Garifuna: Honorary Vincentians

says, if his New Democratic Party (NDP) wins the next general elections in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, his administration would honor the Garifuna people by making them "Honorary Citizens of St. Vincent and the Grenadines."

"I want to bring them closer to St. Opposition Leader Arnhim Eustace Vincent and the Grenadines," said Eustace, leader of the country's main opposition party, in making the announcement Sunday night at a town hall meeting at the Friends of Crown Heights Educational Center in Brooklyn, flanked by Continued on Page 6

CANADA DESERTS CARICOM

Trade dispute goes to WTO

Saving it is fed up of the protracted nature of the talks, the Canadian government has not only walked away from free trade negotiation discussions with the Caribbean trading group but has also asked the World Trade Organization (WTO) to allow it to revert to an old mechanism governing trade between the two because the future for a deal looks guite bleak.

Talks on a deal that would not only allow for two-way free trade but also one that is more compliant with today's global trading rules started way back in 2009 amid much optimism that an agreement between traditional friends would have been

achieved in a short space of time.

As the months wore on, it became clear that the differences in approaches and how each other saw the world would become an impediment that eventually resulted in a complete breakdown of negotiations after six vears.

Recently. Canada gave the 15-nation grouping the clearest sign yet that it has abandoned sessions at the round table by formally writing to the WTO, asking it to extend the life of CaribCan, the decades-old agreement that had governed trade between the two.

The problem with CaribCan, however, is that it is a one-way deal in

Marching against senseless violence

Marches and rallies are no longer a concept of the past.

In recent months, we have seen marches stop traffic, take over bridges and more across the states and in New York City.

On Saturday May 30, the fifth annual "Not In My Hood" march took over the streets of East Flatbush to spread the message of non-violence. Held by the East Flatbush Village in conjunction with Council Member Jumaane D. Williams, the energy of the crowd demanded an end to the violence in their communities.

"We do not want to live in a society where the only way we feel safe is if there's five or six officers on every block," Williams said. "We want to make sure we are funding programs that are dealing with structural issues that have been going on in these communities for generations."

Leading the march, which started on Tilden and Ralph Avenues, was former gang member Shanduke McPhatter who energized the crowd with messages to end gun violence.

"Violence will not be accepted as a norm in our community," McPhatter blasted on a microphone. "It doesn't matter who pulls the trigger. Violence is violence and it's a public health crisis. Guns Down! Lives Up!"

McPhatter is the founder and executive director of Gangstas Making Astronomical Community Chances Inc., a nonprofit he founded while incarcerated in 2008 and established after his release the following year. The mission of the organization is to reach out to youth following his former path.

Over 200 youth participated in the march that culminated at Flatbush Gardens on Foster, Brooklyn and New York avenues for a health fair.

Antigua

The husband of former Miss Dominica Nadira Lando, has been declared a "persona non gratia" in Antigua and is now facing deportation from the island, according to media reports.

Media reports say businessman, Morrad Ghonim, is wanted for an alleged "capital crime" in the U.S.

It has been reported in the Antigua media that he was declared a persona non gratia by Cabinet after his home was searched recently by the police and

they found out that he had no work permit for the island, his last extension was in 2012 and he had remained in the country longer



than the period granted by immigration.

Ghonim was handed over to the Immigration Department.

The Antigua Guardian, is reporting Ghonim is wanted for a capital crime in the U.S. and that U.S. Marshals are already in Antigua to escort him to the mainland.

Ghonim, the owner of "Ayoushe Beauty Supplies Limited" in Antigua, married Lando, who is Miss Dominica 2012, in 2014.

Barbados

Barbados has ratified the global Arms Trade Treaty aimed at preventing the illicit trade in conventional arms.

Barbados officially became a state party after Permanent Representative of Barbados to the United Nations, Keith Marshall, deposited the country's instrument of ratifica-

tion of the Arms Trade Treaty at the United Nations Office of Legal Affairs.



The Arms Trade

Treaty is the first global treaty, which establishes legally binding standards to regulate the international trade in conventional arms. It also aims to prevent and eradicate the illicit trade in conventional arms and prevent their diversion.

The Treaty entered into force on Dec. 24, 2014, following its ratification by

"Given the devastating impacts of illicit small arms and light weapons and their ammunition in the Caribbean region, Barbados joined fellow CARICOM countries in negotiating for a robust treaty, which would include regulation of the trade in small arms, light weapons, their ammunition, parts and components," the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade said in a statement. A total of 11 of the 14 states of CARICOM are now party to the treaty.

Dominica

The Petrocaribe plant in Dominica is to be renamed in honor of late Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez this month, exactly a decade after he signed the fuel deal with Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit.

The announcement was made by Minister of Lands, Housing Settlements and Water Resource Management Reginal Austrie, who has responsibility for Petrocaribe, at the recent celebrations for the 10th anniversary of the Petrocaribe Energy Corporation Agreement

under which Venezuela sells gasoline, diesel and liquid petroleum gas to Dominica at preferential rates.



renaming of the plant from Waitikubuli Storage Facility to the Hugo Chavez Storage Facility would be done "in recognition of the effort and hard work that President Chavez has put in the program".

The Petrocaribe agreement, conceived by Chavez who died on March 5, 2013, at the age of 58, benefits several

other countries in the Caribbean and Latin America.

Guyana

A mining pit collapsed in the Guyanese jungle recently, presumably burying 10 gold miners, who are believed to be dead.

So far six bodies were located in the mine.

"The men are confirmed dead," said Ajay Baksh, a consultant with the local Guyana



gold and diamond miners association.

The accident at the private mine was believed to have been caused by heavy rainfall that saturated the soil surrounding the pit.

Rupert Roopnarine, Guyana's official in charge of the natural resourc-

Member of Parliament for North Leeward, Roland "Patel" Matthews, and former Communications and Works Minister in a former NDP administration, Glenford Stewart.

"There are those who say it can't be done, but it will be done," added the former prime minister to loud applause, with some Garifuna in the audience. "I have navsayers who say 'it'll be a drain on the economy.' There's a saying, 'where ignorance is bliss, it's folly to be wise.'

"I must say, they'll (Garifuna) make the most marvelous contribution to St. Vincent and the Grenadines," continued the NDP president. "There's no way they can pull us down; they'll pull us up.

"Tonight, I say to the Garifuna, 'welcome home'," Eustace declared. "We've stated our position tonight, and we'll stand by it.'

During his week-long visit to New York, Eustace said he had met with a number of Garifuna, descendants of Black Caribs from St. Vincent and the Grenadines and "got an understanding of what took place" (leading up to and during their exile by the British on Balliceaux - a rocky island in the St. Vincent and the Grenadines, and Roatan, an island off Honduras).

"They are, therefore, ours," the Opposition Leader said. "It is time that we take steps to remedy this situation. We cannot allow, in good conscience, the situation to continue."

In recent years, Eustace said he had heard "more and more of the Garifuna and their commitment to St. Vincent and the Grenadines, which they call Yuremein

"It became more and more clear that we cannot ignore this matter," he said. "We must address it."

He noted that, about 218 years ago, the British "mistreated and exiled a lot of people we now call Garifuna," stating that they were first sent to Balliceaux "where many of them died" and then to exile in Roatan.

favor of the Caribbean, as it largely allows products from the region to enter Canadian markets duty free or with preferential treatment. A new agreement would have amended this but from all indications, this might not be the case anytime soon unless something dramatic happens from the level of the Canadian prime minister's

The missive to the WTO asks it to extent CaribCan until 2023, the second time an extension would have been sought. The first was to cover the period when negotiations had been active.

In the meanwhile, however, the Canadians have interestingly not indicated any plans to restart talks. Both sides have been arguing that they have granted the maximum level of tax and other concessions to each other, leaving little wiggle room for a restart of talks.

Regional leaders welcomed the move to the WTO by Canada, noting that it "will ensure that existing CARI-COM trade with Canada will continue without disruption."

From the very beginning, the negotiations have had its problems with the smaller Eastern Caribbean states being lukewarm to the sessions, arguing that they had little reason to open their economies to powerful producers

and suppliers out of Canada while having little in return to export.

Additionally, duty free trade means they would lose much needed import duties, noting the fact that the U.S. and Europe have already destroyed the lifeline banana export industry and have collapsed other revenue earners such as online gambling.

For the region, CaribCan has been kind to economies. Since the 90s, CARICOM has dominated trade with Canada, enjoying a favorable trade balance thanks largely to bulk gold exports from Guyana and Suriname as well as petroleum products from Trinidad.

This is the second time Canada has asked the world body to approve a waiver and extension of CaribCan. The first had come in the midst of negotiations for a free trade deal.

Officials at regional headquarters in Guyana say that the move by Canada means it has given up on trade negotiations with the region but trade ministers will try to nudge Canadian negotiators back to the table. Leaders are scheduled to meet in Barbados in early July and will discuss the way forward if there is one.

While some officials cling on to hope, the latest announcement from CARICOM speaks of "Canada's recent decision to suspend trade negotiations with the community," noting that various levels of meeting in the Caribbean "will give member states the opportunity to decide on the way forward."

Geoffrey Holder, the quintessential multi-tasker

In a New York Times review in 2009 of the documentary film "Carmen & Geoffrey," about multifaceted Geoffrey Holder and his wife, the dancer/choreographer Carmen de Lavallade, Stephen Holden wrote that given Holder's awesome accumulation of talents, along with de Lavallade's impressive resume, you wonder why they were not more widely recognized as "national treasures."

Holden mentioned the marginalization of the world of dance, as well as race, as perhaps contributing to this. And he asked: "What does it say about our culture that Mr. Holder is probably best known as the voice of the 'uncola' commercial for 7 Up?" To the Times' credit, not giving Geoffrey Holder his props wasn't about to be a charge laid at its door. Its full-bodied obituary when Holder died last Oct. 5 was altogether reflective of the "national treasure" esteem in which he was held.

It would be difficult, if not downright impossible to find anyone in arts and entertainment as gifted in as many disciplines as was Holder: dancer, choreographer, costume designer, set designer, director, painter, sculptor, actor, singer, composer. He achieved his most notable acclaim when he won Tony Awards for directing and costume design for "The Wiz" in 1975. He also earned a Tony nomination in 1978 for costume design in "Timbuktu!" Early in his U.S. residency, he had been the recipient of a Guggenheim fellowship in painting. But except for these and other acknowledgments of his creative strengths that would have been brought to the public's attention, Holder largely did not gain the kind

St. Vincent's first chief minister

Ebenezer Theodore Joshua (May 23, 1908 – March 14, 1991) was a Vincentian politician and the first chief minister of St. Vincent from 1956 to 1967.

Joshua, who was born in Kingstown, the Vincentian capital, went to work, as a young man, in Trinidad and Tobago in the 1920s.

There, he became involved, with Buzz Butler, in trade unionism. From 1938 until 1950, Joshua was an official of the Oilfields Workers' Trade Union.

According to Caribbean Companion, Joshua, in 1950, was futile in being elected to the Trinidad and Tobago Legislature.

A year later, however, he returned to his native land, where he entered politics and was elected to the country's Assembly. In 1952, Joshua founded the People's Political Party (PPP), whose goal was to garner political independence from the United Kingdom, and improve working conditions and wages.

With St. Vincent and the Grenadines obtaining increased autonomy, Joshua became the country's first chief minister in 1956.

His PPP gained continued success in subsequent elections up to 1967, when the party lost to Robert Milton Cato's St. Vincent Labor Party (SVLP).

Joshua remained in Parliament until 1979, when the PPP lost all parliamentary seats. Five years later, the party dissolved.

Dr. Kenneth John, a historian, columnist and lawyer, wrote in THE VIN-CENTIAN on March 13, 1992 that Joshua, affectionately called "Papa Joshua," was "a born leader, a noble patriot and committed Vincentian," who went to the Great Beyond on Thursday, March 14, 1991.

John noted that Joshua died on the anniversary of the death of Carib Paramount Chief Joseph Chatoyer.

"Joshua was a colossus that bestrode the political center, and one who contributed positively to the shaping and molding of modern St .Vincent and the Grenadines," he said, stating that Joshua saw active political service from 1951 to 1979 — from Adult Suffrage to Independence.

John said Joshua's political career can be "neatly divided up" into three separate decades: 1951-1960; 1961-1970; and 1971-1980.

"His finest hour, undoubtedly, fell in Continued on Page 31

After that, she quickly honed her skills as a reporter working for Gannett News Service where she was tasked with covering a wide variety of stories.

That foray ended when she as a publicist. was tagged in 1985 for an editor's position at the popular teen Black Beat Magazine.

In her position, the editor-inchief was responsible for delivering the latest entertainment news breaking with young stars.

Akin to the TMZ of this era, Black Beat and Noel-Schure was able to keep teenagers informed on virtually every aspect of their adolescence. Often her reports also introduced new talent signed to major record label deals.

It was there that she bonded with and nurtured relationships with the likes of LL Cool J, Will Smith, Whitney Houston, New Kids on the Block, Boyz II Men, New Edition, Tupac Shakur, Patti LaBelle and other Black entertainment talents.

Her insightful production displays, unique style of writing, diversity in reporting and alluring personality did not go unnoticed and eight years later she made a major leap from objective journalism to personally declaring approval of specific products

Named director of media at Columbia Records, Noel-Schure was handed her very first project.

"I remember taking a deep breath and ...praying," Noel-Schure said.

Her first task was to execute a publicity plan for her boss' -Tommy Mottola — new bride. Mariah Carev.

That the singer was also the label's young and promising signee from Long Island posed more than a few challenges for the former journalist.

Needless to say, that successful first endeavor quickly led to campaigns for Jessica Simpson, Tony Rebel, Diana King, Super Cat, Tremaine Hawkins, John Legend, Kenny Lattimore, Destinys Child, Will Smith, Wyclef Jean, Bow Wow and Beyonce.

By 1997 she was upped to the position of senior director and not long after, vice president working for an even expanded roster which also included Johnny Mathis, Nancy Wilson,

Prince and long-time signees to the label.



Father of **West Indies Federation**

Grenadian Theophilus Albert Marryshow was known throughout the Caribbean as the "Father of West Indies Federation."

He was regarded as an ardent advocate of closer association of the islands of the region all his life, leading campaigns in all West Indian colonies with that object in view, according to CARI-COM (Caribbean Community) Perspec-

Born Nov. 7, 1887, Marryshow received primary education at the St. George's Methodist School in Grenada.

He started life as an office boy at the age of 16 in the then "Federalist and Grenada People," and was its sub-editor and book reviewer at 19.

In 1915, he co-founded the "West Indian," which he later owned outright and edited until 1924, according to CARICOM Perspective.

It said Marryshow was a prime mover around 1905 in spreading branches of Literary and Debating Societies in Grenada. The movement was later adopted in other islands.

After years of preparation in municipal life, CARICOM Perspective said Marryshow took a leading part in politics and in West Indian affairs generally, with emphasis on the right of all West Indian people to elect their own chosen representatives in inter-colonial legislatures.

As a result of his persuasion, CARI-COM Perspective said the then secretary of state for the colonies appointed a commission, which was sent to the West Indies to enquire into constitutional reform.

The report of the commission was favorable; and, as a result, Grenada and the rest of the Windward Islands. the Leeward Islands and Trinidad and Tobago gained a "first measure of rep-

Jamaican Patriot scores touchdown in Super-Bowl

Without apologies, Jamaicans are known to toot their own horn.

And on Super-Bowl Sunday earlier this year, Jamaicans on the island huddled in clubs, sports bars and private homes to whistle, cheer and applaud throughout the National Football League's showdown between the Seattle Seahawks and the New England Patriots.

For most, all bets were on a winning performance from Patriots' player number 23, Patrick Christopher

When the 27-year-old, 5 feet 11 inches, 210-pound athlete scored a tackle, it was like sprinter Usain Bolt had won another Olympic gold. And when victory recorded a final score of 28-24 for the Patriots, television viewers there added another historic entry naming the nation's first Super-Bowl ring bearer.

Supportive of the Kingston, Jamaica-born athlete they cheered each tackle that may have enabled a touchdown to their 28-24 victory against the Seattle contenders.

Chung is one of a handful of Jamaicans to play in the much-revered Super Bowl game. He was tagged a Caribbean achiever by Caribbean Airlines' web portal caribbean-beat.com as one of only four from the region to excel to Super-Bowl status.

With Puerto Rico's Victor Cruz (New York Giants), Haiti's Pierre Garcon (Washington Redskins) and Barbados' Ramon Harewood (Baltimore Ravens) Chung joined the short list of Caribbean players to make the NFL.

"It's something I've worked for my whole life," Chung told the Portland tribune. "This is awesome."

According to reports: "Chung was drafted by the New England Patriots in the second round (34th overall) of the 2009 NFL Draft. He played four seasons with the Patriots, signed a free agency contract with the Philadelphia Eagles in 2013, and subsequently returned to New England for his sixth season in the NFL.'


His road to the spotlight began when his family moved to the United States.

He was 10 years old.

His mother, Sophia George, acclaimed for her reggae hit "Girlie Girlie" and father Ronald Chung settled in Miami,

After a brief stint in Miami, the family relocated to Rancho Cucamonga, a suburb southeast of Los Angeles in California. Chung did not play organized football until he was a 13-year-old freshman at Rancho Cucamonga High.

Reportedly a fast-learner, by age 16 he was enrolled at the University of Oregon and playing the game with skill and promise.

Initially, his mother feared he would be hurt playing the rugged sport and even tried to dissuade him from playing the game.

She encouraged her athletic son to try-out for the swim team.

Chung holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in Oregon history, having started 51 straight games during his collegiate career.

But his record reveals he is "a twotime first-team All-Pac-10 selection."

It has been widely reported that "Chung finished his Oregon Ducks college career with 384 tackles; 9 interceptions, 19 tackles for loss, 26 passes defended, and 4 sacks."

"He caused and recovered a fumble, batted down seven passes and returned his only interception 31 yards for a touchdown," Wikipedia states.

Early into his career he played safety for the Philadelphia Eagles.

About his heritage Chung said: "I'm not just a Jamaican. I'm from the West and being kind to people.

The Chinese-Jamaican "Growing up in Jamaica teaches you about diversity.'

"It teaches you race doesn't matter. It's how you live life and how you treat

He credits his Jamaican roots with shaping him as a hard-working, relentless NFL player.

"I realize I come from a small place," he said, "but so many West Indians have shaped the US. I'm proud of that, and I know I can make a difference on the field. Jamaicans are fast and quick, and that helps us in football."

Chung is proud of his Jamaican her-

He sports tattoos that remind him of his roots. "Kingston and August, my birthday, are on my right bicep, and Jamaica is on my left bicep."

"I never forget my Jamaican roots." For Jamaicans, nationality mattered



Congress rewards corporations, punishes the American people

Congress keeps feeding big corporations huge tax cuts they don't deserve, even as it starves average Americans of the services and investments they need. The latest example of this indefensible policy is a \$182 billion corporate tax giveaway the U.S. House of Representatives recently approved. It comes after Congress passed a budget earlier this month that slashes \$5 trillion from benefits and services that help working families get by and get ahead.

This huge tax cut would make permanent a break corporations get for research and development (R&D) costs. The R&D tax credit has been around for years, but only on a "temporary" basis that's been repeatedly extended.

While government should support useful private-sector research, this tax break has often been abused: corporations can claim the tax credit for questionable "innovations" including new food flavors, textures and packaging or use it on research they likely would have done anyway, according to Citizens for Tax Justice. As the Congressional Research Service explains, companies can claim the tax credit for such dubious research because the guidelines for what qualifies as research are "vague and incomplete."

Even granting that the R&D tax credit is worthwhile, it should be paid for by closing

other corporate tax loopholes. While conservatives demand that any new spending benefiting the American people be paid for by cutting spending, they hypocritically apply different rules to corporate tax breaks: every dollar handed out to corporations in tax cuts is added to the deficit.

The R&D tax credit is not the only huge tax giveaway to corporations and the rich passed by the House this year. Two other costly tax breaks have been approved without being paid for ("Section 179 expensing" and the "State and Local Sales Tax Deduction Act"). Then there's the \$269 billion cost of repealing the estate tax, which the House voted to do last month, benefiting the wealthiest 0.2 percent of estates owned by multi-millionaires and billionaires. The total cost of all four of these special-interest tax breaks is \$570 billion over 10 years.

Meanwhile, the American people are paying the price for fiscal austerity. The budget blueprint just passed by Congress would slash health care for seniors and the poor, ignore crumbling infrastructure, and make it harder for already struggling families to buy groceries and afford college.

The cuts are stupid as well as cruel. The IRS won't have enough money to catch tax cheats, even though every dollar invested in enforcement

Enforcing Belize rights to its territorial waters

According to international law many countries claim their 12 miles of territorial waters and enforce their jurisdiction over it. There is also a 20-mile and the Exclusive Economic Zone for drilling and other rights that Belize can control in their southern border with Guatemala and Honduras. Then come international waters. Belize would like to do the same but the Guatemalan claim is standing in the way. Guatemala is claiming the whole or part of our country for years now and there is no end in sight. If Guatemala was to drop their claim, then they will be land locked and have no access to the Atlantic Ocean for their commercial and military vessels. Guatemalan vessels have always and continue to traffic through Belizean waters without any action taken by the Belizean government. Is there a secret agreement between Great Britain, Belize and Guatemala to allow their vessels to traffic through our territorial waters? If there is then it should be made public to we the Belizean citizens. The failure of the Belize government to stop these vessels to continue travelling through Belize waters gives me the impression that there is an agreement. Or, Belize may be allowing Guatemala to use their waters as a Good Neighbor Policy to avoid increasing tensions over the Guatemalan claim. These are the

type of discussions that our leaders from the political parties should be discussing to educate us about the Belize-Guatemala dispute.

The withholding of information from the Belizean citizens will make us not trust our government in dealing with this Guatemalan claim. I am not against signing a conditional agreement with Guatemala, to allow their commercial vessels the right to go back and forth through Belizean waters to the Atlantic Ocean as a Good Neighbor Policy but military vessels no. Unless, their commercial vessels are being threatened while trying to move back and forth in Belize's territorial waters with their goods.

In fact, indirectly it seems as if this has been the position of the British and all the Belizean governments PUP and UDP since we obtained our independence on Sept. 21, 1981. Do you all remember The Maritime Areas Act? The Belize government was forced to withdraw it because of pressure

coming from Belizean citizens. I just hope and pray that some provisions of this proposed agreement were not signed later in bilateral agreements without our consent and approval. They cannot say that they have changed their positions on this issue because they have not publicly stated their position to we the Belizean citizens. Belizean fishermen are at risk if they travel in this area and encounter Guatemalan patrol boats. Offshore drilling is another issue that is being discussed constantly by the Belizean government that will be affected as well.

If Guatemala does not have a 12-mile territorial waters in the region because they are landlocked, then the issue of having "markers" to identify our territorial waters is insignificant. For anyone to raise the issue that there is need for "markers," make me suspect that there was and is an agreement between Britain, Belize and Guatemala for the use of our Territorial Waters. The use of military vessels to traffic back and forth through the territorial waters of a nation state without their consent and approval, is in violation of international law and can be deemed a hostile act leading to a conflict and war. I call on my people in Belize to start asking these types of questions in this debate.


they got rebuffed by the great Mandela. But this was and is Warner. There is no bridge

reaps six dollars in revenue. Ironically, even as profitable corporations have their often dubious research subsidized by taxpayers, the federal budget blueprint cuts medical and other scientific research that makes our society healthier and our economy stronger.

All of us have given up something to reduce the deficit—except corporations. Federal spending is expected to be cut by about \$3.6 trillion over the next 10 years due to budget deals enacted since 2010. Total revenue increases will be about \$836 billion, resulting in a very unbalanced ratio of \$4 in spending cuts for every \$1 raised from taxes on the rich. The wealthy could do a lot more, but corporations haven't contributed a dime.

Giveaways like the R&D tax credit just add to the unfairness of a system riddled with loopholes. Over a recent five-year period, many familiar corporate giants such as General Electric, Verizon and Boeing paid zero federal income tax.

The choices being made by this Congress are very troubling. While it's willing to give out a \$182 billion R&D tax break with no questions asked, it's been scrambling to figure out how to close a 10-year \$168 billion shortfall in the Highway Trust Fund because it's not

willing to raise taxes. This imperils basic investments for roads, bridges and mass

Even as Congress makes corporate tax breaks permanent, it refuses to do the same to help working families. The Republican budget failed to renew improvements to the Earned Income Tax Credit and Child Tax Credit that expire in 2017, which provide crucial income support to working families. As a result, more than 13 million families (including nearly 25 million children) would lose an average of \$1,073 per family.

Voting to give corporations a huge tax cut, without closing loopholes to pay for it, is the height of hypocrisy. It represents an egregious double standard by conservatives: they increase the deficit by providing hundreds of billions in tax breaks to corporations while they slash \$5 trillion in spending that primarily benefits working Americans in order to reduce the deficit.

No further research is needed: that destructive pattern must be reversed. Congress can begin by rejecting the R&D tax credit.

Jamaica

Jamaicans are being put on alert following an outbreak of another mosquitoborne illness, the Zika virus.

Following meetings at the World health Assembly, which took place recently in Geneva, Switzerland and a warning issued by the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) regarding an outbreak of the Zika virus in Brazil and its potential to spread to other countries, the

Ministry of Health is urging citizens to take the necessary precautions to ride their surroundings of any place mosquitoes breed.



The Zika virus, also known as ZIKV, is transmitted by the bite of an infected Aedes aegypti mosquito, the same mosquito that transmits chickungunya and dengue.

Brazil has confirmed its first case in May.

Acting Chief Medical Officer Dr. Marion Bullock-Du Casse said "this virus has never been detected in Jamaica before and we are taking all the precautions."

St. Lucia

The St. Lucia government said that it was become aware of an Associated Press (AP) report dated May 5, 2015 that 38 Cubans caught trying to sail to the United States had tourist visas to the Caribbean island nation of St. Lucia when they were intercepted at sea by Coast Guard.

An investigation has been launched into the matter to determine how the

alleged visas appeared in the passports of the Cuban nationals, since Cuban nationals do not require tourist visas to visit St. Lucia.



The government of St. Lucia said it is in touch with the Cuban and American authorities on this matter. The government said it has become aware of the AP story and an investigation has been launched into the matter.

St. Vincent



Washington removes Cuba from US terrorism list

HAVANA (AP) _ The Obama administration formally removed Cuba from the U.S. terrorism blacklist Friday, a decision hailed in Cuba as the healing of a decades-old wound and an important step toward normalizing relations between the Cold War foes.

Secretary of State John Kerry signed off on rescinding Cuba's "state sponsor of terrorism" designation exactly 45 days after the Obama administration informed Congress of its intent to do so on April 14. Lawmakers had that amount of time to weigh in and try to block the move, but did not do so.

"The 45-day congressional pre-notification period has expired, and the secretary of state has made the final decision to rescind Cuba's designation as a state sponsor of terrorism, effective today, May 29, 2015," the State Department said in a statement.

significant concerns and disagreements with a wide range of Cuba's policies and actions, these fall outside the criteria relevant to the rescission of a state sponsor of terrorism designation," the statement said.

The step comes as officials from the two countries continue to hash out details for restoring full diplomatic relations, including opening embassies in Washington and Havana and returning ambassadors to the two countries for the first time since the U.S. severed diplomatic relations with the island in January 1961. The removal of Cuba from the terrorism list had been a key Cuban demand.

The Cold War-era designation was levied mainly for Cuba's support of leftist guerrillas around the world and isolated the communist island from much of the world financial system because banks fear repercussions from doing business with designated countries. Even Cuba's Interests Section

States, we isolated the United States from the Cuban people and, increasingly, the rest of the world."

Bronx through the eyes of a Jamaican artist

What does the borough really have to offer beside the Yankee stadium and a ridiculously long commute? For residents of the borough, these are common misconceptions tossed by members from the surrounding boroughs creating a negative stigma that the "Boogie Down Bronx" simply has nothing to offer.

Jamaican descendant and Bronx native Dondre Green is taking on the task to change the world's perception of his beloved borough through BronxNarratives.com — a new online publication showcasing the borough through art.

'Bronx Narratives is an online publication that provides a fresh view on our community. The Bronx is a place that is often associated with negative stereotypes, so we've created a platform for our readers to help understand the lifestyle of the Bronx. Created and run by Bronx native photographer, Dondre Green and fellow Bronxites. We invite you to experience our borough through our eyes," the new website reads.



Founder Dondre Green is changing the conversation around his beloved borough of the Bronx.

Green's love for the Bronx was not always constant. Steadily hearing that it is not a destination for the arts or that it lacks attractions like museums and other amenities found in other boroughs like Brooklyn or Manhattan, Green — a photographer — also ventured out in search of things to do. "Hearing the stigma and I think any Bronx person after hearing all these bad things about your borough it can influence how you see your own borough," he said. "You start thinking 'well, maybe there isn't much to do here.' I feel like a lot of people gravitate towards the popular opinion and for me when I was a lot younger I would think the same, 'there isn't much to do here. Brooklyn has all these nice collectives and the musuem is very nice.'

Unwilling to settle with the stereotypes, Green decided to explore the perceptions of the Bronx through the eves of residents and non-residents in creation of a short film. Compiling answers ranging in celebration of all the Bronx has to offer to a minority group stating how "there really isn't much to do here," the 11-minute short film was debuted in December 2014. With this project, Green met Decota Letman who now operates as the lead editor on the site. Through their chance meeting outside of their borough, this provided even more of a reason for Green to undertake this project as he felt there

The exhibit attracted other artists and designers to participate in the project leading to the creation of the website. Artists such as Kayla Smith, a poet and founder of Bronx Collective is also aiming to dismantle the negative stigma about the Bronx through art, created a poem which cur-

groups and both men accused of masterminding the crime took shelter in Florida, where one, Luis Posada Carriles, currently lives.

"I think this could be a positive act that adds to hope and understanding and can help the negotiations between Cuba and the United States," said director Juan Carlos Cremata, who lost his father in the 1976 bombing.

"It's a list we never should have been on," said Ileana Alfonso, who also lost her father in the attack.

Top U.S. Republicans criticized the move, with House Speaker John Boehner of Ohio saying the Obama administration had "handed the Castro regime a significant political win in return for nothing."

"The communist dictatorship has offered no assurances it will address its long record of repression and human rights at home," Boehner said in a statement.

Former Florida Gov. Jeb Bush said the decision was a mistake and called it "further evidence that President Obama seems more interested in capit-

ulating to our adversaries than in confronting them."

House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, a California Democrat, praised the move, saying it is a "critical step forward in creating new opportunities for American businesses and entrepreneurs, and in strengthening family ties."

U.S. and Cuban officials have said the two sides are close to resolving the final issues needed for restoring diplomatic

relations, but the most recent round of talks ended May 22 with no announcement of an agreement.

White House press secretary Josh Earnest said Friday that "there continue to be issues that need to be worked out." He said important progress had been made, but would not give a time frame for an announcement. "That's obviously among the next milestones," he said.

resentative government in the right to popular election on a quota of members to their legislative Councils," CARICOM Perspective said.

Through his ceaseless agitation in press and on platform, there was steady constitutional development in the West Indies, it said.

Marryshow was the first deputy president of the Grenada Legislative Council, 1951 to 1954, and member of the Executive Council from 1942 to 1954.

He sat as elected member for the capital town of St. George's since the inauguration of the new Legislative Council with elected members in 1925.

"His unbroken period of service, 30 years in the same seat, was said to constitute a parliamentary record for the Dominions and Empire," CARICOM Perspective said.

It said Marryshow, who died on Oct. 6, 1958, was referred to in influential quarters in Britain as "The Elder Statesman of the West Indies.'

In the "Marryshow of Grenada: An Introduction" Jill Sheppard wrote that Marryshow was one of the key figures in the

political history of Grenada and the West Indies Federation.

Marryshow was registered as Theophilos Maricheau, son of P.I. Maricheau, a small planter, and Eugenia de Souze.

His mother died in 1890, and the boy was brought up by his godmother, Christine, housekeeper and later wife of Antonio Franco, a Portuguese merchant, Sheppard said.

After a brief apprenticeship to a carpenter, in 1903, Franco obtained a job for the young Marcheau in the printing establishment of W.G. Donovan, initially to deliver newspapers.

Sheppard said Donovan produced "notably radical newspapers, advocating representative government and a Federation of Britain's West Indian colonies."

Marryshow (he adopted an Anglicized spelling of his last name) demonstrated literary abilities that were soon recognized by Donovan who became his mentor, Sheppard said.

"Teddy' Marryshow was soon involved in the whole range of journalistic activity, as well as becoming an active participant in local politics and in the Grenada Literary and Debating Society," she said.

Comptroller steps in to protect immigrant workers

For immigrant workers, it can seem like an uphill battle to secure representation genuinely invested in their interests and concerns.

On May 18, New York City Comptroller Scott M. Stringer showed his support for immigrant workers by presenting checks for work completed on various New York City public schools and the Queens Muse-

This effort provided nearly 33 workers with the majority of Guyanese descent, by North American Iron Works Inc. (NAIW).

"Thirty-three workers, many of them immigrants, were robbed and exploited. Today, we will pay these men the wages they deserve for their work and in doing so, we are

sending a message to unscrupulous contractors: we will take action against those who cheat their workers," Stringer said in a press release.

Steve, who asked to exclude his last name, worked for the NAIW around 12 years. During his time, it was typical for him to be cheated out of wages and it was not until he finally got into the union that he realized the conspiracy by NAIW's president Abdul Kari.

"I used to work for them and \$1 million in unpaid wages to I asked them a couple of times to help me get in the union and he never did. He get his family into the union, why can't he help us too? We're all Guyanese together. He said the union is no good so I get into the union on my own. When I get into the union he was very upset with me," Steve said.



the first period when he lifted the level of political awareness of the man-inthe-street, raising his social consciousness to new heights," he said.

When confronted by stark choices, John said Joshua's the second phase was characterized by his "reneging on his early promise, seeking out the lines of weakest resistance and setting himself on a course leading to decline.

The political scientist said the second phase "accelerated in the third period, as the integrity and fortunes of the party took a turn for the worst and the leadership finally lost all credibility."

John noted that Joshua was part of George Charles' Eighth Army and the United Workers and Rate-Payers Union that captured all eight elected seats in the first elections under Adult Suf-

"The cutting edge of the group," Joshua had won the North Windward Constituency "after Cato had backed away from the 8th Army for whatever reason," John said.

During the 1950's, he said Joshua was "in his element."

"He was the tribune of the people, championing their every cause, real and imagined," John said. "Living the simplest of lives, he rode his bicycle around the town and, with wife Ivy, walked from village to village preaching the Gospel of anti-colonial politics and spreading the word of militant trade unionism.

"In thunder, lightning or rain, Joshua held his regular Wednesday night meetings in Kingstown; and, on other nights, where ever two or three were gathered in his name, hammering home his message by constant repetitiveness fired from a voice box of gravel." he added.

"For their part, the masses enjoyed every bit of it, as, on their behalf, Joshua challenged the might of the plantocracy, stood up to colonial authorities and defiantly twisted the tail of the establishment," John continued.

As always, he said Joshua remained in constant touch with the grassroots. "taking the pulse of the people, and keeping his ear close to the ground."

"One afternoon, he would be at Mount Bentick (in North Central Windward) pleading the cause of the sugar workers; next 'fore-day' morning, he would be at Richmond (in North Leeward) 'opening' an arrowroot field," John said.

From 1957-61, he said Joshua behaved "responsibly," concentrating on infrastructural development, of which feeder-roads, school- building and low income housing programs, together with the Arnos Vale Airport, "bear eloquent testimony." The Arnos Vale Airport was renamed the E.T. Joshua Airport.

John said Joshua's "timely interven- and so withered and died."

tion into the banana industry turned that crop into green gold."

After 1960, he said Joshua denounced socialism, as his government became "more business-oriented, self-centered, even corrupt."

John said Joshua helped to create "an unsavory political climate" on the approach to statehood, "which ultimately led to the dismal defeat of his government in 1967."

After statehood in 1969, the PPP's fortunes dipped more sharply, as Joshua struggled for survival in "political quicksand," John said.

"He began to see a communist under every bed," he said. "To him, the Labor Party had gone red, and [James F.] Mitchell [the former prime minister] had turned Marxist."

John said Joshua cast aspersions on "The Black Power Boys" in reference to the burgeoning movement of black consciousness in the early 1970s.

Joshua finally embarked on a course which, despite its short-term gains, "could only lead ultimately to his downfall," John

First, Joshua joined with Mitchell in 1972, "purely as a tactic to buy time and keep the Labor Party at bay.'

Then, in 1974, John said Joshua caused "consternation amongst his top brass, and panic in his rank-and-file when, without consulting them, he abandoned Mitchell and jettisoned some of his most loyal and devoted followers, to enter into a unholy alliance with the Labor Party - which, for 25 years, he had represented as the very embodiment of evil."

Three years later, Joshua, who ranked foremost in the vanguard of the movement for self-determination, broke with Labor on the pretext that the country was not ready for independence, John noted.

"It was probably about this time, too, that he shook off the 'Shakers' [Baptists] and joined the Church of Latter Day Saints," he said.

In the ensuing 1979 elections, held three months after the grant of independence, the PPP failed to win a seat, with Joshua himself suffering "ignominious defeat" in the former PPP bastion of South Central Windward, John said.

"Six months later, drained and battleweary, a punch drunken Joshua threw in his political towel," he said.

John said Joshua's story represents the "classic case of the populist leader whose magic was lost, whose spell had been broken, and whose hold over his people, therefore, loosened as his charisma waned, his native gift of grace worn thin,"

"Correspondingly, it is the story of a once towering figure who could not march with the times, out-lived his usefulness, and eventually lost his direction," he added. "Finally, it is the story of the leader who became cut off from his roots

find the transition to a nursing home somewhat difficult. Seniors tend to see a move to a nursing home as a step toward surrendering their independence, and this can be a difficult hurdle for seniors and their loved ones to overcome.

Adding to the difficulty is the fact that many move into nursing homes because their physical or mental status requires the help of a professional nursing staff, leaving family when aging relatives protest the move. But there are ways to ease a loved one's transition into a nursing home.

Keep a positive attitude. The stress of moving an aging relative into a nursing home can be significant for all parties involved. But focusing on the positives of nursing homes, such as around-the-clock care and daily activities, can help aging relatives look at nursing homes

any older men and women members with little to no recourse in a new light. In addition, family members who familiarize themselves with nursing homes will begin to see they are often great places for aging men and women to socialize with others their age while receiving the care and attention they need. Plan trips with your loved one. Just because an aging relative lives in a nursing home does not mean he can no longer travel. If a relative is healthy enough to travel, include him on family trips and outings. This includes more routine events like weekly Sunday dinners, kids' sporting events, and other extracurricular activities. The more involved your aging relative is in the daily life of your family, the more likely he is to see the advantages of living in a

Getting seniors the care they deserve

How a 76-year-old woman changed Medicare for millions of patients

Sometimes all you need is one determined woman to change the lives of millions of seniors. Glenda Jimmo, a 76-year-old, blind, wheelchair-bound woman did just that; she improved Medicare's rehab policy for millions of infirmed seniors. In 2011, Jimmo filed a class action suit against Medicare after being denied rehabilitation therapy. She was informed that she was no longer eligible for physical and occupational therapy because she was not making progress with the therapy she was receiving. In rehab language, she had "plateaued."

Jimmo could not understand this reasoning. She had her right leg amputated due to complications from diabetes and was confined to a wheelchair. She required intense rehab therapy to improve her physical abilities. She knew her condition would deteriorate if she did not continue.

Thousands of rehab patients face similar situations everyday. Since Medicare's creation in 1965, it has stuck to an improvement standard policy that states once a person stops showing progress in physical, occupational, or speech therapy, treatment will stop. This policy is particularly harmful for chronically ill patients who require continuous therapy in order to maintain an optimum level of health. When their therapies are discontinued, their condition deteriorates.

Jimmo, a resident of Bristol, Vt., decided to challenge this decision and filed a class action suit against Medicare. This landmark case, Jimmo v. Sebelius, changed the lives of millions of chronically ill seniors throughout the United States. On Jan. 23, 2013, the U.S. District Court for the District of Vermont decided in Jimmo's favor. The Court ruled that nowhere in Medicare's policy manual is there a clause requiring a person to show improvement in order to continue receiving skilled treatments through Medicare. In fact, the court determined that Medicare must cover therapy services that helps a person maintain his ability to function. As a consequence of this settlement, patients with chronic conditions can now continue to receive physical and occupational treatment

in and out of a rehab facility.

This court's decision does not mean that a patient can continue receiving physical, occupational, or speech therapy indefinitely. A person who receives rehab in a nursing home can get up to 100 days of Medicare financed therapy. The first 20 days are paid in total. After that Medicare pays 80 percent of additional therapy starting on day 21 and continuing up to 100 days. The remaining 20 percent is covered by a secondary health plan.

Upon leaving a rehab facility a person can continue to receive out-patient rehabilitation, however, it is not as intense as the treatments received in a rehab facility. In-house therapy includes two 30- to 45-minutes sessions a day. A person receiving rehab at home gets the same amount of time per visit but usually gets therapy approximately three days a week.

In 2015, Medicare covers up to \$1,940 for outpatient physical and speech therapy combined, and another \$1,940 for occupational therapy. If a patient is approaching this limit and a doctor or therapist feels more therapy is re-

quired, he can tell Medicare that it's medically necessary to continue. With proper documentation from the provider, Medicare may cover additional therapy. If Medicare denies the claim, the decision can be appealed.

All the information on how much, how often, and under what conditions a person can receive rehabilitation therapy paid by Medicare is publicly available by referencing The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services' Policy Manual on Medicare. It is important that every person be aware of his rights under Medicare. It takes people like Jimmo to challenge unsubstantiated policies like Medicare's "improvement standard" and demand their rights. And it is up to consumers like you to insure you get the care you deserve.



Cognitive ability better among bilingual



Seniors who have been bilingual since childhood have cognitive advantages over those who only speak one language.

and have spoken two or more languages since their youth may have cognitive advantages over adults who have only spoken one language their entire lives.

A new study headed by Brian Gold, a neuroscientist at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine, which was published in the journal Neuroscience, found that bilingualism leads to heightened mental skills. In the study, participants were divided into three groups: bilingual seniors, monolingual seniors, and younger adults. Each group was instructed to sort colors and shapes in a series of simple cognitive exercises. The researchers used a brain imaging technique to compare how well the subjects switched between mental tasks. The results indicated there were different patterns of brain activity among the groups when the tasks were being completed.

The patterns showed that bilingual seniors were able to

eniors who are bilingual switch between tasks and activate their brains in a manner closer to the younger subjects. They didn't have to expend much effort, and they out-performed their peers who were monolingual. The researchers surmised the bilingual seniors were using their brains more efficiently.

> Other studies have shown bilingualism pays even more dividends, including improved cognitive function in those suffering from Alzheimer's disease. A study titled "Lifelong Bilingualism Maintains Neural Efficiency for Cognitive Control in Aging," found that even though seniors who spoke dual languages had more brain atrophy due to Alzheimer's, they were still able to function better than individuals with lower levels of atrophy who spoke one language. Researchers believe that being bilingual strengthens the brain's capacity for doing work, even if it is working at a deficit.

> The jury is still out as to whether learning a second

language or moving to a foreign country as an adult can provide the same level of cognitive advantage as being bilingual from childhood. However, learning a new language can help keep the brain sharp. Many experts now believe learning a second language is no harder when you're getting on in years than when you're a child.

There are different methods to learning a new language:

- · Foreign language tapes
- ·Grammar and vocabulary books from a child's foreign language class
 - A foreign language tutor
 - Vocabulary index cards
- ·Moving to a foreign country and learning through immersion

Bilingual seniors have distinct cognitive advantages over other people who are monolingual. Urging children to learn a new language or learning as an adult can have profound effects on mental abilities.

It is the first calendar event in the world to be officially proclaimed and dedicated to celebrating reggae music.

The global fete for a genre birth in Jamaica is annually held on July 1 and by its definition describes the music of reggae as — "the infectious syncopated sound from the little rock that has turned pirate into governors, quietly shaping western civilization while giving rise to a major social revelation and lifestyle movement."

This year, IRD will salute the Jamaican sound system movement and recognize the fundamental and pioneering role the operators played in advancing the growth of Jamaica's music and lifestyle culture.

Reggae lovers on virtually every continent are already committed to the July 1 date. Their worldwide participation via, radio, the internet and other medium will add to the annual internationalization of the festive celebration.

Local events at varying des-

tinations have focused on concerts, conferences, film screenings, photo and literary exhibitions relevant to the genre. This year's program already has committed cities and on radio stations in New York, Miami and Fort Lauderdale, Florida, Honolulu, Hawaii, London, England and Mumbai, India.

Although countries in Africa, South America, Europe, Asia and throughout the Caribbean have annually participated in the festivities, Jamaica has been the focal point of major activities helming fashion shows, concerts, international reggae poster contests, digital art displays, tree planting ceremonies, symposia, and a myriad of reggae-related activities geared to include generations, nationalities and genders.

Andrea Davis, whose Jamaica Arts Holdings (JAH) created and sustained the unifying cal-

endar date through two decades said her principal motive was to mobilize "celebration of the best of Jamaica's creativity and unite, inspire and uplift the reggae community through special programming complimenting a network of official lifestyle party events."

According to the Kingston-based trailblazer, this year a conference will engage audiences for a discussion on how to create bridges between capital and culture in Jamaica. It will be presented in two sessions: "Securing Jamaica's Competitive Advantage in the Global Market," and "Jamaica's Sound System Movement and Creative Economy."

Its aim will be to focus on how Jamaica can benefit from the vast international reggae market which seems to be the biggest benefactors of profits from the genre.

According to Davis, although

major accomplishments have been recorded throughout the years, "reggae is still not being given a priority in terms of investment and promotion here."

"How do we secure a share of what's out there?" Davis asked. "That's what we will be focusing on."

"As the home of reggae, when you look out there, there are so many versions of our-

selves. For example, right now there are more sound systems outside of Jamaica. There are secure brand deals and making inroads into the market which Jamaicans are not doing or not in a position to see. We need to become more proactive in maintaining our competitive advantage or we won't be in that position for long," Davis added.


Broke college student moonlights as stripper

Fox) is holding down a couple of jobs to make ends meet while praying that her sons stay on the straight and narrow path until they can make it out of the ghetto. Though grown, both boys still live at home; yet neither is helping their struggling single-mom much, financially.

At least the younger one, Michael (Robert Ri'chard), is close to graduating from col-

lege and works part-time at brother Chris (DeRay Davis) is a diner as a short order chef. But he hasn't even been able to save enough from that minimum wage position to have his car fixed, so he has to travel around Los Angeles via bicycle. By comparison, his 30-year-old

a trash-talking hustler who's more interested in hanging out on the streets than in finding gainful employment.

The siblings' fortunes change the day they decide to patronize the local gentlemen's club. For, while Michael is relieving himself in the men's room, he's approached by the owner (Michael Jai White) about stripping there on Ladies' Night.

And his girlfriend gets the surprise of her life the evening she shows up at the club to take in a show with her BFFs in tow.

of recognition, outside of the arts community, commensurate with the enormous contribution he made on several fronts. There was no doubt, however, as to his place as one of the leaders of the pack among Caribbean émigrés in the U.S. who staked a claim in the arts and proceeded to excel.

Born and raised in Port of Spain, Trinidad, Holder was greatly influenced by his older brother Boscoe, who had himself developed an interest in the arts and had formed a dance troupe of which Geoffrey, at age seven, had become a member. Assuming leadership of the Holder Dance Company after Boscoe left for England, Geoffrey proved himself eminently suited to the challenge. While performing in St. Thomas in 1952, the troupe was fortuitously seen by and impressed the noted American choreographer Agnes de Mille. Two years later, de Mille arranged for Holder and his troupe to come to New York - a move that resulted in Holder getting his first taste of Broadway, playing a character and doing choreography for the musical "House of Flowers," which opened in December 1954. Holder's influence was the impetus for another Broadway first associated with the Caribbean-themed "House of Flowers," when a steel band was added to the music featured in the

Holder taught for a while at the famed Katherine Dunham Dance School and he also landed a gig for two years as a principal dancer at the Metropolitan Opera Ballet. Other Broadway gigs, besides "The Wiz" and "Timbuktu!" included "Waiting for Godot" and the Josephine Baker musical revue. He also appeared in the Gershwin musical "Rosalie" onstage in Central Park, Perhaps the most significant affirmation of Holder's work in dance was that pieces choreographed by him have become permanent repertory selections for two distinguished companies, the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater and the Dance Theater of Harlem.

Holder was tapped for a number of films, including the James Bond thriller "Live and Let Die," "Doctor Dolittle," "Annie," "Everything You Always Wanted To Know About Sex," "All Night Long," "Krakatoa, East of Java," "Swashbuckler" and "Boomerang." In addition, his paintings always lent further validation to Holder's prodigious creative output. Apart from commercial success, he had the honor of his paintings being given auspicious showings by, among others, the Guggenheim Museum in New York and Washington's Corcoran Gallery. The quintessential multi-tasker co-wrote and illustrated a book on Caribbean folklore. And in the 1970s he also wrote a Caribbean cookbook.

Cicely Tyson's insistence on quality roles in her career

Cicely L. Tyson's parents, both of them immigrants from the island of Nevis, were apparently so deeply religious that their daughter's desiring to be involved in movies and such was the kind of pursuit deemed forbidden in the household. When, as a working young woman, Tyson decided to give up her secretarial job and go into acting full-time, she and her mother reportedly became estranged for some time. In truth, perhaps condemning Tyson's choice of profession was a rush to judgment. Whether or not engendered by the environment in which she was reared, Tyson would establish in the industry a reputation for refusing any roles offered her that did not pass the high bar she set for qualitative material.

Raised in Harlem, Tyson's first taste of being somewhat in the spotlight came after she was selected to be a fashion model, a part-time engagement she undertook while holding down her nine to five office gig. When she gave up her regular employment to concentrate on an acting career, Tyson did so even while being committed to maintaining her own standards for roles she would accept. Many of her career highlights attest to the kind of premium-grade material on which she set her sights from quite early. She won two Emmy Awards for her title role in the epic television presentation "The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman" in 1974, for Best Dramatic Performance in a TV special and Actress of the Year. For her memorable performance in the film "Sounder" in 1972, she earned a Best Actress in a Leading Role Academy Award nomination. She received a Golden Globe nomination as well for this portraval. And she won a Tony Award in 2013 as Best Actress in a play for her Broadway turn in "The Trip To

over the years in films, on television and in the theater, Tyson garnered many other honors. Although she is herself reported to have commented about having to sometimes endure intervals of "two or three years" between jobs, the roles she was prepared to accept came along often enough to have given her a successful, much respected acting career, more so as far as work of which she could be proud.

Among the films were "A Man Called

Adam," "The Heart Is a Lonely Hunter," "The River Niger," "Fried Green Tomatoes" and "The Comedians." On television, besides dozens of appearances in episodes of various network series, Tyson's credits in special programming include "Roots," "A Woman Called Moses," "The Marva Collins Story," "King" and "The Rosa Parks Story." Stage credits, in addition to her Tony Award-winning performance in "The Trip To Bountiful."

Kirani James wins 400 meters

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) Kirani James won the 400 meters Saturday in the Prefontaine Classic, pulling away from a strong field at Hayward Field.

James, the 2012 Olympic champion from Grenada, and American rival LeShawn Merritt ran side by side on the final curve before James turned it on, finishing in a world-best 43.95 seconds, two-hundredths of a second faster than the time he and Merritt ran at the meet this year.

James won that race as well and

holds a 9-5 edge against Merritt.

"It's something that you always have to take seriously. You can't take any athlete for granted," James said. "There are a lot of talented athletes, a lot of guys capable of doing great things, so you always have to stay on top of your game and make sure that you try to do all the right things to be successful."

Merritt, the 2008 400 Olympic champion, was bothered by a knee injury in February and March that limited his training.

"We're kind of doing the training a little backwards," Merritt said. "I have to run myself into shape. But the beauty of it is I have the bye so I don't have to peak for nationals. Just train and get ready for Beijing. I've been running races, learning every race, and I'll put it together."

American Justin Gatlin showed that he's not done at age 32. He won the 200 in 19.68, matching his lifetime best to break the Hayward Field record. It was the fastest time in the

world this year.

"I'm very proud of that, to be able to come out here and run with these young guys," Gatlin said. "I think age is nothing but a number, and I just want to come out and show the fans that it doesn't matter what race you're in you've got to give it your all."

Tyson Gay won the 100 in 9.88, ahead of fellow American Michael Rodgers

Gay, whose doping case led to the 2012 U.S. men's 400 relay team being stripped of its Olympic silver medals, accepted a one-year ban in 2014.

He has a goal of making the U.S. team for the world championships later this year. The USA championships will be held at Hayward in June.

"I want to make the team, man," Gay said. "A lot of people don't know, I haven't competed in the world championships since 2009. That's been a very long time, and people don't realize it because I've been around the sport for so long.

"So to make the team would be a huge blessing for me because I haven't been in that environment for so long, it would be great for me to get back in that position."

France's Renaud Lavillenie, the pole vault world record-holder, had the best mark ever in the United States at 19 feet, 10 1/4.

Avanleh Souleiman of Djibouti won the Bowerman Mile in 3:51.10, edging American Matthew Centrowitz (3:51.20) and Kenyan Asbel Kiprop (3:51.25).

Three-time 3,000 steeplechase world

champion Ezekiel Kemboi of Kenya won for the second time at Hayward Field in 8:01.71, just ahead of countryman Jairus Kipchoge Birech (8:01.83).

Allyson Felix showed her depth, moving up in distance to win the women's 400 in 50.05. Fellow American and fourtime Olympic champion Sanya Richards-Ross was second in 50.29.

Felix expects to run the 400 at the USA meet at Hayward next month. She also has four Olympic titles, including the 200 in 2012.

"I focused on the 200 for so long," she said. "Just wanted to explore the 400 a little bit and see where I can go."

Jamaica's Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce won the women's 100 in 10.81, the same time as runner-up Murielle Ahoure of Ivory Coast.

fraud, money laundering and bribery, FIFA President Sepp Blatter resigned

Recently-appointed U.S. Attorney General Loretta Lynch, who led the Justice Department's investigation, said the indicted FIFA officials "corrupted the business of worldwide soccer to serve their interests and to enrich themselves."

Blatter, who last week Friday was re-elected for a fifth consecutive fouryear term, was widely blamed for the corruption, which the U.S. Justice Department said went on for the past 20 years, 17 of those years under Blatter's reign. His resignation was welcomed by the soccer world as it paves the way for true reform, which most believed could not be achieved with Blatter. A new president will be elected by March 2016.

UEFA (Union of European Football Association) President Michel Platini, a likely candidate for president, said, "It was a difficult decision, a brave decision, and the right decision." Englishman David Gill, a member of FIFA's Executive Committee, said that he will consider returning to the post now that Blatter is no longer at

Among the allegations were bribes accepted by FIFA officials for awarding the 2018 World Cup to Russia and the 2022 tournament to Qatar, which the Swiss government is investigating. The Qatar situation is a prime example of how these decisions are detrimental to the game: a Qatar World Cup means that the traditional June tournament now must be played in January, the coolest month there, and in the midst of local league schedules throughout the world.

Also, temperature soar to around 120 degrees Fahrenheit by noon in Qatar, presenting dangerous conditions for players; these extremely hot temperatures would facilitate numerous water stoppages and slow the game down considerably, taking away from the free flow and rhythm of play; soccer fans now will have to vacation at an unusual time in January.
