

## CARICOM UNDER REVIEW

### Jamaica to assess usefulness of regional organization

As far back as the late 1950s when regional leaders had formed the West Indies Federation, Jamaica was the first to abandon it, as its leaders looked more north to the United States than backward towards the Caribbean.

Now more than 50 years after a referendum on the island forced the then internal self government to leave the integration movement, Jamaica is once again moving to review its relations with fellow Caribbean Community neighbors mostly to the south.

Its latest reason for dissatisfaction with things CARICOM


or Caribbean, is premised on a simmering row with Trinidad over the treatment of Jamaican nationals arriving in the country and the way Trinidadian customs sometimes deal with Jamaican imports into the island despite duty free status for goods manufactured in the region.

In parliament late Tuesday, new Prime Minister Andrew Holness appointed his mentor and former prime minister Bruce Golding to head up a commission to review not only Jamaica's role in the 15-nation single trading group but to determine what exactly, if any,

## Haitians celebrate Flag Day

In the mid-nineteen nineties a group of Haitian students felt Haiti only got attention when something negative was happening. At that time, Ruddel Deceus and friends from CUNY and other universities organized the 18 Mai Committee named for the date the Haitian flag was created in 1803. The idea of the committee was cultural awareness and the group was dedicated to Haitian history.

The Haitian flag was adopted on May 18, the last day of the Congress of Arcahaie. The story goes that revolutionary leader Jean-Jacques Dessalines created the flag by taking a French tricolor and ripping out the white center, which he discarded, asking his god-daughter Catherine Flon to sew the remaining bands together.

Over time, the 18 Mai Committee grew, held many commemorative and other events including celebrating Haitian Flag Day at New York City Hall.

Deceus was clearly at the forefront of awareness. Subsequently this young history activist got married and started a family and while he's busy with different things, others carry on the historical torch.

This year, from the United Nations and throughout the region, there were many and varied events celebrating Haitian Flag Day.

Ambassador Daniel St. Lot with the National Alliance for the Advancement of Haitian Professionals (NAAHP) held at the United Nations the Catherine Flon Symposium: Cultivating Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Economic Empowerment to boost women entrepreneurship in Haiti and the diaspora. The first panel entitled: "Bridging the Gap — How to Fill the Missing Middle" focused on empowering Haitian women in Haiti or abroad through the promotion of social entrepreneurship, leadership, social skills and professional development.

#### THE NEWS FROM BACK HOME

#### **Antigua**

The Professional Organization for Women in Antigua & Barbuda (POWA) and Women Against Rape (WAR) are in support of a recommendation that abortion should be an option for women who are pregnant and may be infected with the Zika virus.

Public relations officer for POWA, Gisele Isaac said a woman's health and her mental and emotional well-being should he paramount.

"Abortion is a decision for the parents of the baby and the last word really should be from the woman, because

she is the one who will be carrying and the one who will be the primary caregiver. So we have to look at her



quality of life and the baby's quality of life," Isaac said.

Head of WAR, Alexandrina Wong left the right to abort squarely in the hands of the woman.

She based her argument on the premise that the twin-island state lacks the infrastructure necessary to adequately support a baby born with a birth defect or provide assistance for the affected family.

Chief Executive Officer of the Caribbean Family Planning Affiliation, Alder Bynoe suggested that women should have access to a range of options in response to Zika and abortion should be one such option.

Bynoe said simply asking women to delay pregnancy was not enough.

#### **Barbados**

Barbados Prime Minister Freundel Stuart has described as "unfair and

unwarranted" the decision last year by the European Commission to blacklist several Caribbean



countries, including his country, as uncooperative tax jurisdiction.

Addressing a ceremony marking Europe Day 2016 and the 40th anniversary of the European Delegation's presence in Barbados, Stuart said he was surprised at the blacklisting.

Jamaica gets from being a member of the community.

"We must assert ourselves in such a way that Jamaica gets the full benefits that membership in CARICOM promises," he told the house. "Our foreign policy must support our economic and development policy," he said.

Holness did not hide the fact that the latest government mindset on CARICOM has a bit to do with the latest row between Trinidad and Jamaica, among the bloc's two most influential members, over hassle free travel in the region.

The two exchanged harsh diplomatic barbs in recent weeks after Trinidadian customs and immigration officials had turned away more than a dozen Jamaican at the main Piarco Airport.

The refusal to land the Jamaicans sparked a simmering diplomatic row with Jamaica formally writing Trinidad protesting the alleged persistently negative treatment of its citizens and demanding better treatment.

And in a surprising move, Port of Spain for once did acknowledge that its airport authorities might have been prejudiced and could have acted pre-

cipitately even commencing a special training program for Caribbean nationals arriving on the island in general and Jamaicans in particular.

Trinidadian immigration officials had muttered remarks about the Jamaicans that the group of mostly women visitors might have been intended drug mules or were planning to become involved in prostitution.

Many of them protested vigorously to their government who fired off protest letters to Trinidad and hastily arranged meetings to discuss a worrying recurring issue.

For his part, Holness told the house that a CARICOM Review Commission will be established to determine and assess the "value of CARICOM" to Jamaica

will also receive input on HR-40, the Reparations Study Bill, which Congressman John Conyers, (D) of Detroit, has introduced every year since 1989.

Conyers, who is the Ranking Member of the House Judiciary Committee and dean of the Congressional Black Caucus, will travel to Atlanta to consult with NAARC on the Reparations Program and plans to introduce a revised version of HR-40 that will focus on remedies for slavery and discriminatory practices and policies, IBW said.

It said the hearing will be convened in conjunction with the Morehouse School of Religion, Saturday, June 11, 12:00 noon at the Interdenominational Theological Center (ITC), 700 Martin Luther King Ave.

The proceedings will feature a keynote address by Sir Hilary Beckles, vice-chancellor / president of the University of the West Indies, Kingston, Jamaica, and chairman of the CARI-COM [Caribbean Community] Reparations Commission.

A Clergy / Faith Leaders Roundtable on engaging people of faith in the reparations movement; panel of scholars and activists posing inquiries about the Commission's 10-Point Program; and questions / comments / input from the public will be part of the proceedings, IBW said.

It said the Atlanta Hearing is the first NAARC.

in a series of area/regional events of its kind that will be convened by NAARC over the next 12 months.

Houston, Los Angeles and Chicago have been identified as potential sites for future hearings.

IBW said the input/recommendations from the hearings will be incorporated into a Final Reparations Program that will be used as the framework for negotiations with the federal government, state and local governments, private corporations and institutions.

The hearing at ITC will be preceded by a Benefit Reception, Friday, June 10, 7 pm at the National Center for Civil and Human Rights, 100 Ivan Allen Blvd., where the actor, humanitarian and activist Danny Glover will be the special guest.

IBW said the Atlanta Reception and Hearing come at a time when there is a resurgence of interest in the issue.

One of the most dramatic recent developments was the unanimous decision by the 15 nations of CARICOM demanding reparations from the former European colonialists for native genocide and African enslavement.

"When the heads of state of nations took such a courageous position, reparations activists in the U.S. and around the world took notice," said Dr. Ron Daniels, IBW president. IBW serves as the administrator and convener of NAARC.





## **Protest over hangings**

Two Jamaica Human Rights organizations are opposing plans by National Security Minister Robert Montague to resume hanging as a means to dealing with the escalating crime problem in the country.

In a joint statement, Stand Up for Jamaica (SUFJ) and Jamaicans for Justice (JFJ) said, "while we understand the minister's need to send a strong message about his handle on crime, we believe that he could have been more prudent in making his comments about the resumption of hangings."

Recently, Montague said the Andrew Holness government remains committed to mobilizing all the resources at its disposal to wage a "relentless war" against criminal elements "intent on destroying our nation."

He said as a result, the government is currently exploring the possible resumption of hangings and that the junior minister, Pearnel Charles Jr, has been asked to consult with several stakeholders, including the Ministry of Justice and Attorney General's Office to determine if there are any "legal impediments" to be addressed.

But the opposition spokesman on justice and governance, Mark Golding said the death penalty is not the answer to the country's crime situation.

SUFJ Director Carla Gullota in the statement said: "Montague's comments about a resumption of the death penalty has fed into the frustrations of many Jamaicans and has served to ignite passions about what is a very widely debated issue."

"If we are not careful, this frustra-

tion could lead to citizens taking matters into their own hands once they come to appreciate the well-established legal impediments which make the resumption of hanging highly unlikely in Jamaica," she added.

JFJ Chairman Horace Levy noted that the position of the group is that there should be a moratorium on carrying out the death penalty, given the state of the justice system.

The human rights groups said that there is an abundance of evidence which shows that capital punishment is not an effective deterrent to crime.

The two human rights groups said several countries and states in the United States, which continue to practice capital punishment still have very high rates of violent crimes and the international trend is that more and more countries are abolishing the death pen-

## **Concerns over rising murder** rate in the Caribbean

Homicides in Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago are expected to rise to alarming levels and the Eastern Caribbean islands could see an increase in murders currently resembling those reported in Jamaica.

That is the prediction of a report which looks at the Caribbean in 2050 based on its current development path.

The report; "Achieving a Resilient Future for Small States: Caribbean 2050" considers current policies and trends in six Caribbean countries — Bahamas, Barbados, Jamaica, St. Lucia, Grenada, Trinidad and Tobago and Guyana — made a 34-year projection across different sec-

The report was released at the Fourth Global Biennial Conference on Small States in Seychelles last week.

The report predicts that if nothing

changes, the Caribbean in 2050 will face unmanageable debt, poor growth and greater socio-economic problems.

The report said: "Five out of the six countries under study would have a debtto-gross domestic product ratio for 100 percent while for two countries this could exceed 200 percent."

With interest on debt reducing funds for development, the report predicts that when combined with the slowdown in growth in the medium term due to declining competitiveness, Caribbean countries would face worsening socio-economic condition.

The report said crime and disorder is forecast to rise in the region.

It noted that youth unemployment and underemployment contribute to inadequate human and social capital development and a rising crime rate.

## Developing countries under attack from new FTAs

In this column, Martin Khor, the executive director of the South Centre, warns that industrialised powers are taking aim against the role of the state in developing countries.

GENEVA (IPS) - Two new trade agreements involving the two economic giants, the United States and the European Union, are leading a charge against the role of the state in the economy of developing countries.

Attention should be paid to this initiative as it has serious repercussions on the future development plans and prospects of developing countries.

The two latest attempts towards this are through the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement (TPPA) and the Trans-Atlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP). A new feature of both, as compared to other FTAs, will be discipline on the operations of state enterprises and a reduction of the state's role in development.

The latter is a subject of long-standing discussion. The immediate post-colonial period saw a tendency towards a strong state, including government ownership of some key sectors, such as industry and banking.

Past decades witnessed a wave of privatisation across both rich and developing countries. But the state still owns or controls utilities, infrastructure, public services, banks and a few strategic industries in many developing countries.

Countries provide incentives for foreign companies, such as tax-free status. However, the state also offers special treatment to local companies, such as grants, cheaper-than-normal credit, subsidies, and government contracts.

The developmental role of the state in developing countries is now coming under attack from developed coun-

This is promoted by the big companies in the U.S., Europe and Japan, which seek to enter the markets of developing countries – the source of their future profits.

The support given by the state to domestic companies is seen by multinational companies as a hindrance to their quest for expanded market share in developing countries.

They are thus seeking to change the worldview and policy framework in developing countries, to get them to reduce the role of state enterprises as well as to curb the governments' promotion of local private companies.

A sub-chapter on stateowned enterprises is a prominent part of the TPPA, which is being negotiated by the U.S. and Australia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, Singapore and Vietnam. Japan has just joined

The U.S. and Australia are leading the move to have rules to discipline the role of the government in the economy, through a two-pronged approach.

First, to get government or other monopolies to behave in a "non-discriminatory" way, including when they buy or sell goods and services. For example, they are not allowed to give preferences or incentives to local firms.

Second, companies that are linked to the government (including through a minority share) should not get advantages vis-à-vis other firms in commercial activities. Of course, the developed countries that are proposing this are thinking of their companies -how they can get more access to developing countries' markets.

In the TTIP, a U.S.-European Union agreement, negotiations for which started in July, the EU has prepared a sub-chapter on state-owned enterprises, with rules that seem guite similar to what the U.S. and Australia are proposing in the TPPA.

Although the TTIP only involves Europe and the U.S. directly, the rules it sets are intended to have consequences for other countries.

According to press reports, the two economic giants are planning for the rules they set in the TTIP to become the standard for future bilateral agreements that also include developing countries.

They also hope that these rules will eventually be internationalised in the World Trade Organisation, which has over 130 member states.

The EU position paper on state-owned enterprises says that its aim is to "create an ambitious and comprehensive standard to discipline state involvement and influence in private and public enterprises" and for this to "pave the way to other bilateral agreements to follow a similar approach and eventually contribute to a future multilateral engagement."

In other words, the constraints on the role of the state, and the reduction of the space for behaviour or operations of state-linked companies, will become the way of the future for all countries, if the U.S. and European plans succeed.

These attempts to curb the role of the state in the economy are worthy of serious study and counter-action.

Developing countries that succeeded in economic development were able to combine the roles of the public and private sectors in a partnership that advanced overall national development.

Asian countries, including Japan, South Korea, Malaysia, Singapore and China, have pioneered this model of public sector collaboration with the private sector.

Those few developing countries that managed to get development going were all driven by the "developmental state", or the leadership role of government in establishing the framework of economic strategy, and the collaboration between the state, state enterprises, and commercial companies.

Ironically, agricultural subsidies, the main trade-distorting practice of developed countries and regions like the U.S., Europe or Japan, have been kept off the agenda of the FTAs negotiated by the U.S. and EU with developing countries, including the TPPA.

The developed countries are clever not to include what would be more damaging to them. Thus the developing countries are deprived of what would have been the major trade gain for them.

Naturally, there are pros and cons to any agreement, including the FTAs. Any potential gain for a country in exports or investments should be weighed against potential losses to domestic producers and consumers, and especially the loss to the government in policy space and potential pay-outs to companies claiming compensation under the FTAs' investment rules.

But if developing countries have to come under new international rules that curb the role of the state and that reshape the structure of their economy, then the prospects for future development will be adversely affected.


Ultimately, that's the shame of it — that there's so much nakedly political posturing attending composition of the nation's judicial forum of last resort. And the guestion isn't whether Democrats.

were the Senate breakdown reversed, would be doing the same dance. They very well might. The question, rather, is whether the process toward someone's placement on the nation's highest court couldn't be stripped of at least part of the circus atmosphere that demeans it. It was in mid-February, for instance, that Justice Antonin Scalia's death created the vacancy now to be filled. Which is to say, if the Republican wall of defiance holds all the way, it would have been roughly a year before a start could be made toward seating the court's ninth justice. Think of the many 4-4 splits that figure to compromise court rulings in the meantime. Where, in this calculus, are the best interests of "the people" taken into account? Reform of the process, by whatever device is required, that expressly prohibits the kind of protracted delay to which the Garland nomination is being subjected, is sorely needed.

Even more scary than the travesty we're now experiencing, with Republicans engaged

in what their Senate majority allows them to do, is the prospect of Republicans brazenly attempting to stymie any high court nomination made by a Democratic president. We have regularly seen evidence, in certain extremist behavior displayed in the GOP caucus, which clearly suggests that being of hard-right ideological bent is the key acceptable qualifier for membership on the court. Especially so as a Scalia replacement. It's the sort of fanaticism that tends to tune out the rights of others in the discussion and makes light of rules, protocol, etc. The name of Ted Cruz comes to mind. But he's by no means alone in his single-minded devotion to right-wing extremism.

What's being done with the president's pick of the generally respected Judge Garland for the high court very much deserves to be in the mix in this contest for the presidency. And it will be, never mind one candidate's trivializing of what this most sobering of presidential duties entails.

## **SCARED STIFF!**

#### Brookdale brings kids to morgue to show dangers of guns

This scared-straight program is dead

Brookdale Hospital brought 50 kids from Brooklyn high schools to its morgue to scare them away from gunplay on May 18. And the event was right on target, according to one student who said it helped him realize how one wrong move could cause a lifetime of

"It was touching," said New Visions Charter High School student Deshawn Rios. "Knowing what these people went through, it could have them think. 'What if that was me in that situation, in this position? How would the family members of the victim of the life I took away feel?"

Hospital employees showed kids some unlucky stiffs whose lives gun violence cut short, because the day was all about tough love, one worker said.

"They never had a chance to see tomorrow, they never had a chance to wear Jordans, they never had a chance to enjoy themselves," external affairs guru Khari Edwards told a group of aghast students viewing a corpse. "What we want you to do is live long, fruitful, fulfilling lives being real ingratiated people to society."

Edwards dreamed up the event the first in the hospital's "It Starts Here" campaign to end gun violence because his 12-year-old son was held at gunpoint in an attempted robbery.

A criminal justice advocate, a gunshot survivor, a trauma surgeon, and Deputy Borough President Diana Reyna talked to kids about confronting aggression in their own lives, and students shared their reasons for fearing to speak out — peer pressure, respect, and fear of what might happen to their families if they did. The intimate conversation resonated with pupils, one school administrator said.

"I felt like that personal level that they had, talking about the gun violence and holding them accountable for their behavior and actions while watching this presentation, I thought that was super effective," said New Visions Charter High School for Advanced Math and Science III guidance counselor Stefan Phillip.


"It opened their eyes to see stuff they had never seen before, and to see that this is real. It's not just something that's in a movie, it's not something from a video game. This stuff can actually happen."

Ministry, Jose Daniel Alonso, announced at the event that 25 of those projects aimed at building new hotels, another 97 initiatives include hotel management with or without foreign financial back-up and five for the management of marinas.

The official said that by December 2015, Cuba was offering 65,000 and 67,000 hotel rooms, while another 108,000 rooms will be built between this year and 2030.

Alonso added that the Tourism Ministry considers the construction of what is known as ecological hotels, and new products such as nature and health tourism.

#### Grenada

The U.S. Embassy to Barbados, the Eastern Caribbean and the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) recently part-

nered with the Judicial Education Institute of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court to pro-



vide training in Grenada for regional attorneys and financial investigators on civil asset recovery.

The purpose of the training was to improve regional attorneys and financial investigators' knowledge of civil asset recovery, and promote best practice in this area of law.

The training was an example of the close working relationship between the Eastern Caribbean states and the United States to promote the rule of law and enhance citizen security.

Grenada introduced civil asset recovery powers when it passed the Proceeds of Crime (Amendment Act) and in doing so became the fourth country in the Eastern Caribbean to introduce civil asset recovery legislation.

Since the new took effect, criminal justice agencies in Grenada have made full use of the powers contained in the legislation.

#### Guyana

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) is predicting a four percent economic growth for Guyana in 201.

The Washington -based financial institution, which

recently concluded an Article IV consultation with the Caricom country, said that lower



export commodity prices and budget delays weighed down on activity, while the opening of two large gold mines helped support growth.

It said consumer prices contracted 1.8 per cent in the 12 months ending December 2015, reflecting lower import prices and a one-off increase in value added tax (VAT) exemptions.

The IMF said the macroeconomic outlook is generally positive for 2016 and the medium-term.

It said growth is projected at four percent in 2016, supported by public investment and two large gold mines.

Twelve-month inflation is expected to remain low at around 2.1 percent by year end.

The IMF said it commended the resilience of Guyana's economy, which continues to grow despite global headwinds, challenges and risks remain.

It also stressed the importance of strengthening the anti-money laundering efforts and combating the financing of terrorism framework.

#### **Jamaica**

Jamaica must move with urgency to develop a medical marijuana industry.

The call was made by Finance and Planning Minister Audley Shaw who told lawmakers that the benefits of marijuana is "not about smoking a spiff" or "walking around with two ounces of weed."

Delivering his first budget debate of the new Andrew Holness government, Shaw said, "this is about building an industry of value-added products."

Shaw, who cited other countries who benefitted from using the plant, said that Jamaica is uniquely positioned to

play a leading role in the medical marijuana industry, which can create wealth for the country. He noted that in the



United States alone, the legal marijuana market is predicted to rise from US\$6.7 billion this year to US\$21.8 billion by 2020.

The finance minister said Canada has built a major industry, which may become fully legalized next year, adding that the Dutch Ministry of Health is exporting medical marijuana to Canada, Italy, Germany and the Czech Republic.

In addition, Israel has more than 12,000 medical marijuana patients and is leading the world in research on medical marijuana.

Shaw said developing a medical marijuana industry for the country will involve pursuing research at the universities to create medicines which can help people dealing with major illnesses, such as diabetes, epilepsy and other medical conditions.

#### St. Vincent

St. Vincent and the Grenadines Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves says his government remains opposed to the controversial Citizenship by Investment Program) CIP) as a means of luring foreign investors to the island.

Addressing the launch of the Chamber

of Industry Commerce Finance Fair recently, Dr. Gonsalves said his administration remains opposed to the CIP which



he described as a "race to the bottom."

Several Caribbean countries, including Antigua and Barbuda, St. Kitts and Nevis and Dominica have established CIP's through which foreign investors are given citizenship in return for making a significant investment in the socioeconomic develop of these countries.

#### STAY SAFE WHEN DRIVING IN WET WEATHER

Drivers must modify their driving habits when weather compromises their visibility and makes road conditions un-safe. Rain can fall any time of year, but tends to be most problematic in spring.

According to the Federal

Highway Administration, wet roadways, and rain in particular, are the main cause of weather-related vehicle crashes. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administra-tion notes that, between 2004 and 2013, rain caused 573,784 crashes.

To drive safely in the rain and avoid accidents, drivers should follow certain precau-

· Maintain windshield wip-• Maintain windshield wipers. Inspect and, if necessary change windshield wipers regularly to ensure they are working optimally. Always test wipers before driving in rainy weather.

Turn on lights with wipers. Reduced visibility is a major contributor to wet-weather accidents. Drivers' views may be hampered by falling pre-cipitation and glare from wet cipitation and gare from wet roadways. Cloudy conditions and fog also compromise vis-ibility. When using windshield wipers, turn on your head-lights as well. This makes your vehicle more visible to other motorists and improves your own ability to see the road and

pedestrians.

· Recognize changing road conditions. Roadways accumulate oil and engine fluids that can float in rainwater, creating slippery road surfaces. This is usually a problem during the first few hours of a rainstorm or in areas that receive little precipitation and then are subjected to downpours. These fluids make rain-soaked roads even more slippery. Slow down, leave more room between vehicles and try driving in the tracks left by vehicles ahead.

· Reduce speed. The automotive group ÂAA says hydroplaning, when the tires rise up on a film of water, can occur with as little as 1/12 inch of wa-

ter on the road. The group goes on to say that tires have to displace a gallon of water per sec-ond to keep the rubber meeting the road. Drivers should reduce their speeds to correspond to the amount of water on the roadway. New tires can still lose some contact with the roadway, even at a speed as low as 35 mph. Therefore, reducing speed and avoiding hard brak-ing and turning sharply can help keep the rubber of the tire meeting the road.
• Rely on the defogger. Use

the car's windshield defroster/ defogger to improve visibility. Turn it on early and keep it on until the rain has stopped and visibility has improved.

 Recover from a skid. Skids can be frightening, but when skidding, resist any tempta-tion to slam on the breaks. Instead, continue to look and drive in the direction you want to go and slowly ease up on the accelerator.

• Skip the cruise control. It's important to maintain control over the vehicle in rainy conditions, so avoid using cruise control.

Maintain tires. Proper inflation and tire tread levels can improve traction. AAA recommends checking tread depth by inserting a quarter upside down into the tire groove. If you can see above Washington's head, start shopping for new tires. Check tire pressure on all tires at least once a month. Get an accurate reading when tires are cold and adjust air pressure

 Avoid other distractions.

Distracted driving can be hazardous during good road conditions and even more dangerous when visibility and other factors are compromised. Switch phones and other devices off so you can fully focus

on the road and other drivers. Rainy weather can contribute to poor driving conditions. Drivers should make changes to speed and other factors to make wet weather driving as safe as possible.







Dubbed the Queen Bee for out-spelling all school-age contenders that vied for the Gleaner Company-sponsored championship competition held in Jamaica, her name could easily resonate with similarity and enthusiasm to Usain Bolt's, Shelly Frazier Price's, Bob Marley, Marcus Mosiah Garvey's or Jody Ann Maxwell's.

Those achievers are regaled with pride for elevating the status of the Caribbean nation and its potential for winning against tremendous odds.

However, first from May 24 to 26 Blackwood will have to beat out 284 other spellers from across the United States, The Bahamas, Canada, Ghana, Japan and South Korea all eager to win the coveted loving cup, the

That year, Maxwell at the same age smartly won all the top prizes but also emerged the first non-American to win the coveted national and now international spelling contest.

Since that year, it seems the best of the island's Bees have emerged finalists from that educational institution to represent the entire island.

The anticipated event will be held at the Maryland Ballroom within the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center in National Harbor, Maryland and for devoted spell checkers, the cheering has already begun.

Hanif Brown, a former Jamaica national champion who competed at Scripps in 2011 said Blackwood has all the qualities of a winner.

"She has worked hard, she has made a lot of sacrifices, and Jamaica will only see the result."

Although Brown lost out to tough competition five years ago, the former contender said "the important thing for Chaunte to take from this is that whatever it is you do in life, there are going to be challenges.'

Brown is now a senior at Ardenne and in addition to a demanding study regimen, he is also the replacement coach following the 2015 death of Glen Archer, a reputed spelling coach credited with steering the best to international attention.

Archer coached 26 national champion spellers and it was Archer who coached Maxwell to celebrity status in her native Jamaica after she clinched the title with the word "chiaroscur-

And while Jamaicans hailed that historic acclaim, there are those that believe the U.S.

national competition should be relegated to Americans.

Some even contend that a limit should be placed on the racial makeup of finalists.

Their argument is that for "seven years in a row, and for 11 of the past 15 years, the \$30,000 Scripps National Spelling Bee championship has been won by American youngsters of Indian heritage."

While that may be true, organizers of the competition offer that "they (Indians) make up one in five of the 285 spellers, aged nine through 15, from all 50 states and seven foreign countries, who ran a gauntlet of local and regional contests to qualify for the big event."

To further dispute the bias, "Americans of South Asian heritage make up just one percent of the United States population, but only a few are really into competitive spelling, Shalina Shankar, Northwestern University anthropology professor said.

Seven of the 10 finalists in the National Geographic Bee earlier this month were Indian American, including the winner, Karan Menon, from New

"I look forward to the day, as do I think many of our South Asian participants, when they are called what they want to be called — Americans," Paige Kimble, a 1981 champion and current Bee director said.


"The bee is one of the truest forms of meritocracy, and we support every kid no matter where they come from," Kimble added.

"It's unfortunate that people have some not very nice things to say on social media."

The Bee is the nation's largest and longest-running educational promotion, administered on a not-for-profit basis by The E.W. Scripps Company and 288 sponsors in the United States, Europe, Canada, New Zealand, Guam, Jamaica, The Bahamas, Ghana, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands and American Samoa.

Annually held in late May and / or early June of each year, competitions are open to students who have not yet completed the eighth grade, reached their 15th birthday, nor won a previous National Spelling Bee.



Mabeline, and Evelyn — and a cantankerous and often antagonistic aunt. Beatrice.

The family lives in a refurbished dwelling in Bottom Town, presumably in Kingstown, the Vincentian capital.

With the primary goal of improving his family's impecunious state, Desmond left home and sought employment with the US-based shipping company, National Bulk Carriers.

While sailing, Desmond got caught up in the drug trade, trafficking in cocaine.

But, while hoping to earn US\$1 million in the illegal trade, he was busted in November 1975 by the Feds (FBI - Federal Bureau of Investigation) in Galveston, TX.

Jailed initially for 44 years, Desmond was unable to provide for his family. He, however, continued corresponding with Beverly from behind bars.

But, just before Beverly's death from cancer, Desmond told her where to find some "treasures" he had hidden near the outdoor latrine. Beverly used that money to repair the house.

bring shame and disgrace on her and the family, Beverly kept it to herself. She did not tell her children — much less her loquacious sister. Beatrice.

Instead, Beverly said Desmond was drowned in a "boating accident."

Consequently, the children grew up in dire poverty - hardly getting anything to eat on a daily basis — and the family was often unable to pay for basis utilities, such as electricity.

After growing up, the two elder daughters — Jacqueline and Mable — migrated; Jacqueline, the oldest, went to England, and Mable, "the crack addict," travelled to Trinidad and Tobago. The youngest, Evelyn, remained at home, assisting her mother until she passed.



So he was ready. At the next



## WI, England clash in Jamaica



## As US prepares for Copa America tourney

#### **By The Associated Press**

Goalkeeper Brad Guzan is set to start ahead of veteran Tim Howard for the U.S. national team in the Copa America tournament.

Coach Jurgen Klinsmann announced the 23-man roster Saturday during halftime of the MLS

rivalry game between New York City FC and the New York Red Bulls. The roster features 15 players from the 2014 World Cup team.

"We will go with Brad Guzan as the No. 1 at the Copa America. That's the decision that we made," Klinsmann told FOX Sports for the halftime announcement. "We had good talks with both goalkeepers. Tim Howard is there to support Brad 24-7. But it's important that both goalkeepers know what is the ranking right now."

Howard, who played for Everton Continued on Page 42

for nine seasons until signing with the Colorado Rapids in March, was the national team's starter in goal for the World Cup in Brazil. Afterward, he took time off from the U.S. team and Guzan took over as starter. Upon Howard's return, the two keepers rotated.

Perhaps the biggest surprise on the roster itself was the exclusion of Seattle Sounders forward Jordan Morris. Klinsmann named Clint Dempsey, Chris Wondolowski, Bobby Wood and Gyasi Zardes at forward.

There was the possibility that Morris might make the roster in the absence of Jozy Altidore, who was injured while taking a penalty kick for Toronto FC against the Vancouver Whitecaps last weekend. Altidore is expected to miss six to eight weeks.

"It came down to Wondo (Wondolowski) or Jordan," Klinsmann said. "And we decided at this moment to go with Wondo. He's in top form, he's scoring a lot of goals for the (San Jose) Earthquakes. Obviously when you take

certain players in one area you have to Kansas. leave other ones out."

The roster includes three goalkeepers, eight defenders and 12 midfielders / forwards. Eighteen players have appeared for the United States in World Cup qualifying.

The youngest player is 17-year-old Christian Pulisic, who has one previous appearance with the national team, and played with Borussia Dortmund, where he became the youngest player ever to score two goals in the Bundesliga.

The U.S. opens the 16-nation Copa America against Colombia on June 3 in Santa Clara, California. It then plays Costa Rica four days later at Chicago and closes the first round June 11 against Paraguay in Philadelphia.

A number of the players named to the Copa Roster won't be available for Sunday's U.S. exhibition at Puerto Rico because of Major League Soccer obligations. But most should be return to the national team for matches against Ecuador on Wednesday in Texas and Bolivia on Saturday in Kansas City,

Series and four-Test Indian series starting in July.

Last week, the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) announced that Ambrose would be replaced by former Barbados and West Indies fast bowler, Roddy Estwick, who was recently the bowling coach for Barbados.

The move came just about a few weeks prior to the start of the June 3-26 Tri-Nations Series, involving Australia and South Africa and about a month after the Antiguan helped guide West Indies to their second capture of the Twenty20 World Cup title in India.

The Tri-nation series will be played under lights.

Sir Curtly said he had been told by Simmons that he required a bowling consultant who was "more technical," hence the decision to go with Estwick.

Sir Curtly is widely regarded as one of the finest fast bowlers to have played the game, taking 405 wickets in 98 Tests at an average of 20.09.

Estwick has to his credit national coach of the year in Barbados in 2005 and 2011.
