PORTIA SIGNALS CHANGE

New era in Jamaican politics set to begin nest year

The Jamaican political landscape is bracing for yet another major changing of the guard because the island's first woman prime minister and opposition leader is about to step down, opening the way for a protracted fight among the party's top brass to replace her.

Portia Simpson Miller announced a few days ago that she plans to quit the presidency of the 78-year-old People's National Party (PNP), less than a year after her and the PNP narrowly lost general elections to perennial nemesis, the Jamaica Labor Party (JLP).

Never fully embraced by the

middle and upper echelons of Jamaica's highly class and color-conscious society, Simpson Miller survived fierce challenges to her leadership of the PNP during the 10 years she served as president.

She now appears to have bowed to the rising crescendo from the party and the Jamaican elite to call it quits and to By Martin Khor

Fighting crime requires community support

New York City is now a different and better place when compared to the nineties said the New York City Commissioner of Police, James P. O'Neil recently.

Commissioner O'Neil made these remarks while delivering the featured address at the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce, business and community meeting at Tamdon School of Engineers, NYU, Downtown Brooklyn, on Tuesday, Dec. 6. O'Neil in his opening remarks highlighted the long and hard efforts of the New York City Police Force working to fight crime. He said the police department did not give up and as a result the city has seen a reduction in crime. Commissioner O'Neil said that for over the last 25 to 30 years, the New York Police Department battled the problem and today's decline is the result.

The Neighborhood Coordination Officers program implemented by the NYPD is another area for concentration for the department, he remarked. "This is a sure way to help fight crime in New York City," the commissioner added. "We have to evolve, otherwise we will not make the city better and safer." The commissioner said, although crime is down, 2016 is not the best the city has seen. "We were able to control fatal shooting and burglary is down. However, the community must get involved and know their precincts and their precinct commanders. As crime is a serious business, requiring the involvement of everyone," O'Neil stated.

On the issue of terrorism, O'Neil said the resources for counterterrorism are in place to combat violent incidents and engaging in community policing will keep the situation down, he noted. Commissioner O'Neil asked New York City residents to reach out to the police even by saying "hello," he added. "If you see something say it, report it so we can investigate, if you have video reveal them," he suggested.

Candle light vigil, \$50,000 reward for Guyanese correction officer's murder

Hundreds turned out last Monday night for a candlelight vigil, and called for justice for Guyanese-American Alastasia Bryan, a 25-year-old correction officer of the Anna M. Kross Center on Rikers Island, who was brutally murder in her car at the corner of 73rd Street and Avenue L, in the Flatlands section of Brooklyn.

Mother, Ingrid Bryan was comforted by Guyanese-born Senator Roxanne Persaud and Guyana Consul General, Barbara Atherly as the grieving mother, muttered "Alastsia was a wonderful daughter."

"My daughter doesn't do anything except comes and goes from work. Work was all she cared about," Bryan's mother told the Daily News at the crime scene on Sunday night.

Brooklyn Advocate Anthony Herbert said the city has failed the family of officer Bryan, and questioned why Mayor Bill De Blasio did not make a house call. "Is it because this family is from the Caribbean, or is it because they are black, that you did not show any respect by coming to see this family, Mr. Mayor," blasted Herbert

"At the end of the day they bleed red too, you have to show this community the same kind of respect. You need to check yourself. If you want to celebrate getting black votes, then come and see black people," added Herbert in a loud tone of voice.

"There is nothing more important than us standing behind correction officers, and this family, based on what has taken place. We are not going to speculate, we will let the police department do their investigation."

"We are going to stand behind this family and let them know they are not by themselves. Their daughter made the ultimate sacrifice doing her job in the community, and unfortunately, somebody took her life away," said Herbert, adding that, "a 25-year-old is no longer with us."

"We stand with law enforcement groups to say enough is enough with gun violence. You have to put these guns down. If you want to take a life, take your own, you took somebody's child off this planet," bellowed Herbert, giving respect to correction officers whom he said sacrifice their lives for the community.

The vocal community activist questioned crime statistics that states crime was on the decline in black communities, and blasted the city stating that Bryan should not have been killed.

US deports over 200 Haitians in last several weeks

The United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) says over 200 Haitians have been deported in the last several weeks, as the Obama administration has resumed deportation of Haitians living illegally in the country.

DHS Secretary Jeh Johnson said on Nov. 22 that the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency, which falls under DHS' jurisdiction, also "plans to significantly expand removal operations in the coming weeks."

But Johnson said Haitian nationals currently covered by Temporary Protected Status (TPS) are unaffected by the resumption of deportation to the French-speaking Caribbean country.

"Specifically, those Haitian nationals

who have been continuously residing in the United States since Jan. 12, 2011 and currently hold TPS may remain in the United States and are not subject to removal," he said in a statement. "These beneficiaries also remain eligible for employment authorization."

Johnson said TPS for Haitian nationals has been extended through July 22, 2017, adding, however, that "recently, we have seen an increase in the numbers of those apprehended on the southern border."

He said he has instructed border security and immigration enforcement personnel "to take steps to keep pace with this increase."

As a result, the DHS secretary said there are currently about 41,000 immigrants in United States immigration detention facilities, including over

4,400 Haitians. Typically, the number in immigration detention is about 31,000 to 34,000. he said.

"I have authorized ICE to acquire additional detention space so that those apprehended at the border and not eligible for humanitarian relief can be detained and sent home as soon as possible," Johnson said. "We must enforce the immigration laws consistent with our priorities.

"Those who attempt to enter our country illegally must know that, consistent with our laws and our values, we must and we will send you back," he affirmed.

Following the tragic earthquake that struck Haiti in January 2010, Johnson noted that ICE ceased deporting Haitians living illegally in the United States.

Caribbean

The United States Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is moving to increase airport safety and certification in the Caribbean region.

The FFA has introduced a new initiative, along with its Caribbean partners and International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), will also work to improve the region's air-traffic-flowmanagement activities and collaborative decision-making process.

The initiative will also help implement ICAO's guidelines across the

Caribbean, which is expected to witness five to six percent more air-traffic o0ver the next 20 years.



The FAA said more than 17 percent of international flights currently departing from the United States are headed for destinations in the Caribbean, while various other flights transit the Caribbean airspace between North and South America.

Anguilla

LIAT has cut it services to Anguilla and Nevis, weeks after airline executives announced that the carrier would have to discontinue unprofitable routes.

The executives said in a statement

issued recently that LIAT would not renew an arrangement with Caribbean Helicopters of Antigua, which facilitated airlift to the two small islands.



LIAT's Chief Commercial Officer, Lloyd Carswell said, "as we continue to pursue our relentless pursuit of operational efficiency and profitability, both us and our partner. Caribbean Helicopters, have decided not to extend the arrangement."

Bahamas

The Pan American Development Foundation (PADF) is launching a women's imitative for nonviolence in the Bahamas. The United States government is funding the project.

A 2015 report published by the ministry of social services and community

development noted that in the Bahamas Gender-based violence "constitutes a major public health issue."

Three Caribbean countries have among the highest recorded incidents of rape in the world — The Bahamas followed by St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Jamaica according to the report.

The Women's Initiative for Non-Violence and Development (WIND) seeks to improve the capacity



of law enforcement, the justice sector and communities to respond to and prevent gender-based violence in The Bahamas.

The initiative aims to raise awareness and share information and best practices among agencies in order to better address this issue.

PADF recently hosted four conferences around the United Nations' International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women.

This year's United Nations observance highlights the need for funding for initiatives that prevent and end genderbased violence.

Barbados

The Barbados government is instituting new border control technology at the Grantley Adams International Airport come next year to speed up the processing of arriving passengers.

Minister with responsibility for Immigration, Senator Darcy Boyce speaking at a citizenship induction ceremony recently assured immigration officers that the new technology would not threaten their jobs.

He revealed that 14 automated pass-

port control (APC) kiosks were being installed in the arrival hall and the 20 immigration counters currently in use would be maintained.

Boyce said the booths, which are expected to be operational from February 2017, will initially be available for use by Barbadians and persons with permanent status in Barbados.

The minister said passengers opting to use the booths would spend an estimated 90 seconds completing



the process. Officers would be on hand to assist anyone who needs it.

Boyce said that handling the administrative part of the inspection at the kiosks was expected to result in passengers being cleared four times faster than with the traditional process.

President Donald Trump? This is a hot issue, as Trump has made unorthodox pronouncements on trade issues during and after the election campaign. If he acts on even some of the positions he took, it will create a sea change in trade policy in the US and possibly the world.

Trump has recently emphasised that he will take the US out of the Trans Pacific Partnership Agreement (TPPA) on his first day of office, and renegotiate the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

He called them a disaster for the US. He was probably referring to the claim that many of manufacturing jobs lost in the US in recent years were due to free trade agreements (FTAs) and the overseas relocation of US companies. He is also probably blaming trade agreements for the US' huge trade deficits.

Most economists howev-

er have a different view. They attribute US job losses mainly to technological change.

There are legitimate fears that Trump's "Put America First" slogan, when applied to trade, will lead to an increase in trade protectionism.

Trump has threatened to raise tariffs on products from China and Mexico by as much as 45 percent. Trump in his campaign accused China of being a "currency manipulator." If a country is so labelled by the Treasury Department it could be grounds under US law to slap extra tariffs

on its products.

President Obama came under pressure from many Congress members and economists to do just that, but he smartly resisted as he realised it would trigger a very nasty trade war with China.

It is possible Trump will also climb down from this populist stance once he is president. For a start, China's currency is not under-valued and currently its government is trying to prevent (not encourage) its currency from further sliding.

Secondly, taking trade action

against China on currency grounds would be against the rules of WTO, and China should be able to successfully take a WTO case against the US for any such action.

Finally, China has warned it will retaliate if the US were to take protectionist actions. An article in the Beijing-based Global Times spelled out how the country would cancel its orders of Boeing aircraft, restrict US auto and I-phone sales in China and halt US soybean and maize imports, while a number of US industries would be impaired.

Clarke celebrates 92nd birthday of late Chisholm

Brooklyn Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke on Wednesday celebrated the 92nd birthday of the late Caribbean American Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm, the first Black woman and Caribbean American to enter the race for president of the United States.

"Today, we celebrate the 92nd birthday of my esteemed predecessor, the Honorable Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm. A woman proud of her Caribbean heritage and her membership in the renowned Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., her voice was a call to action in the Civil Rights Movement to insist that women must have an opportunity to assume positions of leadership," said Clarke who represents the 9th Congressional District in Brooklyn.

Chisholm, born in Brooklyn in 1924 to Barbadian and Guyanese parents, was renowned for becoming the first Black congresswoman (1968), representing the then 11th Congressional District in Brooklyn for seven, two-year terms. With redistricting, the 11th Congressional District has now become the 9th Congressional District.

In 1972, the out-spoken Chisholm, whose husband was Jamaican, was an activist who was elected to New York State Assembly in 1964. Chisholm broke many barriers as a

community advocate and legislator.

Clarke said Chisholm's achievements in the United States Congress were "extensive," listing, among her achievements, the establishment of nutrition assistance programs; expanded health services for parents and children; increases in the minimum wage; literacy training; the protection of the right to vote; support for veterans of the armed forces; and providing opportunities for women to succeed in college, graduate school, and collegiate and professional sports with the enactment of Title IX.

The United Nations says Caribbean countries were among more than 190 countries at a major conference in Mexico in pledging to step up efforts to integrate biodiversity into the policies of their forests, fisheries, tourism and agriculture sectors.

The UN said on Sunday that countries adopted the Cancun Declaration, named after the Mexican city where the 13th meeting of the Conference of the Parties to Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), known as "COP13," is being held.

"The Declaration represents an unprecedented recognition from the international community that biodiversity protection must involve different governmental and economic sectors and not just environment ministries," the UN said.

"The Cancun Declaration, and the powerful commitments made here at the High Level Segment send a strong signal that countries are ready to achieve the Aichi Targets,," said Braulio Ferreira de Souza Dias, Executive Secretary of the CBD, referring to the 20 biodiversity targets that Parties to the CBD are meant to achieve by 2020.

During the two-day High-Level Segment of the meeting known COP13, the UN said countries participated in roundtables discussing how the fisheries, tourism, forestry and agricultural sectors can take biodiversity into account and how they can contribute to its protection and conservation.

"For the first time, through the efforts of all parties, we are really speaking meaningfully to one another about the real value of biodiversity to tourism, to agriculture, to forestry, to fisheries – to the very lifeblood of our economies," said Erik Solheim, the Executive Director of the UN Environment Program (UNEP).

In addition to the Cancun Declaration, the UN said various countries announced on Saturday their own commitments to accelerate action to meet the Targets' deadline in less than four

Rethinking trade policy and protectionism in the Trump era

PENANG, Dec 5 2016 (IPS) What kind of trade policy will the United States have under President Donald Trump? This is a hot issue, as Trump has made unorthodox pronouncements on trade issues during and after the election campaign. If he acts on even some of the positions he took, it will create a sea change in trade policy in the US and possibly the world.

Trump has recently emphasised that he will take the US out of the Trans Pacific Partnership Agreement (TPPA) on his first day of office, and renegotiate the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

He called them a disaster for the US. He was probably referring to the claim that many of manufacturing jobs lost in the US in recent years were due to free trade agreements (FTAs) and the overseas relocation of US companies. He is also probably blaming trade agreements for the US' huge trade deficits.

Most economists however have a different view. They attribute US job losses mainly to technological change.

There are legitimate fears that Trump's "Put America First" slogan, when applied to trade, will lead to an increase in trade protectionism.

Trump has threatened to raise tariffs on products from China and Mexico by as much as 45 percent. Trump in his campaign accused China of being a "currency manipulator." If a country is so labelled by the Treasury Department it could be grounds under US law to slap extra tariffs on its products.

President Obama came under pressure from many Congress members and economists to do just that, but he smartly resisted as he realised it would trigger a very nasty trade war with China.

It is possible Trump will also climb down from this populist stance once he is president. For a start, China's currency is not under-valued and currently its government is trying to prevent (not encourage) its currency from further sliding.

Secondly, taking trade action against China on currency grounds would be against the rules of WTO, and China should be able to successfully take a WTO case against the US for any such action.

Finally, China has warned it will retaliate if the US were to take protectionist actions. An article in the Beijing-based Global Times spelled out how country would cancel its orders of Boeing aircraft, restrict US auto and I-phone sales in China and halt US soybean and maize imports,

in how the US (and eventually many other countries) will perceive free trade agreements.

while a number of US industries would be impaired.

But if an across-the-board tariff hike is out of the guestion, the Trump administration is likely to consider taking more trade-remedy action on a range of products from China and other countries by claiming they are being dumped or unfairly subsidised.

There are loopholes in the WTO rules on trade remedies which have made these a favourite protectionist tool. A country can slap on high tariffs against an imported good from another country by claiming its price is artificially low because it has been "dumped" (exported at a price lower than the domestic price) or unfairly subsidised by the state.

But if the exporting country complains and a WTO panel rules that the actions were wrongly taken, there is no penalty imposed against the offending country which is only asked to lift the tariff. Meanwhile the aggrieved country has lost many years of export earnings. Moreover, the same actions can again be taken against the same country, thus perpetuating the protection.

We may see a rise in such trade-remedy actions under President Trump, especially if he is counselled against taking the more blatant route of imposing an all-out tariff wall.

But we can also expect titfor-tat counter-action of the same type by the affected countries, in a global spiral of protectionism. That will be in nobody's interest.

The new Trump presidency is also expected to usher in a major change in how the US (and eventually many other countries) will perceive free trade agreements. Trump's objection to the TTPA and NAFTA seems to be based on the issue of goods trade, that the template of these agreements seems to favour the exports of the partner countries at the expense of the US.

Trump said he would instead 'negotiate fair bilateral deals that bring jobs and industry back." This appears to be neomercantilist and against the free-trade principle, but it is this kind of "America-first' populism that helped propel him to power.

If the new US policy moves in this direction, what is to prevent other countries from doing likewise? "Free trade" or "fair trade" will be interpreted by each country in ways that favour it, and many of the present rules will have to be set aside.

However the FTAs are much more than trade, and they became unpopular with the public in the US and elsewhere not only because of the threat of cheap imports taking over the market of local producers, but also because of the nontrade issues that are embedded in most recent FTAs, including FTAs between developed countries, and those between developed and developing countries

If the new US policy moves in this direction, what is to prevent other countries from doing likewise? "Free trade" or

"fair trade" will be interpreted by each country in ways that favour it, and many of the present rules will have to be set aside.

One of these issues include investment rules aimed at liberalising foreign investment and financial flows, with an especially controversial section that gives rights to foreign investors to take cases and make claims against the host government in an international tribunal.

Another issue is the strengthening of intellectual property rules that favour multinational companies at the expense of local consumers. A most unpopular effect is a tremendous rise in the cost of some patented medicines through the additional curbing of competition from cheaper generic drugs.

Other issues include the opening up government procurement to foreign firms on a national-treatment basis, thus reducing the share of local businesses in this huge sector; the liberalisation of the services sectors, which for some countries may affect the cost of basic services that are normally performed by the public sector; and, in the most recent FTAs, the establishment of new rules overseeing the policies and behaviour of state-owned enterprises.

The structure of this kind of North-South FTAs is mainly unfavourable to developing countries in general. While a developing country can get some benefits on the trade component through better market access to the developed country, the non-trade issues are usually against their interests as the developed countries are far stronger and have the upper hand in the areas of

investment, intellectual property, services and procurement.

However, civil society groups in the developed countries also find the non-trade issues against the public interest. For example, the investor-state dispute system undermines the ability of these countries to set their own environmental or health policies, and the tighter intellectual property rules impede access to medicines and knowledge in these advanced countries as well.

Through the recent FTAs, sensitive areas and issues that were previously under the purview of the national government are now subjected to new and intrusive rules that cramp the space that countries (whether in the South or North) normally have to set their own policies.

Both the trade and non-trade issues have made the "trade agreements" highly controversial. Civil society groups in developing countries have been expressing their concerns that the public interest and national sovereignty are being undermined.

At the same time, the public in developed countries, including in the US, Europe, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and Japan, have become disillusioned and even outraged by the effects of the FTAs their governments signed or proposed.

The anti-FTA movement became so strong in the US that it helped boost the unexpectedly good showing by Bernie Sanders in the Democratic primaries, pressurised Hillary Clinton to pledge her opposition to the TPP, and enabled Trump to ride on and add to the "anti-trade" emotions in his campaign.

The heightened focus on trade policy during and after the US elections is a good time to review what works and what does not work for the public interest in trade agreements.

It is becoming clear that trade agreements have become overloaded with many issues that do not belong to an agreement originally designed for trade in goods.

For example, there is a history and logic to the "non-discrimination" and "national treatment" principles established for trade in goods among countries, and even then there is a debate on the conditions under which the application of these principles bring about mutual benefits in trade.

The same principles and template are often inappropriate when applied to non-trade issues for which they were not designed. Creating rules based on these principles and including them in trade agreements can lead to imbalances and unequal outcomes among the partners, and even adverse consequences for all the partners.

However in recent years the scope of agreements.

trade agreements has grown to include more and more issues, to which the original trade principles have been applied, leading to more and more contention and unpopularity.

The overloaded agenda in FTAs gives trade a bad name, with people being confused between trade, trade policy and trade agreements. Many people who are disgruntled with trade agreements also become unhappy with trade per se, and the benefits that trade can bring get mixed up with and overwhelmed by the contentious non-trade issues, and trade ends up being condemned as well.

It is important, at this moment of an imminent Trump presidency, to clarify the difference between trade and trade agreements, and to review the whole issue of trade policy.

A good outcome would be to design new agreements that are mutually beneficial in the trade aspect to all partners, whilst removing the controversial non-trade issues from the agenda. And this could be part of a broader prodevelopment trade agenda.

But this is not likely to be the new agreements being envisaged by the Trump team. The danger is that these may be even worse than the existing ones.

We risk entering a new era where the US, and maybe some other developed countries as well, are tempted to promote extreme trade protectionism, whilst retaining or expanding the unpopular non-trade issues in the trade agenda because it is in the interest of their corporations.

We might end up with a new type of "America first" agreements, in which a Trump administration ensures that the US can curb imports whilst championing its exports, thus reducing the trade benefits to its partners; while at the same time strengthening the rules in non-trade issues like intellectual property and liberalising financial services that favour US corporations but are against the partners' interests.

That would be the worst of both worlds, at least for developing countries

It is thus crucial for policy makers and thinkers in developing countries to rethink what kind of trade is good for their economies, what kind of trade policy would correspond to that positive trade performance, and what kind of trade agreements would be good to have and which types should be avoided.

It is also time to rethink the role of the World Trade Organisation and reaffirm the priority of developing a balanced and pro-development multilateral trading system. If (and that is a big if) the WTO could evolve into such an ideal system, there would be no need or less need for bilateral trade agreements.



PNM wins seven corporations

A historic 17 percent of voters went to the polls for the Local Government General Election (LGE) in Trinidad last Monday. More than one million people registered to vote with the Election and Boundaries Commission (EBC).

The ruling People's National Movement (PNM) in Trinidad won seven corporations including four Borough Corporations (7) in the Local Government Election (LGE) on Nov. 28, while the opposition United National Congress (UNC) took six corporations. There was a tie (4-4) in one of the Corporations in East Trinidad.

It was a tight victory for the PNM. In 2013, a historic 452,013 faced the polls (or 43 percent) to vote in that Local Government General Election in Trinidad.

Four other smaller political parties failed to win a seat. All their candidates lost their deposit.

It was a close victory for the PNM as the UNC bounced back after failing in the 2015 general election.

However, Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley said it was a "fantastic win" despite the low voter turnout.

He said the PNM did well and the election demonstrated that the country understood the difficult economic situation that the PNM inherited

Persad-Bissessar told cheering UNC supporters that she had asked the peo-

ple to send a message to the Rowley government that there was too much pain and suffering and it is time for change.

She said the UNC had managed to wrest 12 seats from the PNM in the election and promised to look out for the needs of the "small man."

The LGE was seen as a referendum on Rowley's performance after a year in office and Persad-Bissessar who had lost nine elections since her defeat in 2015.



"Hollywood Comes to Brooklyn" is a fund-raiser for the blind popular host of the first rap-show on MTV who has lived with Type 2 diabetes for a decade now. Money raised is going towards starting a foundation Doctor Dre is creating, and to cover some medical bills. The event will be an important cause for people to support they will get a little bit of Hollywood-inspired entertainment while supporting an important cause because that will encourage the radio personality to come out of his shell and talk more to the public about his life with diabetes in time for Hollywood month, said the event's organizer.

"Doctor Dre made his first social appearance this year at my award show," said Coco-

event. "When he came out and revealed that he went blind from diabetes, I thought it would be a perfect month to have a fund raiser to talk about men's health."

At the event, Doctor Dre will meet with fans and talk about his life since his big break on MTV, and living as a diabetic since his diagnosis. Special guests that will attend will be state Sen. Kevin Parker (D-Ditmas Park) and radio host Lenny Green.

"He's totally dependent on people assisting him but he's not mad about it — he's very happy," she said. "He wants to create a legacy for our young people. He's blind but he sees

Ford says her goal for the festive party is to bring the icon back into the limelight and help boost support to spearhead his own foundation, called the Doctor Dre Foundation for Diabetes Research Associates to Find a Cure. The organization will aim to support research and find a cure for the disease. But despite his name, he is not getting a lot of support from fans or famous people knows, said Ford.

"He doesn't have a lot backers in the industry even though he is radio loyalty in hip-hop,' she said. "We're trying to raise money because he needs a lot of things and he wants to start a foundation for wellness and getting in shape, and work with existing organizations."

Ideally raising \$100,000 is a perfect number to get things rolling faster, said Ford, but she hopes to raise less than that just to get his immediate needs taken care of.



He noted that the system was already in place at several international airports, resulting in waiting times in arrivals halls had dropped by 40 to 50 percent.

Cuba

The Cuban government has pardoned close to 800 prisoners in response to a recent call by Pope Francis.

The state-run Granma newspaper reported that 787 prisoners who have been pardoned include women, young



and sick prisoners, but not those who have committed "extremely dangerous" crimes such as murder and rape.

The newspaper said the Council of State, led by President Raul Castro, issued the pardons "in response to the call by Pope Francis to heads of state in the Holy Year of Mercy".

The statement said when it came to choosing which prisoners to free, the Council of State had taken into account the crimes they had committed, their conduct and years they served.

Relations between Cuba's Communist government and the Catholic Church have improved in recent years.

Cuba released some 3,500 prisoners last year ahead of the Pope's visit, in what has been called a goodwill gesture.

Haiti

Customs officers in Haiti recently discovered a shipment of weapons in a container at the Global Lafito about 20

kilometers north of the capital, Port-au-Prince.

A total of seven Smith and Wesson pistols, five Glock models 40, more than 400 rounds of



ammunition for the Glock and various others, including ammunition for assault rifles were seized by the customs and police, according to the justice of the peace.

The names of the sender and recipient have not been revealed.

This is the third seizure of weapons in Haiti since a large shipment was discovered on Sept. 8 at the Port of Saint-Marc.

Jamaica

Amnesty International has accused Jamaica of "promoting a culture of fear" linked to a chronically high rate of killings by police.

A report issued recently by the Londonbased group says two Jamaican officers have



been convicted of murder since 2000.

About 3,000 people were killed in police-related facilities during that time.

Poor residents have regularly protested what they insist are murders by police and accuse officers of planting pistols beside bodies and collecting spent shells.

Senior police officers have dismissed accusations of unlawful killings, noting Jamaica is overflowing with guns and gangs.

A herbalist is raising the health consciousness in his community with his one-stop natural food store.

Ambrosia Health Foods has been in East Flatbush for 30 years, selling natural products to locals pursuing a healthy lifestyle. The store's Trinidadian owner, Roland Guy, carries everything including natural medicines, vitamins, and herbs for health. The shop has grown and expanded significantly, and is now giving their community more than healthy food, by providing health services such as eye-reading for internal health and programs, said the owner and manager.

"We sell natural organics and minerals, and we also do iridology and colonic therapy in our clinic," said Guy, who prides himself on all-natural and chemical-free products.

"We sell nothing white in the store - no white rice and no white sugar because those are carcinogenic and cause illnesses — so we stay away from that white stuff.'

Guys said if he was not passionate about the health of his community he would have a different kind of business, and sell chemical-laden food. "If I wanted to do that I would open up a grocery store," he said.

With a thriving business on Church Avenue, a popular commercial hub often filled with notso-healthy food options, and one of the few businesses catering to natural living, Guy said he often notices customers who pass by his shop after leaving a fast-food place. But when he sees that he uses that opportunity to edu-

But what makes the business standout from other health stores is the variety of options available. Ambrosia Health Foods

store sells just about anything, and health enthusiasts interested in going all-natural and learning on how to transition, can find everything including food such as rice, beans, and spices, drinkable blends for all organ functions, and literary education such as black history and "Back to Eden," a go-to book for understanding herbal remedies.

"There's a blend for everything and we sell very specific things to clean the liver and the kidney,' said Guy. "Books are also very important and we sell plenty of books on African history and religious books — we are very well rounded."

Several programs are also run in the store to educate customers on incorporating herbs into their diets. Grenadian herbalist, Patrick Delves, comes to United States mainly to give lectures and conduct programs at Ambrosia Health Foods, Guy said.

At 73 years old, Guy describes himself as being in good health. Having studied herbology and naturopathy, Guy who is also a Vietnam war hero who served as a medic in the United States Army, has dedicated most of his life learning and sharing his knowledge on the natural living, starting a smaller shop in the late 80s. He now runs it with his son, who now manages most of the tasks, but he has big plans

"I'm relaxing and my son is in charge now," he said. "But we are thinking of doing a factory and doing different things with the same herbs, tea, and working on making our own tonics. We've always discussed these things and my son is going to be in charge of that.'

A winter festival with a health conscious goal is debuting in Crown Heights to encourage awareness and healthy eating at P.S. 221 on Dec. 15 and Dec. 17.

The inaugural Crown Heights Winter Fest is bringing fresh food, local vendors, healthy cooking demonstrations, art activities, and free health screenings for local residents. An organizer of the event hopes the direly lacking neighborhood of Crown Heights comes out to support the festival in hopes of bringing back a farmers market into the community.

"We thought of some ways to empower the community to build something and bring in

money for fresh food access — because both things are lacking compared to other neighborhoods," said Nancie Katz, director and cofounder of Seeds in the Middle, who is organizing the event. "We attempt to do something that is joyful for everyone with a cross-cultural and diverse aim because nobody is doing that for Crown Heights."

Families with kids are encouraged to come as chefs will show children how to make healthy recipes of popular dishes.

"I'm going to make zucchini pizza," said Barbara Adamson. "This is a way of introducing ethnic backgrounds to eat healthy without eating greasy food."

Adamson said starting health educa-

tion with children is a more effective prevention method than with adults because older adults may be set in their ways.

"I prefer to deal with children and I

want to teach them that they have alternatives and can eat healthy," she said. "You can bend a young tree, but you'll break branches of old ones."

Visitors will be able to eat, buy, and also get on-site health screenings for high blood pressure, asthma, and even enroll for off-site screenings such as breast exams and cancer services with health providers.


Katz said the disparity between the efforts to bring healthy options to more lower income communities are not being

"There are not many farmers market in minority neighborhoods," she said. "But look at Park Slope where they have 20-40 markets of fresh food a year, and Crown Heights has only two or three."

Whatever it is, it's going to be close. Both sides are playing well today, and they're all very talented. Your team might win. They might lose. Or, as in the new book "Game Changers" by Molly Schiot, they might alter the way the whole thing's played.

Growing up, Schiot says, "I thought only men could be champions." Most popular sports-themed movies indicated as much; so did TV before cable. Few tales of women in sports were widely known, so Schiot, a Hollywood director, searched until she found a "treasure trove of images" that "inspired me to pull theses stories out of the dark."

Take the story of Alice Mar-

Marble was a Grand Slam championship tennis win-





ner many times over, but her "post-tennis life" was equally remarkable: shortly after losing both her husband and her baby, Marble became a spy for the Allies during World War II.

Althea Gibson was the first tennis player to break the color barrier at the U.S. Open. But did you know that there were a lot of African-American women who fought on the courts before her: Ruth Harris, Lillian Hardy, Alfreda Jackson, Clementine Redmond...?

Of course, this book includes athletes like Billie Jean King, Babe Didrikson Zaharaias. Nadia Comaneci, Renée Richards, and Diana Nyad. You've heard about them, but you may not know that Olympian Abby Hoffman masqueraded as a boy when she was nine years old, in order to play hockey in Canada. You may not know about the abuse the first female pro-baseball umpire got during ump school, the jeers the first female Boston Marathon runner endured, or the record snatched from Kitty O'Neil. You might have seen an invour-face move by skater Surva Bonaly, but you don't know what bullfighter Conchita Cintrón did, or that Negro League baseballer Toni Stone cheekily befriended prostitutes while on the road. Because of what an autopsy revealed, you might not know about Stella Walsh at all. And there's a chance that many of these women couldn't have reached their goals or made history without the efforts of Bernice Sandler and Edith Green.

Wow, are there a lot of surprises inside "Game Changers."

Even rabid sports fans will find something new hiding here, in part because author Molly Schiot includes minichapters on women athletes in a huge variety of sports. Fans will find everything from the archery to zooming race cars, balls to boats, journalism, hiking, climbing, skating,

and coaching. Nearly half of this book consists of photos of women athletes in action or in peril; many of them embraced dangerous feats and many were the target of men who thought they didn't belong on the field. Schiot also treats readers to a few interviews with and by pro female athletes.



Safety first when stringing holiday lights

Work with a partner

Inspect lights

Use an extension cord of adequate

Exterior holiday lights are often plugged into extension cords that extend to a shed or garage. Do not connect several extension cords to power holiday lights; instead, use just a single cord that's lengthy enough to reach the outlet. Connecting extension cords is a fire hazard. In addition, make sure the amperage of the decorations matches the amperage rating of the extension cord, which can be found on the product label or possibly on the manufacturer's

Make sure lights do not pose hazard

Christmas trees or along hallways. Such lights and the cords connecting them to power sources should never pose safety hazards, so make sure they are not lying on the floor. Staple lights to the wall and never place them beneath furniture or rugs. Lights can overheat when placed beneath Lights might be hung on rugs, and lights that are not

properly secured to a wall can pose certain dangers, including being potential tripping hazards.

Hang the correct lights

When stringing lights, make sure you hang lights designated as exterior lights on the exterior of your home

and those designated as interior lights inside your home. Hanging lights in the wrong places poses a fire hazard and creates additional safety concerns, so adhere to manufacturer instructions when stringing lights.

In addition, candy or cookies sweetened with the artificial sweetener xylitol can cause a dangerous drop in blood pressure for dogs.

Pine needles and trees

When ingested, pine needles can puncture the intestines of pets. In search of an easy drink, dogs and cats may be drawn to the fresh water reservoir of live trees, increasing the likelihood that they knock over a Christmas tree, injuring themselves and causing damage around the house.

Trees should be properly secured, and fallen needles should be promptly discarded.

Tinsel

he holiday season is full a particularly serious threat. a cat. Felines are likely to mistake tinsel for a toy. Eating tinsel can cause severe damage to a cat's intestinal tract, as it may get caught in the stomach while the rest of it continues to pass through the intestines.

Tinsel also may wrap around the tongue, increasing the cat's risk of choking. Ornaments also are tempting playthings. Cats may pounce on glass ornaments, breaking them and suffering injury.

Electrical cords

The American Animal Hospital Association says holiday lights mean more electrical cords for kittens and puppies to chew. Secure all cords and keep them out of reach of pets.

Candles

The subtle flicker of a lit candle can add ambiance to a space. But all it takes is the swish of a tail or the pat of a paw to knock over a candle Skip the tinsel if you have and spark a fire. Never leave

According to McDonald Nevers, one of the things Dr. Olive Lewin said while doing her research collecting the music, was that she got the music freely from the people who she sat with in the community, and it was very important for her and for the group to continue to share that music. hear us can come and share in what is ours," said the musical director.

She was born in 1937 in Jamaica and died on April 10, 2013 in Kingston, Jamaica. She studied

These tours over the years have been sponsored initially by Berger Paints in the 1980s, and since 2009 by Mother's.

Love gurus date despite philosophical differences



Love guru Matthew Taylor (Shemar Moore) is the author of the new best seller, "The Bounce Back." Accompanied by his enterprising business manager, Terry (Bill Bellamy), he's been hawking the self-help book on plenty of TV and radio programs.

Since Terry believes that "Image is everything," he's concerned that Matthew hasn't settled down since his divorce. "A relationship guru should be in a relationship for longer than a minute," he counsels his BFF/boss.

That sentiment is echoed by Matthew's teenage daughter, Aleva (Nadja Alava), who says, "Dad, you really need to get a girlfriend." Nevertheless, her father tends to settle for

one-night stands, like the one he recently shared with Lizette (Marta Cross), the makeup artist at a TV station where he'd just appeared.

Matthew finally meets his match, literally and figuratively, the day he crosses paths with Kristin Peralta (Nadine Velazquez), a fellow therapist also making the rounds on the talk show circuit. Trouble is,

while there's evidently chemistry between the two, they have conflicting adivce to offer folks nursing wounds from a painful relationship.

Matthew's simplistic suggestion is to "Get out of your head and into action." By contrast, Kristin doesn't think the solution is quite that easy. She says, "Therapy's a marathon, not a sprint." After all, she's still recovering from having her heart broken over six years

Consequently, she views Matthew as a charlatan exploiting the vulnerable. And she tells him so to his face, snarling, "Quick fixes like yours are always a scam, whether it's a book, a pill or a seminar."

Confrontation makes for great TV drama and, soon

enough, the two therapists find their services in demand to debate their contradictory philosophies head-to-head. However, the more time they subsequently spend together making personal appearances, the more the feelings between them have a chance to develop.

But can a relationship survive on chemistry alone? That is the pivotal question posed by The Bounce Back, a delightful romantic romp directed by Youssef Delara (Filly Brown). The movie is most reminiscent of Think Like a Man, another urban-oriented soap opera revolving around the battle-ofthe-sexes.

Nevertheless, this novel contribution to the genre stands on its own and thus warrants recommending, between a solid script with a couple of cleverly-concealed plot twists, and a plethora of praiseworthy performances on the part of a talented cast topped by Shemar Moore, Nadine Velazquez, Kali Hawk, Sheryl Underwood and the versatile veteran, Bill Bellamy.

Senior guard Keith Williams — who committed to the University of Cincinnati earlier this year — racked up 26 points, including a pair of highlight-worthy dunks of his own. The soon-to-be Bearcat regularly out-muscled his opponents in the paint, drawing fouls and hauling in

Despite the big numbers on offense, it was the lack of efficiency and consistent defensive pressure that kept the game close throughout the night.

Bishop Loughlin jumped out to a 19-14 lead after the first quarter and padded that cushion throughout the second. Nowell led the charge, highlighting an 11-point run with a higharcing, mid-range jumper in the first half. All Hallows (0-1) refused to go down without a fight, however, coming out strong in the third quarter and matching the Lions throughout the second half. It wasn't pretty down the stretch, bordering close to nerve-wracking, but the Lions are confident they can turn their defense around. After all. that was only game one.

'We gave up a lot of points," Gonzalez said. "We've got to take better pride in our defense and move on from here."
