Haiti 'protected' for 18 more months

United States Secretary of Homeland Security Jeh Johnson has extended Haiti's designation for Temporary Protected Status for an additional 18 months, Citizenship and Immigration Services reports.

The agency said on Tuesday that the extended designation is effective Jan. 23, 2016, through Jul. 22, 2017.

The U.S. urged current Haiti beneficiaries seeking to extend their status to re-reg-

ister during a 60-day period that runs from Aug. 25, 2015, through Oct. 26, 2015.

"U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services encourages beneficiaries to re-register as soon as possible

United States Customs uncovers alleged gold smuggling scam

Guyana's three-month-old government is beginning to come to grips with the magnitude of illegal activities that were tolerated by the previous regime and has a number of western agencies, including U.S. Customs, to thank for it.

The recently established asset recovery unit operating out of the office of President David Granger reported this week that it has just uncovered a gold-smuggling racket to the U.S. involving at least \$220 Guy million worth of gold in less than a year of monitoring.

As officials have indicated, a number of businessmen without

gold export licenses would smuggle large amounts of gold out of the country to the U.S. without declaring the shipments at the local airport but would in fact declare their cargo to American authorities upon arrival for fear of seizure and prosecution.

The smugglers have quite smartly used a loophole in local laws, labeling their exports as "scrap gold" because this category does not attract any export duties from Guyana or import taxes into the IIS

Startled by the amount of gold arriving on commercial flights from

200 take in Energie Nouvelle

Wilmer Jennings Gallery at Kenkelaba House was abuzz, packed with more than 200 people last Sunday celebrating the month-long exhibition Energie Nouvelle-New Energy. The works of 53 artists-solely of Haitian descent, almost 100 pieces, are on exhibit including traditional, realistic, cubist, and abstract paintings. Watercolors to spray paint, collages, sculptures, and black and white images by four photographers are on display.

"We put out an open call, internationally, the first one ever, and made our selections from 200 submissions," says Patricia Brintle, one of five from the "Artist Forum," who organized the exhibit.

On Aug. 30 at 3 pm, five exhibiting artists will participate in a panel at the Gallery, 214 E. Second St. in Manhattan, discussing issues of the feelings of Haitian artists and what they think of the future of Haitian art.

Exhibitors in this show run the generational gamut, some in their teens to two in their eighties. And these Haitian artists live all over too: Canada, Austria, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Florida, and the New York region. At least two-thirds were at the reception.

Art lovers, friends and fans couldn't believe the variety of art produced from the Haitian community, says Brintle, "It's not all coconut trees or naïve art."

The Artist Forum collaborated with the Haitian Consulate, which offered support, inviting those from its vast mailing list and bringing in a wider audience. They also helped with the reception.

The Artist Forum and Consulate organized the show well aware that there is a plethora of artists in the community and that "artists don't know how to promote themselves.'

The host space Kenkelaba House is perfect for this exhibition, as it is dedicated to the exhibition of artworks by African-American, Latino, Asian-American, and Native American artists. The Gallery sponsors exhibitions, often exploring historical or thematic issues, and hosted "Save a Museum

Opportunity for Vincentian voters in NY

In preparation for general elections, constitutionally due by March next year, members of the Vincentian community in New York are being urged to file objections to their names possibly being struck from the electoral list of St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Consulate General in New York said it is working with the Supervisor of Elections in allowing Vincentians in New York to lodge their objections at the

"During this period, anyone desirous of filing an objection to their name being removed can do so by submitting a letter addressed to the Supervisor of Election stating why their name should not be removed from the voters' list and present the necessary documents

to the office of the Consulate to be forwarded to the Office of the Supervisor of Elections," the statement said.

'Persons wishing to submit their objections directly to the Office of the Supervisor of Elections will still be able to do so, using the same method of submission," it added.

The Consulate General urged Vincentians in New York to "make full use of this opportunity to ensure that their voter registration is regularized and pledges to continue the excellent working relationship with the members of the Vincentian community in New York."

Barbados

Barbados Minister of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade Senator Maxine McClean says the illicit trade in small arms and light weapons pose a grave threat to Barbados and the rest of the Caribbean.

Speaking during the Open Debate on Peace and Security Challenges Facing Small Island Developing States (SIDS) at the UN Security Council in New York recently, she said: "On a day-to-day basis, we must focus on the trade in small arms and light weapons which facilitates traffic in illicit drugs and other organized crime, and which undermines our economy and can destabilize society".

McClean said the situation was made

worse by the many vulnerabilities which commonly characterized SIDS, such as narrow resource



bases, small domestic markets, susceptibility to external shocks and environmental vulnerability.

"These threats are made more significant because of the geography of SIDS, Often of small land mass, their air and maritime borders are multiple times larges. The cost to protect national borders is thus rendered prohibitive and difficult," she said.

Taken together, the foreign minister said, these threats to peace and security required the diversion of already limited resources at a significant cost to national development.

She pointed out to the Security Council that CARICOM heads of government had reiterated the threat and committed to implementing all necessary actions at the national and regional level to combat the illicit trade, in the 2011 CARICOM Declaration on Small Arms and Light Weapons.

Dominica

An agreement amounting to US\$1.5 million has been signed with China towards purchasing police vehicles and equipment as well as the training of policemen and women.

National Security Minister Rayburn Blackmore who made the announcement recently at the commission of a new police station and court in Laplaine, to the east of the capi-

tal Roseau, said the agreement is one that deepens ties between both countries.



He said the money is going to be utilized to purchase new vehicles, to train police officers and to invest in equipment for search and rescue.

He said the agreement is with a view to further developing and improving

ple of Dominica.

The new police station is financed through a loan from the Social Security fund.

The Guyana government says 12 people, including six Haitians and two Russians, were intercepted at the Cheddi Jagan International Airport when they sought to enter the South American country illegally.

Citizenship Minister Winston Felix said immigration officers had also denied four Cubans and a Colombian from entering the country after they arrived on a COPA Airline flight recently.

He said the foreigners did not have visas or money.

Felix told reporters that the Haitians had produced a letter purportedly issued by the



Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Guyana granting them entry into the country.

But the minister said that immigration officers have informed him that the use of such letters by illegal migrants is common.

Haitians require visas to enter many Caribbean Community (CARICOM) countries even though the French-

People's Republic of China and the peo- 15-member CARICOM grouping.

All six Haitians as well as the Colombian were deported and the Russian national was denied entry because she did not meet immigration requirements. But her husband, who did, opted to leave Guyana with her.

A truck crowded with vendors heading to a market went out of control and tipped over Haiti's northern region recently, killing 18 people and injuring 28, authorities said.

The accident occurred when the truck driver swerved to avoid a motorcycle and the vehicle turned over near the coastal city of Cap-Haitien, said

Jean-Henri Petit, a coordinator for the Civil Protection Agency.



He said the truck also was carrying loads of charcoal and wood the passengers had planned to sell at a nearby market.

Petit said the 28 injured were all hospitalized.

Jamaica

Jamaica's government has identified four potential stages to tax the medicinal ganja industry, in a bid to benefit from seed to sale, according to the cooperative relations between the speaking country is a member of the a draft document entitled the "Regula-

tory Footprint on Medical Ganja."

The document which was released recently forms the latest development in the government's drive to regulate and license a ganja industry.

The stages of potential taxation include a cultivation tax applied to each plant; a license fee and income tax from all licensed and registered

entities; a distribution tax applied to each plant; a license fee and income tax from all licensed and regis-



tered entities; a distribution tax applied to each package and a sales tax.

Industry Minister Anthony Hylton explained that government needs to identify all possible avenues to tax the industry, for the benefit of the country.

Hylton said his ministry expects to receive recommendations to guide the development of the regulations for the cannabis industry by September, following which, it will be taken to Parliament for debate.



once the 60-day re-registration period begins," the statement said.

The agency said the 18-month extension also allows re-registrants to apply for a new Employment Authorization Document.

It said eligible Haiti beneficiaries who re-register during the 60-day period and request a new authorization will receive one with an expiration date of Jul. 22, 2017.

"USCIS recognizes that some re-registrants may not receive their new EADs until after their current EADs expire," the statement said. "Therefore, USCIS is automatically extending current TPS Haiti EADs bearing a Jan. 22, 2016, expiration date for an additional six months. These existing EADs are now valid through Jul. 22, 2016."

Haiti was initially designated for temporary protected status on Jan. 21, 2010, after a major earthquake devastated the country.

Following consultations with other federal agencies, the Department of Homeland Security said it determined that current conditions in Haiti support extending the designation period for current beneficiaries.

To re-register, current beneficiaries must submit Form I-821, Application for Temporary Protected Status. Re-registrants do not need to pay the Form I-821 application fee.

Beneficiaries must also pay the biometric services fee, or a fee waiver request, if they are 14 years old or older.

Additionally, beneficiaries must submit Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization, regardless of whether they want an authorization, and Form I-765 application fee, or a fee waiver request, but only if they want an EAD.

If the re-registrant does not want an authorization, no application fee is required, the agency said.

It said applicants may request that the agency waive the Form I-765 application fee and/or biometrics fee based on an inability to pay.

To do so, the agency said applicants must file a Form I-912, Request for Fee Waiver, or submit a written request.

It said fee waiver requests must be accompanied by supporting documentation.

The agency said it will reject the applications of any applicant who fails to submit the required filing fees or a properly documented fee waiver request.

It said all forms are free. Applicants can download these forms from its website at uscis.gov/forms or request them by calling USCIS toll-free at (800) 870–3676.

Additional information on TPS for Haiti—including guidance on eligibility, the application process, and where to file—is available online at uscis.gov/tps.

Further details about this extension of TPS for Haiti, including the application requirements and procedures, appear in a Federal Register notice published on Tuesday.

Guyana at New York's John F. Kennedy Airport and other American airports, U.S. customs office began liaising with the Guyanese intelligence community, alerting them to the racket and also began building intelligence files on the smugglers.

In one case, officials from the two sides compiled evidence showing that a single businessman alone accounted for a whooping \$18 million in smuggled scrap gold, while a group of others account for at least \$200 million.

The racket came to the attention of authorities around mid last year so agencies are looking into the money laundering aspect of it and say they expect a number of indictments from the US in the coming months as evidence is overwhelming.

Scrap gold has much to do with personal amounts of gold a person might have owned and decided to smelt the pieces into a bar or bars so these is no real tax categorization for this.

About two years ago, the natural resources ministry had complained that half of the gold produced in the coun-

try by small and medium scale miners is smuggled out of the country, a fair amount of it through neighboring Suriname and the others by air to Canada and the US. Rough estimates put the amount at around one million troy ounces. As well, officials say that much of Guyana's gold ends up in Dubai in the Middle East through Suriname.

Taxes and royalties in Suriname on raw gold are way cheaper than in Guyana, making it a prime temptation for smugglers, as the profit margins are humongous.

Some also head out to the Caribbean by river transport as was seen in the case of about 70 gold bars discovered on a trawler from Guyana to Curacao back in 2012.

A leading city businessman remains under the watchful eyes of local and especially American intelligence officials as they try to track down where the money is going and what it could be financing.

To go along with the investigations and to put pressure on some of those involved, the State Department has already cancelled American entry visas of several businessmen and women, many of them from the western Bartica river town that is regarded as the gateway to interior goldfields.

19th amendment, guaranteed which women the right to vote, became part of the United States Constitution. The anniversary of this historic achievement deserves recognition, celebration, and a tremendous "thank you" to those brave women who faced ridicule, beatings, starvation, torture and false imprisonment so that women today could exercise their right to cast a ballot. Yet 95 years later, equality continues to elude many women.

The right to vote armed women with a critical weapon in the fight for equality. However, the persistence of economic policies that degrade the value of women's work, damages the access to fair labor and cripple career promotion undermines that promise of equality. The litany of challenges is daunting: low wages, cuts in public services, pregnancy discrimination and access to health care remain substantial obsta-

women of color and working class women.

We must work harder to ensure equality for all women. State legislatures are often the first line of access - for it was there that the women in the U.S. first received the right to vote. We must leverage these bodies of justice to ensure that women and their families continue to improve their opportunities.

We can pass real policies that will improve the lives of women and their families and make meaningful progress toward equality, but it won't happen unless everybody elected officials, voters, men and women, demand change. We need not debate whether one party or another has done more to help or harm women. If we work together, across party lines and towards a common good, we can take the actions necessary to advance policies that will make women's lives better. By standing

n Aug. 26, 1920 the cles to women, particularly united to address the barriers in the areas of economic policy and women's health, women across our country will benefit every day. Adopting paid leave policies, ending pregnancy discrimination and expanding Medicaid for the working poor reflect the core value of women's contribution to our economy and to our success. We don't have to wait for Congress to act. In legislatures everywhere, we can deliver our own victories.

Progress has been stalled for far too long. The millions of women who are working both inside and outside the home to support themselves and their families should demand action and not rest until changes are made. With their voices raised, women can show that they care much more about the concrete actions that legislators take than about fruitless political debates and restrictive policies that stand in the way of women making progress in our state, leaving

families worse off than they are now.

When we talk to the women in our districts, the issues they care most about vary; but the message is loud and clear: they want to see an end to the partisan bickering and political bank shots. They want to see policies that reflect our values, an economy that works for all families, and real progress for everyone in our state.

It took 72 years of campaigning for women to win the right to vote. Since then, 95 years have passed. The new gender gap is not in voting. It lies in pay, promotions, healthcare, and retirement. Too few women hold leadership roles in elected offices, the courts, and boardrooms. We need to pick up the pace of change substantially, if we want to reach parity in the near future. We not only need leaders who will do the right thing, we need them to take action now to build a more equitable future.

The non-stop flights which will have a capacity ranging from 154 to 166 seats will complement existing airlift into St. Kitts from North America, providing more convenient options for travelers to get to St. Kitts during the peak winter travel season.

Mark Brantley, minister of foreign affairs and aviation for St. Kitts and deputy prime minister of Nevis, said: "We welcome the United Airlines flight from Newark as an integral component of our strategy to provide non-stop airlift from our key international gateways. Our visitor research and stakeholder input have indicated that New Jersey is a very strong market for the Federation and for Nevis, in particular."

St. Lucia

A delegation from Venezuela, led by Venezuela's Minister of External Affairs, Delcy Rodriguez recently visited St. Lucia to hold talks with Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony and Minister of External Affairs Alva Baptiste to deepen the relations between the two countries.

The Venezuelan delegation was on a regional tour of nine

ALBA PertroCaribe member countries, including St. Lucia, in order to strengthen bi-lateral cooperation



amongst ALBA PetroCaribe member countries.

Baptiste, accompanied by St. Lucia's Ambassador to ALBA-TCP and Petro-Caribe, Eustace Vitalis attended the ALBA-TCP and PetroCaribe Political Council Meeting in Caracas.

Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago (T&T) became the ninth country out of 161 members of the World Trade Organization (WTO), to accept the Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) on July 29.

T&T is also the first Caribbean Community (CARICOM) member to accept the TFA, a release from the

Trade Ministry said.

The TFA is the first multilateral agreement to be completed out of the protracted Doha Development Round (ongoing since 2001).

It provides a series of global measures for expediting the movement, clearance and



release of goods. Some major reforms covered by the agreement include disciplines on fees and charges; transparency measures such as the online traders and procedures for faster release and clearance of goods.

The TFA, when globally enforced, is expected to reduce trade costs by 13 percent. Its entry into force requires formal acceptance by at least twothirds of the WTO membership.

Turks & Caicos Island

Deputy Attorney General in the Turks and Caicos Islands (TCI), Wyanante Mary Adrien-Roberts, has been appointed as a high court judge of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court and has been assigned to Grenada. She assumes office on Sept. 1, 2015.

"I am delighted that Ms Adien Roberts' elevation to the High Court bench in the Eastern Caribbean has now been announced," said TCI Attorney General Rhondalee Braithwaite-Knowles.

On her new appointment, Adrien-

Roberts said; "I am thankful for the opportunity to serve the people of the Turks and Caicos Islands in the capacity of deputy



attorney general. I will always cherish the time that I spent here in the TCI in particular at the Attorney General's Chambers.

Adrien-Roberts holds a Bachelor of Laws Degree from the University of the West Indies, a Master of Laws Degree from the George Washington University Law School and the Certificate of Legal Education from the Norman Manley University. She is a former president of the Dominica Bar Association.




"Other than tourism, what else can we supply our people

Barbadians heading to Canada need to read this

By Azad Ali

The government of Canada has issued a revision to its new entry requirements for all visa-exempt travelers seeking to enter the country by air.

Effective March 15, 2016, it will become mandatory for Barbadians travelling to Canada to obtain an electronic travel authorization.

The application must be submitted online and will

be available from Aug.1,

This is due to the Canadian government's limited capacity to identify and screen foreign nationals who do not require a temporary resident visa to travel to Canada.

The application fee is Can\$7 or Bds \$12.

This new requirement is similar to the existing US tralian E Electronic System for Travaulthority.

el Authorization or Australian Electronic Travel Authority.

All persons with Barbadian passports are expected to have the paperwork prior to their departure for Canada, and this includes all holders of diplomatic and official passports travelling on official or personal business. Only holders of diplomatic and official passports who are accredited to Canada will be exempt from this requirement. Additionally, an application for a work or

study permit would constitute an application.

Students in possession of the relevant student visa will be exempted.

The program, which is only applicable to visaexempt travelers arriving by air, will only require an online application.

The vast majority of applications will be autogranted by an electronic system, and will be valid for five years or until the passport expires, or whichever comes first.

All Barbadian travelers arriving in Canada and in possession of an eTA will still be interviewed by a Canada Border Service Agency (CBSA) official, who will determine final eligibility. Persons transiting Canada are also required to have an eTA prior to travelling.







How to improve test-taking skills

gauge their progress on a variety of subjects. Testing can be an effective way to determine a student's understanding of a given subject, but not every student performs well on tests. Test-taking comes easily for some, but not so for others. Nerves or trouble concentrating can foil the best students. However, there are ways for students to improve their test-taking skills.

Preparation

Most tests are given with prior notice, enabling students to prepare for them well in advance. Sometimes teachers and professors will surprise students with a quiz. These pop quizzes are used to judge how well students are absorbing the information and if they have been paying attention.

When in class, continually jot down notes and create an outline of important information. The teacher may provide hints about the upcoming test, including emphasizing specific areas of focus or even revealing the format of the test. Contrary to what some students believe, teachers want their students to succeed. Therefore, your teacher may offer a review session the day before or be open

tudents are periodically tested to for questions prior to the test if further needed for the test. This may include clarification is needed.

> Studying with others can shed new light on a subject. Studying difficult subject matter with peers may help students grasp the materials better than they did in class. Classmates may have some tricks they've developed, including pneumonic devices for putting facts

Day before and day of

Prior to a test, make sure you eat and get enough rest. While it may be tempting to pull an "all-nighter," you will not perform well on the test if you are tired from having studied all night. Review the material and put the main ideas or formulas onto a sheet that can be quickly reviewed. Review it many times and then put it away. Have a good meal, relax, and try to get at least eight hours of sleep.

On the day of the test, wake up and arrive on time or even a few minutes early for your class. This can help to calm your nerves and enable you to squeeze in some last-second studying.

The test itself

Make sure you have the supplies

pens or pencils, a calculator, a textbook if you are allowed to reference, or any other supplies the teacher allows. Have a watch available so that you can pace yourself during the test. Avoid using a mobile phone during the test, as the teacher may misinterpret that as cheating.

Try to remain positive through the test. If you feel yourself getting nervous, take a few deep breaths and re-

In addition to these tips, there are other ways to approach the test.

Do the easiest problems first. If you do not know a question, skip it and move on. There may be clues later on in the test that help you go back and answer skipped questions.

Always read the entire question. Skimming could find you missing important instructions.

Look for words that may help you determine the answer. Words such as "all," "never," or "none" may present clues to the answer.

Pay attention to your work and only your work. Do not be distracted if others finish before you.

If there is time, go back and

look over the test. Make sure that all the questions have been answered and check for any careless mistakes. Proofread any essays and short answer questions.

Preparing well for a test, remaining calm and checking over your work can help students who struggle with test-taking do their best.

Exploring the risk factors for prostate cancer

in six men can expect to be diagnosed with prostate cancer, while there is a one in seven chance that a Canadian man will be diagnosed with prostate cancer at some point during his lifetime.

Those elevated incidence rates could be a byproduct of an aging population, as age is a significant risk factor for prostate cancer. According the Prostate Cancer Foundation, one in 10.000 men under age 40 will be diagnosed with prostate cancer. That figure skyrockets to one in 38 for men between the ages of 40 to 59, and one in 15 for men in their

Though age is perhaps the most significant risk factor, it's not the only thing that increases a man's risk for prostate cancer. In fact, there are a host of factors in addition to age that increase a man's risk for prostate cancer, which the Canadian Cancer Society says will claim the lives of more than 4,000 Canadian men this vear.

One such risk factor is where a man lives. Men who live in rural China, for instance, have a relatively low risk of developing prostate cancer during their lifetime. That risk is only two percent if a man stays in rural China his entire life. But that risk increases significantly if a Chinese man moves to the West, where a man in the United States has a 17 percent chance of developing prostate

'n the United States, one role, but also the location of his home within that country's borders can elevate the risk. Men who live in cities north of 40 degrees latitude (north of Philadelphia, Pa.; Columbus, Ohio; and Provo, Utah) have the highest risk of dying from prostate cancer, and researchers feel this is because men who live in such cities get less sunlight during the winter months and therefore less vita-

> Race is another risk factor for prostate cancer. Asian men have the lowest risk of developing prostate cancer, while African-American men are 60 percent more likely to develop the disease than Caucasian men. The PCF notes that African-American men are also 2.5 times more likely to die from the disease, which highlights the importance that African-American men must place on screenings.

> Family history also plays a role in a man's risk for developing prostate cancer. Men whose fathers or brothers have had prostate cancer are twice as likely to develop the disease. Their risk increases even more if their fathers or brothers were diagnosed with the cancer before reaching the age of 55 or if they had three or more family members who were diagnosed with prostate

Research into prostate cancer is ongoing and continues to unearth new information regarding this potentially deadly disease. More informa-And not only does which tion about prostate cancer is

High cholesterol linked to prostate cancer recurrence

'igh cholesterol poses a significant threat to human health, and now there is another reason for men to get their cholesterol levels in check, as high cholesterol has now been linked to increasing a man's risk for prostate cancer recurrence

A recent study funded by the National Institutes of Health linked triglycerides and cholesterol to the recurrence of prostate cancer. Among men who underwent surgery for prostate cancer, those with high cholesterol and triglyceride levels in their blood were more likely to develop prostate cancer again, says the research.

Instead of eating an abundance of saturated fats, such as those found in red meat and dairy products, select foods with monounsaturated fats found in olives and peanuts.

The study also found that relatively simple changes can greatly reduce one's prostate cancer recurrence risk. Findings suggest that normalization, or even partial normalization, of serum lipid levels among those with an abnormal cholesterol profile can reduce the risk of prostate cancer recurrence. Men with triglyceride levels of 150 mg/ DL or higher were 35 percent more likely to have a prostate cancer recurrence. Similarly, those with total cholesterol levels above 200 mg/DL were linked to a 9 percent higher recurrence instance for every 10 mg/DL increase.

Men can take various steps to lower their cholesterol. which can be a multi-pronged process, and can work in concert with their physicians to develop an effective plan. The following are some effective ways to lower one's cholester-

Make dietary changes. Many different changes to your diet can impact cholesterol levels. Choosing healthier fats is

a start. Instead of eating an abundance of saturated fats, such as those found in red meat and dairy products, select foods with monounsaturated fats found in olives and peanuts. Eating whole grains and opting for fruits and vegetables over meats and refined carbohydrates also can lower your cholesterol

Exercise. Moderate daily physical activity can help raise high-density lipoprotein, or HDL, which is often referred to as "good cholesterol." Such activity also may help lower bad cholesterol levels.

Lose weight. The Mavo Clinic advises that losing as little as five to 10 percent of your body weight can help you signifi-

cantly reduce your cholesterol

Consider niacin. Some studies sav niacin (vitamin B3) mav be more effective at lowering bad cholesterol than medication. Niacin can be found in liver, meat, peanuts and other nuts, and whole grains.

Consider medication. People who are at a high risk of heart disease and who have poor cholesterol numbers may need to take medication. Doctors can work with you to find the right combination of treat-

Lowering cholesterol has a number of health benefits. and preventing prostate cancer recurrence can now be added to that list.

The ongoing prostate test controversy

naccurate results and less than fool-proof detection has lead many health professionals to eschew prostate specific antigen tests as an indicator of prostate cancer. A draft recommendation from the U.S. government said tests should no longer be part of routine screening for men.

Why? According to the U.S. Preventative Services Task Force, evidence indicates there is little, if any, reduction of prostate cancer-related deaths from the tests. Further research has indicated that tests actually may turn a man's life upside down by unnecessary stress and surgery for false-positive readings. But there are proponents of the test that say it is still vital in early detection of prostate cancer and enables men to get treatment earlier.

A prostate-specific antigen test measures a protein in the blood, which has a tendency to spike when prostate cancer is present. People who support the test say that it is one of the best practices for male health screenings and that fatalities have dropped 40 percent due

Opponents say the tests often deliver flawed results. This has

to prostate cancer since these frequently led to overtreatment, stress and anxiety. Furthermore, the test may indicate cancer, or it could be detecting something much more benign,

like an infection or recent sexual intercourse. Also, a positive test reading can require a biopsy that takes place through the rectum, which can lead to a

number of uncomfortable side

One of the biggest arguments against tests is that they don't really lower a man's risk. Prostate cancer is a slowgrowing cancer for many men, which may not actually impair a man's health in his natural lifetime, especially since prostate cancer is largely a disease of men in their 60s and older.

The American Cancer Society has not taken sides on the matter. The Canadian Cancer Society has said that the test cannot diagnose cancer. If your tests are high, more tests are usually needed to determine if you have prostate cancer. They also say some types of prostate cancer grow slowly, may never cause problems, and don't need to be treated. Finding this type of cancer may lead to unnecessary treatment that can have side effects.

Whether to undergo a test or not is largely the decision for a man and his doctor. Some believe it to be invaluable in the fight against cancer, while others are no longer so sure about a test's efficacy.

Is heavy tea consumption linked to prostate cancer?

fter water, tea is the second most popular beverage in the world. However, new evidence suggests that men who tend to be prolific tea drinkers may be at a higher risk for developing prostate cancer than those who are not.

A Scottish study led by Dr. Kashif Shafique of the Institute of Health & Wellbeing at the University of Glasgow points out that, among the 6,016 Scottish men ages 21 to 75 who participated in the 37-year study, heavy tea drinkers, defined as those who had more than seven cups of tea a day, were at 50 percent higher risk of developing prostate cancer than men who drank less tea. Of the men who were reported to have consumed the most tea on a daily basis, 6.4 percent developed prostate cancer while the study was being conducted.

take into consideration a host of factors, including family history or any additional dietary choices beyond tea, coffee and alcohol intake, the doctor believes heavy tea drinking can increase prostate cancer risk. But Dr. Shafique indicates that

itself is a risk factor or it is simply that people who drink tea. which is high in antioxidants, are more likely to live longer lives. That's an important distinction, as a man's risk of developing prostate cancer increases dramatically as he ages.

The study does not show a direct link between tea consumption and prostate cancer, so it is not wise for individuals to quit their tea habits particularly because tea has so many potentially positive side effects. Previous studies have shown that drinking tea may help reduce cholesterol levels and even help fight cancer. But the study does suggest that perhaps moderate tea consumption is best.

Until more information is discovered about tea's connection to prostate cancer, men can continue to enjoy their favorite varieties, but it might be prudent to Though the study did not he doesn't know whether the tea err on the side of moderation.

Recognizing the signs and symptoms of prostate cancer

rostate cancer is a deadly disease that forms in the tissues of the prostate, a gland in the male reproductive system that is found below the bladder and in front of the rectum. According to the Canadian Cancer Society, prostate cancer is the most common cancer among Canadian men (excluding nonmelanoma skin cancers). while the National Cancer Institute estimates that nearly 30,000 American men will lose their lives to prostate cancer in 2014, and roughly 15 percent of American men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer at some point in their life.

Despite its status as a

potentially deadly disease, prostate cancer can be beaten. In fact, the NCI notes that the five-year survival rate for men diagnosed with prostate cancer between 2004 and 2010 was 98.9 percent, proving that a prostate cancer diagnosis is not a death sentence. Like many types of cancer, prostate cancer is most effectively treated when discovered in its early stages. For example, the five-year survival rate for patients diagnosed with localized prostate cancer, which describes cancer that is found only in the part of the body where it started, between 2004 and 2010 was 100 percent.

Men are often their own best friends when it comes to fighting prostate cancer. Men over 50 should speak to their physicians about routine prostate cancer screenings, which include the prostate-specific antigen test or the digital rectal examination. Such screenings can help detect prostate cancer early and dramatically improve a man's prognosis. In addition to screenings, men can learn the signs and symptoms of prostate cancer to further improve their chances of surviving a diagnosis.

Early signs of prostate cancer

Prostate cancer does not always show signs or symptoms in its early stages, and that's because it tends to be slow-growing. A sign of prostate cancer refers to something that a physician or healthcare professional can observe and recognize, while a symptom is something that only the person experiencing it can feel. It's important men recognize that certain symptoms associated with prostate cancer may be caused by other conditions and that the presence of these symptoms does not mean a man has prostate cancer. However, it's equally important that men who notice symptoms associated with prostate cancer bring them to the attention of their physicians immediately.

Changes in bladder habits are among the most common symptoms of prostate cancer, and these symptoms tend to be early indicators of the disease. These changes may include a frequent need to urinate, especially at night; an intense need to urinate; difficulty in starting or stopping the flow of urine; inability to urinate; weak and/or interrupted urine stream; and burning or pain during urination.

Blood in urine or semen and painful ejaculation may also indicate the presence of prostate cancer.

Late signs of prostate cancer

When prostate cancer is not detected early, the cancer then grows larger and may metastasize, or spread to other organs of the body. This spreading can produce the following late signs and symptoms, which differ greatly from those that appear during the early stages of prostate cancer.

- Bone pain, especially in the back, hips, thighs or neck
- Weight loss
- Fatigue
- Low red blood cell count (anemia)
- Weakness or numbness in the legs or feet
 - Loss of bladder or bowel control

Though prostate cancer is a potentially deadly disease, men who prioritize screening and learn to recognize its signs and symptoms can vastly improve their chances of surviving a diagnosis.





If you are married to a

US Citizen or green card holder who is abusive or has abandoned you, you may be entitled to a work permit and green card even if you are divorced or have a criminal record. You do not need your spouse to fi le for you or sponsor you or attend the interview with you. This relief is also applicable to child (including step child), fi ancée and parent of US citizens or green card holder. You can also get relief if you are married to a citizen or green card holder who was already married but did not divorce before marrying you, that is, a bigamy or polygamy situation.

2. PARENTS OF US CITIZEN WANTING TO WORK AND MAINTAIN THEIR CHILDREN:

Are you a parent of a US Citizen Child or Green card holder? You may be administratively approved for a work permit to enable you to maintain your family. This is an administrative relief subject to

discretion of the government officials.

3. ILLEGAL ENTRY INTO THE US:

This is a major problem but there is relief for special immigrants married to a US Citizen or green card holder or those who have US citizen children. You may still get a work permit and green card.

4. ILLEGAL REENTRY AFTER DEPORTATION:

Did you enter the US after being deported? This is a crime. There is relief for special immigrants married to a US Citizen or green card holder. Hurry to talk to us before you are arrested. You may be entitled to relief?

5. WORK PERMIT AND GREEN CARD FOR CHIL-DREN AND YOUNG PERSONS:

- Are you less than 21 years old?
- · Are you living in the US dependent on someone other than your parent?
- · Is your natural parent dead or lack viable means to take care of you?
- Do you think it is not in your best interest to return to country of birth or citizenship now? You may be entitled to work permit and or green card whether you entered with visa or not. You may still be approved even if you entered without inspection, entered with fraudulent document or overstayed your visa or have certain criminal record.

6. CRIMINAL RECORDS: WAIVERS AND PARDONS:

If you are convicted or pled guilty to a crime in the past it can generate complexities and be a nightmare but waivers and various special actions and legal procedures are available to relieve immigrants with past criminal records.

7. REMOVING 2-YEAR CONDITIONAL GREENCARD:

Many immigrants have found it difficult to remove conditions on their 2 year green cards either because they are not able to convince

the government that their marriage is genuine or because they are not getting cooperation from their spouse. 





BOOK REVIEW

Get inspired by 'Destiny'

'Destiny: Step into Your Purpose By T.D. Jakes 2015, Faith Words \$25.00 • \$30.00 Canada 255 pages

Around work, you've gotten a reputation as the go-to person for certain things.

Everybody has a talent; yours happens to be on the job. People know you're good, they utilize your ability, and you don't mind. It's not a big deal to you, but could there be more to it? T.D. Jakes thinks so, and in his new book "Destiny: Step into Your Purpose," he shows how your talents may reveal a new path.

In the moments after leaving a meeting with Coretta Scott King some years ago, T.D. Jakes began to ponder something she'd said about destiny. He "lived a life to which [he] felt drawn." That kind of success, he knew, was attainable

for everyone.

You have talents that are inherent inside you, says Jakes. -You may not understand them. You may call them God-given, dumb luck, or fate, but those talents are your destiny and "... people must learn to live genuine lives that allow them to perform the... tasks they are gifted to do."


In following your destiny, remember that it's a process. That doesn't mean things can't happen quickly, but it's unlikely. Time will give you the chance to grow and learn to use your talents to their utmost; just be patient and understand that few things happen when it's convenient. Meanwhile, gather all the skills you can get, which "may be just what you need to propel you..." And remember that "the only reason we have steps is to get us to a higher level."

Learn to prioritize, not just in your tasks but in your relationships, your finances, and in your dreams. Don't "fix every problem that comes across your radar." Know how to handle situations that are important, and "leave behind small thinking."

Don't confuse who you are with what you do. Remember that pain and failure are part of the journey, but don't let them deter you from your destiny and don't waste a second of your life. And remember that "Sometimes the best hello to a new opportunity is the good-bye you gave to a dead situation."

As I see it, there are two main aspects that set "Destiny" apart from other books that line the business shelves at the library or bookstore: it's perhaps not surprisingly quite faith-based, and it's very surprisingly quiet in its steadfastness.

Author T.D. Jakes is almost laser-focused-insistent in his urgings for readers, in fact, and that's not a bad thing. Jakes' words feel like a giant hand on your back, like an industrial magnet pulling toward success and his advice, though sometimes repetitive, is startlingly intense. Again, that's not a distraction, but there was one thing that did bother me: I saw

More than 100 candidates to contest **T&T** election

A total of 132 candidates will be contesting the General Election in Trinidad and Tobago on Sept. 7, 2015.

When nominations closed last Monday at various registration offices across the country, there were 17 political parties and five independents who would be contesting the election, according to the Election and Boundaries Com-

The United National Congress (UNC), which is led by Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar is the major partner in the People's Partnership (PP) coalition has nominated 28 candidates for the 41 constituencies, while the other coalition partner, the Congress of the People (COP) led by Justice Minister Prakash Ramadhar is fielding only eight candidates — four less than in 2010. The minor parties in the coalition — the Tobago Congress of the People (TOP) is contesting two seats in the Sister Isle Tobago and the National Joint Action Committee (NJAC) is going with three candidates.'

The Independent Liberal Party (ILP) led by Jack Warner has 28 candidates in the election race.

The main Opposition party the People's National Movement (PNM) is contesting all 41 constituencies.

The Trinidad Humanity Campaign has three candidates, the New National Vision Party (three), and there are five Independents.

The pollsters are predicting a very close fight between the UNC and the PNM with the PNM slightly in the lead with 21 seats to the PP 20 seats.

The PNM has been campaigning on poor governance, corruption and escalating crime.

Prime Minister Persad-Bissessar has promised 19 items to be delivered in its "First 100 Days of Government" if it wins the election, which includes escalating crime, establish a financially independent judiciary, tackle the homeless problem, laptops for university students and tables to primary school pupils, which will begin in 2016.

Catholic Charities to welcome Pope to America

A seemingly unending procession of Roman Catholics are already queueing up to meet Pope Franciswhen he visits the United States for the first time.

The long line of potential spectators includes celebrities, and average citizens willing to wait extended hours in order to get a glimpse of the papal apostle from Rome during the six days he is slated to address faithful believers and even some non-believers in Washington, Philadelphia, and New York City.

"We are thrilled that the Holy Father is visiting the United States," Monsignor Kevin Sullivan, executive director of Catholic Charities for the Archdiocese of New York said.

Hosted here by Catholic Charities, the Pope will be the guest of an agency that aims to provide a vast array of human services, including protecting and nurturing children and youth, feeding the hungry, and sheltering the homeless, strengthening families and resolving crises, supporting the emotionally and physically

challenged, and welcoming and integrating immigrants and refugees.

"Our country and New York City in particular, has long been a beacon to those tired and oppressed who seek a better life," Monsignor Sullivan explained. "The Pope's visit with recipients of Catholic Charities' work; reflects the importance of charity and also recognizes the generosity that is a tradition of the United States."

The Holy See is slated to arrive here on Sept. 25 and a cross section of people who have benefitted from the services provided by Catholic Charities will be accommodated and blessed with admission to Madison Square Garden when he conducts a mass at mid-town.

Already confirmed to attend the mass gathering are a group of immigrant carpenters who have been chosen to build the altar where the papal leader

will speak. Also among the chosen are Honduran women who are now busy embroidering cloths that will be used to drape the altar.

The Hondurans represent the indigenous, immigrant Garifunos who reside in the Bronx.

Another group identified to be "Dreamers" — immigrants brought here as children by their parents in search of opportunities for a college education — will also receive special blessings.

A number of undocumented children and their parents or guardians are also assured a place among the 24,000 expected to attend the ticketed religious service.

And Dominican immigrant families in Washington Heights and the Bronx are also slated to participate in the special ceremony.



First recorded as a demo on his phone, the haunting love ballad "Cry to Me" is only the second song he ever wrote.

It concerns "a personal situation with a young woman I was dealing with," he explained.

poverty, girlfriends, God," he said.

At first blush, Mike Howell (Jesse Eisenberg) looks like your prototypical slacker with not much of a future. The small town stoner is very content to fritter away his life behind the counter of the local convenience store, so long as he can go home and get high with his girlfriend, Phoebe (Kristen Stewart), after work every day.

It's hard to figure out why she puts up with the loser, between his lack of ambition and a crippling fear of flying

that prevents them from venturing very far from landlocked Lymon, West Virginia. After all, she's attractive and has a decent career as a bail bondsman. Nevertheless, she sticks

with him, even after he has a panic attack in the airport and screws up their plans for the perfect Hawaiian getaway. Mike was as upset as Phoebe when he failed to muster up the courage to get on board, since he'd purchased a diamond ring with which to pop the question during the vacation.

But Phoebe has no idea that her beau has a hidden past as a sleeper agent trained as a deadly assassin by a U.S. government spy agency. Trouble is, Mike's been blissfully unaware of it, too, since a part of his brain was turned off when the Ultra program was put in proverbial mothballs.

However, the cozy couple is in for the shock of their lives soon after Adrian Yates (Topher Grace) targets Mike for death. The callous bureaucrat dispatches killers to Lymon to eliminate the remote risk of the dormant asset somehow activating and going rogue. Mike surprises himself when the hit men arrive to take him out.

He suddenly displays an array of prodigious fighting and survival skills implanted deep in his subconscious, and slays his attackers almost effortlessly.

Alternately sophisticated and silly, but ever unpredictable thanks to a few cleverly-concealed twists, "American Ultra" is a delightful summer sleeper not to be missed.



dle East and Africa.

Anticipation is high for at least a viewing of the world's most known religious disciple during the brief time he will spend in NYC.

Fraser-Pryce, Bolt win 100-meter

Jamaica's sprint dominance continued on Sunday with race favorite Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce capturing the women's 100-meter world title.

The 'Pocket Rocket,' Fraser-Pryce, is now the first three-time world champion in the women's 100

meters, thanks to her exciting win at the International Amateur Athletics Federation World Championships in Beijing, China.

Fraser-Pryce beat out the Netherland's Dafne Schippers, who placed second, and the United States' Tori Bowie, who came third.

The two-time Olympic gold medalist's winning time of 10.76 seconds comes a day after fellow Jamaican sprinter Usain Bolt's victory in the men's 100m race.

"We are delighted to celebrate with the 'Pocket Rocket,' Shelly-Ann

Fraser-Pryce, on her emphatic win in the 100-meter at the 15th IAAF World Championships in Beijing," said Wykeham McNeill, Jamaica's Minister of Tourism and Entertainment. "Shelly-Ann is in a class by herself, clinching her third individual World Championship win by retaining her 100m title. Jamaicans at home and abroad are beaming with pride today"

Jamaica's Director of Tourism Paul Pennicook was also high in praise for Fraser-Pryce.

"Shelly-Ann has had a remarkable career, and her win in the 100-meter concretizes her dominance on the track," he said. "She has worked hard this year, and we are excited to celebrate her golden run."

McNeill and Pennicook also had high praises for sprint king Usain Bolt, who had a challenging year in preparing for the World Championships.

They said the pride of Jamaica was once again on display for the entire world, as Bolt, the two-time Olympic gold medalist, edged Gatlin, in the finals on Sunday.

In 9.79 seconds, the Jamaican sensation narrowly beat Gatlin by 0.01 seconds in the long-awaited match up of the sport's top two athletes. The victory snaps Gatlin's two-year, 28 race

"Shelly-Ann has had a remarkable career, and her win in the 100-meter concretizes her dominance on the track," he said. "She has worked hard this year, and we are excited to celebrate her golden run."

"We are extremely elated to congratulate our native son, Usain Bolt, on his 9.79 clocking to win the world 100-meter title in Beijing," McNeill said. "Being touted as perhaps his greatest miracle of all, he beat American, Justin Gatlin, to retain his world 100meter title, and as he said he would, he brought it home!

The victory placed him on level with Carl Lewis and Maurice Greene, both of

whom have won three 100-meter world

"Jamaicans everywhere are proud today," he added.

Inside the same stadium where he romped home to victory in 2008, winning two Olympic gold medals and setting two world records, Bolt rose to the occasion silencing many of his critics who doubted his form ahead of the Championships, the Jamaica Tourist Board said.

"It's a great win for the undisputed sprint king, and we are happy that he was able to put his early season struggles behind him to snatch victory," Pennicook said. "Bolt has represented Jamaica with great distinction, and we are proud to share in his successes."

"This is Usain Bolt's best race ever" said American sprint legend and BBC commentator Michael Johnson after the race. "When it comes to Bolt, that's a familiar refrain. Seven years after shocking the world at the Beijing Olympics, the best could still be ahead of



Toll numbers may be a direct line to trouble.

Classified ads are intended to help people by facilitat-ing communication and advertising available services; however, some of the hotlines & service num-bers in classifieds actually hurt the people who rely or them by cheating them of their hard-earned dollars. "Most newspapers print a disclaimer in their classified ad section to warn readers ad section to warm readers about numbers that are a direct line to trouble. Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges. "Consu-mers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information. the source of all informa-tion & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party."


