# Caribbean discusses future of energy

The Organization of American States (OAS) says its Assistant Secretary General Albert Ramdin, on Monday joined ministers and high-level authorities on energy in the Caribbean to address energy and climate challenges in preparation for a meeting of ministers in 2015 under the umbrella of the Energy and Climate Partnership of the Americas (ECPA).

According to the OAS, Ramdin stressed in Miami how the shift toward sustainable energy is critical

"We cannot escape the fact that renewable energy has very high upfront costs and at the moment many of our countries are facing a very serious debt challenge," he said. "We have difficulties striking that balance between investing in the future and dealing with our day-to-day problems; this is a major issue for policy makers in the region."

Minister of Public Services, Information, Broadcasting, Sustainable Development, Energy, Science and Technology of St. Lucia, James Fletcher said, "we need to shift to an energy paradigm that is more sustainable."

Fletcher also addressed capacity building and strategic partnerships, explaining that "this energy sector is new, and we do not have the same capacity in-house to be able to respond to and deal with the challenges.

Energy is now the investment frontier," he added.

The Minister of Science, Technology, Energy and Mines of Jamaica, Phillip Paulwell, who chaired the ministerial debate, said he was impressed with the wide array of ECPA activities over

# Carib Muslims discuss, T&T government investigates

Until the beginning of October, discussion points in Trinidad would have centered more on preparations for general elections expected in mid to late 2015, but persistent media reports that local Muslims are flocking to the Middle East to fight with the Islamic State group have not only changed this but has promoted an official state investigation into the developments.

For most of this week, media houses, national security officials and the country's Islamic community have been obsessed with efforts to identify two Trinidadian men appearing virally in social media sites urging others to travel to the battle grounds and join them and other fighters.

Local media think that one of the men might be a Trinidadian deported for felony crimes in the U.S. several years ago and up to recently had been living in southern Trinidad before disappearing and reappearing in the video.

Neighbors say they think that Shazam Mohammed might be

### Vincentian Relief Committee donates US \$20,000

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Relief Steering Committee of New York last Saturday evening handed over a check amounting to US\$20,000 to Foreign Affairs Minister Camillo Gonsalves to be delivered to the National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO).

The sum is a significant part of the monies raised by the New York group to assist the homeland in the wake of last Christmas freak storm that left at least seven people dead and a trail of destruction primarily in the north of the country.

The committee, chaired by New York Consul General Selmon Walters, a former government minister, disclosed that a total of US\$34,500.80 was raised in the relief effort and that there were expenses amounting to US\$5,671, leaving a balance of US\$28,829.80.

With US\$20,000 dispatched to NEMO, the committee said US\$8,829.80 remains in the account.

The committee told a town hall meeting at the Friends of Crown Heights Educational Center in Brooklyn that, to date, four 40 ft. containers of supplies were dispatched to St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

The committee said its efforts are on-going,

thanking all Vincentians, organizations, businesspersons, musicians, friends and supporters for assisting in the relief effort.

Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves told the meeting, via a telephone link from his hospital bed in Cuba, that the unusual Christmas storm cause damage to the tune of 17 percent of the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP).

He said, since the storm, his administration was able to raise \$280 million, inclusive of concessionary grants from the World Bank and "a number of different countries."

The Vincentian leader said 10-12,000 nationals were directly affected by the storm that caused significant "damages and loses to the housing stock."

He said the government has since built and refurbished several houses, from FitzHughes, a village on the outskirts of Chateaubelair, to Fancy in the north of the country.

Camillo Gonsalves, who delivered the keynote address at the town hall meeting, said: "Any conversation with St. Vincent and the Grenadines has to begin with the floods at Christmas Eve into Christmas Day.


### **Barbados**

The Barbados Chamber of Industry and Commerce (BCIC) said it had urged the Frendeul Stuart government to consider entering into a standby agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) as the island grapples to turn around the ailing economy.

BCIC President Tracey Shuffle addressing a business breakfast meeting in Bridgetown that the private sector had suggested that once a reasonable portion of the present fiscal deficit had been reduced, "the government of Barbados could then consider the feasibility of engaging the IMF

to enter into a standby arrangement.'





"In fact, many countries wait until they are in absolutely dire financial straits to engage the IMF as the Fund is often seen as a rescue of last resort, a time when financial power is handed over to outside interests," she said.

### **Dominica**

Dominica has told the international community that it does not discriminate against persons who engage in same sex relationships, but insists that the laws of the country must be obeyed.

Vince Henderson, Dominica's permanent Representative to the United Nations said that Dominica takes exception with some of the accusations and allegations made by some organizations that clearly are not in tune with what

is happening on the nature isle.



He said the island, neither through the

legal process or non-state actors "is not involved in the persecution of gavs and lesbians and the representatives of the organization would be better served if they would take the time to visit the island and understand what is happening in Dominica.

Henderson said with a population of 70,000 people, "It doesn't take the stretch of the imagina-

tion to know if there are people who are gay and lesbian that the majority of the population would know who they are.

"They are not hunted down, they are not persecuted, nor are they being prosecuted contrary to the statement made by Amnesty International," Henderson said.

### Guyana

Speaker of the Guyana's National Assembly Raphael Trotman has been granted an exparte injunction preventing a 22-year-old man from publishing any material relating to allegations that he was molested by the Speaker about a decade ago.

Trotman who has already dismissed the allegations as a

move "obviously intended to provide a timely distraction from the serious prevail-



ing political situation in Guyana" got the injunction recently.

The injunction also orders the 22-year-old man to remove all allegations of sexual abuse by the Speaker from his Facebook page.

The minority Alliance for Change (ADC) said in a statement that Chief Justice Ian Chang granted the injunction barring Johnny Anthony Welshman from publishing whether in the print or electronic media any material relating to allegations he has made against Trotman.

Trotman is also seeking damages in excess of Guy\$50 million for libel contained in statements allegedly made by Welshman and published in the Stabroek News, Guvana Times and on Welshman's Facebook page.

The AFC said it would continue to provide "unequivocal support" for Trotman, the party's cofounder against the recent "spurious and unfounded allegations against him."

The Speaker has already sought to link the accusations to the vote of no confidence filed against the Donald Ramotar administration.

### Jamaica

The Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) Paula Llewellyn on Wednesday withdrew the corruption charge against jailed Jamaican dancehall entertainer Vybz Kartel and two other people.

Kartel, whose real name is Adidja Palmer and entertainer Gaza Slim (Vanessa Saddler) had been charged with attempting and conspiracy to pervert the court of justice in 2011. Another person, Andre Henry was also facing the same charges.

The charges were also brought

after Saddler filed a police report claiming that she was robbed at gunpoint by a man she identi-



fied as Clive "Lizard" Williams.

Kartel was earlier this year sentenced to life imprisonment for killing Williams. He is appealing the conviction.

The police allege that the report by Saddler was an attempt to assist Kartel's case.

### St. Kitts

The St. Kitts-Nevis government announced an "immediate" increase in security arrangements at the main JFN Hospital following the

fatal shooting of a 19-year-old youth recently.



Police said: "With immediate effect, we have increased the presence of the security forces at the hospital on a 24-hour basis, security cameras will be installed and the visiting policy would be strictly adhered to."

Other security measures would be put in place in the short and medium term, Health Minister Marcella Liburd said in a radio and television broadcast.

### St. Lucia

The St. Lucia government says the war on illegal drugs is being significantly hampered by the decision of the United States to continue sanctions against the St. Lucia Police Force.

Washington announced last year that it was preventing the local police force from taking part in the America-funded training exercises and assistance under its anti-drug program.

The decision was taken by Washington in light of what it called credible



allegations of gross human rights violations by local law men.

The allegations are linked to several fatal police shootings between 2010 and 2011 under the former United Workers Party (UWP) government.

Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony one year ago announced the U.S. prohibition assistance to local law enforcement officers under the terms of the Leah Law.

### St. Vincent

The European Union (EU) has agreed to allocate approximately EC\$45. 5 million in grants for St. Vincent and the Grenadines and St. Lucia after both countries were affected by a devastating weather system in December

St. Vincent and the Grenadines, which suffered the heavi-

est damage, is earmarked to receive EC\$23.5 million and St. Lucia EC\$22.4 million.



This long-term reconstruction support will be in addition to the EC\$1.4 million of emergency humanitarian assistance provided by the European Union to the affected populations in the two countries immediately after the

# Trinidad & Tobago gov't investigates ISIS link

one of the men identified in the video but Islamic Missionaries Guild President Imitiaz Mohammed said that the government should seek the help of Interpol and other international agencies to locate the men, believed to be fighting either in Iraq or Syria.

"Government must keep a check on people who are travelling to the Middle East. They need to try and verify if there are visits there or whether these visits are genuine or not," Mohammed urged.

But even as local umbrella Muslim groups are readying to meet in emergency session this week to discuss the island's growing links to radical Islam, a teenager from Illinois nabbed by federal officials in the past week trying to head to the Middle East also has strong links to Trinidad.

Mohammed Hamzah Khan, 19, remains in U.S.

custody. National Security Minister Gary Griffith confirmed his island links, saying he was born in Trinidad even as he announced the formation of a special counter terrorism squad to deal with the situation at home as official worry about locals being lured away to the Middle East.

The young Khan is accused of attempting to provide assistance to ISIS as the worries of officials in Trinidad grow, the Trinidad Guardian newspaper reported

The latest developments have put pressure and an unwanted spotlight on all island Islamic groups.

For example, Muslim League President Nasser Mustapha said the local community is appalled at increasingly credible reports that some from among its midst have opted to join rebel fighters in Syria and Iraq and want to get a proper handle on the

situation before making a more informed statement.

"They are using our religion for their misguided aims. Scholars have written a lot about this but joining ISIS is not the way to paradise. These fighters are taking things out of the proper context and using it for their misguided aims. I am very shocked to know that Trinidadians could be involved in this. It is very unfortunate that we have reached to this stage. I am

praying for them to return to sanity, balance and objectivity. People have lost their direction by supporting those who are involved in these barbaric things. I pray for them to regain their sanity," he said as he prepares for the meeting.

All these developments come as well just days after the administration of Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar decided to join with the U.S. and other nations to co-sponsor an anti-terrorism resolution at the United Nations General Assembly, triggering criticisms of authorities and fears in some quarters that the island should have laid low rather than join with the powerful and attract unnecessary attention to itself.

Opposition Leader Keith Rowley was among the most vocal of critics in this regard but both the prime minister and Attorney General Anand Ramlogan have argued that the island is not immune from terrorist activist and actually have a history of deadly attacks that include the July 1990 attempted coup by the Black Muslimeen group.

### Remittances to the region expected to grow

Remittances by international migrants from the Caribbean and other developing countries are on course for strong growth this year, while at the same time forced migration due to violence and conflict has reached unprecedented levels, according to the World Bank's latest issue of Migration and Development Brief.

The report, which was released in Washington, D.C. on Monday, recorded remittances to developing countries, stating that they are expected to reach US\$435 billion this year, an increase of five percent over 2013.

The growth rate this year is substantially faster than the 3.4 percent growth recorded in 2013, driven largely by remittances to Asia and the region, the World Bank said.

It said remittances to developing countries will continue climbing in the medium term, reaching an estimated US\$454 billion in 2015.

Global remittances, including those to high-income countries,

are estimated at US\$582 billion this year, rising to US\$608 billion next year.

"Remittances remain an especially important and stable source of private inflows to developing countries, as they bring in large amounts of foreign currency that help sustain the balance of payments," the report says.

It says that, in 2013, remittances were significantly higher than foreign direct investment (FDI) to developing countries and were three times larger than official development assistance.

"Remittances to developing countries grew this year by 5 percent," said Kaushik Basu, senior vice president and chief economist of the World Bank Group.

"Remittance inflows provided stable cover for substantial parts of the import bill for such countries as Egypt, Pakistan, Haiti, Honduras, and Nepal. India and China lead the chart with projected remittance inflows of, respectively, US\$71 and us\$64

# Ousted Haitian dictator, Jean-Claude Duvalier dies

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) \_ Jean-Claude Duvalier, who presided over what was widely acknowledged as a corrupt and brutal regime as the self-proclaimed "president for life" of Haiti until a popular uprising sent him into a 25-year exile, has died. He was 63.

Duvalier died Saturday from a heart attack at the home of a friend in Port-au-Prince where he had been staying, said his lawyer, Reynold Georges, and several officials in the impoverished nation.

The former leader, known as "Baby Doc," made a surprise return to Haiti in 2011, allowing victims of his regime to pursue legal claims against him in Haitian courts and prompting some old allies to rally around him. Neither side gained much traction, how-

ever, and a frail Duvalier spent his final years quietly in the leafy hills above the Haitian capital.

Haitian President Michel Martelly expressed his condolences to the former dictator's family, making no mention of the widespread human rights abuses that occurred under Duvalier and his more notorious predecessor and father, Francois "Papa Doc" Duvalier.

"On behalf of the entire government and people of Haiti, I take this sad occasion to extend my sincere sympathies to his family, his relatives and his supporters across the country," Martelly said.

The elder Duvalier was a medical doctor-turned-dictator who promoted "Noirisme," a movement that sought to highlight Haiti's African roots over its European ones while uniting the black majority against the

mulatto elite in a country divided by class and color.

"Papa Doc" tortured and killed political opponents, relying on a dreaded civilian militia known as the Tonton Macoutes.

In 1971, Francois Duvalier suddenly died of an illness after naming his son to succeed him. At 19, Jean-Claude Duvalier became the world's youngest president.

Jean-Claude Duvalier ruled for 15 years, retaining the Tonton Macoutes and the brutality of his father's regime, though to a lesser extent. The son's administration was seen as less violent and repressive than that of the father, though it perhaps was more corrupt.

Wisps of press freedom and personal criticism, something never tolerated under the elder Duvalier, emerged sporadically during the reign of "Baby Doc" because of internation-

al pressure. Still, human rights groups documented abuses and political persecution. A trio of prisons known as the "Triangle of Death," which included the much-feared Fort Dimanche for long-term inmates, symbolized the brutality of his regime.

Since his return from exile, victims of the regime

have testified in a criminal investigation of human rights abuses during his 15-year reign but the case has moved fitfully and there had been few signs of progress. His death brings an end to that effort without giving Haiti a chance to reconcile with that past, said Amy Wilentz, author of "The Rainy Season: Haiti

Since Duvalier," and other works about the country.

"What this means is that there will never be a trial against him and there won't be a chance for the Haitian people to have justice and to purge from its soul the true horrors of the Duvalier era," Wilentz said. "It's an end but there is no closure that comes with it."





# Will American ground troops fight ISIS?

With the United States dropping bombs on yet another Muslim country, we might benefit from a close look at President Obama's anti–Islamic State strategy.

Obama and his spokespeople are always quick to make two points: first, that no American ground forces will be sent into combat against the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS), and second, that the United States will merely be part, albeit a leading part, of a broad coalition of Arab and NATO countries.

The Obama administration's emphasis on these points strongly suggests that Americans would not support a war against ISIS fought solely by the United States with American ground troops as part of the effort.

In his speech at MacDill Air Force base on Sept. 17, Obama said.

As your Commander-in-Chief, I will not commit you and the rest of our Armed Forces to fighting another ground war in Iraq. After a decade of massive ground deployments, it is more effective to use our unique capabilities in support of partners on the ground so they can secure their own countries' futures. And that's the only solution that will succeed over the long term.

Although Obama was at an air force base, he was probably talking more to the general public than to the assembled troops, many members of which may be

disappointed in Obama's pledge because combat experience is a valued résumé item.

He went on:

We'll use our air power. We will train and equip our partners. We will advise them and we will assist them. We will lead a broad coalition of countries who have a stake in this fight. Because this is not simply America versus [ISIS]—this is the people of the region fighting against [ISIS].

Obama keeps saying that this is not just an American fight and that ground troops will not be necessary. Yet he also insists that ISIS threatens Americans in the United States. That naturally raises this question: what if the local ground troops that Obama counts on—the Iraqi and Kurdish armies and the alleged moderate Syrian rebels—aren't up to the job? Many prowar commentators think they are not, and no one thinks air power alone can defeat ISIS.

The typical administration response is that they will be up to the job, so that event need not be planned for. When Joint Chiefs Chairman Martin Dempsey told the Senate that in such an event he would recommend the dispatch of American ground troops, all hell broke loose because he had departed from the script.

The administration's evasion of this important question is ominous. Even a confused policy embodies a logic. If Obama

# Planet racing towards catastrophe, politics look on

ROME, Oct. 6, 2014 (IPS) - If ever there was a need to prove that we are faced with a total lack of global governance, the U.N. Climate Summit, extraordinarily called by U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon on Sep. 23, makes a very good case.

The convocation of the climate summit – albeit just for one day – appeared to indicate that it had finally dawned on political leaders that there is a problem, in fact an urgent problem, about the impact that climate change is having on our planet.

And yet, the array of leaders gathered together in New York, although full of general platitudes, gave another impressive display of failure to come up with a concrete answer. While acknowledging the problem, many leaders found a way to duck their responsibility, indicating domestic constraints.

Thus U.S. President Barack Obama made it clear that the U.S. Congress would not be ready to ratify an international climate treaty. Of course, this line of reasoning applies to the U.S. approach in general – Congress does not accept binding the United States to any international treaty because of its exceptional destiny, which cannot be brought under scrutiny or control by those who are not U.S. citizens.

Furthermore, the United States has become a dysfunctional country, where the judicial, legislative and executive powers cannot cooperate, even on crucial issues.

on its path towards industrialisation and energy fully based on coal, while other renewable energies will be brought in progressively, even if this will eventually make India the world's biggest polluter.

The European Union could not make any commitment, because a new Commission was due to take over the following month (i.e. October) and the person earmarked for the post of Commissioner for Climate Action and Energy was Spanish Conservative Miguel Arias Canete, who was a major shareholder in two Spanish oil companies – Petrolifera Ducal and Petrologis Canarias – until he sold his shares to garner support for his nomination

No problem, say his critics, Canete's wife, son and brotherin-law did not follow suit and remain shareholders or even occupy positions on the boards of the companies.

In line with this same political sensibility, the new and more conservative European Commission has brought in a well-known City lobbyist, Lord Jonathan Hill, to the portfolio of Financial Services.

Such a system of political compromises is like bringing Count Dracula in to run a blood bank – hardly a system that is likely to appeal to blood donors!

What is sad is that there was no lack of background papers for the U.N. Climate Summit.

Beside one prepared by the Intergovernmental Council on Climate Change, bringing

together 3.200 scientists from all over the world, there was, for example, a report prepared by the Spanish Ministry of Agriculture (clearly not part of a leftist government), based on a detailed study of Spanish coastal areas which found that by 2050 the level of the Mediterranean Sea will increase by a minimum of 30 centimetres (if climate control measures are taken now) up to a maximum of 60 centimetres (if no action is taken).

That means that the coastline will recede by between 20 to 40 metres, with an obvious impact on tourism, ports and costal settlements. One hundred years ago, only 12 percent of the coast was used, rising to 20 percent in 1950, 35 percent in 1988 and 75 percent in 2006. In Spain, 15 million people now live in area which will be affected by the climate change.

Obviously, France, Greece, Italy, Tunisia and all other Mediterranean countries will share that same destiny.

Another more global study conducted by Climate Central, a U.S. research group, based on more detailed sea-level data than has previously been available, reports that about 1 person in every 40 in the world lives in an area which will be susceptible to flooding in the next 100 years – about 177 million people.

Even if immediate measures were taken for climate control, 1.9 percent of the population of coastal countries would be affected. At worst, the figure would be 3.1 percent. To give a concrete example, four percent of the Chinese population, 50 million people, would be affected. Eight of the 10 large countries most at risk are in Asia.

### Those coalition partners of 'pipsqueak' status

For the second time since entering the 2000's, we're deep in "coalition" talk, thanks this time to the strange breed calling themselves ISIS. President Obama, despite his reassurances to the contrary, may well have to commit U.S. ground troops to the effort to rout this collection of maniacs, because of revolting behavior they not only practice but seem to have a sick fetish for advertising. Given today's cause, getting member states of the UN aboard in the attempt to assemble a coalition has been nothing like the side show when George W. In the circumstances, Bush administration overtures across the Third World spectrum landed the likes of Nicaragua, Honduras and Dominican Republic as formal coalition partners.

Such canvassing of small states was fortunately not required here in 2014, the ISIS nemesis having evoked outrage throughout the civilized world. So that included in today's coalition are small countries which in some instances can contribute to the international effort little or nothing. Trinidad and Tobago's prime minister, Kamla Persad-Bissessar, seized the opportunity, while attending the UN General Assembly last month, to officially respond in the

affirmative to Obama's call and have the country be numbered among coalition partners. Whether or not Trinidad and Tobago will be making a material contribution, bottom line is that it surely won't be much beyond symbolic. Bissessar's move has however generated some criticism back home. One line of attack we saw was that the prime minister was "currying favor" with Obama. Along with which was the contention that Bissessar's catapulting Trinidad and Tobago into the spotlight that way was also putting the country in harm's way...harm as orchestrated by deadly ISIS of course.

We have long since come to realize that in these times of ongoing terror threat, we don't necessarily have to be resident in the region considered Ground Zero for violence masterminded by terrorists to be potential victims. Attacks in Bali in 2002 and 2005, the massacre in Kenya last year and of

If this presents an opportunity to make like a world-class leader for the folks back home, why not? Attempting to harvest everything that might possibly yield election dividends is a not unexpected position by the prime minister at this time. president of the Maldives, who reminded leaders at the Climate Summit that small island countries — which would be the first to suffer from any rise in sea levels — have formed a federation to defend their right to exist, went largely unheeded.

An entire new generation has been born since the debate over climate change started but there are no signs that the situation is improving.

In the decade up to 2012, global emissions of CO2 rose by an average of 2.7 percent. In 2013, emissions were the highest in the last 30 years. And yet, the energy sector is mounting a strong campaign to deny that there is any climate change.

If anything, say the deniers of climate change, what is happening is part of a normal historical cycle, not the result of human activity. All data demonstrating the contrary are being ignored, and the upshot of this campaign is that many people believe that debate on the issue is still open.

Perhaps what happened a few days ago between Google and the American Legislative Exchange Council (ALEC) is symptomatic of this "normal historical cycle"?

On Sep. 22, Google chairman Eric Schmidt announced that the hightech company was withdrawing from ALEC, saying: "Everyone understands climate change is occurring and the people who oppose it are really hurting our children and our grandchildren and making the world a much worse place. And so we should not be aligned with such people - they're just, they're just literally lying.

ALEC is a conservative organisation that has urged repeal of state renewable power standards and other pro-renewable policies. It drafts proposals for regulations that it submits to politicians, asking them to make just the effort of passing them into law.

Reacting to Google's decision, Lisa B. Nelson, CEO of ALEC, said: "It is unfortunate to learn Google has ended its membership in the American Legislative Exchange Council as a result of public pressure from left-leaning individuals and organizations who intentionally confuse free market policy perspectives for climate change denial."

So, if you are worried about climate change, you are left-wing and against the market!.

The fact is that executives from many large corporations are well ahead of political leaders. They can take decisions unencumbered by political constraint, and they have found out that working in the direction of climate controls makes sense not only in terms of public relations but also economically.

For example, forty major companies, including l'Oreal and Nestlè, issued a declaration on Sep. 23 pledging to help cut tropical deforestation in half by 2020, and stop it entirely by 2030. Some of these companies work with palm oil, profitable production which is at the expense of tropical forests, especially in Indonesia.

In fact, it was only corporations that made any concrete pledges at the New York Summit.

Apple CEO Timothy Cook said that his company was committing itself to focusing on the emissions of its main suppliers, which account for around 70 percent of the greenhouse gases that come from production and use of the company's products.

(despite the evidence) declares ISIS a significant domestic threat, and if the Iraqi, Kurdish, and Syrian forces fail, won't he be pushed by the logic of his policy to send in American ground forces? threatened, when the world needs help, it calls on America

[T]here just aren't a lot of other folks who can perform in the same ways—in fact, there are none. And there are some things only we can do. There are some capabilities only we have.

In declaring war against the ISIS insurgency (with no congressional declaration), Obama has set the country on a course of intervention in two Muslim civil wars. It can't turn out well.

### **Trinidad**

Trinidad and Tobago-owned Caribbean Airlines Limited (CAL) is predicting a loss

next year, accounting for an increase in its allocation of \$718 million, according to Finance Minister Larry Howai.



Howai was confident that over a space of three years, CAL could become sustainable.

He said a large chunk of losses related to the fuel subsidy, the Tobago route subsidy, losses from the aborted CAL/Jamaica merger.

Howai said the fuel subsidy alone was US\$50 million; the Tobago subsidy US\$26 million. There was also a loss on the Venezuelan route due to the immobilization of the Bolivar currency to the tune of US\$45 million. He said CAL's management had estimated the airline's losses in 2015 at

about \$200 million.

### **Dominica**

The Dominica government has introduced a new travel tax on visitors to raise funds for the port's upkeep.

The EC\$27 entry tax and an EC\$5 security fee took effect on July 14, but was only revealed in Parliament a month later on Sept. 18.

Opposition United Workers Party (UWP) legislator, Norris Prevost, said the government's approach should be viewed as a "clandestine way of evading Parliament,

media and industry scrutiny of a very far reaching tax measure."



Prevost said it contradicts Prime Minister Roo-

sevelt Skerrit's claim of "no new taxes" in his 2014/2015 budget.

Ports Minister Rayburn Blackmoore said the new tax would assist in the maintenance of the ports on the island.



# Boyers' bees thrive in Brooklyn

In a Ditmas Park front yard, under a towering evergreen, a lot of buzzing is going on. That's where the Boyers' two beehives reside, soaking up morning sun. In the hot afternoon, the pine shades them.

Haitian musician—bass and percussion—Chico Boyer and his wife, Kathy, a graphic artist, like loving parents, care for their bees that thrived amidst lush summer blooms, which have long since faded as autumn creeps up.

Kathy tells it, "They don't pollinate these plants. They fly elsewhere, up to three miles, including Prospect Park." Now, late in the season and in lieu of blooms, they're given a sugar water solution to keep them happy and working, and insure that they won't dip into their stash of honey that will keep them alive during the winter.

The Boyers began nurturing their interest in bees through classes with the New York City Beekeeping Association in 2007. A year later, they ordered online their first two lots, each with a queen and 3,000 bees. Introduced into the hive, the queen flies up only once and mates with as many drones as possible, returning to lay up to 3,000 eggs, a day.

"It's very educational for me," says Chico, "I learn more about nature from watching the bees. We think, 'it's us against nature, but we are nature!" Kathy adds, "We contribute to the balance of nature."

During the working season, drones live up to only six weeks. "They're so hard working, their little wings give out," Kathy explains of their short life expectancy.

The typical hive has 60,000 bees. As the season is dwindling, they are down to about 45,000 in each hive. When it gets really cold, the bees compress into a compact ball and vibrate, keeping the queen at 92 degrees and eating the stashed honey, returning to work when it warms up.

These Ditmas Park hives are boxes stacked vertically in the method of the Langthroph Hive where bees build honeycombs into frames. Kathy explains that bees recognize patterns and look for a graphic to know where they live. For the Boyers, each stack/hive has a Haitian veve drawn on it: one is three percussion drums representing "petro tambou" and the other veve is "kongo wongo." The vodou references resonate for

Chico whose family was oriented in this way.

In addition to helping the environment by raising bees, Chico wanted to learn some skills to bring to Haiti. The neighborhood of his family home in Marin, La Plenn, an economically mixed outskirt area of Port-au-Prince, has many youth with nothing to do. Chico explains that beekeeping in Haiti will not just help the

# Jamaica's mangoes headed for US market

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) \_ U.S. agriculture officials have cleared the way for the export of Jamaican mangoes to the United States.

Derek Kellier is Jamaica's acting agriculture minister. He said Monday that the ministry "will do everything in its power to ensure that mango farmers and exports" meet requirements for continental U.S. shipments to begin starting Oct. 20.

Jamaica last supplied the juicy, yellow-orange fruit to the U.S. market in the 1980s. It stopped when the U.S. banned a fumigant used to deter fruit flies.

As a condition of entry, Jamaican mangoes must now be inspected and found free of certain fruit flies, scale insects and diseases

### Pot decriminalization bill drafted in Jamaica

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) \_ Jamaica's justice minister said Tuesday that legislation has been drafted to decriminalize marijuana on the Caribbean island where the drug has been pervasive but prohibited for a century.

Mark Golding told reporters that lawmakers should make possession of two ounces or less a petty offense before the end of 2014. He also expects decriminalization for religious purposes to be authorized by then, allowing adherents of the homegrown Rastafarian spiritual movement to ritually smoke marijuana, which they consider a "holy herb," without fear of arrest.

Golding said it will take longer to agree on more complex changes to Jamaica's Dangerous Drugs Act needed to spur a medical marijuana and cannabis research sector. He said Jamaica, where scientists developed a cannabisderived medication to treat glaucoma decades ago, is "well-positioned to be a forerunner" in efforts to research therapeutic uses of the plant.

As Jamaica advances marijuana decriminalization,

the government is committed to battling drug traffickers, Golding stressed. He said keeping marijuana away from children, the international black market and organized crime will be a top priority.

Previous efforts to decriminalize marijuana, or "ganja" as it is largely known in Jamaica, failed to advance because Jamaican officials feared they would violate international treaties and bring sanctions from Washington. But those concerns have eased now that a number of nations and some U.S. states have relaxed marijuana laws.

Golding said the regulatory framework needed for a medical marijuana and research industry in Jamaica is still being hashed over. Setting maximum limits on pot cultivation is not anticipated, he said, but the government wants to ensure that small farmers "are not excluded and it does not just become something exclusively for major capital-intensive investors."

Ethan Nadelmann, head of the nonprofit Drug Policy Alliance, a pro-legalization group based in New York, called Golding's announcement a "significant step forward"

# Antigua faces climate risks with ambitious renewables target

HODGES BAY, Antigua, Oct 6, 2014 (IPS) - Ruth Spencer is a pioneer in the field of solar energy. She promotes renewable technologies to communities throughout her homeland of Antigua and Barbuda, playing a small but important part in helping the country achieve its goal of a 20-percent reduction in the use of fossil fuels by 2020.

She also believes that small non-governmental organisations (NGOs) have a crucial role to play in the bigger projects aimed at tackling the problems caused by the burning of fossil fuels, such as coal, oil and gas.

Spencer, who serves as National Focal Point for the Global Environment Facility (GEF)-Small Grants Programme (SGP) in Antigua and Barbuda, has been at the forefront of an initiative to bring representatives of civil society, business owners and NGOs together to educate them about the dangers posed by climate change.

"The GEF/SGP is going to be the delivery mechanism to get to the communities, preparing them well in advance for what is to come," she told IPS.

The GEF Small Grants Programme in the Eastern Caribbean is administered by the United Nations office

in Barbados.

"Since climate change is heavily impacting the twin islands of Antigua and Barbuda, it is important that we bring all the stakeholders together," said Spencer, a Yale development economist who also coordinates the East Caribbean Marine Managed Areas Network funded by the German government.

"The coastal developments are very much at risk and we wanted to share the findings of the IPCC report with them to let them see for themselves what all these scientists are saying," Spencer told IPS.

# Regular exercise can help kids do better in school

(StatePoint) Physical activity may not be the first thing parents or teachers think about when they want to boost a child's academic performance, but evidence supports the notion that a bit of exercise for the body is beneficial to the brain as well.





### Antigua sets renewables target

"We are in a small island so we have to build synergies, we have to network, we have to partner to assist each other. By providing the information, they can be aware and we are going to continue doing follow up.... so together we can tackle the problem in a holistic manner," she added.

The United Nations' Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) has sent governments a final draft of its synthesis report, which paints a harsh picture of what is causing global warming and what it will do to humans and the environment. It also describes what can be done about it.

Ruleta Camacho, project coordinator for the sustainable island resource management mechanism within Antigua and Barbuda's Ministry of the Environment, told IPS there is documented observation of sea level rise which has resulted in coastal erosion and infrastructure destruc-

tion on the coastline.

She said there is also evidence of ocean acidification and coral bleaching, an increase in the prevalence of extreme weather events – extreme drought conditions and extreme rainfall events – all of which affect the country's vital tourism industry.

"The drought and the rainfall events have impacts on the tourism sector because it impacts the ancillary services – the drought affects your productivity of local food products as well as your supply of water to the hotel industry," she said.

"And then you have the rainfall events impacting the flooding so you have days where you cannot access certain sites and you have flood conditions which affect not only the hotels in terms of the guests but it also affects the staff that work at the hotels. If we get a direct hit from a storm we have significant instant dropoff in the productivity levels in the hotel sector."

Antigua and Barbuda, which is known for its sandy beaches and luxurious resorts, draws nearly one million visitors each year. Tourism accounts for 60 to 75 percent of the country's gross domestic product, and employs nearly 90 percent of the population

Like Camacho, Ediniz Norde, an environment officer, believes sea level rise is likely to worsen existing environmental stresses such as a scarcity of freshwater for drinking and other uses.

"Many years ago in St. John's we had seawater intrusion all the way up to Tanner Street. It cut the street in half. It used to be a whole street and now there is a big gutter running through it, a ship was lodged in Tanner Street," she recalled.

"Now it only shows if we have these levels of sea water rising that this is going to be a reality here in Antigua and Barbuda," Norde told IPS.



# Call to make migration safer and cheaper

Continued from page 6 billion in 2014," he added.

The brief notes that the global average cost of sending remittances continued its downward trend in the third quarter of 2014, falling to 7.9 percent of the value sent, compared to 8.9 percent a year earlier.

In a special analysis on forced migration, the brief notes that forced migration due to conflict is at its highest level since World War II, affecting more than 51 million people.

An additional 22 million people have been forced to move due to natural disasters, bringing the total affected by forced migration to at least 73 million, according to the latest available data.

"Despite the encouraging outlook for remittance flows, the circumstances of many migrants are troubling. With so many people on the move against their will and many others undertaking desperate and dangerous journeys, it is clear that more effort is needed to make migration safer and cheaper by exploring economically viable policy options," said Dilip Ratha, Lead Economist, Migration and Remittances, at the

World Bank's Development Prospects Group and Head of the Global Knowledge Partnership on Migration and Development (KNOMAD).

Forced migration is typically viewed as a humanitarian issue but affects growth, employment and public spending for both origin and destination countries. The issue needs to be examined also through a development lens, says the brief.

The report says remittance flows to the Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) region are "likely to bounce back this year, following a weak 2013."

It says that remittances to the region are expected to increase by 5 percent this year, compared to 1 percent last year, to US\$64 billion, rising to US\$67 billion in 2015.

environment but can be an income supplement.

"We harvested 120 pounds, this season," Kathy boasts, the different sized jars informally sold by word-of-mouth and to neighbors and friends. The early summer harvest produced a pale yellow Linden honey from Brooklyn's many Linden trees and the end of September harvest, produced an amber wildflower honey.

"We have a lot of Christmas presents," Chico says.

Their 90-year-old neighbor, Mary Campinile stops by for a quick visit, and pipes up about the bees, "I love it. They make honey and it's good for everything. It's home-made and not too sweet."

There are 35 licensed owners of 85 hives in Brooklyn, 277 registered hives citywide, most situated on rooftops. The Boyers corner house offers bees this near-the-ground living opportunity. The hives are licensed—there is no cost—with registration that can be done online by the Department of Health. Basically, beekeepers must use appropriate practices to prevent bees from becoming a nuisance. The Boyers learned early on of the hefty fine levied on unlicensed hives.

Later this month, the Boyers will be presenting at a Bee Summit at the Schoharie River Center not far from Albany, sharing how bee keeping fits into Haitian culture.

# Firm fights valiantly for rights of little guy

For more than 35 years the Brooklyn law firm of Ross and Hill has been fighting for the rights of its clients. It has worked hard and has won millions of dollars for people from all walks of life, but the staff are most proud of the cases where they were able to stand up for victims who had nowhere else to turn.

Partners James Ross and Arthur Hill, who practice personal injury law and related civil litigation, have been joined by His Honor William C. "I can save this kid," said the judge. Although he knew the boy's grandmother, he said he had little confidence that the boy's relatives could protect the boy and get his life going in

the right direction.

Thompson has served in the Appellate division of the New York Supreme Court for 20 years. He said he is proud to work with Ross and Hill, "two of the best lawyers in the state."

"We're not just doing this for the money," said the judge. "We take a great of satisfaction when we can do something for people who need our help. It means a lot to us."

# Africa Now! celebrates at Carnegie Hall

It was 1994 that South Africans decided a new path for their nation. The democratic process elected Nelson Mandela the very first Black leader of the richest African nation and also outlawed an antiquated system that categorized citizens according to their race. That same process afforded a privileged few to benefit while enslaving the masses that occupied the vast and beautiful most southern land mass on the continent. 



## True tale of an intrepid investigative journalist

In August of 1996, the San Jose Mercury News published an eyeopening expose' detailing exactly how the Central Intelligence Agency had orchestrated the importation of crack cocaine from Nicaragua as well as its distribution in the black community of South Central Los Angeles. Entitled "Dark Alliance," the 20,000-word series was written by Gary Webb (Jeremy Renner), an investigative journalist who'd risked life and limb to release the incendiary information.

For, in the midst of conducting

his research, he had been asked "Do you have a family?" by a CIA operative trying to intimidate him into killing the article. The spy agency was ostensibly determined to suppress any facts which might shed light on its covert dealings with the Contras, the rebels attempting to topple the government of Nica-

But Webb, already a Pulitzer Prize-winning reporter, would not be intimidated and went with the piece. And even though he had supported his shocking allegations with declassified documents obtained via the Freedom of Information Act, the Establishment secretly enlisted the assistance of the New York Times, the Washington Post and the L.A. Times to discredit him.

These prominent papers poohpoohed the very notion that the CIA could possibly be behind the dissemination of crack in the inner-city. Nevertheless, "Dark Alliance" became the biggest story of the year, especially among Afri-

can-Americans, many of whom surfed the internet for the first time in order to read the damning report.

Congresswoman Maxine Waters (D-CA) took to the floor to warn that "Somebody's going to have to pay for what they have done to my people." Yet, the revelations seemed to take the greatest toll on Gary Webb, who lost his good name, his job, his career, his home, and even the love of his wife (Rosemarie DeWitt) in due course.

This shameful chapter in American history is the subject of Kill the Messenger, a sobering biopic directed by Michael Cuesta and starring Jeremy Renner. The film features an A-list cast also including Ray Liotta, Barry Pepper, Tim Blake Nelson, Andy Garcia, Oliver Platt, Michael Sheen, Robert Patrick and Paz Vega.

However, make no mistake, this riveting thriller is a Renner vehicle, and the two-time Academy Awardnominee (for The Hurt Locker and The Town) delivers another Oscarquality performance as a family man/respected writer slowly turned into a paranoid soul haunted by demons and hunted by Machiavellian mercenaries drunk with power.

A cautionary tale about what might easily transpire whenever the Fourth Estate is willing to serve as the Fifth Column rather than as a government watchdog.



# Trinidadian Geoffrey Holder, multitalented artist, dies at 84

Geoffrey Holder, the dancer, choreographer, actor, composer, designer and painter who used his manifold talents to infuse the arts with the flavor of his native West Indies and to put a singular stamp on the American cul-

tural scene, not least with his outsize personality, died on Sunday in Manhattan. He was 84.

Charles M. Mirotznik, a spokesman for the family, said the cause was complications of pneumonia.

Few cultural figures of the last half of the 20th century

were as multifaceted as Holder, and few had a public presence as unmistakable as his, with his gleaming pate atop a 6-foot-6 frame, full-bodied laugh and bassoon of a voice laced with the lilting cadences of the Caribbean.

He directed a dance troupe from his native Trinidad and Tobago, danced on Broadway and at the Metropolitan Opera and won Tony Awards in 1975 for direction of a musical and costume design for "The Wiz," a rollicking, all-black version of "The Wizard of Oz." His choreography was in the repertory of the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater and the Dance Theater of Harlem. He acted onstage and in films and was an accomplished painter, photographer and sculptor whose works have been shown in galleries and museums. He published a cookbook.

Holder acknowledged that he achieved his widest celebrity as the jolly, white-suited television pitchman for 7Up in the 1970s and '80s, when in a run of commercials, always in tropical settings, he happily endorsed the soft drink as an "absolutely maaarvelous" alternative to Coca-Cola — or "the Uncola," as the ads put it.

Long afterward, white suit or no, he would stop pedestrian traffic and draw stares at restaurants. He even good-naturedly alluded to the TV spots in accepting his Tony for directing, using their signature line "Just try making something like that out of a cola put"

out of a cola nut."

Geoffrey Lamont Holder was born into a middle-class family on Aug. 1, 1930, in Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago, one of four children of Louise de Frense and Arthur Holder, who had immigrated from Barbados. Geoffrey attended Queen's Royal College, an elite secondary school in Trinidad. There he struggled with a stammer that plagued him into early adulthood.

"At school, when I got up to read, the teacher would say, 'Next,' because the boys would laugh," he said in an oral history interview. Growing up, Mr. Holder came under the wing of his talented older brother, Arthur Aldwyn Holder, known to everyone by his childhood nickname, Boscoe. Boscoe Holder taught Geoffrey painting and dancing and recruited him to join a small, folkloric dance troupe he had formed, the Holder Dancing Company. Boscoe was 16; Geoffrey, 7.

Holder's career mirrored that of his brother in many ways. Boscoe Holder, too, went on to become a celebrated dancer, choreographer, musician, painter and designer, and he, too, left Trinidad, in the late 1940s, for England, where he performed on television and onstage.

He took over the dance company, as its director and lead performer, and he took it to New York City in 1954, invited by the choreographer Agnes de Mille, who had seen the troupe perform two years before in St. Thomas, in the Virgin Islands. She arranged an audition for the impresario Sol Hurok. To pay for the troupe's passage, Holder, already an established young painter, sold 20 of his paintings.

After dropping his bags at an uncle's apartment in Brooklyn, he fell in love with the city.

"It was a period when all the girls looked like Janet Leigh and Elizabeth Taylor, with crinoline petticoats and starched hair," he told The New York Times in 1985. "The songs of that period were the themes from 'The Moulin Rouge' and 'Limelight,' and it was so marvelous to hear the music in the streets and see the stylish ladies tripping down Fifth Avenue. Gorgeous black women, Irish women — all of them lovely and all of them going somewhere."

Holder had the good fortune to arrive in New York at a time of relative popularity for all-black Broadway productions as well as black dance, both modern and folk. Calypso music was also gaining a foothold, thanks largely to Harry Belafonte.

DC United (15-9-7, 52 pts.) leads the Eastern Conference and has secured a playoff berth, New England (15-13-3-, 48) is in second and Sporting Kansas City (13-11-7, 46) in third. New York is only four points ahead of its next MLS foe, sixthplace Toronto FC, which visits Red Bull Arena Saturday, Oct. 11 for a 7:00 p.m. game, so the race is still on. In the last 28 games, when Henry has scored for New York, the team won.

In the Houston matchup, more than 21,000 fans saw Henry score in the 47th minute when he latched onto a Llovd Sam cross as the ball scuttled cross the Houston goal undisturbed. The goalless first half saw New York dominate the game, but MLS leading goal scorer Bradley Wright-Phillips of the Red Bulls did not capitalize on his team's good play; he missed several chances, and in the second half as well, to close in on the regular season

goal-scoring record of 27 tallies, set by Roy Lassiter in 1996 with the Tampa Bay Rowdies; Wright Phillips is stuck on 24 goals the past two games. He also failed to score last weekend when New York suffered a 4-0 loss at the Los Angeles Galaxy.

#### **MLS**

DC made a remarkable turnaround this year. Last season DC United finished with the worst record in MLS (3-24-7, 16 pts.), now the men at RFK Stadium sit atop the Eastern Conference and are the first in the East to secure a playoff berth. DC earned that berth with a goalless draw against Sporting Kansas City at RFK Stadium in DC last Friday night, U.S. national goalkeeper Bill Hamid recorded his MLS-leading 10th shutout of the season to secure the draw. He is a shutout short of tying the club record of 11 set by Nick Rimando in 2005.

Also in the Eastern Conference, host Philadelphia Union and the Chicago Fire played to a 1-1 draw at PPL Park last Thursday night when Amobi Okugo scored for the Union and Robert Earnshaw got the equalizer for the Fire, which set an MLS record for ties in a single season with 17. 




