### **US slams CARICOM as money launderers**

In one fell swoop the United States government has condemned 14 of the 15 CARI-COM states as major money laundering countries, and Barbados government minister, Donville Inniss, is calling for joint regional reaction.

In its March 2017 International Narcotics Control Strategy Report of the US Department of State omitted only Montserrat in its broad brush across the region that hit every CARICOM member along with other Caribbean states, and Inniss noted that such charges carry severe consequences for financial operations of these countries.

"This is an issue that affects the survival of each economy in the region," he said recently in a comment on the issue.

"Our health-care systems Territory. in the region are at risk of not being adequately financed if we do not get it right in international finance and business. Our agricultural sector would be under immense pressure if we don't get it right in these areas," he told the Barbados Advocate newspaper.

The State Department stated that as of 2016 major money laundering countries included

Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago.

Though a full CARICOM member, the nation omitted from that list, Montserrat, remains a British Overseas

Among the consequences of such labeling for the 14 states, is further unwillingness of international banks to act as corresponding financial houses for worldwide transactions coming out of and entering these CARICOM countries.

The inability to conduct, or limiting of, such transactions will affect not only macro economics considerations like international trade, but could also hurt CARICOM citizens on the individual level by hindering remittances, on which many in the region depend.

Prior to the State Department's broad brush labeling of CARICOM countries, many international financial houses had been dropping correspondent banking services to

### Guyana quits sugar exports to European Union market

Guyana, the Caribbean trade bloc's largest producer and exporter of raw cane sugar, is scaling back production and pulling away from the European market for the first time in nearly 400 years as Europe will from in the fall end a decadesold system that had guaranteed export quantities from its former colonies, officials said this week.

The country has since the mid 1970's been annually exporting nearly 170,000 metric tonnes of raw sugar to the European Union market under a special protocol with guaranteed prices and fixed quotes for production from Africa, the Caribbean and Pacific nations.

But Errol Hanoman, chief executive at the Guyana Sugar Corporation said that the European Union will from September end the fixed quota system and throw open its market

to exporters from around the globe, including making more room for its own beet farmers to thrive.

The move will affect all countries still producing and exporting in the group including Jamaica, Belize and Barbados. Trinidad and St. Kitts quit that sector more than a decade ago when the European Union had slashed import prices by 36 percent, contending that sugar had become highly unprofitable and no longer made economic sense. Barbados has a single functioning estate.

The end of the quota system now means that cane sugar from the Caribbean with its high production costs will be unable to compete going forward as beet farmers move into space left by departing regional producers.

The result is that Guyana's government will close three of Continued on Page 6

### UN resolution on World Creativity and Innovation Day

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Permanent Mission to the United Nations said it has led the successful adoption of a UN resolution on World Creativity and Innovation Day.

St. Vincent and the Grenadines Ambassador to the UN, I. Rhonda King, said on Friday that the resolution was successfully tabled by her Mission the day before and adopted by the UN General Assembly. "This resolution calls for the international recognition of April 21 as the day to highlight the role of creativity and innovation in problem-solving and, by extension, the implementation of the [UN] Sustainable Development Goals and, ultimately, achieving the future we want," King told Caribbean Life.

"Beyond the obvious call for the recognition of the day internationally, the resolution also intends to initiate a discussion around the options available to countries, especially developing countries, in addressing the many issues that they grapple with in their quest for development," she added.

King said that while developing countries, such as those in the Caribbean, are "unfairly seen as too dependent on aid from developed countries, the application of creative thinking and the use of available technologies can provide solutions to some of their most pressing problems, such as poverty eradication, the elimination of hunger and job creation."

The UN diplomat pointed to the construction of the Argyle International Airport in her native land as "a prime local example of the use of creativity in a large scale, macro infrastructural project that was otherwise, and through 'business as usual' methodologies, seen as an insurmountable challenge."

# Senator Parker proposes bill for teens leaving foster care

State sen. Kevin Parker (D–Ditmas Park) wants to financially assist young adults transitioning out of the foster care system in a new bill he proposed on May 4. To commemorate foster care awareness this month, Parker said it was his passion to solve issues regarding teens leaving the foster care system and working with advocacy groups, he hoped his bill would address the issues affecting them.

"I've been working over the last two years with Foster Care Unplugged and they work with young people out of foster care, and we are really concerned because the biggest problem is facing adults aging out of foster care," said Parker

Parker is proposing a bill to provide financial needs to teens, such as a banking accessibility and courses that will educate them the necessary information.

"First part of my bill will establish an individual savings account that the state can contribute money into for everyone," said Parker. "This is especially important for young people when they come out and they can use this money for education or start business."

The other parts of the bill will also require courses on financial literacy and basic independent living skills, according to Parker.

At 18 years old teens are officially out of the states' system and are usually on their own with not much support, said Parker.

"When you come out of prison you get \$40, a metrocard, and a good luck, but when you leave the foster care system you only get a 'good luck,' if you're lucky," he said.

Parker said while the number of children in the system had decreased, many children were finding themselves with no place to go despite decreasing rates.

"The DeBlasio administration has done a number of things to reduce numbers with more people getting adopted but we're finding that 15 percent of people aging out of the system are becoming homeless and that's a big problem,"

he said. "We are already overburdened with homeless shelter systems in New York, but with this bill I introduced, we believe it will be part of the solution to address people in foster care."

The senator said that as the son of a former foster child, the welfare of children in the system impacted him a lot and he felt that not every child will be as lucky to find a stable life as his father.

### CBC chair, Clarke urge Trump to extend TPS

The chair of the Congressional Black Caucus (CBC), Cedric Richmond, and Caribbean American Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke have urged the Trump administration to extend Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for Haitian nationals who were in the United States prior to Nove. 4, 2016.

Haiti was added to the list of TPS-designated countries on Jan. 21, 2010, after an earthquake killed 300,000 people and displaced another 1.5 million people. TPS has been extended three times since then for 18 months each, CBC noted.

"Allowing Haitian nationals in this country to remain here longer puts them and their families in a better position to help Haiti rebuild and recover from devastating natural disasters," said Congressman Richmond in his letter to John Kelly,

Secretary of the US Department of Homeland Security, on Wednesday. "The 2010 earthquake and the cholera outbreak and hurricane that followed hurt a country that was already hurting and now is not the time to add salt to the wound."

Clarke, the daughter of Jamaican immigrants, who represents the 9th Congressional District in Brooklyn, New York, said the 2010 earthquake "disrupted the function of civil society in Haiti, displacing families from their homes, closing schools and social service agencies, creating instability in government and undermining the economy.

"The people of Haiti have demonstrated extraordinary resolve in their efforts to rebuild, despite serious hardships, such as Hurricane Matthew in 2016 and outbreaks of cholera," she said in her letter to Kelly. "Their efforts have been supported

by Haitian nationals here in the United States, who are working hard, and [are] sending money to family members and friends.

"These remittances are critical to the recovery, and have provided not only for basic needs but have also supported education, agricultural restoration, business development and home reconstruction," she added

Clarke, therefore, urged Kelly to "follow in the proud tradition established by his predecessors of continuing to allow Haitian nationals to contribute to their nation's future."

CBC said Clarke's request was joined by the entire group. CBC. She has also introduced H.R. 1014, the Haiti Emergency Relief Act of 2017, which would provide TPS for Haitian nationals who have been in the United States since before Nov. 4, 2016.

#### **Barbados**

Barbados has joined a list of countries who have criticized the recent International Narcotics Control Strategy Report (INCRS) published by the US Department of State's Bureau for International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs, which claimed that the island was among several countries that the US regards as major money laundering countries.

Part of the report states, "narcotics trafficking, money laundering, and firearms trafficking are major



sources of illicit funds in Barbados. In addition to the use of financial institutions, money laundering through the purchase of real estate, vehicles, and jewelry as well as through a variety of businesses.

Attorney General and Minister of Home Affairs, Adriel Brathwaite said that this finding is "misleading" and in respect of Barbados merely cited "a number of generic methods of money laundering that may be found in any country."

He said there is nothing to support the view that they are at proportions that would have a significant impact on the local economy, or cause the faintest ripple in the international financial sector.

The attorney general acknowledged that the illegal drugs trade is the crime that is of the greatest concern in the country.

Braithwaite emphasized that Barbados is neither a producer of drugs for export, nor does or manufacture guns, contrary to the State Department's assertion that "narcotics trafficking and firearms trafficking are major sources of illicit funds in the country.

Antigua and Barbuda and Nevis have also rejected the INCRS report.

# Guyana to scale back sugarcane production

the six grinding estates and factories by year end, scale back production to no more than 150,000 tonnes and concentrate more on selling about 60,000 to the Caribbean group of countries, about 50,000 on the open world market and just under 13,000 to the United States. The remainder will be left available for the local Guyana market.

The announcement came hours after government had laid a special white paper in parliament on sugar, saying its value to the local economy had fallen from the number one foreign exchange earner a decade ago to now behind gold, rice, bauxite and timber. The corporation has debts totaling nearly \$500M and produces sugar at nearly 40 American cents per pound, about three times higher than market prices.

The announcement also comes less than two months after the umbrella Sugar Association of the Caribbean (SAC) had met in emergency session in Jamaica to consider the developments in Europe where the region had been selling an average of about 450,000 metric tonnes to Europe annually.

SAC President Karl James had told Caribbean Life recently that "we have to get into the market for refined sugar as well urgently. All of our refined sugar in the region is imported from outside so the way forward is for us to add refined sugar to brown sugar that is available and not bother too much with raw cane sugar."

Hanoman said Guysuco will give up about 35,000 acres of land to diversification to other crops and to workers to switch to farming after estates are close and grinding comes to a halt.

"It will be irresponsible to do anything else other than to close those estates that are not performing as well," he said, saying these decisions are the best for the money-losing, problemplagued sector.

regional countries in what is termed 'de-risking' because of fears of huge financial penalties from US authorities if they are found doing business with suspected money laundering entities in the Caribbean.

The US State Department's announcement has the potential of heightening the fear of international banks that they are likely to process financial transactions for the region that could involve laundered money.

Inniss, a Barbados Commerce and Industry minister, is concerned that in reacting to this latest accusation, and others, against the Caribbean grouping, these small countries are going forward as individuals, which makes it easier for them to be picked off.

"We are still 15 nations going into the international fora, grappling with an understanding of the issues and then perhaps 15 divergent positions on the matter, and I have been saying publicly and privately in regional meetings that we really need to come together."

For this absence of a united approach, he blames officials of the Guyana based CARICOM Secretariat and heads of government of the respective states.

"It is like pulling teeth to get the reputation of all."

the folks in Georgetown, Guyana to understand the issues and I would go as far as to suggest that I do not think the leaders in the region appreciate the gravity of the situation," he said.

Inniss' call for coordinated CARI-COM action matched that made by Eastern Caribbean Central Bank Governor, Timothy Antoine, during a Barbados visit earlier this month.

Pointing out that the world views the Caribbean as a brand or single entity, he said, "it means that not-withstanding our heroic domestic efforts, larger countries, correspondent banks, regulators and even international institutions regard us as a homogenous region. Consequently, the weaknesses of one often impact the reputation of all."

### Caribbean scientists work to limit climate impact on marine environment

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Apr 28 2017 (IPS) - Caribbean scientists say fishermen are already seeing the effects of climate change, so for a dozen or so years they've been designing systems and strategies to reduce the impacts on the industry.

While some work on reef gardens and strategies to repopulate over fished areas, others crunch the data and develop tools designed to prepare the region, raise awareness of climate change issues and provide the information to help leaders make decisions.

In December 2017, the Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism (CRFM) secretariat, with funding from the UK government, announced a Climate Report Card to help formulate strategies to lessen the impact of climate change on regional fisheries.

"The CRFM is trying to ensure that the issue of climate change as it relates to the fisheries sector comes to the fore... because the CARICOM

put fish and fishery products among the priority commodities for CARICOM. It means that things that affect that development are important to us and so climate change is of primary importance," said Peter Murray, the CRFM's Programme Manager for Fisheries and Development.

The grouping of small, developing states are 'fortifying' the sectors that rely on the marine environment, or the Blue Economy, to withstand the expected ravages of climate change which scientists say will increase the intensity of hurricanes, droughts, coastal sea level rise and coral bleaching.

In its last report AR5, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) reported: "Many terrestrial, freshwater and marine species have shifted their geographic ranges, seasonal activities, migration patterns, abundances and species interactions in response to ongoing climate change," patterns that are already being

Heads of Government have noted by Caribbean fishers.

In an email to IPS, Murray outlined several initiatives across the Caribbean that ,he says are crucial to regional efforts. The Report Card, which has been available since March, will provide the indepth data governments need to make critical decisions on mitigation and adaptation. It provides information covering ocean processes such as ocean acidification; extreme events like storms, surges and sea temperature; biodiversity and civil society including fisheries, tourism and settlements.

In addition, the 17-members of the CRFM agreed to incorporate the management of fisheries into their national disaster plans, and signed off on the Climate Change Adaptation and Disaster Risk Reduction Strategy for the fisheries sector.

"It means that anything looking at climate change and potential impacts is important to us," Murray says.

### **Green Card for victims** of domestic violence

According to National Domestic Hotline, domestic violence is a pattern of behaviors used by one partner to maintain power and control over another partner in an intimate relationship. Anyone of any race, age, sexual orientation, religion or gender can be a victim — or perpetrator — of domestic violence. It can happen to people who are married, living together or who are dating. Domestic violence includes behaviors that physically harm, arouse fear, prevent a partner from doing what they wish or force them to behave in ways they do not want. It includes the use of physical and sexual violence, threats and intimidation, emotional abuse and economic deprivation.

According to United States immigration website: "there are three ways immigrants who become victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and some other specific crimes may apply for legal immigration status for themselves and their child (ren).

- Self-petitions legal status under the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA).
- 2. Cancellation removal under VAWA.
- 3. U-nonimmigrant status (crime victims).

To win an abuse case, you must establish the following:

- 1. • Proof that the abuser is a U.S. citizen or green card holder.
- Proof that you are the abuser's spouse, child, or parent.

- Proof that you lived with the abuser.
- Proof that you cur-4. rently live in the United States.
- Proof that you suf-5. fered abuse, such as police records, hospital records, witness statements, psychological evaluation.
- A statement describing your relationship with the abuser and the abuse you suffered, police clearance records and / or other evidence to show you are a person of "good moral character"a copy of your passport or birth certificate.

These immigration benefits each have specific requirements that must be established. Consult an immigration lawyer who works with victims of domestic abuse.

### Towards a global role for African, **Caribbean & Pacific states?**

BRUSSELS, May 7 2017 (IPS) - The African, Caribbean and Pacific Group of States (ACP) met this week in Brussels for the 105th Session of its Council of Ministers to discuss the key question of how these 79 countries could play a more effective role for their own citizens and in the international arena.

The ACP-group was established by the 1975 Georgetown Agreement to co-ordinate cooperation between its members and the European Union. At that time, it consisted of 46 countries of the Caribbean and the Pacific that signed the first Lomé Convention on trade and aid with nine European Union member states.

Since then the ACP's commercial and political clout has grown. Today it counts 79 states. All of them, save Cuba, have signed the Cotonou Agreement that replaced the succesive Lomé conventions and is better known as the ACP-EU Partnership Agreement.

### Post-2020 relations

The current ACP-EU Cotonou Partnership Agreement ends in 2020. In the lead-up to negotiations for a renewed partnership, future relations between the ACP and EU countries was one of the main points on the agenda of the Council. The current ACP-EU Partnership Agreement is based on three pillars: development cooperation, political cooperation, economic and trade cooperation.

Economic and trade cooperation has been a key component of the ACP-EU partnership. It took the form of Economic Partner-

ship Agreements (EPA's). They replaced the former non-reciprocal preferences the ACP countries enjoyed and had to meet the World Trade Organization (WTO) requirements. The majority of ACP countries are now implementing an EPA or have concluded EPA negotiations with the EU.

Ethiopia's Minister of Finance and Economic Cooperation Abraham Tekeste said, "We have to be ready to fundamentally reform our cooperation with the EU after 2020 aiming at deepening our relationship in various, differentiated fronts rather than sticking to the traditional cooperation areas. We must ensure a more balanced partnership with Europe based on shared values and mutual respect."

Therefore the Council of ministers approved its three priority areas to guide future programmes and activities of the Group post-2020: trade, investment, industrialisation and services; development cooperation, technology, science, innovation and research; political dialogue and advocacy.

The ACP representatives reaffirmed their commitment to enhance ACP-EU trade relations. At the same time, they asked the European Union to show flexibility in responding to concerns from ACP countries.

### Comparative advantage

Another APC challenge of paramount importance will be to demonstrate its comparative advantage in partnerships with governments, the UN, multilateral organizations, civil society, the private sector, academia, and others.

According to Peter Thomson, President of the UN General Assembly, the ACP Group has an added value on the global scene. "It can play a significant role in multilateral agreements such as the 2030 Agenda and the Paris Climate Agreement."

This has recently been shown by the joint announcement made by the EU and ACP during the COP21 negotiations, representing 28 plus 79 countries of the world. The partners called for a legally-binding, ambitious, inclusive and durable agreement with clear long term goals, as well as a five-yearly review

### First West Coast Garifuna Festival triumphs

The inaugural Garifuna festival in Long Beach, California proved to be an ideal launchport for what will now be an annual spring celebration of Black Caribbean and Central Americans from Belize, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua.

Held at the Museum of Latin American Art (MOLAA) thousands participated to flaunt the culture, arts, music and language of Black Caribs- Garifuna people of Central America.

Organized in collaboration with the Garifuna American Foundation United, the free, day long festival featured art workshops, face painting, children's story time, Garifuna drumming and dancing.

Costumed women displayed the unique typical fashions that distinguish the Garifuna people whose colors are black, white and yellow.

A family atmosphere prevailed with the language of the people tempering a myriad of displays from craft vendors, culinary ambassadors and artisans who travelled from the east coast, Midwest and as far away as the homelands that



comprise the specialized indigenous nationals.

Welcomed by the infectious dance beats by DJ Fuego of Matralleta de Oro, celebrants were treated by a multitude of talented traditional performers and demonstrators.

Following on the success of the first festival in 2011, later this month from May 21-27, the sixth annual Garifuna International Indigenous Film Festival (GIIFF) will be held in Venice, California.

Although a burgeoning calendar addition, the GIIFF is already acclaimed as one of the nation's most prestigious film festivals celebrating Garifuna, Caribbean and indigenous cultures from around the world.

"We are happy to take audiences and moviegoers on a global journey celebrating culture through art and film," the organizers said.

Since its launch the GIIFF

has showcased a variety of films and created by Garifuna filmmakers -- as well as many other indigenous people -- and has hosted panel discussions, workshops, cultural presentations and award ceremonies.

Opening night events includes a Black carpet arrival interview session, live music, performances and recognitions

Engraved plaques will be issued to winning entries and a Garifuna International Indigenous Film Festival Award will be presented. The latter is a humanitarian award presented for a film or documentary that embodies change in the world that teaches and brings awareness to the causes of the indigenous populace.

According to the GIFF mission statement: "It is in essence a venue that reconciles, entertains and portrays the very diverse and brilliant cultures

mechanism and a transparency and accountability system tracking national commitment progress.

The statement became known as the "Ambition Coalition", quickly growing to include major powers and emerging economies.

### Intra-ACP cooperation

To play a significant global role, the ACP-group must also invest in stronger intra-ACP cooperation. There the group wants to play a complementary role to national and regional initiatives.

Patrick I. Gomes, secretary-general of the ACP Group, said, "Looking at the question of security, peace and stability, we do not have an army to go for example after Boko Haram in Nigeria. But as ACP we can ask ourselves why that ideology of Boko Haram appeals to young people and what gives people purpose in life. And that

is where the ACP culture programme comes in.

"The question of insecurity, peace and crime is also a fundamental question of poverty and development: how do we have comprehensive approaches to reducing and addressing poverty in all its forms and aspects? ACP makes a contribution in that direction by complementing what is at the national and the regional level. We have to look for examples of success at the national, we have to learn from each other's experience and make a difference by our intra-ACP programmes."

### Sustainable financing

No organisation can develop without strong institutions and solid, sustainable financing sources. Therefore the Council asked its member states to invest in a sustainable self-financing capacity of the ACP. It made an appeal to consequently pay their membership contribution and launched the idea of an endowment trust fund.

According to Gomes, "Member countries are receiving millions in grant financing thanks to the ACP. Compared to that amount of money the membership contribution is very little. So we encourage everyone to contribute to keep us going

"We also encourage voluntary contributions as a start for an endowment trust fund. There is so much wealth and money in our countries. Would our billionaires and corporations not be concerned to look to how they can support their own organisation? We see that as a very important area for our financial sustainability."

At the end of the twoday meeting, the president of the council, Abraham Tekeste, said, "We have received by our Heads of State and Government clear marching orders to undertake the reforms needed to transform the ACP Group into an effective global player, fit for the 21st century, and responsive to the emerging priorities of our Member States."

# Eight Jamaicans extradited to the US

Eight Jamaicans, including a former police officer were last week extradited to the United States to face charges related to their alleged involvement in a lottery scam.

Jason Jahalal, a former police officer, Alrick McLedo, Oneil Brown, Xanu Ann Morgan, Dario Palmer, Kazrae Gray, Kimberly Hudson and Dahlia Hunter were charged with various fraud offences including money laundering.

Mastermind of the scheme, Lavrick Willocks operated it out of a house where he lived with his mother, Dahlia Hunter. The accused will each face one count of conspiracy and attempting to commit wire fraud, 48 counts of wire fraud, 15 counts of mail fraud, and one count of money laundering in North Dakota, United States.

It is alleged that conmen schemed more than 70 people, mostly Americans, out of about US\$6 million.

Willocks had evaded arrest for some time, but was taken into custody in January after being found hiding in a garden in a hotel in Kingston.

He was extradited and at his court appearance, pleaded not guilty to the



through the London-based Commonwealth Secretariat.

Sharing of practical operational experiences among anti-corruption bodies from across the region was part of the conference agenda.

The main objective was how to develop systems and programs for the betterment of countries.

The conference brought together some international delegates including Commonwealth Secretary General, Deodat Maharaj and Anti-Corruption Advisor, Dr. Roger Roranteng, as well as CCAICACB Chairman, Lady Anade Trotman-Joseph.

### St. Vincent

The National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO) is warning that the La Soufriere Volcano



remains an active volcano and "will erupt again."

The volcano erupted almost four decades ago and NEMO warned that while it "has been quiet for some time, it is still an active volcano and will erupt again. Citizens would know where they live in relation to the volcano and in which hazard zone they are located."

NEMO advised La Soufriere last erupted 38 years ago, in 1979.

NEMO will be joined by the Seismic Research Center (SRC) of the University of the West Indies, the Soufriere Monitoring Unit (SMU) and the Forestry Division to commemorate the 38th anniversary of the last eruption and to raise awareness of the risk and science associated with the active volcano this month.

#### St. Lucia

Prime Minister Allen Chastanet has removed government multibillion funding for the St. Lucia National Trust (SLNT) in the budget estimates currently being debated in parliament.

It is widely regarded as punishment for its opposition to a proposed dolphin park and its outspoken criticism of environmentally damaging components of a controversial development in St. Lucia.

The SLNT, joined by conservationists across the world had opposed the Chinese-sponsored co-called Pearl of the Caribbean project that poses a serious threat to the country's ecological cultural and archaeological heritage.

There is a proposal to build a causeway linking the Maria Islands Nature Reserve to the mainland, one of the only two wild-



life havens, which is officially a protected

The prime minister has removed the entire Office of the Prime Minister's contributions of \$700,000 towards the work of the SLNT from this year's budget.

#### Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago President Anthony Carmona is urging other CARICOM states who have not replaced the London-based Privy Council with the Caribbean Court of Justice as their final court in legal matters that they should consider doing so now.

Though 12 of the 15 CARICOM member states have signed the agreement establishing the CCJ, only Barbados, Guyana, Dominica, and Belize have accepted the court as the end decisionmaker.

Carmona, who served as a High Court judge before his appointment as President of T&T in 2013, expressed his frus-



tration over the long delay in members joining the CCJ, while speaking in Barbados recently during a presentation on Redefining Caribbean Pride for the 21st Century Youth, to the University of the West Indies, cave Hill Campus, undergraduate organization, Students Today Alumni Tomorrow.

President Carmona said he sees acceptance by all territories of CCJ to be the court of the last resort as another step towards fortifying the Caribbean identity.

He noted that CCJ is predominately of Caribbean origin, and according to a CARICOM document, "judges appointed to the CCJ are evaluated on the basis of wide-ranging criteria, including experience and high moral character".

### **NYC libraries launch** letter-writing campaign

By Nelson A. King

The city's three public library systems say they officially launched a letter-writing campaign this week, urging the mayor and City Council to increase funding for libraries in Fiscal Year 2018.

The Brooklyn Public Library, New York Public Library and Queens Library are calling on members of the public to sign letters to elected officials asking for US\$34 million in additional operating funding for increased hours, said the libraries in a statement.

The funding includes more branches to be open seven days a week and \$150 million in capital funding "to address critical maintenance needs at branches."

Letters can be signed at any of the city's 217 library locations, or online at investinlibraries.org.

The libraries said renowned writer Malcolm Gladwell is supporting the initiative and encouraging the public to sign letters, penning an email that was sent to library patrons on Wednesday.

"As a kid, the highlight of my week was Wednesday evening, when my mom would drive me into town to the Public Library," Gladwell wrote.

"The library was a magical place, that gave me — a kid from a tiny town — a

window on the whole world. I've never lost that feeling. And I've never felt more strongly that every child deserves that same window on the world," he added.

Gladwell said that only seven percent of New York City's libraries are open seven days - "for some families, weekends are their only chance to visit a branch and expand their horizons" — and mentions branches in need of serious repairs.

"Libraries are a lifeline — not a luxury — for New Yorkers. I know I wouldn't be a writer without learning to love reading at my local library as a child," Gladwell said. "Let's make sure other New York City kids get a chance to follow their dreams just like I did."

The letter-writing effort is part of the multi-year "Invest in Libraries" campaign to fight for increased resources and ensure that New Yorkers have the libraries that they need and deserve, the libraries said.

Since the campaign launched three years ago, the libraries said it has generated strong support from authors and celebrities such as Junot Diaz, Judy Blume, Tom Wolfe, Robert Caro, Anna Deavere Smith, Jeff Kinney, as well as thousands of everyday New Yorkers, "resulting in City funding for six-day service and an initial capital budget commitment.

> play does take a look at some serious issues, such as enslavement and the origin of the negative perception, said Dixon.

Even though there was a growing natural hair movement among black women, Dixon said hair was an important part of black women's identity and there was still a need to conform because their hair remains a political issue.

"This play covers all the issues we go through on a daily basis because black women are always doing for something different with their hair and are looked at differently for each thing they do, she said. "I think it still plays a major part of our lives and even today black women struggle with their hair and want to be more accepted, so they

braided hair. And with each hairstyle straighten and blow it out to make it acceptable to society.'

She said the play will spotlight how each hairstyle was received and most importantly will explain a thing or two about hair to help people to show more consideration to the differing experiences black women undergo.

### Jamaican booted from the White House

Cinco de Mayo celebrated Mexico but it did not bode well for a Jamaican who made history October 2011 when President Barack Obama named her the first woman and second Black person to serve as the White House's chief usher.

Angella Reid was fired on May 5 and reportedly relieved of her position without any explanation nor reason.

According to reports, on arriving to work on the usually festive day, White House staffers were told that Reid was no longer working there.

The White House declined to provide any specifics for the reasons behind Reid's departure but a spokesperson for President Donald Trump's administration said: "We are very grateful for her service and wish her the very best."

Fluent in German and Spanish, Reid is credited with running the Hartford Marriot Rocky Hill Hotel in Connecticut and the Renaissance New York Hotel in New York City. A native of the parish of St. Thomas, Jamaica, she attended Excelsior High School in Kingston and soon afterwards in 1978 broached a career in the hospitality industry working at the Half Moon hotel in Montego Bay.

With a degree in hospitality management from the Carl Duisberg Gesellschaft School in Munich, Germany, Reid took the highly-placed position at the White House after working for the Ritz-Carlton group in Washington D.C.

She had previously worked for the same hotelier in Miami and Arlington, Virginia.





### **Greensleeves to celebrate** 40th anniversary

British reggae music label Greensleeves Records is celebrating its 40th anniversary this summer. Founded in 1975 as a record store in West London, the shop quickly grew into a go-to locale for Jamaican record producers two years later. Now 40 years later the label is thrilled to reach this landmark event, said a spokesman for the com-

"We are proud of our continued survival and the development of reggae music," said Chris O'Brien, artist and repertoire at Greensleeves. "We are also proud of being a launch pad for the successes of great artists.

Since partnering with United Statesbased independent reggae label VP Records — which operates a record stores in Queens and Florida — Greensleeves is an even bigger influential brand in the genre, said O'Brien.

"The beginning years of the label saw many great successes but the partnership with VP in 2016 has increased our global reach to see Greensleeves become a truly international brand,"

The label is home to tunes that popular dancehall artists created in the 90s, and is responsible for helping artists like Shabba Ranks, Beenie Man, and Shaggy accomplish hit singles. One of those pinnacle moments was "seeing Shaggy reach number one," said O'Brien.

International reggae pop artist Shaggy scored a number one hit in 1993 with his song 'Oh Carolina,' and that achievement skyrocketed his career, shedding light on the independent label.


"Oh Carolina' reaching number one was an epic feat because at that moment we knew the impact of our label and the vast fanbase we were reaching," said O'Brien. "That was also one of the pivotal moments of Shaggy's career that led him to international superstardom."

To celebrate its milestone anniversary, the label is releasing several new and exclusive music to honor its four decades in music, said O'Brien. A release of a digital and CD compilation of 40 tracks — each song commemorating the 40 years of being in the business - will debut, along with a special 40th Anniversary edition package of The Congos 'Heart Of The Congos.'

And to top off the label's birthday, various festivals, events, and concerts will be planned in London, Paris, and the 40th anniversary concert will take place at BB Kings in Times Square on June 21.

O'Brien said Greensleeves Records proved themselves to be an instrumental hand in the growth of reggae music and looked forward to its 80th anniversary.

"We couldn't be prouder of this monumental milestone. Knowing that the label has had such an impact on the development of popular reggae styles such as lovers rock and dancehall gives us more motivation to keep pushing forward with more music and developing more great artists," he said. "We hope that we can look back in another 40 years and see even more legends emerge from our catalog."

You are a very different kind of person.

You like things that others don't like, you're good at something that nobody else can do, and you laugh at the craziest jokes. You're different — and that's okay. If we were all the same, as you'll see in "The Awkward Thoughts of W. Kamau Bell" by W. Kamau Bell, life would be awfully boring.

When Kamau Bell was born in late January, 1973, his mother was already "a pioneer."

She'd been married and divorced twice, and was unmarried and 35 years old when Bell


was born. Unwilling to marry Bell 's father, she defined her own life and raised her son to do the same.

Bell grew up a "blerd" (a Black nerd) who loved superhero comics and TV cartoons. He especially "LOVED! LOVED! LOVED!" the Incredible Hulk and thought he could actually be Spiderman because it was possible that Spidey was Black. Bell says he didn't, however,

much care for the superheroes who seemed to have "some sort of contractual obligation to put the word 'Black" in their Superhero name."

Bell also loved Bruce Lee movies, and though there were surprisingly few authentic Lee films, the awesomeness of martial arts led Bell to take classes. He was a big Saturday Night Live watcher, absorbed stand-up comedy acts, and he appreciated how Muhammad Ali lived life by his own rules. All this — added to the day when someone other than his mother laughed out loud at his jokes — led to a decision: Bell gave up a scholarship to an Ivy League college, to pursue a career in comedy.

It wasn't the smoothest of paths. He didn't do well at his first gig. Audiences didn't laugh, so he tried another comedy tactic by utilizing the subject of racism in his shows. He wrote, offered workshops, found a niche medium, created a podcast, met a few of his

idols, was taken advantage of (often by white men), and he bounced ideas off others as he meanwhile met an independent woman, fell in love, and started

a family.

And his career took off...







### The Modern Kindergarten Experience





"This has been a long time coming," exclaimed Jakie, after Master of Ceremonies Ulric "Soca" Jones, Jr., a popular Vincentian entertainment promoter in Brooklyn, declared him the winner at 3:45 am. The crowd

approved boisterously.

Singing "This Carnival" before an ebullient crowd, and paying tribute to 40 years of Vincy Mas in July, Jakie also brushed aside challenges from veterans, such as John Dougan, Phil Patch and Striker, to grab the Soca Devil Trophy, which is awarded to the winner of the New Song Competition. Jakie told Caribbean Life in a brief


post-show interview that "this one [song] was special," stating that it conveyed several elements of carnival, such as music and mas.

friends so you have to walk with god," said Papa Biggy. "It's really an inspirational song."

Making a return to the music scene Papa Biggy started his music career in 1982 after winning a national deejay contest, which would also lead to his scholarship to attend the Jamaican School of Music. Having worked as a producer with artists such as Sizzla, Luciano, and Byron Lee and the Dragonaires, he is not a rookie to the industry and wanted to try something new in his sound this time around, said Biggy.

The upbeat rhythm for "Walk with God" instantly drew him when he heard it and became the incentive for the song, said Biggy. Hoping to also reach more listeners he chose to go with a fusion beat combining reggae, calypso, and soca.

"It had a different sound and I've been doing this for years but this time I wanted to do something different and new, and the words just exploded off of my tongue with it," he said. "I also wanted to do something that would appeal to a wider crowd and

not just reggae audience."

The song has religious context but all kinds of audiences can enjoy the message summarized in the song, said Biggy. Likening his song to Mr. Vegas' 2012 hit song "I am Blessed," he says his track has a similar mass appeal to listeners.

"It has the same type of vibe and the song has a general message — it can be played in the dance hall or anywhere," said Biggy. "This song is something that is motivating and uplifting and you'll feel empowered."

Papa Biggy says that as a Christian-raised artist and lover of music, he is not a religious fanatic and only wants to share the guidance of teachings that helped him to inspire other people. But most importantly he wants to entertain people in the purest way that he can, he said.

"I strongly believe in God but I don't make religion determine the way I look at others because I look at it as a concept of love and as long as you believe in love that's fine by me," he said. "I'm a cultural dancehall and reggae singer and a conscious artist. My songs are inspirational and have social messages that come across to the diaspora and different people on different levels."

### Military misfits take shot at redemption

"Black Site Delta" is a microbudget production most reminiscent of "The Dirty Dozen" (1967). Like that classic action flick, the actionoriented tale of redemption revolves around the patriotic exploits of a ragtag team of convicts.

However, given the film's financial constraints, it features a team of six instead of 12 protagonists. They are led by Jake (Cam Gigandet), a vet suffering from PTSD who, at the point of departure, lands in a military prison following a bar fight. He soon discovers that the place doubles as a black site kept off the radar of the general public.

His fellow inmates are other disgraced soldiers, such as Simms (Benjamin Charles Watson), a

former drone pilot incarcerated for refusing to drop a bomb on a terrorist at a child's birthday party full of kids. Truth be told, the facility has been hijacked to secretly serve as the command center for a treasonous operation employing a weapon of mass destruction.

Apparently, one Colonel Irving (Michael Dale) has gone rogue and is now doing the bidding of an Afghan warlord named Khan (Arash Mokhtar). Once that fact comes to light, Jake recruits Simms, his love interest Vasquez (Teri Reeves), and a few other cellmates with the hope that their heroics might lead to full pardons. What ensues is a spectacular splatterfest worthy of John Woo or Sam Peckinpah.

Thus unfolds "Black Site Delta," a gratuitous snuff flick laced with lots of gory kill shots. The movie marks the directorial debut of Jesse Gustafson who does a decent enough job to satiate the bloodlust of fans of the high body-count genre.

From the very beginning, it just felt right.

Nazareth senior Alexis Sykes stepped onto campus at South Alabama last week and knew she'd found the place for her. The Lady Kingsmen basketball standout made it official May 4, committing to the program and cementing her on-court future for the next four years.

She hasn't stopped smiling since.

"I just feel like this is the best school I could have possibly chosen," Sykes said. "The coaching staff is really great and it's far from New York, which I think I need. It's going to slow me down, make me more humble and I'm so excited to go."

Sykes said she's proud of her college choice — and proud of herself for getting to this point.

The road hasn't been easy — her father passed away when she was a freshman — but she's found an outlet through basketball and her dedication

to the game hasn't faltered.

"Basketball saved me. There's been days I've just stayed in the gym from nine in the morning until 12 at night," Sykes said. "It kept me off the streets, away from things most people would be doing at my age, but for me basketball is my guardian angel. It really helped me get through a lot. Without basketball, this wouldn't happen."

Sykes credits Nazareth and her coaches there with keeping her on the right path, and she's confident she'll have a similar support system at South Alabama next season.

She met the entire team during her official visit and, as the only player from New York, said she is more than willing to show them her hometown.

"I'm the only one from New York, the only one from up North really, so it'll be a big adjustment," she said. "I told everybody else on my team, they can come to New York. Any time they want to come to New York, they're more than welcome to stay at my house."

The key for Sykes was finding a program where she knew she could make an impact, and she already knows exactly what her role at South Alabama will be: scoring.

The squad lacked a big-time offensive weapon last season and Sykes is anxious to fill that role. It also helps that Jaguars coach Terry Fowler has already expressed confidence in Sykes and her jump shot.

"When a coach has confidence in me as a freshman, that means a lot to me," Sykes said. "It says that I can be great at this game, but it's up to me if I want to be great. So as long as he gives me the blueprint to be successful, I'm going to follow that."

As far as Sykes is concerned, the sky is the limit. She knows how hard she worked to get here and she's ready to spend the next four years proving it was all worth it.

"It's the best feeling in the world right now," she said. "I'm going to college for free. That's a dream come true."

sington Oval.

The total equaled Pakistan's lowest posed by India 20 years ago at the same venue and was also Pakistan's second lowest-ever against West Indies, surpassing their record low of 77 in Lahore, 31 years ago.

Meanwhile, West Indies hope for automatic qualification in the race for the 2019 World Cup in England took a setback when they dropped another point in the latest International Cricket Council (ICC) rankings released recently.

The regional side, currently lying outside of the automatic places at ninth rankings, lost the final One-Day International to Pakistan to suffer a 2-1 defeat last month.

As a result, West Indies dropped to 83 points while Pakistan gained one point while remaining in eight place in the rankings.

Hosts England and the other seven teams as of September 30, 2016 will qualify automatically for the quadrennial tournament, with the remaining three teams heading to qualify to determine the last two spots.

Windies looked on course to enhance their rankings when they staged a record run chase to beat Pakistan by four wickets in the opening ODI recently at the Guyana National Stadium.

However, they plunged to a 74-run defeat in the second game before also suffering a six-wicket defeat in the three-match series.

The paper said Bolt's partying during the 2016 Olympics in Rio was outpaced only by his accomplishments on the track.


'He dominated the competition to preserve a 100 percent win record in Olympic finals dating to 2008," the Daily News



Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges. "Consumers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party.'
