Obama's new executive actions

U.S. Rep. Hakeem Jeffries (NY-08) and Brooklyn Councilman Jumaane Williams on Tuesday welcomed President Obama's new executive actions to reduce gun violence and make communities safer.

"With this historic action, President Obama

has taken a significant step toward making America a safer place," said Jeffries, whose 8th Congressional District includes parts of Brooklyn and Queens.

He noted that, over the past decade, more than 100,000 Americans have been killed as

GUYANA TO PUMP OIL SOON

Exxon to drill second well for newest Latin producer

Guyana, the Caribbean trade group nation which has long been known to be the one blessed with the most natural resources of its regional neighbors, is setting to become Latin America's newest oil and gas producer sooner that most people would dare to think.

Back in May, Exxon Mobil, which has had a large offshore concession declared a humongous oil and gas find in a field about 120 miles offshore Guyana triggering jubilation in the country of less than a million people, a nation that will soon be very rich from all appearances.

In the past week, officials from Exxon's Houston, Texas headquarters, flew by private jet to Georgetown for talks with President David Granger and other top officials.

The American delegation included Stephen Greenlee, the president of Exxon who Guyanese government officials had said late last year that they are very happy to see.

This is because they wanted to discuss the issue of Guyana drawing down up to \$2B even before a drop of oil is pumped to fund a string of development projects across the country — roads, rural and hinterland electrification and an asphalted 350-mile jungle road to Brazil.

Officials this week were reluctant to talk about the frontload-

Medgar Evers mourns death of activist

The predominantly Black Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn, which boasts a high percentage of Caribbean students, is mourning the passing of Dominican-born community activist Agnes M. Abraham.

Abraham, a former student of the school, died on Dec. 22. She was 56. No reason was given for her death.

The college said in a statement on Wednesday that Abraham, a "long-time community leader," died at her Brooklyn home. "Ms. Abraham was not only a friend to those who knew her but was a fierce and dynamic advocate for many she never met," said the statement, stating that Abraham served as chairperson of the Council of Community Advisory Boards of the New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation (HHC), now NYC Health and Hospitals, the largest public healthcare system in the United States.

She was also chairperson of the Community Advisory Board (CAB) at the sprawling Kings County Hospital Center in Central Brooklyn. CABs are the public's direct connection to the planning, program development and service delivery at HHC facilities around the New York City, the college

Before graduating from Medgar Evers College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Public Administration, Abraham served for three years on the Student Government Association (SGA): Two-terms as SGA president (2002-2004) and one-year as Senior Class President (2004-2005).

"As a student-representative in the SGA, she was a change agent that worked tirelessly to support the growth of the institution," the college said.

Additionally, Abraham served as the chairperson of the University Student Senate and, by virtue of this role, sat on the City University of New York's (CUNY) Board of Trustees as an ex-officio student trustee.

Kelly's comments on crime 'a low blow': Bichotte

Brooklyn Assemblywoman Rodneyse Bichotte has described as "a low blow" recent comments made by former New York Police Department (NYPD) Commissioner Raymond Kelly that the department, now under new leadership, is engaged in falsifying crime statistics.

Kelly claimed that the lower crime rates reported by the de Blasio administration have "some issues."

"In fact, New York is becoming a safer place to live because of our current Mayor and our current Police Commissioner [William J. Bratton]," said Bichotte, the first ever Haitian American from New York City to be elected to the State Legislature, in a Caribbean Life interview.

"I applaud the current administration's efforts to lower crime," added the representative for the 42nd Assembly District in Brooklyn. "Such comments by former Commissioner Kelly are a low blow to our police officers who make our streets

Bichotte said the Mayor's report that crime was lower by 4 percent this past year "is a statistic that I feel personally as a NYC resident.

"The fact that the unconstitutional use of stop, question and frisk is down, along with overall crime is something to celebrate," she said. "Also, while I am not intimately familiar with the data, I am confident in the Mayor's integrity, and stand by him."

Brooklyn Borough President Eric L. Adams, a former NYPD sergeant, said it was "patently offensive" for Kelly to suggest that the NYPD is in any way involved with falsifying crime statistics.

"The fact that there is no proof to this spurious charge is fitting with his history of lobbing rhetorical bombs behind the shade of tabloid covers, while falling silent under the scrutiny of truth," said an outraged Adams.

During the Floyd trial, Adams said

Kelly had a chance to testify under oath. "in front of the world, in response to his regime's use of stop and frisk.

"Instead, he ducked," said Adams, adding that "the evidence shows that when Ray Kelly had the chance to back up his media bloviating, he didn't take it."

Antigua

Antigua and Barbuda Prime Minister Gaston Browne, who was under pressure to report on the nation's Citizenship by Investment Program (CIP), has revealed CIP passports "sold" has surpassed 800.

Speaking in Parliament recently, he failed to deliver the report as stipulated under the CIP, but committed to doing

so in January 2016 as he gave a limited update on the program and the first since his last statement in June.



"June to Dec. 16 this year saw 194 applications and the granting in excess of 300 passports under the program" according to the prime minister.

"We have actually had 194 applications and these are applications as opposed to passports, as in some instances you may have one individual that forms part of an application, or it may be four individuals, it could be a family, husband and wife and two children," he said.

Bahamas

A major drug bust by Drug Enforcement Officers in The Bahamas has netted a stash of 1,449 pounds of cocaine on the island of Bimini.

The seizure was made two days before Christmas and a 41-year-old American man was arrested and charged.

Jose Ramon Diaz, of Miami, Florida was remanded in prison when he

appeared in court on Christmas Eve and pleaded not guilty to possession of dangerous drugs with intent



to supply, importation of dangerous drugs, conspiracy to import dangerous drugs and conspiracy to possess dangerous drugs with intent to supply.

Police say that a team of officers from the Drug Enforcement Unit (DEU) assisted by their counterparts from the U.S. Drug Enforcement (DEA) conducted a search of a yacht moored in Bimini - the closest Bahamian island to the U.S., located about 50 miles off Florida's coast- and found the huge stash of drugs.

Diaz, who was on the boat, was subsequently arrested. He faces a maximum of seven years in prison.

Barbados

The Barbados government is moving to pass legislation to amend the Value Added (TAX) to allow for a 22 percent tax on voice and other transmission from cell phones.

Finance Minister Chris Sinckler told legislators recently that the tax, which goes into effect from Jan. 1, 2016 will raise BDS\$14 million (US\$7 million)

Cuba

Cuba ended 2015 with an encouraging development in the tourist sector, which was able to inject more than two billion dollars a year into the economy.

According to preliminary data, from January to November, 3,139,837 people traveled to the communist country,

equivalent to a 17. 6 percent growth compared to the figure recorded for the same period in 2014.



That figure exceeded the total amount of foreigners who arrived in confirms the possibility of breaking, for the second consecutive time, the record in international visitors to Cuba.

There has been a determination to convert Cuba into a major tourist destination in the Caribbean, with promotional campaigns and measures to raise the quality of the tourism product.

A year ago, the presidents of Cuba and the United States announced their intention to move towards normalization of relations. Since then, the flow of tourists to the island has not stopped growing.

ing of money from the global oil giant but one thing was clear from interviews with delegation members who met with Greenlee and his team.

They say that Exxon has given local authorities every indication that actual production of oil and gas could begin in what industry officials say would be record time — 2017, less than two years after the confirmed discovery of a commercial find.

"There is every reason for optimism on this issue," said Prime Minister Moses Nagamootoo. "My impression from the discussions is that oil will be extracted well, long before the next general elections in 2020," he said, responding to a specific question about a timeline.

When, not if, Guyana begins to pump and export oil and gas, it will join Trinidad and Suriname as major oil producers among the 15 nations in the Caribbean Community group of nations. Barbados has a small developing on land producing industry and others such as the Bahamas and Grenada are waking up to the very real possibility that oil and gas might be nearer than they think as these countries are surrounded by oil and gas producers.





a result of gun violence.

"Many of these crimes were committed by people who never should have been able to purchase a gun in the first place," said Jeffries, a key member of the House of Representatives' Judiciary Committee and Congressional Black Caucus leadershin

"The overwhelming majority of Americans agree that every single person who purchases a gun should undergo a thorough background check," he added. "House Republicans have done nothing to advance gun safety legislation, and continue to function as wholly-owned subsidiaries of the gun lobby.

"Enough is enough," Jeffries continued. "It's time for Congress to act."

Williams, deputy leader of the City Council, who represents the 45th Council District in Brooklyn, commended the president for taking action to reduce the supply of illegal guns throughout our country.

"It is clear the president has a difficult task and is working against a Republican Congress owned by the NRA (National Rifle Association)," he said. "Still, he must move even further."

Hope for stranded Cubans

The Secretary General of the Organization of American States (OAS), Luis Almagro, has welcomed the agreement reached by Mexican and Central America authorities allowing the passage of thousands of Cuban migrants to the United States.

"The humanitarian situation of the Cuban migrants required a quick and integral solution, and this agreement facilitates that," said Almagro on Tuesday.

"We have to congratulate the diplomatic efforts made by the countries involved," he added. "They have taken a giant step forward."

Almagro, who had followed the process closely, also recognized the role played by Pope Francis in urging a solution to the crisis.

He stressed that "migrants have the same rights as other citizens," adding that those rights are "valid regardless of the administrative situation of the migrants."

The secretary general offered the support of the OAS to protect migration in the hemisphere against human trafficking, and to develop the agreement reached on Monday in Guatemala by Mexico and six Central American countries.

Almagro also reiterated the need to protect migrants throughout their route, according to the OAS.

Meantime, as Cubans continue to arrive in South Florida in droves, a deal that allows thousands stranded in Costa Rica to complete their journey to the U.S. has relatives scrambling to come up with more money to help, according to Local 10 TV News in Minmi

Under the U.S.' "wet foot, dry foot" policy, Cubans reaching U.S. shores are allowed to stay in the country but those caught at sea are repatriated.

The new deal will allow Cuban migrants to travel to Mexico and ride a bus to the U.S., Local 10 said.

"We are very, very happy with the news," said Cuban migrant Reynier Garces in Spanish.

He was among the now estimated 8,000 who were stuck after Nicaragua closed its border on Nov. 13.

Some 250 Cubans were expected to fly from San Jose, Costa Rica to San Salvador, Salvador, before the year ends, according to Local 10.

The television station said they will ride a bus from Guatemala through Mexico, "which has been aggressively trying to stop Central Americans on their way to the US."

Costa Rica, Mexico, Honduras, Panama, El Salvador and Guatemala were among the signatory nations in the new deal, Local 10 said.

Foreign Direct Investment: Myths and realities

GENEVA, Dec 29 2015 (IPS) - Foreign direct investment (FDI) is perhaps one of the most ambiguous and the least understood concepts in international economics. Common debate on FDI is confounded by several myths regarding its nature and impact on capital accumulation, technological progress, industrialization and growth in emerging and developing economies.

It is often portrayed as a long term, stable, cross-border flow of capital that adds to productive capacity, helps meet balance-of-payments shortfalls, transfers technology and management skills, and links domestic firms with wider global markets.

However, none of these is an intrinsic quality of FDI. First, FDI is more about transfer and exercise of control than movement of capital. Contrary to widespread perception, it does not always involve flows of financial capital (movements of funds through foreign exchange markets) or real capital (imports of machinery and equipment for the installation of productive capacity). A large proportion of FDI does not entail cross-border capital flows but is financed from incomes generated on the

existing stock of investment in host countries. Equity and loans from parent companies account for a relatively small part of recorded FDI and even a smaller part of total foreign assets controlled by transnational corporations.

Second, only the so-called greenfield investment makes a direct contribution to productive capacity and involves cross-border movement of capital goods. But it is not easy to identify from reported statistics what proportion of FDI consists of such investment as opposed to transfer of ownership of existing firms (mergers and acquisitions). Furthermore, even when FDI is in bricks and mortar, it may not add to aggregate gross fixed capital formation because it may crowd out domestic inves-

Third, what is commonly known and reported as FDI may contain speculative components and creates destabilizing impulses, including those due to the operation of transnational banks in host countries, which need to be controlled and managed as any other form of international capital flows.

Fourth, the immediate contribution of FDI to balance-of-payments may be positive, since it is only partly absorbed by imports of capital goods required to install production

2016: The forthcoming adjustment shock

GENEVA, Dec 10 2015 (IPS) - Analysis of the latest International Monetary Fund (IMF) expenditure projections for 187 countries between 2005 and 2020 reveals that there have been two distinct phases of government spending patterns since the onset of the global economic crisis.

During the first phase (2008-09) many countries introduced fiscal stimulus and expanded public spending as a countercyclical measure to cushion the impacts of the global crisis on their populations. Overall, 137 countries (or 73 per cent of the world) ramped up expenditure, with the average annual expansion amounting to 3.3 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP). About 50 high and middle-income countries announced fiscal stimulus packages totalling US\$2.4 trillion, of which approximately a quarter was invested in social protection measures.

The second period of crisis (2010 onwards) is marked by fiscal adjustment. In 2010, premature budget cuts became widespread, despite the ongoing and urgent need of vulnerable populations for public support.

This phase is characterized by two major contractionary shocks, the first occurring in 2010-11 and the second expected to hit in 2016 and continue at least until 2020.

According to IMF projections, 2016 marks the beginning of a second, major period of expenditure contraction globally.

Overall, budget reductions are expected to impact 132 countries in 2016 in terms of GDP and hover around this level until 2020. Developing world will be the most severely affected. Overall, 81 developing countries, on average, are projected to cut public spending during the forthcoming shock versus 45 high-income countries. Expenditure contraction is expected to impact more than two-thirds of all countries annually, affecting more than six billion persons or nearly 80 per cent of the global population by 2020.

A review of recent IMF reports indicates that governments are weighing various adjustment measures, as summarized below.

Eliminating or reducing subsidies: Overall, 132 governments in 97 developing and 35 high-income countries are reducing subsidies, predominately on fuel, but also on electricity, food and agriculture. The Middle East, North- and Sub-Saharan Africa are the regions being hardest hit.

Wage bill cuts/caps: as

recurrent expenditures like salaries of teachers, health workers and local civil servants tend to be the largest component of national budgets, an estimated 130 governments in 96 developing and 34 high-income countries are considering to contain the wage bill, often as a part of civil service

Rationalizing and further targeting social safety nets: overall, 107 governments in 68 developing and 39 high-income countries are considering rationalizing their spending on welfare, often by revising eligibility criteria and targeting to the poorest, reducing social protection coverage. IMF country reports generally associate targeting with poverty reduction, as a way to reconcile poverty reduction with austerity; however, targeting risks excluding large segments of vulnerable and low income households. Rather than targeting and scaling-down to achieve cost savings over the short term, there is a strong case for scaling up social protection for all.

Reforming old-age pensions: approximately 105 governments in 60 developing and 45 high-income countries are discussing changes to their pension systems, such as through raising contribution rates, increasing eligibility periods, prolonging the retirement age, lowering benefits, sometimes structural reforms of contributory social security pensions. As a result, future pensioners are expected to receive lower benefits.

They knowingly suppressed economic reality

Trinidad and Tobago's petrodriven economy, having been traditionally regarded as a Caribbean gold standard, recent news of very troubling jitters on the economic front cannot but generate real concern, even well beyond the country's borders. In truth, the fact that the nation, so used to a buoyant economic climate, needed to brace itself for some shockwaves, was a caution that should have been sounded well before the government changed hands last September. With the precipitous decline in oil and gas prices on the world market, negative impact on the country's economic well being was a given. Leave it to the Kamla Persad-Bissessar administration, before it was ousted, to have barefacedly insisted that everything would be just fine.

The record of the Bissessar government was so chock-full of iniquitous conduct, there would probably be many willing to cite actions taken during the five-year term that were as reprehensible, if not more so, as deliberately misleading the populace on worrisome economic developments. Still, there's no trivializing how dastardly is withhold-

ing the real deal about major energy sector changes adversely affecting people's livelihoods. What's even more preposterous, though, is Bissessar's continuing, even today, to maintain that there was nothing wrong with her government's handling of the reversed economic fortunes her government came to face. And that included no relent in the government's profligate ways, clearly indifferent to what the changing times dictated.

In our several well-deserved jabs at the Bissessar administration, while it prolonged its orgy of recklessly abusing the privilege of governance, we regularly settled on "brazen" as most aptly defining the moral tenor of the regime in power. Perhaps it shouldn't surprise us that "brazen" is no less evident in the M.O. of Bissessar and her minions after having been shown the door by the Trinidad and Tobago electorate. Errol Pilgrim, columnist for Trinidad and Tobago's weekly Mirror, summed up Bissessar's election aftermath behavior as pressing on "with one inanity after the other." One of which being her peculiar conclusion that a recent Standard &

Poor's rating downgrade for the country, from stable to negative, was a vindication of her government's economic policies. And if that's not brazen, heaven only knows what is. The Standard & Poor's action, by the way, coming after Moody's had also announced a downgrade, while Bissessar and company were still calling the shots.

It had become well established fairly early in the life of the Bissessar government, that scruples were in very short supply. Touted as reflecting the government's adherence to moral high ground, the firing of one cabinet member in the regime's infancy for an alleged conflict of interest indiscretion was soon recognized to have been all the way a farce, given the wallto-wall corrupt practices that became business as usual. Moral failings were indeed overwhelmingly why voters deemed the incumbents unfit to any long-

er walk the corridors of power. The taint of unprecedented corruption had rested heavily on the Bissessar crew since midway through their tenure, and the results of a series of local elections had underscored the disenchantment in the public square. With a gauge of popular sentiment about her administration that was so crystal clear, a strategy of concentrated focus on Bissessar personally and somehow selling her as disconnected from her government's enormous baggage was pretty strange as a campaign tactic, hardly becoming the homerun it was crafted to be. Likewise has Bissessar been baffling, in this post-election frame, still seemingly wedded to the idea that her very presence is up to the challenge of reconfiguring ingrained public perception of her unflattering stint at the helm. Her nonsensical response about the bond rating downgrade being "a vindication" classically illustrates the alternate universe she has inhabited before and since her election defeat.

Wherever in the political arena gracelessness is readily identifiable in the package

anyone presents, who aspires to standout achievement as a player, the chances of attaining such heights are markedly diminished. On the American scene, for the past seven years we have seen gracelessness in spades, in the disrespect shown President Obama by many in the Republican / Tea Party ranks. In Trinidad and Tobago, Kamla Persad-Bissessar has "distinguished" herself as capable of gracelessness comparable with anyone, anywhere. A telling indicator of how she would treat with the administration that replaced hers was her refusal to congratulate incoming Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley on election night...not to mention a refusal to address even her own party supporters.

Trinidad and Tobago's new economic challenges — to which, beyond energy sector problems, the Bissessar administration's policies ably contributed — would, in the best of worlds, require of Bissessar, in the national interest, perhaps her finest demonstration of statecraft. No one is fool enough, though, to entertain those expectations.

capacity. But its longer-term impact is often negative because of high import content of foreign firms and profit remittances. This is true even in countries highly successful in attracting export-oriented FDI.

Finally, superior technology and management skills of transnational corporations create an opportunity for the diffusion of technology and ideas. However, the competitive advantage these firms have over newcomers in developing countries can also drive them out of business. They can help integrate developing countries into global production networks, but participation in such networks also carries the risk of getting locked into low value-added activities.

These do not mean that FDI does not offer any benefits to developing and emerging countries. Rather, policy in host countries plays a key role in determining the impact of FDI in these areas. A laissez-faire approach could not yield much benefit. It may in fact do more harm than good.

Successful examples are found not necessarily among countries that attracted more FDI, but among those which used it in the context of national industrial policy designed to shape the evolution of specific industries through interventions. This means that developing countries need adequate policy space vis-à-vis FDI and transnational corporations if they are to benefit from it.

Still, the past two decades have seen a rapid liberalization of FDI regimes and erosion of policy space in emerging and developing countries vis-à-vis transnational corporations. This is partly due to the commitments undertaken in the World Trade Organization as part of the Agreement on Trade-Related Investment Measures .

However, many of the more serious constraints are in practice self-inflicted through unilateral liberalisation or bilateral investment treaties signed with more advanced economies – a process that appears to be going ahead with full force, with the universe of investment agreements reaching 3,262 at the end of 2014.

Unlike earlier bilateral treaties, recent agreements give significant leverage to international investors. They often include rights to establishment, the national treatment and the most favoured-nation clauses, broad definitions of investment and investors, fair and equitable treatment, protection from expropriation, free transfers of capital and prohibition of performance requirements.

Furthermore, the reach of bilateral investment treaties has extended rapidly thanks to the use of the so-called Special Purpose Entities which allow transnational corporations from countries without a bilateral treaty with the destination country to make the investment through an affiliate incorporated in a third-party state with a bilateral treaty with the destination country.

Many bilateral investment treaties include provisions that free foreign investors from the obligation of having to exhaust local legal remedies in disputes with host countries before seeking international arbitration.

Labour market flexibilization is being discussed by 89 governments in 49 developing and 40 high-income countries. Reforms include revising the minimum wage, limiting salary adjustments to cost of living benchmarks, decentralizing collective bargaining, and easing firing and compensation arrangements at the enterprise level. Labour market reforms are supposedly aimed at increasing competitiveness and supporting businesses during recessions. However, available evidence suggests that labour market flexibilization will not generate decent jobs. On the contrary, in a context of economic contraction, this approach is likely to generate labour market "precarization," depress domestic incomes/demand and ultimately hinder recovery efforts.

Reforming health systems: 56 governments in 34 developing and 22 high-income countries are discussing

reforms to their healthcare systems, generally through increasing fees and co-payments as well as by introducing cost-saving measures in public health centres.

Increasing consumption taxes on goods and services. Some 138 governments in 93 developing and 45 high-income countries are considering options to boost revenue by raising VAT or sales tax rates or removing exemptions. However, increasing the cost of basic goods and services can erode the already limited incomes of vulnerable households and stifle economic activity. Alternatively, progressive tax approaches should be considered, such as taxes on income, inheritance, property and corporations, including the financial sector.

Privatization of public assets and services: according to IMF reports, this revenue generation approach is being pondered by 55 governments in 40 developing and 15 high-income countries.



A municipal identification for all New Yorkers

You've got another year to get your free municipal I.D.

The City is extending its signup schedule for its City municipal I.D. program—IDNYC— into 2016, a second year.

The I.D. provides official identification for those who previously do not have government issued identification and enables the holder to get into government and other buildings including public schools that require an I.D. Instituted in 2015, the program is an initiative of the Mayor's Office.

Mayor deBlasio said at the original launch, "This I.D. addresses substantially the notion that we all matter and everyone has an identity." The I.D. is open to all New Yorkers including undocumented, elderly, homeless, vets, and transgender.

Enrollment centers have been set up in some libraries and many other sites around the city.

While proof of New York residency is a requirement, immigration status is not information that is asked. Knowing someone has a municipal I.D. would not indicate they are

undocumented immigrants, since the I.D. is available to all New Yorkers.

"If you're calling about a municipal I.D., call 311" is the first thing a caller hears on the voicemail of immigrant advocacy group Make The Road New York, proof that getting the IDNYC is encouraged. Twenty percent of applicable residents in Corona Park, a richly immigrant neighborhood, have IDNYC. One out of 10 Queens's residents have IDNYC.

Rosemary Boeglin from the Mayor's Office said, "We know that immigrant New Yorkers have been some of the first and most eager applicants across the five boroughs."

As of Fall 2015, 52 percent of the 311 inquiries in regards to IDNCY were in non-English: Spanish accounts for 88 percent of the non-English, with Mandarin next (4.6 percent of non-English) followed by Cantonese, Russian, Korean, Haitian Creole, Hindi, and other languages.

More than 700,000 New Yorkers across the city have thus far received one. There are many other benefits beyond just identification that are

attached to the card, which adds to its popularity.

The perk that attracts a large swath of New Yorkers is a free membership package at the City's leading cultural institutions, an added seven more than last year.

The American Museum of Natural History, the Bronx Museum of the Arts, Flushing Town Hall, the Staten Island Zoo, and the Brooklyn Botanical Gardens are among the 40 cultural institutions offering free memberships. Metropolitan Opera, Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the Museum of Modern Art are also on the list.

Joining at each individual institution, cultural memberships redeemed through IDNYC will be good for one year from the date the membership benefit is redeemed. Institutions have different protocols for enrolling members — check with the participating institution.

The IDNYC Card also enables one to open a bank or credit account at more than a dozen financial institutions across New York City. The card can be integrated with your



IDNYC, the City's municipal ID, is delivered by mail (two to three weeks after you apply) with a brochure that describes some of the benefits.

thing into consideration, said the COE had been "an agonizing and to some extent painful."

He said the country could not just keep giving extensions for something that has gone on for over two years and that was instead meant to last for several months.

Dr. Rodney, a Guyanese historian was killed in his brother's car outside the Georgetown Prison on June 13, 1980 when a bomb in a walkie talkie exploded.

The enquiry has cost Guyanese taxpayers Guy\$400 million.

The previous Bharath Jagdeo administration had said the inquiry was necessary to allow Guyana to heal after some 30 years of uncertainty concerning Dr. Rodney's death and to give his family closure.

St. Kitts

Former depositors of the defunct Bank of Commerce that went into bankruptcy in 1985 have started recovering their money.

This was disclosed by Prime Minis-

ter Dr. Timothy Harris who said depositors will get what they put in, plus a 2.5 percent on their balances, through



the St. Kitts-Nevis-Anguilla National

In wrapping up the 2016 budget in the National Assembly last week, Dr. Harris said the bank is expected to pay out EC\$18 million (US\$6.7 million) to former clients. Between 5,000 and 6,000 people are expected to benefit from the payout.

The prime minister said that after three decades, he is pleased that the resolution could come under his Team Unity Government.

The Bank of Commerce has been in Liquidation since May 9, 1985, following a court order granted in response to a petition filed on Feb. 2, 1985, by the Social Security Board (SSB), one of the financial institutions creditors.

Earlier this year, Harris said that a court settlement had finally been reached.

As a result, the SSB will receive about EC\$1.4 million (US\$518,518) and the government, which had a substantial investment in the bank, will get EC\$1.2 million (US\$444,444).

Trinidad

Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley wants to ensure that Trinidad and Tobago does not have to govern under conditions of the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

He said the government wanted to avoid "the final option, where decisions are made for you by the lender of last resort." "We don't want that at all," he

said during an interview on a local radio station recently.



"We want to ensure that we are not govern-

ing by austerity measures and restrictions (that) equals IMF. And if we don't manage our affairs properly, we could end up in a situation where we don't have options," Dr. Rowley said.

"When our revenues have collapsed in the way oil and gas revenues have collapsed in this country, we have to respond to these circumstances," he added.

Rowley warned that countries in our situation that don't make the economic adjustments themselves and "postpone the day, hoping that the next sunrise would change things on its own" end up having to accept "the final (IMF) option."



THE CARIBBEAN BUSINESS REPORT

Hand-knit with love by NY grandmothers

Fort Greene resident, Yvonne is a 96-year-old grandmother from Jamaica and the first knitter who is part of the knitting team that creates hand-knit winter accessories with the company named Wooln.

Learning to knit in Jamaica when she was 14, she has continued to knit for 82 years. With a preference to knit in bright colors "because she makes less mistakes," she works on three to four projects at a time so she does not get bored. She did confess, however, that for two weeks she worked in the dark after eye surgery. Her specialties are chunky cowls and slouchy hats.

The 15-item Wooln line is the brainchild of two French social entrepreneurs Faustine Badrichani, 31, and Margaux Clermontel, 32, both mothers and lovers of grandmothers.

In its first season, items are highend trendy accessories that include caps and hood / scarves for babies, and snoods commonly known as a cowlscozy infinity scarves created on circular needles. All are hand-knit in New York by talented grandmothers.

Nationally, the Bureau of Labor Statistics estimates that 25 percent of the United State's workforce will be age 55 or older by 2020, with more and more older Americans electing to keep working.

"I don't think Americans appreciate their seniors," says Faustine, who brings her French sensibilities toward elders to this business.

Most of the knitters but not all are grandmothers. A few are younger who want to supplement their income.

Harlem-resident Charmaine Jones admits to not being a grandmother. A musician and the owner of a high-end custom cake company, she loves to knit and discovered a call for knitters on Craigslist. This is a perfect fill-in as it gets slow during the holidays, she says.



Jones says of the visionary Wooln founders, "They hire people with great skills usually overlooked because they're of a certain age. Previously grandmothers would make these things for free. They respect grandmothers."

There are 12 women and one man, self-taught knitter Brooklyn-resident Phillieo, knitting and purling for Wooln. Knitters are given patterns, yarn and needles.

This year's fashion collection is in

more than 20 colors, each finished item labeled with the knitter's name.

Items are available for sale from www. wooln.com and have been sold at some local holiday fairs.

The Wooln website reads: WOOLN strives to act for the benefit of society at large. We welcome retirees back into the active work force, value forgotten talents, and foster intergenerational exchanges.

The knitters are paid when the items are collected.

Knitter Jones meets up with the founders in mid-town to exchange finished products for more yarn and get paid \$10 to \$30 depending on the size. Faustine and Margaux might meet up with Yvonne at her neighborhood senior center, at times interrupting her bingo, to "conduct business."

Senior centers — they visited 60 — were one of their first recruiting resources when they began this project, just last spring.

BOOK REVIEW

The real deal about author **Palmer Alexander Haley**

"Alex Haley and the Books That Changed a Nation" by Robert J. Norrell c.2015, St. Martin's Press \$26.99 / \$31.50 Canada 251 pages

The gardening catalogs started arriving this week right on time.

In the gray of winter, they represent so much promise, whether you have six acres or six inches of dirt. Norrell, and see how a career can grow.

Born in 1921 into a wealthy





Irish-African American family, Palmer Alexander Murray Haley was raised mostly by his grandmother, who instilled in him a love of storytelling. As an adult, Haley would recall hiding behind rocking chairs on his grandparents' front porch, listening to tales of "the African" and of slavery.

In 1939, after rejecting his professorial father's ideal of an education, Haley (by now, calling himself "Alex") joined

the Coast Guard. Because of racial mores of the time, few onboard jobs were open to African American men, so he worked as a steward while also searching for assignments as a magazine writer. Ultimately, he came under the command of a "boss" who demanded help with letter-writing; his skills honed, Haley landed a job as a press officer for the Coast Guard.

By 1960, Haley left the Coast Guard and a wife, and focused "intensively" on magazine writing. Just two years later, his reputation as an author was set, "linked in part to the growing notoriety of the Nation of Islam (NOI)." An assignment he had accepted allowed him to become good friends with Malcolm X and they began working closely together on a book, even as Haley simultaneously wrote articles against the NOI.






tion and inclination to stand away from the elected-public figures on issues not in the public's best interest.







The 24-year-old set out to bring "GoFish" to life, working with a small team that felt and understood her passion.

The short-film was inspired by the 1991 Crown Heights Riots — race riots that occurred from Aug. 19 to Aug. 21 between African American residents and Orthodox Jews following the death of two Guyanese children accidentally hit by a car.

"Growing up in Crown Heights, hearing stories about the 1991 riots and having friends from different walks of life, whether it be culture or race — it is a narrative piece which has some elements of truth," she explained.

The process to create the 16-minute short film may appear easy while watching the end product, but editing the scenes — scrapping some all together — proved to be Brown's biggest challenge as a first-time director.

"There were times where it was hard for me to let go of scenes and times where I

editor who really helped me to accept the process," she said.

The film follows two young girls, one an African American and the other Jewish, who are friends despite the violence and hatred occuring at the time between the two groups.

artist, Monique Letamendi, her strategy is to capture audiences with her poignant lyrics whether delivered as a song or in spoken word.

According to Letamendi, "I use my poetry for activism because not only do I have an unconventional way of performing my poetry but a lot of people sound the same and play with similar topics but I really want to use what I have to tell a story that everyone needs to hear."

As a teaching artist for theater nonprofit viBe Theater Experience, Letamendi connects with girls - ranging in ages 13-18 — who attempt to make sense of the viral stories such as Sandra Bland and Tamir Rice.

As a 24-year-old, Letamendi guides the teens to utilize their poetry, songs, dance, and even plays as a method to help them understand the police brutality seen in their schools and neighborhoods.

"When I work with the girls it's weird because I'm supposed to give off this professional image of someone who is put together but we are - no matter the age range — are experiencing and feeling the same things in response to these events," she explained.

It is through the various writing exercises she leads with the girls birthed from their conversations that she feels a particular need to utilize her lyrics to invoke some sense of change or hope to her neighbors in her Bushwick neighborhood and beyond.

Often performing at open mics and other shows, Letamendi's "Overseer" poem has particularly struck audiences for its delivery and detailed descriptions.

"Overseer, afraid of my talent n***a tongue," Letamendi opens in the poem. "Don't treat my arrest like a hunting game."

Like most Americans, Letamendi is hopeful that 2016's clean slate will come with more justice, less death, and peace to those living in the urban neighborhoods such as hers that see themselves in tragedies as in that of Trayvon Martin.

"I hope to achieve a better state of understanding when it comes to people of color. I want my work to be the mouthpiece for the people I see living in the projects like I do," she said. "I just want their stories to be heard."

Oscar-winner Michael Moore (for Bowling for Columbine) has been challenging the power structure ever since releasing Roger & Me way back in 1989. That groundbreaking expose' indicted General Motors for the outsourcing of jobs which devastated his beloved hometown

of Flint, Michigan. Over the intervening years, Moore has exhibited a knack for tackling a variety of hot-button topics from a leftist perspective,

including the Iraq War (Fahrenheit 9/11), the healthcare industry (Sicko), and the global financial crisis (Capitalism: A Love Story), to name a few.

With "Where to Invade Next," the inveterate rabblerouser sets his sights on the subject of American imperialism. You may remember that

the Bush Doctrine, as espoused by President George W. Bush in 2002, asserted the United States' right to wage preemptive war whenever deemed in the national interest. Well, relying on that dubious notion, Moore proceeds to play agent provocateur as he circumnavigates the globe visiting countries with cultural and social constructs supposedly worth emulating.

So, instead of conquest with intent to plunder, the focus here is merely on borrowing ideas which might improve our quality of life. For instance, in France, he asks public school cafeteria chefs how they manage to serve their students such fine cuisine compared to the slop American kids are forced to settle for. And his mission in Finland is to discern why its educational system is far superior to ours, while in Italy he learns about the generous employment benefits not only for maternity leave but for honeymoons as well.



Foreigners who add to MLS

The signing of foreigners labeled 'Designated Players' who came to MLS last season certainly helped to heighten the awareness of MLS around the world, but in most cases that's all that it did; few amongst the high-priced players helped their

teams substantially on the field.

Kudos now to Italian Sebastian Giovinco of Toronto FC, Ivorian Didier Drogba of the Montreal Impact and Brazilian Kaka who played for Orlando City FC — a trio who proved their worth to their teams many times over and justified the top dol-

lars spent to secure their services.

Conversely, a thumbs down to New York FC's trio of Andrea Pirlo, David Villa and Frank Lampard, along with Steven Gerrard of the La Galaxy — a group that miss-kicked last season.

Giovinco joined a failed franchise

and immediately gave it life as he led Toronto to its first MLS playoff appearance. Giovinco was the 2015 MLS MVP after scoring a league 22 goals, tied with Columbus Crew Kai Kamara, and also won the Golden Boot award. He registered 16 assists to lead the league in both categories and set an MLS season record for his combined goals and assists (38). His assist record gave him the edge over Kamara in the Golden Boot voting.

Accomplishments in MLS is certainly respected in world soccer because Giovinco's MLS performance earned him a re-call to the Italian national team. The Italian became the first player to score more than 20 goals and register more than 10 assists in one season.

Like Giovinco, Drogba came to Montreal from Chelsea FC (English Premier League) and immediately made an impact in Montreal. The former Ivory Coast international scored 12 goals in his 12 starts and made the Impact a formidable team in 2015; he led Montreal into the playoffs as it registered its first postseason win, versus Toronto FC.

The Impact, though, may have problems re-signing Drogba for the 2016 season since Chelsea is eyeing him as a future assistant coach. According to newspaper reports in Montreal, the fans have threatened to abandon the team if Drogba is not re-signed for the 2016 campaign.

Montreal's public relations department released this statement on the Drogba situation: "We are currently in everything we can to have him back with the Impact in 2016...

...But our objective is to have him back for another season, as agreed in his contract. This situation is out of our control. We would like to thank our supporters for their understanding and their patience."

Kaka thrived in the Orlando sunshine and he too was re-called to his national team when he played for Brazil against the USA last fall in an international friendly. Kaka helped to draw 62,510 fans on opening day of this new MLS franchise as the team continued to attract large crowds throughout a successful season.

The Brazilian midfielder is credited with having a positive influence on the young players in the new team, and an example of this is Canadian forward Cyle Larin, who won the 2015 MLS Rookie of the Year award after scoring 17 goals, the highest for an MLS rookie.

The thumbs-down group disappointed many; Pirlo may have tried his best but his production didn't help his team much since his high-priced supporting cast in Yankee Stadium of Villa and Lampard, for all intents and purposes, did not really show up.

Villa clearly has not lived up to the hype of being former Spain international striker and performer for famed Barcelona FC of Spain. Villa was hampered by injury, seemingly cause by the lack of top level fitness; Lampard, a former England international arrived late in the season injured and got off to a slow start. It seemed that the English Precontact with Didier Drogba and Chelsea mier League took its toll on Lampard,

' the club tweeted. "We are doing who was clearly ineffective in Yankee Stadium. Lampard's former England teammate Gerrard, who also arrived at midseason, seemed lost in the Galaxy midfield for much of the second half of the season and was unimpressive in his much publicized MLS debut.

Galaxy Re-organizing

The LA Galaxy is retooling its onfield personnel for the 2016 season after missing out on the MLS Cup appearance for the first time in the past three seasons. The club sold 26-year-old Brazilian midfielder Juninho to Club Tijuana of the Mexican Clausura (top league) last Wednesday. Juninho signed with the LA Galaxy in 2010 and had been its top midfielder since; he played 187 times for the Los Angeles club and helped it win three MLS Cup titles.

"It has been a privilege and an honor to have worn the LA Galaxy jersey for the past six seasons," Juninho said in a statement released by the Galaxy. "I have worn it with pride, however, it is time to for me to trade in my Galaxy jersey for a new one. I've always welcomed the opportunity for growth and change. To play for Club Tijuana in Mexico is a tremendous opportunity for me."

The retooling didn't stop with Juninho; American international central defender Omar Gonzalez was sold to Mexico's Pachuca of the same league. The moves reportedly were to free up salary cap monies after high-spending on Englishman Gerrard and Mexican international Giovanni Dos Santos, both of whom were signed late last season.

Windies Women's captain cops Twenty20 title

West Indies Women's Captain Stafanie Taylor was named the International Cricket Council (ICC) Women's Twenty20 International Player of the Year recently.

The 24-year-old Jamaican, presently in Australia campaigning in the Women's Big Bash for Sydney Thunder, has been the leading batsman in world cricket in recent years and is currently installed sixth in the ICC Twenty20 rankings and number four in One-Day Internationals.

Taylor, who won the ICC One-Day Internationals Players of the Year award in 2011 and 2012, said the honor was a surprise and she was elated to win it.

"Winning an award is an added motivation to do better. We were dominant in our two series this year against Sri Lanka and against Pakistan and that is something to build on," she said.

"Next year (2016), we will face South Africa and then on to India for the ICC World Twenty20. Those are two "big" series and I am fully geared a series in the Caribbean.




