Francine Chin is taking over Internet radio

We are spoon-fed that radio, newspapers, magazines and eventually television, are dying.

Many pioneers have left their perches in search of either joining the new wave in the digital realm or reminiscing on the good ol' days.

Francine Chin stands as a radio powerhouse who has taken her talents online with the new school but manages to keep everything else old school. "There's no rules in doing it on online radio," Chin explained. "As you know, it is a free medium so I think what most of what you will find are just folks who want to do their thing without the training and there's nothing that we should say to discredit that. However, when you want to establish and maintain a professional outfit than obviously you should do it the way it's supposed to be done with some updates."

Chin is a decorated radio host with a background in broadcast media. Spanish and English. Her drive to be one of the greatest started in her teenage years after being inspired to be a voice on the radio like the greats before her.

"Since I was a young teenager, I wanted to do radio mainly because of some influences that were on radio in Jamaica where I was born. Namely, the biggest influence was a woman called Marie Garth. I just fell in love,"

Like many Caribbean radio hosts before her, Chin took the traditional route to achieve radio host status. After high school, she immersed herself in theater training and some speech work.

In 1982, Chin's first opportunity to join the airwaves presented itself when wellknown Don Topping approached her to start working at radio Jamaica. "At the time I couldn't do it, I was newly married, pregnant, I had a good job position and I totally

There is a wealth of women's organizations aiming to pull women together in the name of sisterhood and empowerment.

On college campuses, women have many organizations to choose from whether it is within a sorority, student union, faith based or Caribbean based organization.

Bringing women together to empower and celebrate their cultural heritage, the Grenadian American Young Women's Association (GAYWA) is championing for their beloved country with a passion to impact and effect change.

Kizzi Belfon, a Grenadian native and past president of GAYWA, could have joined any women's health organization but chose GAYWA for a sense of community.

"It would be great — and none of us are objecting to being members of women's organizations that are more inclusive — but I think when you're in a place like New York City and you have all these people from these different areas it's good to band together. And a lot of times when people migrate here there isn't that community connection. Being together, there's so much we can do because we have that commonality of being Grenadian so that makes us push more," Belfon said.

I'm around people who are around my age range. My mother, she didn't really engage me in much of the culture when I was younger and that's why I took it upon myself to join an organization like this where I can learn more and become more connected."

Founded Nov. 10, 2010, the founding ladies realized that there were more for them to do following a Grenadian

beauty pageant where they connected. "At the end of the pageant, we all got together and literally just started hitting the ground running. The idea was really just to speak to the youth in the diaspora as well as back home and to have events and do charitable things to help," Noreen Wall, a Grenadian native and founding member, said.

Joining Caribbean Life at its inception, Pryce has delivered insightful pieces from her coverage of Nelson Mandela's visit to Jamaica to interviewing Fidel Castro at Columbia University, to name just a few.

"I'm a beat reporter so I cover entertainment, I've been known to cover sports in that publication, I have a column in that publication where I cover politics and whatever is happening in the New York area with the Caribbean community," Pryce explained.

Before bringing her talents to Caribbean Life newspaper, Pryce worked as the entertainment editor at The Amsterdam News and also wrote for many black publications in New York

"Simone Gill — who was the founding editor of that paper — was very excited to have regular coverage. At that time, Caribbean Life was a bimonthly publication," she said.

Since joining the Caribbean Life newspaper family, Pryce has at times covered the paper - having one page dedicated to her many stories.

"At times I had a page dedicated to whatever I was covering and other items throughout the paper," she said.

Pryce remains a valuable member to the team, aiming to always report on what matters most to the Caribbean community away from the islands. Her hope for Caribbean Life newspaper is that the paper continues to provide information pertinent to the audience, nothing cookie cutter that can be found elsewhere.

THE NEWS FROM BACK HOME

Antigua

The Antigua and Barbuda government says it will settle the country's longstanding debt to the Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development.

The debt, which dates back to the late 1990s, provided loans to the country for the construction and renovation of the parallel taxiway at the airport, the repairs of All Saints Road, and the construction of American Road to Airport Road.

Prime Minister Gaston Browne

and the first Deputy Prime Minister, Charles "Max" Fernandez signed off the new financial arrange-



ment recently, with the chairman of the Fund's board, Sheik Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabha.

In a response to the development, Leader of the United Progressive Party (UPP) Harold Lovell said his administration had failed to resolve the debt during its time in office.

He explained that the government had been unable to come to agreeable terms with the Western Asian Fund.

"It's a debt that we met and during our 10 years it's the only one, with the exception of the one with Trinidad and Tobago that we had not resolved from the administration before our time," he said.

The former finance minister further noted that his administration had devised a debt management plan to service Antigua and Barbuda's mounting debt burden.

Bahamas

The U.S. Department of State has warned citizens traveling to The Bahamas because of a rise in armed robberies in New Providence.

A recent travel advisory posted on the Department of States' Overseas Security Advisory (OSCA) website warns visitors of an increase in robberies in tourist areas.

"An apparent two-year rise in armed

robberies in The Bahamas has spurred numerous warnings by foreign governments to their citizens visit-



ing the country," the report said.

"Given the large volume of U.S. tourists that visit The Bahamas and recent criminal incidents in popular tourist destinations, American visitors to tourism hubs in Nassau should be cognizant of heightened criminal risks," the report said.

On each country's website, travelers are warned that crime in The Bahamas is on the rise.

Barbados

Legal Education, which runs the Norman Manley School to court challenging its refusal to admit him to pursue the six-month course to qualify to practice law in Jamaica.

Owen Roach is contending that the law degree he obtained in 2001 from Middlesex University is of equivalent rating to the LLB offered at the University of the West Indies.

Lawvers from overseas are required to do a six-month program before they can be allowed to practice law in Jamaica. Roach is seeking leave from the

Supreme Court to go for Judicial Review to quash the council's decision not to admit him to the Norman

The application is set for hearing on Oct. 13. He is also seeking an expedited hearing for judicial review.

Roach, who is a barrister-at-law residing in London, obtained a joint major Bachelor's degree in law and politics at the Middlesex University in the United Kingdom.

He is a citizen of Montserrat and therefore a citizen of CARICOM and is expected to apply to the Law School in Jamaica, he said in his court docu-

Cayman Islands

on churches in the Cayman to stand firm against gay marriage, noting that the only morally acceptable sex is that between a man and woman who are married and everything else was a sin.

Pastor Alson Ebanks from the Church of God in a statement submitted to the media that the objection by Christians to gay sex is not hate speech and has compared the expression of those objections to homosexuality to a parent chastising a child for being badly behaved.

Defending the church's opposition to

same sex unions, the pastor wrote that the church rejected the practice of classifying as 'hate speech' any



objection to a particular behavior lifestyle, in particular when the opposition is to be the behavior and not an attack on the personhood of the practitioners.

In the statement, which was endorsed by all of the pastors of the various Church of God congregations in the Cayman Islands, the influential pastor, who is one of several local church leaders who have been particularly vocal over their objection to same-sex unions and gay marriages, but almost silent on most other sex-related transgressions, said no human is free from "sexual challengers" and that "all sexual behavior has moral implications."

As the local Human Rights Commission awaits a response from govern-A Cayman Islands pastor is calling ment about how it plans to address the

question of civil unions for gay couples in Cayman, it appears likely that sooner or later same-sex unions will be legal in the Cayman Islands, regardless of the position taken by religious institutions.

Cuba

The communist-island of Cuba is expecting some three million tourists this year.

This was revealed by Cuban tourism official Pablo Vazquez who said in Panama that given the tourist boom witnessed by the island, marked by a 17 percent growth.

Vaguez who is the representative for Venezuela and Central America made his statement during the opening of Panama's Tourist Fair and he added that over 10,000 Panamanians have

traveled to Cuba this year.

Cuban authorities are currently building new tourist facilities,



marinas and other resorts on the cavs to the northern of central Villa Clara province and in eastern Holguin province, said Vaquez.

The construction program is joined by more than 11,000 private homes offering accommodations in coordination with the Ministry of Tourism, plus another 53 business projects included in the island's tourist investment portfolio.

Churning out 10 to 12 articles a week, boasting an impressive list of celebrities he has held conversations with, and one of the few black reviewers on popular site Rotten Tomatoes, Kam Williams' career as a film reporter happened seemingly by accident.

A resident of Princeton, New Jersey, Williams was charged with the opportunity to write film reviews by an editor who was fed up with her current film reviewer that often took two-week vacations; leaving an empty space where his review would have been.

"She said, I know you like movies would you like to go

Nelson King: Caribbean Life's freelancer since 1990

Nelson King began putting pen to paper for Caribbean Life newspaper while wrapping his senior year at Brooklyn College, pursuing a dual degree in Political Science and Journalism, back in 1990.

King's affinity for words and sharp reporting did not start in the Fall of 1990, rather, it began right at home in St. Vincent and the Grenadines where his focus was to shine a bit of light on his hometown, Chateaubelair.

"I covered a lot of politics but I initially started out as a sports reporter — I wanted to put my town on the map," King, who served as the president for the North Leeward Cricket Association and Chateaubelair Football Association in St. Vincent, said.

King's first piece for Caribbean Life newspaper featured a cricket player who's stomach was sticking out — reigning in a bit of laughter from the audience.

"I did the story and I didn't realize it had so much impact on the readers; a couple people called me up and told me they were making fun of the guy in the article. I was a senior in college — been around a long time and have paid my dues so to speak," he said.

His extensive resume included experience serving as a correspondent for multiple Caribbean-based publications.

In the mid-late 1980s, King had toured the Eastern Caribbean – travelling from St. Vincent to St. Lucia, Dominica, Antigua, Montserat – as a way to promote himself and his work. Before landing at Caribbean Life, King had already corresponded for exceptional news organizations such as the

Stacked alongside his vast journalism experiences are his time spent teaching Caribbean History and other topics at secondary schools in St. Vincent, serving as a local preacher, and activist in his community. All of these experiences lent to his inspiration to begin writing, documenting all that he encountered.

"I began to report these activities in the community to the national radio station and newspapers pro bono," he said.

Much of his success he attributes to his extensive education, including an undergraduate law degree — LL.B (Upper Second Class Honors) — from Huddersfield University School of Law at Holborn College in the United Kingdom, and an associate degree in Liberal Arts from St. Leo



Paul Clement — Grenadian political scientist


By Nelson A. KingPaul C. Clement is an associate professor of Economics and chair of the Department of Social Sciences at the Fashion Institute of Technology (FIT), State University of New York (SUNY).

Clement, who was born on Grenada's smaller sister isle, Petite Martinque - the larger one is Carriacou - holds a Ph.D. in politics from The New School University in Manhattan; a Master of Arts (MA) degree in politics from The New School University; a Master of Arts (MA, Honors) degree in economics from Brooklyn College of the City University of New York (CUNY); and a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in accounting from Brooklyn College, CUNY.

He also holds a certificate in industrial and labor relations from Cornell University.

Clement's interests are in the areas of international political economy and comparative poli-

es on the politics of regional integration in the developing world, namely Latin America, the Caribbean and Africa.

Clement has also been an adjunct professor in economics, from 1990 — present, at Nassau Community College in Long Island; and an adjunct professor in economics, from 1998-2013, at St. Francis College in Brooklyn.

He teaches courses in macroeconomics, microeconomics, international economics, labor economics, health economics, and money and banking.

forthcoming Clement's papers are on "Foreign Aid and Regional Integration: The CARICOM case;" "The Influence of National Parliaments on Caribbean integration;" and "Implementation Deficit: Why member States do not comply with CARICOM directives."

On March 26 this year, he wrote an article in the New York Times on "Reflecting on the Trayvon Martin Tragedy."

He has published two books: "The Quest for Economic Development in the Caribbean (1999)" and "Petite Martinique: Traditions and Social Change (2000)." Among Clement's recent scholarly presentations are: "Contemporary Issues of Conflict and Governance" at the 68th Annual New York State Political Science Association (NYSPSA) Conference; "Making Unions and Workplaces

Higher Education Conference, Lake Buena Vista, Fl.; and "The Politics of Regional Integration in the Developing World: The Case of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM)," Economic Globalization, Development and Integration Conference, Lehman College, CUNY.

Clement's recent professional conferences comprise co-chair, conference on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), FIT; New York State United Teachers (NYSUT) Financial and Fiscal Reporting, Tarrytown, N.Y.; American Federation of Teachers (AFT) Special Leadership Conference, Washington D.C.; and moderator, Legal Issues, New York State United Teachers Community College Conference, Saratoga N.Y.



The party's over for U.N.'s Sustainable Development Goals

UNITED NATIONS, Sept. 30, 2015 (IPS) - The Pope has left the U.N. and the traffic in Manhattan is back to normal. The hoard of government delegations, NGOs and civil society representatives are packing up and the press is moving on. The party's over for the Sus-

tainable Development Goals.

Last week member states of the U.N. agreed goals, which set to end extreme poverty, fight against inequality and fix climate change. The Sustainable Development goals cover almost every aspect of poverty and are targets for every country around the world — devel-

oped and developing alike.

For such ambitious goals to be achieved, leaders will need to turn their promises on inequality into policies that will deliver real change. One day after the deal was done, I had a glimpse of how hard it will be to convince the world's leaders. Attending a meeting on growth as part of the official SDG agenda, I was surprised the narrative of free trade and mega-investments continued to flow unbounded from governments.

Despite having a goal dedicated to ending inequality, the language of false market-based solutions continues — the same solutions which for years have locked people into

low paid employment, divested money from public services and helped drive up inequality in almost all countries. The consequences of bad investments on people and the environment — causing environmental degradation, evictions and land grabbing — were blatantly ignored.

But here lies the catch. Corporations are not just stalking the corridors of the U.N. and promoting investments damaging to the poor, they also have a stranglehold on how countries raise tax, which will enable them to pay for the goals

ActionAid research last month discovered tax incentives given to big corporations

in West Africa drain the region of an estimated 9.6 billion dollars a year — money which could be spent on health and education. And globally it is estimated that developing countries lose over 200 billion dollars a year from corporate tax dodging. Yet rich countries continue to block moves for a global body on tax to make the rules fairer.

The 800 million people in poverty worldwide need change. In many ways, people are ahead of the U.N. as they're doing it without flashy launch events or concerts. Across Africa, people have been mobilised and fought for the right to free primary school education, with massive wins.

It's not that we here on the outside weren't hip to the sick games these GOP charlatans were shamelessly content to play with a serious incident that had occasioned the loss of American lives in Benghazi. Persons even slightly familiar with the goings-on in the aftermath of that consulate attack in 2012 knew that multiple investigations including, outside of government, an independent New York Times probe, had found no evidence of then Secretary of State Clinton conducting herself other than altogether responsibly. The spotlight that has been turned on McCarthy, revealing him to be not very bright, cannot but set lots of us to wondering how is it possible, today, for seats of power in the U.S. to be occupied by folks who so glaringly don't belong there. What's absolutely amazing in the case of McCarthy is that, as a congressman and, to boot, one installed in the leadership ranks, why doesn't he have staff capable of making him not look as much the ninny as he now does. And where does the GOP get off, foisting vet another circus act on the American citizenry as leadership material? The speaker of the House is next in the line

of succession to the presidency behind the vice president, for heaven's sake.

McCarthy's goof and gaffes should be a bonanza for Democrats who seem ready to play some hard ball, rather than act timid in the face of typical dirty pool by Republicans, as they're so often prepared to do. The Dems are now talking about releasing testimony given before the select committee on Benghazi that controlling Republicans would rather have kept under wraps. Meanwhile, we're left to ponder the very disturbing prospect of Republicans electing McCarthy House speaker — two heartbeats away from the presidency. Word on the street is that McCarthy is facing what is at best lukewarm challenges to his being anointed Boehner's successor. And it should give great pause to a concerned electorate that the enormous power and privilege that attends the number one figure on Capitol Hill will apparently come to reside in an absolute misfit.

Not by a long shot was Boehner any great shakes as speaker. His accomplishments in the role, such as they were, will never land him among the memorable names of speakers past. In light of which, one is constrained to wonder if there isn't something almost sinister at play in a departing Boehner willingly ceding his space to the likes of clueless Kevin McCarthy.

waited until I came here and I went to broadcasting school," she said.

Following her broadcast instruction, Chin kicked off her career with Caribbean radio pioneer, Ken Williams where she soaked in a wide range of knowledge from her mentor.

Taking over local and international airwaves for nearly 24 years and counting, Chin has worked with the late Philip Smart and has provided voice over work for public relations agencies in New York City and Fox F.M. in Melbourne, Australia.

Now, the Jamaican native is spearheading a new project: online radio. Providing a Caribbean centered show with the inclusion of a few other veteran hosts, Chin boasts an average listenership of 200,000 and counting.

"I am pleasantly surprised at the success of what we're doing on Internet radio and how much I have learned," she said. "It shows how times are changing and where the next big thing is. A lot of folks tell me I came into this game at the right time because when they started there was not much respect for Internet radio. Now, you have someone like the former director of KISS FM who has a fully up and running Internet station like we do.'

The seasoned radio host manages to offer a full radio line-up through the access the Internet provides. Tapping into other networks who carry her show

as well, Chin cherry picks radio hosts who fit her standards — many of whom are colleagues of hers — to fill in the hours from morning to late evening.

"Well basically, each of us have our own network," Chin said. "I have 1095 Jamz and I take the morning show from someone who has another network with a full lineup. I had a twohour slot from 10-12 so I fit in a gentleman who has another additional 20 networks that carries him, there's some music but there's mostly talk. Mid-day, I take Clinton Lindsay who is one of the more established networks within the foundation radio network. I take Clinton's show because we are very close and we worked together in New York and he has a huge listenership. Patrick Lafayette has a small network where he does mostly music without talk but at 6 o'clock he comes on. That's how I get my full line-up, taking professionals from different networks and they carrying me."

Her ability to include all of these different networks who in turn carry her is something she coins as: "the power of the network" — which she ultimately attributes to networking and the willingness to build community.

Since the inception of the online radio station, Chin's thoughts on expansion includes reaching out to local media outlets including newspapers and magazines catering to the Caribbean community.

According to GAYWA, "The purpose of the Grenadian-American Young Women's Association is to promote the advancement of the youth within communities throughout Grenada, Carraicou and Petite Martinique. To implement programs that will facilitate their development educationally, socially and culturally.'

Since its inception, GAYWA has worked to create culturally enriched programming for Grenadian natives and first generation Grenadian Americans within the organization.

Celebrating their fifth year anniversary this year, GAYWA has grown insurmountably. From membership to events, GAYWA has been able to create pillar events including "Fashion For A Cause" and their "Take A Stand" campaign.


"One major thing that we've done in the past five years is our domestic violence campaign, "Take A Stand," and that was in response to a number of killings and incidents of domestic violence in a matter of 12 days back home in Grenada. That really energized us and got us upset so we really wanted to do something about that and we started this campaign. We adopted a home — a women's shelter in Grenada - we did an IndiGoGo in November of 2013 and we raised over \$5000 towards that cause. We're still working with the home and we're trying to give some long-term help to the women there," Belfon said. The money raised was used to buy books for the home, maintain the house grounds and more.

The women hope to raise more funds and make a trip to Cedar's House where they want to get into the ground to make some aesthetic changes. "Our program once a year would be Cedar's Home, the home that we adopted, and when we do "Fashion for a Cause" we have been donating to Cedar's Home. We're working towards making some physical improvements to the home itself right now," Wall added.

Together, these women have watched each other face challenges, lean on each other for support and accomplish goals. Already accomplishing five years, the ladies of GAYWA hope that the future of the organization will continue to strive empower women within a sisterly bond.

"I think a legacy of sisterhood and just togetherness. I really want everyone coming in to understand that we're in this together and at the end of the day we're all the same. To really look at each other to learn and grow,' Wall said.

"I really want our legacy, the members, to be able to look at the older members and see how diverse we are, see our journeys and learn from that and be inspired by that," Belfon added.

The community work of Montserratian Dr. George Irish, dean of the School of Liberal Arts and Education at Brooklyn's Medgar Evers College, embraces diverse fields.

This involves multicultural, bilingual and special education issues; curriculum development; research, evaluation and assessment; parent involvement; counseling; placement and adjustment concerns, among others.

Additionally, he is a consultant on Multicultural Education to New York City Board of Education and New York State Education Department.

Dr. Irish is a member of the Doctoral Dissertation Committee, St. John's University, N.Y.



Arze and Mollica, LLP – helping the injured

We seem to be reading about far too many construction accidents these days.

The Manhattan trict Attorney's Office recently filed criminal charges against two construction companies for the death of a 22-year-old worker last April. The companies allegedly ignored warnings issued by inspectors to the site that dangerous conditions existed, and they disregarded federal safety regulations. The excavation of the site went as deep as 14 feet, without the fortification required by both city and federal law for excavations deeper than five feet. Gerald Arze of the law firm, Arze and Mollica LLP says, "Unfortunately, big business and construction sometimes comes ahead of worker safety, and it shouldn't."

Becoming injured in this type of accident — or any type of accident — is painful.

But the legal restitution process shouldn't be — and it won't be - when Arze and Mollica LLP is on your side.

The Brooklyn law firm recently obtained a jury award of more than \$800,000 for an undocumented worker who was injured while performing brick pointing on the roof of a commercial building. He was working within a chimney which was thought to be sealed. Instead, it collapsed, causing the injured worker to fall approximately seven stories down the chimney chute, savs Mr. Arze.

The worker suffered a fractured ankle, a fractured scapula, lower back injuries, and fractured ribs. A vear later, he underwent an arthroscopic surgery to repair damage sustained to his shoulder. The law office of Arze and Mollica filed a motion on his behalf, requesting that liability be awarded in his favor.

"The building owner failed to provide sufficient safety devices to him at the work site," says Mr. Arze. The court agreed, and declared the building owner was negligent in permitting the work to be done in that fashion, but a jury trial is still always required to determine the amount of compensation which should be awarded under the circumstances, he

At trial, the building owner's attorneys claimed he recovered from these injuries, and that he could now return to work in the same capacity.

"A one-week jury trial determined that our client be awarded over \$800,000 in damages for past and future pain and suffering, as well as past medical expenses," says

When situations like these arise, there are lots of questions that come up, long before any decision is made. For example, people want to know: How long will it take before there's a settlement? Who pays for medical care if you have no insurance?

It can take six months to a few years before a case is resolved, says Mr. Arze. Medical coverage depends upon many factors. If it's a car accident, No Fault is part of every auto insurance policy, but if the accident happened at work, it may be covered by Worker's Compensation.

"If it occurred on someone's premises, there may sometimes be insurance coverage available for medical treatment," says Mr. Arze.

When issues aren't so clear, the services are of an attorney are all the more important.

Jamaica

Britain's Prime Minister David Cameron and his Japanese counterpart Shinzo Abe paid a short visit to Jamaica last week.

During his visit Cameron addressed

parliamentarians. Abe is expected also made a brief visit en route to the 70th anniversary celebrations of the



United Nations General Assembly in New York.

The Japanese prime minister used his visit to lobby Jamaica to influence member states in the Caribbean Community (CARICOM), in support of efforts to reform the UN Security Council.

Jamaica's Ambassador to the UN Courtenay Rattray is the incumbent chairman of the UN inter-governmental Negotiations on Security Council reform.

In addition to the visit of both prime ministers, Princess Anne of Edinburgh is also scheduled to visit this week (October) for a working visit.

Her visit coincides with her attendance at the Caribbean-Canada Emergency Leaders' Dialogue.

Guyana

Guyana and Venezuela have agreed to restore their respective ambassadors despite a continuing border dispute.

Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro and his Guyanese counterpart, David Granger, met recently in New York ahead of the United Nations General Assembly.

In July, Venezuela recalled its ambassador and last month stalled its acceptance of Guyana's nominee for ambassador to Caracas.

President Maduro said that Ven-

ezuela would restore its ambassador to Georgetown "immediately" and accept Guyana's nominee.



He described his meeting with President Granger as "complex, tense, difficult," but insisted Venezuela was "not an imperialist country" and that he wanted to restore "brotherly relations" with its eastern neighbor.

Granger had accused Venezuela of conducting an "extraordinary escalation of Venezuelan military activity" near the disputed border.



The fallout from last week's visit by British Prime Minister David Cameron to Jamaica continued this week with a flaming row over whether Jamaican authorities had in fact agreed to allow Britain to dump hundreds of Jamaican convicts serving time in British jails into a facility to be built on the island specifically for that purpose.

Cameron had already angered Jamaicans by dismissing calls for Britain to compensate Jamaica and the rest of the Caribbean for using millions of Black people as unpaid slaves on sugar and other plantations during the genocidal Trans Atlantic slave trade. In fact, he basically told them to forget all about it and focus on today's events and the future.

His level of flippancy and British arrogance has sparked an ongoing row in Jamaica as to whether authorities had exerted enough pressure on him to say something positive even though Prime Minister Portia Simpson-Miller said publicly said she had indeed

raised the issue with him during formal meetings.

Now the latest flare up has much to do with pressure London is exerting on Kingston to give in to already well developed British plans to donate about \$40M to Jamaica to build a spanking new facility to house about 700 Jamai-

cans serving time for various offenses in the United King-

Cameron's administration has complained about the cost of maintaining such a large posse of criminals from the island and thinks it best to send them home to serve time

years left on jail time.

Since his departure, there has been a back and forth about whether Jamaica had in fact agreed to both take the money to build the prison and to welcome, house and accept people who had not committed any crime on Jamaican soil.

Official websites in the UK are reporting that Kingston has bowed to the wishes and demands of Cameron but Jamaican Justice Minister Peter Bunting says no such deal has been signed, not even a memorandum of understanding.

"This is not the case. The fact is that we have agreed to commence a process, which may, or may not, result in a prisoner-transfer agreement. We have brought these inaccuracies to the attention of the British High Commission locally and trust that it will be corrected. We have not signed a prisoner-transfer agreement (PTA). The British government put an offer on the table, which is contingent upon our signing a prisoner-transfer agreement. We have said to once they have about three them that in order to sign

a prisoner-transfer agreement we first have to have legislation that will allow it."

Of the 700 in prison in England, about 300 are ready for transfer if only there was an agreement to allow for this.

Opposition Leader and former Prime Minister Andrew Holness as well as legislator Darvl Vaz asked in parliament this week for a clear and unequivocal guarantee from government that no such deal will go through bearing in mind general elections are about a year away.

"I am quite convinced, based on what I have heard, especially coming out of the mouth of the UK prime minister, that this deal is a done deal. The timing of the deal is not a good time. We have a certain event coming up," Vaz said.

How authorities will escape the pressure Cameron has heaped on by striking first with an announcement about an agreement is unclear but the issue is fast becoming an election headache for the Simpson-Miller administration as many believe it is not telling all it knows.



UN officials 'shocked' by ex-Antiguan diplomat arrest

Top United Nations officials say they are "shocked" and "deeply troubled" to learn about the "very serious allegations" announced by United States' federal prosecutors against Dr. John Ashe, a former president of the UN General Assembly and erstwhile Permanent Representative of Antigua and Barbuda to the UN.

U.S. federal prosecutors said on Tuesday that Ashe and a Chinese billionaire real estate developer from the territory of Macau were arrested and accused of engaging in a broad corruption scheme.

Ashe, 61, was one of six people identified in a criminal complaint outlining a bribery scheme that involved more than US\$1 million in payments from sources in China for assistance in real estate deals and other business interests, according to the New York Times.

Prior to his appointment as leader of the 68th session of the UN General Assembly in Sepand Barbuda's Permanent Representative to the UN.

Stéphane Dujarric, the spokesperson of UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon said on Tuesday that the allegations against Ashe "go to the heart of the integrity of the United

Asked about whether the UN was involved in the United States attorney's investigation, Dujarric told reporters that the UN was not informed of the case until it was featured in

"Obviously, if we're contacted by the relevant U.S. authorities, we will cooperate with them," he said.

President of the General Assembly's 70th session and former Speaker of the Danish Parliament, Mogens Lykketoft, said he, too, was shocked by the allegations.

'Coming from a country, which is consistently number one on the world transparency index and having served for 34

tember 2013, Ashe was Antigua years in Danish politics without being rich, I certainly am shocked about it, and I think that the United Nations and its representatives should be held to the highest standards of transparency and ethics," he told a news conference.

> Lykketoft said that when he took office as the President of the UN General Assembly on September 15, he committed himself to uphold these principles during his tenure, stating that "corruption has no place at the United Nations or anywhere else."

> The case is highly embarrassing to the United Nations, which had vowed to act with greater transparency and accountability after past scandals, according to the Times.

> But the paper said Ashe's case is different from the oilfor-food program scandal in Iraq a decade ago, when an independent commission found widespread abuse by UN officials

broad pattern of corruption by Ashe, who is accused of using the bribes to support a lavish lifestyle: spending US\$59,000 on hand-tailored suits in Hong Kong in 2013 and 2014, buying two Rolex watches in 2014 for US\$54,000, and later that year paying US\$40,000 to lease a new BMW X5, according to the Times.

He also bought a membership at a South Carolina country club for US\$69,000, and solicited money to construct a US\$30,000 basketball court at his home in Dobbs Ferry, New

York, according to the complaint.

"If proven, today's charges will confirm that the cancer of corruption that plagues too many local and state governments infects the United Nations as well," Preet Bharara, the United States attorney in Manhattan, told reporters.

He said that the investigation was still in its early stages, adding, "We're looking at a lot of things, and I wouldn't be surprised if you would see other people charged."







REMOVING IMMIGRATION NIGHTMARES

There are solutions to problems immigrants frequently experience. Among the problems and solutions are the following:



1. GETTING MARRIED TO A US CITIZEN OR GREEN CARD HOLDER AND BEING ABUSED OR **ABANDONED BY THE SPOUSE:**

If you are married to a US Citizen or green card holder who is abusive or has abandoned you, you may be entitled to a work permit and green card even if you are divorced or have a criminal record. You do not need your spouse to fi le for you or sponsor you or attend the interview with you. This relief is also applicable to child (including step child), fi ancée and parent of US citizens or green card holder. You can also get relief if you are married to a citizen or green card holder who was already married but did not divorce before marrying you, that is, a bigamy or polygamy situation.

2. PARENTS OF US CITIZEN WANTING TO WORK AND MAINTAIN THEIR CHILDREN:

Are you a parent of a US Citizen Child or Green card holder? You may be administratively approved for a work permit to enable you to maintain your family. This is an administrative relief subject to discretion of the government officials.

3. ILLEGAL ENTRY INTO THE US:

This is a major problem but there is relief for special immigrants married to a US Citizen or green card holder or those who have US citizen children. You may still get a work permit and green card.

4. ILLEGAL REENTRY AFTER DEPORTATION:

Did you enter the US after being deported? This is a crime. There is relief for special immigrants married to a US Citizen or green card holder. Hurry to talk to us before you are arrested. You may be entitled to relief?

5. WORK PERMIT AND GREEN CARD FOR **CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS:**

- Are you less than 21 years old?
- Are you living in the US dependent on someone other than your parent?
- Is your natural parent dead or lack viable

means to take care of you?

• Do you think it is not in your best interest to return to country of birth or citizenship now? You may be entitled to work permit and or green card whether you entered with visa or not. You may still be approved even if you entered without inspection, entered with fraudulent document or overstayed your visa or have certain criminal record.

6. CRIMINAL RECORDS: WAIVERS AND PAR-

If you are convicted or pled guilty to a crime in the past it can generate complexities and be a nightmare but waivers and

various special actions and legal procedures are available to relieve immigrants with past criminal records.

The charges represent a widening of the investigation of Ng Lap Seng, a developer based in Macau, who was arrested by customs officials in New York last month and charged with bringing US\$4.5 million into the United States under false pretenses, the Times said.

Ashe, according to the complaint, took payments from Ng and used "his official position to obtain for Ng potentially lucrative investments in Antigua."

In one instance, US\$200,000 was wired into Ashe's private bank account in exchange for a foreign trip in 2014 in his official capacity, to discuss a conference center that Ng wanted to develop for the United Nations, the compliant alleges.

The campaign to construct a permanent center in Macau seems to have started as early as February 2012, when Ashe, in his capacity as the ambassador to the United Nations from Antigua and Barbuda, proposed a "permanent expo and meeting centre" to be created with help from Ng's company, the Sun Kian Ip Group of China, the Times said.





Antigua & Barbuda will fund 'Rebels'

The government of Antigua recently earmarked \$20 to \$80 million of its budget sealing a deal that will spotlight "Rebels," a film about Robert Nesta Marley.

Allegedly, one-fifth of a total \$125 million development deal decided between the government of Antigua and Golden Island Filmworks, the agreement dictates that five feature films will be shot on the island.

Announced at the Toronto International Film Festival in Canada, reportedly, the deal was struck by the independent film company owned and operated by St. Kitts-born film producer Rudy Langlais.

"My partners and I had a dream more than 10 years ago, that the Caribbean, which has produced brilliant statesmen like Alexander Hamilton, Nobel Prize-winning poets and novelists, Walcott and Naipaul, legendary athletes like (Garfield) Sobers and (Vivian) Richards and (Usain) Bolt, and perhaps the world's greatest cultural icon in Bob Marley, should add its 'voice' now to filmmaking," Langlais explained.

His main partners in the ven-

ture are entrepreneur Valmiki Kempadoo, producer Don Allan and veteran film executive Neil Sacker.

"We have wanted to join our colleagues around the world to share our stories and join in telling stories together," Langlais added. "Now that time is here. Exciting films will come of this collaboration."

From the title, it is safe to believe that the Rastafarian reggae icon will not be the sole focus of the feature.

From early reports, along with the iconic musician a spotlight will shine on four men who discovered and mentored him through his journey to worldwide fame.

Already, the film company has acquired the life stories of Danny Sims, Allan "Skill" Cole, Johnny Nash, and David Simmons - the men who signed, developed, and produced Marley in the initial stages of his career.

From those insider perspectives, the film is expected to provide new insight and unprecedented information about Marley's life before he became the first Third World superstar.

Nash, the founder of JAD Records was first to sign the now-legendary singer/musician.

Sims, who died in 2012 at age 75 was Nash's partner and another principal to be spotlighted.

Allegedly, the film will examine Marley's career growth after meeting the Mississippi-born Sims and Nash, a Texan he met in Kingston, Jamaica during the late 1960s.

It is widely known that Sims successfully secured a deal for Nash with CBS Records. With that commercial relationship, the two hired Marley to write several songs including the hit

JAD recording "Stir it Up."

During that period, the Jamaican singer recorded with Peter Tosh and Bunny Livingston, with releases credited to Bob Marley & The Wailers.

Reportedly, the film company has secured the rights to never-before-released JAD Records catalogue which include much of the early Marley music.

In addition to biographical details from the revolutionary music investors, previously unreleased information about the early life of the reggae legend and songs from Marley's pre-fame career fans will be delighted with this alternative from the deluge of so-called definitive biopics on the Caribbean music legend.



Grammy-winning rapper's reunion with dad

Che "Rhymefest" Smith is among the handful of rappers who have actually managed to make it in the music industry. What's even more remarkable is the fact that the Grammywinning artist also overcame a challenging childhood, having been raised on the rough South Side of Chicago by a single-mom who'd given birth to him while still in her early

Despite his phenomenal success in the music business, one thing that nagged at Rhymefest was why he'd been abandoned by his father, Brian, a man

he'd only seen a few times in his entire life, and not at all over the past two decades. He wondered whether his dad ever cared or thought about him? Or might he be dead?

Rhymefest's curiosity was probably piqued because of the guilt he himself felt about having three out-of-wedlock offspring with baby-mamas he'd never committed to. He wanted

to understand why he'd perpetuated the cycle of parental neglect, especially since fatherless kids represent 60 percent of youth suicides, 71 percent of juvenile incarcerations and 90

percent of homeless children.

So, first, he proceeded to buy the house that his father grew up in and moved in with his wife, Donnie. Then, after hearing rumors that Brian was a local hobo and an alcoholic, he started scouring the streets of the Windy City for him.

Yes, he did search for and get his dad into rehab right after their tearful reunion. But would the lush find the strength to keep his nose clean with the help of this new lease on life coming in the form of a job, an apartment, and a loving, supportive son?

That is the tension that tugs at your heart while watching "In My Father's House," a prodigal dad documentary co-directed by Ricki Stern and Anne Sundberg. The picture proves to be very compelling as a sociological examination of profound dysfunction, but it's simultaneously a bitter disappointment for anyone expecting a miraculous, happy Hollywood ending.

The Brooklyn Museum is one of the few North American museums to permanently house one of Oller's paintings: "Hacienda La Fortuna," which features a Puerto Rican sugar plantation whose sugar would have been bound for the Brooklyn sugar refinery that later became the iconic Domino Sugar Refinery.

"While we cannot be credited for making the historic link, our collection committee was very enthusiastic about the idea of having such a historic piece with ties to Brooklyn," Aste said.

The show gathered paintings from museums and private collectors across the globe. Once it finishes its run at the Brooklyn Museum, the exhibit will travel to San Juan, Puerto Rico for another three month display.





played every four years, between the champions of FIFA's (soccer governing body) six confederations: Africa (CAF), Asia (AFC), North and Central America and the Caribbean, (CONCACAF), Europe (UEFA), Oceania (OFC) and South America (CONMBOL).
