# Landlord's indictment a 'bittersweet victory'

Brooklyn Council Member Jumaane D. Williams has characterized as a "bittersweet victory" Monday's indictment of Manhattan developer Steve Croman on 20 felony charges related to allegations of tenant intimidation and fraud on May 9.

The charges include grand larceny, falsifying business records, a scheme to defraud, criminal tax fraud, and offering a false instrument for filing.

"Steve Croman's indictment on Monday is a bittersweet victory," said Williams, Deputy Leader and Chair of the City Council's Housing and Buildings Committee. "His indictment means that we are one step closer to stopping him from taking advantage of our City's housing crisis for personal profit."

"His surrender, and potential conviction, would mean there is one less greedy building owner harassing the City's most vulnerable so they can be replaced by higher-paying tenants," added Williams, who represents the 45th Council District in Brooklyn.

"I find it deplorable that former New York Police Officer Anthony Falconite, who took an oath to protect and serve, was the main instrument used in intimidating and forcing tenants out of their homes," he continued. "Croman continuously harassed, intimidated and manipulated rent-regulated tenants to force them out of their homes so he could convert their apartments into market-rate units.

Williams said that for every Steve Croman, "there are a handful more just like him, who are targeting New Yorkers who are struggling to make ends meet.

"I applaud Attorney General Eric Schneiderman and his office for making cases like

# Trinidad, Jamaica now in trade war over immigration

The simmering years-old row between Trinidad and Jamaica over the way Jamaicans are treated while visiting Trinidad is shifting from a row over free movement of Caribbean nationals into an all out trade war as Jamaica moves to retaliate against a neighbor it says is sometimes too arrogant and insensitive.

Jamaican authorities complain that about 50 Jamaican nationals have been summarily refused entry into Trinidad in recent months on suspicion that they were intended drug traffickers, prostitutes or were arriving to sweep local men off their feet and later obtain citizenship in the oil and gas-rich nation.

Tired of pleading with Trinidadian immigration officials to be more open minded and live with the fact that there is something called the free movement of people within the 15-nation single trading group, some sections of Jamaican society including the private sector think that the time has come to retaliate and hit the Trinidadians where it will hurt the most.

So radio Disc jockeys, some influential private sector players and local politicians have begun a spirited campaign to fight back at Trinidad by persuading Jamaicans to not only not buy Trinidadian products but to also remove them from supermarket shelves.

This situation has been playing out to growing levels of success as both Jamaican and Trinidadian media have published photos of supermarket shelves bereft of normally popular Trinidadian products such as milk and soda beverages.

Trinidadian Trade and Industry Minister Paula Gopee-Scoon in addressing the issue said, "I am aware of one large business entity where the product has been taken off the shelf in Jamaica. You are not going to see the figures because this has

# **Presidents** College to benefit from **GAC** fundraiser

Presidents' College of Guyana will benefit from funds raised at the (GAC) Guyana Action Committee's 50th Independence Gala at Georgetown Pegasus Hotel, on May 21, according to Operations Director Bonita Montague.

Scholarship grants, and donation of books and supplies will then be handed over to students of the 31-year-old college during a May 24 education initiative, and ceremony at the school's Golden Grove campus.

Students who wrote the National Grade Six Assessment and the lower sixth form in the academic performance of the Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate, attend the school, that suffered neglect, said Montague, whose organization wants to return Guyana to its glory day of academic excellence.

Montague says the prestigious school, founded by late president Forbes Burnham in 1985, was abandoned, and as such, GAC is seeking support to return not only Presidents College to its once high academic standing, but is prepared to uplift Guyana's literacy rate by teaching many Guyanese to read and write.

As part of its outreach, the nonprofit is also lobbying the United Nations to discuss domestic violence in Guyana where the surge has reach epidemic proportions.

To this end, GAC will invite overseas organizations to conduct programs to educate citizens. Its long-term goal is to build a transitional center to house battered woman.

These programs are planned for Guyana's Independence. In addition, GAC will host a fundraising booth at the May 12 to 15 GuyExpo 2016, at the Sophia Center, where memorabilia would be sold to benefit various causes.

# Four receive Medgar Evers College **International Educational Awards**

The office of International Education at Brooklyn's Medgar Evers College (MEC), City University of New York (CUNY) last Thursday held its inaugural International Education Awards Ceremony amid much fanfare, honoring four outstanding individuals.

The honorees were a faculty member, a student, an alumna (posthumously) and a corporate sponsor.

Dr. Maria-Luisa Ruiz, chair of the college's Foreign Language Department, received the International Education Faculty Award; Dominicanborn Certified Public Accountant Jean Joseph received the International Education Corporate Sponsor Award; Business Major Sharmony Gibson received the International Education Student Award; and Dominican Agnes Madalene Abraham, a Medgar Evers College alumna, was honored posthumously with the International Education Alumni

The ceremony, which was held in the college's Founders Auditorium, preceded the keynote address by Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley. The proceedings were chaired by former Grenada United Nations Ambassador, Eugene Pursoo, MEC's director of International Education.

"It is truly an honor for our college to host this inaugural International Award Ceremony," said the college's President Dr. Rudolph F. Crew, a former chancellor of New York City's public schools, who, in August, will mark three years in leading the predominantly Black institution in Central Brooklyn.

"Clearly, it is with your assistance and the amazing work of this evening's

honorees and our distinguished guests for the past 25 years. that we take another significant step in realizing our quest to transform MEC students into global citizens," he

CUNY Board Trustee, Jamaican-born Dr. Una S.T. Clarke, a former New York City Councilwoman and the first ever Caribbean-born woman to be elected to the City Council, said she was one of the founders of the college in the Crown Heights section of Brooklyn.

She also said that she had "walked the streets of New York" in ensuring that the college, named after a slain civil rights leader, became historic.

Rowley - Trinidad and Tobago's 7th prime minister, who was introduced by Dr. Sheilah Paul, MEC's Associate Dean of the School of Liberal Arts and Education – said the "community spiritedness and generosity have come at a critical milestone and must be rewarded.

"I can see the Medgar Evers energy thinking back to the origins of the college," he said. "Congratulations to the honorees!"

Dr. Ruiz, who has been leading MEC students on study abroad trip to Paris since 2008, said it was "great to be appreciated.

'It's a great honor," she said, dedicating the award to her students and her mother, who sent her to Germany to study German.

"What I'm doing with them is putting them on the road," added Ruiz about her students.

Joseph – founder and chief executive officer of Joseph Tax and Consulting Services, LLC, considered one of the leading tax services in Central Brooklyn - said she has been "a friend" of MEC

She said she has taught accounting pro bono at the college, offered internship to MEC accounting students, and made financial donations to various causes at the college.

"It has been an extraordinary journey for me," said Joseph after receiving her award. "Medgar Evers College gives me a source of encouragement.

"Medgar Evers College has stood the test of time as a beacon of hope," she added. "I plan to support the international program at Medgar Evers College."

Gibson, who has successfully completed study abroad programs in Japan and Italy, thanks to the signing of a \$1,600 promissory note by Pursoo, the amount of which was repaid, complimented the former diplomat for helping to realize her dreams.

"Hopefully, this year, I'll be able to go to Africa," she said after breaking down

Dr. Rowley also urged her to consider travelling to Trinidad and Tobago.

There were lots of teary eyes, as well, as Alejandra George, a MEC Alumna, read a brief biography of Abraham, a "very highly regarded" ex-MEC student leader, who, on Dec. 22, 2015, "suffered an accident in her bathroom and died," as she was preparing for work.

Abraham's only sister, Astazie Abraham, cried aloud when called to accept the award on behalf of her late sister and had to be consoled by Dr. Drew and other officials on the stage.

"Thank you for this in my sister's name," said Astazie's tersely afterwards.

#### **Antigua**

Antigua and Barbuda Minister of Trade Chet Greene said his country will continue to speak out against the false allegations against the region as "high risk" for financial services and the label of "tax havens."

Speaking at a recent trade ministers meeting in Guyana Greene said that, without correspondent banks, the region's capacity to trade would be so constrained as to make any legal trade virtually impossible.

He said, "if the present trend continues in which our banks lose correspondent relations in the United States, which is our biggest trading partner, we will witness an upsurge in illegality."

Greene called on his colleagues to immediately declare at the end of the meeting, among other things that the CARICOM region is a non-secrecy area for financial services.

He noted that CARICOM countries are compliant with international stand-

ards set by the Financial Action Task Force (FATA) and the Organization for Economic Co-operation and



Development (OECD) Global Forum and CARICOM countries have tax information exchange agreements with every major nation and are implementing the US Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FACTA).

#### **Barbados**

The U.S. Coast Guard recently held its fourth annual multilateral maritime interdiction and prosecutions summit in Barbados.


The summit, which gathered representatives from law enforcement agencies

throughout the region. the Dominican Republic and France, focused on building partnerships to deter and



disrupt transnational organized crime organizations and to prosecute the leaders of such organizations.

The original focus of the summit had been drug interdiction, but was expanded to encompass migrant and weapons smuggling.

US ambassador to Barbados, the Eastern Caribbean and the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS), Linda Taglialatela said the US embassy is always pleased to cooperate with "our partner nations on issues of mutual concern, including citizen security, drug interdiction and law enforcement training."

#### Guyana

The British government is giving Guyana a US\$77 million grant to improve airstrips and drill new wells in the South American nation's vast jungle interior.

This was revealed by Finance Minister Winston Jordan who said that the funding is part of a US\$432 million initiative from the United Kingdom Car-

ibbean Infrastructure Fund to pay for nations that experienced a noteworthy development projects in former British colonies in the region.

The initiative was unveiled by British Prime Minister David

Cameron last year. Jordan said the grant will help repair several airstrips that are the only



way to get to some Amerindian communities on the coat.

He said the funds will increase access by those communities to potable water and will be used to build new roads, bridges and ferry piers.

#### **Jamaica**

One of the world's largest travel companies, Expedia group, has reported that travel demand to Jamaica on all its sites grew about 20 percent compared to 2014.

been happening just over two weeks. I have been in touch with persons whose goods have not been imported and persons to whom sentiments have been expressed that at this time we are not buying from you."

She has also said that local authorities are quite disappointed that the situation is beginning to resemble a war over products rather than an immigration issue but even as she spoke, there was a hint of Trinidadian arrogance as the minister just could not help boasting that Jamaicans have to buy Trinidadian products.

"The spectrum of goods produced by T&T is very wide and there are things that Jamaica needs and will obviously buy from us because we have the competitive advantage of buying within CARICOM," she said.

Fatigued by the prolonged war which dates back to more than a decade when Trinidad did everything in its power to prevent Jamaica's world renowned Beef Patties from Trinidadian supermarket shelves, former Jamaican Foreign Minister Anthony Hylton says the time has come for the Trinidad-based Caribbean Court of Justice to adjudicate on the matter as this is a key reason why the court was established.

"We are still using the megaphone to shout to each other across the Caribbean. I believe that that matter should appropriately be brought before the CCJ at an appropriate time," Hylton told a Rotary Club forum this week. His remarks were carried quite prominently by the Jamaica Observer.

In the past week, there appeared a glimmer of hope on the horizon as Port of Spain made it clear it was moving to address fears by Jamaica and other countries about unfair treatment by immigration offices and prejudice in how they handle arrivals from particular countries including Guyana.

these a priority," he said. "I am proud to be part of a legislative body that works every day to protect tenants' rights, as evidenced by the series of bills passed during this session to do just that."

In announcing the indictment on Monday, Schneiderman said Croman, a major New York City landlord with more than 140 apartment buildings across Manhattan, surrendered on multiple felony charges for his role in an alleged scheme to fraudulently obtain several multi-million dollar refinancing loans between 2012 and 2014.

Croman was also named, along with private investigator Falconite, in a civil suit filed on Monday by the Attorney General's office for allegedly engaging in illegal, fraudulent, and deceptive conduct in connection with Croman's realestate business.

The lawsuit alleges that Croman directs an illegal operation that wields harassment, coercion and fraud to force rent-regulated tenants out of their apartments and convert their apartments into highly profitable market-rate units.

The lawsuit further alleges that Croman deployed Falconite to frighten and intimidate rent-regulated tenants into surrendering their apartments.

"My message to unscrupulous landlords is simple: if you put your own profits over your tenants' legal protections, we will investigate you and prosecute you to the fullest extent of the law," Schneiderman said. "My office will not tolerate anyone who attempts to line their own pockets by gaming the system. No one is above the law—no matter how rich or powerful."

Based on an extensive investigation by the Attorney General's office, Croman allegedly submitted false mortgage documents to New York Community Bank and Capital One Bank, including rent rolls that falsely reflected market rate rents for units that were actually occupied by rent-stabilized tenants.

Croman also allegedly inflated the amount of rent charged for certain commercial spaces in his buildings in an effort to show greater rental income. Croman allegedly falsified these rent rolls in order to inflate the annual rental income of his buildings, upon which his refinancing terms are partially based.

All told, over a three-year period, Schneiderman said Croman allegedly received more than \$45 million in loans under these false pretenses.

A grand jury indicted Croman on 20 felony counts, including seven counts of grand larceny in the 1st degree, seven counts of falsifying business records in the 1st degree, one count of scheme to defraud in the 1st degree, four counts of offering a false instrument for filing in the 1st degree, and one count of criminal tax fraud in the 4th degree.



# Trinidad PM says gov't making steady progress

Despite several challenges facing the twin-island republic, Trinidad and Tobago's Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley says his new People's National Movement (PNM) administration is "making steady progress" in addressing them.

In delivering the keynote address Thursday night, at the inaugural International Education Awards Ceremony at Brooklyn's predominantly Black Medgar Evers College, City University of New York (CUNY), Rowley said his eight-month-old administration has, "step by step," been "putting modalities in place after five years of recklessness and irresponsible governance.

"The special entities we've set up to improve lives are taking roots," said Dr. Rowley in a 40-minute address at the end of the award ceremony that featured four presentations to faculty, students and a corporate sponsor.

"We're tackling waste and corruption; we've established a smaller Cabinet — the size of government has been reduced from 54 to 24," added Rowley in listing several initiatives underway or on stream.

These, he said, include, a "thorough review of the health sector;" the tabling of "whistle blower" legislation to tackle corruption; the creation of jobs, particularly for young people; and the address of the spiraling crime wave.

"We're facing a crime wave," declared Dr. Rowley, stating that his administration has "changed legislation to have a Commissioner of Police, but the opposi-

tion has taken us to court.

"We'll go to court," he added, as the standing-room-only audience of students, faculty, staff, officials and members of the Caribbean community in the New York metropolitan area applauded.

The Trinidad and Tobago prime minister bemoaned the Parliamentary opposition's rejection of an eavesdropping measure that he said would help deter crime.

"Given the crime wave we're facing, we're gone to Parliament, and, for some un-bemoaned reason, the opposition is opposed to it," he said, hoping, however, that independent senators will support the bill.

# Trinidad gov't seeks to freeze terrorists assets

The Trinidad and Tobago government wants to ask the court to have several people designated as terrorists so as to freeze their assets.

This was revealed by Attorney General Faris-al-Rawi who told Parliament, "the country deserves action and enforcement and that is what we intend to deliver."

The AG said he could not give a precise number of the nationals who are currently fighting with ISIL (Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant) in the Middle East.

"We are approaching the issues of foreign terrorist fighters... by separate stand-alone legislation as well, which would be coming to the Parliament shortly," he said.

Al-Rawi said the matter of foreign terrorist fighters was being addressed by all the security apparatuses in Trinidad and Tobago and with the country's international partners.

He said it was important to deal with the terrorist threat and apply the laws of the country, and to work with Trinada's international partners to eradicate terrorism and the financing of terrorism.

The attorney general had explained earlier that Section 22B of the Anti-Terrorism Act can be invoked to deal with people who have been proven to be linked to ISIL and are wishing to return to the country.

The act allows the attorney general to apply to a judge for an order to designate an individual a terrorist and freeze assets where there are reasonable grounds to believe the entity or individual is knowingly acting on behalf of, at the direction of, or in association with an entity designated as a terrorist entity by the United Nations Security Council, such as ISIL.

# Reforming our end-oflife healthcare system

During a CNN presidential town hall on Feb. 3, an 81-year-old man from Concord, NH, with phase IV colon cancer, Jim Kinhan, asked Hillary Clinton what she could do to "help advance the respectful conversation that is needed around this personal choice that people may make, as we age and deal with health issues or be the caregivers of those people, to help enhance and — their end of life with dignity."

Jim Kinhan is not alone.

Our society is in the midst of a profound shift in attitudes toward end-of-life healthcare. We are increasingly aware that too many suffer needlessly in their dying. Too many endure tests and treatments that increase suffering but do nothing to extend life. Too many carry memories of the pain, confusion and agony of a dying loved one.

Every day, 10,000 people turn 65. The proportion of the population reaching age 85 is 48 times larger than a century ago. Increased life expectancy brings challenges of advanced illnesses among the aged.

Our medical system focuses almost exclusively on extending life at any cost, often at the expense of its quality. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services reinforces this focus by reimbursing doctors generously for complicated tests, ICU stays and medical device implantations, but not for conversations and comfort care.

People who do not communicate their values and priorities as illnesses advance often pay dearly for this failure. Lacking clear guidance on how an individual weighs the quality of life against its absolute duration, physicians often assume the latter, so they propose agonizing tests and treatments that steal life's joys as they prolong the dying process.

Most Americans want to die at home, peacefully and with loved ones close by. But nearly 40 percent die in a hospital, and almost 60 percent of these hospitalizations include an ICU admission.

As noted in the Jan. 19 issue of the Journal of American Medical Association, devoted entirely to end-of-life care:

"ICU care in the United States at the end of life appears unwanted, expensive, and futile.

In other words, our healthcare system is failing to deliver what people need as they approach an inevitable and imminent death.

Polls shows people across the country increasingly expect candid information, more options and more personalized care at the end of life.

Empowered patients ask more and better questions. They weigh treatment decisions carefully and they understand how an ICU admission, with its cascade of tests and treatments, impacts the end-of-life experience.

People need greater access to information and options as Continued on Page 12

# Growth of lateral economies in the Caribbean

The message to the Caribbean people is to make our own government. And so, our own economies. There are enough riches on the ground, in the communities, to do so.

The communities of the Caribbean are paved with gold. Local roads, local, local commons, local corporations, local parlours, local churches, local schools, local police station, local farms, local health centers, pickups, vans, motor cars and more recently, the Internet, connecting the local with the global, the planet. Built by the people, ever since they shattered the ashen urn of Empire, plantation, which held them, and walked

One week ago, I went to a pigeon peas festival in Covigne Road, Diego Martin. At the Y of the road, the street was lined on one side with tents. Each tent carried a product, each made from pigeon peas. Pigeon peas wine, pigeon peas dip/relish, pigeon peas liqueur, pigeon peas pastelles, pigeon peas and rice, pigeon peas lasagne, pigeon peas soup, pigeon peas bread, pigeon peas sweetbread, pigeon peas punch, pigeon peas pizza, pigeon peas ponche crème, pigeon peas roti, and curried pigeon peas and eddoes which my mother carried.

All this was the product of the local: the local leaders, local expertise (the local farmer, Mr. Francois), local police, local corporation, local entrepreneurs/vendors/traders (mostly women), local church, local transport, local road, local school, local com-

mons, that is the steep hills above Covigne Road, where he pigeon peas crop was reaped. Local production.

Nobody owns the hills above Covigne hills. It is shared property: commons. The goal is to grow the entire hills of Upper Covigne Road, way up to the mountain peak, with pigeon peas. A large tract of pigeon peas flourishing uphill. I was told that Covigne produces a special brand of pigeon peas. Large, full, bright, like pearls. The soil here, the sun, the uphill relief is just right for this species of peas. And this peas have grown here historically. And that the only chemical additive was pesticides, to keep fungus in the soil from spoiling the pod, the

This is not the only pigeon peas economy I know. In Claxton Bay, where I grew up, there is a thriving pigeon peas economy. Seven bags were sold in twenty minutes at the stall next to the fishing port that morning, mopped up like hot hops. Pigeon peas gone ballistic! On the hills above Pranz Gardens, where citizens revolted and brought an end to the Essar Steel Complex, a 100 percent for-

eign deal, in the locality, pigeon peas abound. The soil is good for another species of pigeon peas. Weather, soil type: pigeon peas could grow on dry ground. In each yard, families plant a pigeon peas or two.

These are the economies of the future. Local expertise, local communities, local expertise, the local leaders, traders, vendors, producing and trading goods, developed from local commons, shared property. Hundreds of such economies. All along the West and East coast, the hills, the plains of Caroni and Naparima. Local products, traded locally, using local expertise. And through the Caribbean. Hardly a cent in U.S., Forex, fiat currency involved.

Within the next 20 years, our central government's capacity will wither away: exorbitant public debt; ungovernable public sector wage bills; "development" error; global recession, leading to fiscal shortfalls; and extreme climate events. When the metaphorical tsunami hits, it is not the prime minister, the Cabinet and Parliament who will to save us; it is the local: land, leadership, corporation. Ordinary citizens, whilst giving to Caesar with is Caesar's, now have no choice but to make our own governments

It is local police who will have to protect us: burn down the marijuana to plant pigeon peas. Local churches and temples, mosques: build spaces of sanctuary to serve food, a meal a day, books, clothes. Local corporations: with their fund of tractors, backhoes, store-

It means that David Duke of KKK fame, who was a Trump endorser, could just as well have been a candidate himself. As could, presumably, any big cheese in the American Nazi Party. If a so-called national party has no mechanism currently for denying entry to undesirables on that order, maybe the Trump experience of 2016 gets them back to the drawing board to set down a marker against conduct that's unarguably beyond the pale...if they have any real desire to avert more Trump-like scenarios.

But for now the GOP game plan for re-taking the presidency revolves around Trump.

the end of life approaches. And they want our national and state policy makers to address this need.

- Establish consistent federal payment for palliative care consultations to ensure that treatment decisions align with patients' goals, priorities and values.



# CARICOM's case on correspondent banking

Prime Minister of St. Kitts and Nevis, Dr. Timothy Harris championed CARICOM's case on correspondent banking during an important consultation in Washington, D.C., with State and Treasury officials at the U.S. Department of State on Tuesday, May 3.

The prime minister led a delegation comprised of representatives from the Bahamas, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, Suriname, and Trinidad and Tobago. Justin Hawley, counselor at the St. Kitts and Nevis Embassy to the United States of America, accompanied the prime minister.

Harris outlined the challenges confronted by Caribbean countries as a result of de-risking. De-risking is the practice whereby several major banks have either terminated their correspondent banking relationships with banks in the Caribbean or threatened to discontinue them. According to the International Monetary Fund, as of June 2015, at least 10 banks in the region in five countries have lost all or some

of their correspondent banking relationships.

Hawley gave a report of the consultation which took place at the U.S. State Department. "The honourable prime minister expressed his concern that the stringent regulatory requirements that have been placed on national banks have begun to adversely affect the financial sector, leading to a negative perception of Caribbean banking on a whole. He reassured the U.S. representa-

tives that St. Kitts and Nevis along with member states of CARICOM have established and implemented mechanisms to tackle the scourge of money laundering. Prime Minister Harris was applauded for his in-depth and thorough analysis of the plight of the commercial banking sector throughout CARICOM and the negative impact that these onerous regulations have placed on its respective economies," Hawley said.

Representing the U.S. during Tuesday's consultation were Daniel L. Glaser, assistant secretary for Terrorist Financing in the Office of Terrorism and Financial Intelligence at the U.S. Department of the Treasury, and Juan Sebastian Gonzalez, deputy assistant secretary of state for Western Hemisphere Affairs, with responsibility for U.S. diplomatic engagement and policy implementation in Central America and the Caribbean.

Gonzalez was previously at the White House, most recently as special advisor to the U.S. Vice President from 2013 to 2015.

The consultation began at 3 pm on Tuesday; three hours prior to a reception that was also held at the State Department in honour of the delegations attending the U.S.-Caribbean-Central American Energy Summit. U.S. Vice President, Joseph R. Biden, Jr., hosted the Energy Summit on Tuesday, May 3 and Wednesday, May 4.

The Energy Summit forms part of the Caribbean Energy Security Initiative, which is coordinated by the U.S. Department of State and provides technical assistance for improved governance in the Caribbean energy sector. The Initiative was launched on June 19th, 2014.

On April 9, 2015, at the U.S.-CARICOM Summit in Jamaica, President Barack Obama announced the formation of an Energy Security Task Force aimed at evaluating the progress of the United States' energy cooperation with the Caribbean and Central America.

the destination's premier event and the single most important business generator for Jamaica's tourism industry from April 29–May 1, 2016, at the Montego Bay Convention center.

#### **Turks and Caicos Island**

The Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA) says HIV / AIDS and the mosquito-borne virus will be addressed at its health research conference to be held in the Turks and Caicos Islands (TCI) later this year.

CARPHA said the 61st CARPHA Health Research Conference, which will take place from June 23 to 25 will also address child health and healthy ageing among other issues.

TCI Premier Dr. Rufus Ewing said his Overseas British Territory "will gain tremendous exposure from this

conference. It is an opportunity for local health professionals, to share their experiences and challenges,



to be educated and informed and for delegates to enjoy activities in the Turks and Caicos Islands." CARPHA Executive Director Dr.

CARPHA Executive Director Dr. James Hospedales, said the conference is the longest running health event in the Caribbean and Latin America and attracts leading health professionals from across the globe.

#### St. Kitts

Attorney General Vincent Byron Jr, who is responsible for electoral matters in St. Kitts and Nevis, will soon be taking to Parliament proposals to reform the electoral process.

Speaking at the prime minister's press conference recently, the attorney general said that the question of electoral reform involves several factors including if the current voters' list is properly constituted, the need for proper enumeration process to register people where they live, whether citizens

living overseas would have to be resident to be able to be active participants in the voting process, and the



issue of the realignment of the constituency boundaries.

Byron said there needs to be a legislative framework for these reforms to happen and to initiate the process.

He indicated that the question of electoral reform is a constitutional issue "involving all aspects of society and it would be open to the citizenry to be involved in the process."

The minister responsible for elections highlighted that there are many problems with respect to the electoral process that where inherited from the ousted Douglas administration and that to be addressed by the present government, but that the electoral process at the moment has been restored under the current Elections Act.

#### St. Lucia

Former St. Lucia National Security Minister Guy Mayers is suing Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony over statements he made regarding the 2010/11 "Operation Restore Confidence" by the St. Lucia police.

Mayers, who is also the chairman of the main opposition United Workers Party (UWP), is alleging that Prime Minister Anthony made the allegations during an address to the convention of his ruling St .Lucia Labor Party (SLP) earlier this year.

He said Anthony also repeated the statements at SLP meetings after-

wards. Mayers said he demanding a public apology from Anthony as well as a court order preventing him



from making the allegations. He is also seeking compensation.

In August 2013, Anthony said the ORC was among reasons the United States decided to suspend all assistance to the local police.

Anthony had also sought assistance from the CARICOM Implementation Agency for Crime and Security (IMPACS) to probe the so-called "extra-judicial" killings by members of the police force.

#### **Trinidad**

Trinidad and Tobago Opposition Leader Kamla Persad-Bissessar said the Strategic Services Agency (SSA) Bill which is being debated in Parliament will result in an onslaught on the constitutional rights of not only citizens but visitors to T&T as well.

The former prime minister told a news conference that the legislation,

which was presented by Attorney General Faris-al-Rawi seeks to give the SSA more powers and will allow



phone tapping without a warrant.

She said while the opposition understood the need to support crime-fighting legislation, the measures must have the required checks and balances.

Persad-Bissessar said the bill would breach the privacy rights of "every citizen and even non-citizens who may be visiting Trinidad and Tobago."

Persad-Bisessar said her concerns must not be seen as being against crime-fighting measures but rather one for ensuring that safeguards were put in place to protect citizens.

# Fort Greene Jamaican eatery tastes like success!

He's Jamaican it!

A Jamaica-born Brooklyn chef who was once told he might never walk again is not only cruising around the kitchen again, he just achieved his dream of opening his own eatery, unlocking the doors to an island grill in Fort Greene last week.

"I knew from the first day I started in the culinary field I always wanted to open my own restaurant," said Canarsie resident Lancelot Brown, who is now the proud owner of Jamaica Grill on Myrtle Avenue between Hall Street and Washington Avenue. "It's one of the dreams I wanted to accomplish and accomplishing it is a momentous achievement for me."

Brown — who moved to a public housing complex in Canarsie from Jamaica 19 years ago — has two culinary degrees, and has worked in eateries across the island and the Big Apple.

But Brown's goal of commanding his own kitchen was nearly sliced and diced when he broke his back in a 2004 accident, and doctors told him he might never be able to stand in front of a stove again.

Brown refused to take the prognosis lying down, however, and after years of physical therapy, he was back on his feet and aiming to make it big.

"I wanted to do something more, because I knew I could

do more," he said.

He enrolled in the inaugural class of New York City Housing Authority's Food Business Pathways program, where he learned how to run a business and got help securing the permits he needed to open

Jamaica Grill.

At his new eatery, Brown is serving up dishes from his home country that he said are rarely done well in the concrete jungle.

"It's one of those cuisines that you either have to go

to Jamaica to have it or find somewhere that prepares it really well," he said.

Brown said diners go wild for his vegetarian pasta, made with jerk-spiced butter and tofu — a recipe he created himself — as well as more tra-

ditional Caribbean fare such as jerk chicken and curried goat.

Jamaica Prime Minister Andrew Holness said the government will be sparing no effort in the fight against


The prime minister said the government remains resolute that the issue of crime must be addressed and will be dealt with using two parallel strate-

# Certified coders see their demand rise

Nine years ago, Peter Esswein, a resident of Sandy Springs, Ga., enrolled in a health information technology degree program at DeVry University to capitalize on the growing prominence of electronic medical records.

"I always wanted to work in the medical industry, and the time was right for a personal career change," Esswein said. "Completing my associate degree in health information technology gave me the confidence and skills I needed to progress on my new career path."

Now, as Esswein continues his career as a coding quality assistant, health care is changing again. Following the release of a medical coding system overhaul in October 2015, expected updates in the near future are underscoring the demand for coders.

International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems, 10th Revision, or ICD-10, increased the number of medical codes by more than 50,000 — and in fiscal year 2017, about 5,500 more diagnostic and impatient procedure codes will roll out.

"The new codes are designed to enable more informative, accurate recording of the medical information required to bill correctly for reimbursement," Esswein said. "In my role, it's essential that I not only understand ICD-10, but that I'm staying ahead of what is coming next to help alleviate any confusion in my workplace and mitigate mistakes in advance."

# Prepping for industry change

Many health care organizations say transitioning to the new system was their biggest challenge last year.

While Esswein graduated years ago

and is getting on-the-job training with the new system, many employers struggled to find qualified new technicians, since recent graduates had studied the previous classification system, ICD-9.

To get these new grads up to speed, DeVry University offered an ICD-10 course at no cost for medical billing and coding graduates who had registered by November 2015 and students in their last semester of the program. All future courses will be taught using ICD-10 as the standard.

"DeVry University programs will continue to evolve as healthcare advances and becomes more accessible in the United States," Kristyn Murphy-Rodvill, assistant national dean in the College of Health Sciences at DeVry University, said. "We know finishing a degree program during an industry transition can create obstacles for recent graduates. Our ICD-10 course is designed to eliminate those barriers and prepare students with the skills and knowledge they need to be competitive in their field."

## Propelling the future of health care

Knowledgeable health information technology experts — from coders to technicians and managers — are projected to remain in high demand through 2022. Medical billing is projected to grow by 22 percent in this time period.

"With the right education, the future is bright for healthcare professionals," Murphy-Rodvill said. "DeVry's programs are designed to help students grow their professional expertise, and remain at the forefront in their industry."

Get three sports fans togeth-





# Britain lauds Grant, a trailblazing Guyanese

Imagine in 2016, a television personality delivering coverage of the political primary campaigns and other news singing to calypso music?

Unimaginable on CBS, NBC, ABC, CNN, FOX or MSNBC or any national medium in the United States, however, Guyanaborn Cy Grant dared to try and successfully executed this feat on the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC-TV) almost six dec-

He regularly made appearances on the BBC and by 1957 made daily appearances on the "Tonight" current affairs show in the UK.

His unusual brand of delivering information was not only unique for any reporter but that he was also the very first Black man to appear on Europe's highly reputed network proved groundbreaking.

He introduced levity to current affairs using calypso renditions to accompany news.

Grant's "ability to compose tunes spontaneously and fit the news into verse was highly commended and won him the admiration of viewers nationwide," a reporter accounted.



## **Inside Life**

Grant, actor, singer and writer, born on Nov. 8, 1919 in Demerara, Guyana, died Feb. 13, 2010 at age 90 after living in Highgate, London, England.

His extensive career spanned acting, song writing, Civil Rights and a stint in the Royal Air Force.

illustrious career That was recently celebrated by a project at London Metropolitan Archives (LMA) in England.

Geoff Pick, director of London Metropolitan Archives said the LMA was "delighted that we have been entrusted with the Cy Grant Archive and have become a key partner in preserving and making accessible this outstanding collection that traces the life and work of a very special Londoner and hero of the Black Caribbean community."


Documents, manuscripts, photographs and films dating from the 1940s to 2010 will now chart Grant's enviable and admirable life and form part of the Cy Grant Archives.

They will be catalogued and made public for the first time, following an award of a \$115,711 grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to the Cy Grant Trust.

Archived and presented to inspire young people and raise awareness of his achievements Grant's storied contribution to British history has been well documented.

His mother was a talented pianist and he grew up surrounded by music, playing the guitar and singing folk songs. He had two brothers and four sisters and excelled at school.

His interest in law emerged at an early age with a burning desire to study the legal profession. But at that time his

parents could not afford the expensive schools.

After working as a civil servant, he migrated to Britain and on arrival in 1941 joined the Royal Air Force. He was one of approximately 400 men recruited from the Caribbean — the first cadre of soldiers from the

region — after the huge losses in the Battle of Britain.

During military service he trained as a navigator and in 1943 during the Second World War was shot down in the Battle of the Ruhr, landing in Hol-


According to an obituary published in the Guardian newspaper in London, Joost Klootwijk, the young son of a Dutch farmer, looked on as his parents tried to help the airman. The boy was moved by the novelty of a uniformed Black RAF officer crash-landing near his home.

The Gestapo identified Grant as "a member of the Royal Air Force of indeterminate race" and he was held as a prisoner of war for two years.

Grant later used that phrase for the title of his book about his war service.

The wartime encounter must have made an indelible impression on the farmer's son because as an adult he research history on the RAF enabling his son, Hans, to write a book about Grant's crew, "Lancaster W4827: Failed to Return."

Nat (Jonathan Pryce) is the owner of Dayan and Son, a Kosher bakery located in London. The store's name is a bit of a misnomer since he's been the only Dayan working there ever since his father passed away.

Nat's disappointed that his own son, Stephen (Daniel Caltagirone), opted to become a lawyer rather than join the family business. Consequently, he had to settle for teaching the tricks of the trade to a neighborhood kid (Dominic Garfield), only to have that sole assistant eventually stolen away by Sam Cotton (Philip Davis), a conniving competitor planning

to open another bakery right having trouble staying afloat

To add insult to injury, Cotton is also wining and dining Nat's lonely landlord Joanna Silverman (Pauline Collins), not out of affection, but to buy the building for a song. If successful, he'll be able to kick Nat out once the lease expires. Worst of all, Dayan and Son is

due to a dwindling clientele that's dying off.

Nat's fortunes change soon after he hires Ayyash (Jerome Holder), a teenaged Muslim immigrant from Darfur, as his new apprentice. For, it isn't long before the store is attracting long lines of customers.

But what Nat doesn't know

is that Ayyash has been spiking the batter with marijuana. That's the reason for the sudden increase in satisfied shoppers. Of course, it's just a matter of time before the cat's out of the bag, and matters come to a head when the proprietor gets an explanation for his skyrocketing profits.

Thus unfolds "Dough," a ten-

der-hearted dramedy directed by John Goldschmidt (Maschenka). The cross-cultural adventure milks most of its humor and tension out of the friendship grudgingly forged between between unlikely-buddies Nat and Ayyash. The picture effectively contrasts the former's being old, Jewish, white, British and middle-class with the latter's being young, Muslim, black, African and living hand

By the closing tableau, all the loose ends are tied up quite satisfactorily, and we've also learned a very timely lesson in tolerance. 'Dough'-lightful!

# India, Windies in Test series

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has announced that India would play a four-match Test series in the Caribbean, starting in July this year—signaling renewed relations between the BCCI and the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB).

In a statement the BCCI said that the "outstanding issues" from the abandonment had been "resolved."

The West Indies had pulled out midway through a tour of India in October 2014 amid claim of payment disputes between players and the WICB.

### Clint Dempsey, Jordan Morris score one each

SEATTLE (AP) \_ Through the first eight games of the season, neither Clint Dempsey nor Jordan Morris had a goal in the same game for the Seattle Sounders.

On Saturday night, the World Cup veteran and the star rookie both

found the back of the net.

Dempsey rocketed in a shot from straight in front of the goal in the 26th minute, and Morris scored for the fourth straight contest, and the Sounders beat the San Jose Earthquakes 2-0.

Dempsey's goal, from just beyond

the top of the penalty spot, was his second of the season.

Morris scored from the top of the penalty area restraining arc in the 89th minute. That tied the MLS record for consecutive games with a goal for a rookie. Damani Ralph

did it for the Chicago Fire in 2003, and Patrick Mullins matched it for the New England Revolution in 2014.

"It's always nice to get a goal, but all that matters is the three points," said Morris, who picked up an assist on Dempsey's goal. "Clint had a great game and a really good finish. We're on a good streak, and we just have to keep it going."

Added coach Sigi Schmid, "Jordan did a good job with Clint in terms of dropping and going, so they were hard to pick up."

The Sounders (4-4-1) have points in five of their last six games (4-1-1).

"We created some more chances in the attacking third and still kept it tight in the back," Dempsey said. "Tonight, we probably could have scored more than what we did. But we're moving in the right direction, and hopefully, we can keep building."

Goalkeeper Stefan Frei earned his

second straight shutout. He got some help from the left goal post in the 84th minute when San Jose's Chris Wondolowski banged a penalty kick off of it.

The penalty kick was awarded when Victor Bernardez was taken down in the box by Sounders defender Tyrone Mears.

Earthquakes coach Dominic Kinnear said it was just one of those breaks that didn't go his team's way.

"He's got a lot of goals and a lot of penalties," he said. "If we get a penalty in the first minute (of the next game), I'd like for him to take it — and the next one, and the next one."

Saturday was the first time in 23 games that the Earthquakes (4-3-3) were kept scoreless.

Dempsey was the last of four Sounders to touch the ball leading up to his goal. Aaron Kovar initially kept it in play deep in the right corner, passing it back out to Morris. He tapped it on to Erik Friberg, who took it into the right side of the penalty area.

Friberg crossed the ball toward the top of the penalty spot, and Dempsey ran onto it for a 14-yard blast into the back left corner.

Besides the penalty kick, the Earthquakes missed two other opportunities to tie.

In the 36th minute, Frei slid out to the top of his 6-yard box and took the ball off Wondolowski's right foot. Then in the 56th, Simon Dawkins launched a 22-yard free kick over a seven-man Seattle wall. It bounced off the underside of the crossbar and down onto the goal line, where Frei was able to grab it

"You've always got to have a little bit of fortune," Schmid said. "I thought at times, our soccer was as good tonight as it has been this season. We were very dangerous when we were effective. Clint put in a really good effort tonight and deservedly got a goal. It was good to see Jordan get a goal, as well."

it had given "serious consideration" to bringing sanctions against the players.

"The board considered the behavior of some of the West Indies players in the immediate aftermath of the final, and unanimously agreed that certain comments and actions were inappropriate, disrespectful and brought the event into disrepute," the statement said.

"The board acknowledged an apology by the WICB but was disappointed to note that such behavior had detracted from the success of what was otherwise a magnificent tournament and final," the governing body said.

West Indies beat England by four wickets in a dramatic final in Kolkata to win their second Twenty20 World Cup, following their triumph four years ago in Sri Lanka.

Many of the regional players celebrated wildly afterward, with some removing their shirts as they danced in delight.

West Indies Captain Darren Sammy also stunned many cricket fans by openly criticizing the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) during the official post-game interview and highlighting the players' ongoing pay dispute, which had marred the build-up to the tournament.

Man-of-the Match Marlon Samuels was also fined for his verbal outburst against bowler Ban Stokes during the final over of the game.

The ICC Chairman Shashank Manohar said the Windies players actions were not "acceptable conduct" for ICC events.

"The sport of cricket is proud of its unique spirit and this involved being gracious in victory as well as defeat and respectful at all times to the game, one's opponents, the sponsors and the fans," Manohar said.

## **Hundreds bid farewell to** Keith 'Slick' Bonadie-Clarke

#### By Nelson A. King

Hundreds of Vincentian and Caribbean nationals in Brooklyn last Sunday paid their last respects to Keith "Slick" Bonadie-Clarke, one of St. Vincent and the Grenadines' greater mid-fielders ever in soccer, who died on April 18 at Kingsbrook Jewish Medical Center in Brooklyn. He was 58.

Scores of ex-national soccer stars, erstwhile sporting heroes and officials were among mourners at the jampacked wake and funeral service at El Caribe Funeral Home, 1922 Utica Ave., near Avenue L in Brooklyn.

Dozens also converged on the entrance to, and in the lobby of, the large chapel.

Mourners paid tributes in song, scriptures and speeches, while pannist Trevor "Ras Jahbie" Hepburn beat out spiritual rhythms during the almost three-hour-long wake and periodically during the two-hourlong funeral service that followed.

Since no other musical instrument was used during the service, Hepburn provided the lone accompaniment to renditions in song and hymn.

Bonadie-Clarke, who represented the nation in soccer from 1974 until he migrated to New York in 1982, died from cardiac arrest after suffering a stroke in August last year, from which he never fully recovered, vious New Democratic Party his eldest brother, Lennox Ber-

thram "Bertie" Hadaway-Clarke told Caribbean Life.

Hadaway-Clarke also said his brother, who played soccer for the Brooklyn-based Vincentian team, Hairoun, was additionally afflicted with hypertension and diabetes.

"The thing about Keith today is that you, too, can meet him again," said Sarah Tannis, a former neighbor, who served as liturgist during the funeral service, while an overhead screen showed photos of Bonadie-Clarke's soccer-playing and frolicking days. "He has surrendered his life to God.'

Earl Horne, a former president of Hairoun Sports Club, described Bonadie-Clarke as a "genuine, humble and passionate human being," who was the "best" midfielder the nation had ever seen.

Horne — the nephew of former St. Vincent and the Grenadines Cultural Minister John Horne, under the preadministration — said he knew

Bonadie-Clarke even before he played for Youths United in the national soccer championship, adding that Bonadie-Clarke's "first national cap" came during the 1974 Cable & Wireless Windward Islands Tourna-

"Yes, I know he had talent," said the ex-General Secretary of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Football [Soccer] Association in his tribute, stating that Bonadie-Clarke was a player anyone would want on one's soccer team.

"I know you will be playing soccer in Heaven and will be learning the game of basketball when you meet the talented

Pearl Washington and many more who have gone before you," added Horne, referring to Bonadie-Clarke. "Cuthbert Keith "Slick" Bonadie-Clarke, may your soul rest in peace. Gone but would never be forgotten."

In adding to his previous tribute, former national soccer captain Stanley "Luxie" Morris, under whose captaincy Bonadie-Clarke played in the national squad and for Hairoun, said Bonadie-Clarke was "a very exceptional player, who was destined to be so," reiterating that Bonadie-Clarke played with "poise, grace, and assertively; and was a mastermind.


