No discrimination against foreigners with local passports

Foreigners who obtain local citizenship and travel documents through the controversial passport for dollar investment scheme will have full rights to travel and live anywhere in the 15-nation group of countries a regional leader said Wednesday.

Antiguan Prime Minister Gaston Browne said countries like his and other Eastern Caribbean states with Citizenship Investment Programs (CIP) stoutly defended the rights of outsiders who pay for their citizenship and local passports

by spending hundreds of thousands of dollars in investment schemes to have similar rights as people born in the region.


"Our founding treaty has made it clear that you cannot discriminate against anyone. A citizen is a citizen no matter how you look at it," said after a spirited discussion on the issue earlier on Wednesday.

Some of the other states which do not have or have no interest in the dollars for passport scheme had suggested that the newer citizens should not have full rights to rules

Mayor meets local leaders

With his eyes set on his re-election next year, Mayor Bill deBlasio has wasted no time in starting a "productive conversation" with Caribbean community leaders, small business owners and others in Brooklyn.

On Tuesday night, the Mayor attended a fundraising cocktail reception at Suede Restaurant on Clarendon Road in East Flatbush, owned by a Trinidadian family.

The event was organized by former New York City Council Member Dr. Una S.T. Clarke, the mayor's former colleague in the City Council, with the trail-blazing Clarke's daughter, Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke, representative for the 9th Congressional District in Brooklyn, as the honorary chair.

"We know victory comes through hard work, victory comes through preparation," deBlasio told the enthusiastic reception, which included Cory Provost, district leader for the 58th Assembly District in Brooklyn; Dr. Roy Hastick, president and chief executive officer of the Brooklynbased Caribbean American Chamber of Commerce and Industry; and William Howard, president of the West Indian American Day Carnival Association (WIADCA).

"No one every says change is easy or complete," the mayor added. "But never listen to the doubting Thomases."

He said reporters and others had expressed skepticism about the implementation of many of his policies and programs, such as universal Pre-K and an end to the New York Police Department's (NYPD) Stop and Frisk policies.

The West Indian American Day Carnival Association (WIADCA) and the Caribbean Tourism Organization (CTO) are partnering for a union that will encourage multi-organizational efforts between the two organizations that would benefit the Caribbean region, as well as its people in New York.

For the first time since WIADCA was established more than 49 years ago, French Guiana is expected to participate in the organization's events. The French-speaking South American country that borders Brazil, will participate in the West Indian American Day Carnival held on Eastern Parkway on Monday, Sept. 5. The success of adding another country to the association was via connections with CTO, says William Howard, president of WIADCA.

"We're trying to be inclusive of all islands," said Howard. "This partner-

ship will save money."

The partnering also added new musical acts from Barbados, including the introduction of artists from French Guiana, that will have floats in the parade this year. Both organizations will benefit from the partnership because of similar, yet different missions for the Caribbean. WIADCA wants to open doors for CTO, which they hope gains them more artists that have relationships with CTO, according to Howard.

The Caribbean Tourism Organization, founded in 1989, primarily focuses on making tourism to the Caribbean the top destination, as well as promoting tourism education via scholarships for students. The organization also builds a relationship in countries that have large Caribbean diaspora's, such as the United States and United Kingdom.

While WIADCA's mission is "to promote, develop and celebrate Caribbean culture, arts, history and traditions through year-round programs which culminate with a week-long display of festivities and a grand finale Carnival parade expanding our cultural reach throughout the world" its focus is more varied, to include education, tourism, fundraising, and healthcare.

Howard also sees more growth for WIADCA by appealing to the younger generation through the use of technology and social media, hoping to model the organisation's outreach after other popular events.

"We're looking at South by Southwest," said Howard. "They're getting \$5 million for one week."

The CTO will also participate in the West Indian Day Carnival in September

Caribbean

CARICOM leaders were expected to sign an agreement to officially launch the Caribbean Center for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency (CCREEE) during the Heads of Government Meeting in Guyana.

The CCREEE was first inaugurated in October 2015.

This was revealed by Devon Gardner, program manager at the CARICOM Secretariat. He said the issue of renewable energy is being taken seriously by CARICOM leaders.

In May, Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley attended the U.S.-Caribbean Central American Energy Security Summit in Washington D.C and told leaders that given the "enormous scale"

of resources in the renewable region, energy should be contributing more to the



energy needs and increasing prospects of energy security.

Gardner said funding of renewable energy products continues to be a challenge to achieve CARICOM's renewable energy targets successfully, US\$30 billion in required.

He said CARICOM countries are "financially stressed" and funding does not exist in the public sector, so it should be taken from international funding agencies.

Antigua

The Antigua and Barbuda government has indicated that the construction of a new Beaches Hotel by Sandals Resorts International (SRI), on the site of Halcyon Cove by Rex Resort will be on the table when the two parties meet for negotiations.

According to the Minister of Infor-

mation Melford Nicholas the government is actively seeking to increase the number available hotel



rooms in the twin-island state, in order to advance the tourism state.

He said it is still the intention of the government to support the economic expansion of Sandals — the acquisition

of the Halcyon Hotel (for) the Beaches Resort is something the government is very much interested in.

Nicholas added that during the upcoming negotiations, the government would seek to resume those negotiations with the principals of the Sandals group.

Barbados

The United Nations Food and Agri-

culture Organization (FAO) said climate change is expected to increase the intensity and frequency of droughts

in the Caribbean, so countries in the region must enhance their capabilities to deal with this and other



extreme weather-related challenges to ensure food security and hunger extradition.

The FAO said in a new report, "Drought Characteristics and Management in the Caribbean" that the Caribbean region faces significant challenges in terms of drought.

Deep Ford, FAO regional coordinator in the Caribbean said drought ranks as the single most common cause of severe food shortage in developing countries, so this is a key issue for Caribbean food security.

The FAO noted that the Caribbean region already experiences drought-like events every year, with low water availability often impacting on agriculture and water resources, and a significant number of bush fires.

According to the FAO the Caribbean region accounts for seven of the world's top 36 water-stressed countries, with one of them — Barbados — in the top

The Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) has approved a loan of US\$15 million and a grant of US\$533,000 to complement the government of Grenada's efforts to address the substantial need for improved education infrastruc-

J.W. Fletcher is one of the six schools across the country that will be expanded or rehabilitated as part of the Grenada

Education Enhancement Project (GEEP). Teachers and students are looking forward to the construction of



two new blocks which will provide three classrooms, administrative space, and laboratories for Building Technology and Electronics, rooms for Music, Art, Technical Drawing and Counseling.

Grenada's Minister of Education Anthony Boatswain said the implementation of the project will allow "our ministry to be better positioned to serve all its stakeholders at all levels and to take a professional approach towards the conduct of business and education.

Grenada was badly affected by Hurricane Ivan and Emily in 2004 and 2005 respectively that some damaged schools



help raise awareness about the importance of the proper trash disposal process

Eugene said this ongoing effort, which began last year, is dubbed, "Keep Our Community Clean."

"Littering isn't just aesthetically upsetting; it can also have a dangerous impact in the community," he said.

Eugene said students from MS 246, who have been working diligently on a campaign to end litter, made a video to

illustrate how litter can wash into the waterways and harm marine life.

allowing them to establish businesses in the duty free, single market area but Browne said agreement was reached that countries cannot discriminate against the new comers.

Countries with CIP schemes include Grenada, Dominica, St. Lucia, Antigua and St. Kitts. St. Vincent which has said it has no plans to go that route under the current administration, was one of the countries which had objections. Jamaica has said that it is considering a similar scheme.

He said objecting countries were pointed to a recent ruling by the Trinidad-based Caribbean Court of Justice in the case of a Jamaican woman who was body band cavity searched by Barbadian immigration officials several years ago.

She sued and won. The court had ordered officers to ensure citizens of the bloc who enter any member state be given the six-month stay period without a work permit as per rules in the free market.

Caribbean governments are to organize a global conference on actions taken by American commercial banks to cease doing business with counterparts in the region and Latin America and have also asked for a temporary cessation of severed ties.

The issue was a key agenda item of the three-day leaders summit due to end here late Wednesday.

Meanwhile, Antiguan Prime Minister Gaston Browne said exasperated leaders are going to appeal to U.S. lawmakers and bank heads to stop cutting ties with agencies in the 15-nation group "to give us some breathing space" while they bring together legislators, NGO's, bank owners and others at a massive conference on the issue later this year. The conference is to be held in the Caribbean.

"We have decided as well as to hire a well established American lobbying firm to lobby on our behalf, to make representation for us on this question of derisking by American banks. At this point we want to ask them to stay their hand," Browne said Wednesday.

Banks across the region, locally owned ones in particular, have been cut off by American mega banks in recent years, forcing the region to look for alternatives to process credit card payments, wire transfers and check chasing transactions among others.

Browne said leaders did toy with the idea of the region setting up its own bank or clearing house on U.S. soil but no decision was taken as the move now is to take the lobbying campaign globally.

In the meantime, British Crown Agents Bank is moving through the region exploring the possibility of taking up the slack left by those such as Bank of America and JP Morgan Chase.

Meantime, Belizean Foreign Minister Wilfred Erlington said that the country's Central Bank has been able to establish relations with smaller banks but they too soon quit because of increased pressure from U.S. regulators to scrutinize transactions from the region.

"Our transactions are small and the costs of doing business with us is so high so the banks have taken the position that it is just not worth the time. Africa and Latin America are also feeling the squeeze."

Former T&T PM to be buried Saturday

Former Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Patrick Mervyn Augustus Manning, who died on Sunday morning, will be given a state funeral.

Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley, in making the announcement said the former political leader of the People's National Movement (PNM said his body will lie in State at the Southern Academy Performing Arts (SAPA) in San Fernando on Thursday and at the North Performing Academy Center in Port of Spain on Friday for public viewing before a funeral service at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity in Port of Spain on Saturday, July 9.

He will then be laid to rest in a private ceremony.

Manning, 69, died about two days after he was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (a rare form of cancer) at the High Dependency Unit (HDU) at the San Fernando Hospital.

Manning, who like his predecessors Dr. Eric Williams and George Chambers died at the age of 69.

Condolences continue to pour in for Manning's family from across the Caribbean and North America. He served Trinidad and Tobago for 23 years. Manning was prime minister on four occasions. He represented San Fernando East as Member of Parliament for 44 years. He entered politics at the age of 24.

Jamaica takes action against yellow fever virus

Jamaica is taking steps to prevent the importation of the yellow fever virus into the country where the disease does not occur but where the mosquito vector and human hosts are present.

Yellow fever is an acute viral disease transmitted by infected mosquitoes.

Last month, the Jamaica government issued a statement indicating that all travelers over the age of one year who arrived in Jamaica from countries where there is a risk of yellow fever transmission — including those passengers transiting those countries — would be required to produce a valid certificate to show they have been vaccinated.

Last week nine passengers who arrived in Jamaica by air were refused entry, while another eight were quarantined because of yellow fever concerns.

The 17 were among passengers from Trinidad and Tobago and Panama, who were unable to produce evidence that they were vaccinated against the virus. The Trinidadians had arrived on a Caribbean Airlines flight from Trinidad.

Time to declare our independence from corporate tax dodging

Marchers in this year's 4th of July parades in small towns across America will pass a variety of Main Street businesses: barber shops, restaurants, computer repair services. What all these small businesses have in common is that none of them use unpatriotic offshore tax dodges to avoid paying their fair share of U.S. taxes. Unfortunately, the same can't be said for America's multinational corporations.

Huge U.S. firms are avoiding almost \$700 billion in U.S. taxes on \$2.4 trillion in profits they hold overseas, according to a study by Citizens for Tax Justice. This massive, ongoing tax dodge hurts American families, small businesses

and hometown communities in bridges, overcrowded schools, several ways at once.

First, it's just not fair. Why should working Americans pay all their taxes every year, while big corporations don't? The only winners from this tax avoidance scheme are corporate CEOs and wealthy shareholders, whose payouts are inflated with the taxes not paid. (Oh, and the lobbyists who swarm Capitol Hill convincing Congress to open the tax-dodging loopholes in the first place.) Those tax-dodge bonanzas further widen our nation's already yawning income and wealth gaps.

Second, it deprives us of resources we desperately need to fix what's broken in our society: potholed roads, crumbling underfunded retirements.

Here's just one breakdown of how we could put \$700 billion to use: double federal highway and mass transit spending for seven years (\$470 billion); provide high-quality preschool for all low- and moderate-income four-year-olds for 10 years (\$75 billion); provide two years of free tuition at community college over 10 years benefitting 9 million students (\$61 billion); and increase the National Cancer Institute's budget by 50% for 10 years (\$27 billion).

Third, overseas tax dodging gives multinational companies one more advantage over small businesses and domestic corporations that actually pay their taxes. With their economies

of scale, national advertising budgets and cushions of cash, big companies don't need yet another leg up on their smaller competitors.

How do multinationals get away with it? It's mostly due to a loophole in the tax code called "deferral." Even though American corporations are taxed on all their worldwide earnings every year, they can indefinitely

to edit all submissions.

avoid paying the taxes due on overseas earnings till they bring that money home.

And here's a key point: a lot of those profits sheltered offshore weren't actually made there. Corporations use accounting tricks to shift domestic profits to overseas tax havens, thereby cutting their U.S. taxes while facing little or no tax abroad.

Some corporations aren't satisfied to send their profits offshore—they send the whole company, at least on paper. In so-called "inversions," an American corporation changes its legal address to a tax haven by merging with a smaller foreign company. The company is still operated from the U.S. enjoying all the benefits of our country-but it stops paying its full share of taxes for those benefits.

What can be done about all this unpatriotic corporate tax dodging this 4th of July? Plenty.

First, Congress needs to make corporations pay the \$700 billion they owe now on their \$2.4 trillion in untaxed offshore profits. House Speaker Paul Ryan has just proposed a tax plan that would let corpo-

rations pay a fraction of what they owe - about \$170 billion. That's a huge tax giveaway for a small collection of the nation's largest and most profitable corporations.

Second, Congress needs to reject Speaker Ryan's plan to slash the corporate tax rate nearly in half. Cutting the corporate tax rate from the current 35% to 20% will lose \$1.7 trillion in public revenue over 10 years. Because of all the loopholes in the tax code, big corporations are already paying an effective tax rate of just 14% now, according to the Government Accountability Office. They don't need to pay less in taxes; they need to pay their fair share.

At the heart of the American colonies' drive for independence back in 1776 was a demand for tax fairness. That demand is still alive today as we celebrate our 240th 4th of July. Through much needed reforms, working America can declare its independence from corporate America's tax dodg-

Congresswoman opens new office with fanfare

Clarke, Democratic representative for the 9th Congressional District, on Friday opened her new office to better serve constituents.

A steady stream of constituents, community leaders and officials trekked to the new office at 222 Lenox Rd.. between Nostrand and Rogers avenues, in the epicenter of the Caribbean community, from 2 pm to 8 pm, to be warmly greeted by Clarke and staffers.

"We've been planning all along to do a grand opening so the community can spread the word," Clarke told Caribbean Life in an exclusive interview amid the fanfare.

"I'm very proud to represent this district," she added. "We want that to be reflected in all that we do. We also want to collaborate with community organizations for the services we provide.

"Our goal is to build a strong community, to partner with those involved in growth," continued Clarke, who is serving her 10th year in the US House of Representatives.

Clarke said she moved to the new office in February after the owners of the old office, at 123 Linden Blvd., sold the building.

She said her new office is a former medical facility that was "retrofitted to meet the needs of our office."

The congresswoman said her dis-Brooklyn Congresswoman Yvette D. trict, formerly the 11th Congressional District that was redistricted in 2010, is very diverse, with constituents from the Middle East, South Asia and Turkey. She said they comprise the "bulk of the Muslim community."

The 9th Congressional District also comprise the Jewish community from ultraorthodox to liberal – and the Christian community, including the Caribbean community.

Clarke said the Caribbean community is the largest cultural, ethnic and religious group, comprising nationals from the English, French, Spanish and Dutch-speaking Caribbean.

The 9th Congressional District, Clarke said, is also the only congressional district that comprises constituents in one borough in New York City.

The highly residential and commercial district runs through the middle of Brooklyn - from the Barclays Center, downtown Brooklyn, to Sheepshead Bay, and includes Parkslope and Brownsville.

In her new office, Clarke said she plans to conduct a series of small community meetings, "where people can come to get professional services."

Clarke has a conservative opponent in the November Presidential Elections, as she seeks her sixth consecutive, twoyear term in Congress.

STAY SAFE WHEN DRIVING IN WET WEATHER

Drivers must modify their driving habits when weather compromises their visibility and makes road conditions unsafe. Rain can fall any time of year, but tends to be most problematic in spring.

According to the Federal Highway Administration, wet roadways, and rain in particular, are the main cause of weather-related vehicle crashes. The National Highway Traffic Safety Adminis-tration notes that, between 2004 and 2013, rain caused 573,784 crashes.

To drive safely in the rain and avoid accidents, drivers should follow certain precau-

• Maintain windshield wipers. Inspect and, if necessary change windshield wipers regularly to ensure they are working optimally. Always test wipers before driving in

rainy weather.

• Turn on lights with wipers. Reduced visibility is a major contributor to wetweather accidents. Drivers' views may be hampered by falling precipitation and glare from wet roadways. Cloudy conditions and fog also com-promise visibility. When using windshield wipers, turn on your headlights as well. This makes your vehicle more

visible to other motorists and improves your own ability to see the road and pedestrians.

· Recognize changing road conditions. Roadways accumulate oil and engine fluids that can float in rainwater, creating slippery road surfaces. This is usually a problem during the first few hours of a rainsform or in areas that receive little precipitation and then are subjected to downpours. These fluids make rain-soaked roads even more slippery. Slow down, leave more room between vehicles and try driving in the tracks left by vehicles ahead.

· Reduce speed. The au-

tomotive group AAA says hydroplaning, when the tires rise up on a film of water, can occur with as little as 1/12 inch of water on the road. The group goes on to say that tires have to displace a gallon of water per second to keep the rubber meeting the road. Drivers should reduce their speeds to correspond to the amount of water on the roadway. New tires can still lose some contact with the roadway, even at a speed as low as 35 mph. Therefore, reducing speed and avoiding hard braking and turning sharply can help keep the rubber of the tire meeting the road.

· Rely on the defogger. Use the car's windshield defroster/ defogger to improve visibility.

Turn it on early and keep it on until the rain has stopped and visibility has improved.

• Recover from a skid. Skids can be frightening, but when skidding, resist any temptation to slam on the breaks. Instead, continue to look and drive in the direction you want to go and slowly ease up on the accelerator.

· Skip the cruise control. It's important to maintain control over the vehicle in rainy conditions, so avoid using cruise control.

 Maintain tires, Proper inflation and tire tread levels can improve traction. AAA recommends checking tread depth by inserting a quarter upside down into the tire groove. If you can see above

Washington's head, shopping for new tires. Check tire pressure on all tires at least once a month. Get an accurate reading when tires are cold and adjust air pressure accordingly.

· Avoid other distractions. Distracted driving can be hazardous during good road conditions and even more dangerous when visibility and other factors are compromised. Switch phones and other devices off so you can fully focus on the road and other drivers.

Rainy weather can contribute to poor driving conditions. Drivers should make changes to speed and other factors to make wet weather driving as safe as possible.

Councilman continues combatting gun violence

Neither the U.S. Supreme Court decision to forego hearing a challenge to New York's SAFE Act nor Omar Mateen's killing of 49 people (and injuring of 53) at The Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida, has altered the position of the Senate on tightening gun control.

Nearly a week after the Orlando shooting, the Senate did not vote in the interest of fair gun control proposals.

The failure of the four varied gun control measures to pass the Senate, within a close time period of the mass shooting in Orlando, is predicted to be a heated issue during the presidential campaign.

Both Democrats and Republicans offered gun laws limiting the purchasing of firearms. In what could have been perceived as a possible moment of reckoning for the two political parties, was quickly dissolved.

Not surprising, the Senate denied a Republican-gun measure, which permits at least a three-day sale delay to terrorists suspects, if there is a showing of probable cause.

According to one major

publication, "gun clubs for the LGBT community nationally are showing a significant increase in membership" nearly doubling - following the Orlando shooting.

After the Orlando massacre, Sen. Chuck Schumer (D-NY) declared that the Senate "ought to do something" to eliminate shooting fatalities.

"At least, they (Senate) are feeling the heat," Schumer, added, at a news conference with Democrats and relatives of victims of gun violence.

The nonpartisan Organizing For Action and gun-control advocates are hopeful bipartisan gun-control legislation is inevitable.

"The Senate had the chance to pass two amendments, one that would've expanded background checks on gun sales and one that would've helped prevent known terrorists from buying guns," stated OFA Director of Community Programs, Traci Wile. In a prepared statement Wile added, "Both had a real chance go help gun violence and make our neighborhood safer." According to Wile, the activist Rep. John



St. Lucia's gov't to review its diplomatic appointments

St. Lucia's new Prime Minister Allan Chastanet says his government intends to review the appointments of diplomats by the former Dr. Kenny Anthony administration.

High on the list is the controversial appointment of Saudi billionaire Dr. Walid Juffali as St. Lucia's Permanent Representative to the International Maritime Organization (IMO).

Chastanet and his United Workers Party (UWP) had raised concerns about Dr. Juffali's appointment, particularly after he attempted to claim diplomatic immunity in a public divorce battle between the businessman and his exwife Christina Estrada.

Earlier this year, a High Court in the United Kingdom contended that Dr. Juffali obtained a diplomatic appointment in April 2014 with the sole intention of defeating Estrada's claims, following the breakdown of their marriage. They were formerly divorced in December 2014.

Questions had been raised about Dr. Juffali's appointment since he does not have any known qualifications in maritime law and there were no public record of him ever attending any meetings of the IMO.



noticed the left side of her body becoming paralyzed she knew something was seriously wrong. 

Trends in nursing shift health education

as individuals, they become engaged, active partners in their care plan and their health outcomes improve. This shift in providing customized care to patients is also being adopted by nurse educators, who are applying a similar approach that sets up nursing students for success in both the education and clinical setting.

The customization of care is also a driving force behind four growing trends across education: individualized instruction, experiential learning, educating for cultural humility and increased access to education for military students.

Focusing on success

Individualized instruction is an emerging trend that is designed to help students achieve greater confidence and overcome barriers to their education. Each student has their own preferred methods of learning, their own challenges and their own goals. When nurse educators care about the student's individual success, everyone benefits.

"We believe that if we take extraordinary care of our students, they will in turn take extraordinary care of the patients and families they serve," Richard Cowling, vice president of academic affairs at Chamberlain College of Nurs- of Science in Nursing degree. gruent care.

When patients are treated ing, said. "We call this value system, 'Chamberlain Care."

Through the Chamberlain Care Student Success Model, a team of Chamberlain faculty, advisors and mentors identify any barriers to the student's success and deliver individualized academic coaching and a customized support plan to encourage and support students in reaching their goals.

Fostering active learning

To help students reach those goals, nurse educators turn to another emerging trend: active learning. A stark contrast with passive learning, watching a teacher in a classroom or learning from a textbook, nurse educators are cultivating active student participation and curiosity through direct patient care and simulated and virtual learning experiences.

Active learning promotes clinical reasoning and affords students the opportunity to see the outcome of their care decisions in real time. Simulation labs, a form of active learning, engage students to explore various clinical processes but instead of live patients, hightech mannequins are used. In addition to these on-campus labs, Chamberlain also offers virtual learning environments for students pursuing a Master Both simulation and virtual learning are types of experiential learning opportunities. When direct patient care isn't an option, experiential learning opportunities can be created by nurse educators so students can learn how to respond to disasters, treat infectious diseases or participate in other scenarios they may not have exposure to otherwise.

"Active learning experiences allow students to practice the skills they need in a safe environment," Cowling said. "Students feel in control of their own learning because they receive real-time feedback from instructors immediately following the experience, which helps in building confidence while they actively build their clinical knowledge and skill set."

Promoting diversity

In addition to transforming how students learn, current trends in health care influence what students learn. Today's health care environment is becoming more complex — with a rise in chronic illness, an aging population, ever-changing technology and increasingly diverse communities. The role of the nurse is also rapidly evolving as the focus has shifted to personcentered and culturally con-

lege student, they likely envision an 18-year-old who is fresh out of high school.



Health providers can benefit from legal studies

Career opportunities in the health care industry are expected to continue growing more quickly than in virtually any other industry, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Occupational Outlook Handbook.

Not only is the health care industry expected to add more than 2 million new jobs by 2024, many existing roles will continue to evolve, creating additional opportunities for professionals currently working in what is a broad field.

Health care law is one area seeing significant growth, thanks in part to the impact of the Affordable Care Act.

It is one of the fastest-growing disciplines for graduate and post-graduate degrees, according to Lawyer & Statesman.

The changes spurred by the ACA are also inspiring many professionals to learn more about the law to enhance their career opportunities and boost their skill sets.

"Health care professionals routinely find their day-to-day tasks affected by legal issues like regulatory compliance, risk management, malpractice, ethics, and patient privacy," Scott Johnson, professor of law at Concord Law School, said. "Recent laws and regulations governing these issues and the delivery of health services generally make knowledge of health care law a real career asset these days. A background in law can help a wide range of professionals, from administrators to clinicians to technology entrepreneurs be more effective in their current roles and better positioned to seize emerging opportunities."

Legal expertise can benefit health care professionals and their patients across many aspects of the industry, but it is particularly helpful in three key areas, Johnson notes:

- Regulatory compliance Compliance professionals help providers prevent, detect, and correct any actions, policies, or procedures that are counter to the many regulations governing the health care industry. They also help promote ethical conduct. The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 propelled growth in this area and regulatory compliance has been one of the fastest-growing professions over the past 15 years. Health care professionals in a wide range of positions including those who work with electronic health records, Medicare or Medicaid requirements, or the various requirements from the Affordable Care Act could benefit from knowledge of legal issues related to regulatory compliance.
- Ethics A subspecialty of regulatory compliance, knowing legal issues related to ethics is particularly important for professionals working in facilities where research also takes place. Bioethical principles and standards cover areas such as human subject research, genetic privacy, patient rights, rehabilitation ethics and more.
- Risk management This discipline focuses on reducing errors to protect patients as well as health care employers. This includes provider and institutional liability, notification and apology programs, risk assessments, patient safety, and adverse event reporting.

The growth of health care law has encouraged schools to create specialized degree programs for professionals seeking added legal expertise, but not planning to become practicing attorneys. For example, Concord Law School offers a health care law track within its Executive Juris Doctorate program.



Parents should know about ed savings accounts

Improved student achievement and higher graduation rates are not as hard to achieve as one might think.

They could become a reality with one simple policy: educational choice.

Robust parental choice in education is an idea that has taken root in more communities in the U.S. than ever before, and education savings accounts (ESAs) are the best mechanism to date for funding customized learning for students.

- contributions to a 529 college savings plan;
 - college tuition and textbooks;

• individual public school classes and programs.

The funding can go to several education providers at once, an option that could become increasingly important as online learning proliferates.

This level of customization helps bring American education into the 21st century and can ensure that no child is relegated to the limited effectiveness of a monopolistic system.

Parents can also "roll over" unused funds from year to year.

ESAs are the only educational choice policy to date that affords consideration of "opportunity costs," which encourage families to pursue the best education for the best value to maximize their ESA dollars.

A recent study by the Friedman Foundation for Educational Choice-a nonprofit and nonpartisan organization discovered that when parents are able to choose where their children go to school, they're happier with the entire experience. School choice also leads to increased academic achievement, graduation rates and student safety.

In addition, the foundation says, educational choice options put competitive pressure on public school systems to improve and to meet the needs of students or risk losing pupils-and money.

You're not the only kid in the world who likes ice cream.

Lots of kids do; everybody loves a good treat. Other people like biking, puppies, candy, and video games, too. You're unique, but you have a lot in common with a lot of people and in the new book "Lincoln and Kennedy: A Pair to Compare" by Gene Barretta, you'll see how two great men were alike, a century apart.

When you first take a look at Abraham Lincoln and John Kennedy, they're just two ordinary presidents. Lincoln was a Republican, Kennedy was a Democrat. Lincoln was born in 1809, Kennedy was born in 1917. Lincoln's family was poor; Kennedy's was definitely not.

So far, so different, right?

Not so fast.

Kennedy hated Jim Crow







Hundreds pay tribute to Barbadian entertainer

Hundreds of Barbadian and other Caribbean nationals on Friday paid their last respect to Alvin Headley, described as the "consummate entertainer, the life of the event," at a funeral at Fenimore Street United Methodist Church in Brooklyn.

Headley, of Mt. Standfast, St. James, Barbados and a staunch member of Fenimore Street United Methodist Church, died on June 16. He was 57.

While the cause of death was not made public, Headley, in recent months, was active in his church and in the community until his hospitalization.

"I thank God for the time I spent with my uncle," said Wendell Osbourne, the second oldest of Headley's nephews, at the 2 ½ hour-long service, attended by a wide cross-section of the Caribbean community, including Barbadians, Vincentians, Jamaicans, Trinidadians and Guyanese.

"He was easily one of the greatest uncles to ever walk on

this planet," Osbourne added. "My uncle, he changed lives and helped people. His life was changed; he did a good job."

One of Headley's friends, who only gave his name as Dwayne, said Headley was "the kind of person to help everyone.

"He helped everyone and everybody," Dwayne said. "He would go out of his way [to help others]. He had a heart of gold.

'His family treated me like family," he added. "The world got a little sad. He'll be truly missed."

Another friend, Gladwyn, said he met Alvin in 1993, and 'we became more brothers than friends.

"Any problems and he's there," he added, accompanied by his girlfriend, with whom they gave their "hearts to God' a few weeks ago. "He had a kind heart. The world is a little sadder because of Alvin [death]."

Merle Bartley, the Jamaicanborn chair of the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee at Fenimore Street United Methodist Church, said Headley was a "stalwart member" of the

Guyanese Ivor Griffith, a member of the church's Chancel and United Methodist Men choirs, the latter of which Headley was secretary and "the driving force", said Headley was "a people's person.

"He thought of everybody," said Griffith, stating, at the same time, that Headley was very outspoken. "He will be greatly missed. He's in the arms of the Lord. Alvin, your

time was short."

Brenda Hutto, the Trinidadian-born chair of the Education Committee at Fenimore Street United Methodist Church, said Headley was "a brother to me.

"Anytime I felt depressed, I will call Alvin," she said. "When he was going down [getting more sick], it became hard for me.

"Inside, my heart is heavy, very heavy," she added. "We'll be able [were able] to laugh and talk of the old times. I thank his mother for raising such a wonderful young man."

Pastor Andrea Moore-Smith, whose parents hail from Barbados and who offered the "Prayer of Comfort," said Headley was "a giving person.

"Alvin never denied his love

of Jesus Christ," she said. "Alvin was always feeding somebody. We thank God for Alvin."

In reading the obituary, Julie Osbourne, one of Headley's aunts, flanked by cousin Dr. Jennifer Hurley, said: "This is a job of high honor to speak on [about] the only gem of this family."

Osbourne said Headley, who was called "Magoo" by his closest friends, was born on Aug. 14, 1958 to the late Lionel Headley and Eloise Headley.

Headley attended the St. Alban's Infant School in Lower Carlton, St. Alban's Junior School in the Garden and St. James Mixed School in Holetown - all in St. James, Bar-



have not yet been restored and some continuing to be housed in temporary structures.

Guyana

The Guyana Energy Agency (GEA) says it is considering importing oil from markets in non-CARICOM countries, but will continue with importation of the product from the Trinidad-based state owned oil company, Petrotrin.

The GEA recently approved a paper on approaches to mitigate supply disruptions and will go before Cabinet for review.

GEA's Chief Executive Officer, Dr.

Mahender Sharma, said the new approaches by GEA entail the identification of other markets that can be pursued, as



well as mechanisms for improving local storage capacity.

He said receipt of Cabinet's approval of the paper, the recommendations would be pursued in a bid to satisfy the country's demand for oil.

A government statement said that the inconsistency in product availability over the past three years has been the cause for considering alternative markets within and outside of the region.

Haiti

Authorities in Haiti say there is a rise in violence in the island's capital following the murder of Swedish tourist who was gunned down while walking with his girlfriend in a major commercial district.

The man was identified as Johan Noren, who was on vacation when he was shot in the chest during an apparent robbery on a busy street in Petionville.

Noren's Swedish girlfriend who was

beaten by the gun-wielding bandits is recovering at hospital, police said.



Reports are that the Swedish couple had

missed a bus and was walking back to the hotel they had just checked out when they were attacked.

Haiti's Chamber of Commerce has expressed concern over the "alarming" rise in violent acts creating a "climate of fear and panic."

Recently, gunmen shot at several prominent businesses in Port-au-Prince but there were no reports of injuries.

Two days after Noren's killing, a medical student from Tulane University who was in Haiti as part of a school program was shot in the chest during an armed robbery in Petionville.

Jamaica

Prime Minister Andre Holness said his government is working with the police and army to deal with the issue of gun violence in Jamaica.

Police recently announced that they would be mounting more police / military operations in the western section of the island.

The prime minister, who came into office in February this year, said his administration is giving the law enforce-

ment agencies the resources needed to deal effectively with crime and murders in particular.

He said crime impacts families and by extension the economy. "We must end gun violence," Holness stated.

In January, law enforcement officials

said that violent crimes among rival gangs involved in the so-called lottery scam had helped to drive the island's hom-



icide rate to the highest level in five vears.

The Jamaica Constabulary said the country had at least 1,192 slayings in 2015, about a 20 percent increase from the previous year.

So far for this year more than 300 people have been murdered.

St. Kitts

American hip-hop star 50 Cent, whose real names is Curtis Jackson was slapped with a EC\$3,000 fine

(US\$1,111) for using indecent language on stage at the recent St. Kitts Music Festival.



The 40-year-old rap-

per, along with a member of his entourage, Bajar Walter was also made to pay a fine when they made a rare Sunday sitting of the court and pleaded guilty.

50 Cent was arrested last Saturday night after an hour-long performance at the Warner Park Stadium that included with profanity-laced hit, P.I.M.P.

The court which usually closed on week-ends was opened on Sunday so 50 cent could make an afternoon flight back to the U.S. in time for the BET Awards. Back in 2003 another American rapper, DMX, whose real name is Earl Simmons, was also fined for using indecent language during a concert.

Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago is sending goods supplies valued US\$ \$29 million to economically depressed Venezuela, which is facing a food shortage.

Two cargo planes from Venezuela's military arrived at Piarco International Airport recently and began airlift-

ing items such as rice, flour, frozen chicken, ketchup, pasta, toilet paper, tuna and powdered milk.



The Ministry of Trade and Industry said a total of 68 tons of food left Trinidad for the eastern side of Venezuela, where it was received by Venezuelan officials including President Nicolas Maduro.

The products came from local manufacturers who had demanded payment for the foodstuff before it left T&T.

The arrangement came within one month of an agreement T&T signed with Venezuela during an official visit by President Maduro to supply the South American country with basic food items through the establishment of a US\$50 million revolving fund.

Britain's divorce a sign of sovereign insecurity

It's interesting to see how one of Europe's architects of colonization recently trod a similar path some of their colonized possessions maneuvered when in the last century they voted to be independent.

In a recent referendum, a majority of Britons voted independence from the European Union.

Last week, by a 52-48 margin Brits voted to leave the EU.

Regarded as a rise in rightwing populism, the votes are perceived to be in response to patriotism, disenfranchisement with foreigners, convergence of migrants and unfair trade practices.

Race and class have also been cited as contributors to the votes of dissociation.

Formerly a powerful empire attributed to rich acquisitions forged in Asia, Africa and the Caribbean — the once Great Britain voted to secede from the EU coining a new addition to the English language lexicon and a catchy contraction which is and will be referred to as Brexit.

Revered as the jewel in the EU crown, England and its vot-

ers decided to opt out of unification with their allies in the region.

And while that majority is now jumping for joy with optimism of a new-found opportunity of independence and a mantra of pride akin to Donald Trump's "Make America great Again" campaign slogan, the deafening dissent against defection is what seems to be getting all the media attention.

The divergent opinions are not dissimilar to the prevailing politics that echoed throughout the Caribbean in the early 1960s when citizens were faced with deciding for or against a federation of neighboring countries.

It took a referendum from each of the bordered nations and Jamaicans were first to say they wanted out — to stand alone from the group, free of British and royal dictates.

The fear of uncertainty, self

rule, trade arrangements, tourism, and economic and military, vulnerability and a myriad of other concerns prevailed then but the tiny, fragile yet determined gem in the Caribbean had taken note from a distance underlining how India in 1947 and a decade later Ghana, Africa had led the charge to deciding their fate and agreed it to be a worthy challenge to risk.

Ghana, formerly known as the gold coast was a major loss to the British cache of wealth and power. And that Nigeria, Sierra Leone and The Gambia followed the lead of their black star neighbor a trend to independence proved a huge deficit for the once-powerful empire.

India was certainly a jewel in the crown, perhaps the biggest providing more than a Hope diamond after South Africa's split from Britain on May 1910 and Egypt in 1922.

However, the persevering and relentless desire to true democracy, self-governance and independence now dictates policy and responsibility to flags — other than the Union Jack — that identify people and places willing to decide their own destiny.

Since the recent vote, Prime Minister David Cameron announced his decision to step away from leadership from the Conservative Party and the British parliament in October.

Apparently that decision caused a ripple that reverberated here briefly on the NY Stock Exchange.

It also registered with national elections pending in November and the dominant neo-Nazi, hate rhetoric passing from patriotism.

Alexander Skarsgard stars as King of the Jungle

Tarzan became a sensation soon after his initial introduction to the world via pulp magazines published in 1912. Created by Edgar Rice Burroughs, the character proved to be such an enduring cultural icon that he would become the subject of a series of best-selling novels, 200+ movies and a long line of consumer products.

According to the lore spun by Burroughs, Tarzan, aka John Clayton, was the son of a couple of British aristocrats who perished in Africa while the boy

was still an infant. The baby was subsequently raised by apes in the wild where he became so in tune with nature that he learned to speak the language of all the beasts residing there.

Moreover, as the legendary "Lord of the Jungle," he not only exercised dominion over the animal kingdom but over cannibalistic tribes eager to sial in more enlightened times. rape white women and to boil And after decades of uncritical

missionaries in a big pot. Such insensitive portrayals of Africans as evil and uncivilized eventually became controver-

appeal, Tarzan finally witnessed a sharp decline in popularity.

Now, for the first time this millennium, he's been brought back to the big screen. Directed by David Yates (Harry Potter 5, 6, 7 and 8), The Legend of Tarzan features a more politicallycorrect version of the controversial character.

Set in 1884, the film stars Alexander Skarsgard in the title role as well as Samuel L. Jackson as his sophisticated sidekick, Dr. George Washington Williams. The American doctor was ostensibly shoehorned into the story to offset the relatively-primitive image of the indigenous black folks.

At the point of departure, we find Tarzan and wife Jane (Margot Robbie) living in the lap of luxury in London as Lord and Lady Greystoke. It's apparently been ages since Tarzan has even set foot on the dark continent.

He leaps at the chance to return to the Congo, when invited by Parliament to serve as a trade emissary.





citizens anxious and nervous about the impact the vote will have on their economies seem to be embracing the topic with caution.

That an Africa Union and a Caribbean union known as CARICOM unites geographical groupings of African and Caribbean nations, Brexit seem a latent response to European union and one counter to the prevailing opinions prior to 2016.

Allegedly, remorse from voters clueless as to what their decision meant when they voted secession and that their vote could prove a financial calamity for their sovereign nation is now a proposition for a recall of the referendum and fodder for more discussion.

In a published report from Brussels, Belgium, Dr. Patrick I. Gomes, secretary general of the African Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) Group, said the implications of Britain's decision to leave the 43-year-old EU could be far-reaching on the ACP and may give rise to many consequences for trade, services, investments and development finance assistance.

The Guyana-born Gomes in a statement said in each of the areas, the ACP-UK relations have been longstanding and mutually beneficial, not only for Caribbean countries, but for the ACP Group as a whole.

He noted for instance that as a contributor of at least 17 per cent to the European Development Fund (EDF), the UK has been consistent in its support and has argued in favor of making the European Development Fund (EDF) less cumbersome in its regulations.

"With the UK outside of the EDF Committee the ACP will lose an ally of great value," Gomes said, adding "beyond development financial assistance, the area of greatest concern for Caribbean countries will be in trade in goods and services, investment and technology development and transfer with the preferential arrangements provided under the Cotonou Partnership Agreement (CPA), signed in 2000, revised in 2005 and 2010 but coming to an end in 2020."

He said also the Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA) with the Caribbean Forum (CARIFORUM) signed in 2008 has indefinite provisions for duty free, quota free trade and the provision of services under preferential conditions.

Gomes said despite the relatively slow pace of implementation of the EPA, a basic question that will be posed by the ACP Group to the UK is the extent to which they will continue to honor the provisions and obligations of the EPA.

"This is an area that will call for tough negotiations by the ACP Group and will be clearly linked to what concessions come out of the "divorce settlement" between the UK and the EU," he added.

The negotiations are expected to last up to two years after the UK has formally notified the EU of its intention to withdraw from the Union.

"While all this means there is some time before the ACP will know what are the substantive areas in the "divorce agreement" of the UK and EU, the ACP Group is setting about pre-emptive actions and will adopt a multi-pronged strategy with a view to securing interests of the ACP member states, as best as possible under the favorable provisions in Cotonou and the EPAs, as well as in the case of Haiti and other LDCs, the provisions of the Everything-But-Arms (EBA) Agreement.

"This allows duty free / quota free trade with Europe in all goods except military arms and equipment," the ACP secretary general said.

Pre-emptive measures include detailed analytical work on the volume and value of exports to the UK market by ACP countries and for what commodities; along with regulatory requirements of health and safety standards for specific commodities.

"Any such data analysis on which to base our negotiating positions must draw on support of the private sector who are mainly the exporters, in collaboration with commercial representations in the UK." Gomes said.

He said such a strategy will require coordination of efforts at national levels and in the regional organizations, in this case CARICOM and CARIFORUM along with parliamentary representatives.

"The latter will be encouraged to invite their counterparts to raise questions in the UK Parliament pointing to the importance and value of trade in goods and services between the ACP countries and UK," he added.

Gomes said while the waiting period of formal notification to the EU by the UK and subsequent negotiations proceed, the ACP Group will pursue a positive approach that will seek to strengthen mutually beneficial relations with both the EU and the UK.

The implication of Brexit on the Caribbean — more than 50 years after independence — is already being diagnosed with varying predictions of negatives and positives to the region's economies

A few things are certain — sovereignty is never permanent, humans are unpredictable and change is constant.


