Black Friday Protest for Wall St.

Three weeks after the dav-after Thanksgiving national sale marathon popularly known as Black Friday, a Day of Outrage protest rally will be held at the headquarters of America's financial district.

"Don't get it twisted, this is going to be a real Black Friday," an outraged New Yorker said about a Dec. 19 demonstration planned for 26 Wall St.

Organizer Omowale Clay

said the day marks the 27th anniversary of the first Day of Outrage which crippled subway service and businesses when New Yorkers mobilized to call attention to police brutality in the

BACK IU AFRICA THEY GO

Trinidad deports 11 Ghanians

A race-laced row over the deportations of eleven Ghanians to West Africa this week has sparked a major race controversy in Trinidad just as the ethnically-divided nation is preparing for general elections in the coming months.

While most people were asleep on the twin-island republic with Tobago on Monday, the group was secretly put on a specially chartered Caribbean Airlines flight with 15 special branch officers and flown across the ocean to Africa at the start of what officials say is a spirited effort to rid the country of thousands of undocumented residents from all over the

Their deportation after hours of appeal hearings lasting unusually

into Saturday and Sunday has raised discomforts about whether the Indoled administration of Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar specifically targeted Africans for expulsion as against other racial groups in the country including Indian and Chinese nationals.

The umbrella Emancipation Support Committee for example, called the deportations brutal and inhumane and pointed to a series of previous alarms it had raised about the alleged targeting of Africans in the country, especially those who had been in detention for months on end awaiting hearings or deportations on mostly immigration issues.

By midweek, Attorney General Anand Ramlogan was forced to roll

'I Can't Breathe!' protest rages on

The last words stifling through the lungs of Eric Garner, has become the mantra of a nationwide call for policing reform in communities of color.

New York City's streets, stores, and transportation systems have been affected by people in an ongoing protest of the "no-indictment verdict" announced by a Staten Island grand jury on Wednesday,

Lack of confidence in the policing habits of the NYPD have prompted New Yorkers of all walks of life marched in solidarity with their brothers and neighbors persecuted by what many of the protesters have called racist policies adopted and enforced by the New York City police department.

Elsa Waithe, one of the people voicing the loosely organized protests, expressed that "[our] purpose is to disrupt the system so [the NYPD] will know we will not allow business as usual."

According to an article published in the New York Daily News on Monday, in 179 fatalities involving uniformed officers in a 15-year span, only three led to indictments yielding one conviction. The Daily News highlights a systematic lax in the handling of police shootings resulting the death of unarmed men of color. The article found that approximately 27 percent of people killed by police officers were unarmed. In cases where the race was identified, 86 percent of the killings were individuals of African or Hispanic descent.

The data was recorded after the mistaken identity killing of an unarmed black male Amadou Diallo in 1999.

in the Bronx. Four plainclothes officers approached the 22-year old, returning to his apartment. They ordered him to show identification. When Diallo reached for his wallet he was blitz with bullets. 41 shots were fired, 19 struck him. The four officers mistook is action of motioning for his wallet as him reaching for a gun.

The officers were acquitted of all murder charges.

Bryan Conrov was the only officer convicted in the 176 reported killings by police officers.

In 2005, Conroy was convicted of criminally negligent homicide in the shooting death of Ousmane Zongo, 43. The husband and, "father of two was never implicated in the counterfeit goods investigation." Conroy disguised as a postal worker, drew his weapon and Diallo was Guinean immigrant living shot Zongo four times. Conroy did not mas.

receive jail time for the murder of an unarmed black male. He was only sentenced to five years of probation and 500 hours of community service.

Staten Island not indicting Officer Daniel Pantaleo in the chokehold death of Eric Garner aligns with the paradigm of impunity awarded to law enforcement in the killing of unarmed men of color.

"[We] are bringing awareness to a [situation] a lot of people are not [conscious] is going on", asserted Waithe while dissidents echoed Garner's final words. The mob navigated through cars stalled by their demonstration, reciting, "HANDS UP! DON'T SHOOT!" They hoisted signs displaying the names of their fellow countrymen fallen victim to police brutality. They paraded banners reading, "Black Life Matters," inspiring drivers inconvenienced by the movement to show support by honking their horns.

Waithe describes the protest as an annoyance but justified its necessity by expressing her own grievances. "...I am annoyed that my rights are taken away. If it takes a few extra minutes to get to work or home, so be it." She urges us to remember that, "Eric Garner is never coming home."

World AIDS Day in **Brooklyn**

In commemorating World AIDS Day on Dec. 1, Lutheran Family Health Centers' (LFHC) Caribbean-American site, in conjunction with the Caribbean Women's Health Association (CWHA), gathered for a special march and event to raise HIV/ AIDS awareness and to educate the community on prevention.

The site's staffers also tied red ribbons to nearby trees. The special event was themed "Focus, Partner and Achieve: An AIDS Free Genera-

The group's procession made its way from East 34th Street to Nostrand Avenue in Brooklyn.

Participants distributed information packets and commemorative red ribbons and pins.

At the end of the march, CWHA's speakers shared information to patients at LFHC's Caribbean-American site about HIV/AIDS prevention and personal experiences treating and living with HIV and AIDS.

LFHC's Caribbean-American site is located at 3414 Church Avenue in Brooklyn.

New York State Sen. Kevin S. Parker, who also attended the program, spoke of a loved one who passed away because of AIDS and strongly emphasized the importance of HIV/AIDS prevention and awareness.

"On World AIDS Day, we want to make sure there's an awareness of HIV/ AIDS," said Parker, who represents the 21st Senatorial District in Brooklyn. "It [HIV/AIDS] can be eliminated starting with getting to know our status."

On World AIDS Day on Monday, U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon said ending the epidemic by 2030 requires a "comprehensive approach that includes social justice, the democratization of science, gender equity, and a peoplecentered approach to health.

He spotlighted the gap in prevention and treatment that persist among regions and people.

Ban said in his message to mark the Day that, with some 35 million people worldwide living with HIV - 19 million of whom do not even know they have the virus – "tremendous" gains made over the years in fighting the virus remain very fragile.

"The legacy of the AIDS response is already apparent as we confront Ebola in West Africa. We know that medical systems alone are not enough to provide robust health care," said Ban as events kicked off across the globe to mark World AIDS Day, launched in 1988 as the first-ever global health

Caribbean

British tourists are being warned of the dangers of the chikunguyana virus that is sweeping the Caribbean.

According to the Daily Mail newspaper, "British tourists in the Caribbean are being struck down by a debilitating and potential deadly virus carried by mosquitoes.

An unprecedented outbreak of the chickunguyana virus is affecting several Caribbean islands,

including Barbados, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines where many UK holiday tourist flock dur-



ing the festive season, the newspaper said.

It said thousands have been hit by the illness that leaves victims bedridden for days and the "more vulnerable victims have died."

British tourists and expats are among hundreds of thousands of cases reported since the outbreak last year.

Chickunguyana, which is contracted through mosquito bites, causes a sudden onset of fever, and agonizing joint pain, particularly affecting the hands, wrists, ankles and feet.

Antigua

Chairman of the shareholder's governments of the cash-strapped regional airline LIAT, Dr. Ralph Gonsalves says while he is unaware of the details regarding any possible retrenchment of employees, the airline needs to deal with its high cost of operations.

Recently, the troubled airline described as "speculation" media reports it was planning to trim its workforce by sending home as many as 200 employees.

The Observer Newspaper in Anti-

gua reported the airline, which is owned by the governments of Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, and St. Vincent and



the Grenadines, would send home the workers as it moves to improve its financial stability.

Gonsalves, who is also Prime Minister of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, said he is aware of plans to streamline the operations of the airline as to ensure "that LIAT be placed on a sounder commercial competitive footing."

But he said he wanted to make it clear LIAT has explained on numerous occasions the need to cut the high costs of its operations, including salary, fuel, repairs and lease arrangements.

Haiti sees cholera increase

in Barbados is on the decline, dropping by 20 percent compared to the same period last year.

He said as of Nove. 22, 2014, there were 6,526 reported cases of crime in the country compared to 7,893 cases for the same period last year.

The AG said to date, there were 22

homicides, compared to 23 in 2013. Of the 22 homicides reported. 18 persons have been charged and brought before the law courts of the country.



Turning to crime against visitors, the home affairs minister said to date, 239 reports were received between January and November, compared to 251 last year.

He explained that the most prevalent form of crime against visitors included theft from accommodation, those totaled 106 cases; 19 cases of theft from the persons and 16 of robbery.

Guyana

The Guyana government recently announced salary increases for public servants and members of the Disciplined Forces.

A statement from the Office of President Donald Ramotar said more than 20,000 public servants and members of the Discipline Forces would receive salary increase ranging from five to eight in 2013, the number of cases treated by

to Jan. 1, 2014.

"In keeping with the government of Guyana's commitment to provide these increases, public servants and members of the Discipline Forces earning above Guy\$50,000 (Guy\$1=US\$0.004) monthly wages and salaries as of Dec.

31, 2014, are being granted and across the board increase of five percent; while those earning less than Guy\$50,000 monthly



as of Dec. 31, 2013, would be receiving eight percent across the board increase, retroactive to Jan. 1, 2014.

Teachers earning less than Guy\$50,000 monthly as at Dec. 31, 2013, are being granted an additional three percent increase across the board.

Haiti

The international medical group, Doctors Without Borders is reporting an increase in cholera cases in Haiti in recent weeks.

Oliver Schulz, head of the group's Haiti mission, said more than 2,000

people with symptoms of the disease were in need of emergency hospitalization since mid-October.



He said compared to the same period ing the public the assurance that crime percent as of Dec. 31, 2013, retroactive Doctors Without Borders has almost

doubled.

In a statement, the group said Haiti's health system "is still facing shortages of funding, human resources and drugs," and authorities are displaying a "lack of preparation for outbreaks that are known and foreseeable."

Cholera cases become particularly bad during rainy months, aggravated by a scarcity of sanitation and clean water in many areas. It is most often spread through the consumption of contaminated drinking water or food.

The cholera outbreak in Haiti surfaced in October 2010.

St. Lucia

Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony says the St. Lucia economy is beginning to turn around and the country should return to positive growth by the next financial year.

Anthony, addressing a recent conference of the ruling St. Lucia Labor Party (SLP) said there is no doubt

that the one issue that transcends all other issues and "that is on the mind of every citizen is the state of the economy."



"We inherited a broken economy from the United Workers Party (UWP). Our job is to fix it," Anthony said, telling supporters there is light at the end of the tunnel and "we are right on

"We will not be shopping for bargains on this Black Friday but for action and justice from some of the biggest investors in Wall Street."

According to one of the spokespersons for the organizers, at noon, demonstrators will rally in front of Federal Hall at Wall and Nassau Sts in the heart of the business district just a half block from the New York Stock Exchange.

Last week, City Council members walked out of the Council Chambers to protest the recent Grand Jury decision to forego prosecution of Officer Daniel Pantaleo who choked Eric Garner to death in Staten Island because according to the NYPD he was suspected of selling loose cigarettes.

"Black life matters," the elected city officials chanted as they exited City Hall and probably disrupted business as usual for the city's governing group.

"Yes it is happening in Ferguson, Yes it is happening in East New York and Yes, it is happening on Staten island and it is not isolated, these killings are occurring all over the country," Brook-

lyn councilwoman Inez Barron said.

"Black life matters and they have to know it"

Her sentiments were endorsed and amplified by her husband, Charles Barron, a former councilman and recently elected Brooklyn Assemblyman.

He released a statement announcing his five-point plan that could ensure better police relations and improved accountability for the tarnished security force repeatedly accused of brutalizing and killing minorities.

Barron proposed that instead of following a tradition of the mayor appointing a police commissioner, an election process should decide the head of the NYPD. He called for the complete dismantling of the city's Grand Jury system which many have described to be archaic.

out what he said were official statistics showing that the 725 Guyanese sent back home in the past three years represented the largest single group of deportees rather than Africans. Those from the continent were number seven on the list of largest groups he said.

"The truth of the matter is that illegal immigrants from the African continent were

way down on the list at number seven. The total number of African immigrants that have been deported from 2010 to now is 70 persons. Seventy African deportees in four, nearly five, years, against 734 Guyanese in the same period So when we run to light a fire, coming on the heels of the Ferguson experience in the U.S. and we jump to pour kerosene to light a social flame that we cannot control, then we must look to the truth which shall set us free. And the statistics show that we must reject outright that kind of nonsense and absurd allegation against the government of Trinidad and Tobago."

"There is absolutely no merit, truth or justification in it," he noted, calling allegations about racial targeting disturbing.


The island of 1.3 million that is almost equally dominated by Afro and Indo Trinidadians is scheduled to hold general elections by the third quarter of the new year. The general predic-

tion is that the governing People's Partnership, wracked by widespread allegations about graft, sleaze, corruption and mismanagement of major projects, will likely lose to the Afro-supported People's National Movement of Opposition Leader Keith Rowley.

It is also left to be seen whether the issue and others linked to race will be part of the campaign as race is at the center of much of what happens in Trinidad and neighboring Guyana where the British brought hundreds of indentured Indians from India to replace Africans who had been emancipated from sugar and other plantations in the 1830s.

The British ensured that the Indians were treated better than the Africans, given land to plant, wages and other incentives, sparking divisions between the two major groups that simmer to this day. But even as different groups were debating the racial and other merits of the deportations of the group back to Ghana, the leading Express Newspaper hinted that there might well be some levels of political and security discomfort by authorities with many of the African and other illegals in the country.

It said, for example, that some of the dozens of Nigerian academic exchange students who came to Trinidad in recent years, were actually former armed rebels fighting to liberate the country's oil and gas-rich delta from the grips of western control.

Haitians protest delayed elections



PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) _ Thousands of anti-government protesters marched Saturday through Haiti's capital for the second time in two days amid anger over delayed elections and other issues.

The crowd began marching peacefully toward the Canadian Embassy in Port-au-Prince, but protesters later began burning tires, throwing rocks at police and trying to force their way through barricades as officers fired tear gas.

Many protesters carried posters demanding that President Michel Martelly and Prime Minister Laurent Lamothe step

"We need elections in the country so democracy can continue ... not corruption," said Jean Ronald Brison, owner of an auto parts store.

Martelly's administration was supposed to call elections in 2011 for a majority of Senate seats, the entire Chamber of Deputies and local offices.

But both he and Lamothe have blamed legislators for blocking a vote that would lead to approval of an electoral law.

Workshop on drug treatment courts

The Organization of American States (OAS) says it has launched the third and final two-day regional training workshop on the Monitoring and Evaluation of Drug Treatment Courts (DTCs) in the Caribbean.

The OAS said on Thursday that participants at the workshop in Barbados, organized by the hemispheric body's Inter-American Drug Abuse Control Commission (CICAD), included judicial, health and drug treatment officials from Barbados, Belize, Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago, and Canada, including the chief justices of Belize and Barba-

Adriel Brathwaite, attorney general and minister of home affairs of Barbados, opened the workshop highlighting his country's investment in the drug treatment court program, "to save our young people."

He expressed gratitude for the support from the govern-

ment of Canada and the United States to the OAS Drug Treatment Court program, while also expressing the view that the countries, including Barbados, should take responsibility for the initiative within their countries.

The OAS representative in Barbados, Francis McBarnette, noted that the training provides DTC teams in the country with an important resource, as monitoring and evaluation are crucial to the process of implementing DTCs.

The High Commissioner of Canada to Barbados and the OCES, Richard Hanley, said his country is pleased to fund this project given that DTCs help to provide an alternative to incarceration for drugdependent abusers, and also to reduce crime, recidivism and overpopulation in prisons, "which is one of the biggest problems in Barbados," according to the OAS.

Now is the time for churches to speak up

"Then Mordecai told them to reply to Esther, 'Do not imagine that you in the king's palace can escape any more than all the Jews. For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance will arise for the Jews from another place and you and your father's house will perish. And who knows whether you have not attained rovalty for such a time as this?"" (Book of Esther 4:13-14).

A lot has happened in the last three months or so when it comes to black people and black men in particular. The feeling of abuse and injustice by the criminal justice system has been crushing and for many blacks it has given them the feeling of wanting to go to sleep and never waking up just to escape this nightmare that is the reality of the "Land of the free and home of the

brave." Black people have not seen much of either for quite some time.

Curiously enough, the church has been very inconspicuous by its silence and absence in this matter. Yes, there has been some commentary about sin being the root cause for injustice and oppression, but for some that is the equivalent of stating, "The sun rises in the east." Meanwhile, there are people chanting, "Hands

up" and "I can't breathe." Citizens in this country are staging "Die ins", laving on the cold cement in protest of injustice while the church just seems concerned with giving charismatic sermons. This is a far cry from the role that the church, particularly the black church played in the 1950s and 60s during the Civil Rights era. They marched, they protested, they orchestrated boycotts. They were willing to be hosed down and had dogs set on them in the streets. They got arrested and praised God in jail.

However, in recent times, we have seen a church prone to shrink from services that come with peril or loss. The church is quick to come out against tv shows like the now canceled show, GCB or Black Jesus, but when it comes to standing in the

Time to change direction on tax extenders

While the dust is still settling from the mid-term elections and the pundits are trying to figure out what it all means, the American people have made their collective voices heard and delivered a message that they do not like the country's direction. Exit polling data from Election Day showed clear majorities in against growing corporate influence on the political process and in favor of greater corporate accountability. The message is clear: inversions must stop, corporate tax

avoidance must end, and spe- led Foreign Corporation cial corporate loopholes must

The question that remains, of course, is whether Congress will hear that message. As the post-election lame duck session gets underway, Congress has an excellent opportunity to show that they've heard the American people loud and clear by acting on tax extenders. There are two extenders that exemplify the very worst of corporate tax avoidance and should be allowed to fade away.

The first is the Control-

(CFC) Look-Through rule. The CFC Look-Through rule allows multinationals to create "stateless income," moving income to low or no-tax countries and avoid U.S. tax in the process. They do this by setting up a network of subsidiaries, one of which own copyrights and patents used by the other foreign subsidiary. The fees paid from the one subsidiary to another create vast profits for these entities and avoid any tax anywhere. Google has heavily utilized

Across the bridge, 'justice' frozen in time

So maybe our scanning mechanism for the city came up short on its reach when we talked last edition about New York's "cachet" being none too welcoming of cultural traits that just plain reek. In which context we noted the aberrational presence here of two high-flying Republican schmucks who are in no way to be mistaken as representing the classiness we associate with New York chic. Alas, we neglected to consider in the reckoning the most "outer" of the boroughs constituting the New York tapestry, which last week made the loudest discordant noise despoiling of the city's harmony that we've heard in quite a while.

The law enforcement travesty that went down last July on Staten Island, causing Eric Garner's pointless death, and the due process charade orchestrated by the borough's district attorney, culminating in last week's grand jury outrage, will be one of this city's stains for the ages. An instance of unequivocal rogue behavior by "protect and serve" guys on the Staten Island streets brought about the demise of another

black man. And, yes, we do speak in plural terms as far as culpability, it being quite clear from the now iconic video, that not only the chokehold officer, but the others who accosted Garner and ignored his repeated "I can't breathe" pleas need be held accountable for the loss a family was forced to suffer.

And what does one say of the repugnant utterances emanating from the PBA, in the name of pushback vainly attempting to provide cover for lawless, renegade conduct to which, thanks to that video, we're all privy? We of course don't expect the PBA head to acknowledge a member or members having acted outside of established guidelines. But does he, alternatively, have to inflame passions, not only among people of color but in the public at large, with incendiary crap about there having been a "seatbelt maneuver," not chokehold? Or spewing an acidic "If you can speak you can breathe" in rebuking a dying man's cries for help? We have seen the video! And you, sir, should save your mean-spirited hogwash for occasions when manipulating the facts poses

less of a challenge.

Such stonewall support from the PBA for a cop whose prior interaction with persons of color should raise a red flag, serves as reminder of the perception of a racism culture within the organization. It's hardly a secret that it was the "outsider" status to which blacks in the NYPD felt themselves relegated that largely drove formation of their own Guardian Association in the 1940s. All these years later, although there's been progress made, in terms of the department's minority numbers at patrolman level, to be more reflective of the city's ethnic breakdown, clearly no commensurate evolution in the look of the PBA, especially among those in positions of authority, has taken place. Those grossly insensitive comments by the PBA head in the wake of an African American man's death seem of a piece with the tenor

of the organization he leads. I mean, did he really think the apology to Eric Garner's family, likely drafted by PR folks for the officer, would fly?

As for that grand jury convened by the Staten Island district attorney, one wonders why he didn't just punt and accede to the voices clamoring for a special prosecutor to handle this glaringly egregious act of police wrongdoing. We would have been loath to imagine the Big Apple or any part thereof providing us today with a classic Southern justice decades ago lookalike. "To Kill a Mockingbird" came to mind, Gregory Peck's lawyer Atticus Finch defending Brock Peters' wrongly accused Tom Robinson in the Depressionera South - the poor black man having nary a chance a foregone conclusion. Here in 2014, on Staten Island, they backtracked justice to give it a dark-ages appearance. The prosecutor didn't request judicial approval for release of more than perfunctory, non-controversial details of the grand jury proceedings, and we wonder about that as well.

Again reminiscent of that other justice model that hasn't altogether gone away, it seems the Feds will have to weigh in on the Garner case to ensure any possibility of arriving where we have a sense of the right thing being done. Indeed, the vigilance of Attorney General Eric Holder has been the one reassuring component from the justice system, both with Garner and Ferguson, standing as the ultimate buffer between the bulk of us and utter despair.

The PBA head, in his bellowing when just about everyone else was heaping scorn on the grand jury's no-indictment decision, made it known it was in fact a "correct" determination made by those Staten Island jurors. Maybe he should have noted that included in the backlash over that shocking grand jury conclusion were a number of well-known conservative firebrands - customary friends of the PBA turned foes this time around. That should have given the leader and his flock pause, that maybe in the matter of Eric Garner's death, a line was crossed.



name of social justice, the church tends to be mum on the subject. The church is willing to stand in front of abortion clinics in defense of life for the unborn, but there is not much standing of protest in defense of black life being taken without impunity. Where is the outrage?

Jesus said, "Whoever tries to keep their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life will preserve it." I believe that when the church is more concerned with consulting their own ease and safety instead taking up the cross and the cause of Christ and his people they are in danger of losing their lives in the community that surrounds them. If you doubt it, look up how many churches of various denominations have closed down over the past 10 years. And you know what, the community they were in hardly noticed.

Mordecai in the Book of Esther was confident that God would not allow the destruction of his people. He had a trust and conviction that the purposes of evil men would be frustrated. the CFC Look-Through rule in its tax avoidance efforts.

The second is the Active Financing Exception. This is an exception to the rule that passive income (interest, dividends, royalties, etc.) is treated as taxable income even if it is not brought back to the United States. Instead, if the income is used for financial operation like financing the sale of jet engines, there is no U.S. tax so long as the profits from the deal stay offshore. However, what constitutes financial operations is so broadly defined as to enable virtually any multinational to take advantage of it. The Active Financing Exception explains why G.E., through its G.E. Capital subsidiary, has paid a negative tax rate on billions in profits over the

tricks that continue to benefit corporations that are already seeing record high profits. Those who doubt this need to look no further than Walgreen's, which halted a planned inversion of its own in the face of massive public outrage.

These policies hurt all of us. When multinational corporations are able to avoid taxes, it leaves individual citizens and domestic corporations picking up the tab in the form of higher taxes and more public debt. And it further places small businesses, which pay a higher tax rate with none of the loopholes, at a competitive disadvantage. The message to Congress is clear: it is time for corporations quit cashing out without chipping in.



Will rollout of green technologies get a boost at Lima Climate Summit?

By Desmond Brown

LIMA, Dec. 2, 2014 (IPS) -The road towards a green economy is paved with both reward and risk, and policymakers must seek to balance these out if the transition to low-carbon energy sources is to succeed on the required scale, climate experts say.

"I think what is important is that in most of these processes you will have winners and losers," John Christensen, director of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Centre on Energy, Climate and Sustainable Development, told

"So you need to be aware that there are people who will lose and you need to take care of them so that they feel that they are not left out.

"You need to find other ways of engaging them and help them get into something new because otherwise you will have all this resistance from groups that have special interests," said Christensen, who

spoke with IPS on the sidelines of the 20th session of the United Nations Conference of the Parties (COP 20) which got underway here Monday.

The climate summit convenes ministers of 194 countries for the annual Conference of the Parties to negotiate over 12 days the legally binding text that will become next year's Paris Protocol.

It will provide an early insight into what may be expected from the agreement with regard to the long-term phase-out of coal-fired power plants, the rate of deployment of renewable energies, and the financial and technological support for the vulnerable and least developed countries.

Nevis, a 13-kilometrelong island in the Caribbean, recently announced that it was "on the cusp of going completely green." Deputy Premier and Minister of Tourism Mark Brantley outlined the Nevis Island Administration's vision for tourism development and in particular, replacing fossil fuel generation with renewable

energy resources.

"Besides reducing a country's carbon footprint, concern about waste management is a particularly challenging issue for all nations" he said, sharing Nevis' initiative to create an environment-friendly solution for its waste management with the Baltimore firm, Omni Alpha.









Caribbean urged to dismantle corruption

The U.N. said the theme of the 2014 International Day, "Breaking the Corruption Chain," is geared towards showing the importance of individual engagement in tackling a phenomenon "that strikes hardest at the poor, hinders inclusive economic growth and robs essential services of badly needed funds."

"From cradle to grave, millions are touched by corruption's shadow," said Ban, urging engagement of the public and private sectors.

"Public servants and elected officials had to be guided by ethics, transparency and accountability, while the private sector needed to recognize that good behavior is good business," he added.

SVG PM condemns 'criminal blockade' against Cuba

St. Vincent and the Grenadines' Prime Minister Dr. Ralph E. Gonsalves has condemned what he described as the "criminal blockade against Cuba," and called for "the liberation of the five antiterrorists from U.S. prisons," according to reports in Havana, the Cuban capital.

"We have to work together in this globalized world to address international issues affecting our hemisphere. This includes demanding an end to the economic sanctions against Cuba," said Gonsalves on arriving in Havana on Saturday for the Caribbean Community (CARICOM)-Cuba Summit.

St. Vincent and the Grenadines, a member of CARICOM, as well as the Bolivarian Alliance for Our Americas (ALBA), was the first delegation to arrive in Havana to participate in the fifth Summit, which began on Monday in the Cuban capital, according to Telesur (Telecommunications Company Suriname), the Suriname government-owned full telecommunications service provider.

The events took place at the Palace of the Revolution, where several regional leaders met to continue dialogue on integration and cooperation between the neighboring nations, Telesur said.

Topics the delegates will discuss at

the summit include poverty, equality, and social justice.

Jennifer Jones-Kernahana, ambassador of Trinidad and Tobago to Cuba, affirmed to Prensa Latina, the Cuban news agency that the fifth CARICOM-Cuba Summit "will serve to strengthen regional ties and allow the Caribbean to act as a block in world political affairs."

The first summit between Cuba and CARICOM member states took place in 2002 to commemorate 30 years of diplomatic relations between Havana and its Caribbean neighbors.



track."

He said negative growth has now decelerated "and I believe that we will see a return to positive growth next financial year."

Dr. Anthony said that airlift from key source markets increased significantly over the past year, with the United States in particular growing by 11 percent between 2012 and 2013. Additional airlift came from new gateways in the United States, the United Kingdom and Canada.

The SLP leader said that foreign investors were now returning to St. Lucia.

Anthony said that the main opposition UWP does not have the answers to the situation confronting the island with party officials indicating that should they win the next general election there would be a reduction in the Value Added Tax (VAT).

He warned that a reduction as small as one percent would result in the loss of revenue of approximately EC\$21.5 million.

Suriname

The gay rights group, Suriname Men United (SMU), is taking issue with a song by a local entertainer that calls for "bullets for homos."

"It is horrific that Surinamese artistes, in this particular case, King

Koyeba, use these types of lyrics. This brings us back to when our community fought against the Jamaican artistes who were singing homophobic lyrics," said SMU's Kenneth van Emden.

Koybea, the self-proclaimed Suri-

namese King of Dancehall recently launched his latest CD with the song "Bullet" a few weeks ago.



In the video, available on social media, Koybea blatantly calls for violence against gay people.

Trinidad

A British couple is moving to sue the Trinidad and Tobago government for £2 million (US\$3 million), five years after a brutal machete attack on them in the Sister Isle Tobago.

In August 2009, Peter Green and his wife, Murium were chopped and left for dead. They survived, barely, with permanent injuries.

Green, 70, a retired hotelier suf-

fered a cracked skull, fractured cheekbones, smashed teeth, limited vision after the knife cut his left cornea and nerve damage.



Murium, who has multiple sclerosis, had both cheekbones and eye sockets smashed and her jaw detached.



Jamaica sees success in curbing killings by police

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) Jamaican police have often been viewed with suspicion and fear, routinely accused of indiscriminately using their weapons and intentionally killing suspects as the island struggled with soaring violent crime.

Now, with overall violence ebbing, the Caribbean country is on track to have the fewest deaths at the hands of law enforcement in years, drawing cautious praise from human rights activists and making officers more welcome in some of Jamaica's grittiest districts.

The number of citizens killed by police is expected to reach just over 100 this year, far below the 258 slain last year by security forces. The annual total of police killings hasn't been below 200 since 2004.

"Police always used to come with guns cocked, but more of them are calmer now and have a better attitude," said Susan Ramsay, a mother of three in the rough east King-

"It's gotten to the point where I prefer seeing the police around here than not seeing them."

There seems to be a mix of reasons for the reduction, but perhaps the biggest is a newfound fear among officers of prosecution by an independent agency that investigates allegations against police.

The Independent Commission of Investigations was created in 2010 after security forces killed 70 civilians in Kingston during an operation to capture a fugitive gang leader. Police had disputed the agency's authority, but last year the courts ruled it has the right to arrest and charge officers, previously the role of an internal police bureau and public prosecutors.

The increasingly robust commission is now advancing highprofile investigations against lawmen, including a probe of 11 officers in a single police division in the central parish of Clarendon. After those officers

ston neighborhood of Rockfort. were hit with murder charges earlier this year, a big drop in police-related fatalities followed across Jamaica. There also were two successful convictions this year of police personnel who failed to cooperate with commission investigators.

"A clear message is being sent that all police killings are being rigorously investigated and that the Jamaica Constabulary Force must cooperate fully," said Robin Guittard, Caribbean campaigner at Amnesty International.

Hamish Campbell, a former Scotland Yard commander who is the investigative agency's deputy commissioner, said reducing fatal shootings has been helped by a significant drop in early morning raids. Heavily armed and often masked officers would roll into slums before dawn on raids that frequently ended in bloodshed, though police went unscathed.

"The tactic was not tenable and the greater majority of the



public recognized it for what it really was," Campbell said.

Rights groups long accused the government of fostering a culture of impunity by protecting law enforcers accused

of killing suspects rather than subjecting them to the backlogged, inefficient court system. Activists are now cautiously hopeful the tide might be starting to turn.



Dominica Labor Party retains power

The incumbent Dominica Labor Party (DLP) of Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit regained power in general elections on Monday, winning 15 of the 21 seats in Parliament.

The main opposition United Workers Party (UWP), led by Lennox Linton, won the remaining six seats, an increase of three over the last general elections in 2010. Linton was elected to Parliament for the very first time.

It was the third consecutive victory for Skerrit, 42, who was first sworn into office on Jan. 8, 2004 on the death of Prime Minister Pierre Charles. Skerrit remains the youngest prime minister in the Caribbean.

"I am humbled by the overwhelming response of the electorate of Dominica to our appeal for the mandate to continue to govern Dominica for another five years," said Skerrit in his victory speech, broadcast nationally, on Monday night.

He also congratulated Linton for his success at the polls, noting "numerically speaking, there will be a stronger opposition in Parliament.

"I accept the will and verdict of the people," added Skerrit, who was sworn into office on Tuesday. He said the rest of his Cabinet will take the oath on Saturday.

The prime minister lauded the electorate for "conducting themselves

properly throughout the campaign and minimizing the incident of violence and destruction.

"I congratulate you all for demonstrating to the world that Dominica is now a mature democracy," he said. "I thank you for showing, in the Commonwealth of Dominica, (that) common sense has triumphed over propaganda and the appeal to raw emotion."

In his new term, Skerrit promised "more resources" to wipe out "poverty and ignorance from the island of Dominica?

"The best is yet to come," he affirmed,

stating that Dominicans have benefited from "at least one of the economic and social policies and programs we have introduced during the past 14 years.

"I am sure that this is your way of showing gratitude," he said. "That is why you have decided to give us a new mandate to continue to deliver the many realistic promises we made to you in the manifesto."

Skerrit urged nationals to put aside political differences "and pull together to make Dominica one of the best places in the region to live, to work, to study, to do business, to visit and to enjoy life.

"Never forget we are all Dominicans and that I get up every morning knowing that I am the prime minister of one Dominica," he said.

Meantime, the Electoral Observation Mission of the Organization of American States (OAS/EOM) in Dominica, led by the OAS Secretary for Multidimensional Security, Adam Blackwell, congratulated Skerrit and nationals of Dominica for "exercising their civicminded spirit in a very orderly and respectful manner on Election Day."

On Election Day, the OAS said members of the delegation visited the country's 21 constituencies, and observed the voting process from the opening of the polls to the transmission of the preliminary results.

Grenada economy expected to grow by 2.6%

The Grenada economy is expected to grow by 2.6 percent this year, higher than the Eastern Caribbean Currency Union (ECCU) average of 1.4 percent.

This was revealed by Prime Minister and Finance Minister Dr. Keith Mitchell during his presentation of the 2015 estimates or revenue and expenditures in Parliament recently.

Mitchell said the 2.6 percent economic growth being forecast surpasses the 1.5 percent projected when the 2014 budget was presented.

The leading sectors contributing to an improvement in the local economy have been identified as tourism, agriculture and education.

Haiti commission seeks new government consensus

Haiti (AP) _ A commission recently appointed by Haitian President Michel Martelly is calling for his prime minister to resign so a new consensus government can be formed, according to a report obtained Tuesday by The Associated Press.

The 11-member panel made up of former officials and religious leaders was appointed by Martelly on Haitian President Mi-Nov. 28 to help resolve a political stalemate holding up long-delayed legislative Kaster and municipal elections.

In recent months, there has been an uptick in street protests by government critics demanding government resignations and a chance to vote.

Minister Laurent Lamothe's resignation would pave the way for a consensus government to be created. It also calls for members of Haiti's Provisional Electoral Council and the president of the Superior Judicial Council to step down as "appeasement measures."

Among other recommendations, the commission says "political prisoners" not yet taken before a judge should

be immediately released and a "truce" should be adopted by political opponents to allow dialogue to take place.

Martelly was expected to hold a news conference about the commission's findings. There was no immediate comment from Lamothe, Haiti's No. 2 official.

Martelly was supposed to call elections in 2011 for a majority of Senate seats, the entire Chamber of Deputies and local offices. But he hasn't

done so over the last year because the Senate has yet to approve an electoral law authorizing the vote.

The Chamber of Deputies has The commission's report says Prime approved the legislation, but it has been held up in the Senate because of six senators who have blocked a vote. The six opposition senators argue the measure is unconstitutional and favors the government.

Martelly administration officials blame the senators for the standoff, insisting the government wants to hold the elections but can't because the lawmakers are preventing a quorum.

Guess who's nominated for Reggae Grammy?

Shaggy, Sean Paul, Sly and Robbie, Ziggy Marley, Lee 'Scratch' Perry, and American band SOJA are nominees for the Best Reggae Album category of the 57th annual Grammy Awards. Shaggy has been nominated for his album (Out of Many, One Music), Sean Paul (Full Frequency), Sly and Robbie (The Reggae Power, featuring Spicy Chocolate), Ziggy Marley (Fly Rasta), and Lee 'Scratch' Perry (Back on the Controls). Released in April by Tuff Gong, Ziggy Marley's "Fly Rasta" is the most commercially successful album in the United States by a Jamaican reggae artiste this year, with sales of more than 16,000 copies to date.

Ziggy Marley, the eldest son of reggae legend Bob Marley, has won three Grammys as lead singer of the Melody Makers. Solo, he has been nominated in the Best Reggae Album category four times, winning in 2007 for "Love is My Religion" and for "Ziggy Marley In Concert" this year.

Lee 'Scratch' Perry's "Back on the Controls" was released on the Upsetter label in May. It



became the enigmatic producer's highest-American charting album when it peaked at number five on Billboard's Reggae album chart. He won the Best Reggae Album Grammy in 2003 for Jamaican ET and has been nominated five times.

Produced by Jamaican Dwayne 'Supa Dups' Chin-Quee, American reggae band SOJA has earned its first nomination for their sixth studio album Amid the Noise and The Haste. To date, it has sold more than 22,000 copies.

The ceremony is slated for the Staples Center in Los Angeles, California, on Feb. 5, 2015.

"I grew up watching the Grammys, and it is a huge deal. My music is about believing in yourself and making a change within your lifetime, changing the world. My idol is Bob Marley and that's what he did: Change things. So I've never been afraid to try, or to bring about change. It's the most exciting part of life. I couldn't be happier right now," he said.

The singer used the opportunity to laud several people involved in the project.





der from the Amazon down through the mountains to the Atlantic Ocean.

Guyanese men have long ventured into the canopied jungle to mine some of the purest gold in the world. Ingrid Griffith's own grandfather dug precious metal out of the red dirt and forged raging rivers to carry his gold back home. But he gave his granddaughter another even more valuable gift. In "Demerara Gold," a seven-year old girl is left behind in Guyana in the care of her grandmother when her parents get visas to the United States of America. The girl finally reunites with her parents in America. She finds the promised wonders of America, but also a family unlike the one she remembers. Aspirations and reality have collided. Assimilation has taken its toll and that's when the girl in "Demerara Gold" reaches deep and reclaims her true birthright.

Ingrid Griffith, is the writer and performer of this one-

woman show. She is a gifted actress who with subtle adjustments of voice and bearing transforms herself from an arthritic grandmother to a swashbuckling gold prospector in an instant. She is also a beautiful woman and graceful performer who excels at both farce and confrontation. The audience will roll with laughter as the young girl in Guyana challenges her grandmother's authority, not with back talk but with a full-body African dance. Viewers will be captivated as the same child, now a teenager in America, stands like a goddess of war to make wrong right.

"Demerara Gold" reaches back to the rhythm and heartbeat of the Caribbean. In the first part of the show, the audience hears the music of the street masquerade in Guyana as "flute players, drummers and flouncers dance in the street." In the second part of the show, the play moves to America and the audience witnesses the teenager acclimating to her new home.

Cheryl Strayed's (Reese Witherspoon) life went into a tailspin right after the untimely death of her mother (Laura Dern). The grief-stricken 22-year-old subsequently became emotionally estranged from the people closest to her, including her husband, Paul (Thomas Sadowski), and her brother, Leif (Keene

And by the time she had finally bottomed out several years later, she was all alone and addicted to heroin. Yet she somehow summoned up the strength to set out on a transformational, solo trek

along the Pacific Coast Trail that would take her from the Mojave Desert in California all the way north to the border of Washington and Oregon.

The perilous, 1,100-mile journey would prove to be Cheryl's salvation, as it afforded her an opportunity to purge her demons while conquering the elements. That magical metamorphosis would also become the subject of her best-selling memoir, "Wild: From Lost to

Found on the Pacific Trail," an Oprah Book Club selection.

The story has now been adapted to the screen by Academy Award-nominated scriptwriter Nick Hornby (for An Education) as a touching tale of female

empowerment featuring Reese Witherspoon as the intrepid heroine. The picture was directed by another Oscar nominee, Jean-Marc Vallee, whose Dallas Buyers Club netted Oscars for both Matthew McConaughey and Jared

Unfortunately, this flashback flick fails to generate the same sort of sobering gravitas which made Dallas so effectively gripping. Consequently, it unfolds less like the similarly-themed "Into the Wild" (2007), a riveting survival saga, than "Eat Pray Love" (2010), another relatively-lighthearted romp about a woman finding herself.

"Wild" is an uneven endeavor which undercuts its own cause by including intermittent interludes of comic relief, such as when Cheryl's overstuffed backpack repeatedly causes her to topple over. Hence, rather than ratcheting up the tension of a harrowing ordeal, the film merely recounts the assorted highs and lows of a poorly-planned camping trip run amuck.

Jamaican swimmer makes history

Jamaica's Alia Atkinson made history in Doha, Qatar by winning the first gold medal ever attained in swimming by a Black woman.

She won the women's 100m breaststroke during the 12th FINA World Swimming there and in the process

not only championed a victory for her nation and the Caribbean but for an entire race. With the stellar victory Atkinson also distinguished herself as the first of her race and gender to hold a world short-course record since Enith Brigitha of the Netherlands 40 years ago.

The 24-year-old Jamaican scored the win in record time equaling the world record of 1:02:36 and beating Ruta Meilutyte, the defending champion. Reportedly, Atkinson touched the wall ahead of her closest rival who had led part of the way and

Angeles Galaxy, and Robert Kraft of the New England Revolution, are billionaire philanthropists, which partly explain their investments in MLS, but one is a five-time MLS Cup winner, the other a five-time loser.

Anschutz, a Denver billionaire worth US\$11.00 billion according to Forbes Magazine, began to make millions whenhe bought his father's Denver drilling business and went on to invest in real estate, entertainment and a host of other businesses. His millions virtually carried MLS in its early days when he owned five of the franchises in the 10-team league back in 1996 (the Galaxy, Chicago Fire, Houston Dynamo, San Jose Earthquakes and the New York/New Jersey Metro Stars) and is now enjoying the fruits of his investments. Anschutz franchises have appeared in over 15 of the 19 MLS Cup finals and have won 10 MLS titles, including the Galaxy's fifth on Sunday.

Kraft, the Revs owner and worth US\$4.00 billion, according to Forbes, owns a not-so-successful record. A graduate of Columbia University, who received an MBA from Harvard Business School,

he built Kraft Foods Company with his family, and has numerous investments in myriad businesses such as real estate, entertainment, media and sports. Anschutz and Kraft were at the game on Sunday, and despite their different fortunes in MLS, both seemed proud of their association with the league, which played its 19th championship. Without men such as Philip Anschutz and Robert Kraft, MLS may not have survived its early lean years. So, despite their contrasting fortunes on the soccer field, both owners are winners off it because of soccer's success in the U.S.



The 2014 Caribbean Premier League (CPL) Twenty20 cricket pumped a whopping US\$166 million into the region's economy, a new independent economic study has revealed.

Twenty-nine broadcasters from the world aired the games live.

According to the study, the figure of US\$25.1 million was injected into Jamaica, US\$24 million pumped into Guyana; US\$21.1 into Trinidad and Tobago, while US\$13.9, US\$13.8 and US\$13.3 were invested into St. Lucia, Antigua and Barbuda and Grenada respectively.
