# SEAWEED INHIBITS **TOURISM**

## Caribbean hotels faced with visitors cancelling bookings

The umbrella University of the West Indies and some high officials in the region this week scrambled together academics and tourism industry experts to discuss the seaweed invasion of beaches across the region, to what extent it has disrupted activities in the summer peak season and how best to tackle this unwanted scourge of nature.

The Cave Hill, Barbados Campus was the venue for the parley and officials even suggested that more than \$100M will be required in grant aid or concession financing for affected nations and hotels to deal with the invasion of the Sargasum seaweed that has washed up on some of the most pristine beaches in the region in recent months.

The problem with the invasion and its threat to the lifeline tourism industry is that it has arrived during the summer holiday season when experts at places such as the Caribbean Development Bank and the CARICOM Secretariat are away from the desks on annual

The region's top brass is also distracted by the latest edition

of the Caribbean Festival of Creative Arts (Carifesta) which Haiti is hosting this week until the end of the month.

So people like UWI Vice-Chancellor Sir Hilary Beckles took it upon themselves to raise the alarm bells about the effects of the invasion and sought to raise public awareness about a problem that appears not to have attracted attention at the very highest echelons of Caribbean life.

"This is the greatest single threat to the Caribbean. This is a threat not only to our tourism product. It is also a threat to our regional economy," Beckles argued." But since this is an international crisis I am therefore calling upon the international community to see this as such. Here in is an endemic and systemic threat to the resilience and development of these nations and therefore we must have an international response to this."

The number of countries affected by the invasion of the dirty and smelly mass of brown vegetation washing up on beaches continues to grow with nations from Trinidad to Antigua to Puerto Rico and

# Julian Bond 'A Man of Courage': Clarke

Brooklyn Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke has described Julian Bond as "a man of courage and moral vision who insisted on his right and the right of all African Americans to participate in the politics" of America.

Julian Bond, a charismatic figure of the 1960s civil rights movement, a lightning rod of the anti-Vietnam War campaign and a lifelong champion of equal rights, notably as chairman of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (N.A.A.C.P), according to the New York Times, died on Saturday night in Fort Walton Beach, Fla. He was 75.

Among other things, Bond was a founder of the Southern Poverty Law Center.

Clarke, who represents the 9th Congressional District in Brooklyn, noted that when Bon was elected to the Georgia House of Representatives at 25 years of age, his colleagues refused to admit him because of his work as a civil rights activist.

"But he was soon vindicated by a unanimous Supreme Court decision, and became a distinguished member of the legislature, where he established the Georgia Legislative Black Caucus," Clarke told Caribbean Life.

As a founder of Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, the congresswoman said Bond was "on the front lines of protests that led to

# Kamilah Brock fights City

Approaching a precinct or hospital has just become scarier for one New Yorker.

Labeled delusional, pumped with a cocktail of drugs and discharged without explanation — the array of events seems perfectly carved out of some horror movie.

Unfortunately, there were no actors adhering to a script or Ashton Kutcher to pop out of the bushes to yell "punked" at Kamilah Brock.

Brock endured eight days in Harlem Hospital's psychiatric ward following what should've been a simple point in the right direction to reclaim her seized BMW.

"I knew I had to go to the 151st precinct but I wasn't sure how to get there," Brock explained. "I asked the locals for the closest precinct and they directed me to Service Area 6. I went in there and I told them my car was confiscated yesterday and I'm trying to find the precinct. I don't have any money, can you guys just take me there and they completely denied me."

Previously working as a banker at Citibank and Astoria Bank, the unfortunate series of events alienated Brock from corporate America. Now, the Jamaican American works for herself doing life insurance.

Prior to her visit to Harlem's Public Service Area 6, Brock's car had been confiscated by the authorities who suspected she was high on marijuana.

The bizarre experience continued with over an hour of back-and-forth as Brock attempted to be taken to where her car was. Instead of help, Brock says she was met with suspicion. "They asked me my name, my address, I gave them everything and then they asked me what kind of car I had and I told them it was a BMW and then after that it was 'how old are you? Are you sure it's your car? Are you sure it's not your parent's car?' They started badgering me and I was like 'look, I just need to get the 151st precinct can you take me there' and they wouldn't take me there," she explained.

Unwilling to leave PSA6 without knowledge of where her car was located, Brock was placed in handcuffs and led into an ambulance. The officers assured her that she would be taken to

where her car was located.

"EMS approached me and I said 'I'm going to my car in an ambulance?' and they said yeah, 'we're going to take you to your car in an ambulance.' So I said whatever so long as I get to my car I didn't care how I got there," she said.

Brock was then transported to Harlem Hospital's psychiatric ward where she grew more and more skeptical of the situation. She approached the officers and doctors to attempt in gaining some understanding of why she was at the hospital and not with her car.

At this point, the situation took an insane turn as Brock claims she was then restrained and sedated — the start of her forceful stay. "I spent eight days at Harlem Hospital in the psychiatric ward," she recalled.

While in the psychiatric ward, Brock remained on a cocktail of drugs with the belief that if she complied she would be released sooner rather than later. She also attended group therapy sessions.

Brock believes that what helped her leave the hospital was her conversations with the nurses about the entertainment side of her life.

"I think the reason why they let me go is because I started showing the

nurses that was monitoring the floor and the people my entertainment side to my life because I do music. I started showing my videos and my pictures with celebrities I know and things like that and they were like 'wait a minute.' I think that's when they finally realized they made a mistake but they never owned up to it at the end when they discharged me. They never said I'm sorry or anything," Brock said.

A year later, Brock has discovered

A year later, Brock has discovered that despite telling the truth to both the authorities and hospital staff she was diagnosed as having "grandiose ideations" of herself.

"I didn't know the reason why I was there for so long was because they thought I was having grandiose ideations of being a banker and I had grandiose ideations of owning a BMW," she said.

Now, the 32-year-old is waging a lawsuit against the City of New York. Her attorney, Michael Lamonsoff, believes there was a definite racial component that played a part in the way Brock was treated. "There's a racial component to this too. I think if she was a white woman and she said I am a banker and I own a BMW, I tweet with the president because I'm political, do you think she would be hospitalized for it," Lamonsoff said.

#### **Bahamas**

Authorities in the Bahamas recently detained 143 migrants from Haiti on a crowded sailboat at the southern edge of the island chain.

The Royal Bahamas Defense Force says a patrol boat stopped the vessel west of Ragged Island.

Among the migrants were 23 women and three children. All were taken to a military base in Nassau for further investigation. The

Bahamas usually repatriates migrants who are detained at sea.



Defense Force statement says eight Cubans were also apprehended earlier this month in a vessel off Grand Bahamas.

The force has detained about 1,000 migrants so far this year.

#### **Barbados**


Governor of the Central Bank of Barbados (CBB), Dr. Leslie Worrell, says the country's fiscal adjustment program since 2013 offers a textbook demonstration of an effective framework for managing the local economy in the face of adverse circumstances.

Addressing the recent 35th CBB annual review, Worrell said that because foreign exchange is crucial, economic policy makers check the balance of inflows and outflows every day, so that any pressure on foreign exchange may be detected immediately.

He said, in May 2013, the authorities noticed a persistent decline in foreign exchange reserves.

"We understood that total spending in the economy would have to cut, to reduce the demand for imports in line with the available for-

eign inflows.



first budget adjustment, in August 2013, proved insufficient. The reserves continued to fall, but the December measures did the trick, by bringing the fiscal deficit down from 12 percent to under seven per cent and the country's foreign reserves have since reverted to the normal pattern seen in the years prior to 2013," he said.

Worrell said Barbados also has lessons to teach the world about how to grow the foreign exchange-constrained economy that depends on foreign exchange growth.

#### **Dominica**

The Dominica government says it will soon announce a new visa system for Haitians wanting to enter the

## Bahamas detains Haitian migrants

(CARICOM) grouping, Haitians nationals require visas to enter most if not all CARICOM countries.

Immigration Minister Rayburn Blackmore said over the past six months there has been a review of the issuance of visas to Haitian nationals.

"We have reviewed the system and in due time we will be making an announcement as to the way forward," he said, while speaking on state-owned DBS radio.

"The intention is to have a sys-

tem whereby it can be more transparent. We are just waiting to have the administrative system put in place and also out intention is



to have a proper vetting system," he added.

Blackmore said under the new system Haitian nationals could apply in person for visa rather than rely on an employer.

#### Guyana

Prime Minister Moses Nagamootoo has confirmed media reports that ministers and other top level government officials will be getting bigger pay checks, saying they need to be paid "respectable salaries" to reduce the risk of them getting involved in corruption.

However, he said no 100 per cent Despite being a member of the increase had been decided on, as some

Nagamootoo sought to explain the reasons for the pending salary hikes saying there has been a reduction in the number of ministries, and also it would be used as a method of preventing ministers from putting their hands in the cookie jars,' he said.

"They need to be paid respectable salaries, same as the police ranks and other persons, so as to avoid the temptation of stealing, accepting bribes and indulging in corrupt practices,' the prime minister said.

#### Jamaica

The Bank of Jamaica (BOJ) has announced that some of its members will stop doing cash transactions with cambios as of Sept. 8, 2015.

In a release, the Central Bank said this is due to a decision by the Bank of America to stop accepting cash transactions from Jamaican banks.

According to the BOJ, it will now allow the affected cambios to purchase and surrender foreign currency bank

notes directly from its headquarters as of Aug. 17. This arrangement will end on Feb. 17, 2016.



However, cambio dealers are concerned about the implications.

President of the Cambio Association of Jamaica, Heather Ferguson, says this will affect some areas of the members' operations.

Several cambios use cash facilities to surrender to the Central Bank, so when this happens, what will occur is that the sector's ability to surrender to the Central Bank will be impeded.

She said it is too early to determine the impact the changes will have on customers.

#### St. Lucia

St. Lucia is set to become the fifth Eastern Caribbean nation to introduce a Citizenship by Investment program.

The country's attorney general has suggested a regional body be established to constantly examine these types of initiatives.



The Senate passed the Citizenship by Investment Bill recently, paving the way for St. Lucia to join Grenada, Dominica, St. Kitts and Nevis and Antigua & Barbuda in offering citizenship to the wealthy in return for substantial investment

Minister for Legal Affairs, Home Affairs and National Security, Senator Victor Phillip La Corbiniere told the Senate that the program would bring tremendous benefits to the country.

"We know that the Citizenship by Investment program has the potential to generate significant sums of money, and it is important particularly at this time in terms of the economic realities

# City Council passes Williams' pro-tenant bill

New York City Council this week passed Intro. 700, a bill sponsored by Council Member Jumaane D. Williams (D-Brooklyn), deputy leader and chair of the Council's Housing and Buildings Committee, which is part of a Tenant Protection Package that aims to address the poor business practices of unscrupulous tenant relocation specialists, or as they are more commonly known, tenant relocators.

"Our city cannot stand by while tenants are being harassed out of their homes," Williams told Caribbean Life. "There are too many unscrupulous owners of rent stabilized buildings who will do anything to have a tenant vacate their apartment, including hiring a tenant relocator to get the job

"Tenants don't deserve to be intimidated out of their homes, and should be informed of their rights to refuse buyout offers," added Williams, representative for the 45th Council District in Brooklyn. "I am proud to sponsor this legislation which will combat such egregious

tenant harassment behavior, and thank Speaker Mark-Viverito and my Council colleagues for pushing these important reforms."

Williams said that in New York City, there has been a long history of owners offering

tenants money to vacate their apartments.

In recent years, however, he said there have been complaints from tenants that buyouts have become a form of harassment

es most frequently when building owners have hired tenant relocation specialists, many of whom receive a fee for each vacancy, to try to convince tenants, many of whom are rentregulated, to leave their apartments.

He said Int. 682, Int. 700, and Int. 757 are intended to address this issue.

Int. 700, sponsored by Williams and Councilmember Daniel Garodnick, would amend the Housing Maintenance Code's definition of "harassment" to make it unlawful for a dwelling owner, or an owner's agent, to make a tenant buyout offer without first notifying the tenant that they have the right to refuse the buyout offer, without disclosing that the person making the buyout offer has been hired by the tenant's landlord.

Int. 757, sponsored by the Council Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito, would amend the administrative code to include repeated buyout offers, made after a tenant has asked for them to stop, as part of the definition of harassment under the Williams said this issue aris- Housing Maintenance Code.

Int. 682, sponsored by Council Members Garodnick and Williams, would create a licensing scheme for tenant relocation specialists. Under this legislation, the relocators would have to become licensed by first passing an exam, furnishing a surety bond, and paying a licensing fee.

"All of these laws will protect tenants and keep the process of buyout offers by land lords fair and honest," Mark-Viverito said. "New Yorkers who live in rent-regulated housing have the right to stay in their homes, and no one should feel pressured, intimidated or coerced to accept an offer they don't want to take. With this legislative package, we will ensure that rent-regulated tenants are protected from harassment and coercion."

Garodnick said these relocators "can't have a business built on tenant harassment and the city needs to step in."

"Tenants should feel safe and secure in their homes," he added. "That is impossible if they're being pursued relentlessly by someone pushing them out of their home."


as far north as Mexico complaining about it.

Officials argue that nations would need about \$120M in funding to clean up beaches, lease heavy duty equipment and hire large brigades of manual labor to confront and fix the issue.

"We probably would have to deploy over 100,000 people to carry out a similar strategy across the Caribbean space to make our beaches available to those who wish to use them for their multiple purposes," Beckles suggested.

While most of the countries have not reported large scale cancellations, Tobago has indicated that it is among the worst hit with hundreds of cancellations.

Various officials had called for a special summit of Caribbean leaders to discuss the issue but prime ministers Kamla Persad Bissessar of Trinidad and Ralph Gonsalves of St. Vincent who are usually the most supportive to these kinds of calls, are both in the middle of general election campaigns and are

likely to barely hear much less heed such requests.

As if the battle by tourism officials against the invasion is not providing enough headaches, health officials in Barbados are monitoring the situation as people in some areas are complaining about respiratory infections and other illness associated with the mass on beaches near homes as well.

As well in Barbados, the tourism sector there has warned about the use of heavy duty equipment on beaches to clean up as these have damaged beaches causing additional expense.

In 2010, a constitutional reform eliminated birthright citizenship in the Dominican Republic, denying for the first time the nationality of children born in the country to undocumented parents.

The September 2013 Constitutional Court resolution— TC0168/13— retroactively denied Dominican nationality to anyone born after 1929 without one "Dominican" parent. The Court ordered meticulous review of the civil registry.

LeGros explained that next year there will be an election in the DR and President Danilo is "running on an anti-Haitian platform."

The deadline for registration in a "regularization process" passed on June 16 with the majority of Haitians facing deportation. Since then, round-ups and forced deportations, and self-deportations have taken place.

Sophia Contave from the International Campaign to End Apartheid in the Dominican Republic reiterated, "They have generations of families there.

What the Dominican government is saying is, 'Even though you've been here, you speak the language, you've been going to the school system, we're going to rescind your birth certificate.' They changed their constitution to take people out of their legal status in

their own country."


Arelis Figueroa representing the Latino Ministry of Riverside Church handed out a flyer that read: "We join religious leaders and denominations in the Dominican Republic, United States and around the world, among them the World Council of Churches (WCC) and its 345 member churches, who have denounced this grave human rights violation."

At the rally, Representative Yvette Clark took the megaphone. "What we're confronting in the Dominican Republic is a human crisis. This is not a Haitian problem, this is a Dominican problem with a nation turning on its own people and rendering them stateless."

She continued, "We must speak out and keep pressure on the Dominican Republic to do the right thing."

Clarke called for a public vote to overturn their constitutional ruling or a fair regularization process without coercion or violence. She suggested that there could be economic sanctions.

Jumaane Williams addressing the protest said, "We are not against the Dominican Republic. We want all Dominicans to stand up with us, for everybody who loves human rights to stand up with us to say: Do not strip people of their citizenship who were born in a country!"

Trinidad and Tobago police have uncovered a murder plot against Opposition Leader Dr. Keith Rowley as the Sept. 7, 2015 General Election heats up.

And this was confirmed by the island's National Security Minister retired Brigadier Carl Alfonso, who said he was officially informed of the threat by the Deputy Commissioner of Police Glen Hackett.

Security has now being increased around the People's National Movement (PNM) political leader.

The minister said the threat against Dr. Rowley and any politician or public official at this time — a heated election season, was a cause for concern.

Reports in the PNM have been circulating that a TT\$15 million (US\$2.3 million) "hit" has been put on the head of Dr. Keith Row-

# Presidential candidates need to address racial inequality

The next Presidential election is 15 months away and none but the most ardent political enthusiasts are paying attention to the sideshow that is campaigning before the primaries and caucuses. Yet I'll be the first to admit that as a casual observer, I felt pangs of annovance as I watched "Black Lives Matter" protestors upstage Democratic presidential candidate Bernie Sanders - first at Netroots Nation, and then recently at his own event celebrating Social Security and Medicare.

This move left many, including myself, to wonder, why target Sanders — an unabashed liberal who was certain to be "on their side"? Why not, perhaps, another presidential candidate from New York, known for his ostentatious displays of privilege and flamboyant denunciations of immigrants and women?

After some thought, I recognize that the protesters make a salient point.

Both parties believe, in their own ways, that the solution to racism is through economic opportunity — in that your purchasing power and home ownership will raise you to the vaunted "middle class" and overcome discrimination. Immigrants are a useful tool in this regard, as their successes in America are touted as a success of this country's economic parity. Yet, candidates spend so much time speaking about the middle class that it's no

surprise that according to a recent Pew poll, nine out 10 Americans believe themselves to be some level of middle class.

Sen. Sanders, whose platform strikes populist chords railing against the "billionaire class," has the backing of organized labor and the grassroots of progressive organizing. This is a message that resonates for a large sector of the population — over 72 percent, according to Pew, believing that polices since the recession have benefited "banks, corporations and the wealthy." It's for this reason that his supporters insist that he would be the candidate best suited to tackling institutional racism.

Yet, history has shown that even the most revolutionary changes to the economy — replacing plantations with sharecropping, the New Deal's massive public works projects or sending returning veterans to college through the G.I. Bill — have all failed to end racism as we know it. In the 1992 election, candidate Clinton won the presidency on a vow to reform welfare, encouraging Americans to view recipients through the heavily racialized "welfare queens" meme, despite the broad spectrum of American households — elderly, veterans, single parents and so on — that rely on public assistance. These attitudes about food stamps, public housing and other benefits persist today.

Yet, can any economic pol-Continued on Page 12

# Women's rights and gender equality

UNITED NATIONS, Aug. 14, 2015 (IPS) - If there is any idea and cause for which the United Nations has been an indispensable engine of progress globally it is the cause of ending all forms of "discrimination and violence against women and girls, ensuring the realization of their equal rights and advancing their political, economic and social empowerment.

Gender equality and the empowerment of women has been featured prominently in the history of the United Nations system since its inception. The ideas, commitments and actions of the United Nations have sought to fundamentally improve the situation of women around the world, in country after country.

Twenty years after its adoption, the Platform for Action remains a gold standard of international commitments on strategic objectives and actions on gender equality and women's empowerment.

Now, as we celebrate the United Nations' 70th anniversary, the U.N. continues to be the world leader in establishing the global norms and policy standards on women's empowerment, their human rights and on establishing what we at U.N. Women call the Planet 50 / 50 Project on equality between women and men.

Equality between men and women was enshrined in the U.N.'s founding Charter as a key principle and objective. Just a year after, in 1946, the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) was set up as the dedicated intergovernmental body for

policy dialogue and standard setting and monitoring gender equality commitments of member states and their implementation.

Since then, the Commission has played an essential role in guiding the work of the United Nations and in setting standards for all countries, from trailblazing advocacy for the full political suffrage of women and political rights to women's role in development.

It also gave birth to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, CEDAW, adopted in 1979. Often called the international bill of rights for women, and used as a global reference point for both governments and NGOs alike, the Convention has been ratified by 189 states so far.

These governments regularly report to the CEDAW Committee which has also become a generator of normative guidance through its General Recommendations, apart from strengthening the accountability of governments.

As the torch-bearer on women's rights, the U.N. also led the way in declaring 1975 to 1985 the International Women's Decade. During this period the U.N.

held the first three World Conferences on Women, in Mexico (1975), Copenhagen (1980) and Nairobi (1985) which advanced advocacy, activism and policy action on gender equality, women's empowerment and women's rights in multiple areas.

In 1995, the U.N. hosted the historic Fourth World Conference on Women, and adopted the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, one of most progressive frameworks which continues to be the leading roadmap for the achievement of gender equality and women's empowerment globally.

Twenty years after its adoption, the Platform for Action remains a gold standard of international commitments on strategic objectives and actions on gender equality, women's empowerment and women's rights in 12 critical areas of concern including poverty, education, health, economy, power and decision making, ending violence against women, women's human rights, conflict and post conflict environment, media, institutional mechanisms and the girl child.

Since 1995 gender equality and women's empowerment issues have permeated all intergovernmental bodies of the U.N. system.

The General Assembly, the highest and the universal membership body of the United Nations, leads the way with key normative resolutions as well as reflecting gender perspectives in areas such as agriculture, trade, financing for development, poverty eradication, disarmament and non-pro-

liferation, and many others. Among the MDGs, MDG 3 was specifically designed to promote gender equality and empower women apart from Goal 5 on maternal mortality.

The Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) has also been a strong champion of gender mainstreaming into all policies, programmes, areas and sectors as the mains strategy in achieving gender equality and women's empowerment.

Progress achieved so far has been in part possible thanks to ECOSOC's strong mandate for mainstreaming a gender perspective and its support to the United Nations system-wide action Plan on Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment (UN-SWAP) which constitutes a unified accountability framework for and of the U.N. to support gender equality and empowerment of women.

Strongly addressing the impact of conflict on women and their role

in peacebuilding, the U.N. sent a strong signal by addressing the issue of women peace and security in the landmark Security Council resolution 1325 (2000) which asserted the imperative of women's empowerment in conflict prevention, peacemaking and peace building apart from ensuring their protection.

This resolution was seen as a must for women as well as for lasting peace and it has since been complemented by seven additional resolutions including on Sexual Violence in Conflict. This year as the 15th anniversary of Security Council resolution 1325 is commemorated, a Global Study and Review on its effective implementation is underway.

It is expected to renew the political will and decisive action to ensure that women are equal partners and their agency and leadership is effectively engaged in conflict prevention, peace-making and peace-building.

Continued from page 10 icy, no matter how necessary or revolutionary, end racism?

The dilemma in burying racial divisions in high-minded rhetoric about inequality is that it makes the basic assumption that wealth is the only form of inequity in this country — discounting how race and discrimination affect neighborhood policing, the administration of criminal justice and urban planning. By now, we've heard the statistics — that one in three black males born today will go to prison in their lifetimes, that one in nine black men have spent time in prison — and

this is not just because there is poverty in America. Nine innocent people were not gunned down in Charleston because the shooter had grievances about tax policy.

Yes, it is true that policies such as expanding insurance coverage or raising the minimum wage help minority households and improve their quality of life. Yet, the argument made by Black Lives Matter is not an economic one - no amount of education or gainful employment protects African Americans from being treated differently than whites by law enforcement. No amount of benevolence from a candidate with their

economic interests at heart changes the stunning disparity in incarceration rates. By now, the incidents of shockingly excessive force by law enforcement against African Americans are too numerous to recount and it does a great disservice to both activists and law enforcement to subsume this conversation into a broader argument about economics.

Not everyone will agree with the activists' methods, their target, or the inelegance of their actions, but at this early stage, the conversation has entered the 2016 presidential race and for that reason, it is wel-

#### St. Kitts

The St. Kitts-Nevis government says an agreement has been reached under which people who lost funds when the Bank of Commerce closed its doors more than three decades ago.

Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris said the agreement would allow for the payment of EC\$15 million to deposi-

Speaking in Parliament recently, Harris, who is also finance minister, said the court settle-

ment would bring "tremendous relief to the many suffering depositors in the Bank of Commerce."



He told legislators "a fresh start has now come to the depositors.'

The Social Security Board (SSB) had begun legal proceedings against the Bank of Commerce on Feb. 2, 1985 and the court delivered an order on May 9, 1985 in response to the Social Security Board petition, enabling the first resolution of the matter this month.

It was further revealed that the SSB, which is a creditor to the Bank of Commerce, should be receiving approximately UC\$1.4 million, and the Nevis Philatelic Bureau was in line for just over a quarter of a million dollars.

The government said it would be providing more details on the settlement to depositors and the general public at a later date.

#### St. Vincent

St. Vincent and the Grenadines parliament has given the green light to the Ralph Gonsalves government to borrow a further EC\$13 million towards

the construction of the EC\$700 million Argyle International Airport.

Prime Minister Gonsalves told parliament that the airport, which has missed several completion deadlines since 2011, would be completed this year.

"The government of the Republic of China has already agreed to provide this sum of money between

the embassy here and official in the Ministry of Finance, all the arrangements are being put in place to have



these monies brought to use to assist in the completion of the airport before the end of the year," he said.

Gonsalves said the urgency of securing the parliamentary approval in respect of the sale of land in Canouan were yet to be received after a falling out between the investors on the southern Grenadine island.

#### **Trinidad**

The Caribbean development Bank (CDB) has pledged US\$120 million to Trinidad and Tobago's Energy Fund for the Caribbean Sustainability.

This promise follows a recent US\$600 million pledge by the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), which will now push the Energy Co-Financing Facility for Caribbean Sustainability up to US\$720 million.

The CDB's pledge is expected to assist the government as it moves closer to its target of mobilizing US\$1 billion for the fund.

Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) President Warren Smith, in a letter to T&T's Planning Minister Dr. Bhoe Twea-



rie, projected an annual demand of at least US\$30 million "for bank resources to finance projects in the energy sector over the next four years" and made a commitment of US\$120 million over the four-year period.

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar proposed the Multi-Donor Energy Summit of CARICOM and the United States in January this year.

# Clarke pays tribute to Julian Bond

the nation's landmark civil rights laws as we know and continue to fight for to this very day."

"His activism continues to inspire generations of activists dedicated to social justice," Clarke said. "His contributions to the Southern Poverty Law Center and the NAACP remain invaluable to protecting the civil rights of every American.

"Julian Bond was a man of history whose legacy will continue in our work to secure for all people the full blessings of American life," Clarke added. The Southern Poverty Law Center

The Southern Poverty Law Center announced Bond's death on Sunday, according to the Times. His wife, Pamela Sue Horowitz, said the cause was complications of vascular disease.

Bond was one of the original leaders of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee while he was a student at Morehouse College in Atlanta.

"He was the committee's communications director for five years and deftly guided the national news media toward stories of violence and discrimination as the committee challenged legal segregation in the South's public facilities," the Times said.

"He gradually moved from the militancy of the student group to the leadership of the establishmentarian N.A.A.C.P," it added. "Along the way, Mr. Bond was a writer, poet, television commentator, lecturer and college teacher, and persistent opponent of the stubborn remnants of white supremacy."

The paper noted that Bond also served for 20 years in the Georgia General Assembly, "mostly in conspicuous isolation from white colleagues who saw him as an interloper and a rabble-rouser.

"Mr. Bond's wit, cool personality and youthful face — he was often called dashing, handsome and urbane — became familiar to millions of television viewers in the 1960s and 1970s," the Times said.

"On the strength of his personality and quick intellect, he moved to the center of the civil rights action in Atlanta, the unofficial capital of the movement, at the height of the struggle for racial equality in the early 1960s," it added.



# Naomi Jackson pens a coming to the Carib story

There are an infinite number of coming to America stories.

Tales that detail an immigrant's journey to assimilating, fitting in and their own selfdiscovery are popular identity topics to write about.

Providing another layer to the complicated story of identity politics, Naomi Jackson ushers in "The Star Side of Bird Hill" – a story following two girls who journey from America to Barbados.

"I grew up going home to the Caribbean for the summer," Jackson said. "I wanted to write a story about Caribbean American life that was a little bit different than the coming to America story that we usually read. I wanted to write about what it was like to be a Caribbean American kid in the Caribbean — thinking that you're Caribbean and then not feeling that you're Caribbean enough.'

Also of Bajan descent, Jackson embodies a mixture of West Indian culture as well as her home of Brooklyn. "My mother is from Barbados and my father is from Antigua and my stepmother is Jamaican. So I claim Brooklyn and a little bit of all those places," she said.

Digging deep into her own experiences shared visiting her Caribbean home and learning of the privilege associated with it, Jackson was able to craft her first published novel.

"I think that now that I'm older, I understand the privilege and also the loss about being a Caribbean kid in the United States. I think that it's a privilege to have the freedom of travel, just for what an American passport allows you if you have papers because that's not everybody's experience in our

face, Jackson recalled visiting community. I think that what used to be a childhood yearning for belonging and acceptance has gotten more complicated but I've grown up and come to understand a little bit better about the politics of travel and of migration," she explained.

With her book available for purchase, Jackson actually completed "The Star Side of Bird Hill" back in December of 2013 but waited 18 long months before actually seeing it on shelves.

With the summer nearly over and fall quickly approaching, Jackson plans to continue promoting her book at various events including the AfroPunk Festival on Aug. 22, a panel discussion at Medgar Evers College Sept. 19 and during the Brooklyn Book Festival Sept.

Ultimately, Jackson hopes "The Star Side of Bird Hill" leaves an impression on Caribbean readers to have important conversations around topics such as sexuality and also see

# Caribbean seeks funding for renewable energy mix

**By Desmond Brown**FORT-DE-FRANCE, Martinique, Jul 21 2015 (IPS) -A leading geothermal expert warns that the small island states in the Caribbean face "a ticking time bomb" due to the effects of global warming and suggests a shift away from fossil fuels to renewable energy is the only way to defuse it.

President of the Ocean Geothermal Energy Foundation Jim Shnell says to solve the problems of global warming and climate change, the world needs a new energy source to replace coal, oil and other carbon-based fuels. OGEF's mission is to fund the R&D needed to tap into the earth's vast geothermal energy resources.

'With global warming comes the melting of the icecaps in Greenland and Antarctica and the projection is that at the rate we are going, they will both melt by the end of this century," Shnell told IPS, adding "if that happens the water levels in the ocean will rise by approximately 200 feet and there are some islands that will disappear altogether.

"So you've got a ticking bomb there and we've got to

defuse that bomb and if I were to rate the issues for the Caribbean countries, I would put a heavyweight on that one.'

It has taken just eight inches of water for Jamaica to be affected by rising sea levels, with one of a set of cays called Pedro Cays disappearing in recent years.

Scientists have warned that as the seas continue to swell, they will swallow entire island nations from the Maldives to the Marshall Islands, inundate

vast areas of countries from Bangladesh to Egypt, and submerge parts of scores of coastal cities.

In the Caribbean, scientists have also pointed to the likelihood of Barbuda disappearing in 40 years.

Shnell said countries could "essentially eliminate" the threat by turning to renewable energy, thereby decreasing the amount of fossil fuels or carbon-based fuels they burn.

"The primary driver of cli-

mate change is greenhouse gasses and one of the principal ones in terms of volume is carbon dioxide," he said.

"For a long time a lot of electricity, 40 per cent of the electricity produced in many countries, would come from coal because it was a very inexpensive, plentiful form of carbon to burn.

"But now countries have seen that they need to move away from that and in fact the G7 just earlier this month got together and in their meeting, the leaders declared that they were going to be 100 percent renewable, that is completely stop burning carbon, coals and other forms of fossil fuels by the end of this century. The only problem is that for global warming purposes that's probably too late," Shnell added.

Shnell was among some of the world's leading renewable energy experts who met here late last month to consider options for renewable energy development in the Caribbean.

The Martinique Conference on Island Energy Transitions was organised by the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA) and the French Government, which will host the United Nations International Climate Change Conference, COP 21, at the Le Bourget site in Paris from Nov. 30 Dec. 11 2015.

Senior Energy Specialist at the World Bank Migara Jaywardena said the conference was useful and timely in bringing all the practitioners from different technical people, financial people and government together.

"There's a lot of climate funds that are being deployed to support and promote clean energy...and we talked about the challenges that small islands, highly indebted countries have with mobilising some of this capital and making that connection to clean energy," Jaywardena told IPS.

"They want to do it but there isn't enough funds and remember there's a lot of other competing development interests, not just energy but nonenergy interests as well. Since this conference leads to the COP in Paris, I think being a part of that climate dialogue is important because it creates an opportunity to begin to access some of those funds."



Trinidadian born artist and educator Daniela Fifi has been awarded the prestigious Samuel H. Kress Interpretive Fellowship Award, which she will pursue at the esteemed Miriam and Ira D. Wallach Art Gallery at Columbia University, in New York.

Her current doctoral research examines the sustainability and longevity of museum-community relationships and she is particularly





### Haitian folklorist publishes music book, CDs

Georges Vilson's passion is collecting Haiti traditional music and also the musical interludes that are part of some Haitian folktales. His passion is dedicated to acquiring the fabric of Haiti's musical folk culture before it disappears.

The avocational folklorist went to parochial school in Port-au-Prince and his mother, who recently passed, was a church-going Catholic, but she had reverence for folk traditions.

"My mother was aware; she knew we must love the culture," he says. "She was always singing traditional songs." Though he didn't grow up in the Vodou tradition, there was respect.

"Cousins from the countryside in the Nippes department visited us all the time and told us lots of stories," he says of his own connection to traditional culture.

He elaborates that the role of the folktale is entertainment and education. "Most of the time there is a moral. They help you grow up."

For the songs that are part of folktales, "It's like a Broadway musical," in this case, a very short song, part of the story as the teller spins the yarn. Integrated into the folktales and easy to catch on, listeners often sing along at the appropriate point.

"When I tell stories to kids, I always teach the song first," he says, and the children take his lead to join in.

Vilson, affectionately known by his friends as Mous, makes research trips to Haiti during his vacations as a Brooklyn high school music teacher.

He never goes into a place without an introduction. A friend who might be a Vodou priest or mambo — a trusted reference — opens the door. Then, with a recording device in hand and accompanied with other friends, he's ready.

On a recent visit to the Plateau Central, in the center of the country, he was in for a surprise. The chief storyteller greeted him, "We'll talk about the stories, but we won't tell them until the sun goes down." Explaining, "It's bad luck; we don't want anything to happen to our family."

arrangements, his group of four drove back to Port-au-Prince. "We returned the next week," he said, having

secured hotel reservations in a nearby city. And, recording all, the visiting group along with town folk listened from 6 - 10 pm. "I never knew stories aren't told until the night," he said, still learning the nuances of his cultural heritage.

In this second volume of 102 songs, 80 percent are Vodou or rara origin. The rhythms or dances are identified: petwo, chayopye, woumble, nago, kongo, yanvalou, and banda rhythms. Traditional songs make up the rest of the collection.

The music is notated, one song per page that looks like sheet music with the words printed.

Who uses the books? In addition to young musicians looking for the words or actual music of traditional songs, teachers in schools in Haiti use his book as a source. The size of the volume, with occasional full-page black and white photographs, is With no accommodation not bulky, a perfect carrying

trips add to the archive. He sees himself, in total, notating 2000 songs.

The next and third traditional music volume in the Kandelab series - named for a thick many-branched cactus in Haiti that serves as a natural fence — will be "103 notated Haitian Folk and Vodou Songs."

Accompanying the book and sold separately, Vilson recorded a set of CDs where he sings with a percussionist in Haitian kreyol, each song with its proper rhythm.

In the recording, sometimes you hear multiple voices or a choral background. "That's me," he says, of the multi-layered songs. The CD set also includes the songs played to a metronome on a piano, the notes from the sheet music slowly articulated. "It's so people can follow along who don't read music,' he says.

### **Jamaicans named for Heroes Day Ceremony**

One of the anticipated pluses to celebrating Jamaica's independence is the announcement of distinguished nationals to be acknowledged by the government on Heroes Day in October.

Established in 1968, they were first awarded a year later and annually on Aug. 6, the Jamaica Information Service quelled all anxieties by naming the 2015 awardees considered worthy of distinguished and honorable mention.

One hundred and 67 individuals were named to receive the national honors and as always for a wide variety of service to the island.

Among those to be conferred with The Order of Jamaica (OJ) — the country's fourth-highest national honor — eight distinguished citizens were acknowledged.

Former New York Consul General Derrick Heaven is among the chosen few and will be rewarded for service to the public sector.

The girls sections are: Pacific Pearls, Spanish Splendor and Southwest Treasures. Oriental Onyx is the lone boy section.


"We expect the kids to come out and have fun, and enjoy the carnival," said Millington, as he worked

Back in the Eighties, the CIA began orchestrating the introduction of crack-cocaine to African-American communities all across America, starting with the South Central L.A. By the middle of the decade, the epidemic had turned Compton into a godforsaken wasteland rife with drug addiction and crime.

Thus, it should come as no surprise that when a young Ice Cube (O'Shea Jackson, Jr.) teamed up with MC Ren (Aldis Hodge) to write songs, they'd reflect the reality of what they'd

witnessed growing up in the 'hood. In 1988, together with Dr. Dre (Corey Hawkins), Eazy E (Jason Mitchell) and DJ Yella (Neil Brown, Jr.), they released

"Straight Outta Compton," the debut album of N.W.A., aka Niggaz with Attitudes.

The controversial group pioneered a seminal sub-genre of

rap revolving around black-onblack violence, misogyny and police brutality. While detractors criticized their glorification of ghetto dysfunction, pro-

ponents countered that N.W.A. was merely telling it like it is.

Despite that first CD's going double platinum, Cube soon departed to embark on a solo career, ostensibly after being ripped off by their manager, Jerry Heller (Paul Giamatti). In fact, he subsequently threatened to "put a bullet to his temple" in a tune where he also suggested his former bandmates "get rid of that devil" because they couldn't be gangstas "with a white Jew tellin' you what to do." Meanwhile, his abandoned homeys promised Cube via lyrics that they would "f\*ck you with a broomstick."

Ironically, they would all eventually wise up and come around to agree with Cube, most notably, Dre, who finally left Ruthless Records in 1991 to sign with his bodyguard Suge Knight's (R. Marcus Taylor) new label, Death Row Records. Eazy E would remain loyal to Heller the longest, leaving not long before he died of AIDS at just 31 years of age.

legendary production hauled seven wins and accolades 40 years ago for its direction by Trinidad & Tobago native Geoffrey Holder.






### Windies team fails to qualify

### Liberty honors 'disqualified' boys hoops team

NEW YORK (AP) \_ Kymora Johnson just wanted to play basketball.

The 10-year-old girl was thrown into the spotlight earlier this month when her youth team from Virginia was disqualified from a basketball tournament because she played in it. Johnson's the lone girl on the boys' team, the Charlottesville Cavaliers. The tournament had a rule, put in place this year, that girls couldn't play on a boys' team because there was also a girls' competition. Johnson had been playing with the Cavaliers for the last few years because there was no girls' team in her area until recently.

After the Cavaliers were disqualified from the tournament in South Carolina, her teammates came to watch the semifinals in pink uniforms in a sign of support for Johnson.

When the WNBA's New York Liberty heard the story, they wanted to do something for going to fly the team up, but

So they brought the Cavaliers to Saturday night's game.

"In this day and age it really is unheard of. Kids at this age, boys and girls, they play together," Liberty president Isiah Thomas said. "Mo'ne Davis, she was pitching against the boys. I think these are the type of moments where you continue to break down barriers and shine the light and expose. A moment like this and a night like this for the kids in terms of basketball it's everlasting. What was a bad moment turned into memories that last forever"

The Liberty honored Johnson and her team during a timeout Saturday night. The young squad received a warm long ovation from the crowd. Johnson spent the second half sitting behind the Liberty bench.

"It's been overwhelming, but exciting," Johnson said.

New York originally was

Johnson and her teammates. the Cavaliers' bus broke down on the way to the airport so they ended up taking the train instead. The Liberty also set up a game for the Charlottesville team against a local group that was played on the Madison Square Garden court after the Liberty lost to the Tulsa Shock 81-76 on Saturday night.

About 1,000 fans and the Liberty players hung around to watch the exhibition game. Johnson, who along with her teammates were wearing t-shirts saying "girls don't sit on the bench," started for the Cavaliers. She didn't score in the 20-minute contest, but still had a lot of fun. She'll tour New York on Sunday before heading back to Virginia on Monday.

New York guard Candice Wiggins said she could relate to Johnson's plight. When she was younger, she played on an allboys team and there were tournaments she wasn't allowed to play in because she was a girl. Wiggins was disappointed to see things haven't progressed






