Kelly continues to cast uncertainty

Secretary of the United States Department of Homeland Security, John Kelly, continues to cast uncertainty on the eventual fate of 58,000 undocumented Haitians who has been granted limited Temporary Protected Status (TPS) to remain in the US, according to reports.

Last week Monday, Kelly granted a six-month TPS extension, rather than the customary 18-month extension, to the Haitians. The extension, which becomes effective on Jul. 23, 2017, rans through Jan. 22, 2018.

extension should allow Haitian TPS recipients living in the US "time to attain travel documents and make other necessary arrangements for their ultimate departure from the United States, and should legislation to fix it. I think it's also provide the Haitian government with the time it needs to prepare for the future repatriation of all current TPS recipients."

However, he said on Thursday that the US Congress could ultimately resolve the matter by changing the legislation.

"This is squarely on them," Kelly told the Miami Herald. "I But Kelly warned that the have a law that I am supposed to enforce, and I think the members of Congress who are interested in this, and there are a lot of them, should probably sit down and talk about it and come up with some on them."

Kelly made a brief stop in Miami after a trip to Haiti on Wednesday, where he spent more than an hour discussing TPS and other Trump administration concerns with new Haitian President Jovenel Moïse and senior officials with the government and the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH), the

LEGAL LIMBO SNAFU

Trinidad judiciary in crisis over appointments foul up

Apparently nothing is done in Trinidad without bacchanal, a very local and well celebrated concept linked to confusion, high levels of anxieties and administrative mistakes.

And this is exactly what appears to have triggered the worst crisis in living memory in the island's judiciary.

A few weeks ago, the Judicial and Legal Service Commission (JLSC) appointed Chief Magistrate Marcia Ayers-Caesar and two other attorneys as judges of the high court, saying more judges were needed not only to fill gaps on the senior bench but to also address a backlog in cases.

But there was a major foul up that so irked members of the island's bar association that they voted almost two to one to demand the resignation of Chief Justice Ivor Archie who heads the JLSC.

Voting at an unusually well

attended emergency meeting of the Law Association, the body said it was embarrassed by a comedy of errors of the Archieled commission as the body had not done its investigative work properly and went ahead and appointed Ayers Caesar to the bench leaving dozens of cases unheard or part heard.

To the law association, this was a major act of judicial idiocy as debate raged as to whether most of the matters were simply paper committals or were plain and simply partly heard matters. Lawyers argued that it was unfair to prisoners and defendants awaiting the completion of their trials to have them restart all over again, incur addiction expenses including legal fees and other forms of stress.

The snafu and the backlash from various sections of society over the appointment quickly forced Ayers-Caesar to resign



Barbados faces a tax burden

In its 2017-2018 Budget, the Barbados government has opted for an internal solution to its debt crisis that is expect to cause widespread price increases, and effectively a devaluation of the dollar.

Faced with continuously falling international credit ratings that make borrowing from abroad more expensive, and local agencies that are either at their lending limit, or are unwilling to extend more credit to government, the administration last week passed a budget with \$542 (Bar\$1 = 50 cents US) in revenueenhancing measures beginning July

But among those procedures is a two per cent across the board tax on all foreign exchange transactions conducted by anyone on the island. This means that the levy will be placed on all activities involving buying United States or any other foreign currency from dealers, wire transfers, and credit card purchases.

Economists, business persons and non-government politicians have all denounced the foreign exchange transaction 'commission' as effectively a devaluation of the Barbados dollar.

Former prime minister and leading Caribbean economist, Owen Arthur, who is now an independent member of parliament, joined with Opposition Barbados Labour Party members in criticizing introduction of the tax

He said that the levy "is effectively changing the price at which Barbados uses domestic currency to pay for foreign currency and making it necessary for Barbadians to use more domestic currency for foreign exchange. So that is a devaluation."

Another of the measures aimed at

Town brawl

J'ouvert organizer criticizes pol at public safety meeting

She put him in line.

The president of J'ouvert International admonished a politician in favor of suspending the early morning Labor Day parade at a town hall on June 1, criticizing him for not including her in discussions on public safety at this

"We put programs in place to try to work on safety and defusing violence and we have been talking to mas bands — but I haven't heard from you," Yvette Rennie said to state Assemblyman Walter Mosley (D-Fort Greene). "Maybe you're meeting with other people, but the mas and steel pan groups are not part of that conversation. Call us to table, don't work around us.'

Mosley, along with Councilwoman Laurie Cumbo (D-Clinton Hill) and state Sen. Jesse Hamilton (D-Crown Heights), organized the public meeting in Prospect Heights to discuss safety measures for J'ouvert, which precedes the annual West Indian Day Parade. Last year, two people were fatally shot despite a beefed up police presence and security that included an official permit and 250 floodlights — which, said the mother of a woman killed at the parade, were still not enough.

"It's not just doubling or tripling. Sometimes it's how the police do their job, because where my daughter was killed there were no police around," Vertina Brown said. "We need better lighting, because there was no lighting where my daughter was killed."

The organization behind J'ouvert is working to implement even more safety measures this year that include entry checkpoints similar to those around Times Square on New Year's Eve, bag checks, and more floodlights. But the

violence that occurs during the festivity is part of a borough-wide crime problem, Rennie said, not restricted to

'J'ouvert has been a festive event for the past 35 years, but Brooklyn itself has become a challenge for crime and somehow we seem to fall into that situation," she said. "I have been concerned with J'ouvert being stigmatized and I look at it as a total disrespect for my

culture."

Mosley and other politicians, including district leader Geoffrey Davis, proposed youth engagement as a way to curb violence, suggesting cultural events be held a week ahead of the parade to educate the community.

"I suggest we have a concert and let the artists who know about J'ouvert educate the community through music," Davis said. "Let artists lead the way."

Caribbean

The Caribbean Community (CARI-COM) says that no amount of pressure will lead the regional grouping to turn its back on troubled Venezuela, even as least four member states break ranks on the issue.

The matter came up for discussion during the regional foreign ministers 20th meeting of the CARICOM Council for Foreign and Community Relations (COFCOR) which took place in Barbados recently.

Outgoing COFOR chairman Sir Louis Straker speaking to reporters after the two-day meeting



played down disagreement raised by St. Lucia, Guyana, Jamaica and The Bahamas, saying CARICOM would not abandon Venezuela in its time of need.

Sir Louis who is St. Vincent and the Grenadines deputy prime minister and foreign affairs minister and regional integration said there might be one or two countries that may not go along with the grouping, but overwhelmingly, CARICOM is in support of Venezuela.

He noted that the Bolivarian Republic "has been pro-CARICOM and has done more for CARICOM than some of the big powers and they should stand by Venezuela".

Sir Louis claimed that some within the Organization of American States (OAS) were pushing for the Nicholas Maduro government to step down, CAR-ICOM must take a strong stance on the

He told reporters there was nothing happening in Venezuela that requires a fact finding mission.

Recently, the Caribbean Chapter of the International Network in Defense of Humanity called on CARICOM leaders to send a mission to Caracas for "an informed analysis" about the state of affairs there.

her appointment after only two weeks on the bench and to basically leave the lower magistrate's courts in a crisis.

The Trinidad Express Newspaper dubbed the issue as "a judicial tragedy of errors", pointing to near mutiny of prisoners at the Port of Spain Magistrate's Court when they learned that she was leaving the magistracy. Dozens of prisoners and several wardens were forced to seek medical attention after fights broke out with news about her departure from the bench and incomplete cases.

In all the lawyers body, said, the magistrate-judge had left 54 incomplete matters and might have misled the JLSC by indicating that most were simply paper committals for new dates. They blamed the JLSC for poor due dili-

gence work.

"We have immediate concerns about the fact that a judge was appointed and took up office leaving behind outstanding, part-heard matters," said Association President Douglas Mendes.

For their part, the JLSC contended that "anyone who is appointed has been through one of the most rigorous selection processes you can find anywhere in the region or Commonwealth," as it stayed clear from providing too many details.

Justice Archie has said he has no plans to resign anytime soon and other members of the body have said that she could simply go down back to the lower court, complete the matters in about six months then take up her appointment as a judge. Other members have not said much.

The main bone of contention among the bar is that the body "was reckless and or negligent in selecting the chief magistrate for appointment as a pusine judge without first ensuring that she had no part heard matters or had completed any part heard matters pending at the time of her appointment."

As the weeks go by, former Justice Marcia Ayers-Caesar is without a job and her future hangs in limbo even as the disquiet from the fiasco has failed to temper down.

Herald said.

It said the US Homeland Security Secretary urged Moïse to start thinking about how to bring Haiti's TPS recipients back to their homeland by issuing travel documents or identification.

"TPS is not supposed to continue to be enforced until Haiti's like Jamaica, or any country, with a very functioning democracy, [or] a relatively low unemployment rate. That's not the point of it," he said.

"TPS was granted based on the [2010] earthquake," Kelly added. "Things in Haiti were tough for decades prior to the earthquake, and will be tough for decades to come. But the reason TPS was granted was because of the earthquake."

In April, the acting director of US Citizenship of Immigration Services, James McCament, recommended a final six-month extension for Haiti and then termination on Jan. 22, 2017.

But Kelly's decision doesn't put an absolute end date on the program, according to the Herald.

On Thursday, he said the argument that Haiti should keep receiving the benefit seven years after the cataclysmic earthquake left more than 300,000 dead, 1.5 million home-

less and an equal number injured, is "questionable."

"I looked at it real hard and decided to extend it for six months, which should give — in the event it's not extended next time — opportunities for people that are living here in the United States to settle their issues here; and, by the same token, give the government of Haiti enough time to start thinking of how to reintegrate," Kelly told the Herald.

Asked whether TPS would be extended now that he's met with Moïse and other Haitian government officials, Kelly said: "I don't know. I literally don't know."

He said one factor that will aid his decision-making in the coming months will be if the Haitian government starts the process of reintegrating or preparing to reintegrate TPS recipients by providing them with travel documents, according to the Herald.

Kelly said one challenge that he has faced in the top job at Homeland Security is that immigration benefits, like TPS, seemed to be automatically renewed.


"I go back to this issue of, the longer that people stay in the United States, the more of an argument they have that they have become Americanized and 'Why do I have to leave?" he said.



Charting a course to a 'Blue' Commonwealth

LONDON, Jun 52017 (IPS) -The United Nations Ocean Conference offers an historic opportunity to safeguard the ocean environment and support small island and vulnerable developing coastal states, who depend on the seas for national economic growth and sustainable development

This summit is about navigating a course to deliver on the Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development, in particular Goal 14 to "conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources." As we set our eyes on this goal, it is worth considering what the oceans mean to coastal communities.

Forty-five of the Commonwealth's 52 member counties are ocean states, including most of the world's small island developing states. For our member countries, the sea is a precious ecosystem, and also deeply rooted in traditional culture. It also provides jobs and immense potential economic opportunity -Vanuatu for instance has a maritime territory 56 times greater than its terrestrial footprint.

The whole Commonwealth family is immensely proud of Fiji, which has the special privilege of being cochair of the Ocean Conference alongside Sweden. The commitment shown by Fiii's Prime Minister, J.V. Bainimarama, is testament to the Pacific region's leadership and advocacy on oceans.

Pacific countries, and in particular its small island developing states, have in

recent years agreed powerful joint declarations on the sustainable use and management of the ocean. These have had a direct impact on influencing national policies to manage access to their waters while setting vital conservation limits.

A forthcoming Commonwealth Secretariat publication, 'A Sustainable Future for Small States: Pacific 2050', takes a closer look at some of the region's innovative approaches on ocean governance, as well as a host of related issues from health to climate change and migration. The study follows on from a similar report in the Caribbean published last year which provided a stark warning for policy-makers.

Our research concludes that while there is much opportunity to be gained from the oceans, these states face a great many challenges, including commercial competition for marine resources and the impact of climate change. Rising populations, limited national capacity and investment and inadequate fiscal and revenue management also bring huge pressures.

Spurred on by leaders in the Pacific and Carib-

threats better than anyone, Commonwealth heads of government were early pioneers of the 'blue economy' concept. Applying to ocean governance the Commonwealth's shared values - the commitment to democracy. good governance, equity and sustainability - this 'Blue Commonwealth' approach aims to help countries unlock economic value from the ocean while also conserving and protecting the marine environment.

At the Commonwealth Secretariat, we help our member states to better manage and protect against threats such as pollution and illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing. We offer help so countries can claim their maritime territory, and advise on managing offshore renewables, petroleum and deep-sea mining. We help our peoples to unlock the value of the sea in a sustainable manner while ensuring the equitable distribution of its benefits.

'whole-ocean' This approach to economic development recognises the linkages between terrestrial and marine resources. It is an integrated 'regenerative' model which can best respond to sectoral and national interests in a way that suits day to day life.

The magnitude of the threat from climate change and rising sea levels, especially for those whose endowment or stage of development renders them less resilient, makes it incumbent upon us to shift from mere adaptation and mitigation towards approaches capable of transforming cli-

It has been 36 years since the untimely passing of Robert Nesta Marley. Also known as Tuff Gong, he was just 36 years old when he died on May 11, 1981 at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital in Miami, Florida after battling cancer. And while the time seems to have whizzed by, his legacy was not lost on audiences of listener supported WBAI-FM radio, when Imhotep Gary Byrd host of the Global Black Experience touted the rich contribution of the short-lived legend.

In addition to lauding the many, many indelible, timeless musical compositions - some which are now anthems for causes (most recently the Ariana Grande "One Love" concert in Manchester, England); consistent and always-revealing attributes of his heirs, and the global celebrations established in his honor (Reggae On the River, Reggae in the Desert, Reggae in the Mountains, Reggae By The Sea, Reggae By The Nile, etc) a legacy that underscores his short life stockpiles a message he prophesied in a song when he said "dem ago tyad fi mi face."

For sure, Marley's image seems

to be a recurring feature through his children Ziggy, Stephen, Kymani, Damian, Julian, Rohan, Cedella who have all been nominated or won Grammy awards. As a matter of fact, Ziggy holds the record for winning eight, the most in the sole category devoted to Caribbean music.

To compound that magnanimous achievement Ziggy was recently awarded the Gershwin Lifetime Musical Achievement Award at UCLA's Spring Sing.

According to his spokesperson "Marley is the first reggae artist to receive the award in its 29-year history, honoring his contributions to music with 16 albums spanning three decades, countless world tours, being the first reggae act to tour China and Dubai and his global humanitarian and charitable initiatives including work across Africa, Israel, Jamaica and North America."

"Marley stands in good com-

pany, past recipients include Ray Charles, Tom Petty, Frank Sinatra, Stevie Wonder, The Who, Quincy Jones and Anthony Kiedis (Red Hot Chili Peppers). His younger brother Stephen is almost neck-and-neck standing one short of the winning amount. Cedella, the first girl born to the Rita and Bob union earned her Grammys as a member of the Melody Makers, the backers of her brother Ziggy's group.

A fashion designer ("Catch A Fire" clothing), author (five children's books), actress ("Johnny Breaker" 'The Mighty Quinn," and "Third World Cop") and mother to recent Grammy performer Skip (who shared



There are a few signs that we are on track, especially as members of the Private Sector Advisory Group continue to provide valuable perspective about building new partnerships to eradicate poverty, achieve food security and improve nutrition, water access and sanitation. Since joining the group, many companies have successfully incorporated the SDGs into their work and sustainability reports.



IRS's National Criminal Investigation Training Academy with assistance from the United States Embassy in Barbados and its International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs section.

The training was part of a continuing series of efforts by the United States government, in collaboration with Gre-



nada and other partner governments in the region, to enhance financial investigations and raise awareness of illicit financial transactions.

The course included methods of identifying fraud and money laundering and covered topics such as evidence gathering and analysis, interviewing, preparation for courtroom activities and an in-depth practical exercise.

Guvana

A report by The Carter Center in the USA has recommended that prisoners should be allowed to vote when the next general comes around.

The report which was released on May 11, 2015 elections made several recommendations to the government, the



Parliament and the Guyana Elections Commission (GECOM) among them it called for the rights of prisoners to vote to be respected, and also highlighted the slow pace of delivery of justice.

The Carter Center election observation mission was launched about a month ahead of the vote — April 8 following an invitation from the Office of the President and was led by former United States President Jimmy Carter.

Observers were deployed throughout the country in advance of Election Day, on the day itself, and also stayed on to observe the post-election environment.

The report said that Guyana should seek to facilitate voting by prisoners, particularly those held in remand, who have not yet been convicted of a crime.

In the report, the Carter Center reiterated its call for fundamental constitutional reform to reduce the problems with the current winner-take-all-system.

Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Dr. Keith Rowley told a delegation from the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) in Santiago, Chile last week, that the commission has a role to play in T&T's move towards diversification.

According to a statement from the Office of the Prime Minister, Dr. Rowley said Trinidad and Tobago is experiencing economic shock because of the reduction in reserves from the hydrocarbon sector.

He said when this happens there is a clamor for diversification.



"The question now is can we preserve that

quality of life with our current revenues and our current policies. This is where we would like ECLAC to assist us with their research as we move to expand our economic base," he added.

The prime minister who was on a two-day visit to Chile with a delegation said Trinidad and Tobago said Trinidad and Tobago has the ability to produce more goods and services that its population can absorb "and it is therefore, imperative that we look towards other markets."

boosting revenue is an increase in a National Social Responsibility Levy (NSRL) on all imports from two per cent to 10 per cent.

The NSRL was introduced at two per cent last September and since then Barbadians have been complaining of noticeable increases in the cost of many goods and services.

Now the fear is that with the 400 per cent increase effective the beginning of July consumers will wilt under massive price increases.

Caribbean financial analysts, Price Waterhouse, now known as PWC stated, "the increase in the rate of the levy from two per cent to 10 per cent is significant and would result in an increase in the cost of living to the consumer and, by extension, to the rate of inflation. Since the levy is an indirect imposition it would be considered to be a regressive method of taxation, as it also places more burden on the most vulnerable in the society".

Barbados imports more than 70 per cent of its goods with a similar figure for inputs to its services, so the combined effect of a de facto devaluation of the dollar and a massive increase in one of its sweeping import taxes would make it more expensive to purchase items abroad.





"For us what was memorable was this being the largest we've ever assembled, and we did it in one of the most prideful and demonstrative ways, showing off our Indo and Afro Caribbean cultures," said Amin. "We encouraged people to come dressed in cultural clothing and seeing people follow this theme was very nice."

He also says that seeing marchers, particularly newcomers, was the highlight of the walk because it pushes forth more self-love and provides hidden LGBT members with some encouragement.

"It's always empowering to see people come out and celebrate their heritage, we get a lot of support on social media, and there are people who live in Georgia, Canada, Trinidad



Your daddy is many things to you. He's friendly as a puppy, he's a porcupine on his face, and he's a tickle octopus. He's tall as a giraffe, wise as an owl, and he gives the best bear hugs!

When he's taking a nap, you try hard not to make a peep. You sneak around and whisper, but there are times when you can't help it: your voice accidentally gets loud, the door might slam when you go outside, or something


the House. And that's the way

This is a great book for kids to read to Dad, for Dad to read aloud, or for sharing with Grandpa, too. No matter how you enjoy it, "My Daddy Rules Your Daddy is the King of the World" is fit for any Papa's prince or princess.




Book cover of "My Daddy Rules the World" by Hope Anita



The overall highlight of the concert will be focused on the way La Lupe pushed forth her ancestry and her pride in being black, Latina, and Cuban. When the singer arrived to New York City in the 60s she faced several challenges but remained content in who she was, said CCCA's managing director.

"The performers are going to make that connection between La Lupe and the African Diaspora," said Gregory Shanck. "Not only was she Latina but she

was of African descent and she loved her music. Cuba did not always love her, but she loved her culture and her Cuban heritage."

Vega also adds that it is important to resurrect La Lupe's name for the culture's sake because her visibility it is needed to educate the younger generation, and show them the pioneers who paved the way for Latin music.

"We need to know our stories, and if we don't know our stories we will continue to be misinformed," said Vega. "The reason we have the center partner with Pregones and City College is because we need to insist upon a learning and educational process, and build our culture. We have to take on the responsibility of talking about legacy and the people who make a difference or it will be erased."


The West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) Selection Panel has named a 15-member Under-19 squad for tours of South Africa and Zimbabwe next month.

Pulisic goal gives US 1-1 tie vs Venezuela

SANDY, Utah (AP) _ Adjusting to altitude and blending in players returning from injuries produced an uneven game for the United States.

Christian Pulisic scored early in the second half, defender John Brooks limped off with a hip injury

and the Americans played a 1-1 exhibition tie against Venezuela on Saturday night, a warmup for a pair of World Cup qualifiers next week.

Jose Manuel Velazquez put Venezuela ahead in the 29th minute, but the 18-year-old Pulisic tied it in the 61st with his fifth goal in 15 interna-

tional appearances.

"It's a perfect having a game at this time," U.S. coach Bruce Arena said. "Maybe it's a little quick and all, but I think it's perfect. We needed to get a game in and get to know each other a little bit, get adjusted to the

environmental conditions."

The U.S. plays Trinidad and Tobago on Thursday at Commerce City, Colorado, then is at Mexico three days later. Rio Tinto Stadium is about 4,500 feet above sea level, preparation for matches in Colorado (about 5,200 feet) and Azteca Stadium (7,820 feet).

The U.S. is fourth in the final round of qualifying in North and Central America and the Caribbean with four points, ahead of Honduras on goal difference. Mexico leads with 10, followed by Costa Rica with seven and Panama with five. Trinidad is last with three.

The top three nations qualify for next year's World Cup in Russia, and the No. 4 nation advances to a playoff against Asia's fifth-place team.

The U.S. started close to a first-choice lineup, missing only forward Jozy Altidore, who reported late to training camp because of his brother's wedding. The center back pairing of Brooks and Geoff Cameron, starting together in central defense for the first time since October, was not sharp.

Brooks, who missed a March 28 qualifier because of a sinus infection, hobbled off in the 51st minute with a bruised right hip and was replaced six minutes later by Matt Hedges.

Velazquez scored his third international goal after Junior Moreno's cor-

ner kick was headed by Pulisic only for the ball to stay in the penalty area. Clint Dempsey headed the ball again in another clearance attempt, but it went wide to Moreno.

Moreno headed the ball back into the penalty area to Velazquez, who moved between Brooks and Fabian Johnson, stuck out his right foot at the top of the 6-yard box and poked the ball past goal-keeper Tim Howard.

"Obviously, we're not happy with giving the goal away from the set piece," U.S. captain Michael Bradley said. "That's something we've got to continue to work on and really clean up because that's a few games in a row now where we've not done a good enough job in that regard."

Venezuela nearly doubled the lead five minutes later. Moreno sent a corner kick across the penalty area and Rubert Quijada had an open diving header at the 6. Howard dived to push the ball off a post, and the ball bounced across the goalmouth, where it was cleared by Bradley

The U.S. did not have a shot on goal in the first half.

"Venezuela played very well," Arena said. "They had a game plan that I think we may see on Thursday, as well. Dropped off, defended spaces well, pressured the ball and countered caught us on a set piece. We were very poor on a couple of set pieces tonight."

He and Narine are the only two Windies players in the top 50.

"The defense was a little shabby," the coach said. "You have to play defense to win."


LaSalle scored two more runs on a double and sacrifice fly in the top of the third inning, pushing the score to 5-0.

Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges. "Consumers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party."


