Jamaica demands climate treaty

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Nov. 10, 2014 (IPS) - As the clock counts down to the last major climate change meeting of the year, before countries must agree on a definitive new treaty in 2015, a senior United Nations official says members of the Alliance of Small Island Developing States (AOSIS) "need to be innovative and think outside the box" if they hope to make progress on key issues.

Dr. Arun Kashyap, U.N. resident coordinator and UNDP resident representative for Jamaica, said AOSIS has a significant agenda to meet at the 20th Conference of the Parties (COP20) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCC) in Lima, Peru, and "it would be its creativity that would facilitate success in arriving at a consensus on key issues."


Kashyap cited the special circumstances of Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and their compelling need for adaptation and arriving at a viable mechanism to address Loss and Damage while having enhanced access to finance, technology and capacity development.

"A common agreed upon position that is acceptable across the AOSIS would empower the climate change division (in all SIDS) and reinforce its mandate to integrate implementation of climate change activities in the national development priorities," Kashyap told IPS.

At COP17, held in Durban, South Africa, governments reached a new agreement to

Holder to visit Barbados

Eric Holder will soon be resigning from his office as the first African American attorney general of the United States, but he is working to ensure he has one last high-level meeting with Caribbean Community officials before doing so in the coming weeks.

Holder and attorneys general from across the regional trade bloc of nations scheduled a formal session with colleagues on Wednesday in idyllic Barbados.

Officials from both sides say that the Obama Administration through Holder is ensuring that the Caribbean is on the same page with the U.S. in regards to international and hemispheric security.

This of course would include a protracted discussion on the threats from the Islamic State group and concerns that it could be spreading its tentacles to the small and vulnerable mostly island nations in the region.

This is especially so because authorities in Trinidad have already confirmed that some of its able-bodied citizens have left the island to fight alongside Islamic State gunmen in Syria and Iraq. Police across the Caribbean and American

Antigua

The opposition United Progressive Party (UPP) in Antigua has launched a petition geared towards reversing the award of National Hero recently conferred on former Prime Minister Lester Bird.

In a release the UPP said it has been inundated with calls "demanding that action be taken to register our collective disgust" at the award conferred on Sir Lester during the 2014 Independence Ceremonial Parade on Nov. 3, 2014.

"The regime over which Lester Bird presided has been written about by credible and respected political analysts. Bird's failure to take a decisive

legal action against these persons to clear his name points convincingly to his culpability in these unprec-



edented acts of corruption," said former Prime Minister Baldwin Spencer.

The party plans to submit a signed petition to Governor General Sir Rodney Williams, in the hope that he will reverse the former prime minister's Most Exalted Order of National Hero award.

Bird, 76, was named a Knight of the Most Exalted Order of National Hero (KNH) "for his contribution to national development as an outstanding sportsman, lawyer and parliamentarian for 43 years including 10 years as prime minister.

The event was boycotted by Spencer and members of the UPP.



Water filters fight cholera

The United Nations Mission in Haiti's Community Violence Reduction section continued its joint pilot project with the Direction Nationale de l'Eau Potable et de l'Assainissement to install water filter systems and provide hygiene training in Cité Soleil, Port au Prince. CVR's implementing NGO partner, Waves for Water and DINEPA delivered a 'trainer of trainers' session at the Planète des Enfants to local community leaders who will be responsible for the safe usage of five filters. These systems will provide clean water to around 145 local beneficiaries including men, women and children. The training included lessons on hygiene and sanitation which the leaders have pledged to pass on to the communities they represent, widening the impact of the project beyond the direct beneficiaries. The partnership between MINUSTAH and DINEPA forms part of joint efforts between the United Nations and the Government of Haiti to fight cholera. Lessons learned through the pilot will be applied to a nationwide. See story on page 22. United Nations

Barbados

The Barbados government plans to reduce its budget deficit to 6.6 percent of gross domestic product (GDP) by March 2015, Minister of Finance and Economic Affairs Christopher Sinckler said.

Sinckler said in a statement that the government was moving ahead with the implementation of "its fuel stabilization and growth program."

"Following the explosion of our deficit at the start of the program,

when the 2013 deficit reached just over 12 percent of GDP. we set ourselves the ambitious but necessary targets target of



reducing the fiscal deficit to 6.6 percent of GDP by the end of the fiscal year, March 31, 2015," he said.

For the next six months, the ministry will focus on cutting government expenditures, bolstering the Barbados Revenue Authority and reducing the dependence of state-owned enterprises "on the public purse," Sinckler said.

Barbados main industries are tourism, agriculture and manufacturing, according to a 2012 report from the United Nations Economic Commission



Bermuda

The Bermuda government has unveiled plans to legalize marijuana for medical use, while also giving police more discretion to caution firsttime offenders who might otherwise been charged with marijuana position.

The exact cannabis- containing products that will be permitted under amendments to the Pharmacy and Poison Act 1979 were not elaborated on during the Throne Speech at the re-opening of Parlia-

ment.



community," Governor George Fergusson said.

"Significant public engagement, augmented by scientific research and a full consideration of the criminal justice implications, has helped to shape the government's position on these matters," the governor said.

A major report into reform of Bermuda's laws on cannabis was handed over to the government earlier this vear.

The Cannabis Reform Collaborative (CRC) group produced the report after canvassing views through seven groups and targeting different age groups.

Guyana says it has exported 400,000 tons of rice, the most in the country's

Agriculture Minister Dr. Leslie Ramsammy said it was the very first time in Guyana's history that already 401,000 tons have left the South American country adding, "with the countries that we presently have to supply before the end of December, we have 137,000 tons of contract signed to be exported."

Last vear Guyana exported 395,000 tons with more than 50 percent going to Venezuela with significant



buyers being Europe, Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago and other Caribbean countries. Guyana and Panama signed a rice deal in September resulting in Guyana exporting 50,000 tons of rice to the Spanish-speaking country.

Ramsammy said the new contracts for rice export are also on stream but

limit the emissions of greenhouse gases. They decided that the agreement with legal form would be adopted at COP21 scheduled for Paris in 2015. and parties would have until 2020 to enact domestic legislation for their ratification and entry into force of the treaty.

Decisions taken at COP19 in Warsaw, Poland, mandated the 195 parties to start the process for the preparation and submission of "Nationally determined Contributions." These mitigation commitments are "applicable to all" and will be supported both for preparing a report of the potential activities and their future implementation.

The report should be submitted to the Secretariat during the first quarter of 2015 so as to enable them to be included in the agreement.

AOSIS is an inter-governmental organisation of lowlying coastal and small island countries established in 1990. Its main purpose is to consolidate the voices of Small Island Developing States to address global warming.

In October, Ngedikes "Olai" Uludong, the lead negotiator

for AOSIS, outlined priorities ahead of the Dec. 1-12 talks.

She said the 2015 agreement must be a legally binding protocol, applicable to all; ambition should be in line with delivering a long term global goal of limiting temperature increases to below 1.5 degrees and need to consider at this session ways to ensure this; mitigation efforts captured in the 2015 agreement must be clearly quantifiable so that we are able to aggregate the efforts of all parties.

Uludong also called for further elaboration of the elements to be included in the 2015 agreement; the identification of the information needed to allow parties to present their intended nationally determined contributions in a manner that facilitates clarity, transparency, and understanding relative to the global goal; and she said finance is a fundamental building block of the 2015 agreement and should complement other necessary means of implementation including transfer of technology and capacity building.

Sixteen Caribbean countries are members of AOSIS. They have been meeting individually to agree on country positions ahead of a meeting in St. Kitts Nov. 19-20 where a Caribbean Community (CARICOM) strategy for the world climate talks

is expected to be finalised.

But Jamaica has already signaled its intention to walk out of the negotiations if rich countries are not prepared to agree on a deal which will reduce the impacts of climate change in the Caribbean.

"We have as a red line with respect to our position that if the commitments with respect to reducing greenhouse gases are not of a significant and

meaningful amount, then we will not accept the agreement," Jamaica's lead climate negotiator, Clifford Mahlung, told IPS.

"We will not accept a bad agreement," he said, explaining that a bad agreement is one that does not speak adequately to reducing greenhouse gas emissions or the provision of financing for poorer countries. It is not yet a CARICOM position, he said, but an option that Jamaica would support if the group was for it.

"We don't have to be part of the consensus, but we can iust walk away from the agreement. We think that if we walk away it will send a strong signal. It is the first time that we have ever attempted such type of an action, but we strongly believe that the need for having a new agreement is of such significance that that is what we would be prepared to do," Mahlung added.

The Lima talks are seen as a bridge to the agreement in

SIDS are hoping to get developed countries to commit to keeping global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius above preindustrial levels, but are prepared to accept a 2.0 degrees Celsius rise at the maximum. This will mean that countries will have to agree to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Jamaica's climate change minister described the December COP20 meeting as "significant," noting that "the decisions that are expected to be taken in Lima, will, no doubt, have farreaching implications for the decisions that are anticipated will be taken next year during COP 21 in Paris, when a new climate agreement is expected to be formulated."

Whatever the merits of Malloy's first term (and there were fiscal issues on which he was supposedly vulnerable), surely no event during his tenure has resided in Connecticut's, and indeed the nation's, consciousness like the horrific happenings at Sandy Hook Elementary School, two years ago come Dec. 14. That the governor engaged those god-awful circumstances with aplomb and clear-minded judgment was as solid a pitch as any for his retention in office.

In the aftermath of the tragedy, Gov. Malloy assumed a role of lead advocate for gun law changes in Connecticut and saw those efforts rewarded in significant reform action by the legislature, including an assault weapons ban. A legal challenge to this provision of the reform package was turned back in federal court. The court rejected the argument that the legislation was a violation of Second Amendment rights, ruling in January 2014 that the law "is substantially related to the important government interest of public safety and crime control."

Such common-sense interpretation of the Second Amendment shames those strained efforts by gun-rights crazies who rest a case for an unlimited, unregulated profusion of firearms in the society upon the dated, clearly now irrelevant language of the Second Amend-

Even in a nation where mass killings by lone shooters seem sadly to have become part of the social fabric, that unspeakable mayhem in Newtown, Conn. upended our sense of order probably like no other. A visibly shaken President Obama, visiting Newtown to commiserate and console, obviously had a hard time keeping his emotions in check and has several times

commented that his most difficult day in the White House was when he received word of the tragedy.

Attorney General Eric Holder would later speak about the tears the episode elicited from him. Among the hoi polloi, the more sober-minded of us dared to think that this senseless slaughter of innocents constituted a force far greater than the collective indifference of a feckless Congress. Not a chance, as it turned out.

The post-Sandy Hook legislation passed in Connecticut, as well as in several other state legislatures, is laudable. But it remains a stain about which the country as a whole should be thoroughly embarrassed, that not even the horror of an occurrence like Sandy Hook could jolt the powers that be into action that reflects a sense of national concern. Sandy Hook notwith-

standing, the revolting pattern continues, of too many lawmakers in Washington kowtowing unapologetically to the dictates of the National Rifle Association. Worse, it doesn't bode well for this situation abating anytime soon when there's an appetite in the country for electing to the U.S. Senate individuals like an incoming rookie from Iowa, who made a point during the recent campaign of proclaiming her over-the-top kinship with

That they could idly stand by and do nothing at the federal level is all the more preposterous, given that Sandy Hook dramatized so much that cries out for a comprehensive fix. Never mind having lived through nightmare scenarios like Virginia Tech and other university campus outbreaks, Columbine, and others, odds are we never would have figured six-year-olds as potential victims. That any mind, even a deranged one, would go there probably remains beyond our comprehension. That it did in fact go down that way draws attention to the society's failings on the mental health front like

nothing before.

We would come to discover that there existed a perfect cocktail for precipitating the ghastly end result: a mother who was herself enamored of firearms and whose emotional stability seems also to have been questionable; a son whose private domain was such that he reportedly forbade his mother entry to his room in the home they shared. In a perfect world, the alarms duly sounded, appropriate intervention would conceivably forestall what transpired that dark day at Sandy Hook Elementary. So where is the line on "privacy" to be drawn? How much "guilt" does Citizen X bear for recognizing a ticking time bomb and alerting authorities, hopefully that preventive measures be taken?

A mother and child, left to their own devices when they shouldn't have been, have given us this numbing, mystifying Sandy Hook tale for the ages. And it only deepens the pain, that in its wake a country saw fit to pause only briefly, then return to business as usual.

Stop those who would stop Uber

The nerve of some people! Imagine coming to a city and doing business without first asking permission from local officials!

That is what Uber has done in cities all over the United States and Europe, and it has created quite a storm among politicians and licensed taxi drivers, who have held up traf-

fic in, among other places, Boston, London, and Paris just to stamp their feet at the hightech competition.

What is Uber? It is an innovator, and you know what that means. It disturbs the regulatory landscape where protected firms have long settled in safely and comfortably. Suddenly, the advantage of being an "in" flies out the window. No wonder the OP-ED

regulation-spawned monopolies are upset.

To be more specific, Uber (and its competitor, Lyft) is a company whose smartphone app efficiently matches people who need a ride and with nearby drivers. When Uber enters a market, it carefully recruits and certifies local drivers. Then, using the app, people who need a ride can quickly find a car to get them where they want to go. Customers are told fares in advance and how long they'll wait to be picked up. After the trip, driver and rider are asked to evaluate each

You're probably thinking "yes" — unless you're a licensed cab driver, a politician, a regulator, or a progressive. (Recent progressive headlines include "Of course Uber should be regulated" [Slate] and "Why Uber must be stopped" [Salon].) They're all going bananas.

Clearly the welcome wagon rolls out of sight when innovators come to town. In Paris. the government tried to mandate a 15-minute delay between ordering a ride and receiving a pickup. Fortunately, a court said no. The Commonwealth of Virginia has told Uber to "Halt!," while Austin and Miami have (figuratively) posted "Uber Stay Out!" signs.

The only losers from thwarting Uber are riders, who must Sounds wonderful, doesn't suffer the inefficiency and back-

wardness of the local monopoly, and would-be drivers who can't break into the business because of that protectionist, interest-ridden system. Did you know New York City had fewer taxi licenses (medallions) in 2012 than in the late 1930s?

What happened in Little Rock, Arkansas, is typical. Uber came to town to recruit drivers, so the city's board of directors frantically began discussing what kind of regulations they should enact. Uber savs it's not a transportation company and should not be subject to the regulations governing taxis. Uber maintains no fleet of vehicles and employs no drivers. It merely helps drivers and riders find each other. But the discussion of regulations went on.

In your dreams.



Haiti to open ID office in the Diaspora

Haitians living in the Diaspora will no longer have to fly to Haiti to get a national identification card, a critical document to obtain a Haitian passport or the ability to vote in the country's elections, according to reports.

Starting next month, the head of Haiti's civil registry, the National Identification Office (ONI), will open an office in Haiti's Miami consulate and other consulates in the Diaspora to register Haitians, according to the Miami Herald.

The paper said approved applicants will be issued a card, valid for 10 years, with an assigned number similar to a Social Security number.

With the registry key in determining who can vote in upcoming elections, ONI's Executive Director Jean-Baptist Fils St. Cyr said demand at the consulates will also dictate where voting bureaus outside of Haiti will be installed to allow Haitians to vote, the Herald said.

Under Haiti's revised constitution, nationals living in the Diaspora will now be allowed to vote in future elections.

The logistics of Diaspora voting remains a work in process in Haiti, where there is still no schedule for the country's legislative and local elections now three years delayed, the Herald

"There is a motivation among some people in the Diaspora, when they come to [Haiti] for 15 or 22 days, they rush to our office to get a number," St. Cyr told reporters at a press conference in Little Haiti Cultural Center, down-

"Even though the process is long, they never hesitate," he added. "So we decided that if you have this kind of determination, why not bring the services to the people living in the Diaspora?"

St. Cyr said that, given Haiti Diaspora's critical role in the country's economic development, it is not normal for them to stand outside of the politi-

"There are a lot of opportunities people lose because they don't have any identification," he said, adding that the expansion of the office out of Haiti has become "a matter of necessity."



Senior Congressman wants greater U.S. presence in the Caribbean

A senior member of the United States Congress has called for greater U.S. presence in the Caribbean.

In an opinion piece in the Miami Herald, Eliot L. Engel, the senior Democrat on the U.S. House of Representatives' Foreign Affairs Committee, who represents New York, said that the countries of the Caribbean are "of profound importance to the United States and particularly to the millions of Caribbean-American citizens in our country.

"Unfortunately, our sparse diplomatic presence in the Caribbean significantly impedes our ability to engage more deeply with our partners," he said.

"That is why I recently introduced the United States — Caribbean Partnership Act of 2014 in the House of Representatives," he added, stating that the bill would establish US embassies in the five countries in the Caribbean with which the U.S. has diplomatic relations but no permanent diplomatic presence.

He identified them as Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Gren-

Engel said passage of his legislation will deepen the relationship between the United States and the Caribbean and build on the Obama administration's efforts to enhance economic, energy and security

"While these countries are small, they cannot be taken for granted," Engel stressed. "They are key voting members of the United Nations and other international organiza-

"As members of the Organization of American States (OAS) — the only political organization in the Americas that actually includes the United States — their votes are extremely important, par-

known to be keeping an eye out for youths from other states who might harbor similar ambitions.

Officials also suggest that Holder will likely continue talks on dealing with crime and security in the region that he had originally held with heads of government at their mid-year summit in Haiti in March of last year.

At that forum in Port au Prince, the two sides had examined the existing security situation and the role the region could play in fighting international terrorism, narcotics trafficking, and other forms of cross border crimes.

Guyanese Attorney General Anil Nandlall, who has been embroiled in a scandal linked to violent threats he made against a Guyanese newspaper recently, said the session will likely deal with security topics and possible legal support from the U.S. for the region's fight against trans-border crimes

The Obama administration has in recent years set aside nearly \$300 million the region under the Caribbean Basin Security Initiative.

Under the program, some of the participating countries have received vital equipment to help them improve their institutional capacity to deal with organized crimes, including go-fast patrol vessels, high powered radio

communication sets, and other equipment.

Holder arrived in the 166-square mile island, the most easterly in the Caribbean island chain, on Monday for meetings with Prime Minister Freundel Stuart and Attorney Governor General Adriel Brathwaite and other officials

A session with legislators from both the elected lower house of parliament and the senate is also scheduled before the parley with regional attorneys' general on Wednesday.



says the grant, recently signed by Haiti's Minister of Economy and Finance Marie Carmelle Jean-Marie and World Bank Special Envoy Mary Barton-Dock, complements an ongoing "Education for All project" of US\$85 million that the bank manages.

"Poor families at times spend up to 60 percent of their income on the schooling of their children. These challenges are compounded in rural areas by greater poverty and difficult access to schools," Barton-Dock said.

Jean-Marie said the additional financing focuses on the Haitian government's priorities to "increase school enrollment and attendance in disadvantaged areas and improve the quality of teaching."

The project will improve teaching and reading instruction materials and construct 160 classrooms in communi-

ty-based schools.

Trinidad

Police issued a wanted bulletin for a man, who escaped from prison in January this year in connection with the bizarre killings of the family.

Senators: We're optimistic Cuba to free contractor

HAVANA (AP) _ Two U.S. senators expressed optimism Tuesday that Cuba will free imprisoned American government contractor Alan Gross.

Sens. Jeff Flake, a Republican from Arizona, and Tom Udall, a Democrat from New Mexico, said they met with Gross for about two hours during a trip that included meetings with Cuban officials.

Gross was detained in December 2009 while working to set up Internet access as a subcontractor for the U.S. Agency for International Development. He was tried and sentenced to 15 years in prison. Gross' family has said he has threatened to commit suicide if he is not released by his birthday next May.

Asked about the possibility of Gross going free, Flake said: "I do feel we're closer there, one because what Alan Gross has said himself, this is going to end one way or another."

Both senators added, though, that Cuban officials gave no indication any development was imminent.

Flake also cited as cause for

optimism a report by The Associated Press on Monday that USAID is preparing internal rules that would effectively end risky undercover work in hos-

tile countries.

The new policy follows an AP investigation this year into work by the development agency, which set up a Twit-

ter-like social network in Cuba and secretly sought to recruit a new generation of dissidents on the island while hiding ties to the U.S. government. The AP


found USAID and its contractor concealed their involvement in the programs by setting up a front company, routing money through Cayman Islands bank transactions and fashioning elaborate cover stories.

"There's been a realization and a statement that there won't be covert programs run out of AID anymore and that's a good thing," said Flake, who is a longtime advocate of loosening the U.S. trade embargo on Cuba. "It's not just a source of tension between countries; it puts Americans in danger and it really cheapens AID's mission around the world, in my view."

USAID has denied the Cuba programs constituted covert action.

Cuba has said repeatedly it wants to negotiate with the U.S. over the fate of Gross as well as three Cuban agents who are imprisoned in the U.S. on charges including espionage. Cuba argues they were only keeping tabs on militant exile groups blamed for terror attacks on the island.

ticularly as member states choose a new secretary general next year," he added.

"With democracy under attack in the hemisphere, it is important that we work with our partners in the Caribbean to ensure that the next OAS secretary general is willing to protect these fundamental freedoms," he continued. "Interestingly, while the United States has no physical diplomatic pres-

ence, both Venezuela and Cuba have embassies in all five countries."

Without a U.S. presence in these five countries, Engel said it is very difficult to conduct in-person diplomacy with U.S. counterparts on a range of crucial international issues.

Currently, in order to meet with government officials, the private sector or civil society, U.S. diplomats must fly in from Barbados or Washington on expensive, infrequent flights, and at times stay overnight in costly island hotels, Engel noted.

"Close working relationships with key leaders cannot develop because our diplomats are not there to maintain them," he asserted.

"Regrettably, our diplomacy is often reduced to phone calls and emails, even though we all know that the best interaction is carried out in person," he added.

In addition, Engel said U.S. citizens living in these countries do not have full consular services to assist in the event of emergencies.

"Right now, the United States is rightly focused on the many crises around the globe from the Middle East to West Africa. Yet, we must not lose sight of our long-term interests closer to home, and we cannot take for granted our neighbors in the Caribbean," he emphasized.

"Establishing a physical diplomatic presence throughout the Caribbean is just one small way that we can deepen the historic partnership that our countries share," he said. In April 2009, on one of his first trips abroad as president, Obama visited Trinidad and Tobago for the Summit of the Americas.

At the Summit, he declared that "the energy, the dynamism, the diversity of the Caribbean people inspires us all and is such an important part of what we share in common as a hemisphere."





An advocate for legalization Had Marley not died on May with regard to the effects of and an activist spokesperson



'Dumb and Dumber To' is just plain dumb

It took the Farrelly Brothers, Peter and Bobby, two decades to bring back co-stars Jim Carrey and Jeff Daniels for a follow-up to "Dumb and Dumber," their hit comedy that netted nearly a quarter of a billion dollars at the box office in 1994. Far be it for this critic to suggest that the long-anticipated reunion was worth the wait, though I suspect it won't disappoint fans nostalgic for more of the same from the bottom-feeding franchise.

"Dumb and Dumber To" again coalesces around the ter-

minally-inane antics of Lloyd Christmas (Carrey) and Harry Dunne (Daniels), gullible dimwits with a penchant for both playing and being the butt of

practical jokes. As the film unfolds, we learn that, for the last 20 years, Lloyd has been committed to Baldy View Mental Hospital, where he's undergone shock treatments and a partial lobotomy.

Faithful Harry, meanwhile, has been a daily visitor, regularly changing the bag of urine waste attached to his pal's private parts. Today, however, the wheelchair-bound patient giggles "Gotcha!" to reveal that his protracted stay in the asylum has all been a gag staged purely for his buddy's benefit.

After admiring the elaborate ruse, Harry rips the catheter out of Lloyd's penis roughly, with the help of a couple of obliging groundskeepers. Ouch!

The reunited roommates immediately make their way home to their apartment where they proceed to pull a meanspirited prank on their apprehensive, blind next-door neighbor (Brady Bluhm) by feeding Pop Rocks to his pet birds (don't try that at home, kids!).

Harry subsequently exposes the anus of their cat to explain why he refers to it as Butthole, another joke that merely falls flat. Equally unfunny is the introduction of a drug dealer (Bill Murray) whose crystal meth Harry mistakes for candy.

Such lowbrow fare serves as prologue and proves to be par for the course for the peripatetic adventure about to ensue. Yes, the farfetched road trip does revolve around the rudiments of a plot, though that's ostensibly of less concern to the filmmakers than seizing on the flimsiest of excuses to gross out their audience at every opportunity.

To summarize the story in 25 words or less, Harry has his own medical issue and is in urgent need of a kidney donor. Fortunately, he has a long-lost daughter he's never met (Rachel Melvin) who just might be a genetic match.

With that, our brain-damaged protagonists are off on a cross-country trek in search of Penny that provides this kitchen sink shocksploit ample opportunities to slap disgusting displays of depravity and vulgarity onscreen.



Jamaica and we would always link up," she said. "I love her voice; she has soul. I grew up listening to that type of music, so I asked her to come on the album because I just felt her on it."

Saw was the first female Jamaican artist to win a Grammy, go certified triple-platinum, artist and headline dancehall shows outside her native country.

Born Marion Hall in Galina (parish of Saint Mary), she started her career on local sound systems like many artists on the island. As a female artist in a male-dominated world of Jamaican dancehall reggae, Lady Saw defeated all

odds when she went on to top the Jamaican charts with "Find a Good Man." In 2002, her collaboration with No Doubt, "Underneath It All" reached number three in the U.S. and sold more than three million copies, reaching triple platinum certification. The track also won a Grammy Award for "Best Performance by a Duo or Group." Lady Saw released six albums under VP Records and then formed her own label called Divas Records. In 2010, she released her first independent album entitled "My Way," which was later followed up by the hot single "Heels On" which reached No. 1 on all Caribbean charts.





Cardinals hopeful for big season



tain and star batsman Chris Gayle was included in the squad announced Wednesday.

"Of course at all times the selection panel aims to select the best and strongest team available," Lloyd said. "We look forward to this squad giving a good account of themselves for the three tests in South Africa."

Lloyd, a former test and World Cupwinning captain, had to apologize last month for the West Indies' abrupt withdrawal less than halfway through its India tour, which left furious local organizers threatening legal action and scrambling to organize replacement matches against Sri Lanka.

"I did not want it to end like this. It's unfortunate we left, and I hope the damage is not irreparable," Lloyd said at the time.

The International Cricket Council described the West Indies' withdrawal from the tour as "damaging and unacceptable" and indicated that such behavior in future would jeopardize players' participation in lucrative domestic tournaments like the Indian Premier League.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India, which is the most powerful stakeholder in international cricket with vast revenues from sponsorship and TV deals, has suspended bilateral ties with the West Indies and also claimed \$42 million as compensation for lost revenue.

There was initially concern about the South Africa tour going ahead, but the West Indies management has taken the first step in proceeding by selecting the squad while an investigation into the India tour is ongoing.

"There is a significant amount of international cricket to be played over the next six months, including test matches against some of the higher-ranked teams in world cricket and as such it would be critical for the squad to get off on a positive note in South Africa," Lloyd said.

The three-test series will be followed by three Twenty20 matches and five limited-overs internationals. The World Cup starts February in Australia and New Zealand.


