Adams launches new street safety initiative

Brooklyn Borough President Eric L. Adams on Tuesday joined dozens of senior citizens outside the AMICO Senior Citizens Center in Borough Park, along with local elected officials and community advocates, to launch CROSS (Connecting Residents on

Safer Streets) Brooklyn, his new initiative to improve street safety for the borough's vulnerable pedestrians.

INCOME SOURCE THREAT IMF warns against over reliance on economic citizenship programs

Not surprisingly, the Washington D.C-based International Monetary Fund (IMF) has seen it fit to warn Caribbean Community countries, which have developed a 'dollars for local citizenship scheme' not to depend too much on it as a reliable income source as the developed world could easily crush these programs if they only feel that they are not properly administered.

The fund held a rare press conference in Washington at the weekend


and used the opportunity to indicate that while economic citizenship schemes could indeed bring in much needed revenues, these have to be managed properly.

Its cautions to countries such as St. Kitts, Dominica, Antigua and Grenada have come in the wake of similar expressions of concerns from the U.S., Canadian and other western governments as well as international security organizations, which now worry that undesirables are Continued on Page 6

Pressure Republicans on Loretta Lynch: Clarke

At least two Brooklyn Democratic politicians have appealed to the community to put pressure on the Republican leadership in the United States Senate in confirming the nomination of Loretta Lynch as the next U.S. attorney general.

Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke, representative for the 9th Congressional District, and New York City Councilwoman Laurie Cumbo, who represents the 35th Council District, have urged constituents to call Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) to put an immediate end to the long delay in confirming Eric Holder's successor.

"When I return to Washington [D.C.] next week, I am going to act up because we have to get Loretta Lynch confirmed," said Clarke in addressing a gala "Women Celebrating Women" awards ceremony on Sunday at Tropical Paradise Ballroom on Utica Avenue in Brooklyn. The event was organized by the Brooklyn-based Progressive Democratic Political Association (PDPA), of which Clarke is an executive member.

"Call Mitch McConnell and tell him that you want Loretta Lynch confirmed immediately," added Clarke, giving patrons the numbers to call and fax - (202) 224-2541 (T); (202) 224-2499 (F).

"When I return to Washington, D.C., know that I will return with your concerns in my mind and in my heart," she continued. "There has to be a voice that speaks to communities that go unrecognized."

Cumbo, who spoke at the same event, called for a revolt across the nation against what is perceived to be Republicans' stalled tactics.

Protestors march against 'Murder by Police'

On Tuesday, April 14 over a thousand people participated in the "Stop Murder by Police" march and demonstration sponsored by Stop Mass Incarceration Network, co-founded by Carl Dix and Cornel West. There were two feeder marches coming from uptown, which converge at Union Square around 2:30 p.m.

marchers carried signs and The placards on poles and chanted in the call and response style slogan such as, "Hands Up!, Don't Shoot!," "Who's Streets?, Our Streets!," "No Justice!, No Peace!," "Black Lives Matter!," "NYPD, KKK, How Many People Have you Killed Today?," "Who's Streets?, Our Streets!," "You Can't Protect Us!," "A People United, Can Never Be Defeated!," "The Whole Damn System Is Guilty as Hell!," "Shut It Down!," "I Can't Breath! I'm Going to Die!," "What Do We Want? Justice! When Do We Want It? Now!" "We Are the People, and We Are Angry!" The air was charge with energy and the protesters were in high spirits. All segments of the population were represented: teenagers, young adults, middle age, senior citizen, male, female, straight, gay, Christians, Muslims, Jews, atheist, blue collar, white collar, students, and workers, Black, Latino, Asian, and white. It was truly an equal opportunity participation march.

In Union Square, Dr. Cornel West addressed the marchers, urging them to love everyone and stand up for those who are oppressed throughout the world. He then noted, "Don't be confused by some black faces in high places. For seven year's there's been

our black and brown brothers and sisters shot down by the police. Black president, Black attorney general, Black cabinet secretary of Homeland Security and not one policeman sent to jail... something just ain't right."

From Union Square the protesters carried the march down Broadway. Somewhere in the middle of the marchers were Rev. Dr. Calvin Butts, pastor of

Abyssinian Baptist Church, Cornel West and Carl Dix march organizers, marching arm in arm and being interviewed by reporters as they marched. Carl Dix said, "There was a question about whether the movement was alive. This is the answer. There are over a thousand people here with us today. People here are saying that police getting away with murder, must stop! Must stop!

Cuomo first gov. to visit Cuba as ties reopen

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) _ New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo is heading to Havana, the first American governor to visit Cuba since the recent thaw in relations with the communist nation. Whether his trade mission generates anything more than headlines, however, remains to be seen.

The formal state visit on Monday and Tuesday is meant to foster greater ties between New York and Cuba. Cuomo is expected to take a small group of business leaders for what he has called "a tremendous stepping stone" that will "help open the door to a new market for New York businesses."

Trade experts say New York could profit from improved relations with the Caribbean nation. New York farmers could export apples, powdered milk and other dairy products. Businesses could invest big in Cuba's developing information technology infrastructure. Hoteliers could build resorts to prepare for the increase in American tourists.

Any significant economic relationship with Cuba will take time, according to Joe Schoonmaker, the chairman of the New York District Export Council who works as a trade risk insurance broker. He predicted that tourism would be the first sector of the Cuban economy to open up and that it will be some time before Cuba is engaging in robust trade.

"It's not going to be like opening up China," he said. "As far as hundreds of millions of dollars of products going down to Cuba, I don't see it at this time. They're not going to be buying a lot of stuff."

Critics say Cuomo's visit legitimizes a dictatorship and is more about politics than exports. State Republican Chairman Ed Cox dismissed the trade mission as a political stunt "meant to bolster his national profile."

Assemblywoman Nicole Malliotakis, a Staten Island Republican whose mother is a Cuban exile, said any efforts to normalize relations must be accompanied by significant concessions from the Castro regime.

"I do not understand the purpose of this trade mission or see any concrete benefit for the state of New York," she said.

The U.S. has been exporting limited amounts of food to Cuba for years. If New York does establish closer economic ties with Cuba, its first ambassadors may be two of its biggest farm products: dairy and apples. The state is one of the nation's top producers of both.

Caribbean

Business leaders from 18 countries and territories of the Caribbean will meet later this month in Miami to discuss the challenges posed by antilaundering regulation.

Michelle Martin, organizer of the Caribbean Anti-Money Laundering Conference said: "It is the first time so many heads of enforcement agencies will gather in a single location to engage business leaders.'

IRS retired special agent in charge of Criminal Investigation Division Jose "Tony" Gonzalez will discuss how legitimate business are destroyed by financial crimes.

Barbados

A Caribbean Export Development Agency (Caribbean Export) in collaboration with the Organization of American States (OAS) Partnered with the Information Communication and Technology (ICT) for implementation of a training programs for ICT advisors from ll CARICOM countries.

The work shop which was held from March 23 - 25 at Divi Southwinds Resort, Barbados, aimed at improving the competitiveness of firms through

access, implementation, and use of ICT in business processes.

"The reality of the situation is that the SMEs (Single Mar-

ket Economies) must embrace ICT to survive in today's environment," said Pamela Cook-Hamilton of Caribbean Export.

CTIC has successfully led a program over the last 12 years to build capacity in the use of ICTs by SMEs through the training of ICT advisors.


Grenada

The United States is providing US\$300,000 to fund local and hemispheric observers to elect a new govern-

ment on May 11. "It is our hope that international and domestic observation will increase public and stakeholder confidence in the electoral process, culminating in all political parties acceptance of the ultimate results," the U.S.Embassy in



the Electoral Assistance Bureau (EAB).

These resources will assist in their efforts to ensure fair, free and credible elections in Guyana on May 11," it said, adding "the U.S. government is pleased to support the two organizations in bringing their credible and critical analysis to Guyana's 2015 electoral process."

On a statement Washington said it would continue to advocate globally for the expansion and strengthening of democratic governance and that regular free and fair elections are critical in this regard.

Haiti

Authorities in Haiti say they have

discovered the bodies of 17 people who appeared to have drowned off the country's northern coast.

The bodies of 11 men and six women were found recently, washed ashore in the coastal town of Le Borgne, about 100



miles north of Port-au-Prince.

Police said the victims appeared to have drowned in a boating incident, although no vessel had yet been found. It is unclear if there were any survivors.

Jamaica

A new fund to stimulate clean energy was announced recently by U.S. President Barack Obama during a meeting with CARICOM leaders in Kingston, Jamaica.

He described the region's dependence on fossil fuels as its greatest barrier to development.

At the start of the meeting with CAR-

ICOM leaders at the University of the West Indies, Mona campus, Obama said the talks would focus on sever-



al issues such as regional integration, trans-national crime, the Caribbean Basin Security Initiative and human rights.

using the economic citizenship route to obtain visas and entry to countries that would normally reject them.

Dominica's neighbor, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, has flatly refused overtures to establish such a program. Prime Minister Ralph Gonsalves has said that such would not be in place in his political lifetime.

Canada, for example, complained so bitterly about some of those granted citizenship and local passports by the previous Denzil Douglas administration in St. Kitts and sister federation island, Nevis, that it quickly and unapologetically ordered that Kittians must now apply for visas to travel to Canada because it is concerned about the security of the program.

Adrienne Cheasty who is the IMF's deputy director for Western Hemispheric affairs says that while the programs are still in place and are a "valuable windfall to some countries in the area it is very important that the programs be managed very impeccably. For example, if Canada or the European Union felt the programs were not being managed well, they could disappear," she said.

The issue was a key agenda item on the mid-January general elections in St. Kitts that saw the Douglas administration being voted out of office largely because of credible domestic and international allegations about corruption and officials siphoning off monies from the schemes.

In St. Kitts for example, a foreigner can buy citizenship, a local passport and other forms of credible photo state identification by acquiring real estate worth a minimum of \$400,000 or donate \$250,000 to a sugarcane diversification fund.

High production costs and reductions in purchasing prices by the European Union in 2005 forced the island to abandon sugar cane cultivation and production after about 400 years. Trinidad followed suit shortly after leaving production in the community up now only to Guyana, Jamaica, Belize and Barbados.

2016 to construct sidewalk extensions, known as "bulb-outs" or "neck-downs," at intersections determined to be dangerous, based on crash data from the New York City Department of Transportation.

"The foundation of One Brooklyn is built on safety, and I am focused every day on finding new ways to advance the safety of every Brooklynite, especially our most vulnerable," Adams told a press conference in Borough Park, flanked by senior citizens.

"CROSS Brooklyn is literally putting our money where our mouth is to make safe streets a reality for all. We want to shorten the distance it takes for our seniors, disabled, and youngest Brooklynites to cross dangerous intersections; by installing more sidewalk extensions, they will benefit from more of their commute being spent out of the street," he added.

Adams said his new effort builds on his past work to advance Vision Zero and pedestrian safety, including his call last summer on the city to use its school crossing guards to assist seniors in crossing streets.

The announcement also comes in advance of the City Planning Commission's vote on his land use recommendation to approve a lease renewal for AMICO Senior Citizens Center, a recommendation he conditioned on the City's approval of constructing street extensions at the intersection adjacent to the center.


"I am thrilled to join Borough President Eric Adams at the launch of CROSS (Connecting Residents on Safe Streets)," said Council Member David Greenfield.

"I am proud to be a leader of Vision Zero in New York City — working together with my colleagues to make it safe for drivers and pedestrians. CROSS will expand the commitment to Vision Zero via the investment of much needed capital funds by the Borough President," he added. "I look forward to working with the Borough President to find appropriate locations for CROSS improvements in my district and throughout Brooklyn."

Lindsay Goldman, project director for Age-Friendly NYC, said improving intersections reduces pedestrian fatalities and enables older people to remain actively engaged in their communities.

"Increased walkability facilitates access to physical, social, and economic opportunity which is associated with better health for older people and more resilient communities," she said.

According to the Tri-State Transportation Campaign, people aged 60 years and older comprised 42.7 percent of Brooklyn's 473 pedestrians killed in the 10 years from 2003 through 2012, though they made up only 16.2 percent of the population.

Hydrogen fuel cell an attractive option

In the run-up to a solar eclipse on March 20 of this year, European tabloids had a Y2Kstyle field day. In the middle of a bright, sunny day, European solar panels together produce about as much electricity as 90 large nuclear power plants. Germany, with the largest solar commitment, obtains as much as 50 percent of its electricity from the sun during the sunniest hours. The eclipse was scheduled to arrive in the middle of the day and panic was setting in.

Eclipses occur over very broad regions, so grid operators can't count on a sunny Spain to compensate for a cloudy Poland. Moreover, the decrease in sunlight (and the subsequent slingshot back to full sun) during an eclipse occur rapidly; grid operators have no experience managing such abrupt, sweeping shifts. Some predicted the eclipse would produce a catastrophe.

As with Y2K, there was no catastrophe. Europe experienced only a partial eclipse; much of Germany was fairly cloudy; and grid operators had had ample time to work out detailed contingency plans. But, as with Y2K, there had been legitimate reason for concern, and the experience offered a valuable lesson—if we are smart enough to absorb it. We need better ways to store renewable energy.

Renewable energy technologies are becoming increasingly competitive for a major share of the world's energy. In 2014, almost half of all new global investment in electricity generation was in renewables. China, at \$83 billion, was the largest investor. Even excluding huge dams, the world generated 9.1 percent of all electricity from renewables last year — mostly solar and wind.

Solar and wind energy involve no greenhouse gases, no mountain top mining, no fracking, no radioactive isotopes, no oil spills. . . . But sometimes the wind doesn't blow. And sometimes the sun doesn't shine.

In the early years, the intermittent nature of renewable energy was thought to be of little concern. We could use renewable electricity when available and switch back to conventional fuels when needed. But as renewable sources become a cornerstone of our energy mix, we will need to find ways to store power for those times when renewables are unavailable

Sunlight is, by far, the most abundant energy source on earth. But how do you store surplus electricity to use when you need it? Possibilities include batteries, ultracapacitors, and flywheels, all of which have important uses. One of the most attractive options is to use the sun's energy to make hydrogen; store the hydrogen until it's needed; then put it into a fuel cell to make electricity.

Predatory practices against developing countries

GENEVA, April 6, 2015 (IPS) - The world's attention turned to the practices of vulture funds after the U.S. Supreme Court affirmed a lower court opinion in the NML Capital vs Argentina case, which forbids the country from making payments on its restructured debt.

Argentina had defaulted in 2001 and went through two rounds of negotiations to restructure its debt, both in 2005 and 2010. In June 2014, the court ordered Argentina to pay the 'vulture funds' that held out and did not accept the terms of the debt swaps.

The vulture funds had held out with the aim of achieving what amounts to a 1,600 percent return on their original investment. The funds concerned had purchased the Argentinian bonds in 2008 at 48 million dollars and the court ruling ordered Argentina to pay them 832 million dollars.

Nobel laureate Joseph Stiglitz noted that this was "the first time in history that a country was willing and able to pay its creditors, but was blocked by a judge from doing so."

While this case brought the term 'vulture funds' into the public sphere, the predatory practices of these entities did not start with Argentina.

According to a former U.N. independent expert on the effects of foreign debt and other related financial obligations of states on the full enjoyment of all human rights, the term 'vulture funds' describes "private commercial entities that acquire, either by purchase, assignments or some other The African Development Bank has documented that up until the year 2007, 25 judgments in favour of vulture funds had yielded nearly one billion dollars.

form of transaction, defaulted or distressed debts, and sometimes actual court judgments, with the aim of achieving higher returns."

Basically, vulture funds are hedge funds whose modus operandi focuses on three main steps including: (1) purchasing distressed debt on the secondary market at deep discounts far less than its face value; (2) refusing to participate in restructuring agreements with the indebted state; and (3) pursuing full value of the debt often at face value plus interest, arrears and penalties, including through litigation, seizure of assets or penalties.

Many developing countries have been exposed to the predatory practices of vulture funds, especially African and Latin American countries.

The African Development Bank has reported that at least 20 heavily indebted poor countries have been threatened with or have been subjected to legal actions by commercial creditors and vulture funds since 1999. These countries include Sierra Leone, Cote d'Ivoire, Burkina Faso, as well as Angola, Cameroon, Congo, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, Liberia, Madagascar, Mozambigue, Niger, Sao Tome and Principe, Tanzania, and Uganda.

Peru was targeted by NML Capital in the year 2000. According to media reports, the fund spent almost four years in the courts to win a ruling that forced Peru to settle for almost 56 million dollars on distressed debt, which the fund had initially bought for 11.8 million dollars.

The African Development Bank has documented that up until the year 2007, 25 judgments in favour of vulture funds had yielded nearly one billion dollars. Out of this amount, 72 percent of the judgments have been against African countries. The reported number of outstanding cases against debtor countries has doubled since 2004.

According to the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF), 54 court cases were instituted against 12 heavily indebted poor countries between 1998 and 2008. The IMF estimates that in some cases claims by vulture funds constitute as much as 12 to 13 percent of a country's gross domestic product. The World Bank estimates that nearly one-third of countries that are eligible for debt relief and other poverty alleviation programmes are the targets of nearly 26 vulture funds.

Concerned about the extent of the threat posed by such predatory practices and their systemic implications, several international authorities and multilateral institutions have voiced their concern about the matter.

The African Development Bank has warned that by Continued on Page 12

Loretta Lynch's 'dis' demands robust response

being said or done about it. It's just that what's being done hardly measures up to the type of muscular reaction needed. given the contemptible treatment Senate Republicans are meting out to President Obama's nominee for attorney general, Loretta Lynch. Various Democratic senators, including Charles Schumer, have spoken out about the outrage - this abominable "how not to govern" bit of theater by the GOP. The president has made known his disgust at their tactics. Rev. Al Sharpton has opted for a hunger strike strategy. But the collective impact of all of this and whatever else may be happening out there comes up way short, as far as manifesting anger commensurate with the indignity being heaped on this African American woman, the nominee since last November, by the crud now calling itself a Senate majority.

We come face to face again, unfortunately, with conduct that by now we know a control-

It's not that nothing is too capable of. But being aware of their capacity for reducing governance to slimeball behavior doesn't make it any more tolerable. And as good as this raunchiness may look on a scorecard within the GOP support base, for the rest of the citizenry it should serve only as build-up against the notion that anything resembling proper handling of the people's business could come from handing such a mandate to Republicans.

It was on Nov. 8 last year that Loretta Lynch was nominated by the president to replace Eric Holder. And it was on Feb. 26 that the Senate Judiciary Committee voted 12-8 in favor of the nomination. By rights, this was a nomination that should have been voted on by the full Senate even before the new Congress convened in January, the nominee's fitness for her current post of U.S. attorney for the Eastern District of New York having received a Senate thumbs-up by acclamation when she was nominated by Obama in 2010 ling element of the GOP is all to serve in that office for a



second time. But practical good sense having given way to political staging, the Lynch nomination was summarily assigned a place in limbo. The nominee. from all appearances a patently non-political player, became a bargaining chip in the bare-knuckled political games they're so fond of in D.C.

As some have pointed out, you would think that with the visceral feeling of antagonism toward straight shooter Holder evinced by Republicans, there would be every urge on their side to see him exit the Justice Department. But that obsessive GOP distaste for the man, and what he stands for, and the imagery of this disgraceful treatment of the first African American female chosen to be AG, evidently don't weigh heavily enough, as Republicans see the equation. Ergo,

closing in on six months since her historic nomination was announced, it languishes, held hostage by the spiteful antics of Mitch McConnell and his confederates in the Senate who have refused to bring the nomination to the Senate floor for a vote.

Here indeed is a black pride clarion call about which indifference should not be an option. We're not surprised. with the hard-right tail that wags the GOP dog, that there's nary a hint of sensitivity in Republican circles about what their repugnant behavior toward Lynch means to people of color. We're not surprised either that in the Judiciary Committee, 8 of its 11 Republicans voted against so supremely credentialed a nominee. It is for people of color, certainly, but also wherever in the polity decency exists, for the shame of this inexcusable delay of Lynch's confirmation to be dramatically held up to the glare of public scrutiny.

What should the tactic be? Who knows? But on the progressive/moderate side of the


fence, they need be aware that bottom-feeder combat to which Republicans resorted in the Lynch nomination have long since become common GOP practice. On its face Sharpton's hunger strike initiative looks to be the kind of protest technique that would leave the doers of this particular evil completely unfazed. Whatever the action plan, principals arrayed against the well-heeled army of right-wing strategists need to remain mindful, as they evidently were not for the last mid-term elections, that getting themselves behind the eight-ball is flat-out bad news for the country. The country, among other things, doesn't want the confirmation of a well qualified Loretta Lynch languishing while Republicans play vendetta politics, or whatever it is they're playing.

Latest word out of Washington seems to suggest a bit of reason perhaps coming into the picture. Let's hope that by the time this is being read Loretta Lynch is, or is close to being, attorney general of the United States.

Day in 1970, these technologies faced formidable challenges. Solar modules were ultra-expensive devices produced by a cottage industry whose only significant customer was NASA. Hydrogen was tricky to store and expensive to transport. Fuel cells required expensive catalysts like platinum.

Those did not appear to be monumental challenges for a species that had split atoms and gone to the moon. But gasoline was cheap and the oil industry was politically potent. Technical challenges are overcome only with ample funding, creative minds, and dogged perseverance. America's embarrassingly modest, start-and-stop federal support has been more of a tease than a sincere effort to build an industry.

The latest tease relates to hydrogen fuel cell vehicles. For no good reason, the federal tax credit for fuel cell vehicles ended last December while the incentives for battery powered cars continue to be in effect until each manufacturer has sold 200,000 such vehicles. Helping manufacturers achieve economies of mass production makes vastly more sense than cutting off incentives on some utterly arbitrary date.

Hyundai slowly began leasing Tucson fuel cell vehicles last year, and Toyota — the company that launched the hybrid vehicle revolution in 2000 with its Prius — plans to begin selling the Mirai fuel cell vehicle in America later this year. This is worst possible moment to remove the incentives for such vehicles!

Elon Musk, a very bright guy and the CEO of Tesla, disagrees, calling hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles "mindbogglingly stupid." But the arguments he uses against them mostly echo the same arguments that had been used against battery electric vehicles until Musk himself upended the paradigm. Of course, he might well be right the multiple energy conversions, high cost of infrastructure, etc. - might prove to be the kiss of death. But this depends upon a long string of assumptions about the future. It is not selfevident to people who don't own Tesla stock that electric cars should receive rich subsidies while fuel cell vehicles receive none.

Ultimately, though, this is a bigger issue than which alternative vehicle will prove to be the long-term winner. One way or another, we need to have a way to store very large amount of sunlight for times when the sun isn't shining. And hydrogen—for fundamental reasons has to be considered among the most attractive contenders.

precluding debt relief and costing millions in legal expenses, these vulture funds undermine the development of the most vulnerable African countries.

In June 2014, the heads of state and government of the Group of 77 and China, in their declaration issued on the occasion of the 'For a New World Order for Living Well' summit held in Santa Cruz de la Sierra, Bolivia, reiterated the importance of "not allowing vulture funds to paralyse the debt restructuring efforts of developing countries" and stressed that "these funds should not supersede the state's right to protect its people under international law."

The IMF had cautioned that upholding the decision against Argentina would harm future sovereign debt restructuring attempts. In 2013, the IMF stated that "if upheld, [the Court of Appeals decision] would likely give hold-out creditors greater leverage and make the debt restructuring process more complicated."

In 2007, G8 finance ministers had transnational coexpressed concern about actions of some litigating creditors against heavily indebted poor countries, and agreed the South Centre.

to work together to identify measures to tackle this problem based on the work of the Paris Club.

In September 2014, a resolution on the activities of vulture funds and the effects of foreign debt and other related international financial obligations of states on the full enjoyment of all human rights, particularly economic, social and cultural rights, was presented by Argentina and adopted at the 27th session of the U.N. Human Rights Council which took place in Geneva.

It is also worth noting that the 26th session of the Human Rights Council in June 2014 had adopted a resolution titled 'Elaboration of an international legally binding instrument on Transnational Corporations and Other Business Enterprises with Respect to Human Rights.'

This resolution sets in place a process of negotiations towards an international legally binding instrument on transnational corporations and their liability in the area of human rights.

US prez supports Security Summit

United States President Barack Obama has agreed to a Caribbean Security Summit as early as June this year, following regional concerns about the growing number of issues which could affect the region.

The agreement was reached over the week-end following Thursday's CARICOM-US Summit at the Mona Campus of the University of the West Indies, Jamaica, where Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar made the request for the summit.

She made the disclosure after the agreement was reached on the proposed summit, to be held at a venue to be decided.

Persad-Bissessar, who is the lead prime minister for security submitted to the president, that all parties should evaluate

Caribbean and U.S. security. The T&T PM said the time was now for all parties to "critically review, rethink and reform the approach to collaboration between our region and the U.S."

The prime minister said there was a clear and present threat which now existed from the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) and foreign terrorists.

"A number of persons have

been identified as leaving CARICOM Member States to become foreign terrorist fighters," she noted.

Persad-Bissessar pointed out that the war could not be won without shared intelligence.

She said CARICOM was deeply concerned about recent information from the Commander of US Command John Kelly, who spoke of the drawdown of the already decreased naval assets of SouthCom.

Antigua draws a line in the vanishing sand

ST. JOHN'S, Antigua, April 15, 2015 (IPS) - Jabberwock beach, located on the northeastern coast of Antigua, features a mile-long white sand beach and is a favourite with locals and visitors alike.

But Freeston Williams, a resident who frequents the area for exercise and other recreational activities, is worried that the beach is quickly disappearing.

"I travel around the Jabberwock area on the northern side of the island and I notice the shoreline is coming in closer to the road which means that it's minimising the area we use for exercise," Williams told IPS. "I am not sure what exactly is causing all this but sooner or later we will not have any beach left." Antigua and Barbuda's chief environment officer Diann Black-Layne said the sea level is in fact rising and she is mobilising legislators and residents of the small island-nation to become "climate ready" by implementing national activities on climate change.

"In the past 10 years we have experienced three droughts in Antigua. The temperature of the Caribbean Sea will have summer temperatures all the time. This means hurricane season will be all year round," Black-Layne told IPS.

Pointing to the consequences of a two-degree C increase in global temperatures as outlined in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change's (IPCC) Fifth Assessment Report (AR5), Black-Layne said there would Continued on Page 22

The afternoon event entitled "Identity Now, Generation Here! Native Born Immigrant" brought these three authors of Caribbean heritage together to share their written words and thoughts on 'When does one become an American?'

sat among them.

It was noted during the conversation that one is "impli-

cated" in being an American, just by living here.

How do you hold on to culture? What is 'Caribbean' versus individual island identities? When do you stop being an outsider? (Never, was almost a consensus response.) How much does 'being black' factor into outsiderness? (A lot.) How helpful to life and truthful is what you learn in school? Discussed were issues of who is writing history and setting values.

Slow growth in remittances to the Caribbean

The World Bank says remittances growth in the Caribbean is expected to slow in 2015.

The Washington-based international financial institution said in its latest issue of its Migration and Development Brief that growth in global remittances, including those to developing countries, such as the Caribbean, will slow sharply this year due to weak economic growth in Europe, deterioration of the Russian economy and the depreciation of the euro and ruble.

In the Latin America and Caribbean region, the World Bank said remittances are expected to grow by 2.3 percent in 2015 to US\$66 billion.

"While this growth is slower than that seen in 2014, it is significantly higher than the anemic pace of the post-crisis period," the report says.

It, however, said the outlook for the region is "positive, as remittance inflows are expected to benefit from growth in GDP (Gross Domestic Product) and employment in the United States, although this will be offset by high unemployment in Spain."

The report says remittances to the region are expected to grow to US\$69 billion in 2016 and US\$71 billion in 2017.

Officially recorded remittances to the developing world are expected to reach US\$440 billion in 2015, an increase of 0.9 percent over the previous year, the report says.

Trinidadian businessman to be memoralized

Prominent Trinidadian-born businessman Mohan Jaikaran who was the dynamic driving force behind an impressive array of businesses from Richmond Hill, Queens, to his native land, will be remembered at memorial services that begin Friday.

Jaikaran died Sunday in his Westmoorings, Trinidad, home. He was 64.

Memorial services for Jaikaran in the United States start on Friday afternoon with a public viewing at the La Monica Funeral Home in Livingston, New Jersey, followed by a private funeral on Saturday at New Jersey's Rosedale Cemetery and Crematory, according to the New York Daily News.

A second public memorial service will be held on Sunday afternoon in Queens at the Maracas nightclub on Jamaica Avenue for clubgoers and others to pay their respects, said Jaikaran's daughter, Anita.

"He was a humble man who had a passion for helping people while seeking no rewards for his kindness," said Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar, who attended a memorial service in Trinidad and Tobago for the late businessman Tuesday and is due to also attend tributes to Jaikaran in the U.S., the Daily News said.

Jaikaran, who migrated to the United States from Trinidad and Tobago in the 1970s and later became a U.S. citizen, opened a Garment District business selling fur coats before making his entrance in the entertainment field with his nightclubs.

For decades, Jaikaran operated the popular Calypso City, Rum Jungle and Maracas nightclub complexes in Queens, while promoting the Caribbean's East Indian-inspired chutney and soca music through his JMC Entertainment firm and many other ventures, the Daily News said.

In Trinidad and Tobago, Jaikaran established a pair media outlets -WIN Radio 101.1FM (formerly Masala Radio) and the WINTV television station — and also served as vice chairman of Caribbean Airlines until 2013.

Johnny Kemp of 'Just Got Paid' fame dies

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) _ Bahamian R&B singer Johnny Kemp, who is best known for the hit song "Just Got Paid," has died in Jamaica. He was 55.

Jamaica police said Friday that Kemp was found floating at a beach in Montego Bay on Thursday morning. It had not yet been determined how he died.

Police said Kemp arrived in Jamaica on a cruise ship but added that they did not have further details.

Reach Media Inc. said Kemp had been scheduled to be on a Caribbean cruise this week, but the U.S.-based parent company of the "Tom Joyner Morning Show" said it did not have further details.

Kemp was nominated in 1989 for a Grammy Award for "Just Got Paid" in a category that included Bobby Brown and Luther Vandross. The song was a No. 1 hit on the U.S. Billboard R&B chart.

Kemp appeared on a 2007 Keith Sweat DVD called "Sweat Hotel Live" and had been performing at musical events across the U.S. in recent years.

Caribbean Court celebrates 10 years

The Caribbean Court of Justice (CCCJ) celebrated its 10th anniversary last Thursday, with only four CARICOM member states having acceded to its appellate jurisdiction.

President of the Court Sir Dennis Byron in several media interviews where the CCJ is based said he would like to see all CARICOM states, in addition to having embraced its original jurisdiction, also make the CCJ their final civil and criminal appellate court.

In September 2009 when the Londonbased Privy Council was sending signals that Caribbean nations should rely less on the British Court and embrace their own, only two had at the time acceded to the CCJ's appellate jurisdiction- Barbados and Guyana.

One British Law Lord questioned whether some Privy Council cases real-

ly needed to be heard by a panel of Britain's most senior judges.

Sir Dennis said the Court has through its judgments, has made a very positive impact.

He appealed recently for the Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) of St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Grenadines to emulate Dominica's recent example and make the CCJ their final court of appeal.

Sir Dennis hopes that Trinidad and Tobago will soon join the other Caribbean countries and make the CCJ its final court of appeal.

Former OECS Bar Association President Tapley Seaton continues to be a strong supporter of the CCJ. He described the CCJ as an evolving court that has already demonstrated a capacity for excellent judgments.

be disruption of livelihoods in low-lying coastal zones and small island developing states and other small islands, due to storm surges, coastal flooding, and sea-level rise.

"For persons living in the tropics it will just be too hot, every building will have to be air-conditioned – schools, churches, clinics, prisons," she said.

"There would also be failure of infrastructure such as roads, seaports, airports and buildings; plants and animals, including humans, would die during periods of extreme heat; there will be a breakdown of agricultural systems resulting in food prices increasing; there will be insufficient access to drinking and irrigation water and reduced agricultural productivity; and tropical species of fish will move to cooler waters resulting in a reduction of fishing in the Caribbean."

Tourism is the mainstay of the economy of Antigua and Barbuda and is the leading sector in terms of providing employment and creating foreign exchange. But the outlook for reefs in this tourism-dependent nation is also grim.

At around 1.5 degrees C, about 89 percent of coral reefs are projected to experience severe bleaching; at two degrees C, up to 100 percent of coral reefs are projected to experience severe bleaching by the 2050s; and around four degrees C, virtually all coral reefs would be subjected to severe bleaching events annually.

Signing the Copenhagen Accord in 2009, world leaders agreed to keep temperature increases resulting from heat-trapping emissions to less than two degrees C, a target aimed at limiting dangerously disruptive climate impacts.

A policy target informed by science, two degrees C is the formally codified benchmark, the line in the sand by which nations have agreed to measure collective success in providing generations to come with a secure climate future.

The IPCC said global average surface temperatures have risen about 0.85 degrees C since 1900 and cumulative emissions of CO2 largely determine global mean surface warming by the late 21st century and beyond. It finds that having a greater than 66 percent probability of keeping warming caused by CO2 emissions alone to below two degrees C requires limiting total further emissions to between 370-540 gigatonnes of carbon (GtC).

At current rates of CO2 emissions (about 9.5 GtC per year), the world will hurtle past the two C carbon budget in less than 50 years. And this conservatively assumes that emissions rates don't continue on their current upward trajectory of 3 percent per year.

In a bid to increase awareness of climate change here, the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) is spearheading a two-day workshop Apr. 14-15 under its Rallying the Region to Action on Climate Change (RRACC) project, an initiative funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID).

An OECS official said participants are being updated on the current awareness levels on the island and will brainstorm to determine ways to increase the nation's consciousness. Participants are drawn from the sectors most affected by climate change.

Actually, probably, you already have. You're one of the most observant people you know, never missing a thing, always noticing. You make a great witness because you see everything. And in the new book "One Night" by Eric Jerome Dickey, you see two people about to make a mistake.

It was pouring rain that evening and it perfectly matched her mood.

Once she'd been a comedian and an actress. She'd been someone's mother but now she was dressed in a pilfered shirt from an electronics store, driving a stolen truck and trying to con somebody into paying for a box of rocks because the rent was

man putting gas in his expensive car looked like an easy mark.

He had a bruise over his eve, which was fine: she had a bruised heart. She offered the box for sale and he handed her the money, knowing full well that it was a con. He also handed her a business card with an Orange County number before he drove off. She knew he wouldn't get far; L.A. traffic was backed up, police were everywhere, sirens blasting. Her boyfriend wasn't answering his phone, so she dialed the man's number to explain that conning really wasn't what she was all about.

He was skeptical. She challenged him to meet her at a diner.

Dinner was strained but pleasant, a get-to-know-you where very little information was exchanged. She didn't want to be alone; he didn't want to go home to a wife he no longer loved, so they went to a movie before he kissed her in a way she'd never been kissed. She was the first to


due and she didn't have it. The mention a hotel. He paid for the luxury room.

She thought she'd been in love before: with the father of her daughter, certainly with her daughter but she'd never been with a man who did to her what the man from Orange County did. He made her moan and call out things that she didn't know she had a voice for calling.

It was only supposed to be a one-night stand. But she wasn't being entirely truthful with him. And he definitely wasn't telling her everything, either...

Let's start here: "One Night" is steamy. Like, burn-your-mind, hott-with-two-Ts steamy.

But it's not just that. Author Eric Jerome Dickey ekes this novel out slowly, minute-byminute, like a slow dance between two people who aren't forthcoming with facts to one another – or to readers. That can be snail-like, but it's also fascinating: we know there's something we're not quite seeing, but we're too distracted by the tryst to figure it out - that is, until

Dickey repeatedly interrupts the action with smartly-timed shocks that reset everything.

There are a few moments of silliness in this book but overall, I couldn't let it go and if you

can handle the lengthy bedroom scenes, you won't be able to, either. For readers who crave a boatload of spice with their novels, "One Night" is worth two looks.

Environmental factors can trigger asthma

hough many are likely as much as possible. familiar enough with asthma to recognize it's a respiratory disease that affects millions of people across the globe, few may know the role that environmental triggers play with regard to asthma.

Indoor allergens and irritants often trigger asthma attacks, but fortunately, such triggers can be controlled by people who take a proactive approach to reducing their exposure to environmental triggers like those listed below.

Secondhand smoke

The smoke from a cigarette, cigar or pipe contains more than 4,000 substances, some of which are cancerous compounds. In addition to triggering asthma attacks in those already diagnosed with the condition, secondhand smoke is a risk factor for asthma among preschoolaged youngsters.

Thanks to their diminutive statures, kids breathe more rapidly than adults, and that means they take in more secondhand smoke when around smokers than older kids or adults. But secondhand smoke is harmful to adults as well, triggering asthma attacks and increasing their risk for a variety of health conditions. Parents should not let anyone smoke near their children, and adults should avoid smokers

Dust mites

Tiny, invisible bugs that feed on dead skin, dust mites can be found in mattresses, pillows, carpets, stuffed toys, and clothes, among other things. Individuals who are allergic to dust mites might be susceptible to asthma if they come in contact with dust mites' body parts and droppings, and such exposure can trigger asthma in youngsters who have not previously exhibited symptoms.

Bedding should be washed in hot water at least once per week and dried completely, and dust proof covers should be used on pillows and mattresses. Vacuum carpets and furniture once per week. Also, parents can reduce their kids' risk of asthma attacks by only buying stuffed toys that can be washed in hot water.

Molds

Molds live on plant and animal matter and can be found nearly anywhere that moisture is present. Inhaling mold spores, which continually float through indoor and outdoor air. can trigger an asthma attack. Mold problems in a home should be addressed immediately. Mold on hard surfaces can be removed with soap and water, and the surfaces should be allowed to dry completely before being put to use again.

Six common myths about pet allergies

ccording to The Humane Society, 62 percent of American households have at least one pet. Yet, an estimated 31 million Americans are allergic to animals, including up to 30 percent of those who have asthma. For these people, congestion, sneezing, runny nose, and other allergic symptoms occur whenever they are exposed to household pets.

Below are six common misconceptions about pet allergies. By knowing the truth about these myths, you can take action to live comfortably with the pets in your life.

Myth #1: It's only pet hair that triggers allergies.

Not true. Pet hair can trigger allergies, because it contains saliva or other pet proteins. Allergic reactions to pets are actually caused by pet proteins contained in pet dander, and also saliva and urine. Overactive immune systems attack these otherwise harmless substances

Animals with more fur are more likely to carry other allergens such as pet dander and dust, according to the American Lung Association. If you have a pet, not only do you need to handle pet hair carefully, you also need to clean household dust carefully, as it may contain pet dander that can trigger allergic reactions.

Myth #2: Continuous exposure to animals will eventually desensitize you to them.

Not only is this not true, but in some cases, the opposite is true. If you have a confirmed allergy to animals, it usually will not get better through increasing exposure — it may rvrn get worse, according to the Australasian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy.

However, studies have confirmed that early childhood exposure to cats, dogs, and other animals may lower the risk of developing allergic reactions later in life. One study of 8,000 children found that children continuously exposed to cats from the time they were 1 year old were 67 percent less likely than others to develop allergic asthma.

Myth #3: If you just get the right breed, you won't have allergy problems.

Not true. All cat and dog breeds produce dander. However, some breeds are believed to be better for allergy sufferers than others. Typically, the best breeds are those that shed the least fur. Also, smaller dogs produce less saliva than do bigger dogs. The American Kennel Club recommends breeds that produce the least dander for allergy sufferers, including poodles, terriers, schnauzers, and Bichon Frises.

Myth #4: Small animals are not a problem for allergies.

Wrong. Hamsters, guinea pigs, birds, and other warmblooded mammals can also trigger asthma and allergies in people with allergies to animal dander, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Birds are also a problem for many allergy sufferers, as birds release dander into the air bys cleaning their feathers, flapping their wings, and flying. If you are allergic to animals but still want a pet, try animals without dander like a fish, turtle, or other reptile.

Myth #5: Outside the home, you shouldn't have pet allergy problems.

Not necessarily. Pet allergens easily stick to clothing and other fabrics and are carried to other locations. Animal dander can be found in many public places such as the workplace, classrooms, and hospitals, according to the Lung Association. Those with severe allergies may also want to avoid the homes of family and friends who have the type of pet that irritates their allergies.

Myth #6: An air purifier will help.

It depends. Only a high-performance air purifier can help. Small, low-quality air cleaners make little or no difference at all.

opment in the Caribbean ... is expensive, often unreliable and carbon-intensive energy," Obama said.

"This region has some of the highest energy costs in the world. Caribbean countries are particularly vulnerable to the effects of climate change and we have to act now," he said

The U.S. president said there would be a new fund to encourage clean energy.

"We are announcing partnerships, a new fund to mobilize private investment in clean projects," Obama said.

St. Lucia

The St. Lucia government has announced changes to the operations at the Castries Health Center following an upsurge in murders near the facility in the past few days.

The Ministry of Health, Wellness, Human Services and Gender Relations

said the changes are "to facilitate the revision of security arrangements to ensure the safety of clients and staff of the Castries Health Center."

Police said while they had no motive for the latest killing, they believe it may be gang-related. So far four people have been detained in connection with the other murders committed recently.

While there were no murders in January, February and March, there were five killings so far for the month of April.

Suriname

A Jamaican teenager has been detained in Suriname on suspicion of being a would-be militant hoping to join Islamic extremists.

In a statement, Suriname's police said the 16-year-old was denied entry after arriving at the country's airport recently on a Saturday flight. The teen, whose identity was not disclose, was apparently trying to fly to the Netherlands and then to Turkey.

An intelligence agency said Suriname police did not inform them that the Jamai-

can apparently intended to slip into Syria to join Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) militants.



After being questioned and obtaining back-

ground information on the youth, he was flown back to Jamaica.

Jamaica's national security ministry did not respond to questions from the media.

Last month, the ministry insisted there was "no evidence" of Jamaicans joining the Islamic State group or other terrorist groups a few days after a U.S. general identified the island as one of the Caribbean nations that have produced roughly 100 would-be militants with Islamic extremists in Syria.

Vincentian releases CD on new airport



Prez Carter returns to Guyana to inspire peace

If the answer to a television game show Jeopardy question is "former United States President Jimmy Carter" the question must be "who is the busiest president no longer living in the White House."

Since leaving office in 1981, the 39th president of the USA has busied himself traveling the globe to improve the quality of life of citizens living on virtually every continent.

No sooner than he left the White House, Carter mobilized to build houses for the poor. After launching Habitat for Humanity, he and teams of volunteers constructed homes they gave to citizens that might otherwise never own property.

Perhaps he was motivated by the fact he is the only president to have ever lived in public housing, he identified with the plight of not owning a dwelling and relying on government subsidies in order to survive.

One year after serving in the highest capacity of leadership in America, President Carter and his wife Rosalyn founded the Atlanta-based Carter Center which has helped to improve the quality of life for people in



more than 70 countries.

Committed to advancing human rights and alleviating unnecessary human suffering, they have relentlessly exemplified the motto of the Carter Center — "Waging Peace. Fighting Disease. Building Hope."

This week the 90-year-old former president — from 1977 to 1981 — will lead an observer mission to monitor the May 11 regional and national elections in Guyana.

They will be joined by a larger delegation of election observers next month and for the fourth time the 2002 Nobel Peace Prize winner will lead the monitoring team.

"I look forward to leading our delegation to observe Guyana's elections on May 11," the former president said.

The election is regarded as a contest between the ruling People's Progressive Party/

BQ

Civic (PPP/C) which is seeking to extend its more than two decades hold on power and the coalition alliance comprising the main opposition, a Partnership for National Unity (APNU) and the small Alliance for Change (AFC).

"The Carter Center has a long history in Guyana and great respect for the Guyanese people. These will be the fourth elections we have observed there since 1992, and we trust they will be peaceful and inspire hope for the future."

It was Oct. 5, 1992 when Carter's Council of Freely Elected Heads of Government observed presidential elections in Guyana.

Two years later, on Sept. 28, 1994 the Carter Center opened an office in Georgetown, Guyana to support the country's efforts for economic development, electoral reform, and preservation of the environment.

After that, the former Plains, Georgia, peanut farmer met with Guyana President Cheddi Jagan on April 23, 1996 to discuss implementation of Guyana's comprehensive longterm development strategy.

Earlier that year he headed delegations to Nicaragua, the Dominican Republic and prior to that Guatemala, Liberia, Ethiopia, Guinea, Sudan, China, Chile, Burkino Faso, Nigeria, Mozambique, Uganda and numerous countries in the sub-Saharan regions of Africa.

Perhaps, best remembered for returning the Panama Canal Zone to Panama, the one-term Democratic president has been actively involved in eradicating diseases throughout Africa.

American, R&B pop princess Fantasia lived up to her top billing at the sold out "Voices In Concert" held recently at the Kings Theatre in Brooklyn, New York.




could better interact with fans. This simple act was a winning move that may have earned her a permanent place in the hearts of music lovers in the house.

Shades of Romeo, Juliet abound in inner-city saga

Twins Jackie (Keke Palmer) and Sergio Taylor (Eric D. Hill, Jr.) already had it tough enough growing up in the ghetto before the untimely demise of their dad a few years ago. But then their mother (Macy Gray) stopped functioning and started hitting the bottle.

That's when their big brother, June (Cory Hardrict), became the family breadwinner, and it's been a struggle for him to keep a roof over their heads ever since. So, he started dealing drugs hoping that his becoming an outlaw

would at least enable his siblings to keep their noses clean and continue pursuing their dreams. After all, Sergio is one of the top high school basketball players in the nation, while Jackie is an aspiring singer in need of a big break.

By comparison, the living is easy for kids like Chris Collins (Quincy Brown) from "The Hilltop," the upscale enclave located just across the proverbial tracks. He's a classmate of Jackie's at Overbrook High, where students from his 'hood don't mix with those from "The Bottom," especially in the wake of the gang warfare that recently claimed the life of one of his cousins.

Chris has a crush on Jackie, and she likes him, too. Under normal circumstances theirs would be a match made in heaven, since his father is a famous record producer capable of launching a promising talent's musical career.

However, complications arise reminiscent of Romeo and Juliet when the competing clans suggest that the pair separate. Will the star-crossed lovers follow their hearts or capitulate to the pressure from friends and relatives?

Written and directed by Jamal Hill (Autumn), "Brotherly Love" is a gritty, inner-city saga of Shakespearean proportions shot on location in West Philadelphia. Provided you have a strong stomach for Ebonics laced with lots of cursing and the N-word, you'll likely find this super-realistic adventure quite compelling.

As far as performances are concerned. Keke Palmer is terrific in the lead role as Jackie. She also belts out a couple of tunes on the soundtrack, including a mesmerizing, closing credits rendition of the Harold Melvin R&B classic, "Wake Up Everybody." And the rest of the cast, especially Cory Hardrict, Romeo Miller, Macy Gray, Eric D. Hill, Jr., Quincy Brown and Faizon Love, does a great job creating the requisite edgy atmosphere that imbues the production with a very authentic feel for the duration.

Romeo, Romeo, wherefore art though Romeo? I be hanging with my homeys, mama!



He remained to the end after facing 149 balls in just over three and a half hours. He hit 15 fours, mainly fluent strokes through the off-side.

His partnership with Ramdin ended when Anderson induced a catch to first slip to end the captain's resolute 57 that occupied three hours. With that wicket, Anderson surpassed Ian Botham's England record of 383 in tests, having drawn level earlier in his 100th test when he had overnight batsman Marlon Samuels caught at gully for 23 in his 11th over.

The milestone was celebrated by the bowler and the England team on the field and his family in the stands. Botham, commentating for television, was at the stadium to see his mark surpassed. Roach then stayed with Holder for

18.2 overs before England conceded with two balls remaining.

Holder passed his hundred with two fours in off-spinner James Tredwell's 40th over, seven balls before the end when Roach was unbeaten 15 after keeping out 55 balls in an hour and a half at the crease.

Resuming the day at 98-2, the West Indies had no realistic chance of achieving the winning target of 438.

New West Indies head coach Phil Simmons said that the first hour would be critical to the outcome. In that time, England removed both overnight batsmen, Devon Smith and Samuels, adding left-hander Shivnarine Chanderpaul, the 40-year-old veteran of 162

tests. 10 minutes before lunch.

The wicket of Chanderpaul, leg before wicket to second-string off-spinner Joe Root, opened the way to the West Indies lower order and strengthened England's position.

England appeared to have the match wrapped up when first innings centurymaker Blackwood charged down the pitch, swung wildly at fast bowler Chris Jordan and edged a catch to wicketkeeper Jos Buttler.

But only one wicket fell for the rest of the day as England's hopes of an early lead in the three-match series were dashed.

The second test starts in St. George's, Grenada, on Tuesday.




