WIADCA launches 50th anniversary of Caribbean Carnival

The colors, pageantry and sound of Caribbean Carnival were fully on display last Thursday, as the West Indian American Day Carnival Association (WIADCA) launched its 50th anniversary celebration of Caribbean Carnival Week in New York.

Masqueraders from a number of mas camps, as well as carnival lovpoliticians, converged on the Brooklyn Children's Museum for the grand celebration, held under the theme, "From a Dream to a Legacy."

"It's good that we got to the 50th anniversary," costume-clad Trinidadian Kay Mason, described as the "Queen of Labor Day Carnival," told Caribbean Life among the gaiety.

"I want to thank WIADCA for their organization over the years," added Mason, who won WIADCA's Carnival Queen nine times and

was five times "Queen of out the Vote," while callthe Bands" in Trinidad and Tobago Carnival.

"It's a milestone to bring this culture together, so we can celebrate," continued Mason, representing perennial West Indian American Day Carnival Parade's Band the Year Champions Sesame Flyers, who was honored by WIADCA in

Other mas bands ers, officials and area represented included Detailz Mas, Antoine International, Amezilia Costumes and Diamond Entertainment.

> "This is my first year; and, so far, so good," said Giselle Thomas, the Trinidadian designer of Amezilia Costumes. "It's very interesting.'

> Brooklyn Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke, perhaps, spoke for the Caribbean community in New York, stating that it was "important that we stand with pride."

> Later, in her brief remarks, she led the audience to a chant of "Get

ing for President Donald J. Trump's ouster, with the refrain, "As soon as Possible."

WIADCA's president William Howard assured the effervescent crowd that "you'll have a good time [during the Carnival Parade on Eastern Parkway.

"We'll see you for Labor Day," he said.

The 50th Annual New York Caribbean Carnival Week kicks off on Thursday, Aug. 31, with Reggae Unda Di Stars.

WIADCA said this "funky reggae party" features reggae ambassadors Cocoa Tea, Ghanian Dancehall Reggae artist, Stonebwoy, and Brooklyn's own Afrobeat songstress, WUNMI, performing popular hits, such as She Loves Me Now, FYAH, My Name, Come from Far and Fit Body.

NEW YORK CARIBBEAN CARNIVAL PARADE

DATE: Labor Day - Monday, to enter Parade. Sept. 4, 2017

TIME: 8 am to 6 pm

PARADE ROUTE: Eastern Parkway

Utica Avenue to Grand Army Plaza

BAND RULES & REGULATIONS

- APPLICATION FORMS: Every Single 1.1. Group or Band must fill out WIADCA application forms. Acceptance of application forms depend on applicant meeting ALL guidelines and is not guaranteed.
- **REGISTRATION COST:** Registration Fees 1.2. for bands will be as follows:

\$500.00 ADULT BAND - LARGE -ADULT BAND - MEDIUM -\$400.00 ADULT BAND - SMALL -\$300.00 JUNIOR BAND \$300.00 Admission to Brooklyn Museum \$5.00

- 1.3. BAND LEADERS: will be responsible for the following:
- 1.3.1. The organization of their respective band on Labor Day
- 1.3.2. Be at the parade starting point by 9:00
- 1.3.3. Keeping order in the band along the parade

1.3.4. Ensuring that only costumed masqueraders enter the reviewing area for judging

1.4. BANDS: Trucks or Floats must have Proper Registration and must pass Highway Inspection

1.4.1. No one (artist/performer) is permitted to ride on top of the truck cabs.

1.4.2. Bands without a permit from WIADCA will not be allowed to participate in the Parade.

1.4.3. Only paid band revellers and properly identified band security and personnel are allowed in costumed bands.

1.4.4. Band Leaders should be prepared to present their permit to the Police or any authorized member of WIADCA upon request.

1.4.5. Band Leaders must ensure the safety of their band members by providing at least 10 Marshals per 100 masqueraders during their participation on the parade route.

1.4.6. Persons accompanying floats may not stop and walk in the opposite direction of the bands.

1.4.7. Band Leaders must take responsibility to ensure that promotional items or otherwise should not be thrown from the truck (e.g. t-shirts, CDs

1.4.8. Band Leaders must restrict the participation of non-masqueraders.

EXCLUDED BANDS: Artist Trucks, Advertising Trucks & T-Shirt Bands are excluded from Registration by WIADCA.

1.6. BAND VISITS: All bands will be visited by WIADCA Officials and NYPD before final registra-

NYPD ESCORT: NYPD will provide escorts 1.7. to Parkway to registered bands ONLY!

1.8. RETURNING BANDS: Loud music CAN-NOT be played on STREETS on the way back to Mas Camps!

TRAVEL: Please use Public Transporta-1.9. tion. All subways and buses in Brooklyn will connect to the parade area. Vehicles are discouraged - There is NO PARKING in the area.

1.10. DISQUALIFICATIONS / PENALIZATIONS: This year there will be a zero tolerance policy for nudity and indecent exposure. Bands will be disqualified and escorted off the parade route for nudity, indecent behavior and exposure by any individual, in or out of any band. NO EXCEPTIONS. Failure to comply with any of the rules stated in this document may result in removal from the Parade.

THERE WILL BE ZERO TOLERENCE FOR NUDI-TY AND INDECENT EXPOSURE!

NO STRINGS, NO THONGS, NO G-STRINGS, NO FULL BODY PAINT, NO C-CUP (panties) NO WIRES (lower body) HOWEVER, WIRE BRAS UP TO D-CUPS ARE PERMITTED.

1.11. ALCOHOL: Absolutely NO Alcoholic Beverages to be sold or carried on parade route.

SPECTATORS

1.12.1. Spectators are not permitted to enter Parkway Route. No Crossing on Eastern Parkway until there is a gap in the procession of floats and bands. Pedestrian crossing may be allowed at Nostrand.

1.12.2. All non-costumed persons in any band MUST move completely OUT OF THE BANDS before Classon Ave. Only costumed members may be on Stage for Judging

ALL SPECTATORS 1.12.3. AND NON-COSTUMED PERSONS MUST STAY BEHIND POLICE BAR-RICADES AT ALL TIMES!

1.13. IMAGES: WIADCA reserves the right to use the names, images, and mas designs of the COMPETI-TORS to advertise and promote the future parade. WIADCA reserves the right to record, film, videotape, broadcast, and to transmit via internet the proceedings and performances of the Parade. Acknowledgement of images and mas designs will be made related to the band.

1.14. DISCLAIMER: WIADCA WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY INJURIES CAUSED BY PARADE VEHICLES OFF THE PARKWAY AFTER THE PARADE.

1.15. INSURANCE: Each band will be provided a specimen of the Acceptable Insurance Certificate for all trucks and floats that will be participating Labor Day Parade along Eastern Park-

1.15.1. All vehicles taking part in the Parade MUST be insured separately with the policy naming WIADCA as co-insured & the City of New York.

1.15.2. Insurance coverage can be purchased at ANY insurance firm; however insurance certificates must be EXACT replica of the specimen provided.

1.15.3. of insurance certificates, WIADCA reserves the right to verify coverage with their own insurance company.

1.16. VEHICLES: Trucks or Floats MUST have Proper Registration and MUST PASS Highway Inspection to enter Parade. No one (artist / performer) is permitted to ride on top of the truck cabs.

1.16.1. Floats and all other vehicles must have WIADCA Permits, Registration and (one) day Insurance Stickers to enter Parade Route. New York State Highway Police will be conducting thorough inspections of all vehicles before entry on Parade Route. Inquire ASAP at WIADCA's Office: 323 Rogers Ave., Brooklyn at 718-467-1797.

1.16.2.All vehicles MUST be registered three (3) weeks in advance with Association at 323-325 Rogers Ave., Brooklyn, NY 11225.

1.16.3. Trucks and floats with corporate advertising that are not registered with WIADCA will not be allowed to enter parade route.

1.16.4. Vehicles are to display only the banners which have been approved and authorized by WIADCA.

1.16.5.Band Leaders are allowed a

more than one (1) Food truck on the Parkway and no more than 15 adults on that truck during the parade.

1.16.6.Band Leaders and / or drivers MUST NOT allow anyone to ride on the side of their Trucks or Floats. Band Leaders will be held responsible for any injuries caused by such action.

1.17. CONGESTION: Please be mindful of your neighbors! Do NOT block traffic! Do Not PARK in Driveways! Do NOT block Bands on Parade Route & Do Not Jump in other Mas

1.18. **VEHICLE OPERATIONS**

- All Operators / Drivers must have valid license to present to Highway Inspectors
- All Vehicles must have valid inspection stickers
- Operator / Driver should have proof of valid insurance
- Brake lights and tail-lights must be clearly visible at all times
- Brake lights shall be in proper working order
- The coupling device (if applicable) must be in proper working order
- All floats and trucks MUST have wheel guards on rear wheels
- Tires should be in good condition
- Vehicle load (speakers) must be safely secured
- No object shall extend past the front, back or sides of the vehicle
- WIADCA & NYPD advise utilizing 18 wheeler low bed trailers
- No flammable liquid may be carried or stored on floats or trailers
- Floats must have protective Upon submission coverings the length of trailer to cover wheels (front to back)
 - Sound truck/floats shall install mirrors that eliminate blind spots around the vehicle.
 - Only persons affiliated with the music shall be permitted on any float or sound truck
 - No person may board a moving sound truck, float or other parade vehicle
 - No person may distribute promotional items from floats or trailers that are either moving or stationary on route
 - No one is allowed to "throw" gifts to spectators AT no TIME or PLACE! Anyone doing so will be fined by NYPD
 - Children under 16 years old are not permitted on floats
 - Safety marshals must be easily identified by wearing distinctive clothing
 - All Bands must have adequate number of MARSHALS for BAND SIZE!
 - Supply vehicles to maintain a safe distance between themselves and the parade float
- Alcohol consumption is maximum of two (2) vehicles and no strictly prohibited on trailers and Continued on Page A6

- All Music Trucks must have guards on all wheels, properly secured and have constructed railings that do not obstruct the driver's view
- Load Height Nothing higher than 13.6 feet from street level will be allowed NO EXCEPTIONS!
- To facilitate turning corners, hinged covers are to be built where cab wheels join flatbed trailer
- All truck-cabs must be properly cordoned-off for safety reasons
- Railings built around trucktrays must be strong and secured with specifications as per NYPD and Highway Police
- For safety / security reasons ONLY persons relating to music and performances will be allowed on trucks by NYPD

JUDGING CRITERIA FOR BANDS

3. ADULT KINGS & QUEENS; MALE & FEMALE INDIVIDUALS

- 3.1. COMPETITION RULES: The COMPETITOR agrees to appear at the appropriate show sponsored by WIADCA and to perform, compete under, and be bound by the following rules, and to comply with all instructions given by the Stage Manager or an authorized member of WIADCA concerning the presentation of the show in which the COMPETITOR takes part.
- 3.2. IMAGES: WIADCA reserves the right to use the names, images, and mas designs of the COMPETITORS to advertise and promote the future competitions. WIADCA reserves the right to record, film, videotape, broadcast, and to transmit via internet the proceedings and performances of the Competition. Acknowledgement of images and mas designs will be made related to the band

3.3. REGISTRATION

Registration shall commence on Wednesday, July 5, and continue thru Wednesday, Aug, 2, 2017 (10 am -4 pm) at 325 Rogers Ave., Brooklyn. Late registration will not be accepted.

- 3.3.1. All information must be clearly written and submitted in block letters on the registration form. The categories are as follow:
 - a) Name of Mas Player
 - b) Name of Band
- c) Name of the Costume, portrayal and a brief description

- d) C o s t u m e designed & made by
- e) Specify tune selection. Any special selec-

tion should be presented on a CD and given to the DJ one hour (1) in advance.

- 3.4. All registration must be completed by Aug. 12, 2017.
- 3.5. There will be NO REGISTRATION on the night of the COMPETITION.
- 3.6. The costume from one competition cannot be used or adjusted with minor changes such as: additions of fabric or pieces added, to compete in another category of WIADCA competition within the same year.
- 3.7. All costumes entering the WIADCA competitions will be subject to inspection (screening) at the prejudging on the grounds of the museum prior to being judged on stage. At the pre-judging digital recordings or photos will be taken of each costume so that costumes can be reviewed by the judges prior to their appearance on stage. These measures are taken to ensure fair competition for all competitors and a smooth, rapid flow of costumes across the stage. Any deviation or repetition of any costumes or parts of costumes from the images taken are subject to deduction in points or disqualification of competitor.

3.8. CRITERIA & DEFINITION

3.8.1. Color & Impact: An appropriate and pleasing blend of colors, which is relevant to the particular portrayal of the colors displayed, must tell a story. Purists in the world of art contend that black and white are not colors. In the contest of Carnival, black and white are accepted as colors in the same way that for example, red, yellow, and blue are. Throughout the sense of sight, the object viewed seeks to create an impression. t evokes a reaction and it makes up a degree of appreciation and admiration. It may be akin to "love at first sight," the intensity of which is not so much analytical as it is sensory.

 $3.8.2.\;$ Spirit of Carnival: This category is self-explanatory. A close observation should be made in this catego-

OECS body to govern Citizenship by Investment Program

By Bert Wilkinson

The nine-nation Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) will establish an umbrella body to oversee the highly controversial but cashproviding foreign dollars for local passport scheme arguing that it is better to harmonize the system than have individual islands do their own thing with all the global controversy swirling around it.

Antiguan Prime Minister Gaston Browne said this week that the time had come for a comprehensive review of the system given major hiccups in various countries about the Citizenship by Investment Program (CIP) where foreigners pay or invest specified sums to obtain a local passport and citizenship.

Several western nations have complained about the inability of the smaller nations to properly scrutinize the backgrounds

of some of those applying as it has turned out that many have done so to escape criminal prosecutions back home.

Grenada, Dominica, Antigua, St. Kitts and St. Lucia all have active CIP schemes in place with applicants paying or investing up to \$3M in real estate or other programs in the region in exchange for passports and citizenship awards. The fees in some countries are drastically lower.

"We have held discussions with the various leaders within the OECS, and they have all agreed it's now for the technicians to put the logistics together to ensure there is full cooperation and harmonization going forward," Browne told the local Observer Newspaper. "These things do not happen overnight, and when you are dealing with like five different countries, it will take

ture, Commissioner James P. O'Neill said the NYPD is committed to making it safe for all.

That's why, in addition to providing these enhanced security measures and additional public safety resources, we've been strengthening our partnerships with the community, elected officials, other city agencies and other stakeholders," he said. "Each of us has the ability to make J'Ouvert safer and more enjoyable, and together we're so much stronger."

In past years, the J'Ouvert parade, which precedes the massive West Indian American Day Carnival Parade on Brooklyn's sprawling Eastern Parkway, started at 4 am.

But the decision to step off this year's parade two hours later, at 6 am was a "joint, strategic judgment" made by the parade's organizers and permit holders - J'Ouvert City International — and the NYPD in an effort to reduce the potential for violence, according to the Mayor's Office.

This year, the formation area and parade route will close to the general public the night before the parade.

Hundreds of additional uniformed officers — an increase of more than 10 percent over last year — will provide security at 12 secure entry points and along the two-mile parade route.

Both parade participants and spectators will be screened for weapons and alcoholic beverages. In addition, backpacks and other large bags will be prohibited, the NYPD said.

Organizers said each entry point will be outfitted with light towers to increase safety and facilitate the ease of entry.

Additional light towers — representing a total increase of about 30 percent over last year — will be placed along the parade route.

The NYPD said it will also deploy additional high-resolution security cameras this year.

Grenada

The Ministry of Natural Resources and the GGB have attributed the strong performance to recent measures implemented by the government to boost production and export levels.

Haiti

Haitian legislators have banned same-sex marriages as well as all forms of public demonstrations in support of homosexuality.

The Senate recently approved the measures that include sanctions and specifies that perpetrators, accomplices of homosexual marriages face Guyana's gold production is boom- a penalty of three years imprison-

ment and a fine of US\$5,000.

The bill, in addition to prohibiting marriage, or attempted marriage

between two persons, also includes foreigners on Haitian territory to solicit the celebration in Haiti of a marriage between



two persons of the same sex.

The bill must now go to the Lower House for debate before being sent to the executive for publication in the official newspaper.

age of 12, from 50 to 250 per year.





A Guyanese hero in America

Guyanese-born, Deputy Inspector Deodat Urprasad is soft spoken, but his presence in the New York City Police Department is a powerful reminder that it does not matter where you come from, your contribution could leave an indelible mark on the lives you touch every day.

Just recently, Urprasad who is the commanding officer of the 102nd Prescient in Richmond Hill, Queens was presented with two awards, within two weeks. He received the Legacy Award from the Queens Tribune, and later Public Advocate Letitia James presented the officer with a Caribbean Heritage Month Proclamation in recognition of his outstanding work in the community.

A long time resident of Queens, the officer said he was humbled by the recognition he received for his work in the community, but added that creating lasting bonds and treating the community with respect made his work in law enforcement rewarding.

Urprasad's story about an immigrant coming to the United States for a better life and to

pursue educational opportunities may sound familiar, but his speaks volumes. His determination, hard work and commitment to his community are what kept him in the NYCPD, for 25 years.

After obtaining a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science from York College, with plans to pursue a career in law, officer Urprasad took a detour and joined the Little Flowers Children Services foster care agency while continuing his education at John Jay College of Criminal Justice from where he obtained a Master's Degree in Public Administration.

During this time he graduated from the Police Academy and began his career as a hous-

Urparsad worked his way up clocking hours throughout the boroughs learning how to end conflict, and avoid arrests of residents whom he had fostered good relationships, many whom he said, were model citi-

After being appointed sergeant in 1999, and transferred to the 79th Precinct, and the Brooklyn North Evidence Collection Team, he was promoted to lieutenant in December 2002, where he served in the 41st Precinct,

The decorated career officer was promoted to captain in June 2007 and worked in the Bronx as the executive officer of the 45th and 43rd Precincts and Impact Zone Captain in the 40th and 41st Precincts.

His role in helping to reduce the crime rate in his jurisdiction has been commended. For this, he was awarded the rank of deputy inspector in 2015, and commanding officer of the 102nd Precinct.

Officer Urprasad often times found himself out in the community, bringing along his fellow officers, to engage citizens in their day-to-day duties.

After migrating to the United States with his parents in August 1973, exactly 44 years ago, at age 5, it could be said this officer truly personifies discipline in his quest to achieve the American dream, as he continues his love of law enforcement.



Trump's assault on immigrants is wrong!

"America was indebted to immigration for her settlement and prosperity. That part of America which had encouraged them most had advanced most rapidly in population, agriculture and the arts."

-James Madison

A bewildering 22 percent of inmates in the federal prison population are immigrants who have either already been deemed to be in the country illegally or who the government is looking to put in deportation proceedings. They are the stock in trade steered into incarceration by a judicial system that incarcerates minorities and immigrants to feed those evil puppet masters who thrive on exploiting and enslaving them. See, e.g., "The Prison Industry in the United States: Big Business or a New Form of Slavery?" by Vicky Peláez published in Global Research.

Moreover, nearly 50,000 unauthorized immigrants were ordered removed from the U.S., a 28 percent increase over last year, according to statistics released by the immigration review branch of the U.S Department of Justice. an inhumane act which destroyed families, businesses and dreams in its wake.

The 22 percent is much higher than the population of foreign-born in the U.S. as a whole-13.5 percent. Moreover, the government confirmed more than 42,000 aliens in federal prisons as of June 24. About 47 percent already face

final deportation orders, making them illegal immigrants, and 3 percent are currently in immigration courts facing deportation proceedings. Almost all of the rest are being probed by federal agents looking to deport them.

Immigrants who commit serious crimes, even if they once had legal status, can have that status revoked and can be subject to deportation, hence the high number of cases where an alien is still being probed by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Additionally, The U.S. Marshal Service, is holding about 12,000 "selfreporting" aliens, and almost all of them have already been ordered deported.

The DOJ's Executive Office of Immigration Review's data also revealed that total orders of removal combined with voluntary departures by immigrants in the U.S. between Feb. 1 and July 31 were up close to 31 percent over that same period last year. Final decisions issued by immigration judges also rose 14.5 percent during that time frame this year, the DOJ said recently.

There was also a total of 73,127 final decisions issued by immigration judges between February and the end of July this year, compared to 63,850 issued during the same period last year.

The boost in orders of removal over last year is undoubtedly the consequence of President Trump's signing of an execu-

Who is Latin America and the **Caribbean leaving behind?**

UNITED NATIONS, Aug 21, 2017 (IPS) - Last month at the High Level Political Forum in New York, more than 40 countries — 11 from Latin America and the Caribbean — shared their progress in achieving the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), within the new 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda.

The meeting has made evident the region's political will to adopt and accomplish this universal agenda. Argentina, Belize, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Panama, Peru and Uruguay presented their progress, along with Colombia, Mexico and Venezuela that shared their reports in 2016.

The SDGs recognize the virtue of inclusive, sustainable economic growth that respects the environment and strengthens institutional and regulatory frameworks. The agenda seeks to "leave no one behind," and admits that the market alone does not solve all problems. This is fundamental for our region, the most unequal in the world.

During the Forum, the Secretary-General presented his global report on the SDGs, which also shows progress and challenges for Latin America and the Caribbean. Over the past two decades, the region has accomplished extraordinary achievements: the proportion of the population living in extreme poverty (or on less than \$ 1.90 per day) fell The region remains the most violent in the world, with 27.3 murders per 100,000 inhabitants.

from 13.9 percent (1999) to 5.4 percent (2013). In addition, 61% of Latin Americans had some type of social protection in 2016.

But the report also reveals that we remain indebted to certain groups, especially young people and women. In addition to being a young person or woman, being afro-descendant, indigenous, LGBTI or a person with disabilities affects the opportunities and possibilities of social and economic advancement and access to services in our region, as a recent UNDP study shows.

There are challenges for young people, especially those with low incomes. Annual GDP per capita growth has declined over the last decade and the youth unemployment rate (17.2) was almost three times higher than for adults (6.1) in 2016.

If the world was previously focused on measuring the number of children in school, the new agenda looks more at the quality of education. This report shows that, although there are more students than ever before, in many countries in the region only half of them have achieved minimum levels of proficiency in reading or mathematics at the end of primary education.

Moreover, the region remains the most violent in the world, with 27.3 mur-

ders per 100,000 inhabitants. Young Latin-Americans, especially men, are the most affected by crime and violence and vet are the most common perpetrators, according to a UNDP report which also calls for avoiding the criminalization and stigmatization of young people, particularly those with low income.

Many challenges remain for women. An average of 12 percent suffered physical or sexual violence by their partners in the last 12 months. In addition, we have the second highest rate of teenage pregnancies in the world. Also, women do three times more unpaid work at home than men, a disparity that increases in Latin America when there are children in the house-

On the other hand, there are more women in parliaments in our region than ever before. The proportion jumped from 15.2 percent in 2000 to 29.4 percent in 2017, with Latin America being today the second region of the world with more female MPs.

Beyond the report's figures, the region has taken concrete steps in creating or adapting institutions to implement the SDGs, and several countries are moving towards incorporating the targets into their planning and budgeting.

This is good news. The new agenda provides a historic opportunity to rethink the region's traditional progress model and encourages many countries to define new ways of working with the public sector, private sector and civil society, for our planet and our people, leaving no one behind.

tive order on January 25 requiring more stringent enforcement on immigration. It also mandated the hiring of 10,000 more immigration officers, targeted funding for so-called sanctuary cities and revived a controversial information sharing program known as Secure Communities, which allows fingerprints of arrested individuals to be checked against U.S. Department of Homeland Security databases.

The agency mobilized more than 100 existing immigration judges to DHS detention facilities across the country after Trump signed his January order, triggering a 90 percent

increase of the cases those new judges oversaw resulting in orders or removal requiring unauthorized immigrants to depart or be removed. The Justice Department has also hired an additional 54 immigration judges since Trump took office "and continues to hire new immigration judges each month."

In contrast, between Feb. 1 and July 31 this year, 49,983 unauthorized immigrants were ordered removed, compared to 39,113 last year. Another 7,086 unauthorized immigrants agreed to voluntarily depart the U.S., bringing the total removal and voluntary departures so far this year to 57,069, whereas he total orders of removal

increase of the cases those new judges oversaw resulting in orders or removal last year was 43,595.







Using mobile phones

Leading the list of the top distractions behind the wheel are mobile phones. Phones now do more than just place calls, and drivers often cannot pull away from their phones, even when driving. According to the California Department of Motor Vehicles, studies have shown that driving performance is lowered and the level of distraction is higher for drivers who are heavily engaged in cell

phone conversations. The use of a hands-free device does not lower distraction levels. The percentage of vehicle crashes and near-crashes attributed to dialing is nearly identical to the number associated with talking or listening.

Perhaps they're checking out a house in a new neighborhood or thought they saw someone they knew on the street corner. Try to eat meals before getting in the car. For those who must snack while en route, take a moment to pull over at a rest area and spend 10 minutes snacking there before resuming the trip.

Reading

Glancing at an advertisement, updating a Facebook status or reading a book are all activities that should be avoided when driving. Even pouring over a traffic map or consulting the digital display of a GPS system can be distracting.

Twenty-six nations participate in Carifesta

A Trinidadian Red Devil, a marauding Guyanese tiger, flouncing Bermudians, and Barbadian stilt walkers were among the 1,500 artists and performers who pranced and danced their way from Queen's Park to Kensington Oval Sunday to declare open the 13th Caribbean Festival of Creative

A total of 26 nations, from Guyana and Venezuela in the south to Bermuda in the north, invaded Barbados for this 11-day cultural extravaganza that promises to showcase all the Caribbean has to offer in traditional practices and beliefs.

Among those nations is for the first time a Diaspora group from Canada representing the many people of the Caribbean who have made that North American country home.

The colourful Sunday opening that climaxed at the Oval with each nation announcing its presence in song and dance, was two days late owing to the passage of Tropical Storm Harvey that damaged some Barbadian households Friday on its way to put discomfort in the Windward Islands.

But the energy displayed on the Bridgeton roadways Sunday as the teams tramped to the Oval showed the typical resilience of a Caribbean people whose lives are affected for six months of every year by Hurricanes or threats of storms.

With the opening festivities aside, countries will now have individual platforms to not only display their unique twist to Caribbean culture, but also there will be joint theatrical productions of dance, mime, and expressive acting, nation markets, along with a number of symposia discussing the life and significance of cultural icons from Marcus Garvey to Derek Walcott.

Speaking at Kensington Oval Sunday night Barbadian Culture Minister, Stephen Lashley noted that Carifesta as a Festival "was birthed in the imaginations of our Caribbean Literary Artists as far back as 1967 at a Writers' Conference at the University of Kent, in England. Those great sons of the Caribbean soil, among them George Lamming, C. L. R. James, Andrew Salkey and Samuel Selvon, were inspired

to advocate for the staging of a major arts festival within the Caribbean which would bring Caribbean Artistes together.

'The vision of those bold cultural ambassadors was realized when their resolution for the staging of a Caribbean Arts Festival was favorably considered by the CARICOM Heads of Government Conference and the first edition of Carifesta held in Guyana in 1972.'

Financial constraints among the nations of the region caused a temporary halt of this form of collective Caribbean expression until a revival of the cultural party in 1992.

Lashley noted, "we have found the strength within ourselves to survive, a practice adopted during enslavement and colonization. Our cultural moorings were always our anchors of sanity and stability. Carifesta therefore remains the best opportunity for the region to respond to these threats, as it challenges us to look within ourselves and to our special traditions.

"It ought to remind us that we need now more than ever to work even harder towards

full regional integration, by our presence here this evening we must as a proud Caribbean people rededicate ourselves to the dream of our forefathers of a united Caribbean, politically,

economically and socially."

Caribbean lifestyle is alive in Carifesta and promises to have Barbados bubbling in this cultural melting pot over the next week and a half.







This appreciation is extended to our administrators who work tirelessly in striving to provide each student with a quality Catholic education.


Partners in Catholic education







Navigating tech choices for school use

daily lives of students. Whether it's kids learning their ABCs or graduate students pursuing advanced degrees, technology has transformed the way lessons are taught and learned.

Statistics support the notion that technology in the classroom is irreplaceable. According to data from the tutoring resource PracTutor, Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, and various colleges, 98 percent of schools have one or more computers in the classroom. In addition, 77 percent of teachers use the internet for instruction, while 40 percent of teachers report students use computers during instructional time in the classroom.

Many instructors now assign homework that must be completed online. The Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development looked at computer usage among 15-yearolds across 31 nations and regions.

echnology is essential in the nations reported spending between portability. Desktops are not easily one and two hours a day on a computer outside of school. Because computers are so necessary in and out of the classroom, families and students may want to revisit their options before buying new devices:

Desktop computer

Desktop computers used to be the go-to for families and students, and there are still many reasons why desktops make sense. In addition to their relatively inexpensive sticker price, desktop computers allow students to customize their packages according to their needs and get a powerful operating system in the process. New and advanced processing speeds also mean that many desktop computers can be relied on for educational purposes while also being fast enough to handle recreational gaming.

One of the main disadvantages Many students in high-performing of desktop computers is their lack of

moved, and if repairs are necessary, it can be a hassle to have them fixed.

Laptop computers

Over the last decade, laptop computers have become more popular than desktop computers, largely because of their portability. Laptops are designed to be taken from place to place, so students can use them for note-taking in the classroom and then studying at home.

Laptop processors have just about caught up to desktop processors, but they may be lacking the processing pop unless consumers are willing to pay more for laptops with high performance. Another shortcoming of laptops is that they generally have smaller screens than desktop computers, which can make working on fine details more challenging.

Tablets

Tablets offer the most in terms of guide the process.

portability. They're lightweight and small and offer a wealth of access in a compact package. Today's tablets offer much more than the first such devices to hit the market. Some can run apps and equivalent programs that were once exclusive to desktop and laptop computers. Tablets also tend to be less expensive than desktops or laptops.

Where tablets may fall short is in the peripherals. It's difficult to connect backup drives and other accessories to tablets. However, with advancements in cloud-based storage, this may not be an issue. Also, note-taking on virtual keyboards may be more challenging, and working on tablets' small screens can be tiresome over time. Convertible tablet and laptops are now emerging to bridge these gaps.

Finding balance with extracurricular activities

any high schools, colleges, and universities emphasize their goals of producing wellrounded students. Extracurricular activities teach students important life lessons, provide them opportunities to socialize, and often stimulate their minds and bodies in ways that differ from the stimulation provided in the classroom.

Data from the U.S. Census Bureau states that, in 2014, 57 percent of children between the ages of 6 and 17 participate in at least one after-school extracurricular activity. Children are more likely to participate in sports than clubs or lessons — such as music, dance, and language — but each of these activities can be beneficial to students' development.

Students who participate in extracurricular activities may want to limit their participation to 20 hours per week. This is according to a group of professors from Stanford University and Villanova University who have been collecting data on the issue since 2007. In their report "Extracurricular Activity in High-Performing School Contexts: Stress Buster, Booster or Buffer?," Jerusha Conner and Sarah Miles found that 87 percent of kids who would be considered to have packed schedules were perfectly happy unless they were doing more than four hours

The "over-scheduling hypothesis" may be overhyped. This is the concern that too much organized activity participation leads to poor developmental outcomes. This hypothesis also suggests that hectic schedules also undermine family functioning, detract from schoolwork, and possibly increase the risk of copycat behaviors and excessive competitiveness. However, in the study "The Over-Scheduling Hypothesis Revisited: Intensity of Organized Activity Participation During Adolescence and Young Adult Outcomes," researchers J.L. Mahoney and Andrea Vest determined that, controlling for demographic factors and baseline adjustment, extracurricular intensity was a significant predictor of positive outcomes and unrelated to indicators of problematic adjustment (e.g., psychological distress, substance use, antisocial behavior) at young adulthood.

Even though extracurricular activities are largely positive — even when schedules are packed – parents need to be aware of the diminishing returns of too many activities. This is something called the "threshold effect." Benefits from extracurriculars can level off when too many activities are being juggled. If a child is experiencing anxiety, sleeplessness, or depression, or seems overly stressed, it could be time to reduce his time spent do-

ing structured activities.

It's essential that families use the cues given by kids to assess what students can handle. And children should be encouraged to be honest with their parents about their extracurricular activities as

Add health screenings to back-to-school checklist

s summer vacation winds down, thoughts turn mRqmt.asp. from jaunts to the beach to readying for a new school year. To-do lists include many of the typical tasks that precede going back to the classroom, including shopping for new clothes, purchasing school supplies, and finishing summer reading

Another essential requirement parents must find time for is completing their children's health screenings and immunizations so youngsters can return to

Health screenings may include, but may not be limited to, routine physical exams, eye exams, and dental cleanings. Each school district may have its own set of health requirements that must be met in order for children to attend school.

Many schools require that children are up-todate with all immunizations before they can begin a new school year. The issue of vaccinations has inspired debate in recent years, but parents should recognize that many schools will only exempt students from receiving certain vaccinations due to religious reasons. For a list of state vaccination requirements and possible exemptions for schools in the United States, visit www2a.cdc.gov/nip/schoolsurv/schIm-

Students who have specific learning disabilities or medical conditions that require classroom modification should obtain recent documentation from any therapists or specialists prior to beginning a new school year. Doing so facilitates the process of setting up procedures within the school while ensuring children have what they need to excel in the classroom. All parents may want to ask doctors to provide copies of medical and immunization records so that schools will have the most recent copies on file.

Parents should schedule eye examinations well in advance of the first day of school so they have ample time to fill new prescriptions for youngsters before school begins. This ensures kids won't be starting off on the wrong foot because of vision problems that could already have been addressed.

Parents of adolescents or students on the verge of adolescence may want to address the subject of bodily changes before the school year begins anew. Address which changes can be expected, including the start of menstruation for girls. This will help children better understand what is happening when they witness changes in themselves and fellow class-

mates and give them a chance to receive accurate information rather than gossip from their peers.

Why music education matters

ome the 2016–17 school year, the music and arts budget in the Los Angeles Unified School District will reach its highest point in a dozen years. While that's great news for students, it also illustrates the sad fact that arts and music programs have taken a considerable hit in recent decades, when arts education fell victim to budget

The benefits of music education extend far beyond getting kids to tap their toes. The National Association for Music Education lists the following benefits among the many reasons to support music education in schools:

Music training helps develop language skills. Studies have shown that music training contributes to the physical development of the part of the left side of the brain associated with processing language. A 2005 study from researchers at Stanford University found that mastering a musical instrument may also improve reading skills, which can benefit students both inside and outside the classroom.

It can improve hand-eye coordination. Studies have linked long-term music training to improved hand-eye coordination. That is likely connected to the motor skills children develop when playing musical instruments. Without those instruments, those motor skills may not develop as

Music improves concentration. In 2007, a re-

search team from the Stanford University School of Medicine found that music engages the areas of the brain involved with paying attention. Today's students deal with numerous distractions, from smartphones to tablets to social media, but those who routinely listen to certain types of music might find it easier to block out those distractions and focus on their work.

It can help students' emotional development. A 2003 study commissioned by Chorus America found musicians are more likely than the average person to be involved in charity work as volunteers and donors. The National Association for Music Education also notes that music students may be more likely to exhibit empathy toward other cultures.

Music can improve self-esteem. In a study examining 117 fourth-grade students attending public school in Montreal, a researcher at the University of Texas at Austin found that children who received piano lessons weekly for three years had higher self-esteem than children who were not given piano lessons during the same period. Neither group had participated in formal music instruction before the study, and students in both groups reported similar levels of self-esteem prior to participating in the study.

Music education can enrich the lives of young students in a myriad of ways, potentially contributing to happier, more fulfilling lives.







New tool analyses 'climatesmart agriculture'

PORT OF SPAIN, Trinidad, Aug 14, 2017 (IPS) — A Trinidadian scientist has developed a mechanism for determining the degree of climate-smart agriculture (CSA) compliance with respect to projects, processes and products.

This comes as global attention is drawn to climate-smart agriculture as one of the approaches to mitigate or adapt to climate change.

Steve Maximay says his Climate-Smart Agriculture Compliant (C-SAC) tool provides a certification and auditing scheme that can be used to compare projects, processes and products to justify the applicability and quantum of climate change funding.

"C-SAC provides a step-bystep, checklist style guide that a trained person can use to determine how closely the project or process under review satisfies the five areas of compliance," Maximay told IPS.

"This method literally

forces the examiner to consider key aspects or goals of climate-smart agriculture. These aspects (categories) are resource conservation; energy use; safety; biodiversity support; and greenhouse gas reduction."

He said each category is further subdivided, so resource conservation includes the use of land, water, nutrients and labour. Energy use includes its use in power, lighting, input manufacture and transportation. Safety revolves around production operations, harvesting, storage and utilization.

Biodiversity support examines land clearing, off-site agrochemical impact, limited introduction of invasive species, and ecosystem services impact. Greenhouse gas reduction involves enteric fermentation (gas produced in the stomach of cattle and other animals that chew their cud), soil management, fossil fuel reduction and manure / waste management.

"These subdivisions (four each in the five categories) are the basis of the 20 questions that comprise the C-SAC tool," Maximay explained.

"The manual provides a means of scoring each aspect on a five-point scale. If the cumulative score for the project is less than 40 it is deemed non-compliant and not a truly climate smart agriculture activity. C-SAC further grades in terms of degree of compliance wherein a score of 40-49 points is level 1, (50-59) level 2, (60-69) level 3, (70-79) level 4, and (80-100) being the highest degree of compliance at level 5.

"It is structured with due cognizance of concerns about how the global climate change funds will be disbursed," he added.

The United Nations (UN) Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) describes climatesmart agriculture as agriculture that sustainably increases



"Our performance really is Cultural Gateway AIA (Argyle International Airport), a Vincy cultural experience," explained the evening's narrator and St. Vincent theatre



When the U.S. men's basketball team returns to action later this month, fans might be left wondering, "the red, white and who?"

eligible for the events that will matter.

"It's going to be really interesting," USA Basketball men's national team director Sean Ford said. "We don't know. We're flying blind a little bit."

Even the Americans' best-known commodity is a bit of an unknown now.

Jeff Van Gundy coached in the NBA Finals and is analyst for them every year on ABC, but he's leading the U.S. team as an international basketball rookie. He is busy brushing up on the nuances of a game that can be played and officiated completely differently than in the U.S.

He begins Thursday in Houston for training camp, where he will seek the 12 players who will travel to Uruguay and possibly Argentina for the Ameri-Cup and the potentially better-prepared opponents who wait.

"What we have to do is match and exceed their passion, how hard we play, how together we are as a group," Van Gundy said, "because when the U.S. has not succeeded in international competitions, it's because there wasn't as much maybe sacrifice as you need, or maybe you were deficient in one skill that was important."

It's the Americans' first appearance in the former FIBA Americas tournament since 2007. Their starting lineup in that romp to gold — James, Kobe Bryant, Carmelo Anthony, Jason Kidd and Dwight Howard — was one of the strongest the U.S. has ever assembled.

The 17 players in camp with Van suited up for Mike Krzyzewski for a dec-

Gundy include Kendall Marshall, Reggie Williams, Darius Morris and Marshall Plumlee, players good enough to play in the NBA but not stick.

The Americans haven't needed to play in their zone championship since because they've won every Olympic and world title, exempting them from qualifying. But FIBA has revamped its qualification system to look more like soccer's, where national teams will play home-and-away games against teams in their pool.

But some of the windows are during the NBA season — the opening games are scheduled for Thanksgiving weekend — and players under NBA contract won't be permitted to play. So the Americans plan to primarily use players from the NBA G League, with perhaps some who have been playing overseas.

"Look, no one's going to feel sorry for us. But we know that this is different and we're going to have to figure out how to be successful in a different model," Ford said. "There's always unknowns, but there's probably more unknowns because No. 1, we don't know how good we need to be. We don't know how good we can be."

International NBA players could play for their countries in the AmeriCup Aug. 25-Sept. 3, but just like their American colleagues, they will not be able to represent their countries during the NBA season.

Ford considers the prospective players a notch below the NBA, calling them "survivors, grinders, competitors." That's far from the level that suited up for Mike Krzyzewski for a dec-

ade or would play for Gregg Popovich in 2019 and 2020, but Van Gundy is eager to work with them in his first coaching assignment — not counting his daughter's youth league — since he was fired by the Rockets in 2007.

"There's very few LeBron James of the world — obviously one — or great players who have it easy. These guys' careers have not been easy and so I really admire their persistence, their grit and their determination," Van Gundy said. "To get to work with them and coach them, that was part of the pull for me."

With limited time and options, the Americans know the AmeriCup could be a challenge. Ford said they hope to reach the semifinals in Argentina and see what happens from there.

They will need to start winning come the FIBA Basketball World Cup Americas qualifiers in November when they open their first-round pool that includes Puerto Rico, Mexico and Cuba.

The U.S. has to finish in the top three there, playing their other windows of games in February and June-July, to advance to another pool that will include three teams among Argentina, Panama, Paraguay and Uruguay, from Sept. 2018 to Feb. 2019.

Another top-three finish then would clinch their spot in China in 2019.

They will have a deeper field of candidates later who will be in shape from playing with their G League teams. But, they also could lose a player they like if he plays well enough for them in August to get a contract in the NBA or overseas.

169 in their first innings despite an aggressive unbeaten 79 from Jermaine Blackwood.

The Windies were asked to follow on by 364 runs, but they were bowled out for a paltry 137 in their second innings, with only opener Kraigg Brathwaite showing some resistance against the English bowlers with a top score of 40.

The defeat left West Indies trailing 1-0 in the three-Test series. The loss was the sixth heaviest ever for the Windies in its once-proud Test history.

Resuming at 44 for 1 in their first innings, they were all out after lunch on the second day.

England bowled West Indies out twice in less than 100 overs, taking 19 wickets in a day to win the match. It was also the first time a pink ball was used.

Opener Alastair Cook scored a fourth double century (243) and passed 11,500 runs in England's innings.

Joe Root's 136 saw him become just the sixth man to make a half century in 11 straight Tests.

And fast bowler Stuart Broad overtook Ian Bootham to become England's second-highest Test wicket-taker with 384. His spell (3 for 34) under floodlights near the end claimed three wickets for four runs in 11 balls — including two wickets in two deliveries. West Indies has not won a Test in England since 2000. They lost their last four series in England 4-0, 3-0, 2-0 and 2-0.

He is a former West Indies captain who has dominated every format of the game throughout his 17-year career.

The left-handed batsman has compiled 7,214 runs from 103 Tests at an average of 42, and is one of only four batsmen in his-







Nurse said Carican Costumes has "always won a prize every year," as volunteering parents and children chelp in the production.






She said Kaios International, over the years, has placed second and third in the large band category, first and second in small band and even second in medium band.
