CARICOM takes reparation case to the Brits

The man leading the fight by Caribbean governments to make Britain and other European slave owning nations pay for enslaving Africans in the region was earlier this month allowed to take the region's case for reparations to the same British Parliament which had legalized the slave trade, calling on today's members to right a cruel wrong that was meted out to Caribbean people by their predecessors.

Sir Hilary Beckles, the principal of the umbrella University of the West Indies and chairman of the regional committee preparing the case, lambasted his audience, peppering his presentation

CARICOM JAPAN SUMMIT

Leaders discuss investment and trade in the Caribbean

Chairman of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) and Prime Minister of Antigua and Barbuda, Gaston Browne, says that space exists to develop trade and Japanese investment in the services industries in the Caribbean.

Browne identified these as tour-

ism, financial services and technology in addressing the opening ceremony of the CARICOM-Japan Summit in Trinidad and Tobago on Monday.

The Antigua and Barbuda leader commended Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe for his government's efforts to increase trade

Antigua

The biggest drug haul to be made in recent times by Caribbean law enforcement agencies was carried out by The Office of National Drug and Money Laundering Control Policy (ONDCP) in Antigua recently.

Lawmen swooped down on a property at Old Runway and seized 480 kilograms of cocaine worth about EC\$17 million.

The cocaine, which was wrapped in more than 400 parcels was stashed in bags.



A 41-year-old Antiguan male and 41-year-old Guyanese female, both residing in Old Runway, are assisting the police in the investigation.

Director of the ONDCP Lieutenant Colonel Edward Croft said, "it is the largest by any Caribbean law enforcement agency."

The raid follows the seizure of approximately 2,300 pounds of marijuana that carried an estimated street value of EC\$37 million and the arrest of a Jamaican crew comprising of six men who are presently awaiting trial in the High Court.

Bahamas

President of the Bahamas Christian Council Dr. Ranford Patterson has warned that the pending introduction of VAT (Value Added Tax) could lead to more social ills.

Lest than six months before the introduction of the tax, Patterson said that while his organization

supports efforts towards tax reform, the timing could cause more problems.



"No government can operate without tax reform, but I believe this is a bad time to impose any new tax on the Bahamian people.

But we understand there is a need for tax reform," he told the Nassau Guardian.

Recently Junior Finance Minister Michael Halkitis said the government intends to bring the VAT legislation to the House of Assembly before the end of this month. He said an education campaign will move into high gear following the tabling of the bill. He also said that the education process will ease some of the fears surrounding the new tax.

A 15 percent VAT will apply to a wide range of goods and services.

Barbados

Opposition politicians of the

Barbados Labor Party (BLP) are planning public meetings to protest the Municipal Solid Waste Tax (WSMT), but Finance Minister Chris Sinckler has appealed for residents to give it time to work, promising possible amendments.

Announced last year, the new tax comes due by July 28, 2014

with a sweeping .03 percent charge on the site value of real estate property



across the island, but there have been widespread complaints about the financial burden on residents.

Noting that there were just a few days left to the deadline for


the first tax payment, the BLP announced it would hold rallies and meetings to sensitize people of the effects of this levy.

Guyana

Two gay sex workers were murdered recently in Guyana.

The suspect in the two homosexual killings

later committed suicide by setting himself afire.



31, doused himself with gasoline and set his body on fire outside Bourda Post Office in Georgetown.

Before succumbing at the Georgetown Hospital, Bristol confessed to the murders and said he had nothing to live for.

The two gay men were stabbed to death on the streets of Georgetown in the early hours of the morning by Bristol, the rejected lover of another.

The body of Jason John was found on Leopold Street and that of Carl Sinclair was found about a block away on Lombard Street. Both were lying in pools of blood.

The gay men were all commercial sex workers.

Jamaica

Prime Minister Portia Simpson-Miller administration says it is taking steps to prevent a food shortage as the country continues to experience an extended dry spell.

Agriculture Minister Roger Clarke said a decision will be made soon on whether permits will be issued for the importation of some agricultural products.

According to Clarke, the record decline in rainfall is taking a toll

on agricultural production, particularly the southern parish of St. Eliza-



beth — the "bread basket" of the country, which he says is having a "severe, severe, dry spell."

The crippling drought has also had an impact on the multi-million dollar sugar industry, with the Sugar Industry Authority stating that the sector is under major threat due to the lack of water.

In an effort to ease the water shortage, Clarke said J\$34 million has been set aside to assist in trucking water to some affected areas.



around the world, according to an Antigua and Barbuda Government statement.

Browne also referred to the beneficial effect the efforts have had on Japan's economy and on trade partners as well.

"Over the 10-year-period, 2003-2012, Japan has enjoyed a significant trade surplus with our member-states collectively," he said. "In 2012 alone, Japan's trade surplus with our sub-region was US\$621 million."

Browne also outlined CARI-COM's desire to explore ways in which Japan might effectively address the matter through aidfor-trade mechanisms or greater investment in the sub-region.

The CARICOM chairman also suggested to the Japanese Prime Minister ways Japan can assist CAR-ICOM in boosting the economies, highlighting investment by the Japanese private sector as one of the areas.

"There are many opportunities that could be mutually beneficial. For instance, CARICOM countries are very keen to pursue renewable energy options, including solar, wind, hydropower, geothermal, and bio-energy - all of which lend

themselves to public sector-private sector partnerships," he said.

CARICOM, Japan discuss trade

"As a world leader in energy conservation through the development of new energy technologies, Japan could provide tremendous support to CARICOM in building capacity in renewable energy technologies,' he added.

In 2011, the CARICOM road transportation sector consumed up to 65 percent of energy imports at a cost of approximately US\$2 billion, Browne said, adding that it is believed that Japan is a leading supporter of fuel-cell vehicles, which can run five times longer than elec-

Browne also referred to plans by two major car producers in Japan to launch hydrogen-based cars around 2015.

It is widely believed that countries in CARICOM will be keenly interested in partnering with Japan to bring down their own costs of energy, and thereby reducing the cost-of-living of the people of the region, the statement said.

with many examples of injustice, cruelty and double standards arguing that the negative effects of slavery manifests itself in various forms today including chronic cases of diabetes and hypertension suffered by hundreds of thousands of people of Caribbean origin.

He said that slavery was so cruel that there were a mere 800,000 of us left when the trade was abolished in 1833 despite the fact that British and other European ships had transported a whooping 5.5 million from Africa's famous West Coast to the Caribbean, a retention rate of only 15 percent.

He contended that poor diet on plantations during the period has so badly affected the gene pool and DNA of people alive today that his own native Barbados, for example, is now referred to as the amputee capital of the world.

"It is here that the stress profile of slavery and racial apartheid, dietary disaster and psychological trauma and the addiction to the consumption of sugar and salt, have reached the highest peak. The country is now host to the world's most virulent diabetes and hypertension epidemic," he said.

Turning his focus to British MP's, Beckles said it follows that the same assembly should waste no time in backing the fight to win reparations, saying it is basically the only choice it has left.

"It is here, in this house, that the evil system of slavery, and genocide, were established. This house passed laws, framed fiscal policies and enforced the crimes that have produced harmful legacies and persistent suffering now in need of repair. This house also made emancipation from slavery and independence from colonialism an empowering reality. It is in here, we now imagine, that laws for reparatory justice can be conceptualized and implemented. It is in here, we believe, that the terrible wrongs of the past can be corrected and humanity finally and truthfully liberated from the shame and guilt that have followed these historical crimes."

It is unclear whether an effort will be made by governments for Beckles to take the region's case to other parliaments.



Guyana faces possible blacklisting

Guyana is at risk of being placed on an international money laundering black list after the government failed to pass relevant legislation, even as organized crime in the South American country is on the increase.

The Financial Action Task Force (FATF), a global financial crime watchdog, is currently reviewing Guyana's situation to determine whether to blacklist the country internationally.

Guyana has already been blacklisted by the organization's regional affiliate, the Caribbean Financial Action Task Force (CFATF) and faces severe sanctions if the country's parliament does not pass more comprehensive legislation.

Although Guyana has basic anti-money laundering legislation in place since 2009, the country lack the legislation necessary to implement these measures and has not yet put the legal tools in place to fight money laundering,


Guyana does not have adequate

programs in place for financial institutions to report suspicious transactions, for example, as of June 10, 2014 had yet to investigate a single financial crime.

The CFATF first identified Guyana as a country with holes in its anti-money laundering legislation in 2011 and developed an action plan to address these issues with Guyanese authorities.

Guyana's government introduced a bill in parliament to bring anti-money laundering legislation into line with international standards in April 2013, but opposition parties in the National Assembly have used the government to pass the laws to pressure for several political concessions, including the presidential approval of bills they have passed- that must be met before they are willing to support the legislation.

While the president and prime minister have pushed for stricter anti-money laundering measures, opposition parties continue to hold the bill hostage.

EPA's Carbon Pollution Rules - Good for business, good for the economy

Some national business organizations have hammered the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for proposing new rules on carbon pollution from existing power plants, cutting carbon emissions by 30 percent by 2030, using 2005 levels as a baseline. What planet are they on?

It's ludicrous to pretend that climate change isn't happening, or that it won't affect every industry. It's beyond comprehension that large business advocacy organizations, including the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, think that our government should stand by and do nothing, while climate-related disasters in 2012 caused more than \$139 billion in damages, while U.S. taxpayers shelled out \$96 billion in climate-related damages in 2012 alone, or while sea levels rise 6.6 feet by 2100 – enough to swamp Miami.

Let's be clear: the costs from carbon pollution will be terrible for business. Climate change poses tremendous risks -- insurance premiums will skyrocket, electricity prices will soar, jobs will be lost, food and transportation costs will dramatically rise, and taxes will likely increase in order to pay for needed infrastructure upgrades.

That's why business organizations like ours, and many of America's largest companies,

including Johnson & Johnson, Apple, Exelon and Intel, reject the notion that EPA's rules will destroy the American economy. National Grid U.S. president Tom King noted recently, "I am strongly encouraged by EPA's efforts to reduce CO2 emissions through sensible and practical regulation."

This is no minority view. Polling released this week by the American Sustainable Business Council (ASBC) found that 64 percent of small business owners -- a plurality of whom were Republicans -- believe government regulation is needed to reduce carbon emissions from power plants. This is important because, as the same poll shows, about one in five small business owners said climate change has already harmed their operations.

For these and other smaller companies, anticipating and innovating are crucial for success. Why would business people ignore those principles when addressing climate change?

Perhaps climate skeptics fail to see that the EPA's proposal will define a market for solutions, not dictate what the solutions are. Perhaps they are unaware that the standards provide for flexibility on the part of governors, or that carbon reductions will enhance this nation's international credibility and

Beyond the street protests

UNITED NATIONS, (IPS) - Women's empowerment and political participation are not only crucial for women: they are essential for effective democratic governance, one which promotes human rights and equity. The same can be said about the importance of boosting youth political participation.

The U.N. Development Programme (UNDP) invited three young women parliamentarians from Latin America and the Caribbean to join a recent discussion in Salamanca, Spain, on young women's political participation in the region.

That's what Paola Pabón from Ecuador, Silvia Alejandrina Castro from El Salvador and Gabriela Montaño from Bolivia have in common. They are among the very few women in parliaments and they are young: They broke a double glass ceiling.

Of the 600 million people in Latin America and the Caribbean, more than 26 percent are young, aged 15-29. This is a unique opportunity for the region's development and for its present and future governance. Even though the average regional rate of women taking up positions in parliament is 25 percent, higher than the global average, a closer look shows that women still lag behind.

Our recent survey of 25 parliaments in Latin America and the Caribbean shows a very low representation of youth in the region's parliaments – especially those of African or indigenous descent. Only 2.7 percent of male parliamentarians in the region and 1.3 percent of women MPs were under 30 years old—even though more than one fourth of the region's population is young.

When we look at the age of MPs below under 40, 15 percent are men and not even 6.5 percent are women.

UNDP's regional Human

Development Reports have shown that young people have enormous potential as agents of change. But despite Latin America's remarkable progress in reducing poverty and inequality – and its strides toward strong democracies with free and transparent elections – gender, income, ethnic origin, or dwelling conditions are all decisive barriers to young citizens' rights and civic engagement.

Spain expect their participation to increase over the next five years.

Institutions should provide formal spaces for this, or protests will become the only effective way for young people to make their voices heard. And the region will waste an opportunity to enhance the quality of its democratic governance.

We are working towards this goal. UNDP and partners

Young people have enormous potential as agents of change. But despite Latin America's remarkable progress in reducing poverty and inequality – and its strides toward strong democracies with free and transparent elections – gender, income, ethnic origin, or dwelling conditions are all decisive barriers to young citizens' rights and civic engagement.

One in every four young people aged 15-29 in the region are poor or extremely poor. And only 35 percent of them have access to education. More worrying still: Some 20 million young Latin Americans aged 15-18 neither work nor study. That's nearly one in every five, 54 percent of them female and 46 percent male.

And the region's youth have been taking to the streets, playing a central role in recent protests in countries like Brazil, Chile, Peru and Mexico. Such demonstrations urge us to understand the demands of young people, and to address lingering structural problems in our societies, especially inequality.

The increasing frequency of such mobilisations tells us that young people want to actively participate in their society's development. The first Ibero-American Youth Survey - which we launched last year with the Ibero-American Youth Organization (OIJ) and other partners — shows that young people in Latin America, Portugal and

brought together 22 young MPs from 13 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean in 2013 to put together the region's first young legislators' network to boost young people's political participation and inclusion. We have been partnering with OIJ and other U.N. sister agencies and governmental youth secretaries to push this agenda.

Moreover, our youth online platform Juventudcon Voz (youth voices), with the OIJ and the Spanish Cooperation agency, is also helping boost young Latin Americans political participation and leadership skills.

Protests sparked by young Latin Americans will likely continue in several countries. Beyond the street level, in the digital age of flourishing social media activism, these protests also provide opportunities to rethink democratic governance in the 21st century.

No coming of age happened in 2008

With due apologies, I will say again, how paradoxical it is that the very event — Barack Obama's election as president — that many a pundit characterized as America's true coming of age, has in fact turned out to be affirmation of the country's racist core being nowhere near declining as one of its defining markers. The "feel good" spin on Obama's elevation some commentators offered, that such a revolutionary happening had gifted the U.S. an opportunity to expel its enduring sense of guilt, began losing plausibility early in the president's tenure, to the extent of looking today little more than a fanciful indulgence by some of those "better angels" Lincoln hoped to see in the American spirit.

As we know, from Republican leaders on Capitol Hill on down, just about everyone used to assuming a position right of center made it clear early in Obama's first term, that their overriding objective was ensuring there would be no second term. Again, whoever among us figured on some innate goodness on the other side, guaranteeing a more collegial narrative, no such luck. It's been an incessant din of non-cooperation, antago-

nism and worst, blatant disrespect directed toward this president, the venom unprecedented. Leading to the kind of toxic language recently arising from the opposition ranks, the likes of impeaching or suing the president.

What's been remarkable is the across-the-board nature of the attack regimen. Joining in the rally cry to stymie and/or kill all things Obama have been Republicans in Congress, Republicans in state and local government and even members of the judiciary. Chief Justice John Roberts surprised lots of folk, perhaps even including himself, when his was the deciding vote that allowed a challenge to the very premise of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) to be defeated. Undeterred, opponents of this legislation have been relentless in their attempts to drive a Sherman tank through the president's signature legislative achievement. In the Supreme Court's "Hobby Lobby" decision at the end of June, the court's conservative wing signed off on an assault on the ACA's mandate that contraception be included in the health insurance employers provided for workers. The ruling

exempting certain family-owned businesses from the requirement, on religious grounds, was seen as clearing the way for a veritable bull rush of similar filings.

More recently, a lower court ruling that the federal government cannot subsidize insurance purchased through the ACA's insurance marketplace threatens to create havoc, if allowed to stand by the high court, for millions who have availed themselves of a health insurance opportunity, a benefit they never previously enjoyed. Seemingly of no concern in the determination to eviscerate the ACA are the consequences for the more disadvantaged folk for whom the ACA made affordable insurance a necessity no longer denied.

There's more than a hint that Republicans' vile behavior toward the office of this president is driven by a conviction among at least some of them that Obama sim-

ply has no business being there. One gets the impression that their majority status in the House is primarily seen by them as a vehicle for frustrating (God forbid, complementing) any initiative originating from the president. In this sick game of demeaning the president nothing, it appears, is sacred. They jumped all over the people at the V.A. the other day, for example, over the apparently thorough mess that agency had gotten to be. Nary a Republican passed up the opportunity to sound off on how much of a betrayal this was to service men and women. But strong vocal support for the vets didn't translate into sparing no effort, funding-wise, to address the problem. House Republicans again relishing an opening to stick it to the president, authorized an appropriation that was patronizingly small relative to what the administration calculated as needed.

What a contrast the Obama experience has been with that of his predecessor. George W. Bush came into office under the cloud of having, in the view of many, arrived via the machinations of high court conservatives. But it's

probably fair to say that as of the 9/11 occurrence, even Americans formerly reticent about according him legitimacy were prepared to acknowledge him as leader of a nation newly consumed with an altogether different style war footing. Obama, coming into office in cataclysmic economic times, has managed the recovery well enough to have been largely credited for his stewardship. Instead, the ongoing efforts to essentially nullify the Obama presidency, to have this White House "interregnum" asterisked for posterity, outline for us some cold commentary about the road we've traveled.

Insufferable as it already is. with Republicans in control of one legislative chamber on Capitol Hill, one is loath to contemplate what more unseemly depths of ugly could come to define governance of the country, should the Senate's complexion undergo radical change following November's midterms. Already we're well past knowing that any notion of coming of age in '08 was all myth. Surely, this president at the mercy of Capitol Hill under full GOP grip would be a statecraft lesson I don't think we need.

competitiveness. Entrepreneurial activity and private sector capital follows closely in response to government action to address climate change.

Under this plan, states would have extensive options to choose how they meet these standards -- and businesses, including utilities, will have time to adapt. EPA's goals take into account each state's unique and current energy mix. This is a smart approach that recognizes the dynamic nature of the market and the power of businesses to innovate.

Electricity generation accounts for a third of all U.S. greenhouse gas emissions, more than any other economic sector. Coal plants are the worst offenders of all: in 2012, coal energy was responsible for

nearly a quarter of all greenhouse gas emissions in the U.S. The 100 dirtiest power plants in this country are responsible for 3.2 percent of global CO2 emissions and all but two are coalfired plants (PDF). Cutting these emissions is crucial, but there are multiple paths to accomplish that.

A state like Kansas, which had as many as 4,000 jobs supported by wind energy in 2013, could invest in more wind power. Arizona, which led in solar energy per capita in 2012, could continue its rapid growth. The same could go for Washington state, the leader in hydropower. And states that want to join regional capand-trade systems can do so. EPA's proposal will let states set their own course to meeting these standards.

Smart business peo-

ple know that clear market signals and regulatory certainty drive investment. EPA's carbon rules will lead to greater profit and prosperity, boosting economic growth and creating jobs. So when you hear someone say we can't afford to take action on climate change, remember: The costliest thing we can do is nothing. Inaction is not how successful businesses operate.



"The moments you help create -- moments of understanding or awe or joy or sorrow -- they add texture to our lives," he said. "They are not incidental to the American experience; they are central to it, they are essential to it. So we not only congratulate you this afternoon, we thank you for an extraordinary lifetime of achievement."

CapraCare brings health services to rural Haiti

The underserved rural community of 20,000 in southern Haiti, Fonfrede (45-minute drive from Les Cayes), is now receiving some essential community health services from CapraCare, an organization started in 2009 by Jean Pierre-Louis, a son of Haiti and Brooklyn.

Founder Pierre-Louis spent his childhood years in the Fonfrede community, leaving at age nine for the U.S. He remembers the inadequacies of mental and preventative health services in his hometown.



las said he was "appalled by this brazen act" after gunmen shot and killed three people and injured four others at the Frigate Bar Strip in St. Kitts recently.

In a statement, Dr. Douglas quoted eyewitnesses as saying the "victims seem to have been targeted."

The police have not vet release the names of the victims or details of the shootings at the Frigate Bay Strip, but media reports say two men who had been sitting on a bench near a bar, had been shot and killed. St. Kitts media also reported that a third man died near the water's edge as he attempted to flee the area. Two female bystanders were struck in their legs during the early morning shooting that occurred around 3:00 a.m.

Dr. Douglas said that the twin island Federation had been experiencing almost "two years of peace and tranquility" and praised the police and the Defense Force for having "worked extraordinarily hard" in ensuring the peaceful environment.

St. Lucia

Police Commissioner Vernon Francois says intelligence obtained by the St. Lucia police suggests that the recent spate of violence and shootings in the capital over the past weeks is as a result of the activities of criminal gangs.

Addressing a news conference, Francois said his officers will spare no effort in going after the criminals and ensuring they are

brought to justice.

Police have been investigating five mur-

ders and several other shootings within city limits over a two month-period. Several arrests have been made.



Francois told reporters

that the police force has developed new strategies to deal with the issue, adding that instead of conducting regular patrols, intelligence is being used to target specific communities.

Suriname

A 55-year-old man killed his elderly parents recently and subsequently torched their home and an SUV vehicle. Police said the gruesome incident took place in the community of Livorno, several miles south of Paramaribo.

Neighbors rushed to the home on seeing the fire but the son, who had a machete, was locked in the building.

On further investigations, the father was found at the back of the house, in a pool of blood, while the mother who was severely wounded was lying in a hammock.



On arrival, the police held onto the son who then slashed both his wrists in an apparent suicide attempt. He is currently warded at hospital under police guard. So far no motive has been established for the attack.

End 'hypocrisy' in fighting HIV/AIDS: UN AIDS chief

The head of the United Nations agency dealing with HIV and AIDS, Michel Sidibé, has called on world leaders to end the "hypocrisy on sex" and make treatment and reproductive health education universally available.

In his opening remarks to the 20th International AIDS Conference here on Sunday, Sidibé, executive director of the Joint U.N. Program on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS), received wide applause when he declared, "I'm calling for an end to AIDS by 2030."

He urged world leaders to "stop the hypocrisy and promote sexual and reproductive health and rights."

The U.N. said the five-day conference is being held under the banner of "Stepping up the Pace."

It is being held as the international community is pushing towards accelerated progress on the eight anti-poverty goals, known as the Millennium Develop-

ment Goals (MDGs), and laying the foundation for a sustainable development agenda that will begin after their 2015 deadline.

"The post-2015 agenda should explicitly embrace human rights," said Sidibé, underscoring the importance of equal access to health and HIV/AIDS treatment for people who are gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender.

In his video message for the

occasion, U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon noted that "tackling AIDS will help end extreme poverty, address underlying issues and advance universal healthcare."

Ban also paid his "highest tribute" to the people traveling to the conference who were killed in the crash of the MH17 flight over eastern Ukraine. Among the casualties was a staff member of the World Health Organization (WHO), Glenn Thomas.

"In the epidemic's early days, affective groups and civil society refused to accept defeat," Ban said. "Now, let us take strength in the commitment of those who are no longer with us and carry on their work to realize a world free of AIDS by 2030."

Also killed in the crash was Joep Lange, the former head of the International AIDS Society, the U.N. said. In his address, Sidibé called Lange, his "friend and mentor" who inspired him in the global fight against HIV and AIDS.

Antigua weighs high cost of fossil fuels

ST. JOHN'S, Antigua, July 28, 2014 (IPS) - Caught between its quest to grow the economy, create jobs and cut electricity costs, and the negative impacts associated with building an oil refinery, the Antigua and Barbuda government is looking to a mix of clean energy and fossil fuels to address its energy needs.

Venezuela's Ambassador to Antigua, Carlos Perez, announced last week that Caracas was at an advanced stage of negotiations with the government in St. John's to build an oil refinery on the tiny 108-squaremile island.

"The pending negotiations for the oil refinery I believe are well advanced and we're hoping with this new administration of Prime Minister [Gaston] Browne we will advance to conclude that project that will be beneficial for Antigua and for Venezuela too," Perez said.

Browne's Antigua and Barbuda Labour Party won General Elections on June 12 after 10 years in opposition.

Environmentalists, including Dominican Arthurton Martin, oppose the move and say it's the worst possible time to make an announcement like this.

"The United Nations Inter-Governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) just released its 2014 report presenting evidence that not only can we expect a two degree centigrade rise in global temperatures but [possibly] a four degree centigrade rise, which will result in significant increases in coastal damage from sea level rise for countries like Antigua that are relatively flat," Martin told IPS.

"This will in fact result in significant extension of periods of drought as a result of fluctuations in temperature. This is also happening at a time when there are so many options that could deal with part of the energy challenge," he added.

Martin said the refinery was a bad choice not only because of the global movement to avert catastrophic climate change, but because cleaner alternatives are



He suggested instead that government look into sources like biofuel, solar and wind energy to reduce reliance on crude oil. These sources of energy have already been developed and financing exists to explore these options.

"These technologies are off the shelf. You can purchase them right now. You don't even have to do R&D to develop them," he said.

"This is the first time in the history of the international financial community that they have in fact made grants and concessionary loan financing available to actually reduce the dependence on fossil fuel for energy."

Environmentalists stress that oil refineries are a major source of greenhouse gas emissions and other pollutants.

Oil refineries also emit methane and nitrous oxide, which are more potent greenhouse gases than carbon dioxide, as well as several other air contaminants that pose risks to human health and the environment such as hydrogen sulfide, sulfur dioxide, nitrogen oxides, particulate matter, and volatile organic compounds.

Chante Codrington, director of Wadadli Industrial Renewable Energy Ltd., who is in negotiations with the government of Antigua and Barbuda to build a wind farm here, is of the view that wind energy is the most efficient and affordable energy source for the island.

"No good can come from the oil refinery. The environmental concerns associated with the burning of fossil fuel in a country whose main industry is tourism are many," he told IPS.

"There is an odor that comes from the oil refinery, air pollution, water contamination concerns, fire, explosions, noise pollution, health effects – these are all the disadvantages."

Clean energy advocate John Burke agrees with Codrington, telling IPS it would benefit the island's poor more if the country goes green.

"The price of oil is going to go up. The last time I heard the price of sun and wind had not gone up. Currently, every kilowatt hour we're generating we're spending about 80 or 90 cents EC on fuel. If they put together a programme to finance and install solar systems for the poor and the middle class that would in effect be financed by the amount of money we save from importing oil."

According to a report by the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), energy demand in the region is expected to double in the next 20 years, at a 3.7 per cent average annual rate of increase.

Currently, most Caribbean countries are heavily reliant on imported fossil fuels, their energy consumption being based almost solely on oil products, which account for more than 97 per cent of the energy mix.

Trinidad and Tobago, Cuba, the Dominican Republic and Barbados cover part of their fuel requirements from their own reserves of oil and natural gas. Nevertheless, only Trinidad and Tobago has significant, proven fossil fuel reserves.

Several Caribbean countries spend 15 to 30 percent of their export earnings, inclusive of revenues from tourism, on oil products. This results in electricity prices of between 20 and 35 cents per kWh, much higher than in the United States or Europe.

Peter Lewis, managing director of the Bermuda-based Carib Energy Solutions, said the government should consider the environmental factors associated with an oil refinery.

"If the global trend of a mixed-bag approach is the best option for the pursuit of an energy agenda...you would be able to attract more entrepreneurs to the business sector and get the economy going," he told IPS.

Martin also agrees with the mixed-bag approach.

"No single source of power should be allowed to deal with your entire energy bill. That is a bad thing to do," he said.

JAMAICA INDEPENDENCE SALUTE

JAMAICANS USHER 52ND WAVING NATIONAL FLAG

Many Jamaicans believe the month of August should be dedicated in honor of the Caribbean island that led the region in winning independent status from Britain.

Argument to that initiative continues with their rationale that from day one, Aug. 1, the island and its people commemorate Emancipation Day which marks the acknowledgement of the abolition of slavery in Jamaica in 1834.

Combining celebrations of emancipation with independence – Emancipendence – Jamaican citizens laud the island's history early in the month with the reasoning that celebrations will heighten from Emancipation Day until Independence Day on Aug. 6.

"As Jamaicans, we are very proud of our country and heritage. Sandra Scott, Jamaica Tourist Board's Deputy Director of Tourism, Marketing said. "The commemoration of our emancipation from slavery and independence from colonialism provides an opportunity for us to proudly celebrate our history and our remarkable culture."

On the island, Lisa Hanna, the minister of youth and culture announced a new aspect to the annual commemoration which will be called "Celebration of the Drums."

"We now have what is called the Celebration of the Drums in every parish to herald in Emancipation starting this year because of the significance of the drum to Jamaica."

She announced that ancestral drumming would be used to mark the celebration of Emancipation Day across the island this year. She said it was appropriate to use the drums to honor the African ancestors who fought for and won freedom for its people. She added that it will be "one of the features of the revitalized Jamaica Festival."

She made the announcement during a ceremony where she was presented with an instrument. She received a Jamaican 'cyas' drum --which is used in the Kumina religion – from the United States.

Allegedly, with the assistance of the U. S. Embassy in Kingston, a

piece of Jamaica's history was repatriated.

"This drum has become a part of us and a part of who we are and is inextricably intertwined with us as a people," Hanna said.

Allegedly kept here for 25 years, the drum belonged to the late Kumina leader Imogene 'Queenie' Kennedy and had been in the possession of the Smithsonian Institute.

Reportedly, during one of his field research visits to Jamaica, James Counts Early, director of Cultural Heritage Policy had been given the drum in 1989 by Queenie to take to the Smithsonian Institute.

Presenting the drum to Hanna, Early said it was important to bring it back home as it "belonged to the people of Jamaica."

"Today when we hear the reverberations of this drum it sparks within all of us a stirring that evokes a deep sense of familial roots that calls us to action: whether to dance, to think, to respect, or to close ranks around a cause in worship, death, celebration, cultural practice," Hanna said.

Marcus Mosiah Garvey's 127th birthday on Aug. 17 provides added cultural exhibitions and galas marking the anniversary with numerous landmark achievements. It also makes the idea of a month-long ownership more than plausible.

A gala independence ball will be held on Aug. 16 at the Marriott Marquis Hotel, 1535 Broadway in Manhattan from 6:30 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.

Jamaica gets US\$20M to train 15,000 youth

The World Bank says about 15,000 young Jamaicans will benefit from training, digital work opportunities and seed investments to boost the digital and animation industries in the country as a result of a US\$ 20 million loan.

The Washington-based financial institution said on July 18 that the loan is for a Youth Employment in Digital & Animation Industries Project.

"This project facilitates Jamaica's linkage into one of the fastest growing sectors in the global economy," said Jamaica's Minister of State for Science, Technology, Energy & Mining, Julian Robinson. "It is our strongest national thrust to date to mobilize the considerable creative and entrepreneurial talent among our youth towards earning our way to a brighter future."

The World Bank said global animation is a growing industry currently valued around US\$220 billion per year, and that international companies are increasingly looking at Jamaica as a country of choice for outsourcing animation production.

As part of its "Vision 2030 Jamaica" plan, the bank said the Jamaica government is looking at the information and communication technology (ICT) sector as playing a central role in the transformation of the country over the next two decades, moving Jamaica from being a consumer to also become a producer of digital platforms and content.

"Youth unemployment in Jamaica is about 30 percent. This initiative spearheaded by the government is about providing opportunities for new talents to get new skills, find jobs or become entrepreneurs," said Sophie Sirtaine, World Bank country director for the Caribbean.

"For the technology sec-

tor to become an engine for growth and employment, it requires the right environment with training opportunities and the right partnership between governments, private sector and young people," she added.

The World Bank said this project builds on successful pilots in Digital Jam 2.0 and 3.0 and Kingston, which helped create new startups and position the Caribbean as a potential hub for the tech industry, linking the region's youth with digital entrepreneurs, angel investors and centers of excellence in the Silicon Valley and across Latin America.

Recently, the bank said several Jamaican techsavvy entrepreneurs also embarked in a 100-day accelerator program supported by the World Bank and the Development Bank of Jamaica.

Specifically, the World Bank said the Youth Employment in Digital & Animation Industries Project will provide training and coaching to 2,000 young Jamaicans, to enhance entrepreneurial skills and employability; create about 150 startup companies in Jamaica; establish "Startup Jamaica," a physical hub for tech entrepreneurs; and mobilize up to US\$7 million seed funding for tech entrepreneur startups.




It is 2 am and that cough and stuffy nose you have been battling is still keeping you up. You reach for the nighttime cold relief medicine only to find it expired a few months ago. If you take a dose to ease your symptoms, will you be putting yourself at risk?

This situation is a relatively common occurrence. Many medicine cabinets are stocked with over-the-counter drugs as well as prescription medications that may be past their expiration dates. It is a good idea to routinely discard expired medicines, but if you happen to take a drug that has passed its expiration date, you will most likely suffer no ill effects.

According to the Harvard Medical School Family Health Guide, the expiration date on a medicine is not the dates when a drug becomes hazardous. Rather, it marks the period of time after which a drug company can no longer guarantee the efficacy of the medication. Since 1979, drug manufacturers selling medications in the United States have been required by the Food and Drug Administration to stamp an expiration date on their products. This is the date until which the Expiration dates also may be a marketing ploy. Francis Flaherty, a retired Food and Drug Administration pharmacist, has said drug manufacturers put expiration dates on products for marketing purposes rather than scientific reasons. It doesn't make financial sense to a company to have products on the shelves for years. Therefore, most drug manufacturers will not do long-term testing on products to confirm if they will be effective 10 to 15 years after manufacture.

The U.S. military has conducted its own studies with the help of the Administration. Food and Drug Administration researchers tested more than 100 over-the-counter and prescription drugs. Around 90 percent were proven to still be effective long past the expiration date - some for more than 10 years. Drugs that are stored in cool, dark places have a better chance of lasting because the fillers used in the product will not separate or start to break down as they might in a warm, humid environment. Storing medicines in the refrigerator can prolong their shelf life.

My father, and our choice to get him hospice care

y father stopped eating shortly after his 90th birthday. He said he was not hungry and did not want any food. My sister, brother, and I took him to the doctor to see if he was ill or was suffering from some infection. The doctor explained that there was nothing physically wrong with him and wrote up the diagnosis as "failure to thrive."

She told us we had two options. We could put him on a feeding tube. This would give him needed nutrition. The other option was to enroll him in hospice care. She assured us that hospice did not necessarily mean he was going to die, but it offered him a comfortable option until he decided to start eating again or passed on.

My siblings and I decided on hospice care. We agreed that if it was time for him to leave us, we wanted him go peacefully. If he regained his desire to eat, all the better

Our doctor referred us to a local hospice program. We already had a live-in home health aide who attended to him during the week, but the service appointed a male aide to visit my father twice a week to bathe him and make sure he was comfortable. The hospice service even scheduled entertainment. Every week a pianist with a portable keyboard would visit and perform for him.

A hospice social worker visited my sister, brother, and I to discuss our fears and concerns about the process and answer any questions. She explained that the hospice team would keep Dad comfortable at all times. She placed a package in the refrigerator that included a morphine patch that could be used at any time if Dad should show signs of dis-

tress or discomfort.

Then the social worker informed us about the process of dying, explaining the different stages. She offered us a pamphlet called "Crossing the Creek" by Michael Holmes, a registered hospice nurse who spells out the stages of dying.

My father's condition did not improve and after three weeks he passed away peacefully in his own bed with the three of us beside him. We never regretted our decision. My sister Naomi summed up our thoughts: "It was one of the most comforting events we experienced together as a family. Our only regret is there was a death at the end."

Many people cower from the thought of hospice because it implies "the end of life." Often, people think that if they sign up for hospice it is a death sentence and they are giving up. This is not always true. A person does not have to stay in hospice care. He can leave the program at any time.

Not everyone who enters into hospice care dies. Sometimes people get better and "graduate" from the program. Hospice nurses and physicians are specially trained in symptom management. When they become involved in a person's care, the medical conditions are frequently stabilized and the patient actually feels better and can enjoy life again.

Hospice care is intended for people with six months or less to live. That does not mean you have to die in that time span. Nobody can say for sure how long a person has to live, but physicians can give an "educated guess" based on the person's disease and the course the disease typical takes as it progresses. Hospice has developed criteria

for certification. The initial

certification (when a person is admitted to hospice) is 90 days. The patient can be recertified to continue if the hospice medical director feels the patient still meets the criteria at the end of the 90 days. The first two benefit periods are 90 days in length. After that, the recertification periods are 60 days. A person can continue to be recertified as long as the criteria is met.

Hospice care offers sev-

eral benefits. Each hospice has an interdisciplinary team that works together for the benefit of the patient. Social workers or counselors offer counseling to both the patient and the family. Nurses will visit and consult with the patient's physician or hospice medical director to help make sure the patient is comfortable and do everything they can to keep the patient pain free. Nurse aides are available to provide personal care such as bathing. Clergy visits are offered if needed. Volunteers typically provide companionship for short periods. There is also a bereavement team to help the family and patient prepare for the end.

Medicare pays for hospice, so there is no cost to most seniors. Many insurance plans have a hospice benefit as well. A 2000 CNN poll disclosed that seven out of 10 Americans say they would prefer to die in their home. It does not usually provide 24-hour care, but will provide the needed support for the family or caregivers to manage the patient's care in the home (one of the requirements of hospice in the home is that there must be a caregiver available).

It is hard to lose our loved ones, but hospice can help make your loved one's passing a peaceful experience.

AGING CAN IMPAIR DRIVING ABILITY

he number of drivers 70 and older is predicted to triple in North America during the next 20 years. Research indicates that the older a person is, the higher the risk of driver accident or fatality. The risk posed by older drivers and the inevitable increase in older drivers on the road in the next two decades has sparked debate as to whether or not such drivers should be reexamined to ensure safety on the road.

In 2003, an 86-year-old man unintentionally killed 10 people and injured more than 70 when he drove his car through a crowded farmer's market in Santa Monica, Calif. In 2010, a 72-year-old Connecticut man faced vehicular manslaughter charges for allegedly striking and killing a motorcyclist. In 2012, an elderly man in Buffalo, N.Y. caused an accident resulting in three fatalities when he

traveled in the wrong direction on the New York State Thruway. Very frequently, the local news is peppered with reports of elderly drivers causing serious accidents. Some wonder if more stringent requirements for

elderly drivers would help the situation.

Thirty-three states presently have legislation in place to ensure drivers can retain driving privileges once they reach a certain age. It's important to note that, according to the National Safety Council, drivers over the age of 75 account for only 3.3 percent of accidents in the United States. Drivers age 25 to 34 account for the largest number of accidents, at nearly 20 percent. Some argue that these findings do not paint an accurate picture because senior drivers spend far less time behind the wheel and log fewer miles than younger drivers, reducing the chance for accidents.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration notes that aging can affect drivers in a number of ways. The physical and mental changes that accompany aging can have a profound impact on a person's ability to safely operate a motor vehicle. Reaction times may be slower, hearing and vision loss may affect driver awareness, loss of muscle strength and flexibility can make steering more difficult, and medication can impair focus or concentration.

Many senior centers and organizations offer programs that allow elderly drivers to brush up on their skills behind the wheel. Drivers also can contact their insurance companies to see if there are any sponsored classes they can take to reassess their skills and possibly lower their insurance premiums. AAA offers a driver improvement course and suggests seniors find a car they can safely and comfortably operate. It also offers Roadwise Rx, a free online tool that provides confidential, individualized feedback about medication side effects and how these drugs may impact drivers on the road.

It also is important that senior drivers and their families familiarize themselves with local legislation to determine if driver refresher courses or retesting are necessary for older drivers to remain behind the wheel.

New York Methodist Hospital helps to combat hearing loss

earing impairment is often dismissed as a normal part of aging. By age 65, one in three people in the United States will experience some degree of hearing loss. By age 85, that number climbs to one out of every two. However, letting hearing loss go untreated can lead to health consequences beyond the need to "turn up the volume" or "speak louder."

"A person's mental faculties rely heavily on his or her sensory faculties, especially hearing," explains Dr. Mohsen Habib, chief of otolaryngology at New York Methodist Hospital. "Mishearing or misinterpreting words

can prevent people from engaging in meaningful conversations, which can also affect cognition—the ability of the mind to function."

The link between hearing loss and degenerative cognitive disease is not fully known. But what is clear is that hearing loss can make an older person feel self-conscious and less willing to be in situations where ambient noise levels make it especially difficult to hear. Over time, the desire for social interaction can spiral downward.

"Screening for hearing loss is critical if family members suspect that a loved one is beginning to

experience dementia because often, the reality is that the person just can't hear well," said Dr. Matthew Hanson, neurotolothings completely unrelated to a conversation. But instead of indicating Alzheimer's, these may be signs of hearing loss."

Scheduling an appointment with a specialist is the first step in addressing hearing loss. Otolaryngologists determine whether there is a medical cause, and audiologists can determine the type and degree of a hearing loss. An audiogram (hearing test)

provides the information that allows the doctor to prescribe the most appropriate treatment.

Types of hearing loss include conductive hearing loss and sensorineural hearing loss. Conductive hearing loss is often the result of a "mechanical" problem with the ear, such as a blockage or infection. Depending on the cause, conductive hearing loss can often be treated with medication or surgery. Sensorineural hearing loss, on the other hand, results from problems with the nerves that transmit sound impulses from the inner ear to the brain, and is the most common type of hearing

loss among older Americans.

"Often, sensorineural hearing loss is due to exposure to extreme or long-term loud noise, and is most effectively treated with hearing aids or cochlear implants," said Dr. Hanson. "However, no matter what the cause, addressing issues with hearing can be crucial in helping an older person maintain a high quality of life."





JPL celebrates 78 years with service

Jamaicans in New York rallied with purposeful prayers to give thanks for their island's 52 years of independence and also for the longevity of one of its oldest organization in the United States. The double celebratory service held at United Moravian Church in Harlem hailed the Jamaica Progressive League, Inc., a trail -blazing organization which was launched in Harlem in 1936. Conceived and launched specifically to bring self –government and independence to Jamaica, the JPL now boasts their initial drive to realize selfrule. For the 78th anniversary celebration worship and music combined for a fitting acknowledgement of the path dedicated members have invested throughout the years. Longtime members and latter day patrons marked the occasion singing hymns, referencing the Bible and afterwards during a reception shared food and beverages familiar to the island.



"Although it gets harder and harder, we have to maintain this tradition," Vincent Miller said.

One of the veteran members of the organization, he has seen the transition which through the years has expanded to focus on issues of advocacy for nationals residing here in the USA.

In addition to collaborating with the People's National Party to champion the cause for independence, the JPL has also advocated for reforms for fair wages, education, health, land settlement, agriculture, industry and fairness with appointments to the civil service sector.

There was a time when Jamaicans relied heavily on the JPL in order to bond with the nation. Without a consulate or diplomatic spokesperson to advocate

the issues of concern, the JPL provided an atmosphere similar to home away from home. With headquarters at 57th St. in Manhattan, the JPL probably reached the pinnacle of connection with divisions that directly related to the needs of the immigrant group. A youth division regularly hosted a weekly weekend session. It was no surprise that Bob Marley stopped into the mid-town location to meet and greet fans and share in the festivities of the evening. The annual independence gala held at the American Hotel provides nostalgic reflection on the merriment celebrated for an independent Jamaica.

Rev. Hopeton Clennon spoke to the many historic achievements since Christopher Columbus alleged-

ly 'discovered' the land of wood and water. ed for higher ground and lined the perimeter of the lawn to hear but could not see the lyrically infectious Rastafarian singer.

Marley's Central Park moment on June 18, 1975 attracted a record number to the Shaeffer Music Festival for his "Natty Dread" showcase. Allegedly, 15,000 flocked to the small space that accommodated 6,000 but thousands more lined the rocky hills with still more filling the grassy valleys near the Wollman Skating Rink.

At that time, reggae was a novelty billing and Bob was the superstar in the making. Some who saw the king of reggae then returned these many years later to bear witness to another Rastaman tagged for meteoric success.

Earlier in the week, Chronixx made his U.S. network, television debut on the Tonight Show. Hosted by Jimmy Fallon, the show booked Chronixx for reggae's first act since Jay Leno exited the toprated, late night talk show in February.

"The entire island of Jamaica is swelling with pride right now," Fallon said in his introduction of Chronixx.

When the young singer joined

his Zincfence Redemption Band at Rockefeller Center singing "Here Comes Trouble" pride seemed prevalent throughout the Caribbean, and his performance must have enticed more than a few to his first major New York outing because a steady stream of curious, music lovers forced NYPD to bolster Summerstage's security detail.

His spectacular performance surpassed expectations.

He was awe-inspiring.

Proclaiming "Selassie is the Leader," Chronixx launched into what seemed like hit after hit from his "Dread & Terrible" CD.

Tracks such as "Don't Take My Love For Granted," "Say My Name," "Smile For Me Jamaica," and the telling "Our Story" of Christopher Columbus' discovery under Queen Isabella and King Ferdinand amplified his proclamation that "Rasta no live pon captured land."

Chronixx is serious.

Chronixx is clear, concise and considerate.

In addition, he is humble and generous with sharing the praise. Throughout his performance he acknowledged Jesse Royal, another rising star on the horizon.

Chronixx is not the first to be

likened to Marley, reggae fans and Jamaicans have been longing for the next messenger, ambassador and successor since the 1981 passing of the acclaimed first Third World superstar.

Since his untimely passing, Luciano, Sizzla, Ziggy Marley, Taurus Riley and others have been prematurely crowned with Marley's mantle. For some brief reigns fulfilled the fantasy and optimism. However, no one has sustained the tedious, compelling and iconic task of parallel success to Marley's.

Chronixx seems the next best

hope for the genre.

He is young, charismatic, Rastafarian, sings truth to power and from all indications seems destined for greatness.

Junior Reid held his own opening for the headliner. The "One Blood" singer is as seasoned as any and on any other date could well have headlined. As lead singer of Black Uhuru -- reggae's first Grammy winners in 1984 -- Reid won accolades singing at Radio City Music Hall. There he performed "Great Train Robbery," "Guess Who's Coming To Dinner" and "General Penitentiary."

While hearing confessions in church one day, Father James Lavelle (Brendan Gleeson) gets the shock of his life. First, a disturbed man recounts in lurid detail how, as a child, he'd been raped by a priest every other day for five years. Then, the anonymous confessor announces that since the pedophile who ruined his life is already deceased, he's decided to even the score by murdering Father James, and in exactly one

The demented parishioner could

care less that his intended victim is totally innocent and wasn't even a priest when the transgressions transpired. In fact, Father James was married back then and only entered the priesthood relatively recently in the wake of his wife's untimely death.

But there's to be no reasoning with this revenge-minded lunatic leveling the death threat through the opaque screen. He unceremoniously exits the confessional booth without asking for absolution, abruptly leaving Father James in a quandary about what to do next.

The concerned priest consults his immediate superior, Bishop Montgomery (David McSavage), who suggests the matter be reported to the police. However, despite having a hunch about the identity of the unhinged maniac, Father James merely resumes ministering to the needs of his tiny congregation as if nothing happened, ostensibly at peace with the pros-

pect of being martyred for the sins of another.
