Rally, march on proposed CUNY cuts

The Professional Staff Conrepresenting staff and faculty at City University of New York (CUNY) colleges says New Yorkers are mobilizing to defend their university.

PSC/CUNY said on Tuesday that a coalition of 25 comgress (PSC / CUNY), the union munity, student, religious and labor groups has been formed in response to the proposed cuts to CUNY, the planned tuition increase and the failure to resolve CUNY contracts.

The coalition, CUNY Rising Alliance, was organizing its first public action for Thursday: a protest, march and meeting, starting at 5 p.m. at Governor Cuomo's Manhattan office.

Suriname's economy struggles to stay afloat

Battered by low oil and commodity prices including gold, one of the Caribbean Community's most resource rich countries is headed to the international capital markets to raise funds to keep its economy

Suriname, the Dutch-speaking republic neighboring community headquarters, Guyana, is experiencing one of its worst

financial crunches since the 1980s when the country's military dictatorship ran the economy into the ground.

Low international prices for oil, gold, bauxite and rice, the country's main exports and foreign exchange earners have pushed the economy on the back foot, leading to a devaluation of the Surinamese dollar, several spending cutbacks

It was a collegial gathering last Friday of fellowship, inspiration and recognition when more than 200 nurses converged at Kingsbrook Medical Center for the 28th National Black Nurses Celebration.

"We do this every year and it's a great way for us to recognize those in the community who contribute so much," said former president of the Caribbean American Nurses Association(CANA) Claudette Powell.

Following greetings, a panel presented "Perspectives on Self-Care for Nurses."

Leading off the presenters, Information Technology Specialist Angela Jourdain, MSN and doctoral student, nurse administrator at Northwell Health Long Island Jewish Hospital conveyed a strong message about social media — be attentive to what you're putting out there and only put constructive posts of who are. "Don't post what you did on your night on the town," she cautioned. On social media you want to "reflect positively your professional image." These things can come back to you and it is professionally important to be aware, she emphasized.

Dr. Una Clarke: Jamaicans should exercise their democratic right

CUNY Board Member, Dr. Una Clarke, a Jamaican-American, called on Jamaican nationals to harness the country's natural resources by returning to the soil to make their produce marketable, while feeding themselves.

"Our farmers must go back to the soil and produce, this is the only way we would be able to feed our nation," adding that Jamaicans must not see farming as a profession that is beneath them, but instead be educated about the important of the soil that should be used to produce."

Clarke was at the time responding to an invited comment from this newspaper, recently, to address the just concluded election to vote-in a Prime Minister for Jamaica.

Despite the outcome that she never predicted — the unseating Prime Minister Portia Simpson Miller of the PNP — Clarke, one of Jamaica's most influential citizens in New York, said that Jamaica is the first in the region to become an independent nation, and as such, citizens must understand the role they have to play in the democratic process.

The first Caribbean national to hold a position in the NYC Council as representative for the 40th District in Brooklyn, Clarke, who, was attentive to the election poll returns during a Feb. 25, African-American History month celebration at Medger Evers College, said every Jamaican who is eligible to vote, must at all times do so.

"Voting is the only way we will grow, and be respected by the world. We are a small nation with good food, and we are great in many ways, but in order to speak of Jamaica as a great Caribbean country we must be able to say we are leaders when it comes to voting. This process works well as a democracy," said Clarke.

"Whether you are a member of the People's National Party, or the Labor Party, everyone must become engaged so that our country work for everybody, from the smallest to the greatest," she added.

She noted that Jamaicans expressed the desire to vote in the Diaspora but said the legitimacy of the process would be in question, and added that Jamaicans instead influence the vote. She called on citizens back home to hold steadfast, in choosing a leader who will work with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to move the agreement forward to boost the economy.

In 2013 under PM Simpson Miller, the country agreed to a four-year International Monetary Fund loan package in exchange for swapping its debt

Caribbean

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) is advising Caribbean countries to focus on increasing flights from a small pool of airlines to attract more tourists, rather than seeking to attract ever-growing list of carriers.

This, Washington-based financial institution says, it a better use of scare resources.

The report, "Flying to Paradise: The

role of Airlift in the Caribbean Tourist Industry," states that if given the option to increase the frequency of flights from carriers



already servicing a destination, the IMF recommends that Caribbean states do so, as opposed to initiating flights from new carriers.

The reason given is that government will make significant savings when negotiating with a smaller group of carriers.

The study, described as an IMF working paper, is a research in progress, but has made the recommendations as part of its preliminary conclusions.

Barbados

A group of some 35 persons, including police officers, community activists, educators, business persons and social workers recently revived training as community mediators under the Canadian government-funded, Improved Access to Justice in the Caribbean (IMPACT) Project.

IMPACT Justice is a five-year regional justice sector reform project which is being implemented from within the Caribbean Law Institute, University of the West Indies (UWI) Cave Campus, Barbados.

The training which took place in Grenada falls under IMPACT Justice's broader alter-



native dispute resolution (ADR) component. The goal is to build the capacity for community mediation services around the region in an effort to reduce the burden on the courts.

The regional justice reform project is slated to develop or increase the pool of community mediators in 13 CARI-COM member states and assist in the development of a legislative framework within which mediations may be conducted.

Impact Justice has already conducted community mediation training in Barbados, Dominica, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Nevis and St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

IMPACT Justice regional project director said; "We are seeking to increase the number of individuals who are available to assist in solving disputes at the community level before they escalated and

Bahamas

The Bahamas Bar Association (BBA) has joined calls for the attorney general to provide answers to questions regarding the release into the general population of two Cubans previously held for three years at the Bahamas Department of Correctional Services without being charged.

BBA President Elsworth Johnson is questioning why the Department of Immigration is now seeking to re-arrest Carlos



Pupo and Lazaro Seara Martin, who had no legal status in the Bahamas.

He said the government is subject to the rule of law but is not empowered to hold persons beyond the reasonable time without charges.

In a statement recently, Foreign Affairs Minister Fred Mitchell said the men are "a national security risk" and ordered an investigation to take place into how the court was convinced to release them.

But Johnson said if the men were a risk to national security the government could have charged them with sedition, espionage or sabotage, for example.

Guyana

CARICOM is moving ahead to explore new measures in the fight against youth crime and violence in the region.

Its most current initiative was a two-day forum in Georgetown, Guyana recently, which was funded by the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) and the government of Spain, - an outcome of the two-year CARICOM / Spain Project: Youth on Youth Violence in the

This project which aims to reduce youth on youth violence, particularly in schools, is now being piloted in member states: Antigua and Barbuda, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia and Trinidad and Tobago.

Approximately 100 participants from across the region engaged in interactive sessions centered on four main

topics/issues: violence against children; school violence; youth gangs and violence, together with cross-



cutting themes of gender, culture and other social determinants.

According to CARICOM Eye on the Future Report of 2010, the number one concern of youth is crime and violence. Mitchell said in Parliament recently About 60 percent of CARIOM's popula-

tion is under the age of 30. The main perpetrators as well as the victims of crime are young people. Moreover, violence is the lead cause of death among males aged 15 - 24 in the Caribbean.

CARICOM's Community Strategic Plan for 2015-2019 identifies Deepening Crime Prevention Initiatives and Programs as an area of focus to build the social resilience of the Community.

Jamaica

Jamaica has blocked some 50 tons of rice from Suriname after the shipment was found to be con-

taminated with rodent faeces.



The shipment valued at over J\$4.6 billion (US\$37, 952), was

seized by the Food Storage and Prevention of Infestation Division (FSPID) of the Industry, Investment and Commerce Ministry and will soon be disposed.

Acting deputy food storage officer, Tamara Morrison said the contaminant was confirmed following tests conducted at the FSIPD's Rodent Biology and Control Laboratory, on samples collected by the agency's inspectorate.

Morrison advised that the contamination was determined to have occurred prior to the arrival of the rice and further indicated that this was the first time that rice imported by that con-

Financial crisis

by the administration of President Desi Bouterse and growing hardships among its nearly 500,000 residents.

This week, authorities floated the idea of borrowing \$100M from international capital markets to keep things afloat but the move is being opposed by some at high levels of government.

The cabinet has already roped in the Oppenheimer Fund (OF), a U.S.-based international investment group to help it raise the money.

De Ware Tijd, the leading daily newspaper reports that the measure is an immediate move of desperation because approaches to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for bridging finance will take too long so the recommendation is for the money to be sourced from major financial institutions.

"The loan will have a term of 18 months with an interest rate of eight percent per year," the paper said.

An IMF team is in Paramaribo, the country's capital for talks with top officials but there are real fears that the bureauc-

racy of such an institution will mean that Suriname won't draw down its desired soft loan for several months yet.

This is as bauxite and oil prices remain depressingly weak, while gold from the two mega mines in the interior has been showing signs of a decent and steady improvement in recent weeks. Rates for rice remain unspectacular.

But while officials look for immediate solutions amid rising commodity prices and a continuing weakening of the currency, Central Bank Chief Glenn Gersie is setting his face against the borrowing of such a large sum by an economy that is already tanking.

The result is that top officials are now reported to be looking for a compromise route to source the money while an effort is being made to push the IMF into acting faster.

Last November, the country devalued its currency by 20 percent, sending up prices and increasing tensions among labor unions.

Back in 2012 when prices were better for its exports, Central Bank foreign reserved had

topped a billion dollars. At the beginning of this year, it was headed to less than \$400M hence the level of panic among officials.

Like Guyana, Suriname is a major exporter of gold, bauxite and rice. Its economy has also raked in hundreds of millions from oil when prices were more decent than today.

In the 1970s, engineers drilling on shore water wells on its west coast across from Guyana stumbled on wells gushing black gold, pushing Guyanese officials to begin drilling on the other side of the border Corentyne River, albeit without success.

PSC/CUNY said the action was expected to begin at 5 pm with a rally outside the governor's office, 633 Third Ave., between 40th and 41 strees in Manhattan.

PSC-CUNY said students, led by the University Student Senate, will march across the Brooklyn Bridge this Sunday, March 13 "to demand state investment in their university, an end to tuition hikes and a fair contract for CUNY

faculty and staff.
PSC-CUNY said the students are mobilizing other CUNY students, alumni, faculty and staff, and elected officials to join in the march.


The crowd will assemble Sunday at noon at City Hall Park before heading to the

"Members of the PSC will be marching with the CUNY students to keep the momentum going after Thursday's #CUNYrising event," the statement said.

PSC-CUNY wants the public to join CUNY Rising Alliance "as hundreds of students, education activists, union members and others rally and march to defend the right of all New Yorkers to an affordable, high-quality college education.'

The union said "the crisis at CUNY affects all working people in New York City, especially low-income communities and people of color.

"With music, protest, analysis and testimony, we will demand an end to the fiscal starvation of CUNY," it said.

Growing concerns over terrorist activity in T&T

Financial transactions are suspected to be linked to more than 100 persons participating in terrorist activity in Trinidad and Tobago over the past year.

This is according to the Director of the Financial Intelligence Unit of Trinidad and Tobago (FIUTT) Susan Francois, who noted that suspicious transactions linked to terrorism, had tripled.

This was revealed in the FIUTT's 2014/2015 report, which was laid in the Senate recently by the Minister of Finance Colm Imbert. It covered the period Oct. 1, 2014 to Sept. 30, 2015.

Francois said there were five financial transaction reports that were suspected to be linked to terrorist activity in the year 2013 / 2014, but that number increased significantly within the next 12 to 16 months.

The FIUTT director said while there were 16 reports "the number of suspects identified in these reports, suspected terrorists and their financiers, exceeded that amount."

"The FIUTT has received and ana- from government offices," she said.

lyzed information from other local and international sources on over 100 persons who are suspected of participating in terrorist activities," she said.

Francois said based on reports of suspected terrorist activity, the FIUTT contributed to the Egmont Group, ISIL project on Western Hemispheric Regional Financial Intelligence Profile on ISIL, foreign terrorist fighters.


She said once disclosure was authorized, the FIUTT "will share the regional profile and underacted global assessment with domestic government partners."

Francois lamented the fact that terrorist groups were "bent on destabilizing communities, and causing loss of life; activities which are likely to have a global impact around the world, including the Caribbean."

"The FIUTT will recommend that the authorities give serious consideration to instituting limits to the use of cash for the purchase of goods and services, as well as in the collection of revenue from government offices" she said

Deadly prison riots in Guyana, 17 dead

Inmates who rioted at Guyana's main prison facility for the past three days Friday signed off on a gentleman's truce with authorities to cease rebellious activities following an unprecedented meeting with cabinet members who have pledged to deal with several decades-old grievances including delays in trials, better food, and officer brutality.

A visibly rattled Public Security Minister Khemraj Ramjattan and State Minister Joseph Harmon Friday met with a group of more than a dozen handcuffed prisoners to hear reasons for the riot at the Georgetown Prisons that led to the deaths of 17 inmates, injuries to eight others as well as several guards during a fresh round of unrest Friday.

The riots began on Wednesday night with inmates setting nine fires to beds and furniture and causing a serious disturbance at the prison in the heart of Georgetown City, the capital.

Authorities called in the riot squad, soldiers and other armed security personnel to quell the blaze and restore order. By Thursday morning, fires were again set this time it consumed 17 inmates after colleagues had barricaded doors with bed frames and pelted guards with objects as they tried to get to them. The inmates also accused officers of severely beating them and pushing some of them back into burning cells.

Early on Friday, a single fire was lit and inmates erupted again, forcing riot police to lace them with tear smoke but the eight officers rushed to hospitals for treatment appear to have suffered the brunt of smoke inhalation and were spirited away from the facility while colleagues battled to quell the rebellion.

Mid morning Friday as well, ministers Ramjattan and Harmon agreed to meet with a representative team of inmates and said after a hour-long session that a truce had been agreed on while irritants would be fixed by government immediately.

Minister Ramjattan said some of the measures to improve conditions at the prison would include better quality food, an increase in the twice per week number of telephone calls to families, while authorities plan to lobby the judiciary to speed up trials for inmates on remand for misdemeanors and felonies. Some inmates are awaiting trials for up to five years.


In turn, the prisoners have agreed to cease rioting, setting fires to beds, hurling rocks and objects at guards and generally causing unrest at the facility, built for about 500 but now housing twice the number.

"We have agreed to keep our end of the bargain and they have agreed to keep theirs," Harmon said.

Ramjattan said a board of inquiry into the deaths of the 17 on Thursday will be established to probe reasons and to deal with some of the deeper problems at the facility including the need for increased physical space.

"This was a very useful meeting with the prisoners," said Harmon. "A prison is not a five-star hotel but we have to have some minimum standards."

Who is Donald Trump?

Just under one score years ago a core of U.S. fundamentalists got together to plot one of the most egregious and ill-fated crimes of human history. The plot was hatched under the rubric: Project for a New American Century. The plotters collaborated to destroy seven governments in the Middle East and North Africa: Iraq, Libya, Syria, Iran, Lebanon, Somalia, Sudan. They, and media corporations in the U.S. and Britain, called this war "the War on Terror"; and advertised it as being conducted by "the international community." These plotters are also referred to as the neo-Cons, right wing extremists, state terrorists.

Today the planet is reaping the whirlwind of the plot: two million men, women and children killed; the assassination, murder and attempted murder of the leaders of sovereign states; the massive destruction of the economic and social assets of independent nation states; humungous destabilization and the spawning of genocide leading to a massive refugee crisis in the Middle East and Europe; the reckless militarization of North Africa and the Middle East, and a corresponding surge in profits by U.S. military corporations; enhanced U.S. terror, drones, waterboarding torture, and the spread of terror to outlying nations like Pakistan, Turkey, Kurdistan.

Additionally, the emergence of a new proxy war between Russia and the U.S. in Syria; the growth of terrorist extremism; increased polarization between religious ethnicities, and between the Palestinians and Israelis; putting under clear and present danger entire populations in Europe and the United States; and an oil war between the Saudis on the one hand, and the

Iranians, Iraqis and shale gas on the other, leading towards diminished oil and gas prices.

Into this melee of terror jumps Donald Trump. With the exception of his promise to smash ISIS, he promises not military war, but war by trade. He likes Putin, who might be "a genius;" he could talk with Putin. And he loves China. Mexico, Viet Nam; but he would have to negotiate, conduct trade war with them, to get a better deal for America. The ploughshares of several international trade pacts would be beaten into swords. What cat has dragged this in? Neo-conservatives and conservative Republicanism are befuddled. America seems ready to vote him in; and they can do nothing about it.

Meanwhile, in Latin America, four of the most committed leftist (in the U.S. dictionary) leaders have fallen or had permanent setbacks: Chavez, Maduro, Morales, Kirchner; without a shot being fired. Ironically, as the right digs its heel into the Latin American left, the left digs its heel into the American extreme right. Bernie Sanders and Donald Trump. These two are a challenge to the worst forms of Republican right-wing terror, and to Hillary Clinton, a masked version of it.

But will Donald Trump, the Trump deal, save the U.S. from its fate? Will his formula, the preeminence of trade brawl over military embattlement, work? No. His version of talk, negotiation, trade war, will lead inexorably to war. There are just too many goods, corporations, trade pacts, chasing too few markets. Markets are rubbing into each other creating the friction for war. And Trump's wall is not a wall at all; it is the wolf of terror created by the neo-cons. It is the self-fulfilling prophesy based on a self-fulfilling plot.

Women empowerment central to sustainable development

DUBLIN, March 2016 (IPS) - "Planet 50-50 by 2030: Step It Up for Gender Equality" — the theme of this year's International Women's Day serves as a timely reminder that, despite incremental progress of recent years and the ambition of the new global development agenda, we must redouble efforts to achieve a world underpinned by gender equality. All women must be empowered to realise their full and equal rights. But what does it actually mean to step it up for gender equality?

For me, this requires targeted approaches to ensure that all women have a voice in the formulation of decisions that impact upon their lives. This is particularly important when it comes to facilitating the engagement of grassroots women. To realise the "leave no-one behind" approach called for in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the commitment "to reach the furthest behind first". grassroots women must be recognised as key actors in global sustainable develop-

Grassroots women around the world hold a wealth of knowledge which we will need to manage the impacts of climate change and accelerate sustainable development. However, in order to properly value this knowledge and put it to use, women must be allowed to participate meaningfully

in the design, planning and implementation of policies and programmes that impact on their lives. Ensuring women's voices are heard and their needs acted uponis central to advancing climate justice.

The impacts of climate change are different for women and men.

Grassroots women are more likely to bear the greater burden in the face of climate change, particularly in situations of poverty. Climate change exacerbates existing patterns of inequality, including gender inequality. Grassroots women have limited access to productive resources; restricted mobility and little voice in decision makingleave them highly vulnerable to climate change. Climate policy, to be effective. must understand these underlying inequalities in order to address the different ways in which climate effects grassroots women.

Enabling the meaningful participation of women is not just the right thing to do, it is also the smart thing to do. The global development sector has learned, sometimes the hard way, that programmes designed for vulnerable communities. without engaging with the women of the community, rarely achieve their desired outcomes. This important lesson is reflected in the Sustainable Development Goal 5 https://sustainabledevelopment.un.org/sdg5 (Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls) which includes a target to: 'Ensure women's full and effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership at all levels of decision-making in political, economic and public life'. This need is particularly acute in the case of grassroots women. Unfortunately, the importance of including women in decision making and promoting women's leadership is less well understood by the climate regime. Yet the majority of those on the front lines of poverty and climate change are women.

Some progress has made under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFC-CC). In 2012 the Parties to the Convention adopted the Doha Miracle (Decision 23/CP.18), a decision to enhance the participation of women in climate change negotiations.Parties will review progress against the ambition this decision at COP 22 in November. When they do, however, they will see that only slight gains have been made in terms of equality of representation at negotiations. For instance, the latest UNFCCC Gender Composition Report highlights that only 36 percent of delegates were women at COP 20, and this figure drops to 26 percent when

you should be the designated anti-Trump.

Of course, the narrative would not have gotten to these extremes of clown-car adventurism, had the party as a whole in the first place taken, again, a principled stand against Trump's racist bilge and general hate mongering, and told him to take a hike. You wind up where Republicans are today when you prove yourself too gutless to employ condemnation and commensurate action where you know they're clearly warranted.

Trump-led circus atmosphere that has enveloped the GOP's nominee search this time around has turned the spotlight on party structures, as they exist here in the U.S., as distinct, for example, from national parties as we know them to operate in Caribbean democracies. The ease with

which Trump has been a tail wagging the GOP dog, even in the face of strenuous objection from party headliners far and wide to his being the potential brand representative, begs the question: Who or what constitutes the "establishment" of the Republican party? One analyst, when asked this after the circus had been underway for a while, proceeded to list an informal mix of major donors. governors, etc. One imagines that there are other interpretations of what the GOP establishment is.

Fitting into the party leadership bubble somewhere is that Republicans (as do Democrats) have a national committee. The post of chairman of the Republican National Committee is one whose sphere of influence one might wonder about, if not before, certainly as of the time that African American Michael Steele served as chairman a few years ago. The current chairman is a man named Reince Priebus, who was busy declaring to assembled conservatives at their annual gathering in Washington recently, that whoever the GOP nominee turns out to be would be guaranteed the party's full backing. This, even as Mitt Romney at the very gathering, and assorted other GOP power players across the board were sounding off about how embarrassing and utterly undesirable Trump would be as the party's standard bearer.

Republicans have at certain times in the past indicated having arrived at some point of self-examination that would supposedly be leading to some kind of substantive directional shift. Their much ballyhooed intention to undertake serious outreach to minorities comes to mind - an effort whose fruits seem none too visible. But this scrambling of the nomination process precipitated by one guy's toxic presence has to be the GOP's most important cautionary tale to date. It's left to be seen if that elusive party "establishment" fails to take preventive action against getting similarly trapped down the road.

considering heads of delegations. In Lima Parties agreed to commence the Lima work programme on gender, a two-year exploration of the gender dimensions of climate change and the Paris Agreement on climate change recognises the need for gender equality and women's empowerment.

These are all signs of progress, but a lot more needs to be done to be done in order for women's voices to be thoroughly included in the formation of climate action. A key next step is investment in training and capacity building for grassroots women in order to enable full and effective participation. This is captured in SDG 13 (Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts) which includes a target which calls on States to promote capacity building mechanisms in small island developing states and least developed countries to assist women, youth and local and marginalised communities to take part in climate change-related planning and management. Operationalising this target will be critical to achieving a harmonised and people centred approach to both the sustainable development agenda and the new climate agreement.

In 2015, the global community laid a foundation upon which we can build a safer world with opportunity for

all. In concluding the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Paris Agreement on climate change, world leaders signalled a willingness to change course – to leave behind the unequal and unsustainable traditional development models and move towards a future free from poverty and want, with abundant clean energy and a healthy environment.

In 2016 we begin to plan and implement these two ambitious, universal international processes; we must ensure that women's voices, and human rights, inform our actions. Grassrootswomen must not be seen simply as passive recipients of climate assistance. They are key actors in achieving their right to development. By acknowledging grassroots women as agents of change within their communities, valuing their knowledge and building their capacity to adapt, decision makers can develop sustainable, long term climate solutions at a local level which will strengthen whole communities.

As we "step it up for gender equality," I call on all those in positions of influence to provide the platforms for grassroots women to speak to for themselves. Listening to, and valuing, theirknowledge and experiencewill help to shape progresstowards 2030 that is good for people, the planet and gender equality.

signee was found with contaminants.

She told the Jamaica Information Service (JIS) that the implications of the findings, including health risks, were discussed with the importer, adding that "these factors formed the basis for our decision to dispose of the commodity."

St. Kitts

There is no Zika case in St. Kitts and Nevis to date, This is according to Minister of State, Senator Wendy Phipps, who has responsibility for health.

She has confirmed that presently there are no suspected or laboratory confirmed cases of the Zika virus on the twin island federation.

The minister made the claim during a statement in the National Assembly recently concerning the Aedes



aegypti mosquito-borne virus that has been identified in some islands of the Caribbean region.

She said visitors to St. Kitts and Nevis should not be afraid to travel to the island.

Owing to the economic impact of Zika, the World Bank has provided US\$150 million in financing to Latin America and the Caribbean region to help combat the virus outbreak.

Turks and Caicos Islands

Former Turks and Caicos Islands premier Michael Misick is throwing his hat again into the political ring in the



British Overseas Territory's upcoming elections, despite being in the midst of a corruption trial.

Elections must be held no later than February 2017. And Misick, who led the Turks and Caicos Islands (TCI) from 2003 to 2009, before resigning, said he intends to put forward himself as

a candidate for the ruling Progressive National Party (PNP).

Misick has submitted his name to the party he led for two general election victories, for consideration in the constituency of North and Middle Caicos- the constituency where he was born and which is currently represented by his nephew, Donhue Gardiner, who is also Minister of Immigration and Labor.

He and several other former government ministers and their associates are facing charges of conspiracy to accept bribes in public office, conspiracy to defraud and money laundering, brought by a special investigative team set up by the Turks and Caicos Islands in 2011.

The case is currently being heard before Justice Paul Harrison.

Trinidad

Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley said the level of crime in Trinidad and Tobago is "objectionable" and continues to get the attention of the Cabinet.

In a new release following the kill-

ing of a prison officer who was gunned down outside his home and two other murders, the prime minister stated



government acknowledges the level of criminal conduct in the country was unacceptable and the National Security Council and all other arms of the state, whose duty it is, must work assiduously "to ensure that we return, in the shortest possible time, to good order, peace, safety and security in Trinidad and Tobago."

Government, he said, will continue to focus and redouble its efforts to protect, secure and ensure an environment that is not conducive to fear and terror aimed at those citizens whose job it is to provide all aspects of security to the population," Dr. Rowley added.

The murder rate has climbed to 85 so far for the year.

Cuba announces first case of Zika, imported from Venezuela

HAVANA (AP) _ Cuba announced Wednesday that it had detected the first case of the Zika virus on the island, which had been one of the last nations in the Western Hemisphere free of the disease.

The Ministry of Health said in state media that a 28-year-old Venezuelan post-doctoral student in gastroenterology arrived in the country Feb. 21 and a day later came down a high fever and rash. The government says the woman was under medical quarantine in Artemisa province outside Havana with other newly arrived doctors when her symptoms were detected.

An initial test for Zika was negative but a second test on Feb. 28 was positive, health officials said. The woman remains hospitalized in good condition at Cuba's main tropical disease hospital in Havana, officials said. The woman's husband and brother-in-law had both come down with Zika in Venezuela in recent weeks. The medical professionals who had entered Cuba alongside the sick woman remain in quarantine with no sign of Zika,

officials said.

The Health Ministry made no mention of any case of Zika transmitted inside Cuba.

President Raul Castro announced Feb. 22 that the country was militarizing its fight to kill disease-carrying mosquitoes, assigning 9,000 soldiers to spray for the insects nationwide. Since then, soldiers, police and health workers have launched an intense door-to-door effort to fumigate for mosquitos.

Gaps had been increasingly

obvious in the effort to spray homes and businesses for the Aedes aegypti mosquito, which has infected thousands of Cubans with the dengue virus and dozens with chikungunya, a disease that causes fever and severe joint pain. Cubans

frequently claimed allergies or asthma to put off fumigation crews composed of public health workers and teenagers completing obligatory military service.

Those days appear to be ending as troops deployed across the country with hand-held foggers are now armed with the threat of fines for anyone who resists fumigation and fog-spraying trucks and small airplanes are blanketing the capital and other cities with white clouds of pesticide.

In Cuba's airports and cruise ship terminals, crews of white-clad doctors are monitoring incoming travelers for high temperatures or other signs of illness. Medical officials said the fight against Zika had taken on increasing urgency as Cuba's hot, humid spring and summer draw near.

Cuba earns billions of dollars a year from programs that dispatch doctors to allied countries like Venezuela and Brazil and bring medical students to Cuba. Wednesday's report appeared to imply that those medical professionals were now being quarantined on return.





Haitian airline accepts delivery of first ATR aircraft

Haitian-owned airline Sunrise Airways says it has accepted delivery of its first ATR 42-320 aircraft, saying it is "an important next step in its efforts toward establishing a hub in Port-au-Prince," the Haitian capital.

With the new ATR, Sunrise Airways said on Friday that Haiti will "better serve gateways throughout the Western Caribbean."

The 46-seat aircraft last week began operating s inaugural flights between Port-au-Prince and Camaguey, Cuba, as well as its ongoing service to/ from Santiago de Cuba.

"The new flagship of the Sunrise fleet is here, marking a bright new beginning for our company and valued passengers," Philippe Bayard, president and owner of Sunrise Airways, told reporters in Portau-Prince. "Our investment in this aircraft underscores our commitment to expanding our route network and providing the traveling public with the very best."

Sunrise Airways said it is leasing its new ATR 42-320 under a comprehensive ACMI agreement with Danish Air Transport.

The two parties are currently engaged in discussions toward adding a second ATR to the Sunrise fleet in 2016.

Sunrise Airways is the first and only Haitian-owned airline to be awarded a Part 129

The airline said it is "rising to meet the progressively expanding demand for safe, reliable, and affordable air travel throughout the Western Caribbean, operating daily

scheduled passenger service connecting key gateways across the region with the world."

From its hub in Port-au-Prince, the carrier currently serves Santo Domingo (JBQ); Santiago de Cuba (SCU); Cap Haitien (CAP); and, new for

2016, Camaguey, Cuba (CMW).

Additional new flights connecting Port-au-Prince with Kingston, Jamaica (KIN); Providenciales, Turks & Caicos (PLS); and Nassau, The Bahamas (NAS) are planned for 2016.

In line with the expansion of its route network, Sunrise Airways said it will also augment its fleet in 2016, adding new 46-seat ATR 42-320 aircraft to serve alongside its pre-existing cadre of 19-seat Jetstream 32 EP turboprops.

Eugene: Expand Summer Youth Employment Program

Brooklyn Council Member Dr. Mathieu Eugene, chairman of the City Council's Youth Services Committee, on Wednesday dispatched a letter signed by 40 of his colleagues asking Mayor Bill de Blasio to expand the funding for the Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) and to add more job opportunities for disconnected youth.

Eugene, who represents the 40th Council District in Brooklyn, said the letter, which has bipartisan support, highlights the need for the expansion of SYEP.

He said the program provided jobs to less than half of the young people who applied last year.

In 2015, more than 130,000 teenagers and young adults sought positions in the program but only about 54,000 individuals received jobs, Eugene said.

"We must do everything possible to make sure all of our young people who want to work are able to do so," Eugene said. "An investment in our youth is an investment in our city.'

"When our young people are unable to find jobs, they may be forced to pursue other alternative lifestyles in

order to make a living," he added. "By intervening early with positive opportunities, we may be able to change the course of our young people's futures."

Last week, Eugene held the Committee on Youth Services Hearing, "Oversight: The Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)."

He said he was joined by youth advocates who also shared his vision for the expansion of "this important program.'

As a long-time advocate for SYEP, Eugene said he has continually pushed for the program's expansion.

In past years, Eugene said there were enrollment slots for only approximately 36,000 young people.

He said because of his effort and collaboration with his colleagues, under the leadership of Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito, and with the support of Mayor de Blasio, "the program was expanded to include more than 50,000 positions for young people."

Eugene said he wants SYEP to continue increasing "until every applicant receives a job.'

In addition to the expansion of SYEP, the councilman also supports year-round jobs for the youth, especially disconnected ones.

He said a year-round job program, "Work, Learn, Grown (WLG)," currently offers 6,000 jobs for students

Eugene said he wants the program expanded "so that youth who are not enrolled in school would have an equal opportunity to apply for this program.'

Dominicans and Haitians bridging the gap

The Dominicans Love Haitians Movement has joined the ranks of creative Dominicans in artistic collaboration with Haitians reaching across the contentious boundary that separates the two populations of the one island, Hispaniola.

Held at the Nuyorican Poets Café, in late February, four Dominicans and five Haitians came together in poetry, music and inspiration to celebrate commonalities.

The evening was organized by filmmaker and Borinqua College (Bushwick Campus) communications professor Clarivel Ruiz, a Dominican-American who went to the Dominican Republic for the first time in 2009. While she might have been aware of animosity between Haiti and the Dominican Republic, it really hit home on that first family trip to the DR when her father revealed that one of his grandmothers was Haitian.

Ruiz tells this story as an intro to a packed Nuyorican Café in this Lower East Side performance venue on that blustery rainy night.

At the point when her parents had been married for 45 years, her mother said, "If I had known that, I wouldn't have married you." She was sharing this deep-seated prejudice.

A poet herself, Ruiz speaks about a personal journey of self-reflection. "I was looking for why this (Dominican mind-set) is the way it is, particularly Dominicans not honoring their African ancestry." She acknowledges how Dominicans have internalized the colonial attitude and denial of self.

The conversation of "the other" had also previously been with her; she had been having this discussion for several

"I asked myself how could we harness power on how we live our lives? How can we live without being hateful? I thought how poetry and music are great forms of expression of what we feel as people."

Inside the creative community, Ruiz found others with whom it resonated to bring Dominican and Haitian performing artists together. She discovered Afro-Latina poet Amanda Alcantara who "lives in the intersections of gender and race," who grew up in the DR and lives in between many identities. She found poet Roberto Carlos Garcia who knew Dominican poet YuBelly Rodriguez.

Ruiz's friend Jovce Azor immediately wanted to collaborate. Her husband Steve Azor, founder of Ayiti Deploge, reached out to Haitian talent, bringing in newly arrived Anie Alert Joseph who sang during the evening. On acoustic guitar, Mikaelle Cartright sang in French Manno Charlemagne's "Bam Yon Ti Limye" that asks: Why must the Black race suffer? Why are they treated so unfairly?

Others who performed were Haitian rapper singers Rossini Celestin and also D'eithchy & and Tre Issacs.

The 40-year-old multicultural and multi-arts Nuyorican Café, a perfect venue for these spoken words artists to perform together, has a history of giving voice to diverse groups of rising poets, actors, filmmakers and musicians who have not yet found consistent havens for their work.

'Soul Serenade' takes a spin

Vinyl is making a comeback.

Those are five words that put a smile on a music aficionado's face. A CD isn't the same, they say. An MP3 is nowhere near as good. You don't get the right sound unless you're spinning a record, so vinyl is coming back — but, for people like Rashod Ollison in "Soul Serenade," it never really left.

There was once a time when "Dusty" Ollison's parents were

He knows it's true; he has evidence of it, in the form of a picture taken at the beginning of their marriage, which lasted 13 years. When they split, he was old enough to witness but too young to understand, having become inured to the fights, the cheating, and the drinking at his home near Hot Springs, Arkansas.

After Ollison's father fled his family - leaving Ollison's mother with a 'tween and two small children — he rarely returned.

But he left a gift behind: stacks of vinyl.

Ollison says he remembers poking around music stores with his father, ogling covers, eager for approval of his taste in performers. Chaka Khan, Bobby Womack, Stevie Wonder, Ollison recalls fascination with their record labels spinning on the turntable. Michael Jackson gave him comfort, Aretha was a mood barometer, they all taught him about grown-up love through lyrics. With his mother working two full-time jobs to keep food on the table, Ollison counted on music to anchor him. It was his means of escape as his oldest sister took her rage out on him, as his family moved repeatedly, as he was bullied in school for "actin' like a woman."


He denied feminine gestures and a tender heart, but by age 13, he could no longer ignore that he was gay.

School, by then, had joined music as a thing of refuge; Ollison excelled at his lessons, achieved good grades, made friends, and expanded his playlist. As he grew, he also wondered about his father sometimes but was largely indifferent, even as the man lay dying.

And then an aunt told Ollison something that made him change his tune.

"Soul Serenade" starts where many good memoirs do: with a faded picture of a time that barely seems possible. From there, we're surprised by a death that promises to taint much of what's to come, all wrapped in family lore.

But don't get complacent. Author Rashod Ollison doesn't allow any lingering. Soon enough, his story becomes angry yelling, a smack upside the head, profanity, TV-as-babysitter, fists and sore feet. We're taken from neighborhood to neighborhood as the lights are shut off, the rent isn't paid, and he's taunted with words that his sister has to

explain. It's chaos — but it's also a darn good tale that it doesn't dissolve into whining or poorme-ing, testament to Ollison's storytelling skills.



The distinguished honorees presented with commendations included: Mike Muse, co-founder of Muse Recordings, political expert and commentator on XM Radio, and pop culture expert on VH1, BET NBC and ARISE: Faith Williams. student body president and a member of the Youth Leadership Council; Coney Island Generation Gap, a Future Focus Project / Arts and education program for low-income youth with a 100 percent graduation rate; and Jamilah Lemieux, senior editor at Ebony Magazine and champion of Black women and girls, and a fierce advocate for racial, social justice and LGBT rights.

President of Medgar Evers College, Dr. Rudolph F. "Rudy" Crew in his introduction, thanked Comptroller Springer for his contribution to African-American Heritage month and for honoring trailblazers in the community.

In his address to the audience, Springer said, "It is great being at Medgar Evers celebrating our trailblazers. I want to welcome you to this campus with amazing history," adding that the college was named for the great Twentieth Century Civil Rights Leader Medgar Evers, who was fearless in his fight for equality, and left an inspiring legacy for everyone, especially the youths who attend the college.

Naming Shirley Chisholm, the first African-American elected to Congress, Dr. Una Clarke, the first Caribbean-American elected to the New York City Council and Lena Horne, who was born in Bedford Stuyvesant, Springer said he honors people in the community who work everyday to lift everybody up.

"We respect the trailblazers," adding, "It is time to recognize the new frontier of the Civil Rights Movement, a true struggle for economic justice. Here in New York City we are using the fiscal power in the Comptroller's office for opportunity for all New Yorkers. We don't only talk diversity, we are taking action,"

Springer praised his office for electing Carra Wallace, the first chief diversity officer, and Deputy Wendy Garcia, as he continues his fight to end inequality practices in services where only just five percent of contracts go towards women and minority business.

The politician spoke passionately about creating jobs for the millions of New Yorkers and empowering neighborhoods to be competitive to drive down prices and save taxpayers dollars.

The NY City agency report card on minority / women-owned businesses failed with a grade D, said Springer who argued that the agency must do better. "I am also holding Wall Street accountable because billions of our pension money are invested in these firms but the firms do not look like our city," he said. He guipped they are pale, male and stale, adding that 97 percent of hedge fund managers are white males.

As such, the Comptroller's office has launched a new initiative to make diversity a factor when choosing investment manger firms. "This should be the national model," said Springer, calling for boardrooms to be opened to minority so that the young African American males who work hard at Medgar Evers College to complete a degree in business, have a great chance to work on Wall Street.

'We have to make sure that everyone rise through the ranks and sit on corporate boards that manage the largest companies in he United States of America, and when it comes to diversity, we have to change America's corporate landscape, one board at a time. It is not just about dollars and cents, it's the human part. of what we do."

Springer blasted NYCHA for the 50,000 people he said are in shelters, 3000 of whom are children who sleep in rat-infested, un-protected environment and called on the agency to protect the city's children.

"It is time to honor our great African-American leaders in our communities who are working everyday to make our city better," he told the audience which included Dr. Una Clarke, newly elected Assemblywoman Pamela Harris, founder of the popular youth organization Coney Island Generation GAP, and Daniel Abrahamson of the Mayor's Office.

46 state legislators endorse Clinton

Symposium to examine Sparrow's career

The storied career of the artist who has been the most renowned name ever in the field of calypso, Mighty Sparrow, will be examined in a symposium presented by the Trinidad & Tobago Folk Arts Institute, in collaboration with the Medgar Evers College School of Professional & Community Development, on Friday evening, April 8. Titled "Just Like That, Sparrow Turned 80," the symposium will be held in the Mary Pinkett Lecture Hall on the Medgar Evers College campus in Brooklyn, N.Y.

The symposium's title hints at the unlikely reality for veteran watchers of the inimitable "Birdie," regarded by many as calypso's enduring evergreen, that he has indeed joined the octogenarian class as of last July. It's not difficult to imagine that some who recall Sparrow when he was fresh out of the blocks in the 1950s — and followed his remarkable career, through those frequent portray-

als in song of himself as the embodiment of male prowess — would probably not be adjusting readily to his becoming an 80-year-old.

Featuring presentations from a specially selected roster of participants, the symposium will explore various aspects of Sparrow's career, one that is without parallel in the history of the calypso art form. He has been the most prodigious producer of calypso material, with a staggering number of recordings released over the years, and he has been, as well, the foremost global ambassador for calypso.

Sparrow burst on the national scene in Trinidad in 1956 when, not yet 21 years old, he won the Calypso King and Carnival road march titles with what would become one of his legendary hits, "Jean and Dinah." Slinger Francisco was born in Grenada, and migrated with his mother to Trinidad when he was a child. Blessed with a good voice, he

sang in the school choir but soon developed a love for calypso, which intensified when he was in his teens. With his natural flair for performing, the youngster felt convinced he was destined for a career as an entertainer. The "Sparrow" sobriquet was bestowed when he became a regular at one of Port of Spain's calypso tents.

Sparrow proceeded to prove himself a master of calypso like no other and dominated the genre from the time he won his first title. He clearly was without peer as a performer, displaying a singular ability to wow audiences, whether in live performances or recordings, with his flawless command of material in any topic category. And his choice of topics ran the gamut: political discourse, social commentary, male-female relationships, humor, tributes...would typically have measurable impact, once given the deft handling of a Sparrow delivery.

Fan favorites from the enor-

mous library of material introduced by Sparrow also covers the spectrum. Lovers of commentary on the social condition or world affairs might favor "Capitalism Gone Mad," "Slave," "Education," "Crown Heights Justice," "Wanted Dead Or Alive." For those partial to Sparrow in party or good-times mode, preferred choices might include "Drunk and Disorderly," "Going Home Tonight," "Sa Sa

Yea," "Margarita." His paeans to heroes like "Kennedy," "William the Conqueror," "I Will Not Apologize," (tribute to Nelson Mandela) and "Memories" (tribute to departed fellow artists) would be sentimental favorites as well. And no listing of what has most delighted fans is complete without ribald hits like "Congo Man," "Mae Mae," "BG Plantain," "Wood In the Fire," "Sixty Million Frenchmen."

Obama's heir to address Sharpton's confab

Two presidential candidates in the race for nomination by the Democratic Party are confirmed to attend the 25th anniversary convention commemorating the beginning of the National Action Network (NAN).

Recently confirmed by Rev. Al Sharpton who founded the Civil Rights organization, Hillary Clinton, former secretary of state and Senator Bernie Sanders will attend the annual convention slated from April 13 to April 16.

The two contrasting candidates now locked in a campaign to win the approval of the political party that named then Senator Barack Obama, the best choice to defeat any Republican in 2008are slated to headline NAN's 25th silver anniversary event in Manhattan.

"One of them is going to be the nominee," Sharpton said during a recent radio broadcast where he urged potential voters to register and attend the principal meeting of any national Black organization to convene this year.

According to the activist / leader, on the first day of the convention, Clinton, a former first lady and now presidential hopeful will lead a special plenary address at noon.

The Vermont representative will do the same at 10 am on the third day of the convention.

Annually attended by a myriad of local, state and nationally elected officials, this year's gathering significantly spotlights personalities and issues that could impact the outcome of the November elections to decide a successor to America's historymaking first Black president.

Prior to his first election before beating Clinton, Obama attended NAN's 2008 confab.

There he was met with



warmth and assurance by a crowd certain of his impending and historic victory.

Three years later, President Obama returned to deliver the keynote remarks during an awards ceremony named in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. There at the signature event known as the Keepers of the Dream Awards, the president addressed a gathering lauding leading names in politics, entertainment, civil rights and business. The awards, given each year in April to mark the anniversary of Dr. King's death, honor those who have continued to advocate for the principles for which the Nobel Peace Prize winner gave his life.

This year's honorees have not been announced however, in addition to the two Democratic frontrunners that will attend the annual event, Sharpton said five cabinet members of the Obama administration are also confirmed to attend the four-day convention.

Among them, Broderick Johnson, White House cabinet secretary and assistant to the president; Julian Castro, secretary of Housing and Urban Development, Thomas Perez, secretary of Labor, Sylvia Mathews Burwell, secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services and Maria Contreras-Sweet, administrator of the Small Business Administration.

This year with Clinton making a second bid to be elected America's first female leader she is poised to win the same favor from NAN loyalists and members of the Democratic Party who may perceive her as the most electable-Democrat to win against a fierce conservative field of Republicans.

While no member of the Republican slate of candidates were announced to attend NAN's proving ground ceremony, it must be noted that since 1991 when the organization formed, Democrats have dominated the plenary sessions and panel discussions which focus on topics related to civil rights, criminal justice, voter protection, education, gun-violence, immigration, jobs, healthcare, women's rights and police brutality.

Already Sharpton has had meetings with the two leading candidates.

He first met with Sen. Sanders at a Harlem restaurant.

Together, they discussed issues confronting the Black community — Flint, Michigan's water crisis, pervasive police brutality meted out to Blacks and other minorities throughout the nation and joblessness.

After the meeting he said he would also meet with Clinton but would not endorse either of the candidates until he was convinced of the sincerity of each candidate to keep promises to the Black community.

He has since met with Clinton and is yet to announce a choice Democrat.

NAN's convention will bring together influential national leaders in the areas of civil rights, government, labor, religion, business, politics, media and activism to assess progress.

There will be a special tel-

evised forum at the end of the convention entitled "Measuring the Movement" which will be hosted by Rev. Sharpton. It will feature leaders from the legacy civil rights organizations and reviews by some of the legends of the civil rights movement.

NAN was formed in response to the onslaught of racial murders throughout New York. Prior to its formation the brutal murder of Trinidad & Tobago native Michael Griffith in Howard Beach galvanized activists and concerned citizens to confront the growing tragedies. Following that tragedy which mobilized national attention, The Bensonhurst Murder case and The Central Park Jogger Trial also created tensions with polarized reactions from a divided New York.

When businessman Donald Trump placed his full-page opinion in four daily newspapers that may have led to the indictment of the five Black teenagers, it seemed as if the city became even more divided.

Despite the fact, the youths pleaded not guilty and denied being in Central Park at the time of the assault of jogger Patricia Meile, they were found guilty.

During their prison term, an inmate confined at the same facility confessed his guilt and gave detailed accounts of his involvement in the brutal attack of the jogger.

The youths who had aged to men were eventually freed but Trump never apologized for his egregious and hasty conviction of the Black Harlem residents who lived across from the park and claimed a coerced confession by police to be their only

NAN forcefully embraced that case and many of the unjustified accusations and murders of minorities and since then has rallied in support of the Cato family from Guyana, (whose seven-year-old son was killed in Crown Heights, Brooklyn) the Sean Bell family - who lost a son to police killing on a Thanksgiving eve that also marked his pre-wedding date, the family of Trayvon Martin (who grieved after the teenager was shot in Florida by a security guard who was acquitted for the shooting) and most recently, the family of Eric Garner, a Staten Island resident who was choked to death by police.







vear, student loan debt is digging a deeper hole for more young Americans. Over a nine-year period, the average student loan balance among 25-yearolds grew 91 percent, from \$10,649 in 2003 to \$20,326 in 2012. More than 38 million Americans have outstanding debt amounting to nearly \$1 trillion. 

The shameless playboy's almost 30, and his womanizing ways have become an embarrassment to his family and friends. They feel it's high time for him to mature, especially after he brought his latest conquest (Chantel Jeffries) along on a blind date set up by his sister, Sherry (Paula Patton).

Besides, his BFFs, Ricky

(Donald Faison) and Victor (Robert Christopher Riley) have both already settled down. The former is married and doing his best to impregnate his desperate for a baby wife, Pressie (Daschia Polanco). And the latter is engaged to Ginger (Lauren London) who's worried that Charlie's going to ruin her impending wedding by "bringing one of those floozies" to the recep-

However, he still gets involved with the express understanding that theirs will be a "no strings, no expectations" relationship. She agrees, despite the fact that she's only used to being in committed ones. So, they're both ostensibly operating in uncharted waters.

Will this libidinous liaison turn into love, now that Charlie has grudgingly agreed to give what would ordinarily be a one-night stand a chance to blossom? That is the burning question at the center of "The Perfect Match," an intriguing romantic romp directed by Billie Woodruff (Addicted).

Fair warning: this character-driven escapade is certainly not for the prudish, as it contains frontal nudity and some fairly frank dialogue. That being said, it's also funny, engaging, unpredictable and visually-captivating, courtesy of a constant parade of eye candy across the screen.

Overall, this delightful ensemble dramedy is reminiscent of a couple of other great urban classics, "Love Jones" (1997) and "The Best Man" (1999). That's good company!





The Dallas Black Dance Theatre returns to New York for its fifth season of self-produced performances on April 22-23, 2016 at the Ailey Citigroup Theater, located at 405 West 55th St., New York, NY 10019. The "Masterworks Redefined - New York" series will showcase the energetic dance artistry of the repertory dance company that is turning 40 in its 2016-2017 season. The National Endowment for the Arts designated Dallas Black Dance Theatre as an "American Masterpiece Touring Artist."

Highlighting the New York season are four New York premieres. "Instinct 11.1" captures the essence and strength of Francesca Harper's mother, Denise Jefferson, who was the director of The Ailey School from 1984 until her death in 2010. Harper says she felt her mother was born with a warrior spirit. Harper likes to see dancers moving with a sense of empowerment and ferocity. Ms. Harper began her career as a choreographer in Germany where she choreographed a full evening of work for the Holland Dance Festival. She was also the dance consultant for the feature film "Black Swan," starring Natalie Portman, who went on to win an Oscar for her work. Ms. Harper has her own dance company, The Francesca Harper Project.

She is currently a visiting professor at Sungkyunkwan University in Seoul, South Korea and was recently invited to speak at the Korean International Symposium of Arts Education. Moore earned her MFA

from New York University, Tisch School of the Arts. Ms. Moore is a former dancer with Ronald K. Brown's Evidence.

After dancing with Madonna and being dance captain for Cher's Dressed to Kill Tour, Jamal Story sends Dallas Black Dance Theatre dancers skyward in an aerial duet featuring DBDT's most powerful dancers. His aerial work What to Say, has a storyline revolving around the Greek myth of Echo and Narcissus. Story, a former DBDT dancer, has also danced

on Broadway in "The Color Purple" and "Motown: The Musical on Broadway" serving as dance captain on both productions. Jamal sits on the board of the SAG-AFTRA New York Local as co-chair of the union's National Dance Committee.

Furtherance, choreographed by former Alvin Ailey dancer Kirven Douthit-Boyd, takes the audience on a journey from anguish to bliss amid the backdrop of a Japanese taiko drum musical score with additional sound effects of Asian gongs and bells. her pieces including "Hidden Beauty" connect to those attending the exhibit.

"That aesthetic for me, more than anything, is something for me that speaks specific to the diaspora because of the knotting, the tying – I remember being a little girl and my granny would knot and tie my hair up because I had natural hair," she explained.

Specifically, Smith's work focuses on the migrant experience and viewing the world through a lens of hyphenated identities.

"All of my work, although it is about a human experience, it is predominantly focused on the people of the African diaspora and the concern, joy, triumph, and pain of what makes us who we are," Smith said."

Aside from Smith, other artists will tap into specific instances and experiences as it relates to those in African communities such as carrying water in Tamara Natalie Madden's piece "The Water Carrier" or Lehna Huie's figurative works linking Jamaica with the African diaspora.

"I hope there is a diverse intersection of people coming into the gallery to view the work, not just as an aesthetic exploration but an exploration of self and community, and life beyond the lens," Smith said.


Sir Curtly who is the current bowling consultant said that senior players must, however, deliver on their performances.

Portland Timbers beat Crew 2-1

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) _ New season, same result.

Fanendo Adi scored in the 79th minute and the defending champion Portland Timbers defeated the Columbus Crew 2-1 on Sunday in a rematch of last year's MLS Cup final.

The Timbers won that one 2-1, too.

All 20 MLS teams opened the league's 21st season on Soccer Sunday. Portland kicked off the season by unveiling a championship banner hung in the rafters of the north end

of Providence Park.

Diego Valeri's first-half goal gave the Timbers the early lead until Federico Higuain's highlight-worthy bicycle kick drew the Crew even in the 68th minute. Adi's goal gave Portland its first March win since 2012.

"It's good to get off to a good start. Three points. The sooner the better," Timbers coach Caleb Porter said. "Now we've got to get three points in the next one. I'm looking forward to being with these guys for the next 11 months, and 33 more games. There's going to be ups and downs, but if we play like we did today, there will be more ups than downs."

Last season, the Timbers defeated the Crew in Columbus for the title. Valeri scored in the opening 27 seconds, Rodney Wallace added a second goal some seven minutes later and Portland held on for the win.

It was Portland's first title since joining the league in 2011.

are. We showed today that we picked about Higuain. "He's a special player." up right where we left off, that last year wasn't an anomaly," Porter said. "We showed today that we can be even better. And I'm confident that we can.'

The Timbers took the early lead on Sunday on Valeri's free kick in the 23rd minute that was misjudged by Crew goalkeeper Steve Clark, who was also in goal for Columbus for the MLS Cup match. Valeri had an earlier chance in the 19th minute but he was offside.

Columbus star Kai Kamara charged the goal in the 60th minute but keeper Adam Kwarasev made a diving save. Higuain's stunning goal came eight minutes later off an assist from Ethan Finlay.

"He's talented, I'll tell you what," "We showed today how hungry we Columbus coach Gregg Berhalter said

This is the only regular-season meeting between the two teams this season. Portland now leads the series 3-2-2.

"We knew it was a special game, the first time after the trophy," Valeri said.

The Timbers went 15-11-8 last season. Most of the team's starters are back with the exception of Wallace, who is now playing with Arouca in the Portuguese Premier League.

The Crew also went 15-11-8 to finish second in the Eastern Conference, led by Kamara with 22 goals. Kamara's total matched Toronto's Sebastian Giovinco for the league lead, but Giovinco earned the league's Golden Boot award with more assists.

No MLS player has had back-to-back 20-goal seasons.

There was no announcement from the Timbers about the reported signing of young wing Jack Barmby from Leicester City's system. The Oregonian this week reported the signing of the 21-year-old, who played for England's Under-20 national team.

It was the 86th consecutive sellout for the Timbers at Providence Park. The Timbers Army supporters group sang the national anthem, per tradition.

"For us, it was a good opportunity," Berhalter said. "If you play in a hostile environment, you get to see where you are right away. Like I said, we had intentions to come and control the game, and, for the most part, we accomplished that. I think we could have done a better job of controlling defensive transitions, limiting some of the damage there. But Associated Press it's a good mindset."

sity in Orangeburg, S. C., broke the St. Vincent and the Grenadines national record for the 200 meters by clocking 21.36 sec. in a race that involved five other athletes.

The previous record was set by Valentine-Parris himself in late January when he ran the 200 meters in 21.48 sec. for the Claflin Panthers, his university's athletic team, at the Emory Crossplex Invitational in Birmingham, Ala. In that event, Valentine-Parris simultaneously broke the Emory Crossplex Invitational record.

Valentine-Parris, 20, was again in winner's row last Saturday at the Savannah State Tiger Relays in Savannah, Ga. The Claflin Panthers relay team, of which Valentine Parris is an integral member, won the 4x800m relay in 8 min. 20 sec. Other members of the team were Odou Hazel, Christopher Hudson and Sixto Ramos.

Though triumphant in the last event, Valentine-Parris said it was "more so of training, just to keep fit. Because of the cold weather [in South Carolina], I couldn't train properly."

Valentine-Parris is expected this Friday and Saturday to compete in the 200 and 400m in the U.S. National Indoor Championship in Kansas City, Kansas. He said he is the only male athlete from Claflin University to qualify for the twoday track meet.

"According to my performances in past meets, I'm on par to winning the championship," Valentine-Parris told Caribbean Life in an exclusive interview Sunday night. "I thank God I'm still healthy, and I'm going to go out there to win the championship.

"Hopefully, I'll be fast enough to qualify for the World Indoor Championship to take place in Portland, Ore. on March 17," he added.

Valentine-Parris, who is currently ranked 6th in the United States in the 200 and 400m, was among the first athletes to represent the Thomas Saunders Secondary School (TSSS) in St. Vincent and the Grenadines in its initial bid in the prestigious Penn Relays at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia in 2011. He also represented TSSS at the Penn Relays a year later.

The nation's participation in the Penn Relays is coordinated by James Cordice, a former president of the Philadelphia-based St. Vincent and the Grenadines Organization of Pennsylvania (SVGOP).

Valentine-Parris, who is on an athletic scholarship at Claflin University, majoring in Sports Management and Business Administration, was St. Vincent and the Grenadines' National Under 14 and Under 15 Male Champ.

Among other events, he has competed in, over the years, are: The World Youth Champs, (France 2011); World Junior Champs (Barcelona, 2012); World Junior Champs (Eugene, Oregon, 2014); Commonwealth Games (Glasgow, Scotland, 2014); and NACAC Senior Champs (Costa Rica, 2015).

Brown's big night powers Lincoln back to Garden

Klay Brown didn't start Abraham Lincoln's semifinal game against George Westinghouse, but he sure did finish it.

The Christ the King transfer fought back cramps, scored 14 points, and made two of the game's biggest hustle plays in the fourth-seeded Railsplitters' 59-50 win over No. 8 George Westinghouse in the Public School Athletic League's Class AA boys' basketball semifinals on March 5. Railsplitters coach Dwayne "Tiny" Morton chose to sit the junior guard after he was late arriving to St. John's University because of a mix-up with his ride, but the punishment only fueled Brown.

"I knew I had to perform," Brown said. "My team needed me."

Lincoln was without star guard Rakym Felder, who suffered a broken bone in his foot in the quarterfinals. Without Felder — who may also miss the title game against No. 2 Thomas Jefferson at Madison

Square Garden on March 12 it was Brown's time to shine on both ends of the court.

He scored six points during Lincoln's game-changing 17–3 spurt in the third quarter, helping to put the Railsplitters up 50-34 going to the fourth after it held Weshtinghouse without a field goal for nearly 7 minutes.

Brown blocked shots and hustled down a huge rebound with 2:15 to play in the game and Lincoln (23-7) up seven. Morton fully understands how important Brown's night was to the team.

"I got to praise the kid from Queens," he said. "He came late. I didn't start him, but I think he is probably the reason why we are at the Garden right now.'

If Brown is the primary reason, his club's defense is the second — the Railsplitters forced turnovers in key situations and fended off multiple Warriors' runs in the back-

within two points after a Gerald Williams (13 points) putback with 6:53 to play in the third. The Warriors never got closer - mistakes led to Lincoln transition points each time Westinghouse crept close.

Warriors coach Everett Kelly was particularly upset his boys committed errors at half court or above the free throw line, giving his team little chance to get back on defense.

"Every time we made a run to try to get the game down to one-possession or so, we'd just turn it over," Kelly said. "Where we are making them, it leads to transition baskets. It gave them an opportunity to attack us without being able to defend the transition."

Akeem Tate chipped in 11 points for the Warriors, and Damarri Moore had seven.

Kelly's team was able to limit its turnovers and withstand an early 13-2 Lincoln run. The Warriors got a big lift off the bench from Saheem Westinghouse (17-7) was Ferguson, who connected on

his first three shots and scored eight points in the first quarter. A Ferguson trey with three seconds left brought Westinghouse within three at the end of the frame.

The Warriors came as close two more times in the second guarter, but the Railsplitters met the surges head-on each time. Brown kept Lincoln up 33-27 at half with a jumper and then a steal that led to a hoop from Donald Cannon Flores (10 points).

"Defense is out main priority," said teammate Cahiem with Felder likely out.

Brown (17 points), who is not related to Klay. "It gives us easy baskets on offense. We get out there on defense, and offense just comes naturally."

Lincoln is back in the final for the first time since it last won it all in 2013. And the task gets much tougher in the title game against Jefferson, even though the Railsplitters recently beat the Orange Wave 87–77 in the Brooklyn borough final. Lincoln, which finished third in the division, still feels like underdogs — especially



"Consu-mers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam.
