# Jamaican opposition discusses future

#### By Vinette K. Pryce

Riding on a high from recent polls which put him primed for leadership, Andrew Holness, the youngest leader of a Jamaican government addressed nationals with a forecast to future prosperity.

Now leader of the opposition Jamaica Labour Party, Holness was only 39 when he was handed the controls to his country in 2011. Now making the rounds to Canada and New York to test the temperature of the diaspora community and also project his "vision for transformation" of the Jamaican economy he presented ideas to former residents of his island.

Some claim his vision might be blurred.

Others consider his second bid at being leader to be prescriptive, clear and ready for a 2016 challenge and maybe proven through to 2020.

"I don't see JLP or PNP, the only P I see is the P for prosperity" he told a gathering of nationals during a public forum recently.


Seemingly lured to the Tuesday forum by Jamaica National's annual "outlook for the future" presentations, a declared non-partisan, passionate grouping of patriots represented concerned Jamaicans and not the usual devotees to either the JLP or the ruling People's National Party.

Often attended by loyal supporters of the two dominant political organizations that either maintain or exchange leadership and opposition position after each election, a kind of town hall meeting indulged Jamaicans from the tri-state area.

Former Prime Minister Bruce Golding of the same political alliance entertained a similar pro-

# Governments to re-examine Nigeria's case

Some Caribbean governments say they are moving to review travel bans on students and others from Nigeria in the wake of that West African country being declared free of the deadly Ebola virus for now officials said this week even as others say they are racing to become fully prepared for an outbreak.

Most Caribbean Community governments had in the past two weeks slapped travel bans on nationals and visitors from African countries which had or have been ravaged by the disease but from all appearances, some are moving to review those decisions.

The administration of Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar at mid week signaled that it will likely be the first to do so largely because the World and Pan American Health organizations had declared Nigeria, the world's most populous country of people of African descent, free of the disease as it had experienced no new infections for 42 days.

The governments had said recently that they had taken a decision to ban travel since September but had withheld a formal announcement

### **Antigua**

Antigua and Barbuda Prime Minister Gaston Browne has "unequivocally" condemned what he characterized as "the brutal assassination" of a political figure in Venezuela and the intensification of political violence in that country.

Browne was reacting to the assassination in Caracas, the Venezuelan capital, of Robert Serra, a Member of Parliament from the ruling United Socialist Party of Venezuela (PSUV), earlier this month.

Serra, was murdered in his home, along with his partner Maria Herera.



"This is a brutal assault on democracy that needs to be condemned," said Browne in a statement.

"The callous nature of this crime cries out for justice and peoples and governments everywhere must come in defense of democracy," he said.

democracy," he said.
Serra, 27, the youngest member of the Venezuelan parliament, was an active legislator who specialized in measures to fight crime.

Browne said he believed that the government of Nicholas Maduro would "address this negative political development and restore the sanctity of the Parliament and its members."

#### **Bahamas**

The Bahamas government said it has completed the preparation of a new Petroleum Act and a set of regulations designed to guide oil exploration in the country.

Environment and Housing Minister Kenred M.A Dorsett said the legislation and regulations will form "an integral part" of the recently announced National Energy policy.

"This new legislative package will also include the legislative framework for a



Sovereign Wealth Fund to ensure that in the even oil is discovered in commercially viable quantities, the wealth that will accrue to the nation as a result will be invest, managed and conserved in the most optimal way for present and future generations of Bahamians," Dorsett said.


#### **Cayman Islands**

#### **Dominica**

Dominica's Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit says he has no intention of abolishing income tax as his ruling Dominica Labor Party gears up to contest a general election constitutionally due by March next year, but widely expected before that date.

Addressing the recent launch of a water project in Belles, east of

Roseau, Skerrit said his administration would not seek to remove taxes "just



because you want to gain votes."

Skerrit said that Caribbean countries with no income tax or a sales or value added tax (VAT) had to introduce such fiscal policies "because countries that give us aid are saying to us we are paying taxes and you can't come to us asking for money when you are not willing to make your people contribute."

The prime minister said countries "around us" are laying off workers, but Dominica has not lost "one job, notwithstanding the global crisis."


#### Guyana

The Guyana government says 1,600 medical professionals will soon begin training to treat the deadly Ebola virus as it continues to cause concern worldwide.

Dr. Johanna Cole, internal medicine-infectious disease consultant at the Georgetown Public Hospital says Guyana has developed a mass preparedness campaign to deal with the threat of

the virus.

Dr. Cole said surveillance at all ports of entry including airports and shipping ports, as well as

screening is being done.

#### Jamaica

Jamaica police are searching for gunmen who shot and killed four men transporting two million dollars to pay employees of a Chinese firm constructing a section of the North/West link of Highway 2000.

Police said the men, identified as Courtney Courbourne, 38, Carlton Scott, 37, Greg Harris and another man identified only as Kirk, were shot and killed during

the daring daylight robbery that was described as vicious and brutal



Investigators said the vehicle transporting the men overturned as it appeared the driver was attempting to escape, but was impeded by the narrow roadway.

There are reports that the bandits then went over to the injured men, as they lay suffering from gunshot wounds and fired several additional shots. The gunmen took off with the payroll.

#### St. Lucia

St. Lucia's Police Commissioner Vernon Francois says the recent discovery of two bodies within a few hours of each other on the island's west coast appear to be drug related.

The area is known to be the home of several marijuana plantations.

"It may have been drug related but we cannot confirm at this point in time but that is one of the theories we are looking at," Francois told a news conference.

One body was identified as that of Victor Phillip, 65, a farmer who is reported to have sustained




what appeared to be a gunshot to the head.

The other body also bore bullet wounds.

François said officers do not know if the two deaths are related, as the state of decomposition of the second body indicates that he was killed a few days before.

Late last month Prime Minister Kenny Anthony said that the country's war against drugs is being significantly hampered by the decision of the United States to continue sanctions against the

# Dinkins stresses need for an educated population



Former mayor David Dinkins is quite the raconteur-storyteller. And, he has decades of living behind him to engagingly share.

At Medgar Evers College, last week, Honorable David Dinkins meandered through the storyline of his life with Dr. Brenda M. Greene, chair of the Medgar Evers English Department and the executive director of the Center for Black Literature.

The mayor journeyed with an almost-filled Founders Auditorium, back to his childhood where he was raised in part by his mother and grandmother in Harlem. He reminisced, "We were poor, but we didn't know it." Later, he lived with his father in Trenton. N.J. and stepmother, a teacher, who was like a second mother to him.

Entering the World War II years, he wanted to join a select branch of the armed services and he recalled his perseverance through the rejection that he ignored, as he went from one recruiting station to another, in order to be accepted as a Black

recruit into the Marines. He was discharged in 1946.

Mayor Dinkins looks back at his life with humor and many expanded one-liners. But also, he clearly has the demeanor of an elder statesman. The mayor steered his story through his college years - Howard, graduate school – a fellowship at Rutgers where he dropped out, and later, law school. He guipped, "You don't have to be that smart to go to law school."

Working at night at a liquor store while in law school, he told how he kept that night job when he first began to practice law.

He covered his years involved in local politics dropping the names of his political cronies like interbusinessman national Wally Ford, Assemblyman Bert Baker, Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm and also, Basil Patterson, Percy Sutton and Charlie Rangel (the last three with him were known as the Gang of Four).

He spoke of being president of the Board of Elecclerk, then elected, after three attempts, borough president of Manhattan in 1985. He was voted in as mayor in 1989, defeating three-term Ed Koch.

During the Q&A that followed "the conversation" with Dr. Greene, the mayor said that his greatest achievement was receiving Nelson Mandela. "I feel fortunate to have lived during his lifetime," he said.

When asked what is the most critical issue to be dealt with today? He responded, "Education." Getting the population educated increases their livelihood; healthcare, housing, everything improves. "The most important thing is education," he repeated.

In the receptive admiring audience were students and neighbors, community leaders and politicians, many officers and members of the presenting organization - The Community Council for Medgar Evers College and members from a long list of event co-sponsors – education, business, women's, civic, and community organizations.

while researching whether the bans would have violated the human rights of potential visitors. Once that was established, governments moved to do so quickly.

"The matter will be considered and discussed by cabinet tomorrow. I think that is the appropriate forum to receive information and to take the decision. We will certainly review it in light of the clearance from the WHO and I will be very happy to have that review. As you know, we have very close ties with Nigeria. In our own country we have a lot of Nigerian doctors who work here and a lot of Trinis go to work in Nigeria and, in addition, the president of Nigeria visited us here and I will be very happy to review the ban on Nigeria given the information that has come forward."

Many of the CARICOM member states, particularly those with international offshore medical universities play host to hundreds of Nigerians and other West African students each year. Nigerian nurses and doctors also work in some of the countries and travel frequently between Africa and the Caribbean.

Meanwhile, Jamaican health authorities say they have now sourced and acquired hundreds of personnel protection suits and other safety equipment to deal with an Ebola outbreak even as pandemonium broke out at the rural Manchester Hospital this week when a Nigerian doctor who was ill turned up for treatment and was promptly declared to be an Ebola patient.

Dr. Bob Banjo, a Jamaican resident for nearly 30 years said all hell broke loose when he turned up sweating and dizzy for treatment at the hospital. It took nine hours for him to be diagnosed with high blood pressure as everyone at the facility panicked and scampered, particularly because there was no safety gear. He thinks that island preparation is way off in the event of an actual infected patient turning up for treatment.

But even as governments are reviewing travel bans, authorities are appealing to medical laboratories to ensure they are operating at premium levels in the wake of the Ebola and Chikunguyna outbreaks.

"Labs are being required to do so much more with less" at the moment as the region is facing an ongoing challenge from the severe epidemic of chronic diseases as well as ever-increasing threats posed by communicable diseases such as the already widespread regional epidemic of Chikungunya and the global threat of Ebola," the health ministers forum said in a statement.

cedure when he visited Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn prior to his election in 2007.

On this pre-election goround, the JLP delegation addressed nationals in Manhattan.

During a keynote address Holness expressed hope for Jamaica.

His brief address explained how he envisioned Jamaicans proudly traveling without stigma of being economic refugees to destinations such as Trinidad & Tobago.

He seemed to have 20/20 vision on the topic of education.

Offering a 'Superman' perspective of his vision, he projected how under his governance he would eliminate the Darwinian type of education that favors the privileged.

As if illiteracy might be the kryptonite to stall his plan, he took a chunk of time to share a story about an immigrant here whose explanation in court could not be interpreted.

Allegedly, a frustrated judge unable to comprehend the Jamaican asked the defendant to write whatever he couldn't verbally explain. Unfortunately, the man could not read or write. If the persistent judge had not proceeded to call in an interpreter familiar with Jamaican patois, the individual might have faced a murder charge rather than the manslaughter he ultimately defended.

Holness' brief address was followed by a panel discussion with one of his opposition Parliament colleague Edmund Bartlett. Now serving as spokesperson on foreign affairs, Bartlett previously served as minister of tourism and accompanied Golding on his pre-election, Brooklyn outing.

Prof. Donald Robotham, director Advanced Research Collaborative at the Graduate Center (CUNY) and former Holness' instructor, along with Jamaican Senator Kamina Johnson Smith, JLP's chairperson, of the Legal and Constitution Committee and Irwine Clare, a member of the advisory board of the northeast division of the Jamaica Diaspora USA added to the insightful theme.

However, it was not until Jamaicans abroad joined the foray did the transforming process become transparent.

Clare made a poignant comment that members of the diaspora held little trust in the government and that the diasporans' interest in the nation was to be a "partner not an ATM" did the exchange broaden the vision.

While a majority agreed their role is to help bolster the low-growth Jamaican economy, an alleged social worker objected to being a money dispensing machine.

She explained how she migrated from Trench Town in Kingston, studied to earn a degree and don't mind sending money to the family she left behind.

# Caribbean unemployment expected to drop to 6%

Two United Nations agencies say the unfavorable evolution of the economy in Latin America and the Caribbean during the second half of 2014 will not prevent regional urban unemployment from decreasing slightly this year to 6.0 percent or 6.1 percent, from the 6.2 percent recorded in 2013.

The Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) and the International Labor Organization (ILO) on Thursday presented a new edition of their joint report.

The report indicates that while a regional rebound in job creation is not foreseen in 2014, a lower rate of labor market participation which is to say, the proportion of the working-age population inside the labor force, whether employed or unemployed- should enable

unemployment to fall.

In the document, the United Nations organizations analyze the employment situation during the first half of the year and explain the mechanisms that have helped reduce inequality in the region's earned incomes in the last decade.

According to the report, even though country data shows a high degree of heterogeneity, the employment rate at a regional level—meaning the number of employed people versus the total working-age population—continued the decline it had initiated in 2013 during the first half of this year.

"Considering these circumstances, and as paradoxical as it may seem, the decline in the unemployment rate is not entirely positive news... The fall in labor force participation

that is behind the decreasing unemployment has an impact on the economic autonomy of a growing proportion of the population, especially women," Alicia Bárcena, ECLAC's executive secretary, and Elizabeth Tinoco, ILO's Regional Director, say in the document's introduction.

Despite the current stagnation, the overall assessment of the region's labor markets during recent years is positive, according to the report.

Beyond the situation today, the report analyzes the virtuous links between employment formalization and improvements in labor income distribution.

After the 2008-2009 crisis, employment formalization kept growing, which not only favored women's greater productive insertion but also helped reduce the gap in labor income.

# Caribbean farmers reap benefits of ICT

PARAMARIBO, Suriname, Oct 15, 2014 (IPS) - Farmers in the Caribbean are being encouraged to make more use of farm apps and other forms of ICT in an effort to increase the knowledge available for making sound, profitable farming decisions.

Peter Thompson of Jamaica's Rural Agricultural Development Authority (RADA) said Geographic Information Systems (GIS) technology is being increasingly used to track "localised conditions, pests and disease prevalence. The technology will not only add value to us but to the farmers in giving information that they need."

Thompson spoke to IPS at the recently concluded Caribbean Week of Agriculture (CWA), held Oct. 6-12 in Paramaribo, Suriname.

A great deal of attention

was given to "scaling up" the integration of technology into day-to-day farming practices at CWA 2014, cosponsored by the Technical Centre for Agricultural and Rural Cooperation ACP-EU (CTA) and the Caribbean Agricultural Research and Development Institute (CARDI).

The University of the West Indies, St. Augustine, showcased apps that students in the Department of Computing and Information Technology had developed as part of the AgriNeTT project, a collaborative effort between the Department, the Faculty of Food and Agriculture, and farmers' representatives. AgriNeTT's project lead-

er/coordinator, Dr. Margaret Bernard, said "the main focus...is developing intelligent systems within agriculture. There is a lack of data [and] many of the models

being built did not have real data from the field."

The apps are intended to support agriculture, she told IPS. "A big part of the AgriNeTT project is the development of an Open Data repository, particularly to house agriculture data on a national level... The repository will house different data sets, including farm level production data, commodity prices and volumes, farm land spatial data, soils, weather, and pest and diseases tracking data."

Dr. Bernard said the aim of the Open Data repository was to build a platform that would be accessible throughout the Caribbean. The project seeks to encourage all in the Caribbean farming community to share in uploading data so that "developer teams can use that data creatively and build apps [for agricul-

She added that the creation of apps and tools based on the data would help to modernise Caribbean agriculture. "The collection, aggregation, analysis, visualisation and dissemination of data are key to Caribbean competitiveness," Dr. Bernard said.

Dr. Bernard holds high

hopes for a new app, called AgriExpenseTT, which her team developed for farm record-keeping. The app, now available for download at Google Play, allows farmers to track expenses of more than one crop at a time, track purchases of agricultural products they use on their farms, as well as track how much of the

products purchased are actually used for each crop.

She said farmers who opted for the subscription service for this app would then have their data stored which would allow researchers "to verify some of the models for cost production, so we know this is what it costs to produce X amount of [any crop]."

# **Imbalanced media reports:** Ebola vs Chikungunya

It might be irresponsible to describe the incessant media coverage about the Ebola virus in Shakespearean terms -- much ado about nothing.

However, every day Americans die from cancer, influenza, heatstroke, freezing temperatures, pneumonia and complications from it, heart attack, stroke and a myriad of diseases. If a week goes by and only a single American die from any one of those maladies, the news media would not report with such urgency as they seem to have invested in covering Ebola, the foreign terror that has not killed a single American.

Relentless reports have left many Americans terrified and hankering for more and more news about the disease that took the life of a Liberian national who arrived in Texas and unfortunately became the face of the dreaded disease.

And while they should not throw caution to the wind now that Thomas Eric Duncan succumbed here on U.S. soil, one must wonder how such a terrifying and incurable disease accounted for the death of 9,000 individuals in Africa and less than a month ago, the word was absent from the American lexi-

Perhaps, Ghana's Kofi Anan has the answer.

The former Secretary General for the United Nations said the world ignored Ebola until it spread from Africa. Although the disease had been wreaking havoc throughout the continent for decades, only when it affected Americans and Europeans did the threat of a pandemic become newsworthy.

the evolution of the crisis, the international community really woke up when the disease got to America and Europe," Anan

Annan had some choice words for the world's governing bodies when it came to the wav the Ebola virus has been worrying Americans recently. Anan said that the international community could have nipped the issue in the bud much sooner but because of their reluctance to act, ended up ruining the opportunity to contain the virus.

"As a result of their inaction. the Ebola virus has now gone worldwide, and threatens the health of the entire world."

"I am bitterly disappointed by the response... I am disappointed in the international community for not moving faster," Annan told BBC Newsnight.

Annan contends that diseases only matter to the world once they hit the U.S. and Europe (aka white people). With the disease infecting a nurse in Spain and two nurses here in America and the fact the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) appears to be apologizing for their role in handling Duncan's case, Americans are now being deluged with updates on the dangerous Ebola disease.

"I point the finger of blame at the governments with capacity... I think there's enough blame to go around," Annan said.

"The African countries in the region could have done a bit more. They could have asked for help much faster and the international community could have organized in a much better way to offer assistance."

"We didn't need to take months to do what we are doing today."

Annan defended the World Health Organization, which has been criticized for not responding quickly enough to the worst ever epidemic of the disease, which began in Guinea before spreading to Liberia and Sierra Leone.

The Nobel peace prize laureate said that the WHO, which predicts that the infection rate could reach 10,000 a week by December, was aware of the risk of the disease but relied on governments to give them the resources

Already the governments of Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago, issued travel bans against individuals traveling directly or indirectly from some countries in West Africa.

In Jamaica - the Ministry of National Security said the ban extends to Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone.

The ban also extends to Commonwealth citizens who have travelled to or transited through Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone within 28 days of their arrival to Jamaica.

It was also announced that Jamaican citizens and residents, who have travelled to Guinea. Liberia and Sierra Leone within 28 days of their arrival will be guarantined in the interest of public health and national security upon their arrival in Jamai-

Already, reggae artists booked for concerts on the continent have postponed appearances.

Meanwhile, the Chikungunya virus claimed another youth in Jamaica. The Ministry of Education announced that a 10-yearold student in Kingston recently succumbed from the dreaded dis-

# Fantasies of an Obama-style breakthrough

When we get to the point where mention in the media of the name of Louisiana's governor, Bobby Jindal, is regularly accompanied by the line that he is a prospective 2016 Republican presidential aspirant, you understand why buzz continues about Mitt Romney being seriously courted within the party to be a third-time seeker of the nomination. To hear the Romney proponents tell it, you wouldn't think that, as the 2012 nominee, this guy convincingly demonstrated that core convictions defining him were nonexistent; and every step of the way his actions reaffirmed an inability to relate to folks not within the ranks of the well-off. But a Romney, even that much challenged, evidently looks good when things are so dire as to accord Jindal legit contender status.

If reports of Jindal's interest in running for president prove correct, it must be that his is the standard trial-balloon type indulgence, not one with serious expectations of triumph. One would think he's pragmatic enough to do a realistic landscape appraisal. Born on U.S. soil to newly arrived Indian immigrant parents, Jindal's public path so far has shown him to be steeped in conservative playbook ideology, especially on the fiscal front, in addition to being seen as a pretty bright guy. If he happens to believe, however, that the savage, unrelenting backlash from the right against President Obama has only to do with Obama being a Democrat and a progressive, he is woefully out to lunch. To whatever extent Jindal would be committed to flaunting conservative and/or Tea Party colors in a White House bid, he would be in for a rude awakening if allowing himself the presumption that his ethnicity wouldn't play huge with the right-side base.

Obama was able to twice win the presidency, obviously with an impressive chunk of white votes, but with his core support solidly anchored in people of color. Unfortunately for Jindal, any national office quest by him as a non-white Republican/Tea Party hope, would be without the kind of non-white base support that was a gimme for Obama. Even the Hispanic vote, which not too long ago offered fairly decent trawling for the GOP,

has become a lot rougher terrain for the party. So that not suffering the right's immediate disdain reserved for any Democrat would help Jindal some, but at the end of the day, what he is figures to hurt him a whole lot more. The ethnic stock whence Jindal came isn't very likely to gain him the stamp of approval for potential White House duty from a sizeable portion of the Republican/ Tea Party bloc.


The Republicans' shakeout process for the nomination last time around was a protracted, tedious affair which prompted from party bigwigs the assurance that 2016 will see an overhauled run-up to selecting a nominee, most notably in decluttering what was a debate-laden calendar in 2012. Speculation about Romney being again in the mix has come in the wake of a sense that has developed, that the once formidable Chris Christie no longer looks like

the powerhouse he once did, following the slamming he took in the Washington Bridge scandal that has scarred his administration. Christie (some have questionably attached to him the tag of "moderate") was earlier seen as the great GOP hope against Hillary Clinton in her presumed run.

Christie could of course yet resurface as a 2016 factor... although we maintain that, never mind Washington Bridge, the documented history of the governor's coarse, insulting conduct in encounters with assorted ordinary folk is sufficient to effectively derail the bid for higher office of Christie or any other politician similarly given to humiliating defenseless members of the public. And it's been known to happen, there may well be among the players fixing to throw hats in the GOP ring, some little known contender whose stock rapidly rises (Bill Clinton was no odds-on favorite to win the nomination in 1992 when jousting began among Democrats; and of course neither was Obama in 2008). What's clear is there are elements on the GOP side worried enough about the potential pool of presidential wannabes to exert pressure on Romney to step up to the plate one more time. That's Romney, whose infamous "47 percent" remark to some wealthy folk in Florida, about who in the electorate mattered to him, has taken its place among the celebrated hoof-in-mouth classics of presidential campaign lore.

Meanwhile an ambitious Jindal (he was said to have eyed a run for president in 2012 as well) must think he has arrived where his being in the discussion about presidential possibilities is by no means a stretch. "Don't do stupid stuff," Jindal admonished his fellow Republicans a while back. Certainly spoken like a man brimming with confidence. Which is a pretty neat quality to have in your arsenal, if the presidency is your aim and game. But Jindal's glide through plum appointive posts and elective office in Louisiana could lead him to discount the possibility of his race negatively impacting those ambitions of his. It would be "stupid stuff" on his part to do so.



# Wrongfully jailed, man freed after 30 years

Brooklyn District Attorney Ken Thompson on Wednesday, Oct. 15, 2014 announced that he will move to vacate murder and other charges against David McCallum and the late Willie Stuckey, who were convicted in the 1985 kidnapping and murder of Nathan Blenner. The decision follows a thorough review of the case by the District Attorney's Conviction Review Unit.

"In the interest of justice, I will ask the Court today to vacate the murder convictions of David McCallum and Willie Stuckey. After a thorough and fair review of the case by my Conviction Review Unit and the Independent Review Panel, I have concluded that their convictions should not stand and that Mr. McCallum should be released from prison," said District Attorney Ken

David McCallum and Willie Stuckey (who has since died) were just 16 years old when they were charged with the kidnapping and murder of Nathan Blenner, 20, who was kidnapped on Oct. 20, 1985, in front of his South Ozone Park, Queens home. Blenner's

body was found the next day by children playing in an undeveloped lot adjacent to the rear of Aberdeen Park in Bushwick, Brooklyn. He had been shot once in the head.

McCallum and Stuckey were arrested shortly thereafter and

# Caribbean countries implement travel ban

St. Vincent and the Grenadines has placed a ban on nationals from Nigeria, Sierra Leone, and Guinea from entering the island, as Caribbean countries continue to put in place measures to prevent a possible outbreak of the deadly Ebola virus in the region.

Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves said that the measure was taken given the lack of infrastructure on the island to deal with the Ebola virus for there is no known cure

Nigeria, Sierra Leone and Guinea are the three West African countries most affected by the Ebola virus which has killed more than 4,500 people so far.

"Because we didn't consider that we had the infrastructure, necessarily, to deal with an onrush of people if they were to come from any of those West African countries which we have named specifically," Gonsalves said.

Meanwhile, St. Lucia became the third country within the OECS to place an immediate ban on nationals from West African countries entering the country.

A government statement said Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony has advised the Commissioner of Police Vernon Francois to implement with "immediate effect, a prohibition on persons from these countries who wish to travel to St. Lucia."

"All visitors from Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone will be denied entry into St. Lucia until further notice," the statement said.

Last week, the Grenada government said it is considering suspending travel visas to nationals from the same countries, as it moves to prevent any occurrence of the virus.

The government said the mortality rates are climbing in the affected countries and the potential of spread becoming more and more imminent, the move to suspend the visa could soon be taken.

The THA team had already left the country and was at the first destination in London when they were recalled.









# Caribbean infrastructure needs more investment

The Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) would like regional countries to invest annually 6.2 percent of their Gross Domestic Product (GDP) – some US\$320 billion dollars – to satisfy their infrastructure demands in the period 2012-2020.

According to new estimates released by ECLAC in a report, "Economic Infrastructure Investment in Latin America and the Caribbean Database 1980-2012 (EII-LAC-DB)," the figure of 6.2 percent of GDP comes from applying the "investment trajectory to expected infrastructure needs."

The report assumes that the historic pattern of country investments will be repeated.

"As such, it is an approximation and not a strict recommendation," the documant indicates

According to the report, the average 2.7 percent of GDP allotted to infrastructure investment in the last decade shows that the region is not investing enough.

The study also says that an adequate response to requirements in this field is key for the region's insertion in the global economy in the 21st century and for its people's quality of life.

According to ECLAC, an

analysis of the figures in the EII-LAC-DB database reveals "a trend towards increasing investment in the aforementioned four economic infrastructure sectors during the period 2003-2012."

ECLAC says the transportation sector has drawn the biggest amount of investment since 2005, followed by energy, telecommunications, and water and sanitation.

According to the report, in 2012 (the last year available), average regional investment in the four sectors was 3.49 percent of GDP.

According to ECLAC, investment in infrastructure projects contributes to increasing the coverage and quality of public services (for example, health, education and recreation) and reduces the costs associated with mobility and logistics, which, in turn, improves

access to markets of goods, services, employment and financing, providing a favorable environment for improvements in the population's overall well-being.

Therefore, ECLAC stresses that countries must examine the patterns in their investment decisions to orient them towards new infrastructures that reinforce the path to equality, with sustainability and inclusion.

confessed to the crime. They were convicted of second-degree murder, first-degree kidnapping, first-degree robbery and second-degree criminal possession of a weapon, following a jury trial, on Oct. 27, 1986.

They were both sentenced to the maximum of 25 years to life in prison.

After examining all of the facts and circumstances of the case against McCallum and Stuckey - the verdict which was based entirely on their confessions - the convictions could not be sustained. The CRU investigation concluded that the confessions were false and not supported by physical or testimonial evidence.

From the totality of the

circumstances, the CRU and the Independent Review Panel concluded that the jury's fact-finding ability as to both defendants was significantly corrupted, and additionally finds clear reasonable doubt as to the truth and accuracy of the confessions, which were the sole bases of the defendants' convictions.

To date, the work of the Conviction Review Unit, headed by Harvard Law Professor Ronald S. Sullivan, Jr., has resulted in nine convictions being vacated, and one appeal being dropped. In addition, the CRU has found that of the cases reviewed thus far, 17 convictions are just and will not be recommended to be vacated. Approximately 100 cases are pending review.

# Paragon of Reggae John Holt passes

Jamaican reggae singer John Holt was booked to perform in Florida next month. Although rumors of his death had been rampant on social media outlets, since he became ill at the "One Love" Festival on Aug. 16, the reality of an absent 1000-volt entertainer seemed unfathomable.

However, on Oct. 19, the 70th birthday anniversary of Peter Tosh and the eve of Jamaica's National Heroes Day celebrations, the 69-year-old Holt died at the Wellington Hospital in London.

Holt was one of the entertainers booked for the 2014 "One Love" Festival in London, which was dedicated to the memory of South African icon Nelson Mandela.

And Treat With Love!

Renowned for his distinctive sounding voice, he debuted as one of three singers introduced as "The Paragons." Co-writers of hits beginning with "The Tide Is High" Holt, Howard Barrett and Tyrone Evans released the track in 1967.

Latter day converts probably associate the infectious track with Maxi Priest, Johnny Clarke, Sinitta, Take 5, Billie Piper, Swedish dancehall artist Papa Dee, British girl group "Atomic Kitten" and others who reprised versions of varying genres.

The song was also featured in the film "Lizzie McGuire" and in television commercials for Japanese beer company Asahi Breweries

Gregory Isaacs first covered the song in 1978.

And Debbie Harry's blockbuster version with the group "Blondie" took the song to pop heights selling millions and topping charts in the United Kingdom and here.

Holt left the "Paragons" in 1970 and concentrated on his solo career. By the early 1970s, he was one of the biggest stars of reggae.

His "Stick By Me" in 1972 quickly emerged a superreggae hit and that year became the biggest selling Jamaican record. Holt was branded the electrifying singer to pack 1,000 volts. Dubbed from his album title "1000 Volts of Holt" in 1973, the compilation of Holt's reggae cover of popular hits featured "Help Me Make It Through The Night," written by Kris Kristofferson, Billy Joel's

"Just The Way You Are," and Diana Ross' "Touch Me in The Morning."

The high voltage release spawned chart hits which prompted another blast of current releases titled "3000 Volts of Holt."

His discography includes "On The Beach," "Left With A Broken Heart," "Happy Go Lucky Girl," "Wear You To The Ball," "Sweetie Come Brush me," and "Police In Helicopter."


what caused the Jamaican singer to collapse onstage, there were concerns when he returned to the stage soon after an operation in July.

On national Heroes Day, Jamaica's Minister of Culture Lisa Hanna said Holt, was "one of the true heroes of Jamaican music."

"John Holt was part of that special group who spent their lives developing and promoting our music and helping to establish Jamaica, across the world, as a cultural state. He rose from a trying young singer competing in talent competitions in the 1960's to become one of Jamaica's biggest reggae stars and will forever remain a fine example for aspiring entertainers everywhere."

The minister encouraged the music fraternity to 'stick by' Holt's family throughout this sad period of grief and bereavement.

# Vincy unofficial mayor in 'Hispanic Country'

When Vincentian Charles Thompson left his homeland in October 1990, he never dreamed he would become the unofficial "mayor" of his block in a section of Brooklyn that is predominantly Hispanic.

Thompson, 50, presides over his block in the East New York section of Brooklyn that borders Queens. Most Vincentians in Brooklyn reside in the Crown Heights, East Flatbush, Flatbush and Canarsie sections. A few lives in the Brownsville and East New York sections.

About 99 percent of residents in Thompson's neighborhood, referred to as "Hispanic Country," originate from Latin America or the Spanish-speaking Caribbean.

On his block, 61 Obrien Place, between Grant and Nichols avenues, Thomp-



son is the lone Vincentian. A Trinidadian resides a few houses away from Thompson's; the other residents are from, among other places, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Ecuador and Costa Rica.

Thompson – a bus operator with New York's Metropolitan Transit Authority

for the past 15 years and an Adjunct Professor in Mathematics at Advanced Software Analysis (ASA) College, downtown Brooklyn, since 2005 – said he is called on to do almost everything for block residents.

"I love it, we get along very well," said Thompson, who has been living on the



block since 2001, in a Caribbean Life interview. "They give me lots of love and respect – from the youngest to the oldest.

"I can say they appointed me the leader of the block," added the tireless Thompson, who served in the U.S. Army from 1991-94, as a canon crew man, attaining the rank of specialist, equivalent to corporal, in the pay grade of E4 (Enlisted 4).

"Anything they want to get done from the city or anywhere, they will come to me and ask for my opinion, and (I) take on the responsibility," continued Thompson, who also worked as a New York City public school teacher from 2000-04 while driving city buses full time, referring to block residents.

Recently, he organized his block's first party, attracting Hispanic residents in the neighborhood.

"The block party was successful," he said. "There were many people, and they were all well fed. There were lots to eat and drink.

"Instead of each house-hold doing its own thing, I asked each to do something – one did rice and peas and beans; the other did salad; another did drinks; others did the meat, and so on," added Thompson, who, over the years, has made every effort to know every resident on the block. "Everyone did what they had to do, and it was beautiful."

Visitors were amazed to see Thompson at work at the block party, as residents dined on barbecued spare ribs, chicken, fish and hot dogs.

# Four Caribbean talents vie for Soul Train Awards

Three Jamaicans and Trinidad & Tobago's Machel Montano will represent the Caribbean when the 27th annual Soul Train Awards are held next month in Las Vegas.

Competing in the Best International Performance category Shaggy and Ziggy Marley have been named with Montano in the same category.

Both Jamaicans and the sole T&T national will go up against America-born Nigerian musician Davido, Norwegian duo Nico and Vinz, and English singer/ songwriter Sam Smith for the coveted honor.

collabora-Shaggy's tion with r&b talent Ne-Yo earned him the nod for "You Girl."

Ziggy's "I Don't Wanna Live On Mars" guaranteed him a place on the list and Montano's "Ministry of Road" returns his name for the third time.

Last year, Bunji Garlin took the honor with his "Differentology" release.



And now that the category seems to be holding for four years, Montano may have to charm soca and calvpso voters to sure-up a win.

Jamaica's jazz genius Monty Alexander is also named in the Best Traditional Jazz Performance category. He will face tough competition from six-time Broadway songstress Audra McDonald, Wynton Marsalis, Gregory Porter, Kenny Garret.

There was a time Caribbean artists were overlooked as contenders for rhythm and blues' highest honors. Created by Chicago, radio personality Don Cornelius in 1987, the awards to Black singers focused on homegrown soul with categories devoted primarily to gospel, jazz, hip-hop, soul, and

rhythm and blues.

Not a single category defined the music of the Caribbean region and not until the 21st century -2009 - did Jamaica's Sean Paul champion the very first win in a newly-created Best Reggae category.

Paul had earlier won in a special r&b/rap soul or dance category in 2007. However in 2010 a Best Reggae opening made way for Gyptian to claim.

Since that year, a Caribbean presence became elusive and the category is now absent from the 12-category line-up.

Chris Brown leads with seven nominations. Beyonce is up for six nods. And the "Happy" five-time nominee is Pharrell.

Recently, Dionne Warwick announced the name

# **Freedom Riders**



Actress Vinnie Burrows as Aunt Flora is bringing Drama Desk Award winning playwright J.E. Franklin's play "Freedom Rider" to life and to memory. The play showcased at the Dwyer Cultural Center, located at 258 St. Nicholas Ave. in Harlem, revisits the 1960s when interracial activists challenged the segregation laws and harsh treatment African Americans had to endure under the harsh Jim Crow Laws of the south. It was a time when young college students and brave individuals who fought for civil rights, boarded buses and traveled south to segregated areas.

This became known as the Freedom Rides.

Although many of the activists were told to practice non-violence and given training on how to deal with abuse by rolling into a ball when struck by violent individuals bent on keeping segregation in effect, many had no idea the hate they would encounter and the dangers they would face, which for some resulted in their death. Buses were fire bombed and freedom riders were jailed and viciously beaten by violent mobs of southern men, women and children filled with such inordinate hatred they attacked civil rights

the murders of Freedom Riders and Civil Rights workers Michael Schwerner, James Chaney and Andrew Goodman who fell prey to the local KKK, after attempting to register Black voters in Mississippi.

Ms. Franklin's play, directed by Eric Coleman, takes us back to the summer of 1964, in Harmony Village, Mississippi, where we become acquainted with the foot soldiers consisting of hundreds of youth who braved the onslaught of Jim Crow to register voters. Attempting to register voters and assure civil rights came at a high price. It is especially important to remember those who risked their lives in order to win freedom and civil rights for the many southern Blacks, Jews and people of color who bore the hardships of unfair and oppressive

laws; living under what could be called American apartheid. Not only were there the freedom riders but also the brave Black people living in these regions who remained long after the freedom fighters returned home. Those brave individuals who faced the rage and insanity of vicious whites on a daily basis; whites whose hate saw no bounds and who wielded their brand of law underneath white sheets at the slightest provocation. It took great bravado for those southern Blacks to register to vote knowing the danger they and their families were in. "Freedom Rider," is a poignant

rreedom Rider, is a polgnant play and very enlightening. It is definitely worth seeing and gives the viewer a perspective of the unsung heroes whose stories heretofore have gone untold. The production runs each Friday, at 7:00 p.m., Saturdays at 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. and on Sunday at 3:00 p.m. Freedom Rider will run until Sunday, Nov. 2 at 3:00 p.m.

Hank Palmer (Robert Downey, Jr.) is a very successful, criminal defense attorney with a good reason to hide his humble roots. After all, he was a rebellious kid who frequently landed in trouble with the law while growing up in tiny Carlinville, Indiana.

That juvenile delinquency only served to alienate him from his father, Joseph (Robert Duvall), who just happened to be the town's only judge. In addition, one of Hank's more egregious missteps left him permanently estranged from his older brother, Glen (Vincent

D'Onofrio). And since their only other sibling, Dale (Jeremy Palmer), was mentally handicapped, Hank hadn't been back in ages when he received word that his mother (Catherine Cummings) had died.

So, he only planned to make a perfunctory appearance at the funeral before quickly returning to Chicago where he had his hands full, between his high-flying career and a custody battle with his estranged wife (Sarah Lancaster) over their young daughter (Emma Tremblay). However, everything changes when Judge Palmer is suddenly arrested in the hit-and-run killing of a creepy convict (Mark Kiely) he'd publicly castigated in court before releasing back onto the street.

This shocking development conveniently forces Hank to stick around to represent his father, and simultaneously affords him the opportunity to mend a few fences. Plus, it gives him time to unwittingly seduce a woman he meets

in a bar (Leighton Meester), who is not only the daughter of his high school sweetheart (Vera Farmiga), but might be the love child he never knew he had.

Thus unfolds The Judge, a character-driven drama which is half-whodunit, half-kitchen sink soap

opera that pulls another rabbit out of the hat every five minutes or so. A potentially farcical film remains rather well grounded thanks to Robert Duvall who plays the Palmer family patriarch with a sobering, stone cold gravitas.

Both Robert Downey, Jr. and Billy Bob Thornton turn in inspired performances, too, as the opposing attorneys matching wits in a classic courtroom showdown. And the rest of the ensemble more than holds their own as well in service of a script that has a tendency to strain credulity.







KANSAS CITY, Kan. (AP) \_ Abby Wambach scored in the 54th minute to help the United States beat Trinidad and Tobago 1-0 on Wednesday night in their opening Women's World Cup qualifying game.

Wambach scored on a header off Alex Morgan's cross for her record-extending 171st international goal. Hope Solo made one save to push her U.S. record for shutouts to 74.

"It was frustrating," Wambach said. "We created a lot of chances but their goalie basically stood on her head this game until the end. We just couldn't break them down. In this tournament, we knew that we were going to be up against teams bunkering back and making things difficult for us in the 18, and we just weren't on our last bits. We were just a little bit off."

Trinidad goalkeeper Kimika Forbes made 11 saves and the United States had a 29-7 shots advantage.

"She was big time tonight," Trinidad coach Randy Waldrym said. "She was the player of the game for us. She kept it close and kept us in it. She's special. She was fantastic tonight."

The game was the United States' first competitive match since Jill Ellis took over as coach.

"I was happy, relieved, thankful that Abby put one away because, at the end of the day, with all those opportunities you need to put one in the net," Ellis said. "Credit to Trinidad. We don't see teams that often that sit as organized and put so many numbers behind the ball. I thought it was an

excellent challenge for us. We created a lot of opportunities, but defensively gave up some big mistakes. We should have done a better job finishing."

The Americans are 23-1-0 in Women's World Cup qualifying. They are 4-0-0 against Trinidad and Tobago in World Cup qualifying and 8-0-0 overall in the series.

"There was definitely relief," Morgan said about Wambach's goal and the victory, "but there was also a lot of thinking that we should have had a higher score than that from the beginning. It was great to get that goal, and that was the game-winner at the end of the day, but we should have done better than that."

The United States and Trinidad and Tobago are in Group A along with Haiti and Guatemala. In the opener at Sporting Park, Haiti beat Guatemala 1-0 on Lindsey Zullo's goal.

On Friday night in Bridgeview, Illinois, the United States will play Guatemala, and Haiti will face Trinidad and Tobago. On Monday night in Washington, the United States will play Haiti, and Trinidad and Tobago will face Guatemala.




