now more than ever."

The UPP, which is seeking a third term in office, is being challenged by the Antigua and Barbuda Labor Party (ABLP), led by Gaston Browne, in the 17-seat Legislature.

The UPP rally heard from some of its candidates, including Jacqui Quinn, Dr. Errol Cort and Chester Hughes.

Spencer said the UPP stands on its record and deserves a third term to continue building a new society and create a charter for the future development of Antigua and Barbuda.

"The elections are very critical," he said. "It is very important to the continued development of Antigua and Barbuda."

Trinidad launches investigation into "Prison Gate" breach

The Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) Roger Gaspard has directed the acting Commissioner of Police Stephen Williams of the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service to "commence forthwith" a criminal investigation into "prison litigation matters" and the "the prospect of criminal wrongdoing."

Gaspard said he received from the registrar of the Supreme Court the decision of Master Patricia Sobion-Awai in the matter of prisoner Jamal Sambury vs the Attorney General and transcript of the hearing of the procedural appeal. He said there was enough material to support an investigation.

The DPP's decision is the latest seguel to the controversial PrisonGate issue out

of a letter sent by former Solicitor General Eleanor Donaldson-Honeywell to Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar requesting an investigation into circumstances "that may amount to inter alia to breaches of professional ethics" by certain attorneys involved in prison litigation which "may have the effect of perverting the course of justice in litigation against the state."

The investigation comes following Master of the Court Sobion-Awai's call for a probe into the circumstances surrounding how inmate Sambury was able to copy large portions of the witness statements of another prisoner Jamal Fortune who was awarded monetary compensation by the High Court recently.

Grenada's underwater volcano

A team of scientists in the United States is exploring the darkest corners of a huge underwater volcano off Grenada's coast with the hope of better understanding the mysteries of earthquakes and tsunamis, and ultimately saving lives, according to reports in New York.

Kick'em Jenny is a "dangerous and active volcano" sitting roughly 6,000 feet below the surface of the Caribbean Sea, according to ABC TV News.

The major network said Robert Ballard, famous for discovering the Titanic 12,000 feet below the surface of the icy North Atlantic in 1985, has set his sights on exploring Kick'em Jenny to study its eruption history and learn more about how underwater volcanoes can

ose a threat.


Ballard, the president of U.S. Ocean Exploration Trust and the director of the Center for Ocean Exploration at the University of Rhode Island's Graduate School of Oceanography, said the Kick'em Jenny volcano has a history of explosive eruptions, which could have the potential to trigger tsunamis, the effects from which could be felt as far

away as the northeastern United States.

According to the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), the Kick'em Jenny volcano has erupted 10 times since 1939, with the most recent eruption in 1990.

"This is the most hazardous part of our planet, where [tectonic] plates are head-on," said Ballard, noting that the devastating

St. Lucia moves to join Caribbean Court

St. Lucia has followed in the footstep of Dominica in its move to become a full member of the Trinidad-based Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ), Governor General Pearlette Louisy revealed.

Delivering the traditional throne speech recently at the start of the new parliamentary session, Dame Pearlette said that the Kenny Anthony government would write to the British government on the island's move to join the CCJ, which was established in 2001 to replace the London-based Privy Council as the region's final appellate court.

Barbados, Belize and Guyana are the only Caribbean Community (CARICOM) countries that have joined both the appellate and original jurisdictions of the court that also functions as an international tribunal interpreting the Revised Treaty of Chaguaramas that governs the 15-member regional integration grouping.

Most of the other countries are signatories to the original jurisdiction.

The governor general said that while St. Lucia had joined other CARICOM countries and signed the agreement establishing the CCJ in 2002; it did not proceed to abolish appeals in civil and criminal matters to the Privy Council.

"My government believes the time has now come to replace Her Majesty's Privy

Council by the Caribbean Court of Justice is one such international agreement," she said.

The head of state said the first question was whether or not abolition of appeals to the Privy Council required amendments to the Constitution of St. Lucia, including a referendum, or alternatively, whether an error was made in drafting of section 41(7) (a) of the Constitution when it referred to section 107 instead of section 108 of the Constitution.

"In the end, a majority of the court ruled that there was indeed an error in the Constitution and the court was authorized to correct the error," the governor said.

Dame Pearlette said once the agreement of the British government is secured, a bill will be tabled to effect the necessary amendments to the Constitution.

The Garifuna Nation which is comprised of about 30 Garifuna organizations from the countries of: "Yurumein" (Saint Vincent & the Grenadines), Honduras, Nicaragua, Guatemala, Belize, the United States of America, committed to represent the interest of our people which is about 600,000 worldwide and includes about 300,000 people in the U.S. who currently reside in the states of: New York, California, Illinois, Texas, Louisiana, Florida, Massachusetts, Virginia, Nevada, Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Connecticut, New Jersey and other states.

Our organization intends to not only support the efforts of Congresswoman Janice Schakowsky and her congressional colleagues but also stand ready, willing and able to provide them

with whatever additional evidence and testimonies they may need to prove this compelling case against the government of Honduras.

The on-going Human Rights and land-infringement cases against the Garifuna people over the years has been documented by several reputable international, regional and local organizations such as: the United Nations, Organization of American States, Human Rights Watch, Amnesty International and all the Garifuna organizations in the country of Honduras and in the Garifuna diaspora.

We are impressed with the transcript that is being contained in the congresswoman's list of human rights and land violations which have been occurring against our people in the last six years since the overthrow of the democratically elected President Manuel Zelava in 2009. We also would like to add that human rights abuses against the Garifuna people have been taking place in Honduras since we first arrived in this country on April 12, 1797. These abuses have led to the mass migration of our people to the neighboring countries of Nicaragua, Guatemala, Belize, the United States and elsewhere, where they continue to reside up to this day.

Every Garifuna person in the diaspora can trace their origins to the country of Honduras. Despite the fact that the Rights

The ugly truth about garbage and island biodiversity

BONN, May 21, 2014 (IPS) -Some of the Earth's most delicate tropical paradises are being disfigured by the by-products of the modern age - marine debris: plastic bottles, carrier bags and discarded fishing gear.

Just a tiny fraction of this originates from the islands themselves - most is generated on land and enters the sea through the sewers and drains; the rest comes from passenger liners, freighters and fishing vessels, whose crews often use the oceans as a giant waste disposal unit. While much of the garbage sinks, some of it joins the giant gyres where the currents carry it across the globe.

Small Island Developing States (SIDS), recognised as a distinct group of nations by the UN Conference on Environment and Development in 1992, lack the space to dedicate to landfill sites and do not have the resources to deal with the huge problem of marine debris that is being washed up on their doorstep – as the tides and currents wash the accumulated marine garbage onto their beaches. Domestically, they can take steps to ensure that they do not add to the problem - American Samoa for instance has banned plastic bags - but the "polluter pays" principle would require that those responsible for producing the waste should be made responsible for disposing of it properly.

A litter-strewn beach is an eye-sore and with tourism playing a major role in the economies of many island states, marine debris can have substantial adverse financial impli-

cations threatening local businesses and employment prospects.

Palau has banned commercial fisheries in its huge territorial waters forsaking the lucrative licensing revenue and will develop ecotourism based on snorkelling and scuba diving as a sustainable alternative. Alive, Palau's sharks can bring in \$1.9 million each over their life-time. Dead, a shark is worth a few hundred dollars, most of it attributable to the fins used to make soup considered a delicacy in parts of East Asia.

In February, Indonesia became the world's largest sanctuary for manta rays and banned the fishing and export of the species throughout the 2.2 million square miles surrounding the archipelago. The numbers are about the same; as a tourist attraction, a manta ray is worth in excess of 1 million dollars; as meat or medicine no more than 500 dollars.

Whale-watching creates jobs while bird-watching boosts binocular and camera sales and both help hotel occupancy rates. And the total number of international travellers broke the one billion mark for the first time in 2012 making tourism one of the main foreign exchange earners globally particularly for many developing countries, including

But marine debris casts its ominous shadow and threatens to break the virtuous circle which would otherwise guarantee sustainable livelihoods and incentives to protect wildlife.

Sea birds inadvertently feed their young with plastic which then blocks the chicks' intestines preventing them from eating properly and leading to a slow and painful death. The staple prev of some marine turtles is jellyfish but the turtles often mistake plastic bags for their favourite food with same dire results. For larger species such as whales, dolphins and seals, discarded fishing gear ghost nets - are a problem as the animals become entangled in them. This can impede the animals' movement and ability to hunt as well as cause serious injury or even death through drowning.

Remote island habitats support a rich and diverse fauna often including unique endemic species and provide vital stop-over sites for migrants and breeding sites for marine birds. But long established bird colonies have fallen victim to another danger exacerbated by humans – that posed by invasive alien species.

The problem of rodent infestations is well documented. Mice and rats have escaped from ships wreaking havoc on the local bird populations which had previously nested on the ground with impunity as there were no predators. Eradication programmes have successfully rid 400 islands of their alien

PNM focuses now on dislodging Kamla's crew

In the end, an adrenalin boost was probably the most important dividend for party supporters from the failed bid of Pennelope Beckles-Robinson to wrest leadership of the People's National Movement (PNM) in Trinidad and Tobago from Dr. Keith Rowley. For having been the driver of what produced that bit of a battle-readiness rise for party members, Beckles deserves commendation. In many quarters, Rowlev's remaining in place as party leader was seen as a foregone conclusion. Pretty much confirming this were poll results published shortly before last Sunday's internal election in the Express (other surveys as well) which showed barely minimal support for the challenger - a challenger who, in light of the very tainted current administration led by the country's first female prime minister, inscrutably seemed hooked on playing the gender card, supposedly for its cachet.

As is the case universally with intra-party squabbling, the PNM will surely have its share of fence mending to do, preparatory to full engagement of the task at hand: earning the electorate's mandate to replace the government of Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar,

whenever general elections are held. In respect of which, Rowley's scheduling of the internal election at this time was tactically prudent, presumably allowing time enough for the closing of factional rifts. In the event of cleavage with the potential for significant self-inflicted political damage, a party could benefit from any gray eminence within the ranks that really measures up to the role. And here, former Prime Minister Patrick Manning comes to mind.

The Rowley-Manning narrative has at times reflected prickliness. Rowley first challenged Manning for leadership of the PNM in 1996 after Manning, as prime minister, had called a snap election the previous year and wound up losing control of the government. Many felt that Manning's embrace of both Rowlev and key players (including Beckles) who supported Rowley in his challenge, was never again the same. By the latter stages of the administration Manning had begun heading in 2002 with the PNM's return to power, Rowley, although a cabinet member, was apparently becoming disaffected with some of the Manning m.o. That tension erupted into a public brouhaha when Manning dismissed

Rowley from his cabinet post on rather specious grounds. And when Manning prematurely called a new election halfway through the term of the government elected in 2007, speculation was rife about whether he would veto Rowley's running for re-election. Manning's loss in that 2010 election to the Bissessar-led coalition prompted Manning's ouster by the PNM hierarchy and Rowley being installed as political leader.

Given that history, it should surprise no one if Manning is at this point not disposed to the generosity of spirit it would demand of him to lend his voice to tamping down any post-election party friction. But a demonstration of magnanimity on that order is precisely what's required of Manning in the station he now occupies in the party. Some years ago a situation developed which seemed to ask of Manning a similar graciousness. Sometime after he had fired Rowley from his cabinet, Manning was

stricken with illness serious enough to induce from him rumination on his mortality. That turn of events looked to be the perfect opportunity for Manning's revisiting of what had been generally viewed as an unjust dismissal (certainly, as far as the rationale publicly advanced) of Rowley. For whatever reason(s), Manning would leave things be. Manning again fell ill, after retaining his seat in the ill-fated 2010 election, a stroke causing his protracted absence from Parliament until quite recently. So here comes a replay. Eyes are again trained on the former prime minister and longest-serving parliamentarian, curious as to whether he is of a mind to stand tall as party elder. Or signify, by his silence, a willingness to encourage and/or condone divisiveness.

For his part, Rowley, having now received the party rank and file's formal assent for unfettered leadership, can concentrate on formulation of a comprehensive plan for governance of the country. There were voices critical of his not doing so during the internal election campaign. To have gone there would be absolute rock and hard place territory. Were Rowley to have indeed

rolled out any vision for Trinidad and Tobago while campaigning, some of the very critics would likely have called him out as presumptuous for doing so and "dissing" his opponent in the process.

Except for the bias one expectedly finds among its hard-core support base, the Bissessar administration's record of unprecedented abuse of the privileges of government is a given fairly routinely agreed upon by observers. Based on their unenviable track record, it is difficult to imagine where, beyond that unswervingly loyal base, Bissessar and her confederates get electoral support for a re-do. One is tempted to suggest that the mission for Rowley and company is merely to avoid the flight path charted by the current governing crew upon assuming office four years ago.

But of course that will not suffice. There are problems aplenty in Trinidad and Tobago that cry out to be addressed. The signals emitting from Rowley so far tend to convey an awareness that for some of the most intractable of these, much more than a deployment of financial resources is required. Convincing the people is next on the agenda.

Less well known is the phenomenon of "rafting" where the invaders also use marine debris as a vector – plastic bottles are harbouring a potentially devastating assortment of worms, insect larvae, barnacles and bacteria, and warmer waters

arising from climate change increase the resilience of these unwanted stowaways making them an even more potent danger.

One of the fascinations of dealing with the animals covered by the Convention on Migratory Species is how they link different countries and even continents. Many

of the species are endangered and their conservation as well as the threats that they face require internationally coordinated measures. This applies to marine debris, a singularly unwelcome "migratory species" whose continued presence CMS will be doing its utmost to eliminate.


We are grateful for the





tion.

He wants the CCJ to rule against Section 8 of the Immigration Act of Trinidad and Tobago Act and Section 5 of the Immigration Act of Belize, which dates back to 1958.

Both acts are similarly worded and prohibits entry to prostitutes, homosexuals or people who may be receiving or living on the proceeds of prostitution or homosexual behavior.

As an activist for the lesbians, gay, bisexuals and transsexual community, Tomlinson had traveled to both countries previously, but when he discovered the existence of prohibitions he decided to refuse invitations from either country to avoid violating their immigration laws and "he claims to have suffered prejudice thereby."

In the ruling handed down recently, the CCJ, the region's highest court, said; "that there is an arguable case that the mere existence of the legislative provisions in question amount to prejudice, as demonstrated by the jurisprudence of the European Court of Human Rights and the UN Human Rights Committee.

Guyana

Secretary General of the Organization of American States (OAS) Jose Miguel Insulza has issued another call for the Guyana Parliament to approve the Anti-Money Laundering and Countering the Financing of Terrorism Act (AML-CFTA), which has been under consideration for several months.

Insulza said that passage of this act is crucial to bring the country up to standard on these matters, noting that several of Guyana's Caribbean Community (CARICOM) partners have already adopted similar legislation in compliance with the requirements of the Caribbean Financial Task Force (CFATF).

Insulza warned further delays could result in unnecessary damage to the country's financial stature.

"The secretary general, therefore, appeals again to

all political parties and other stakeholders in Guyana to exercise leadership and understanding in seeking prompt passage of the AMLCFTA," the statement said.

Insulza offered the cooperation and support of the OAS, through the Inter-American Drug Abuse Control Commission (CICAD), noting that Guyana's draft law is "fully consistent with the most recent recommendations of CICAD's expert group on money laundering," which were, in turn, endorsed by CICAD commissioners at the 55th regular session recently.

CFATF recently warned of harsh consequences should Guyana fail to pass antimoney laundering legislation before May 29 conference.

Saving Guyana's shrinking coast

GEORGETOWN, May 14, 2014 (IPS) - Agriculture has always played an important role in the socioeconomic development of Guyana, one of just two Caribbean Community (CARICOM) member states that straddle South America.

Agriculture accounts for more than 20 percent of the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP). It is food-secure, and agricultural commodities represent more than 40 percent of its export portfolio.

The 15-member regional bloc has always looked to Guyana, with an estimated 3.3 million hectares of agricultural land, as having a vital role in the Caribbean's thrust towards food security.

But the chief executive officer of the National Agricultural Research and Extension Institute (NAREI), Dr. Oudho Homenauth, warns that climate change is robbing Guyana of some of its prime agricultural land.

"We are seeing increasing rainfall, higher tides and so forth," he told IPS, noting that this has consequences for farmland, particularly along the coast.

"The seawater, as you know, is saline and once saline water gets on the land it is very difficult for that land to recover for crop production because there is nothing we can do in terms of adding any kind of amendment to correct soil salinity."

Homenauth explained that "the land will have to be left for over a period of time until that salinity is lost" and as the authorities move to protect the agricultural land and also its population, most of whom live along the coasts, Homenauth told IPS that Guyana has come to recognise the importance of mangroves, especially for coastal areas.

He said the country has been on an intensive campaign to protect and restore its coastal mangroves.

Approximately 90 percent of Guyana's population lives on a narrow coastline strip a half to one metre below sea level. That coastal belt is protected by seawall barriers that have existed since the Dutch occupation of the country.

In recent times, however, severe storms have toppled these defences, resulting in significant flooding, a danger scientists predict may become more frequent.

"Everybody knows Guyana's seawall, the famous seawall, which is an expensive structure to maintain and to continue to build, particularly as sea level rises," Agriculture Minister Dr. Leslie Ramsammy told IPS

He said that maintaining the seawalls is an enormous cost for Guyana, which has been spending an average of three billion dollars a year to maintain and strengthen the defences.

"But in order to ensure that the seawall and sea dams continue to serve us well and to be less vulnerable to the onslaught of the ocean, we have been protecting and promoting the growth of mangroves and other structures such as geotextile tubes to reduce the impact of the waves coming in," Ramsammy said.

"We've been doing bamboo growth along the seawalls to reduce the impact of the waves coming in. So a number of different structures are being tried but mangroves represent a major response of the Guyana government in supporting the seawall and there-



The Logistics Hub: Implications for Western Jamaica

Scores of residents, business luminaries, and public and private sector stakeholders in the second city Montego Bay, Jamaica were engaged in a riveting exchange of ideas, research and thinking among panellists and presenters at the Logistics Hub symposium at the Wexford Hotel on Thursday May 8, 2014.

The Caribbean Maritime Institute and The University of the West Indies, Western Campus in association with The Montego Bay Chamber of Commerce hosted a symposium to unearth new knowledge, promote discourse and increase awareness about the much talked about Logistics Hub initiative. The discussions were framed under the theme "The Logistics Hub: Implications for Western Jamaica" but they were geared towards providing a greater understanding about the total concept that encompasses the entire country.

This symposium comprised of a plenary session, a luncheon and three panel discussions to cover the various aspects of interest and relevance. Main themes punctuating the proceedings were the fact that the logistics hub is not a place but a development concept to drive productivity and

efficiency and that development has no nationality. "Jamaica's" logistics hub will therefore need the collaboration of the international community, foreign investment, and input from academia, environmentalists, the government and developers to be a success.

Dr. Geneive Brow

Metzger, Caribbean trade and investment analyst based in New York and former Jamaican Consul General, chaired the opening panel, "Socio-economic Implications of the Logistics Hub." The panelists included Sharon Fflokes Abrahams, minister of state in the Ministry of Industry,

Investment and Commerce and Edmond Bartlett, opposition spokesperson on the respective portfolio.

THE GOAT ISLANDS: AN INTERNATIONAL GATEWAY PORT

Dr. Fritz Pinnock, executive director of the Caribbean Maritime Institute and

main speaker for the plenary, believes that "this was an appropriate platform to promote positive discourse and increase awareness about how the logistics hub concept will work for the nation in a practical way; sharing in a comprehensive manner, how its development will affect residents in west-

ern Jamaica, their families, future plans and expectations and their livelihood." Using this as an opportunity to explain in palatable terms, the concept of this new development, Pinnock compared Jamaica's growth aspirations to those of Singapore and the famed London gateway. To make the London Gateway (which nears completion) a reality, the use of arable land and habits was inevitable.

The gateway is physically located in one of the most ecologically sensitive areas of England, and its construction involved the dredging of 60 miles of the River Thames, resulting in over 20 million cubic metres of dredged sand -; enough to accommodate 12000 Olympic size swimming pools. As a mitigating initiative, researchers, ecologists and environmentalists have embarked on a massive project to relocate tens of thousands of reptiles and wildlife to new sanctuaries. Fifty three hectres of land was identified for rehabilitation for various protected species. This is just one project to be undertaken to ensure that the 1.5 billion pound global gateway port and logistics park, which will create 12,000 new jobs,

Tips to boost infant, toddler brain development

(StatePoint) When babies are born, their minds are still a work in progress, and their brains will rapidly grow and develop based on their experience. That means the first few years are critical for healthy brain development.

"Parents play a daily role in promoting lifelong health by focusing on positive ways to nurture brain development, starting in infancy and extending through the toddler years," says Dr. James M. Perrin, 2014 president of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP).

According to Perrin, this means creating a safe, consistent environment to ensure children know they're physically and emotionally protected. He offers these tips for fostering a happy, healthy home:

• Talk to your baby in a responsive way, starting at birth. Watch how he responds to your face, focuses, and moves in time to your voice. As he grows, talk to him about everyday things, wait-

ing for his coos and ahhs, and then respond with an encouraging word.

One study showed that the more words parents used when speaking to an eight-month-old infant, the more words that child used at age three.

- Respond to distress with comfort. Even in infancy, it's an important way to build a child's confidence that the caregiver is there.
- Make eye contact with your child from day one. That could be during play, tummy time or even during necessary activities like diaper changes.
- When your baby starts to smile, smile back! If young children learn healthy, positive ways to get your attention, they'll be less likely to resort to fussing, crying or whining.

- Follow your infant's gaze to get a sense of what is capturing his or her attention. When it's appropriate, let your child explore that object.
- Be aware of what your face is "saying." Temper negative feelings because your baby is "feeling" them as well.
- Infants let us know when they've had enough and it's time for a nap by avoiding eye contact, becoming sleepy or fussy, coughing or rubbing his or her eyes.
- Reading to your child from infancy stimulates language and cognitive skills, builds motivation, curiosity and memory and stimulates language development.
- Babies learn best from people, not screens, and unstructured play time is more valuable for the developing brain than electronic media. Through unstructured, unplugged play, children learn to think creatively, problem solve, and develop reasoning and motor skills.

Instead of screens, try to encourage supervised but independent play like exploring a set of nesting cups or pounding on a pot with a spoon while you are preparing dinner.

in Britain is built without resulting in adverse environment damage. This custom built deep sea gateway port, which allows England to reinvent themself, has an unrivalled location that will increase efficiency.

Similarly, Jamaica will need to undertake a massive reconstruction of road and sea networks to create interconnectivity between air, land and sea modes of transportation, while finding creative ways of preserving the environment. The development plans for the Goat Islands is similar to that of The London Gateway. It too is envisioned as an international gateway of economic trade, facilitated by Jamaica, because of its location. However, given that the Goat Islands is already located in a highly industrial environment, the environmental impact will be far less. Even so as a precautionary measure, Pinnock is recommending that we adopt Britain's approach

to sustainable development which embraces partnership.

COLLABORATION IS KEY

The luncheon featured a special presentation from Professor Gordon Shirley, CEO and president of the Port Authority of Jamaica. fore reducing the impact of water hitting against the wall, against the dams etc."

Guyana has about 80,000 hectares of mangroves in place right now and over the last three or four years, the country has been "accelerating the growth of mangroves," many of which were lost 20 to 30 years ago.

We lost some of our mangroves and we are restoring those mangroves now. But we are also establishing mangrove growth in places that we've never been to," Ramsammy said, noting that "with the water and movement onto the shore, it is very difficult to grow mangroves."

As a result, Guyana has been conducting research to determine the best technology to use to achieve success.

"You need mangroves to grow to a certain extent before it can withstand the water and so we've been trying things like various grasses and so on to hold the soil together and we have been succeeding in these," Ramsammy told IPS.

Technicians came up with the idea of constructing geotextile tubes to help natural regeneration. A biodegradable tube filled with sand and water is used to form a barrier so that at high tide, muddy water can enter the area and sediment left behind can help build the soil up to a necessary level.

Spartina grass is then planted in the area. The technicians have found that the mangrove seeds would get caught in the grass and would later germinate.

When it comes to climate change and global warming, Ramsammy believes Guyanese should take pride that they are perhaps the most aware country in the world.

"I can't say that our people know all the details, all the science, but that's not the point. If we could also make them aware of the science that's okay but they are very aware of climate change as a phenomenon; they are very aware of what climate change can do to us and therefore they are becoming part of the climate change revolution," he told IPS.

"We have vast room for improvement in Guyana and the Caribbean but I think

that Guyana would rank as one of those countries where people are very much aware. Are they doing what is necessary? I think they lag in terms of their knowledge and what they do, but if you don't create the knowledge, actions will not follow."

Ramsammy noted that no country is too small to do something about climate change. In fact, he said there are things that every citizen in the world can do.

"I've heard people say I'm poor and I'm not a scientist and I can't do anything.' In fact we can do much as small countries, including in the reduction of emissions," he said.

"We have in Antigua or even Guvana hotels etc. If these hotels were to switch [from] the use of fossil fuel to the use of bio-digesters, using the waste to create energy, we can make a big difference in emissions and maybe in the global environment. It is a needle in the sand but at least it creates an avenue for every citizen to play a role and I think we should adopt that kind of approach that all of us as citizens could do something," Ramsammy added.

As Hercules descends into the volcano, Ballard and his team watch the robot's live cameras from a control room aboard the Nautilus.

After hours of searching, the team made a startling discovery – life, ABC TV said.

"It means that places that we thought there was very little life existing on our plant, we've just opened up a whole other area where life seems to be thriving," Ballard said. "A lot of the deep sea is sort of like you know you can think of it as a desert. We just found an oasis in that desert."

On its journey, Hercules took pictures of its surroundings, made maps and collected samples, including organisms living inside the volcano and even reaching inside the volcano's bubbling plume to gather materials, ABC TV said.

It said such discoveries on Ballard's trip could allow scientists to better understand the threats posed by underwater volcanic eruptions.

"And there's no reason to stop, there's 72 percent of the planet hardly explored," Ballard said. "I like to tell children that their generation is the generation that will explore more of earth than all previous generations combined."

"We cannot return to the past," he added. "I want to say to you that it is necessary for us to recognize and appreciate that, although victory is in sight, we cannot drop our guard. I want to tell you that it is not over until it is over."

Spencer also told supporters that there is work to be done in order for the governing party to "concretize the victory."

"We have to galvanize the people and defeat them (opposition)," he declared. "You have to do it for yourself, for your community and country.

"The most important consideration is that you want to stay the course and keep Antigua free and democratic, and keep out those who are not about people's development but their own enrichment," he added.

Spencer said the date of the issuance of the Writ for Elections was on May 16, with Nomination Day being May 21.

Browne, who is leading

the ALP into elections for the first time, expressed confidence of triumphing in the polls.

He described as "pathetic and bordering on a pappy show" Spencer's tenure.

"The 12th of June, 2014, will be judgment day for Baldwin Spencer and the UPP," he told reporters. "It will be deliverance day for the people of Antigua and Barbuda and victory day for the ALP."

The ALP had suffered its first electoral defeat in 2004

after nearly three decades of political control by the iconic and controversial Bird family.

Lester Bird, 76, who succeeded his father and ALP founder Vere Bird Sr. as prime minister from 1994 until 2004, lost the ALP's leadership race to Browne in 2012.

The Antigua and Barbuda Electoral Commission (ABEC) said about 48,000 people have been registered to vote after the registration exercise last November.





Buju Banton warns against T&T swindler

Dancehall deejay Buju Banton has not travelled an easy road since 2009 when officers from the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) arrested him in Tampa, Florida with evidence he might have participated in a drug deal. Convicted of conspiracy charges, the Grammy-winning reggae artist is confined to a Florida state facility but controversy has not eluded the popular Jamaican personality.

Allegedly, the incarcerated Banton is the victim of a scam in Trinidad & Tobago that could again put him in the middle of another legal entrapment case.

This time though, Banton is the complainant.

After serving half his conviction time for charges he claims was obtained by entrapment, his attorney Charles Ogletree and the Buju Banton Defense Support Committee -- a group formed to aid in his appeal -- released a statement disclaiming permission for an individual in the twin islands of Trinidad & Tobago to book concerts the deejay did not authorize.

"A certain individual in Trinidad has approached promoters with the false claim that he is the local agent for renowned reggae musician Buju Banton," the

statement said. "He has further sought to swindle monies by stating he is authorized to collect funds for a concert being held for Buju Banton in Trinidad during this year."

The joint statement added

"We wish to warn the

public that it is totally untrue. Buju Banton has not given such rights to anyone in Trinidad. Nor is a concert being organized at this time."

While awaiting a second trial, Banton was temporarily released to perform at a Miami concert. However, since that he has never been freed to perform or appear at any event and particularly none outside of US jurisdiction.

While benefit concerts could help raise funds for his appeal and legal defense, there have not been any announcements for any such event slated for the Caribbean.

In addition, the lawyer cautioned the individual who is allegedly impersonating or acting as Banton's agent to cease and desist and warned that if caught could face legal reprisals.

"Anyone seeking to do this would suffer legal consequences," the lawyer emphasized.

He also asked promoters and the general community to co-operate with his cause by reporting this impersonator and anyone acting in a "We urge that you imme-

similar fashion.

diately inform the authorities of anyone who solicits monies from you for that purpose."

With Banton still locked up after two trials and being sentenced to serve 10-years for conspiracy to distribute five or more kilograms of cocaine his main focus has been to appeal the conviction and prove his innocence. He has consistently argued that he did not receive a fair trial and is determined to overturn the conviction.



You know the rules.

Each base must be touched. each ball hit within bounds or so you hope. No spitballs, corked bats, pine tar, or steroids. Four bases to run. Three strikes, you're out.

Those are the basics of baseball. But rules, of course, can be changed, just like the game itself and in the new book "1954" by Bill Madden, you'll see how the game was altered forever by one simple fix.

It was a time when Perry Como dominated the music charts and Elvis was just some kid in Memphis. The Cold War raged; Brown vs. Board of Education was decided; and radio was king, although everybody wanted a television set on which to watch a few brief programs on a handful of stations.

It was 1954 and, like much of the world, baseball was in the midst of change, too.

Though Jackie Robinson had broken baseball's color line seven years earlier, many teams had rosters that were still completely white. The Dodgers were "the most aggressive" on tackling segregation with six black players that year. The Indians had five and the Giants, four. That complete desegregation was coming was obvious, despite protests against it and owner reluctance.




In quoting the American industrialist and founder of the Ford Motor Compa-

Chairman Elombe Brath passes

After a long illness Harlem's Elombe Brath, a wellrespected, much admired, historian, Pan-African leader and graphic artist passed.

The 77-year-old titan of Black culture and heritage was most acclaimed as the chairman of the Patrice Lumumba Coalition. He held monthly meeting at the Harriet Tubman School where he updated the community on current affairs and mostly spoke to issues under-reported by the media. Through his efforts, the name Patrice Emery Lumumba became familiar. Brath often relaved how the anti-colonial Congolese leader born on July 2, 1925 "among the Batatela people in the then-Belgian Congo was assassinated by a CIA-instigated coup on Jan. 17, 1961." Brath explained that Lumumba's murder occurred "six months after he had led his country to its newly, hard fought for independence."

Brath was regaled as a walking cultural activist.

He was never without an



armful of publications. He was a relentless reader and was always on the cutting edge of news related to Africa and the Caribbean.

Often he travelled to Geneva, Switzerland where the United Nations convened sessions pertaining to Africa.

A former graphic artist for the community affairs program "Like It is," his talent was regularly credited on ABC-TV.

Brath will not be forgotten for the role he played in lobbying for Harlem to be placed on the official schedule of stops when Nelson Mandela and his wife Winnie visited New York after his release from apartheid-riddled South African prison. In the center of 125th St. & Adam Clayton Powell Blvd. thousands rallied to see the best African example. An unforgettable moment

prior to the start of the celebration indelibly imprints Brath's whisper to Winnie Mandela. Although busy coordinating the media event Brath - with clipboard and paper-load in hand reached with urgency to familiarize the continental guest of honor with a woman he knew she would want to know. The crowds witnessed Winnie's look of surprise, shock and pride when she grabbed the woman who stood next to her. It was Betty Shabazz, the widow of Malcolm X.

Brath's commitment to Harlem and New York also marked visits by Zimbabwe's President Robert Mugabe and numerous African heads of state. He played a key role in stopping construction at the site of the African Burial Ground. Brath is also credited with preserving the area

there which is now established as a National Park.

Brath was among the very first advocates for the youths accused with the attack and alleged rape of Patricia Meile who was previously identified as the Central Park Jogger.

In addition to his many advocacies, Brath also hosted "Afrikaledoscope" on WBAI-FM.

He loved jazz and his early years promoted concerts lauding the legends of the genre.


Brath leaves to grieve wife Nomsa, six childen, brother Kwame and many, many friends and associates.

Legendary sea monster resurfaces as humanity's

"Godzilla"

"Godzilla" made its debut in 1954 when the mythical, man-eating monster, inadvertently created by an atomic blast, emerged from the Pacific Ocean to carve a path of death and destruction across Japan, much to the chagrin of the country's overmatched military. A couple of years later, Raymond Burr narrated a documentary-style, English-language remake which was basically a dubbed version of the original with his lines spliced in.

Despite relying for decades on terribly-stilted scripts and a guy in a rubber suit towering over a scale model of a toy-sized Tokyo, the B-movie franchise has remained popular enough to spawn thirty-something sequels and counting. This relatively-upscale reboot of the series, however, abandons the campy dialogue and cheesy trick photography in favor of an emotionally-engaging plot as well as state-of-the-art special f/x.

Furthermore, while the 2014 edition "Godzilla" still looks like a fire-breathing, mutated iguana, he behaves more like a benign, anthropomorphic ally of humanity than its evil adversary. The villains, here, are a couple of nuclear waste-ingesting MUTOs (Massive Unidentified Terrestrial Organisms) that are not only threatening to level San Francisco but are poised to unleash a litter of their equally-hostile offspring.

In case you're wondering, there's plenty of precedent for

Godzilla's squaring-off against fellow behemoths. Consider such classic showdowns as King Kong vs. Godzilla (1962), Mothra vs. Godzilla (1964) and Godzilla vs. Megalon (1973), to name a few.

Although, this one's finale is well worth the wait, it sure takes its sweet time getting around to that spectacular battle royal. In fact, we don't even get a peek at Godzilla during the film's first hour, which is instead devoted to developing characters and filling in the back story.

The adventure revolves around the Brody family whose plight provides the audience with the incentive to invest emotionally in the outcome. Widowed patriarch Joe (Cranston) is driven to learn the truth behind the catastrophe at a Japanese nuclear power plant that claimed his late wife's (Binoche) life 15 years earlier. Their son, Ford (Aaron Taylor-Johnson), a Navy explosives disposal expert, agrees to accompany his dad to the Orient, leaving behind a worried wife (Elizabeth Olsen) and son (Carson Bolde) behind in San Francisco.

Of course, all hell eventually breaks loose back home when anthropomorphic Godzilla self-lessly rises to the occasion in defense of the city. Will the MUTOs meet their match? Will the separated Brodys manage to survive the apocalyptic mayhem for a tearful reunion?

A surprisingly haunting and panoramic picture exploring universal themes like loss and yearning, yet with all the fixins for firstrate action entertainment. Hey, why didn't they make monster movies like this when I was a kid?


