City Council passes Williams' Use of Force bill

New York City Council last Thursday passed Council Mem-Force bill that requires that a vote of 40-4. the New York Police Department (NYPD) issue quarterly reports on the use of force and their relationship to quality of

life offenses.

death of Eric Garner in 2014.

Jamaica, Trinidad & Tobago move to sort out problems

For years Jamaica and Trinidad have had serious differences over how free trade in the single trading market is supposed to work with Jamaica mostly always accusing Trinidad of unfair trading competi-

But in recent months, the issue has boiled over for a very different reason — a reason so bizarre says government and private sector officials in Jamai-

ca that it has forced Trinidadian Prime Minister Keith Rowley to spend a full week in Jamaica assuring islanders that all will be well after he returns home.

At center of the latest reason for a quarrel between two of the more influential members of the 15-nation group is the growing feeling in Kingston that immigration and government officials in Trinidad are so biased against ordinary Jamai-

Prizefighter Clive Atwell knelt before the altar of Safe Harbor Ministries in Jamaica, Queens last Sunday, July 17, as Pastor Jean Kissoon placed her hands on his head and prayed for his recovery, saying because of God's grace, the boxer my not have to undergo the urgent surgery he said he urgently needs.

Atwell, himself a preacher in his rural Agricola village church in Guyana, is not only in need of much prayer, he is also keeping the faith that he would reach his financial goal of \$25,000, necessary for his second brain surgery.

To this end, humanitarian, and businessman Tony Singh who read a Caribbean Life article written by this reporter, invited the fighter to church to pray, and to help the Guyanese hero.

Singh teamed up with Pastor Jean Kissoon who blessed Atwell at the morning service of healing, after which, Singh donated a check for \$1,000.00, and then passed around a collection plate that added an extra \$450.00, to help the champ on his way to recovery.

Singh told the congregation that he had never met the boxer before, but was touched by his plight.

"I immediately called Tangerine, after reading her story, and inquired how I could support Mr. Atwell, because when people are in desperate need we must show kindness, and I wanted to be first to help him with his medical expenses," said the founder of Calvary's Mission Food Pantry, in Queens.

Williams hails Nelson Mandela International Day

As the world on Monday celebrated Nelson Mandela International Day, a Grenadian American legislator here has paid tribute to the late South African president whom he said had an "unwavering devotion for human rights, peace and social justice."

New York City Council Member Jumaane Williams said that Mandela's devotion was not only to those within his own nation but for all people around the globe.

"In celebrating Nelson Mandela International Day, we want to recognize a political pioneer, who fought effortlessly to encourage people to pledge their time and effort in restoring and rebuilding their communities," said Williams, representative for the predominantly Caribbean 45th Council District in Brooklyn.

"Nelson Mandela's legacy serves as inspiration to those who follow in his footsteps, and is a true testament for what he set to accomplish – equality for all," added Williams, deputy leader and co-chair of the New York City Council's Task Force to Combat Gun Violence.

He noted that, during Mandela's campaign for peace and equality, Mandela also known as Madiba (used as a sign of respect and endearment) received over 250 merits, including the Noble Peace Prize in 1993 "for his continued efforts in terminating apartheid."

Williams said Mandela had challenged people to use their knowledge and education to battle prejudice, racism, violence and human suffering.

"It deepens me with sadness that we are still battling some of the same troubles that he fought to overcome." Williams said. "But what's more disheartening is the widespread epidemic that we are being confronted with now, which is the senseless killings of Black and Brown men at the hands of police

'We are also confronted with the harm we inflict on our own communities," he added, stating that, over the weekend, there were two shootings in

Williams said these incidents of gun violence "speak to the gun violence epidemic that is spreading across the country, and infiltrating our neighbor-

"We cannot in good conscience condemn injustices inflicted on the community without also taking a hard look at what we can do ourselves to strengthen our neighborhoods and stop bloodshed," Williams said.

With the recent killings of two Black men by police — Alton Sterling in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and Philando

 Williams said it is his "sincere hope that we start to carry forward Mandela's ideology of unity so that his mission remains prolific.

"I call on everyone to adopt the spirit of love, and not see the injustices being committed against Black and Brown communities, as a reason to retaliate or spread hate," he said.

At the same time, Williams said his 'heart goes out to the five officers in Dallas, Texas and the three officers in Baton Rouge, who lost their lives," in recent shootings.

'Targeting and attacking police officers is not the answer," he said. "We can all agree that now is not the time to lose faith in change; but, instead, we should continue to mirror Mandela's perseverance, and celebrate a hero by continuing the efforts in being great humanitarians."

United Nations officials and UN Peace Ambassador Stevie Wonder on Monday paid tribute to the South African activist and peacemaker's tireless efforts to end intolerance and injustice, calling Castile of Falcon Heights, Minnesota on the international community to fol-

low his guiding example in efforts to build a better world for all.

"Nelson Mandela International Day is an opportunity to reflect on the life and work of a legend who embodied the highest values of the United Nations,' said UN Deputy Secretary-General Jan Eliasson at a meeting of the General Assembly at UN Headquarters in New York to mark the Day, which is observed annually on July 18.

"Today, we remember a man of quiet dignity and towering achievement who worked tirelessly for peace and human dignity," he added, delivering the message on behalf of UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, who is currently in South Africa for the International AIDS Conference and who marked the Day in Durban.

The UN Deputy Secretary-General emphasized that, as the UN sets out to implement the newly adopted 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, Member States should seek to continue building on Mandela's legacy of selflessness and deep sense of shared purpose.

THE NEWS FROM BACK HOME

Antigua

Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ambassador Colin Murdoch said that the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) has yet to agree on a policy that will enable a skilled national to travel with a spouse, child, or other dependent to the respective territories.

He said while there is an agreement on the free movement of skilled

nationals, there is no arrangement or understanding about contingent rights.



Ambassador Murdoch said no person

coming to Antigua & Barbuda from any CARICOM country has any right to bring any dependent.

He stated that these issues are under discussion at CARICOM and there is to be a protocol on contingent rights, but these are not yet agreed.

The ambassador noted that discussions are also going on as to who can be classified as a dependent.

He also pointed to another glitch within the free regime as it relates to the categories of persons allowed to move freely.

According to Murdoch, there are about 11 categories of skilled nationals who are authorized to move freely within the CARICOM single market.

But he said, not all member states have signed off on all 11, thus creating a kind of "confusion" within the system.

Barbados

Secretary General of the Caribbean Tourism Organization (CTO) Hugh Riley said Barbados and the rest of the Caribbean remain safe for tourists.

He said safety and security remained an area that official were always focused on addressing, adding



that the region was "still to see by the people who send our visitors here to be a safer place."

Riley said there is no crime free place on the planet, so there are always going to be efforts to make sure the borders are secure.

"When you look around of some of what is happening around the world, it might not shock you to know that the Caribbean is seen as a place to come to and relax," when he announced that Barbados would host the State of the Industry Conference at the Hilton Barbados Resort from Sept. 14-16.

The CTO secretary general said this

will be the third time the event will be held in Barbados following successful staging in 2000 and 2010.

Riley said among other topics to be discussed at the high level three-day conference are issues relating to security, the aviation industry, religious tourism, emerging markets and the menacing Sargassum weed.

Grenada

Grenada has called for a wider approach to battle the mosquito-borne Zika virus.

Health Minister Nicholas Steele said an increase in suspected and confirmed cases of the virus, the situation is challenging.



He has called for an emergency meeting of health ministers to discuss the situation, saying the matter is bigger than any one country can handle regionally.

To date there has been nine confirmed cases of Zika in Grenada while 30 are suspected.

The health minister said that based on scientific evidence, the re-emergence of mosquito-borne diseases such as Zika, yellow fever and chikungunya are direct consequence of climate change.

Over the past few weeks, doctors at several health facilities have reported an increase in persons with symptoms of chikungunya and Zika on the island.

Guyana

Guyana has vowed to save two million hectares (4.9 million acres) of forested land so it can comply with international conservation treaties.

This was disclosed by Natural

Resources Minister Raphael Trotman who said Cabinet took a decision to preserve forests that will ensure



that Guyana complies with the United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity and conserve 17 percent of its land by 2020.

Trotman said that 8.3 percent of Guyana's land is conserved now and another two million hectares would bring the percentage of protected land to 17 percent.

In 2009, Norway promised to give Guyana a US\$250 million grant to encourage it to protect its rainforests.

Guyana lost US\$20 million of that

can folk that there are either harassed at ports of entry or denied landing altogether.

Earlier this year, Trinidadian authorities turned away a group of more than 12 Jamaicans, most of them women, saying they have given insufficient reasons for visiting the island.

The incident sparked a furor in Jamaica with the umbrella Private Sector Commission jumping to the side of those rejected and saying that the time had come to boycott export products from Trinidad.

Weeks after that, Jamaica formally placed the issue of unfair trade and impediments to free travel within the region on the plate of the trade ministers conference and later took it to the just-concluded regional leaders summit in Guyana, taking up significant portions of debate time at the meeting.

Jamaican government officials say they think they have detected a pattern against Jamaicans and decided that the time had come to do something about it, joining in stinging criticism against Port of Spain, the Trinidad & Tobago capital.

For Rowley who was elected prime

minister back in September, the constant negative barrage against the island and its peoples was just too much to bear, so he decided to make a full official visit to Jamaica, complete with a red carpet welcome, a 21-gun salute and all the pomp and ceremonies associated with a visiting head of state or government.

By mid week, tensions had clearly died down after Rowley and Trinidadian delegation members had held several rounds of talks with Jamaican government and private sector officials, dealing with the trade and immigration issues. Smiles, platitudes and handshakes replaced the stinging rhetoric of recent weeks.

on the use of force when it comes to offenses such as those alleged to have been committed by Mr. Garner," Williams said. "This bill will shed light on the basis for police officers approaching, or engaging in a police interaction with a New Yorker."

Intro. 606 was passed alongside two other bills that address use of force incidents in the police department.

Intro. 539, sponsored by Council Member Rory Lancman, requires the NYPD to provide a quarterly report on the number of use of force incidents disaggregated by type of force used, precinct or unit of the officer that used force, and whether the officer was on or off duty when the force was used.

In addition, the bill would require the department to report on the number of injuries to an officer or civilian resulting from a police and civilian interaction involving a use of force incident, and the severity of those injuries.

The NYPD would also be required to annually provide a report on the uses of force found to be excessive by the department.

Williams said these excessive uses of force would be disaggregated by type of force used, including whether a firearm was used; precinct to which such officer was assigned; whether

such officer was on duty; and the outcome of any departmental charges brought against such officer

Intro. 0824, sponsored by Council Member Deborah Rose, requires the NYPD to post an annual report of the total number and percentage of officers in each precinct that have two or more substantiated Civilian Complaint Review Board complaints in the last three calendar years; have been the subject of an Internal Affairs Bureau investigation that resulted in a suspension in the last five years; and used excessive force in the last three years.

"When combined with legislation by Council Members Lancman and Rose, we'll get further information on overall use of force, along with additional reporting on the location of officers, who have received the highest number of civilian complaints," Williams said.

"We will also be able to identify officers who are frequently named in civil action lawsuits because of alleged police brutality," he added.

"It is my hope that as we move toward improved police-community relations, the data gleaned from these new reports will help us understand overall use of force guidelines, including their relation to quality of life offenses, and open up opportunities to deescalate altercations where at all possible," Williams continued.



Rastafarians celebrate 'one love' to Selassie I

July 23 marks the 124th anniversary of the birth of Ethiopian Emperor Haile Selassie 1, the spiritual leader of the Rastafarian movement. And while the date will be recalled with reverence and acknowledgement by many throughout the world, the Black king from the east who distinguished his native Ethiopia by alluding enslavement of his people from Italian powers and in the process fomented African pride has been regaled through all 2016 seasons.

Earlier this spring, Jamaica recalled the April 21, 1966 visit of the revered Rastafarian messiah with island-wide commemoration of the historic journey to the Caribbean.

Now known as Grounation 1st time an African king had touched ground in Jamaica) -the date marked a significant milestone for the Rastafarian movement. The visit manifested 36 years after HIM's coronation but that an African king would visit the tiny, independent nation also held

sway for braggadocio there.

For the 50th anniversary of the historic four-day visit, the king's grandson Prince Ermias Sahle Selassie returned to the Caribbean island that poured royally an immeasurable welcome even the king had not imagined.

Greeted by Olivia "Babsy" Grange, minister of culture and Mike Henry, the longest serving Parliamentarian in the cabinet with 30 years of unbroken service to government, an equally imposing reception — but not quite as overwhelming a welcome party as the one his grandfather received - the prince witnessed thousands that converged on the Kingston airport this past spring.

US elections cry out for reform!

COPENHAGEN, July 14, 2016 (IPS) - As many observers around the world have pointed out, the United States is no longer a true democracy. It is an oligarchy.

The U.S. government ignores the safety, wishes and needs of the majority of its citizens, and instead makes decisions which will bring profit to enormous corporations, or satisfy the wishes of powerful lobbies.

Governmental secrecy occurs in many nations, but in the United States it has assumed huge proportions.

As Edward Snowden's revelations have shown, the number of people with security clearance (i.e. the number involved in secret operations in the US) is now as large as the entire population of Norway.

Furthermore, trade deals. which threaten both the global environment and the jobs of millions of American citizens, have been negotiated in secret. If people have no knowledge of what their government is doing, how can they exert the control that the word democracy implies?

It is ironic that the United States justifies aggressive wars for regime change by saying that it is "bringing democracy" to various countries. In fact, its own government is not a democracy.

Author John Atcheson has given the following examples of the fact that the will of American citizens no longer influences the decisions of their government:

"When 91 percent wanted to strengthen rules on clean air and protection of drinking water, Congress, led by the Republican majority, proposed to weaken them."

"When 90 percent wanted to

protect public lands and parks, the Republicans proposed putting them on sale or otherwise privatizing them"

"When 74 percent of Americans favored ending subsidies to big oil, Congress retained most of them."

"When 70 percent of Americans said climate change should be a high priority, Congress took no action."

Atcheson gives a number of other examples. Read his full article

According to a recent poll, 91 per cent of American citizens are dissatisfied with their electoral system. Its faults have become glaringly apparent this year, when the presumptive candidates for the two major parties, Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump, are both heartily disliked by most of the voters.

The most dangerous feature of Trump's candidacy is his denial of climate change. If he should be elected, all hope of avoiding catastrophic climate change may be lost. But Hillary Clinton is dangerous too, since her record shows that she is in favour of war.

At present, U.S. policy risks an all-destroying thermonuclear war by provoking both Russia and China. This would continue under Clinton.

How can we get money out of our elections? How can we restore democracy? The reversal of Citizens United would be a vital first step.

Other steps could be de-lelgitimising lobbies, and a law to make networks give equal free broadcasting time to all major candidates.

In 2016 voters are faced with a dilemma. Very many of them would like to vote for Bernie Sanders, but they are afraid that if they do so, Trump will be elected.

There is, in fact a simple voting system in which such a dilemma would not occur: ranked choice voting.

Celebrating Jean-Michel Basquiat's life and work

By Tequila Minsky

A non-descript two-story building in NoHo, the area between the East and West Village, is covered with paste and stencil art. An anomaly to a gentrifying East Village, this building at 57 Great Jones Streets, a symbol of a bygone era, was the site where painter, collagist and musician Jean-Michel Basquiat lived and created work for five years until his death in 1988.

Last week, the Greenwich Village Society for Historic Preservation (GVSHP) honored Basquiat by installing a historic plaque at the doorway of the site of his work / residence.

The Jean Michel-Basquiat (1960-1988) plaque reads: "From 1983 to 1988 renowned artist Jean Michel-Basquiat lived and worked here, a former stable owned by friend and mentor Andy Warhol. Baquiat's paintings and other work challenged established notions of high and low art, race and class, while forging a visionary

language that defied characterization."

The artist joins other creatives who lived or worked in this part of Manhattan and are likewise recognized. Writer James Baldwin — his home, and dancer and teacher Martha Graham, her rehearsal space was in the Village, are also honored through the historic plaque program, co-sponsored by GVSHP and Two Boots.

Basquiat was the son of a Haitian father and a Puerto Rican mother. This innovative artist born in Brooklyn melded his urban American experience with his African-Caribbean heritage. He first achieved notoriety as part of the graffiti duo SAMO. By the 1980s he was exhibiting his work, a mixture of text, abstraction, figures, and historical information mixed with social commentary. Basquiat died of a heroin overdose at the age of

In 2005, the Brooklyn Museum mounted a major exhibition of his work and in 2015, the Museum exhibited the artist's notebooks filled with poetry fragments, wordplay, sketches, and personal observations ranging from street life and popular culture to themes of race, class, and world history.

In May of this year, an untitled painting by Basquiat broke the artist's world auction record and sold for \$57.3 million at Christie's.

At the plaque unveiling last week, the artist's friend from that era Michael Holman called

Basquiat an alchemist whose talent was the transformation of materials.

Ayanna Legros reminded those at the dedication that Basquiat created more than 2,000 images with subject matters of slavery, colonialism, rape, religion, gender and the Diaspora. "He pushed boundaries and it made (some) people uncomfortable," she said. "This plaque serves as a reminder for us to think about legacy. Basquiat was aware that he lived in a world of contradictions that operate on prejudices. He managed to make

himself one of the most recognized American painters of the century."

Haitian-American Legros, along with her graduate studies at NYU, immersed herself in the life and impact of Jean-Michel Basquiat and co-founded the Basquiat Still Fly at 55 Project, dedicated to explore the artist's life, legacy and the impact on African Diasporic communities across the globe.

She concluded in her remarks, "He figured out how to navigate an art world that wasn't prepared for his messages."

Vincentian prime minister chairs CARICOM cricket committee

St. Vincent and the Grenadines Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves has been appointed to chair the CARICOM committee to look into the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) issue of governance and reform.

This was disclosed by Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley at a news conference at the VIP lounge at Piarco International Airport after his arrival from a CARICOM meeting in Guyana recently.

Rowley said at the last CARICOM meeting, there was consensus from the heads that the report of the Dr Eudine Barriteauled review panel should be accepted in its entirety — a move that was subsequently opposed by the WICB.

He said there were two committees — one on governance and another on governance and reform.

The T&T prime minister said Grenada's Prime Minister Dr. Keith Mitchell who headed the committee on reform has retired from the position.

Rowley said the heads of government agreed to the merging of both committees to treat with all aspects of West Indies cricket to be chaired by Gonsalves and with designated members from

He said two legal opinions were sought on the WICB issue — one from the CARICOM secretariat and the other from an independent senior counsel, who advised that "we cannot force the West Indies Cricket Board to cooperate."

Atwell further stated that he felt disappoint-ed that neither the previous, or current Guyana mumbness in his et, while experiencg constant pain in his ody and head. He also





Forum on homelessness among Black gay youth

Inclusive religious leaders are hosting a forum to address homelessness among minority gay youth in New York City. The event will take place on July 27 at the Metropolitan Health Center, located at 1901 1st Ave. in Manhattan at 6:30 pm.

The Citywide Coalition of Clergy and Allies of LGBTQI Youth will host, "The Wall of Silence in our Black Community: The Plight of Homeless Gay Youth." Organizers took a year to plan the first time event, which they hope to discuss homelessness in the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBT) communities of color. The goal is to bring people of different religious faiths to talk about the crises of homelessness among youth of color, said an organizer.

"It's the first time I know of such forum. We don't know what the audience will be. We're doing

our best to attract as many as we can," said Dr. Wilhelmina Perry, member of LGBT Faith Leaders of African Descent. "We hope the presence of the clergy will attract people of faith."

The event will have a panel discussion with various LGBT organizations present, and panelists will discuss the root causes of homelessness, and how religion plays a part. Panelists hope to achieve this by presenting statistics and by presenting their diversity to fellow parishioners. Perry hopes to put an end to the stigma of homosexuality in the church.

"We want to bring people together to look at what the

bible teaches and what it does not," said Dr. Perry. "We come from various denominations — Quaker, Buddhist, Pentecostal, Baptists — we came together to reach people through a variety of goals, and one of those goals is education."

In New York City, there is an estimated 4000-6000 homeless youth, and close to half of them are LGBT, with young Blacks and Latinos accounting for most, according to Perry.

"What we hope is a real acknowledgement of the problem in the community, what comes out of it, and talk about solutions and responsibility," said Dr. Perry.

Guyanese expats ineligible for old age pension

Unless Guyanese living abroad decides to repatriate, they would not be entitled to Old Age Pension under a new measure that the Guyana government has recently put in place. This is according to Minister of Social Protection, Volda Lawrence who clarified after a firestorm by Guvanese at the announcement, that persons will only be eligible for Old Age Pension if they satisfy the age, citizenry, and residency requirements.

Minister Lawrence, further made clear, that Old Age Pension of which she refers, is not an entitlement from employment such as Government Pension or National Insurance Scheme (NIS) Pension, but instead a monthly payment given to eligible Guyanese who have reached the age of 65.

Some 8,000 Guyanese living outside of Guyana are benefitting from the monthly old age pension payments, said Minister Lawrence, who stated that expatriates are

"double dipping" adding that the overseas-based Guyanese would return home yearly to get the benefit of which they are ineligible, short-changing those at home who need the pension money.

Social media and news outlets in Guyana blew up with negative comments, because many Guyanese were not clear as to which Old Age Pension the minister was referring, since thousands of expatriates receive National Insurance Scheme and Government Pensions, and were outraged that the government was taking away their entitlement.

However, Minister Lawrence clearly outlined the benefit, stating that a pensioner must satisfy the proper authority, and have been a citizen of Guyana for at least 10 years immediately preceding claim for pension.

In addition, this pensioner must have being residing in Guyana during the 20 years immediately preceding his or her claim for pension.

funding because it increased deforestation in 2012.

Jamaica

Commonwealth-Secretary General Baroness Patricia Scotland says that the rising incidence of serious crimes among young people in Jamaica is not unique to the island and that the best way to address the situation is to reduce the exposure of children to abusive circumstances.

She said crime is a globalized problem where young men feel dissociated, underemployed, and misdirected, is not unfortunately, an isolated issue, she told young people at a town hall meeting at the University of the West Indies (UWI) regional headquarters in the parish of St. Andrew, recently.

Scotland, the first female head of the Commonwealth Secretariat, was in Jamaica recently to launch the Commonwealth collaboration on youth leadership with UWI and Common Purpose, a development charity.

She explained that domestic violence featured largely in offenders' lives prior to committing crimes was based on analysis of cases brought before her while she served as minister of state for

Criminal Justice and Law Reform with specific responsibility for offender management and youth justice from 2003-2007 in the United Kingdom.



She said the greatest issue among violent crimes was domestic violence, which accounted for 25 percent of all violent crimes. It killed 120 women every year — that was two or three women every single week by their partner or their ex-partner.

The Dominican-born said that the grim statistics delineate a picture of the oppressive, parasitic qualities of domestic abuse on those exposed to it and urged that better care be taken when rearing children.

St. Lucia

St. Lucia's Prime Minister Allen Chastanet has called for drastic changes in the regional airline, LIAT.

He emphasized the importance of transportation to the regional integra-

tion movement, saying regional airline LIAT should be liberalized.



Chastanent, who was attending his first

CARICOM heads of government meeting which was held in Guyana, told reporters, the cash-strapped airline needs to operate in the context of the private sector.

The major shareholders of the airline are Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, and St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

The airline, which has been suffering losses over the years, has come under heavy criticism from the traveling public over poor customer

service, delayed and canceled flights and overall high costs of air fares to its destinations.

Chastanet said transportation is critical to integration and LIAT needs to be liberalized and that the airline needs to operate in the context of the private sector.

The Ministry of Agriculture recently held a two-day Monkey Summit conference to deal with the green vervet monkey which is posing a significant threat to farmers on the island.

The conference was held in conjunction with a technical team from Colombia.

In a statement the Ministry said: "The popular green vervet monkey con-

tinues to be a menace in wreaking havoc on crops, resulting in great economic loss to farmers, they have also been



troublesome at resorts, residential areas and urban districts. It is against this backdrop that the government of St. Kitts and Nevis is aiming to bring about effective solutions to address the problems associated with moneys."

The plenary sessions of the summit covered areas such as research institutions and work with primates; farming perspectives and viewpoint and work from hotel and tourism vantage point.

Discussions also surrounded initiatives involving monkeys, such as education tourism and the establishment of wildlife theme parks.

The green vervet monkeys, which are popular with tourists, are also used in research such as Parkinson's disease at the St. Kitts Biomedical Research Facility.

Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago will soon set up an Embassy in Abu Dabhi, Dubai.

This was disclosed by Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley who said that Cabinet has decided to close its mission in Uganda and establish an embassy in the Middle East.

He also said that a high commission will also be re-established in Barbados to serve the countries in the Eastern Caribbean.

He said Cabinet agreed to the closure of "our mission in




Uganda, given the history of this location and the changes in international profile and where we want to be at this time, we came to the conclusion that Uganda was not the best location to be on that part of the world."

He noted that given the importance of the Middle East in today's world as it relates to finance, business, energy etc. Trinidad and Tobago will be better served with a mission in the Emirates that will serve the surroundings from there.

Guyanese surgeon wants to give back at home

Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon, Dr. Horace Griffith, is hopeful that with this new Guyana government in place, he would get an opportunity to return to his homeland to made a significant contribution, doing what he is passionate about — performing reconstructive surgery to help patients live a normal life.

Because of the type of oral care he received while growing up in Guyana, Dr. Griffith wanted to give back to his country after becoming a surgeon, but said his requests met resistance from the previous government. However, he sees a new opportunity to realize his dream to share his skills in his homeland.

Based in St. Thomas in the United States Virgin Islands, Dr. Griffith, a Howard University educated dentist said he is determine to give back to his birthplace. Since speaking with new Minister of Health, Dr. George Norton, to whom

he expressed his thoughts as to how he could help the Guyanese people, he is optimistic that he will would receive that important call to begin his tour of duty in the Republic.

Dr. Griffith told this reporter after receiving the Twenty-First Century Leadership Now Award during Guyana's 50th Independence Jubilee in Georgetown, recently, that after completing his high school education he moved to the U.S at 18 years old with a vision to become a dentist, simply because it was difficult to get professional dental care in general while growing up in Guyana.

"This was the impetus for me becoming a dentist, and I went on to become a surgeon, the highest in the field of dentistry, because I felt compelled to pursue this particular career to give back. I am at the top of the ladder in dentistry and it is exciting," explained Dr. Griffith.

with new Minister of Health, "I like the thrill that I get, Dr. George Norton, to whom yes, I am helping a patient

recover from an infection, or a gun-shot to the face that needs reconstructive surgery so that they could return to some semblance of normalcy to function in public. This is exciting to me, and a great way to made a difference."

In addition to performing cleft palate surgery during medical mission to Africa, Dr. Griffith has worked tirelessly throughout the Caribbean in countries such as Antigua, Dominica, the British Virgin Islands, and earthquake-ravished Haiti where he performed surgeries to repair deformities of the jaw, face, and cleft lip, working in poor and medically underserved communities.

One of his passions is to ensure that his patients are comfortable whenever he has to perform surgery, and especially in cases where parents in the past in Guyana, and even now, use a dentist visit as a scare tactic to discipline their children.

"Parents use going to the dentist as a benchmark for pun-

ishment, and this had gone from one generation to the next, but this is changing now because we medicate patients to sup-

press anxiety," assured Dr. Griffith, whose practice administers "laughing gas" or medication to relax a patient.

Hundreds pay tribute to Vincentian teacher

Hundreds of Vincentian and other Caribbean nationals on Friday, July 8 paid their last respect to Barbara DeFreitas, a militant in the St. Vincent and the Grenadines teachers' struggles in the mid-to-late 1970s and early 1980s, who died on June 23. She was 69.

Mourners at a funeral service, at the Episcopal (Anglican) Church of St. Mark, on Brooklyn Avenue in Brooklyn, described DeFreitas, who taught public and private schools for most of her life, among other superlatives, as compassionate, caring, generous, loving, extremely spiritual, humorous, talkative and outspoken.

The Rev. Dillon Burgin, a former Methodist Church minister at home and an erstwhile United Methodist Church pastor in New York, noted that DeFreitas was closely related to Prime Minister Dr. Ralph E. Gonsalves and Jennifer Eustace, wife of Opposition Leader

Arnhim Eustace.

"If you get to talk about politics in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, she [DeFreitas] talked about politics from both sides [government and opposition]," said Rev. Burgin. "Barbara knew Jesus, and she knew how to converse with Jesus.

Candis Hope said she met DeFreitas 30 years ago.

"We're going to miss her," she said. "We will always remember

the type of person she was. She was the life of the party."

Shanell Davis said she had formed a bond with DeFreitas.

"It was such a joy to meet her," she said. "We had such a bond. I grew to embrace her. She always had optimism – this beautiful life."

Retired Guyanese-born educator George Davson said he and DeFreitas taught at P.S. [Public School] 92 in Brooklyn.

"She was a good friend, a family friend," he said. "Barbara was very outspoken.

"We would be on the phone for 20 minutes; it was a monologue — not a dialogue [laughter]," he added, disclosing that he had the responsibility of taking care of DeFreitas' plants when she was out of town. "I think she's in a better place."

In his eulogy, Pastor Cecil Durrant, the Vincentian-born pastor of Bethany Deliverance Church of God on Rodgers Avenue in Brooklyn, said DeFreitas was "a lady that would talk.

"The things that we spoke, I can't discuss with you," he told mourners.

The Rev. Denzil I.G. Hinds, who officiated at the two-hour-long funeral service, said DeFreitas "once taught" at the church's school.

"We will remember her," he said. "She's certainly going to Heaven."

Guyanese Serah Barrington, principal emeritus at Bethany Epiphany Lutheran School on Lincoln Place in Brooklyn, said she and DeFreitas taught there together as well.

"She shared so much," said Barrington, disclosing that she and DeFreitas had planned to conduct a mission to St. Vincent and the Grenadines next year.

In reading the obituary, Joyce Lewis-Cordice, who taught school with DeFreitas in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, said DeFreitas was born on Feb. 3, 1947 in the village of Bellvue on the eastern coast of mainland St. Vincent.

DeFreitas, a former teacher at the then Kingstown Methodist School, migrated to New York in the 1980s, "where she pursued studies in education, earning an undergrad [undergraduate] and master's degree, while continuing her teaching career," Lewis-Cordice said.



Founded in 1996 by the late Dr. Mary Umolu, the Medgar Evers College Jazzy Jazz Festival, sponsored by the Department of Mass Communications, Creative and Performing Arts and Speech, is celebrating its 20th year of free concerts to the Crown Heights and surrounding communities.

The journey of Kevin Powell

You never knew what you didn't have.

There were times in your childhood when cereal was supper because there was nothing else. When birthday toys seemed gently pre-loved, handme-downs were new to you, and vou were none the wiser. Your family didn't have much and you never realized it then but in the book "The Education of Kevin Powell" by Kevin Powell, getting schooled later was rough.

Born in the spring of 1966, Kevin Powell entered the world and, though his mother had moved to Jersey City from "Down South" to escape it, slid directly into poverty. They shared a ratand-roach-infested apartment with Powell's aunt and her son, and their us-against-the-world closeness was "something safe, something magical..."

At age four, Powell "did not

know what the word 'drunk' meant," but he learned at a party, and was beaten by his mother for getting drunk-sick. At age six, his grandfather died, but although Powell barely knew the man, he understood that he was a wife-beater. At 13, he impulsively joined a fight and lost his cousin, who angrily shunned Powell for the rest of their lives.

As he grew and matured, Powell began to realize that his family was poor. His home turf was bleak and there were times when it seemed like a dead-end, but his mother told him that he needed an education to become something. She'd never hugged him. He received no physical

affection from her; in fact, she beat him regularly. She said he wasn't "gonna make it." but she got him a library card anyway. Books opened up his world, he hungered to read, and he decided that he wanted to be a writer.


But then life intervened.

Powell went to college, but his temper got him into trouble time and again. He joined a mosque, but left it just as quickly. He'd learned to hate White people, and that got him into trouble, too. He found success in the entertainment world, but he started to drink and commit petty crimes; he hit bottom, then hit it again... until a search for his lost past gave him what he needed.

Imagine, if you will, that you're in the ring with a prowrestler.

He picks you up, and slams you to the mat. Then he does it again. And again. That's what it's like to read "The Education of Kevin Powell": a series of literary body-slams, over and over and over.

Part of that effect comes from Powell's style: there are times when he pulls out a sense





In his statement, Samuels said he has no criminal record nor has been the subject of any criminal investigations.

He said the comments were published and aired with the absence of conducting proper journalist research nor was he contacted to give his views on the damaging remarks about his character.

tally-focused and not be overwhelmed by the opportunity," added Valentine-Parris, who is one of two Vincentian track stars selected to compete in the Olympics, which spans from Aug.

Valentine-Parris — who was the lead athlete when the Thomas Saunders Secondary School (TSSS) first competed in the Penn Relays at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia in 2011 — will represent the nation, along with Kineke Alexander, in the 400m in the Rio Games.

"At first, the excitement did not hit me right when I was told," said Valentine-Parris, who is on an athletic scholarship at Claflin University in Orangeburg, S.C.

"I am extremely excited and grateful [to be] given the opportunity," added the track standout. "I am also humbled and honored. It really does mean a lot being the first athlete from my school and the first in my family to compete at these games.

"I am working hard but smart, and doing my best to prepare myself," Valentine-Parris continued. "I am looking to cut my times down before heading to the Olympics."

He earned the spot on the St. Vincent and the Grenadines' Olympic team through an invitation from the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) for achieving the country's best time (46.11 sec.) in the 400m., according to Claflin University.

In competing in the 2nd Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) track and field championships in the British Virgin Islands (BVI) late last month, Valentine-Parris said, while he did not win, he was "pleased that I found myself again."

He said he placed third in the men's 400m in 46.77 sec. and fifth in the men's 200m in 21.15 sec., adding that "the joy of the day was being a part of the winning 4x400m relay team.

"At the end of the OECS meet, I was informed that I was selected to represent St. Vincent and the Grenadines at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro," Valentine-Parris said.

"Being a part of my country's Olympic team - it hasn't hit me vet." he added. "I'm sure, when I get to Rio, everything will set in. "It's a great accomplishment to make the Olympic team and a great opportunity for me to get the experience I need to continue to be successful in my career."

Claflin University said Valentine-Parris had a "breakout season" during his sophomore campaign for the school's athletic team, known as the Claflin Panthers.

During the 2016 indoor season, he placed third in the 400m at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II Indoor Track and Field Championships in Pittsburg, Kan. to earn the All-American Status.






