Boro prez calls for mass transit expansion

Brooklyn Borough President Eric L. Adams has called for greater mass transit investment in Brooklyn.

In testifying before New York State Assembly Standing Committee on Corporations, Authorities and Commissions, on the Metropolitan Transit Authority's (MTA) 2015-2019 Capital Plan, Adams focused on three areas that he felt the MTA and New York City Transit should address in the coming years.

They are: Disability support, transit infrastructure investment, and bus service expansion and enhancement.

GUYANA REGIME ORDEAL

Opposition files no confidence motion

In less than 10 minutes last week, one of Guyana's two parliamentary opposition parties opened the door to the impending collapse of the administration of President Donald Ramotar formally filing a parliamentary no confidence motion while complaining that it was tired of runaway corruption, breaches of local laws and

the constitution and effectively cutting Ramotar's five-year term by more than two years.

A Partnership For National Unity (APNU) and the Alliance For Change (AFC) hold a single seat majority in the 65-member parliament and once every legislator turns out to vote, the governing People's Progressive Party

Caribbean

The Caribbean Community (CARICOM) has reiterated its call for a ceasefire between Israel and the Palestinians in Gaza to bring an end to the hostilities and the appalling bloodshed being caused by the bombardments, shelling and ground invasion.

A statement from the CARICOM Secretariat in Guyana said: "With the toll of civilian deaths and

wounded mounting incrementally in Gaza, the vast majority being in particular women



and children; with hundreds of homes and civilian buildings such as schools destroyed or severely damaged; with few if any havens for the thousands of displaced Palestinians, the question must be raised as whether the principles of proportionality and the norms of international humanitarian law and of international human rights are being respected in the assault on Gaza".

The Secretariat said the humanitarian situation in Gaza worsens dramatically, the Caribbean Community "joins its collective voice to the calls coming from many quarters in the international community for all the parties involved to cease hostilities and end to the intolerable escalation of death, destruction and violence."

Antigua

An Antigua and Barbuda magistrate has committed newly-appointed Attorney General

Steadman "Cuttie" Benjamin to stand trial on Oct. 1, 2014 on allegations of passport fraud.



Magistrate Nagio Emanuel ordered the prosecution to disclose all evidence to the defense within 21 days.



Constructing resilient houses

As natural disasters become more prevalent, squatter's homes, such as this one in Trinidad, are a cause for concern in Jamaica, where 20 percent of the population is said to inhabit such precarious structures. See story on page 6.

The prosecution had alleged that in 2008 Benjamin had signed a passport application form and photograph of Jamaican Shane Anthony Allen, who claimed to have been Antiguan Tyrell Brann when he applied for and obtained an Antigua and Barbuda passport. Brann had died earlier.

Allen and Lynda Brann, the mother of the deceased man, had been convicted and sentenced to two years in jail as a result of the fraudulent matter.

They have since been released from prison after serving their sentences.

Benjamin was appointed attorney general in June this year after his party the Antigua and Barbuda

Labor Party (ALP) defeated the Baldwin Spencer United Progressive Party in the June general election.

Bahamas

The Bahamas government signed three agreements with the Haitian government to further develop trade between both countries and a lead to decreases in illegal migration.

Prime Minister Perry Christie said it was an historic day.

The agreements include a framework for bilateral cooperation, an agreement on the promotion and protection of investments.

Both Christie and Haitian President Michel Martelly said the agreements could represent a shift in the migration issue that The Bahamas has struggled with for decades.

"It's been a great day, a historic day, in terms of signing these agreements", said Christie following talks with the Haitian delegation.

Barbados

A study done in four Caribbean countries has found that 30 percent of children aged 11 to 13 were overweight or obese, a senior official of the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) said.

Dr. Audrey Morris, the advisor on Food and Nutrition at PAHO, told a workshop to review and refine a draft policy document on Nutri-

tion and Health Foods in Barbadian schools that the number of overweight and



obese children in the region has more than doubled over the last decade due primarily to unhealthy diets and inadequate exercise.

Dr. Morris said the consequences overweight and obesity in children were serious, including breathing difficulties, hypertension, early signs of cardiovascular disease, insulin resistance and psychological effects. She noted the easy access to fatty and salty foods in school canteens, revealed that up to 80 percent of the children in the Caribbean study admitted to drinking a carbonated soda every day.

The PAHO official said countries such as the United States had placed limits on sugar, fat and sodium in all foods and beverages sold on school compound. In addition, Brazil has mandated that 30 percent of the input in school meals must come from local agriculture and Panama has banned fried foods and sodas from school premises.

Grenada

The Caribbean Association of Banks Inc. (CAB) will host its 41st Conference in Grenada from Nov. 12-15.

The conference, which attracts

over 250 delegates each year from around the world, will be held at the Radisson Grenada Beach



Resort. The conference will explore the theme "The Changing Face of Caribbean Banking".

Pols, clergy decry suspicious church fire in Brooklyn

Several local elected officials, the clergy and community leaders have decried the suspicious arson of the offices of a popular church in Brooklyn.

The Byways and Hedges church is known throughout the community for its efforts in addressing violence prevention, immigration reform, youth empowerment, domestic violence, spiritual care and crisis intervention.

On Aug. 5, sometime between 9:30 p.m. and 10:00 p.m., a fire damaged the building at 846 Utica Ave., Brooklyn that housed the church's youth ministry and other services, such as Community Concerns Network Inc., Immigrants Responding to Crisis and The Real Life Times community newspaper.

As a result, the church's Jamaican-born founder and president, the Rev. Dr. Terry Lee, who has been serving the community for more than 20 years, is now left without an office.

In a strong show of support on Friday, fellow clergy, elected officials and

community leaders came together at a press conference to condemn what they described as "this suspected act of destruction," urging anyone with information to come forward immediately.

"The Byways and Hedges Church and its founder, Rev. Dr. Terry Lee, have long embodied the spirit of servant leadership in East Flatbush," said Brooklyn Borough President Eric Adams.

"Now, as one Brooklyn, we need to embrace this congregation with the same love and support in their hour of need," he added.

Jamaican-born Assem-

blyman N. Nick Perry (D-58th AD), said the suspected arson is "a tragedy for the entire East Flatbush community.

"Rev. Terry Lee and his congregation worked tirelessly to spread the word of God and improve the quality of life of all who live in the community," he said, adding that the tragedy is "compounded by the fact his fire may have been set intentionally, thus disrupting the good work of the By Ways and Hedges family.

"Given their tremendous faith, resolve and passion, I am confident though that

Rev. Terry Lee and By Ways and Hedges will rebuild and continue on their path of providing an overwhelming spirit of charity and compassion," Perry continued.

Sen. Kevin Parker (D-21st S.D.) said he, too, was "saddened to learn of the fire that burned By-ways and Hedges Church in my district and am equally grateful that no one was injured.

"This is a tragedy for our community and our friend, the church's founding pastor Terry Lee," he said.

"I know his faith and support from the community, including my office, will sustain him through these questionable days," Parker added. "As he has worked tirelessly to provide immigration, housing, domestic violence prevention and other work to Brooklyn residents, our community will galvanize to ensure By-ways is rebuilt stronger to continue its Godly service."

Members of the 67th Precinct Clergy Council said, "it is so sad that a solid community church like Byways and Hedges has been destroyed by what we are calling an act of terrorism."

Jamaicans celebrate nation's anniversary

Jamaicans in the tristate area flocked to the Wall Street business district on Aug. 6 to mark the milestone independence anniversary of the island. Bullish on the 52-year history, they gathered at Bowling Green to raise the banner that unites those in the Diaspora and those at home. At noon, the black, green and gold colors of the nation slowly rose to the same height as the U.S. flag on an adjacent flagpole. The significant gesture probably raised the hopes of immigrants proud of their culture, legacy and contribution. Hosted by Ewayne McDonald, of the Caribbean Cultural Theater the morning event featured a rendition of the island's national anthem.

Andrew Clarke, founder and artistic director of BRAATA Production received kudos for his stirring performance of the prayer and hymn known as "Eternal Father."

Afterwards an official ceremony led by Consul General Herman G. Lamont united the Caribbean nationals who on that date showed solidarity with enhancing the profile of the nation.

Lamont's keynote address to the gathering – dominated by individuals dressed in national.

traditional red and white bandana outfits as well as a majority whose fashions prominently displaying black, green and gold -featured a message from Prime Minister Portia Simpson-Miller.

Here is the speech:

"My fellow Jamaicans at home and in the Diaspora, I greet you on this the 52nd Anniversary of our Independence.

Fifty-two years since our flag was first hoisted; 52 years since we assumed full responsibility for our national affairs.

Fifty-two years since that hopeful and expectant generation passed on to us the vibrancy of a dream of a new Jamaica: a Jamaica of equal opportunity for all; a Jamaica where justice would roll down like a river, and a Jamaica for which all of us could be proud.

A Jamaica in which all of us could truly say, "This is Jamaica, my Jamaica."

A true ownership society: a Jamaica in which all of us would have a sense of place and belonging, not just a place of abode.

Founding Father Rt. Excellent Norman Manley put it well in speaking of his vision of this new Jamaica:

"All efforts will be wasted unless the masses are steadily taken along a path

(PPP) is on course to lose the House vote and forced to resign and call general elections in 90 days.

Its other option is to preempt the two parties and call general elections on its own but it is widely known to fear such a move as it has been slowly but surely losing support after a withering 22 years in office, compounded by its closeness to the drug trade, the inexplicable wealth of cabinet members and other high officials and its saturation of the governmental system with friends and family of the ruling elite.

The AFC's David Patterson deliberately timed the handing in of the one line motion to Clerk of Parliament Sherlock Isaacs just days before the assembly went on its two-month annual recess giving both sides time to prepare for the vote when sessions resume in early October and to

organize general election campaigns that are certain to have been fully ramped up by the time legislators raise their hands in the affirmative.

Officials say that the administration is so embarrassed by the AFC's move and the decision by APNU to fully back it with its 26 seats that it will likely call early elections and avoid the political and national indignity of becoming the first administration in the country to be kicked out by frustrated and angry opposition parliamentarians.

Officials also say that government has in the past week called in several key advisers to determine whether there were any flaws in the oneline motion but it was made clear to Cabinet Secretary Roger Luncheon that the motion was without blemish and cannot be challenged in court.

PPP insiders had hoped that the AFC would have

proffered and attached reasons for filing the motion, giving it the excuse to take the matter to court and prolong its life but Patterson said that AFC executives and lawyers spent hundreds of hours researching other precedents in the UK. India and even Trinidad before deciding on the deadly one liner that is on course to bring down the Ramotar administration in the coming weeks.

One serious charge against the administration is the government's stubborn refusal to organize local government elections.

"Brooklyn is a borough on the rise, a burgeoning destination for tourists and a hub for hundreds of businesses large and small," Adams said.

"To continue our growth and success, success that helps support the tax base of our great state of New York, our transportation system must be upgraded to reflect a 21st century borough that, if it stood alone, would be the fourth-largest city in America, with a geographic footprint of almost 100 square miles," he added.

On disability support, Adams said only 21 of 170 subway stations in Brooklyn are compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and that only seven more are planned to be made compliant by 2020.

He noted the high population of senior citizens and disabled residents in the borough, calling for swifter action to address their needs.

"The MTA must make the necessary investments to be

in compliance with the ADA and afford their customers, my constituents, access to the subway system," Adams said.

In this regard, he urged the MTA to expedite its timetable to complete accessibility-related work at the seven remaining stations in the current queue, as well as commit to doubling the number of ADA-compliant stations operating in Brooklyn by 2025.

Adams outlined three potential infrastructure projects that the MTA should invest in to enhance improvements in system capacity.

Firstly, he proposed connecting the Junius Street station on the 3 line with the Livonia Street station on the L line. The lines are only 250 feet from each other.

Secondly, Adams called for linking the East New York station on the Long Island Rail Road with the Broadway Junction subway hub, which has five lines that run through it. These sites are one block apart.

Finally, he suggested the creation of a light rail line along Brooklyn's waterfront.

"A generation ago, no one imagined that Brooklyn's waterfront would be some of the most soughtafter real estate in the country, for both residential and commercial purposes," Adams said.

"Yet for all the growth that the waterfront has experienced, from Greenpoint all the way down to Red Hook, this area is poorly served by public transit," he added, stating that "improvements would spur additional economic development and job creation along the waterfront, especially in growth industries, such as manufacturing, technology and the innovation economy."


On bus service expansion and enhancement, Adams called for the restoration of service along several bus lines, including the full length of the B37, B70 and B8.



Jamaicans design 'smart' buildings

PORT OF SPAIN, Trinidad, Aug 5, 2014 (IPS) - Buildings are among the largest consumers of earth's natural resources. According to the Sustainable Buildings and Climate Initiative, they use about 40 percent of global energy and 25 percent of global water, while emitting about a third of greenhouse gas emissions.

Anthony Clayton, a professor of sustainable development at the University of the West Indies, Jamaica, says those statistics make buildings vital to developing resilience to climate change and to reducing pockets of entrenched poverty in the Caribbean region.

"At the moment, most of the buildings in Jamaica are very energy inefficient with very expensive electricity that reduces the level of disposable incomes, which is one of the factors acting as a break on the economy."


"If we build to a higher standard of energy efficiency," the country will also be more resilient to climate change, he added.

Clayton and his colleague, Professor Tara Dasgupta, are currently working on the prototype of a smart building whose key features would be "optimal sustainability and efficiency" with particular attention given to water efficiency, renewable energies, materials and resources, and indoor environmental quality.

The proposed "net zero energy" building, which is the first of its kind in the region, is now in the design phase. The University of the West Indies' Institute for Sustainable Development (ISD), where Clayton holds the Alcan chair, is working in collaboration with the Global Environment Facility and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) on the sevenmillion-dollar research and building project.

Clayton, who is also a member of several advisory groups serving the Caribbean Regional Negotiating Machinery, the UNEP Division

Carnival plans to build port in Haiti

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) — A major Florida-based cruise line has signed a letter of intent to develop a new port on an isolated Haitian barrier island that has long been a major launching spot for smugglers, authorities said Monday.

Carnival Corp., the parent company of Carnival Cruise Lines, said it signed a memorandum of understanding last week with the Haitian government for a cruise port on Ile de la Tortue off Haiti's north coast.

In a statement emailed Monday, Carnival said the development would create a "tremendous economic impact" for Haitians while also carving out a new spot for ship itineraries in the Caribbean, the globe's No. 1 cruise destination.

"The development will create an exciting opportunity for our guests to enjoy a new, secluded and stunning destination," said David Candib, a vice president for Miami-based Carnival.


In a recent tweet, Haitian Prime Minister Laurent Lamothe said the initial investment on Ile de la Tortue will be \$70 million.

Because of its remoteness, the mountainous island has long been a center for smugglers to organize dangerous sea journeys for poor migrants seeking a better life in the United States and elsewhere in the Caribbean. Ile de la Tortue, also known as Tortuga Island, is 11 miles (19 kilometers) across cobalt waters from hardscrabble Baie des Moustiques.

The cactus-studded area's poverty stands out even in Haiti. Ile de la Tortue, where the shores are lined with wooden boats of smugglers and subsistence fishermen, has some of the poorest people in the hemisphere's most impoverished country.

In February, Lamothe said officials had begun a program to improve opportunities, in part by paving the way for seven restau-

Improving your endof-life healthcare

The day my father died from prostate cancer -- Jan 11, 2011 -- is the day I decided that no family should ever experience the same pain. That day everything changed for me. I had worked for seven years at an organization whose sole focus is end-of-life care, yet I had not had even one conversation with my father about his end-of-life wishes. It was truly a wake-up call, an eye-opening experience I hope I never have to repeat.

Imagine sitting in a hospital room with your unresponsive father, your five siblings on one side of the bed, and his new wife and her five children on the other side. People on both sides thought they were best equipped to speak on my father's behalf. The sad reality is that none of us -- not one of the 12 people in that room -- had a clue about what he wanted. He had no advance directive, had never had a serious conversation about his end-oflife wishes, not even with me, an end-of-life care advocate.

Since that fateful day threeand-a-half years ago, I have learned that horrible situations at the end of life are far too common in this country, especially in the African-American community.

Unlike many of the other disparities that impact the African-American community, this is one we have more control over. It starts with having a conversation. Unfortunately too many of

us are not having that discussion. In fact, 20 percent of African-Americans have not talked to anyone about their end-of-life care wishes, according to research conducted in 2003 by the Duke Divinity School and the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO).

African Americans underuse palliative and hospice care. They make up only eight percent of patients who participate in hospice care. At the same time, white Americans make up about 83 percent. Far too often, people associate hospice with "giving up" and "the place one goes to die." That is just not the case; hospice actually fosters good end-of-life care, and the earlier the patient accesses these services, the better off he or she is. Palliative and hospice care are one of the best ways to ensure a good death, whatever that may mean to each individual.

African Americans' end-of-life choices are also influenced by the importance of spirituality. As the New Living Translation of the Bible (Proverbs 27:12) says, "A prudent person foresees danger and takes precautions. The simpleton goes blindly on and suffers the consequences." Being prepared is not disrespectful to one's religious faith and personal beliefs.

At the end of life, African Americans are no different than anyone else in this country. We die too. We also want autonomy,

The U.S. government still tries to subvert Cuba

When I saw the headline about the U.S. government and Cuba in my newspaper the other day, I thought I'd awoken in 1961. It was a Twilight Zone moment for sure: "U.S. program aimed to stir dissent in Cuba." I expected Rod Serling to welcome me to "another dimension."

But it was 2014. The AP news report said President Barack Obama and presumably thensecretary of state Hillary Clinton had plotted to incite a popular uprising — to "gin up opposition" — against the Cuban government by sending in young Latin Americans masquerading as tourists and health workers.

Did Obama, Clinton, and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), which oversaw the operation, learn nothing from the 1960s, when the Kennedy and Johnson administrations tried repeatedly to overthrow Cuban ruler Fidel Castro and even to assassinate him?

The AP investigation disclosed that the USAID agents had "little training in the dangers of clandestine operations - or how to evade one of the world's most sophisticated counter-intelligence services." Nevertheless, the AP continued, "their assignment was to recruit young Cubans to antigovernment activism, which they did under the guise of civic programs, including an HIV prevention workshop." The program, which lasted at least two years, began shortly after Obama's inauguration.

The private firm Creative Associates International ran the operation. The undercover agents "posed as tourists, visited college campuses and used "There's no evidence that the program advanced the mission to create a pro-democracy movement against the government of Raul Castro."

a ruse that could undermine USAID's credibility in critical health work around the world: an HIV-prevention workshop one called the 'perfect excuse' to recruit political activists."

This is reminiscent of the ruse used in the attempt to find Osama bin Laden in Pakistan, in which American agents posed as health personnel encouraging people to get vaccinated against hepatitis-B. In the wake of that operation, some expressed concern that future vaccination efforts in foreign countries could be met with public skepticism.

Covert American efforts to effect regime change, as occurred in Ukraine in February, also undermine genuine indigenous dissent against repressive governments by enabling rulers plausibly to accuse opposition groups of being foreign agents.

In the Cuban operation USAID agents had close calls with the government:

The AP investigation revealed an operation that often teetered on disaster. Cuban authorities questioned who was bankrolling the travelers. The young workers came dangerously close to blowing their mission to "identify potential social-change actors." And there was no safety net for the inexperienced travelers, who were doing work that was explicitly

illegal in Cuba.

The AP says that an instruction manual tried to assure the agents they were safe. "Although there is never total certainty," the manual states, "trust that the authorities will not try to harm you physically, only frighten you. Remember that the Cuban government prefers to avoid negative media reports abroad, so a beaten foreigner is not convenient for them."

The AP concludes, "There's no evidence that the program advanced the mission to create a pro-democracy movement against the government of Raul Castro."

That makes the U.S. government's 53-year-long campaign for regime change in Cuba a perfect failure. Repeated efforts to spark an anti-Castro revolution or to kill the revolutionary-turned-dictator did nothing but strengthen the government's power. The embargo that the U.S. government imposed on Cuba in 1960, and which remains in force today, has given the Castros an excuse for the chronic hardship that Cubans suffer and has brought the people no closer to free-

News of the USAID operation reminds us of some of the U.S. government's most despicable acts during the Cold War. The government made eight attempts on Castro's life and other attempts on the lives of other Cuban leaders. In 1961 the CIA sent 1.500 Cuban exiles to invade Cuba at the Bay of Pigs. That operation, part of the Cuba Project (or Operation Mongoose), failed miserably and embarrassed President John F. Kennedy, who had taken office that year. The U.S.

No light stepping after chokehold outrage

There would be those, certainly, for whom the expression "New York style" doesn't have about it a ring of specialness. Not so the bulk of us who call the Big Apple home. There is, we know, a certain elan, a certain panache to New York style which is to be in no way construed as being lumped in with the rest of the pack. What most distinguishes true New York style is that it's cool. Off-color stuff purporting to emanate from a New York source despoils our desired order. Like, upon Obama's being declared reelected to the presidency in 2008, we get word that a bozo identified with New York named Donald Trump calls for the citizenry to march on Washington. No less a corruption of true New York style is an African American man meeting his death while being arrested for allegedly selling "loosies" on

Staten Island.

Accustomed as we are to gasping, seething with rage, etc over out-of-town instances of foul behavior from law enforcement types that come to our notice, we're still prone, some of us, to draw an imaginary line between such bizarre occurrences "out there" and what our New York

sensibilities hold to be the norm. This, despite knowing that there have been times when the police-civilian interaction in this town haven't been all that cool.

It wasn't a great day for New York's finest last July 17 when officers on Staten Island decided to bust Eric Garner for, they claimed, selling "untaxed cigarettes" on the street. It staggers the imagination that petty crime on that level, if indeed crime was being at all perpetrated, could escalate to where a cop applies a chokehold that ends Garner's life. A chokehold, the NYPD tells us, is a banned maneuver, so right out of the starting gate we have an officer pushing a lever that prompts us to question how suited was he for the job. Whether triggered by panic or by wanton disregard for the rules

of engagement, the officer's resort to a chokehold is indicative either of his being one of the "bad apples" the department has over the years grudgingly acknowledged to be in the manpower mix. Or inadequate training or whatever else caused him to not measure up when the acid test came.

From the Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (PBA) came the predictable slant in a response: had Garner not "resisted arrest" the unfortunate outcome would have been avoided. Problem is, a conflicting version of what's factual in circumstances like this doesn't inspire today the confidence in outwitting the other guy that it did yesteryear. Not in this time of digital cameras in ubiquitous usage across the land. And damned if there wasn't someone on spot to record how this altogether unnecessary turn of events went down.

Rev. Al Sharpton's call for action and response strategy

didn't necessitate, for a change, his jetting off to a location well beyond New York. Garner's death surely was justification for any and all avenues of protest, including the planned march across the Verrazano Bridge, if concerns over logistics and other public safety issues didn't force a re-thinking of the bridge piece. Beyond their vigorous objection to the march on the bridge, one read, in the reaction of some Staten Island pols, a sense that they would much rather there was no protest at all, at least none that would further call attention to Staten Island having incubated this episode of egregious police misconduct. They are of course dead wrong, these outerborough reps, if daring to entertain the notion that an aftermath framed by hushed tones and light stepping is all that's required here. Not hardly. A person of color lost his life, clearly through the carelessness, or worse, of an arresting officer. It is no time for walking softly.

Mayor de Blasio has to simply let the chips fall where they may on this one. And as matters take their course, he needs be reminded that there's a certain point after which

the now obligatory line about "... investigation...so that this never happens again" becomes trite and meaningless. To lots of us, looking in from a distance on what unfolded in Staten Island on July 17, it would be difficult to understand any conclusion different from a cop having gone inadvertently or deliberately rogue, bringing about Eric Garner's death. As for the mayor, to his credit, we have so far seen nothing from him that would lead us to believe he wouldn't want to be the ultimate facilitator in the process of ensuring that justice prevails.

It's not possible, of course, for New York to monitor and deflect everything that looks to be potentially compromising to its pacesetter image. We are too large, too disparate a collective to foolhardily go there. We can, however, remain dedicated to having the distinctiveness that is New York style continue in place, undiminished. When and if they do occur, the likes of the appalling Staten Island goings-on summon us to step up. No mimicking of many a travesty we can recall in this or that place far afield. This is New York. We're better than that.



rants and by creating 1,000 jobs through a sanitation program. Farmers received free seeds and the national police force was to send some 30 officers to crack down on illegal migration.

Carnival said the company's new port would "directly or indirectly" employ more than 900 people. The development would compete with Royal Caribbean's fenced-in Labadee cruise port and beach attraction, also on Haiti's north coast.

A local government representative on Ile de la Tortue said residents were excited by the prospect of foreign investment.

"A tourist port will bring work to La Tortue," Sagesse Loriston Fils said in a phone interview. "But they need to come and talk to the community, get the community involved."

Not everyone is convinced a new cruise port would be

a good deal for Haiti. Jim Walker, a Miami maritime attorney and author of a blog called www.cruiselaw. com, said in an email that his concern is that Carnival will be "sailing back with all of the profits to Miami."

Trade groups say the cruise ship industry injects about \$2 billion a year into the economies of the Caribbean. But critics complain it actually produces little local revenue because the cruise companies and international chain shops on piers siphon away most of the spending.

Earlier this year, Lamothe announced ambitious plans to transform the southern outlying island of Ile-a-Vache into a high-end resort with condos, spas and its own international airport. The \$260 million project being built with a combination of foreign aid and private investment is scheduled to be completed in two years.

tural activities for Haitian underprivileged youth. The organization's mission has expanded its scope, postearthquake, to support more vital rebuilding activities.

David Belle outlined how Ciné Institute in Jacmel, the country's only film training institute, tuition freeof-charge, evolved from the three international film festivals in Jacmel that he co-founded and directed. Each edition of the festival included extremely popular filmmaking workshops with presenting filmmakers. From the great appreciation of and respect for cinema, Belle recognized, "Haitians want to see films about their own culture."

At the panel, Belle spoke about how Nigeria has the third largest world film industry (after Hollywood, and India's Bollywood); its growth owing to new technology, low budgets, local talent and direct sales and how there is a future for Haitian cinema and emerging opportunities in the broadcast market.

Ciné Institute's two-year program graduated its first class in 2011. When classes were interrupted by the earthquake that hit Jacmel hard, students documented its affects.

The Institute has had three graduating classes –100 students, since its inception and graduates have been hired by nongovernmental institutions (NGOs), to film and produce music videos, and to make commercials.

Ciné Institute is also partnering with the new Audio Institute, which offers a tuition free, two-year intensive training program to Haitians in all aspects of music production and audio engineering, as well as the business skills needed to flourish in the local and international music industries and skills for radio production, an integral aspect of Haitian life.

Next to speak on the panel, Gael Monnin stressed the importance of infrastructure in Haiti, both in roads, reliable access to electricity and the internet.

According to Carlton Barclay, chairperson of the Caribbean Association of Banks Inc.; "We are indeed excited to bring the conference to Grenada at a time when Grenada, like the rest of the Caribbean, is grappling with the various challenges facing the financial services sector. Having visited Grenada to assess the proposed conference venue, we are satisfied that all the arrangements."

Local Organization Committee Grenada Chairman Keith Johnson said several international sponsors drawn from the financial services sector as well as delegates from the regional banking fraternity have already registered for the conference and their enthusiasm is catching.

Jamaica

Jamaica Prime Minister Portia Simpson Miller says J\$15 million is to be allocated for drought mitigation efforts in the worst affected parishes.

She made the announcement while speak-

ing at the recent three-day Agriculture and Industrial Show in Clarendon.

She said the money will be used to help truck water for domestic and farm usage.

Simpson Miller said she has instructed the Local Government Minister Noel Arscott to pay special attention to Clarendon, Manchester and St. Elizabeth. Clarendon is said to be the worst hit parish, while St. Elizabeth has had hundreds of acres of farmlands destroyed by bush fires.

Recently, the government allocated J\$30 million to the Rural Development Authority to increase crop production in areas of the country not severely affected by the current drought.

St. Lucia

St. Lucia's Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony says the island is being pressured into accepting same-sex marriages in a bid to further develop its tourism industry. Addressing the recent 16th biennial

convention of the Union of Saint Lucian Overseas Associations, Anthony said there were policies that were being imposed on the island and that St. Lucia



was expected to either sign and accept, or face the consequences.

He told the audience there were some "delicate" issues that face St. Lucia and its tourism industry, and that the island needs the help, assistance and guidance of its overseas based nationals.

"What ought to be St. Lucia's position on same sex marriages given the simple fact that all of you reside in the capitals of the world that now champion same sex marriages? What will you tell St. Lucians on the issue?" Anthony asked.





At Marcus Garvey Park, on his Aug. 17 birth date, Harlem Family Day begins at 4:00 p.m. with performances by Kojo Odu Roney & friends, B-Love's Hip-Hop Jazzy Groove, DJ-KS 360, Shine and the Moonbeams, and Moona Luna. Later at 7:00 p.m. Ballatrix!:a Soul Train Tribute to Women in Music features a three-hour celebration.

And on Aug. 19 at the Garvey School, 950 Baychester Ave. in the Bronx at 5:30 p.m. an anniversary birthday celebration for Jamaica's first national hero will be hosted by the Jamaica Progressive League.

Marcus Mosiah Garvey founded the UNIA on July 20, 1914.

He recruited its first member, a young lady named Amy Ashwood.

He held the organization's first meeting at 121 Orange St. in Kingston, Jamaica. One month later, the UNIA began holding weekly public meetings at the Collegiate Hall on

Church St. and by 1920 the UNIA was the largest Pan African organization ever established in history.

Garvey emerged the undisputed Father of Pan-Africanism and Jamaica's first national hero.

It has been 100 years since he conceptualized and launched the historic and global confraternity of the race. The Kingston division in collaboration with the government has recognized the milestone anniversary with a number of events and activities which began on the actual July 20, founding date. A centennial church service was held at the Saint Andrew's Scots Kirk, home of the Collegiate Hall where it all

The principal commemoration event was followed by the MYC Festival 2014 Signature Conversations series at the Institute of Jamaica lauded where the national hero was regaled during a panel discussion. "Garvey & the National Agenda" was the topic.

Activities have been on-going throughout the month of August and included the UNIA's presence at the Emancipation Jubilee in his St. Ann birth parish. Also held were the unveiling of several heritage signs dedicated to Garvey and the UNIA in Kingston. The historic organization also participated in the national festival activities on Aug. 3 and 5 where they debuted a film by Ashwood who later married Garvey.

On independence, Aug. 6 a special segment was devoted to the 100-year organization at the Grand Gala celebrations held at the National stadium. Some of the tributes included presentations by the UNIA Juveniles. The August celebrations will culminate with the sixth staging of the annual UNIA Marcus Garvey Awards on the East Lawns of Devon House, the former home of one of Jamaica's first millionaires. That event is slated for Aug. 17.

of Technology, Industry and Economics, and the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, told IPS that a major hazard of the current housing stock in Jamaica, in light of climate change, is its proliferation of informal settlements.

He was referring to unregularised settling of vacant lands by squatters who throw up substandard housing for shelter.

He said 20 percent of the population in Jamaica is said to be living in these settlements. "We have got buildings built on unsuitable terrain and unstable slopes. If you get the kind of torrential rain associated with climate change, there is liable to be flooding or landslips."

Many of these houses built by squatters are not particularly sturdy. "A lot of the houses are just basically built of block, some concrete, tin, timber, just patched together. Some are just wood and a corrugated tin roof," he said.

A lot of work still needs to be done in Jamaica and the rest of the Caribbean with regard to establishing and enforcing building codes that provide some protection against natural disasters.

Hence, the ISD at UWI, Mona, undertook an Inter-American Development Bank-funded project "to assess climate-change related risks and help increase resilience in the building stock of Jamaica."

The first phase of that project was "a risk assessment of the housing stock and areas of urban development in Jamaica and... the draft[ing] of a parliamentary paper on environmental regulation."

Among the findings of

the risk assessment phase, said Dr. Kwame Emmanuel, technical consultant on the project, was that the government of Jamaica was partly to blame for Jamaica's unsafe housing environment.

He told IPS, "The development control regime is encouraging illegal developments by enforcing a cumbersome and time-consuming process for formal developments."

Further, "The government of Jamaica is currently pursuing a housing policy which seeks to increase the number of houses for low-income earners. One possible policy conflict is related to the location of these high-density housing developments.

"They may either be placed in vulnerable or environmentally sensitive areas because of the low cost of land; or the development may enhance the vulnerability of adjoining areas. In addition, climate resilience may not be considered in the design of the housing developments and units," Emmanuel added.

Offering a possible explanation for the scenario, Emmanuel said, "There is a disconnect between political agendas and climate change timelines. Politicians are primarily concerned with current problems faced by the electorate such as poverty, cost of living, unemployment, water lock offs, poor road conditions and so on. Therefore, it is difficult for them to consider issues which have not fully manifested as yet, for example, sea level rise."

He added that, in Jamaica, another major issue "is the autonomy of the Urban Development Corporation (UDC) and the Ministry of Housing, facilitated by their

respective Acts. These Acts have influenced the inconsistency of development standards and the exploitation of loopholes in the regulatory framework."

Subsequent to the risk assessment, proposals were developed for modifying current building codes in the region to ensure energy efficient and climate resilient buildings. These proposals are currently being shared with professionals in the construction industry, said Clayton, and the response has generally been positive.

The multidisciplinary

group MODE is leading the review of the building codes on behalf of the ISD.

Project manager of the MODE-led review, architect Brian Bernal, told IPS the project "examines how building codes can be used as an avenue to promote, encourage, and enforce climate change resilient buildings on a national and regional scale."

In an e-mail interview, he told IPS, "Robust and enforced building codes are highly effective in ensuring a better quality of building and, when employed in conjunction with 'green' building standards and/or practices, will significantly increase the functional resilience of our buildings."

The group made the following proposals for improving the current building codes:


- Jamaica's current 2009 National Building Code be adopted, enforced and updated;
- the International Green Construction Code be adopted since it "would [be] the least difficult to implement in the local code environment";
- a local green building rating system be implement-

ed, which involves "voluntary tools for rating the environmental performance of buildings that are typically verified by a third party, in order to achieve recognition for exemplary design and levels of conservation";

• and incentives for green building be given.

Bernal said, "The main objective of building codes is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the building's occupants."





Jamaica currency depreciates; T&T appreciates

Jamaica recorded the seventh highest currency depreciation in the Americas based on its double-digit currency slide, a United Nations (UN) group reported recently.

The report was published by the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), which represents the UN on economic and social issues throughout the region. It acknowledged that the currency was impacted by targets set by the International Monetary Fund (IMF) under the Extended Fund Facility (EFF) with the Jamaican government.

"This deterioration of the currency occurred despite the signing of the EFF as there was lingering uncertainty about the economy. While depreciation may enhance competitiveness in some sectors, it placed pressure on the Bank of Jamaica to intervene to prevent too large a deterioration of the currency," ECLAC stated.



The Jamaica dollar's depreciation now stands closer to 13 per cent over 12 months ending July, which could see it surpass Colombia.

In June, Christine Lagarde, managing director of the IMF, described the Jamaica dollar depreciation as painful but necessary to achieve competitiveness and restore dignity. She indicated on a two-day visit to the island that the currency was overvalued supported by bleeding the reserves.

Most of the region's 35 nations underwent currency depreciation against the U.S. dollar. But the report blamed domestic issues for the higher pace of the slide in Jamaica.

"In Argentina and Jamaica the reasons were domes-

tic, as they were in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela," stated the report entitled Economic Survey of Latin America and the Caribbean 2014.

Eleven other countries recorded depreciation in excess of 5.0 per cent over 12 months to March 2014 led by Argentina at 53.9 per cent, Chile at 19.4 per cent, Uruguay at 19.1 per cent, Brazil at 16.3 per cent, Colombia at 10.2 per cent and Jamaica at 10 per cent.

However, Trinidad and Honduras recorded currency appreciation over the same period.





Streep, Bridges co-star in sci-fi adventure

Despite being born in the same year and enjoying overlapping enduring careers, Oscar-winners Meryl Streep (for Kramer vs. Kramer, Sophie's Choice and The Iron Lady) and Jeff Bridges (for Crazy Heart) never made a movie together prior to "The Giver." Such a long overdue collaboration proves well worth the wait in this haunting, sci-fi adventure set in a deceptive dystopia masquerading as heaven on Earth.

The film is based on the Lois Lowry best-seller of the same name which won the Newbery Award as America's best children's book of 1994. This authorapproved adaptation was directed by Phillip Noyce (Patriot Games) who tapped fellow Aussie Brenton Thwaites to portray the young hero, Jonas.

The picture's point of departure is the young protagonist's graduation day, when he participates in a coming-of-age ritual during which 18 year-olds are assigned a profession by the elders of their idyllic community. Jonas' BFFs Asher (Cameron Monaghan) and Fiona (Odeya Rush) soon learn that they'll be trained as a drone pilot and a nurturer, respectively.

Jonas, however, long recognized as special, because of an uncanny ability to see things differently, is designated the "Receiver of Memories," the protégé of the "Giver" (Bridges). In that capacity, he quickly becomes aware that the whole society is a charade which shields its citizens from the fact that there is

suffering in the world by injecting them once a day with a drug which keeps them naïve, obedient and blissfully content.

Truth be told, evil does exist

in their midst, though invariably veiled, such as how the sick and the old are "Released" in a fashion that gives no hint that they're actually being euthanized. And

Jonas experiences a crisis of conscience in choosing whether to obediently follow in the Giver's footsteps or to upset the apple cart by letting the cat out of the bag about how everybody's mind is being controlled.

Among the factors influencing his critical decision is the unexpected pleasure associated with the "Stirrings," the formerly-suppressed pangs of sexual awakening he suddenly feels for Fiona. Another involves the impending euthanizing of a baby with a birth defect (Alexander Jillings) he's already bonded with.

Besides the historic pairing of Streep and Bridges, the film features sterling performances by the trio of emerging thespians playing the leads, as well as by Katie Holmes and Taylor Swift in support roles. A thought-provoking meditation on mind control offering a valuable lesson about the virtue of challenging any totalitarian authority.



England to play at Kensington

The historic Kensington Oval in Barbados will be one of the venues for Test cricket during England's tour of the Caribbean next year.

The tour, which runs from April 13 to May 5, will also see Test matches played at the Vivian Richards Cricket Stadium in Antigua and the National Stadium in Grenada.

It was reported last May that the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) had overlooked Kensington Oval, in deciding on Guyana, Grenada and Jamaica as venues for the three Tests.

In a statement last week, the WICB said it had "embarked on a bidding process to

East Zone winner Team St. Vincent and the Grenadines and defending champion Team Jamaica are on a collision course on the road to the 2014 Caribbean Cup title. Both former Caribbean Cup champions won their quarterfinal games last Sunday at the Jefferson High School

Sports Complex in Flatlands, Brooklyn to move into the semifinal stage and could well meet at the final juncture on Sunday, Aug. 31.

These teams have a history of fierce battles between them over the years when Team St. Vincent and the Grenadines dominated the tournament in the early 1990s, and won its last Caribbean Cup title in 2000; the fierce competition continued as Team Jamaica since became the dominant force and last year won its ninth title in the last 12 years. the quarterfinals, Team St. Vincent and the Grenadines defeated Team Trinidad and Tobago, 3-0, and Team Jamaica overwhelmed Team St. Lucia, 4-0, in a rematch of last year's final.

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines-Trinidad and Tobago game saw a first half that was a goalless stalemate despite Trinidad's slight advantage in possession; the Trinidadians dominated the midfield and Trinidad and Tobago midfielder Kareem Joachim always posed a threat to the Vincentians as his team created several scoring opportunities that could have seen Trinidad take the lead. One such opportunity came at the 24th minute when Joachim dribbled down the right wing and unleashed a 20-yard shot that hit the left upright goalpost and bounced downward, only inches from going over the goal line.

The more technically skilled Vincentians, led by new arrival Myron Samuel, owned the second period and in the 60th minute, Samuel, recruited from the Vincentian national team in the Caribbean, was on the ball and smartly switched

the play from the left side to the overlapping right full back, Kemmy Christopher, who feathered the ball on his instep and in stride, pummeled a low, hard shot that settled in the far corner of the goal for the 1-0 lead. Ten minutes later, Samuel was at it again when he struck a low, hard shot from 24 yards that Team Trinidad and Tobago goal keeper Marcus Maurice failed to hold; Michael Collis put away the loose ball and put the Vincentians ahead, 2-0.

It was only fitting that Samuel be rewarded with a goal after all his work, and in the 80th minute, Samuel received a pass just beyond the midfield line on the left side and dribbled towards the goal, uncontested, he let fly a 20-yard left-footed bullet of shot that zipped past an unexpected Maurice and grazed the inside of the left goalpost for the final tally. Team St. Vincent and the Grenadines, in the midst of a good year, will play the winner of this Sunday's quarterfinal match-up between Team Haiti and Team Grenada.

Team Jamaica feasted on goals by Denzil Watson, Jermaine Christian, Christopher Banner and Daniel Shaw on the way to trouncing former champion Team St. Lucia. Watson and Christian gave Jamaica a 2-0 lead at half time as the winners dominated the game from the outset, while St. Lucia showed that it is not the team that was on top of its game the past three seasons when it won its first Caribbean Cup title in 2012.

The second half saw more of the same as the winners continued to dominate with former Jamaican international midfielder Jermaine Hue directing proceedings. Banner and Shaw completed the scoring in the second half and Jamaica will now await the winner of the last quarterfinal game between West Zone winner Team Guyana and Team Barbados. The other quarterfinals are schedule for this Sunday, Aug. 17. Semifinals are on Aug. 24.



Dr. Alan P. Goldman: **Treating And Relieving Arthritis Pain**

ple suffering with joint pain and arthritis, says Dr. Alan P. Goldman, a specialist in rheumatology (130 Brighton Beach Avenue, 718-946-7557), and they often believe that there is little that can be done to alleviate their pain.

They are wrong. There are many options available, Dr. Goldman says; the key is finding a physician who is knowledgeable in those treatment modalities.

As a rheumatologist, Dr. Goldman specializes in the treatment of arthritis; one of only a handful practicing in Brooklyn.

Rheumatoid arthritis is an inflammatory illness that causes joints to swell. Symptoms include morning stiffness and swelling, often in the hands, elbows, or wrists, he says. Perhaps because there are so few rheumatologists in the borough, when people experience these symptoms, they often "see a surgeon first," says Dr. Goldman. But this often doesn't make much sense, he explains.

"When you have stomach pains, you don't go to a surgeon before seeing a gastroenterologist," he explains. "When you have chest pains, you don't see a surgeon before seeing a cardiologist."

A surgeon is the expert to see when surgery is needed, he notes, and of course Dr. Goldman refers patients to surgeons when necessary. Still, Dr. Goldman believes that the majority of people who suffer with arthritis can be


There are a lot of peo- treated without surgery. Even those who suffer enormously may find relief with Remicade IV infusion treatments. he says. "It has worked wonders."

> Patients receive these treatments once every few months, and people who previously couldn't move well find that the "benefits are tremendous," he says. Those whose symptoms are less severe may find relief with pills or injections. This method has been used successfully for many years, says Dr. Goldman. And, "It still works."

When patients see Dr. Goldman they are assured of receiving expert evaluations. Dr. Goldman's office offers x-rays, and a number of in-office treatment procedures. Should patients need physical therapy, arrangements can be made for this, as well.

Dr. Goldman also recommends that people age 60 or older come in to be checked for osteoporosis. People who are thin or who smoke are especially at risk, he notes.

Dr. Goldman is a Harvard graduate who has studied at Bellevue Hospital-New York University Medical Center and Gouverneur Hospital in Manhattan. He is on staff at the New York Methodist Hospital, and he is a Fellow of the American College of Rheumatology, as well as a member of the American College of Physicians, Nassau County Medical Society, the New York State Medical Society, American Medical Association, and the New York Academy of Sciences.
