Caribbean pols revile killing

Caribbean legislators in New York have condemned the killing on Saturday afternoon, at point-blank range, of two police officers by a gunman, who, officials said, had traveled to New York from Baltimore vowing

to kill officers.

Police Commissioner William J. Bratton told reporters Saturday night that the officers were sitting in a police patrol car, outside a housing project in the Bedford-Stuyvesant section of Brooklyn, when the gun-

man walked up to them and shot them dead.

Bratton said the suspect then committed suicide with the same gun, after police closed in on him, as he fled down the stairs of a nearby subway station.

Kamla wants to restart hanging

Like all prime and national security ministers before her, Trinidad's Kamla Persad-Bissessar is so frustrated with the number of annual murders in Trinidad that she is now leading a revived and spirited campaign to resume hangings for criminals convicted of cold blooded murders.

As this week began, official records were showing that 399 people had been murdered so far for the year and given the fact that a killing occurs every 36 hours on the twin-island republic with Tobago, the final tally will likely be closer to 410 or so before the year closes.

The prime minister who faces a general election by mid September that polls show she and her umbrel-

la People's Partnership (PP) would most likely lose, the head of government at the weekend vowed to retable a death penalty hanging bill back to parliament for approval as a means of stemming the continuous flow of blood in Trinidad.

The first attempt failed two years ago because the opposition had refused to side with government, disagreeing with some of the clauses. Whether the cabinet will lobby the opposition or meets its demands for amendments is unclear but those in authorities say there are simply too many murders and the country could not be happy with its ranking as the 10th most murderous state in the world. In 2008 for example, there were 550 mur-

Sankofa pupils lead pre-Kwanzaa celebration

The children of Sankofa International Academy in Bedford-Stuyvesant, Brooklyn, held a pre-Kwanzaa celebration for the community on Friday with a ceremony that embodied a true understanding of the Principles of Kwanzaa.

Kwanzaa, an African American holiday, is celebrated from Dec. 26 through Jan. 1. It embodies seven principles known as the “Nguzo Saba” and there are also seven symbols which are associated with the ceremony.

When Dr. Maulana Karenga founded this holiday in 1966, he probably did not envision children internalizing the seven fundamental Principles in such a passionate and committed way as to be able to demonstrate them with emotionality and ownership to the elders of the community. Kwanzaa means “first fruit.”

The pupils, ages 6-14, all dressed in African attire, and led by Kelsey Hair, explained the meaning of Kwanzaa. Individual students explained the seven symbols which were on the display table. They were: a decorative mat (Mkeka), on which other symbols are placed; corn (Muhindi); a candle holder (Kinara) with seven candles (Mishumaa Saba); a unity cup for libations (Kikombe cha Umoja) and gifts (Zawadi). This detailed introduction was followed by the naming of the seven Principles of Kwanzaa; Umoja (Unity); Kujichagulia (Self determination); Ujima (Collective work and Responsibility); Ujamaa (Cooperative economics); Nia (Purpose); Kuumba (Creativity) and Imani (Faith) as students, in their own words, explained the meaning of each principal as it pertains to the African culture. The ceremony culminated with the singing of, “The seven days of Kwanzaa” and exchanging of Zawadis, hand made gifts.

City Councilmember Inez Barron, a Sankofa supporter attended the ceremony. She said that she, “is always fascinated by the abilities of the Sankofa students and the fresh approach they bring to cultural lessons.” The community residents and parents in attendance were encouraged to see the youths give their own rendition of the ceremony and, Neddi Stoute, wife of renowned Jazz Artist Ed Stoute, was brought to tears. She said, “I have traveled all over the country and gone to Kwanzaa celebrations among the most educated in the highest of places, but never, have I been so moved by any of the ceremonies.

Free turkeys for the holidays

In keeping with its objectives of assisting “those pure and lofty principles, which are in the interest of humanity,” the Brooklyn-based Independent United Order of Mechanics, Friendly Society, Western Hemisphere, Inc. on Saturday provided free turkeys for the holidays to members of the community.

According to Jamaican-born Glenver Jones, grand treasurer, the Order’s Charitable Foundation arm distributed 360 turkeys to community residents outside the Order’s Bedford-Stuyvesant headquarters at 65-67 Putnam Ave., Brooklyn.

“The reception was excellent,” Jones, who is also an adjunct professor in the Department of Business and Technology at La Guardia Community College, Long Is. City, Queens, told Caribbean Life in an interview, as a crowd gathered around a truck where the “goodies” were distributed.

“We anticipated a large turn-out because of the work we do in the community,” added Jones, disclosing that recipients, who presented coupons in order to redeem their turkeys, were notified primarily through area churches, day care centers and block associations.

He said the Order purchased the turkeys for \$10,000, and that they were distributed between 1:00 and 4:00 pm

on Saturday.

Jones said it was the first time that the Order launched such event on a “macro level,” adding that the fraternity hopes to make it an annual affair.

“We want the (wider) community to be aware of our function within the community,” he said, adding that the organization also wants the city to be “aware of the Independent United Order of Mechanics.”

Throughout the year, the Order offers assistance to others by, among other things, providing scholarships

to high school students, hosting a community Thanksgiving Luncheon on Thanksgiving Day and conducting a toy drive during the Christmas season.

The Order, which was established in 1757, with headquarters in Lancashire in England, was later incorporated, with head office in New York City.

Jones said the Order – with branches in Europe, Central America and the Caribbean – has a youth sector in which “boys and girls between the ages of eight and 18 can join.”

The Adult section is referred to as lodge (for males) and chapter (for females), Jones said.

“The Order is open to men and women of reputable character; integrity; law-abiding; and, first and foremost, must believe in a true and living God,” he said.

Jones said he was grateful to Panamanian-born Councillor Cecileo Leacock and Jamaican-born Sis. Hyacinth Robinson for working with him on the “Turkey Project.”

He also expressed gratitude to other members of the fraternity for their support and cooperation, including Grand Master Jamaican-born Clive Ascar Sang, the executive committee, the district grand masters, and the “brothers and sisters who assisted with the program today (Saturday).”

Antigua

The Antigua and Barbuda government says the efforts by the owners of a hotel on the island to have Prime Minister Gaston Browne jailed over an outstanding multimillion dollar debt by the government have failed.

In a statement recently the government said the owner of Half Moon Bay were seeking the payment of outstanding debt, "owed for forced acquisition of the property."

The statement said a High Court has ruled Prime Minister Browne cannot be held in contempt for not paying the debt.



"The country is not in a position to pay Half Way Moon Bay US\$40 million. We do understand they are owed and we do understand the principle in the constitution when you acquire someone's property that you have to pay them. We recognize that in law there is no discretion. We must pay," Browne said in a statement.

The prime minister said paying a lump sum of EC\$208 million would mean no payment for pensioners and sending home government workers.

He accused the owner of the hotel of "being greedy."

Barbados

The Barbados government said it has signed an agreement with Trinidad and Tobago that would protect local fishermen and vessels from being detained in each other's territorial waters.

A government statement said that the Protocol on Common Procedures for dealing with the issue was signed recently by non-resident High Commissioner to Trinidad and Tobago Robert Morris and Trinidad and Tobago Foreign Affairs Minister Winston Dookeran.



"The protocol is designed to be reciprocal in nature and will set out standards and procedures on how fishing vessels and crew are handled in the event that they are detained or arrested by either party," the statement said.

The high commissioner stated that the signing of the protocol by Barbados was in keeping with the management of the Caribbean Sea and its resources and the development of the blue economy. The blue economy refers to the use of maritime resources for development.

Haiti

Thousands of anti-government protestors have clashed with police in Haiti's capital, Port-au-Prince.

They burned tires and threw stones at officers who responded with tear gas.

The protestors want President Michel Martelly and Prime Minister Laurent Lamothe to resign and long overdue elections to be held.

Some protestors accuse the U.S. of supporting Haiti's leadership and called on Russian President Vladimir Putin for help.

Hundreds succeeded in reaching the National Palace, an area which has been restricted for several years.

President Martelly was supposed to call elections in 2011, but the elections have been postponed in a stalemate between the government and a group of opposition senators over election law.

Jamaica

A fact-finding panel appointed to examine a bloody 2010 security operation in Jamaica has started its work in the island's capital.

The three-member commission is led by Sir David Simmons, a retired chief justice and ex-attorney general of Barbados.

The panel recently convened and has started holding hearings two weeks ago and will resume in 2015.

They will examine a 2010 operation



during a state of emergency that killed more than 75 people as police and soldiers hunted for the island's biggest gang boss, Dudas Coke.

Most of the bloodshed occurred in a Kingston slum called Tivoli Gardens.

Jamaica's public defender has said 76 civilians and one soldier were killed.

There have been numerous claims of unlawful killings by the security forces.

St. Lucia

A British MP has called on the United Kingdom government to assist with the investigation into the murder of prominent hotelier Oliver Gobat, the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) has reported.

It said that the Conservative MP for Eser and Walton, Dominica Raab made the request during a sitting of the British parliament.

"The foreign secretary knows my constituent Ollie Gobat was brutally murdered in St. Lucia in an apparent assassination. I'm very grateful discussing assurances on the death penalty to allow the UK police to support the investigation at St. Lucia's request," Raab said.

However, the issue of contention is that the United Kingdom cannot examine cases where a suspect could face the death penalty.

While the death penalty has not been



applied in St. Lucia for 19 years, the island has not abandoned the old law.

British Foreign Minister James Dudgeon told legislators that he had written to Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony on Oct. 14, to seek assurances that any person convicted of this crime will not have the death penalty applied.

Gobat's body was found in his Range Rover on Cap Estate on April 25, 2014 burnt beyond recognition.

His family has offered an EC\$500,000 reward to find the killer or killers.

Suriname

Police say they have arrested and charged five Brazilian men suspected of robberies in the gold fields.

They said four of those detained were held in connection with a fatal robbery last month when gunmen ambushed a boat on a river in District Sipaliwini and shot and killed Brazilian Renato Alves de Carvalho.

The victim was traveling with his employer, who was subsequently kidnapped by the robbers and released only after the bandits stole several kilos of gold from him.

Police have charged the four suspects with aggravated robbery and murder. The men are between the ages of 19 and 36.

Police gave few details about the inci-

ders on the island, many blamed on drug and gang activities.

“We will continue with initiatives and some new initiatives. In fact, I have asked the attorney general to bring back the hanging bill for cabinet’s consideration, so we look again to introduce the death penalty for homicides, for murders. We have brought down serious crimes but the murders still remain too high and, therefore, I want cabinet to reconsider the introduction of the death penalty and to take that legislation to parliament,” she told reporters.

Apart from the defeat of the bill in parliament, efforts by governments around the Caribbean to implement the death penalty, by hanging for the most part, have been frustrated by international bodies such as the United Nations human rights appeals division which has in many instances forced authorities to hold their hands while reviews over prolonged periods are done.

Guyana, Jamaica and Trinidad, the countries with the largest number of convicted prisoners on death row, last succeeded in carrying out judicial executions more than a decade ago. Their efforts to proceed with the death penalty were also frustrated by a UK Privy Council decision in the 90s which had

basically said that a prisoner on death row for more than five years would have been subjected to cruel and inhumane treatment and conditions. That forced governments to convert sentences to life or less.

The most famous of these occurred in Trinidad in 1999 when the administration of Prime Minister Basdeo Panday hanged nine men, including ‘businessman’ Dole Chadee who was at the time considered the Pablo Escobar of the region.

Persad-Bissessar said there was “empirical data” linking state executions with a reduction in violent crime and she thinks this scenario will play itself exactly along these lines in Trinidad.

“On behalf of the people of the Ninth Congressional District of New York and all people of good will from throughout our city, I would like to share my most profound condolences with the families and friends of the two police officers, Officer Wenjian Lui and Officer Rafael Ramos, who gave their lives in service to Brooklyn, and our city, and were killed today in the line of duty,” Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke told Caribbean Life.

“I would like to extend my deepest sympathies to the entire New York City Police Department, the men and women who make New York City the one of the safest cities in the world,” she added.

“Murderous and violent attacks on the public servants who are charged with the duty of protecting our public safety are a threat to all of us. This heinous act was despicable and inexcusable. This assassination was, indeed, an attack on our entire city,” Clarke continued.

New York City Councilman Jumaane D. Williams who represents the 45th Council District in Brooklyn, said: “It pains me to hear the officers were executed in the most cowardly fashion imaginable, apparently by someone from out-of-town.

“No one of good conscience could encourage or tolerate horrors such as what has occurred today (Saturday),” said Williams, the Deputy Leader of

the City Council and co-chair of the Council’s Taskforce to Combat Gun Violence.

“Tomorrow (Sunday), as the investigation continues and no matter where the facts lead, the memories of this tragedy must serve as an additional guide to any discourse that may soon come,” added Williams, a frequent critic of NYPD policing tactics.

Bratton said the suspected assassin, Ismaaiyl Brinsley, 28, fired several rounds into the heads and upper bodies of Liu, 32, and Ramos, 40, who never had a chance to draw their guns, adding that police have recovered a silver semiautomatic handgun that Brinsley reportedly used in the fatal shootings.

The police commissioner also disclosed that Brinsley, who had a long rap sheet of crimes, including robbery and carrying a concealed gun, reportedly shot his ex-girlfriend near Baltimore before traveling to Brooklyn.

Brinsley had made statements on social media suggesting that he planned to kill police officers and was angered about the Eric Garner and Michael Brown cases, in which two grand juries — one in Staten Island, New York and the other in Ferguson, Missouri — declined to indict two white police officers for killing two unarmed black men, according to the New York Times.

Employee, employer benefit from paid family leave

The holiday season can be a time of great joy. But for many working parents, the holidays are also a stark reminder of how tenuous their employment and benefits are.

When you have paid time off, spending time with family is joyous, but what if you were forced to take time off to care for yourself or a family member?

By one estimate, 23 percent of Americans have either lost a job, or been threatened with the loss of their job, for taking time off to care for themselves or another family member. For many Americans, there's no good option: Either you worry about your family member, or you worry about losing your job. And nobody is productive when they're stressed.

Of course, for business owners and managers, it's not just productivity they worry about. For example, employers might want to provide paid leave, but feel that the business can't afford to.

Luckily there is a solution. Just over one year ago, Senator Kirsten Gillibrand introduced the Family Act that would create a national paid family leave insurance program. As Congress looks to the new year, companies like Eileen Fisher look forward to seeing the Family Act reintroduced and passed.

Family leave insurance programs let employees pay into

a program that will fund paid leave following the birth of a child. For people whose employers don't offer paid leave, these programs are invaluable.

Of course, some employers do offer leave, precisely because it's good for employees. Leave us all alone! We can't breathe!

The last words out of the mouth of strangling victim Eric Garner are actually a metaphor for how libertarians feel about the entire welfare-warfare state under which modern-day Americans have been born and raised.

Don't his words express precisely how we libertarians feel? Leave us alone, we say to the state. Get out of our faces. Get out of our lives. You're suffocating us. You're killing us — literally, spiritually, financially, and economically.

Thomas Jefferson described this phenomenon in the Declaration of Independence: The king's government was sending "swarms of officers to harass our people and eat out their substance."

There is hardly any part of our lives that government officials aren't involved in. They just won't leave us alone. Drug laws. Economic regulations. Income taxation. IRS audits. Asset forfeitures. Home raids. Secret surveillance. Draft registration. Permits and licenses. Minimum-wage laws. Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security. Terrorist blowback from an interventionist foreign policy. Checkpoints. Perpetual crises and chaos.

It never stops.

The direct cause of Eric Garner's death was obviously the chokehold that the cops put on his neck, which prevented him from breathing.

But let's face it: The real cause of death was his selling of individual untaxed cigarettes, in violation of law. That's what the cops were arresting him for when

they killed him.

Oh sure, they call it "resisting arrest." That's what they always call it. But the truth is that they killed him for selling individual untaxed cigarettes in violation of the law.

Under libertarian principles — indeed, under the principles enunciated in the Declaration of Independence, which Americans celebrate every Fourth of July — a person has the fundamental, natural, God-given right to sell whatever he wants to sell without governmental interference, including booze, tobacco, marijuana, fatty foods, or whatever.

My hunch is that deep down Eric Garner understood that. My hunch is that that's why he was saying, "Stop harassing me. Leave me alone!"

In the 1950s, cops killed a man in Utah named John Singer. He wasn't selling cigarettes. He was refusing to send his children to public (i.e., government) schools, which at that time was against the law.

When the cops came to arrest John Singer for refusing to comply with some judge's order, they shot him dead. They said it was because he was "resisting arrest." The truth was that

they killed him for refusing to send his children into the state's schooling system.

Eric Garner had six children, whom he was obviously trying to support. He was doing that by selling cigarettes. I wonder how much money he earned doing that. Despite his anguished plea — Stop harassing me! — Just leave me alone! — the cops simply couldn't do that. They obviously felt compelled to continue going after him. The law is the law.

The death of Eric Garner — indeed the death of so many other Americans at the hands of the cops, especially in the war on drugs — is the culmination of the welfare-warfare state way of life and what it has done to America. The federal government is killing people overseas as part of its perpetual "war on terrorism." The cops are killing people here. All with impunity. Killing has become an integral part of America's governmental culture.

We are the serfs. The government is the master. The cops kill people because they can. The CIA kills and tortures people because it can. We all know that nothing will happen to any of them.

Is the solution better soldiers and better cops? Better training? More secrecy? More efficient chokeholds?

No, the solution is to dismantle all the destructive policies both here and abroad that serve as the justification for soldiers and law-enforcement personnel to harass people, eat out their substance, abuse

Typical Cuba noises from usual suspects

It goes without saying that, considering the number of occasions on which we have robustly condemned in this space how pointless and retrogressive the U.S. stance toward Cuba has been, President Obama's announcement last week of a major policy re-set was news that got a big thumbs-up here. About the braying from the usual suspects that has come in the wake of his long overdue course correction, we would simply say to the president: "Keep on strutting!"

Chances were minuscule that there could be any objectivity-based rationale for the nations of the world being almost unanimously wrong on the issue of America's decades-old Cuba embargo being kept in place, while this country, joined by one or two lackeys in the UN, conspicuously thought itself correct. Surely, even neighboring Canada and other close western allies deserting the U.S. on its inflexibility regarding the embargo should have been enough of a reality check.

And undoubtedly it was, probably as far back as the Carter presidency, reports suggest. The

red flag all these years being a Cuban-American population in Florida whose stock over time had so risen as to make it a classic rendering of tail wagging dog in American politics. Maintaining Cuba's pariah status became, for Florida's Cuban-American bloc, a major wedge issue which, politicians came to understand, they would oppose on pain of political death. The Cuban-American lobby wielded a clearly disproportionate degree of power in the political marketplace. Perhaps the most bizarre example of that sense of power mirrored at base level in the Cuban-American community was the celebrated story of young Elian Gonzalez in 2000, when the boy's relatives stood in defiance of the U.S. Justice Department following a court ruling that the relatives had to release Elian to his father.

It's not surprising, in light of the Cubans-in-Florida factor, that Washington would want to first check that community's pulse before venturing onto the sensitive ground articulated by the president the other day. Once again it's been time, good old reliable time, working its magic

the way only time can to tidy things up, even when they seem irreparably messy. Polls have been indicating, in more recent times, that the younger set among Cuban-Americans aren't quite the stubbornly combative, pro-embargo types predominant in the generation(s) before them. So came the cue that initiating a policy switch would not occasion the political suicide risk it once did. Joining the rest of the civilized world in honestly appraising an idea whose time had long gone became, if not necessarily hazard-free, not the very perilous move it formerly was.

What's left, by way of barriers to enlightenment and progress, is the braying of head-in-the-sand characters and apologists for American hegemony, come what may, who would rather that the U.S. hewed to the regressive, punitive provisions of the Helms-Burton Act till kingdom come. That act, passed by Con-

gress in 1996 to even further tighten the screws on the U.S.-Cuba no-trade status already existing, being as hard-line as is suggested by the two arch-conservative Republicans whose names it bears.

Common to all the rhetoric about how wrong it is to now proceed with a policy change is that the obstructionists insist they have the Cuban people's best interests at heart. That this "news camera" line is just so much hot air is of course immediately borne out by the reception that greeted the president's announcement on the streets of Havana. From all we've been able to gather, it seems obvious that a thaw in relations between the two countries is something that has generated nothing but positive excitement for the average Cuban. So what super-grade wool are these jokers attempting to pull over people's eyes, about having the Cubans' back? Trying your darnedest to block what Cubans see as opening up economic opportunities for them is one helluva way of expressing solidarity, isn't it?

And then there's the barefaced disconnect so many folks have

hastened to point out, regarding these disingenuous critics raising hell about Obama's move to end a Cuba policy that had outlived any usefulness, while there's no squawking whatsoever about this country's continuing relationship with China. Richard Nixon scored himself a major reelection campaign bonanza with his breakthrough visit to China in 1972, nothing but hosannas for this emanating from the very quarter whence comes today's anti-Cuba drumbeat. Evidently, the potential for a big-business windfall following the opening of trade with China neutralized any contemplation there may have been of lecturing the Chinese on what governmental form they should have. For pipsqueak Cuba, all bets off.

In the final analysis, what has followed the Cuba announcement is true to form with the tiresome polemical barrage from the right that the president has faced throughout his term. Another Democratic president would likely have been ripped into as well for doing likewise. For this one, poison darts come with the territory. It's Cuba today, who-knows-what tomorrow.

Unlocking innovation for food and farming sustainability

LIMA, Dec. 13, 2014 (IPS) - The digital revolution that is continuing to develop at lightening speed is an exciting new ally in our fight for global food security in the face of climate change.

Researchers have spent decades collecting data on climate patterns, but only in recent years have cost-effective solutions for publicly hosting this information been developed. Cloud computing services make the ideal home for key climate data – given that they have a vast capacity for not only storing data, but analysing it as well.

Gone are the days when farmers could rely on almanacs for predicting seasonal planting dates, as climate change has made these predictions unreliable.

This rationale is the basis for a brand new partnership between CGIAR, a consortium of international research centres, and Amazon web services. With 40 years of research under its belt, CGIAR holds a wealth of information on not just climate patterns, but on all aspects of agriculture.

By making this data publically available on the Amazon cloud, researchers

and developers will be empowered to come up with innovations to solve critical issues inextricably linked to food and farming, such as reducing rural poverty, improving human health and nutrition, and sustainably managing

the Earth's natural resources.

The first datasets to move to the cloud are Global Circulation Models (GCM), presently the most important tool for representing future climate conditions.

Visa program

Grenada's ambassador to the United States of America, Dr. Angus Friday praised the US for Grenada's continued inclusion on the list of countries eligible for H-2A and H-2B programs being offered by the USCIS and the Department of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Department of State.

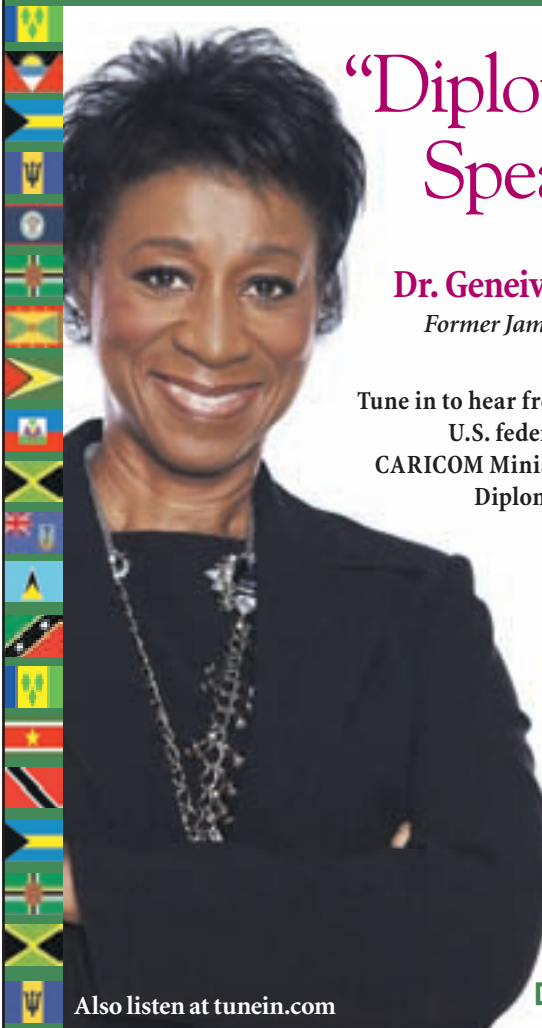
The visa programs begin in January 2015.

In a statement to Caribbean Life, the diplomat said Grenada has long standing relationships with the United States, and policies that allow the free flow of people, knowledge, culture and skills that are positive for both countries. "It is not a one way flow," he added.

Referring to a release that listed five Caribbean countries among 68, eligible for the programs, Friday, who also holds the post of Ambassador to the Organization of American States, said Grenada has a vibrant expat community, and St. George's University based in Grenada trains one in every one hundred doctors practicing in the United States.

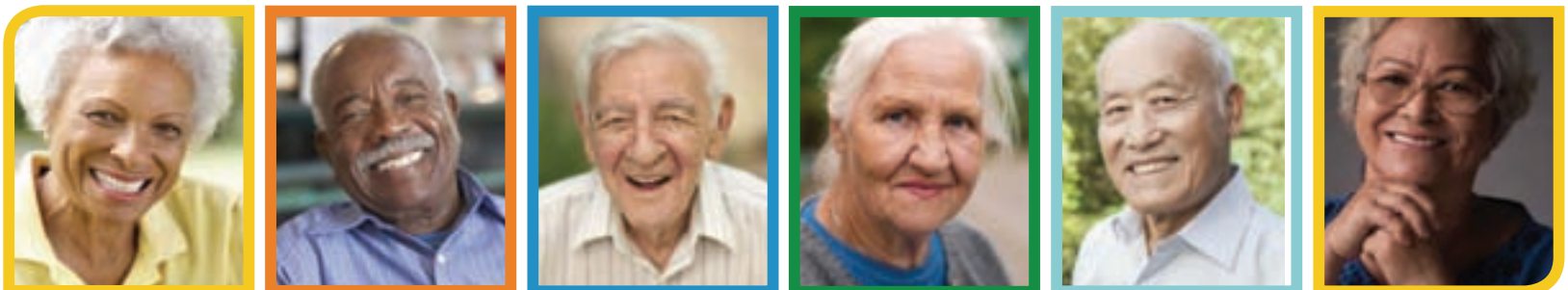

Incredible scooter cops in community

“Two Street Savvy Cops Nail ‘em With Words,” was the glaring headline of a New York Daily News article written in 1977. No Bullets, no choking, no abuse and yet, retired NYPD officers Joseph Willins (Scooter Joe) and his partner Kenneth Kaufman were consistently able to take hardened criminals and murderers into their custody during the 70s and 80s, a time when drugs and crime were rampant and police and community worked together.

“We would not have choked Eric Gardner, we would have hugged him. Ken and I would have taken a much different path. We sought out street-wise individuals, as Eric, because he was the eyes and ears of the community. He knew what was going on. We would have befriended him and enlist him

as an asset to solve crime in the community. He was a family man with children; He wanted a safe community for his wife and family too. He was not a hardened criminal. Wall Street executives committed worse crimes against the people than Eric. No one choked them,” Joe stated during a recent interview at his Bed-Stuy residence.

Joe and Kenny were partners for almost 20 years and worked in the 79th Precinct in Bedford Stuyvesant. Joe lived in the community, while Kenny, his Jewish partner, commuted. The community knew them.

They patrolled up and down the streets on scooters. They knew the criminal elements and the criminals knew their no-nonsense approach to crime. They knew every nook and cranny of the community- the burglars, number joints, dope dealers and they also knew the doctors, lawyers, teachers, other professionals, hard working residents, home owners, elders and youths of the community. There was no profiling because they knew the community and had gained the respect of the people whom they had sworn to serve and protect.

Brooklynite indicted for defrauding immigrants

Brooklyn District Attorney Ken Thompson and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement New York Special Agent-in-Charge, James T. Hayes Jr., on Thursday announced that a Brooklyn woman who allegedly promised green cards and work permits to undocumented Caribbean and other immigrants has been charged with stealing about US\$12,850 from them.

Thompson and Hayes also said that Nickya Wittington, also known as Nicky John, 27, of 280 Grafton St., Brownsville, Brooklyn, falsely promised to help an undercover detective obtain the same documents.

“This defendant is accused of preying on some of the most vulnerable members of our society,” Thompson said. “I created an Immigrant

Fraud Unit – which is prosecuting this case – to stop such opportunists from targeting undocumented individuals.”

Hayes said: “This defendant’s alleged actions served not only to victimize immigrants attempting to comply with federal laws, they also threatened to undermine confidence in the federal government.”

Thompson said Wittington has been arraigned by Brooklyn Supreme Court Justice Danny Chun on an indictment in which she is charged with first-degree scheme to defraud, third-degree grand larceny, third-degree attempted grand larceny, fourth-degree grand larceny and petit larceny.

She was ordered held on US\$5,000 bail and to return to court on Feb 4, 2015. If convicted of the top count, she faces up to seven years in prison, Thompson said.

Woman visionary wins Digicel Entrepreneur award in Haiti

Uzale Remay founded APLADEM, Meyer's Planters Association for Development, 25 years ago in a region near Jacmel, two hours south of Port-au-Prince. She is the first woman to take the title Digicel Entrepreneur of the Year.

In a country that requires true grit, perseverance, and know-how to operate a business, Digicel began to recognize exceptional entrepreneurs five years ago.

Remay is described by Dennis O'Brien, chairman of the Digicel Group and chairman of the judges, as a leader, an entrepreneur and a woman with vision for her community. "What is really rare is someone who looks at a business and sees its potential to change an entire community – that is something truly laudable," said O'Brien.

When Remay saw the amount of fruits and vegetables wasted in her community of Meyer, she set out to do something about it.

She contacted the Ministry of Agriculture who responded by providing initial training for local women in fruit processing and product manufacturing. This allowed the fledgling enterprise of food transformation to get started on a business footing.

Modest funds came from organizations such as the Pan

American Development Foundation, the Inter-American Development Bank and Women in Democracy.

Over the years, increasing numbers of women in local networks began producing jelly, peanut butter, coffee, cocoa, cassava and crémas. In August 2013, a

modern new cassava processing plant with Oxfam as a partner became part of the business.

Now, the business supports more than 1500 families and has become a role model for similar organizations around the country.

This year, the coveted Entrepreneur of the Year award selected eighty-five regional finalists from Haiti's north, center, south, and west, in the first stage of the competition.

Twenty-five finalists in the fields of agriculture and environment; education, tourism and culture; emerging; industry; and services, battled through to the national finals, from which the overall winner was chosen.

Remay also won honors in her division, Agriculture and Environment. Only 21 percent are women.

Richet Junior Jacques from Gonaives, founder of Le Transporteur, whose reliable modern bus service revolutionized rural transport, won the prize in the emerging entrepreneur category.

The award in the Industry sector went to Jonas Guillaume, founder of detergent manufacturer Digo Industries SA; in Services to Jn-Rony Vincent of IT company, BITS SA; and in Education, Tourism and Culture to education entrepreneur, Jean Rico Felix, of the Wonderful Institute.

A special Social Entrepreneurship award was presented this year to Remise Belizaire, founder of LOCAL, which promotes self-help and entrepreneurship networks in marginalized rural communities – working mainly with women and acting both as a social support and a business incubator.

The awards ceremony took place Dec. 16, in Haiti.

Digicel Chairman Maarten Boute said, "That is a remarkable tribute to the deep well of enterprise we have been privileged to discover and tap here in Haiti."

Over these last five years, 350 entrepreneurs have acknowledged for their contributions.

dent but in February robbers attacked the gold mine there killing one person and stealing more than 800 grams of raw gold.

Trinidad

Former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani and New York Police Commissioner William Bratton will return to Trinidad and Tobago to help the local police service improve the dismal detection rate.

This was revealed by National Security Minister Gary Griffith who said the two U.S. crime fighters are expected in the country next month to conduct an audit of the police service to help improve investigation methods, including better forensic testing to improve the detection rate.

The two New York cops were retained previously by the Ministry of National Security to help map a way forward.

Griffith said while serious crimes were at the lowest level in 31 years, homicides continue to pose some challenges for the police service. The mur-

der rate is just short of five to reach the 400-mark for this year.

Jamaica

Grammy-winning reggae artiste Buju Banton, whose given name is Mark Myrie, who was convicted on cocaine trafficking charges in 2011, has filed a motion in a USA court in an attempt to secure an earlier release date.

The Tampa Bay Tribune reported that Buju filed his own motion from prison asking to be released early based on a recent change in federal drug sentencing guidelines. This would mean an earlier release date and deportation to Jamaica.

Buju is currently serving a mandatory 10-year sentence for his conviction on a charge of conspiracy to distribute cocaine.

He is scheduled to be released in 2019.

However, the amendments do not apply to those serving minimum mandatory sentences under the law.

Pumpkin soup, a Haitian New Year's tradition

As New Year's Day approaches, Haitians around the world prepare for another time-honored custom, the making of soup joumou, pronounced "joo-moo." Jan. 1 is not celebrated properly for Haitians unless they partake in their traditional pumpkin soup.

The ingredients have long been assembled by the time New Year's Eve rolls around. That's when Maryse Jean-Baptiste of Bushwick begins making her soup stock with a beef bone.

The soul of the soup is the squash, usually a West Indian pumpkin. This mother of two young adults uses either calabaza squash—looks like a small pumpkin, often sold in cut sections, or kaboucha—a green mottled, squat pumpkin. Both have bright orange flesh that flavors, colors, and thickens the soup.

"We have a lot of Caribbeans in this neighborhood and you can find both types in the stores," Jean-Baptiste says.

"Early on New Year's day, I

cook the squash, and then blend it," she details, eventually adding it to the stock with the vegetables: cabbage, carrots, onions, leeks, potatoes, celery and "a few handfuls of macaroni, spaghetti,

and some rice" and the meat that has been browned.

It turns out that everyone's recipe for soup joumou is a combination of historical, family and personal tradition. Some people don't use rice or pasta. "Sometimes, I add chicken," says Jean-Baptiste. (Vegetarian versions are also a popular adaptation).

Jean-Baptiste is originally from the small town of Pilate in Northern Haiti. After noon on Jan. 1, close family members assemble to celebrate and eat her time-perfected soup.

Canarsie-resident Lily Cerat marinates her meat before she leaves for her New Year's Eve's festivities. "I make up a packet of herbs when I cook the stock," she divulges on how cilantro is an important addition in her flavoring.

"When I get home, I begin cooking in earnest." She puts a big pot on the stove for the undetermined number of friends and family who will drop by during the day. "I like

to add ziti, but cook it on the side, just adding some at the end so it doesn't thicken the soup too much. In a pinch, I'll add some frozen squash," she admits. (For others, butternut squash is sometimes used.)

"My first bowl is an offer-

ing to the ancestors," she says. "When we eat the soup, we sit around and reminisce what it means."

Jan. 1 is also the Haitian day of independence. On that date in 1804, Haiti was liberated from France.

A story of action, honor, and the Wild West

“Bass Reeves: Tales of the Talented Tenth” by Joel Christian Gill c.2014, Fulcrum Books \$25.95 / \$32.50 Canada 126 pages

Everybody needs a hero in their life.

Somebody to look up to. Somebody to want to be like some day, to follow and admire - perhaps a parent, maybe a grandparent or uncle. A friend or classmate might be your hero, or maybe even someone you don't know.

Or, as in the new book “Bass Reeves: Tales of the Talented Tenth” by Joel Christian Gill, your hero just might be a lawman.

George Reeves was a careful man.

His young slave boy, Bass, wanted to learn to read but Reeves “couldn't have that,” so he taught Bass to shoot. Before long, the boy was one of the best sharpshooters Reeves had ever seen, and he decided to enter Bass in a few contests.

Nobody thought a slave could win a shooting match, but that's exactly what Bass did - over and over again. As he grew, so did his talent with a gun but though Bass won every competition, Reeves still treated Bass like a “family pet.”

That continued for many years. Even during the Civil War, Colonel Reeves took Bass to the front with him as his personal slave - until Bass escaped.

Not knowing where he was, Bass ran until he was exhausted. He ran until he couldn't run any more, until he was rescued from near-death by a tribe of Native Americans who tended Bass's

wounds and welcomed them into their village. They considered him family but Bass remembered how he'd been enslaved, so he left the village and returned to the battlefield, where he fought for the Union Army.

After the War was over, Bass married, started a family, and settled down to farm until, once again, duty called. Because Bass (who'd taken his former master's surname) had a good relationship with the Native Americans in the Territories, he was hired to be a U.S. Marshal. It didn't take long before he was deputized, and he began to make a name for himself. Word soon spread that a tall, black lawman was patrolling the territories and that, wherever he went, he left a silver dollar as a calling card. Bass Reeves was known to be smart, and he would do anything to bring a criminal down.

Even when that criminal was

his own son.

Though its back-and-forth timeline can be confusing sometimes - particularly in latter pages - I liked “Bass Reeves: Tales of the Talented Tenth” quite a bit.

Based on little-known but true events, this is a story of action, honor, and the Wild West. That's very good, but what equally appealed to me was the way author Joel Christian Gill uses his artist's skills to tell this tale.

“The fact that they are bringing this problem into their consciousness can give a physician several years of lead time in heading off these far more serious medical problems,” said Dr. Raykhman. “Could a visit to a urologist indirectly save a patient's life?

Absolutely.”

A skilled urologist can slow the progress of the dysfunction and with the proper treatment most patients can regain a more satisfying sexual experience.

Although surgery is sometimes necessary, “it's the last resort.” Changes in lifestyle can often reverse the effects of erectile dysfunction. These include exercise, improvements in diet, and a reduction in smoking and alcohol intake. Erectile dysfunction can often be treated with medications such as Cialis, Viagra, Levitra or hormone therapy.

Dr. Raykhman stressed that because an erection is a vascular event, erectile dysfunction needs to be taken seriously.

Though she was barely able to walk a week before because of gout, Calypso Rose was still able to woo her audience Sunday afternoon/evening, as Brooklyn paid tribute to the woman who “broke the glass ceiling” in the calypso genre.

“Calypso Rose has set the pace,” he continued. “[Calypso] Rose is a Carib-

bean Lady first of all.”

Bronx-based Gus White, a former announcer with the popular, legendary Radio Antilles in Montserrat, who also served as Master of Ceremonies, said he was “honored to be part of this function” that honored Calypso Rose.

“Dr. McArtha Lewis, Calypso Rose, for what you have done, I’ll truly grateful,” he said.

Dave Elcock, an erstwhile popular radio personality in Trinidad and

Tosh estate to donate 'Equal Rights' revenue

The estate of Jamaican reggae icon and Grammy-winning musician Peter Tosh recently announced that 10 percent of all net income collected throughout 2015, from streaming and downloads of the 1977 mega-hit Tosh released called "Equal Rights" will be donated to the families of Michael Brown and Eric Garner.

The bold decision was announced by Brian Latture, manager of the Peter Tosh brand and CEO of entertainment management firm The MegaSource Group.

"Brown and Garner are symbols of an issue that needs to be urgently addressed in America," Latture said.

"These cases of racially-motivated police brutality, and the no-indictment rulings for the cops, set off a movement of all ages and races demanding criminal justice reform. The time has come to re-energize the pursuit of equal rights through music, and I know that if Peter were physically with us he'd want to, in some way, help support the relatives of those that were killed in the line of

living."

Tosh's anthem for fairness pleads, "I don't want peace, I want equal rights and justice," the same call many have been demanding since two Grand juries acquitted police of causing the deaths of Black men in Ferguson, MO and Staten Island prompting nationwide protests.

The reggae recording also reflects an accurate description of the growing incidents of deaths of unarmed Black men at the hands of police officers.

Tosh was a founding member of Bob Marley and the Wailers, and perceived to be the most militant of the triumvirate that captivated world attention.

After leaving the group, Tosh also achieved success as a solo artist.

He is credited as one of the most outspoken of Jamaica's reggae music pioneers.

As a musician and writer,

Tosh earned the respect of popular music's greatest artists, including the Rolling Stones, a label that signed him to their roster in 1978.

He opened for the rock 'n roll Stones throughout its 1978 US tour.

Had he lived he would have celebrated his 70th birthday anniversary of Sept. 11.

Bilbo and pals in epic showdown

"The Battle of the Five Armies" is the third and closing chapter in "The Hobbit" series based on the classic fantasy novel of the same name by J.R.R. Tolkien. The film also represents the finale in the sextet of Tolkien adaptations directed by Peter Jackson also including The Lord of the Rings trilogy.

Picking up from where the cliffhanger of the last episode left off, this action-oriented

installment opens with protagonist Bilbo Baggins (Martin Freeman) and his dwarf pals fretting over having unwittingly awakened Smaug (Benedict Cumberbatch). For, the fero-

cious, fire-breathing dragon has left his mountain lair and begun venting his wrath upon the helpless citizens of Lake-town.

Fortunately, a savior even-

tually arrives in the person of Bard the Bowman (Luke Evans) an intrepid archer who takes aim at the seemingly-invincible Smaug's Achilles' heel. However, piercing the tiny bare

patch of skin on the dragon's vulnerable belly doesn't settle the question of who gets the gold and priceless baubles still sitting inside the now unprotected Lonely Mountain.

As word spreads of the demon's demise, greed gets the better of assorted individuals who proceed to descend upon the area to stake a claim on the vast treasure. Only the arrival of a horde of evil orcs doing the bidding of the avaricious Dark Lord, Sauron the Necromancer (also Benedict Cumberbatch), inspires the contentious masses to end their hostilities and join forces against a common enemy.

Clocking in at a mercilessly-brief 144 minutes, The Battle of the Five Armies is not only the shortest, but the most entertaining of Jackson's Tolkien screen adaptations. Between an engrossing plotline and virtual non-stop combat, the picture proves to be just the perfect way to bring down the curtain on a storied fantasy franchise.

Highlighting an exuberant journey through South African history, using the traditions of storytelling, drum talk, dance and song, the tour stopped into the nation's capital of Washington D.C., Charlotte, North Carolina, Atlanta, Georgia, New Orleans, Louisiana, and Miami, Florida before coming here.

The sweeping tale moves from the potent rhythms of tribal music to the intricate steps of Gumboot dancing. The storyline takes the audience from the country's early history, through the racist years and into the more progressive era of today's regime. With the one-year anniversary of Mandela's death on Dec. 5, one of the highlights of the show include a personal tribute to the beloved leader known as Madiba. In it a visualized performance retraces the world leader's time in jail until his release from prison in 1990.

The song "Long Road To Freedom" amplifies that har-

An emotional tribute to South Africa and the Zulu heritage blends traditional and contemporary elements including authentic Zulu dancing; explosive drumming, and gospel music. Translated from Swahili, Africa Umoja is interpreted to mean "together."

The production tells the

history of South Africa from the earliest rhythms of the Zulu drums to the current club sounds called "Kwaito."

The repertoire includes internationally acclaimed choreography, cross-cultural and traditional love songs, lullabies and other musical expressions of rural life. The narration reflects on stories of love and community as well as overcoming pain and endurance of South Africa's most tumultuous period era.

Woven throughout the historical journey are reminiscent sounds of vibrant jazz that saw Black South Africans through some of the country's stormiest passages.

New York City's own MLS franchise, New York City FC makes its league debut on Sunday, March 15, 2015 versus the New England Revolution and after a year of planning and preparation, the semblance of a competitive team is beginning to unfold.

The team has solid financial backing from its owners - English Premier League club Manchester City, one of the richest soccer clubs in the world, and the New York Yankees of Major League Baseball, one of the richest baseball franchises. Former U.S. national team

Windies humiliated

midfielder Claudio Reyna is responsible for the soccer operations, which includes selecting the coaching staff and player acquisitions; and the team will play in Yankee Stadium in the Bronx until a soccer specific stadium that bears the New York City FC (FC means Football Club) name is built, according to reports, in either Queens or Brooklyn.

Former MLS player and Real Salt Lake City coach, Jason Kreis, was named coach a year ago and has since spent time in England at the team's parent headquarters as an understudy to the Manchester City coaching staff to understand the coaching philosophy and culture that Man City encourages. Kreis was selected, according to the coach, because his style is similar to that of the parent club. Kreis said he was hired for his attractive, possession-oriented soccer he employed at Real Salt Lake.

The club's first signings reveal its attempt to bring that attractive, possession game to New York City, which has a very knowledgeable soccer community. Former Spain and Barcelona forward David Villa and former England and Chelsea midfielder Frank Lampard are the Designated Players who will suit up for New York FC; Lampard is currently on loan at Manchester City and scoring goals for the club which currently leads the English Premier League standings. Designated Players are those high-priced stars whose salaries do not conform to the MLS salary cap. NYCFC is allowed a third designated player and there is speculation that this could be a U.S. national player such as Jozy Altidore.

"As we've gone from there, we're looking for players to complement those two players' styles and also fit in with the way Manchester City wants to see the game played and also the way Claudio and I want to see the game played," Kreis said of future players. "We're always looking for players who fit into the style of soccer and the type of group we want to be."

In its quest to complete a roster, New York City FC took part in the recent MLS expansion draft, where players who were out of contract and those whose contracts were not renewed were available for selection. The club also acquired players on loan and traded directly with clubs for players

Among the 22 players acquired through the Expansion draft are three MLS veterans who played for Kreis at Real Salt Lake: Chris Wingert, a Long Island product who played at St. John's University, Ned Grabavoy and Kwame Watson-Siriboe, all defenders. Also among the new players are midfielders Sal Zizzo from Sporting Kansas City, former Red Bulls player Mehdi Ballouchy from Vancouver and defender George John from FC Dallas.

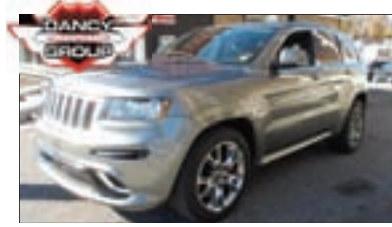

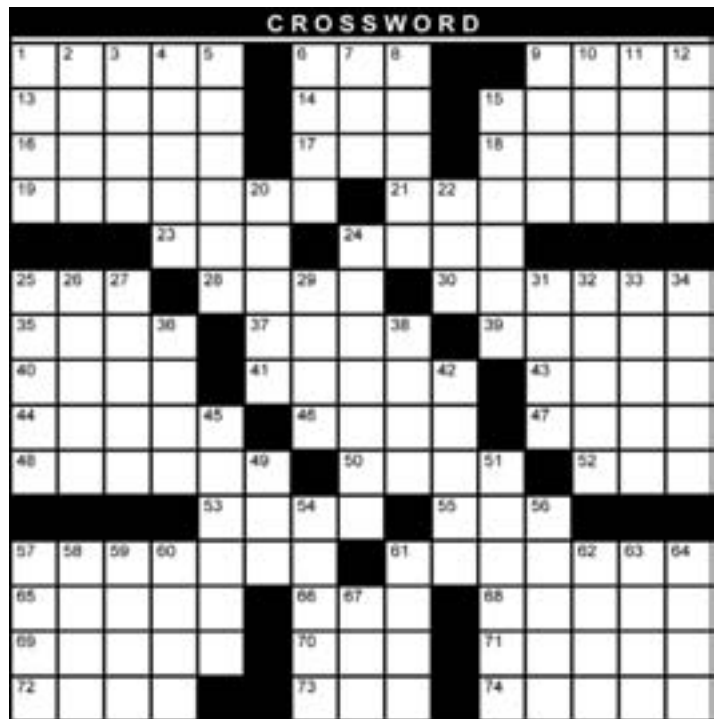

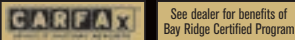

Classified ads are intended to help people by facilitating communication and advertising available services; however, some of the hotlines & service numbers in classifieds actually hurt the people who rely on them by cheating them of their hard-earned dollars. "Most newspapers print a disclaimer in their classified ad section to warn readers about numbers that are a direct line to trouble. Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges. "Consumers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party."
