

Ready for a DACA fight

In the aftermath of the announcement made by the Trump Administration on Tuesday to end the program, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), the New York State Comptroller, Thomas P. DiNapoli has condemned the action taken by the government and called it cruel, immoral and un-American.

In his remarks DiNapoli further declared that of the over 800,000 young adults who may be affected with the end of a DACA program, 40,000 are New Yorkers who have met the requirements and are educated and have passed background checks, which allowed them to earn their DACA status.

The New York state comptroller said that the young people will also be robbed of the opportunity to work and live without fear of deportation. DiNapoli said that the decision to deport the beneficiaries of the DACA program calls for the involvement of everyone, "to join in with the immigrant youths and to fight for the DREAM Act."

DeNapoli went on to call for better and firmer implementation on legislatives solutions that will affirm value and dignity to the immigrant community. For this DiNapoli asked that the community sought out immigrant serving organizations in New York City with unclaimed funds to ensure that they receive these funds that can help serve the immigrant community. "The organizations that serve the immigration community in New York should consider the Office of the State Comptroller an ally," he noted.

The state comptroller also reminded the young "Dreamers" of New York state that he stands with them to fight back on the decision to end DACA.

Agencies prepare hurricane relief

Deeply concerned about the devastation wrought by Hurricane Irma in the Caribbean, United Nations agencies are already preparing supplies and communication lines to the youth in the

"Although it is still early to know the full impact that Irma will have in the region, the main concerns of UNICEF center around the supply of drinking water and food, and the health and protection of children and adolescents," the United Nations Children's Fund said on

UNICEF said its office in the region has activated its emergency protocols, and is working with Government officials in Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, St. Maarten, St. Kitts and Nevis, and the Virgin Islands, as well as the Dominican Republic, Haiti and Cuba, which the hurricane is projected to hit next.

Supplies of drinking water, unperishable food and medicines, and emergency kits are pre-positioned and ready for distribution in the most affected communities, UNICEF said.

The agency also activated its U-Report platform, which allows it to send urgent messages via Facebook and other social media platforms to young people who subscribed.

Considering the possible magnitude that Irma represents, it is both hugely urgent and necessary to be prepared, informed and vigilant so that we try to avoid the impact on the most vulnerable, that is to say children," said Marita Perceval, Regional Director of UNICEF in Latin America and the Caribbean.

The UN said Hurricane Irma has become "the most dangerous natural phenomenon" in the region this year, stating that its impact may likely surpass Hurricane Matthew, which was a category 4 hurricane on a five-point scale and affected 3.2 million people last October - of whom 1.3 million were

children.

Since last fall, UNICEF said it has been working with government officials in the Caribbean to help create better access to clean water and hygiene, education, protection, nutrition and health, and respond to the spread of cholera.

The UN said a team of humanitarian workers headed to Barbados on Wednesday to work with the Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA).

The team will help those on the ground brace for a storm that could affect up to 37 million people, the UN said.

In Haiti, UN humanitarian staff have been deployed to the northern area of the country, which is likely to be hit.

In addition, the UN said some military and police from the "drawn-down" of the UN peacekeeping mission in the country, known as MINUSTAH, are preparing to be deployed to assist the Haitian National Police.

Thousands protest DACA ruling

On Tuesday, Sept. 4, Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced — as anticipated — that the Trump administration will not renew the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program introduced by President Obama's executive order, five years ago. Sessions said DACA will end in six months giving Congress time to formally act.

DACA provides temporary legal status to vetted young adults who immigrated before the age of 16 to the United States with their undocumented parents and are undocumented. Referred to as "Dreamers," it protects them from deportation, issues them a work permit and social security number. More than 800,000 are protected in this program.

Following the announcement, immigration advocates amassed on both sides

of Fifth Avenue outside of Trump Tower to protest. Thirty-four were arrested after sitting on the roadway, blocking traffic. In what might have been called unofficial complicity, the police then within six months to formalize DACA.

set up barricades to shepherd protestors across Fifth Avenue, blocking traffic for an additional 15 minutes.

In the early evening, DACA supporters rallied with local politicians and labor leaders at Foley Square who vehemently assured the crowd they will fight this ruling and will offer assistance to immigrants.

Following the rally, another civil disobedience action took place at the entrance to the Brooklyn Bridge, resulting in several other arrests including City Councilman Ydanis Rodriguez. Thousands then marched on the walkway across the Brooklyn

Antigua

Bahamas

Police in the Bahamas have arrested two Caribbean nationals after they arrived on a Caribbean airline flight.

In a statement, the police said that in the first case, drug enforcement officers on duty at the Lynden Pindling International Airport conducted a search of a suitcase owned by a woman from Suriname who had just arrived on a Caribbean airline.

It said during the search the officers uncovered just over nine pounds of cocaine. The woman was taken into custody and charged with several drug offences.

In the other incident, the police said that acting on a tip off, they conducted a search of a hotel room in the capital where they found nine pounds of cocaine hidden in a suitcase.

A woman from Guyana who had

arrived on a Caribbean airline flight was later charged with trafficking in cocaine, the statement said.



The value of the drugs seized was not given neither was the name of the airline.

Guyana

The Guyana government has seen a 2.2 percent growth of the local economy so far for this year.

Minister of Finance Winston Jordan said the growth was important given the economic development in other Caribbean countries.

However, he noted that the growth for this first six months was "marginal."

The minister of finance said it is not a decline which means that there is still spending, adding that the spending is expected to increase as citizens become more confident and government policies will lead to sustained growth rather than be a "one off."

Jordan said that local spending is directly correlated to the performance of of the agricultural sector, particularly rice and sugar and with the latter's underperformance spending is affected "if only because a number of people employed directly and indirectly in those areas."

The minister said that were it not for sugar's poor performance, the economy would have passed the 3.8 percent growth initially projected, but due to the poor performance of this sector,

projected growth has been reduced to 3.1 percent.



According to the mid-year report, sugar production was 49,606

tones, compared with 56,645 tons for the same period last year, a drop of 12.4 percent.

The shortfall was described as being due to Skeldon Estate's lack of production, due to unsafe boilers and the need for significant repairs.

Jamaica

The Jamaican government said it is moving to clear all criminal charges against National Hero, Marcus Harvey, whose 130th birthday was recently celebrated in Jamaica.

Culture, Gender, Entertainment and Sports Minister, Olivia Grange, said a bill is being finalized to take to parliament to absolve several iconic Jamaicans, including Garvey, of what she described as "acts of liberation."

Garvey was sentenced to prison in Jamaica in 1929 after he made a political speech in which he referred to corrupt Jamaican judges.

In November 1927, Garvey was deported to Jamaica after being imprisoned in Georgia, USA, on mail fraud charges.

He was founder of Jamaica's first modern political party, the People's Political Party (PPP) in September 1929.

He left Jamaica for London in 1935, where he lived until his death in relative obscurity in 1940.

In 1987, then Prime Minister Edward Seaga was instrumental in having Garvey remains returned to Jamaica and buried at National Heroes' Park. He made him Jamaica's first national hero in 1969 and also piloted a decision to pardon him from the criminal sentence in 1929.

The new bill will include provisions to remove the names

of all "freedom fighters" with early antislavery leaders.



St. Lucia

St. Lucia's banana industry is expected to increase by a whopping 300 percent if current production trends continue, according to figures released by marketing agents WINFRESH.

Minister of Agriculture Ezechiel Joseph told reporters that if the current level of production is maintained, the island could see the production of almost 20,000 tons for 2017, an over 300 percent increase compared to 2016 figures.

He said the figures released by WIN-FRESH are "very encouraging" and called on farmers to continue to work diligently as government continues

to expand the export market for the fruit.

Joseph revealed that the country is hoping to add to its exports



starting in January where it will export 3,000 boxes of bananas to France weekly.

St. Vincent

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Police have brought five disciplinary charges against the head of the Police Welfare Association (PWA), Sergeant Brenton Smith, after he allegedly made remarks on social media about plans to "storm" the Office of the Prime Minister.

The charges stem from the July 13 WhatsApp conversation among PWA executive members in which Smith reportedly said



the executive should "storm" the office

Caribbean gov'ts standby to assist neighbors

Caribbean governments and the Barbados-based Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA) were on standby late Wednesday waiting for one of the most powerful Atlantic storms in recorded history to pass by member states before kicking the rapid response system in place towards the weekend.

This is as Hurricane Irma blew through the region with winds of up to 190 miles per hour overnight Tuesday, causing significant damage in Barbuda and several other islands in the northeastern Caribbean including the region's Dutch and French neighbors.

Dutch St. Maarten and French Sint. Martin, took direct hits as the eve of the storm passed directly over the two European colonies, wiping out some of the more sturdier buildings and particularly taking out St. Maarten's iconic Princess Juliana International Airport.

That is the island where thousands of tourists flock to each year to watch the arrival of international flights which pass just a few feet above the heads of

visitors on world famous Maho heach

Tourists also cling on to the chain link fence to feel the power of planes preparing to take off but officials say this won't happen for a few weeks-if not monthsbecause of the severe damage caused by Irma.

Jetways were broken in pieces and debris were strewn on to the runway. The main terminal building also sustained major water and debris damage. Large boulders smashed into planes which were inexplicably left on ramps despite warnings to the contrary from officials. Tides also dumped tons of sand on the runway, indicating that it might not open for a while yet.

The Caricom Secretariat in Guyana said late Wednesday that governments are certain to mount a high level team to visit the affected islands once the storm passes and once flights resume allowing for access to those countries and a proper inspection of the situation on the ground. They are also certain to send teams of engineers and soldiers from various member states to assist in rebuilding efforts on affected islands.

In the meantime, the storm was headed to Puerto Rico on Wednesday and also had the Dominican Republic, the Virgin Islands, the Turks and Caicos and calamity-stricken Haiti in its sights. among others. Authorities in nearby Bahamas have ordered the evacuation of several of the southern so-called Family Islands, moving them to New Providence in the north as the storm is expected to make landfall on Thursday or early Friday if projections hold true.

Prime Minister Hubert Minnis was firm and adamant that locals in the southern Bahamas should get out of the way as accessing those areas if hit by Irma would be difficult.

"Don't be foolish and try to brave out this monster storm. Don't put your lives and those of your loved ones at unnecessary risk," he said as he appealed for common sense to prevail. "This is the largest evacuation in the history of this country," he said.

In St. Kitts and Nevis in the meantime, senior journalist Clive Bacchus said the twin island with Nevis was spared the worst. "No reported deaths at this time. No major damage on both islands.

Officials still assessing the situation but spared. Loads of rain and some strong wind but thankfully far below expectations. I am trying to get more info on vulnerable areas and losses," he said in a hurried note to colleagues.

In neighboring Antigua, 1,500 people live there.

Prime Minister Gaston Browne said that island was also spared but he was preparing to head to Barbuda to determine the situation on the ground as reports have indicated that dozens of buildings were damage. About



Congress must override the President's repeal of the Dream program

The dreadful news that President Donald Trump has scrapped the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) policy is very troubling. In addition to the legal actions to preserve and / or reinstate it, Congress must swiftly act to make it law. The people protected by DACA have been referred to as "DREAMers" and are people who were brought by their parents to America as children, before they were able to make an independent choice to immigrate. These folks are, as President Obama said when enacting DACA, American is every way--except for possessing papers.

Former President Obama condemned President Trump's decision to end the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program, saying a "shadow has been cast over some of our best and brightest young people once again." Obama decided to implement DACA through an executive order during his presidency because "it made no sense to expel talented, driven, patriotic young people from the only country they know solely because of the actions of their parents."

"To target these young people is wrong - because they have done nothing wrong. It is self-defeating – because they want to start new businesses, staff our labs, serve in our military, and otherwise contribute to the country we love. And it is cruel," he said. Deporting them

back to countries they have no memory of and where they know nobody demonstrates the basic lack of human decency.

National pride and interest dictate that the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, or DACA initiative, should have been made permanent years ago. This year marks the fourth anniversary, and although the track record supports that conclusion, these dreamers still languish for some permanence to their hopes and endeavors. All Dreamers are products of America, and most also have someone in their family who's an American citizen-17 percent are married to a citizen, 26 percent have children who are citizens, and 59 percent have a sibling who's American.

Surveys and studies confirm that the economic, educational, and employment experiences and outcomes of DACA recipients make clear that DACA has had a positive impact, not just for recipients but also for the American economy more gen-

Through executive action, DACA provided temporary relief from deportation and work authorization to eligible unauthorized immigrants who entered the country at a young age. 800,000 unauthorized young people have received DACA, improving the lives of its recipients and their families.

The data illustrate that DACA recipients are making significant contributions to the economy by buying cars and

first homes, which translate into more revenue for states and localities in the form of sales and property taxes. Some are even using their entrepreneurial talents to help create new jobs and further spur economic growth by starting their own businesses.

The positive wage effect of DACA is also significant. The data show that DACA increased recipients' average hourly wages by 42 percent. Given that higher wages translate into higher tax revenue and economic growth, these findings reinforce the fact that DACA benefits all Americans. Moreover, a full 95 percent of survey respondents are currently employed or enrolled in school. Consistent with the 2015 survey, the data indicate that many DACA recipients are getting better and higher-paving jobs because of DACA. Many are pursuing educational opportunities that were previously unavailable to them. The majors, specializations, and training that DACA recipients are pursuing include early childhood education, biochemistry, computer science, creative writing, graphic design, neuroscience, nursing, social work, and urban planning, among many others, which benefits our nation.

The latest data indicate that having work authorization remains vital when it comes to helping DACA recipients participate more fully in the labor force. Eighty-seven percent of respondents to the 2016 survey are currently employed, with an additional 8 percent not working but in school.

The current survey is one of the first to systematically identify the industries in which DACA recipients are working, and the results show wideranging labor market contributions. The data indicate that 21 percent of respondents work in educational and health services, 11 percent work in the nonprofit sector, 9 percent work in wholesale and retail trades, and 8 percent work in professional and business services. The results illustrate that DACA recipients are contributing across all sectors of the economy.

Furthermore, after receiving DACA, 63 percent of respondents reported moving to a job with better pay; 49 percent moved to a iob that "better fits my education and training." 48 percent moved to a job with better working conditions. These figures are largely consistent with previous findings from the 2015 survey and show that the temporary work authorization that comes with DACA has helped to unlock recipients' economic potential.

The 2016 survey also found that 6 percent of respondents started their own business after receiving DACA. This rate of business starts is higher than that of both the American public as a whole—at 3.1 percent—and the entire immigrant population at 3.6 percent. These businesses include tech startups, online craft stores, and tax preparation services, among others. One business owner who employs nine people hopes to continue to grow and "hire [even] more people from the community."

Statistics don't lie! Congress must act accordingly, and make President's signature initiative

Sept. 11 – Happy time for some... Sad for others

The ninth month of the year signals the unofficial end of summer conjuring emotions of variance to students returning to school or entering a learning institution for the very first time.

It also provides temporary relief to parents of youngsters restricted throughout the hottest season of the year by constant companionship and mentorship without teachers.

In stark contrast to those perennial realities, since the millennium, the nation has had to recalibrate each year to recall a series of four coordinated terrorist attacks by the Islamic group al-Qaeda on the United States on the morning of Tuesday, Sept. 11, 2001.

The attacks reportedly "killed 2,996 people, injured more than 6,000 others and caused at least \$10 billion in infrastructure and property damage" Wikipedia notes.

On Sept. 11, four passenger airliners operated by two major U.S. passenger air carriers — United and American — were hijacked resulting in the single deadliest incident for firefighters and law enforcement offic-



ers in the history of the United States, with 343 and 72 killed respectively.

One jet crashed into the Pentagon — the headquarters of the Department of Defense in Arlington, County, Virginia, leading to a partial collapse of the building's western side.

Another initially was steered toward Washington, D.C., but crashed into a field in Stonycreek Township near Shanksville, Pennsylvania, after its passengers tried to overcome the hijackers.

Worst of all, the haunting reflection of witnessing two passenger jet-planes surge into two of New York's tallest edifices seemed at first like a scene from a movie. Many people could not believe their eyes. From a distance, the huge gasoline bombs looked like toy planes. Few would have perceived such a notion that terrorists took control of the

cockpit forcing suicidal and homicidal deaths in 2001.

The indelible images seem to resurface annually since then with added bleakness recalling billowing black smoke spiraling upward and across the skies.

Singer Michael Jackson had performed a fantastic concert at Madison Garden the night previous amidst a star-studded lineup that included Liza Minnelli, Whitney Houston, Shaggy and others.

I was among the patrons there to see the galaxial assembly.

The fact many of my entertainment associates were scheduled to jet back to the west coast on the first flight out of New York and those two flights were among the first bound for California resonated with concern.

It was also a primary election Tuesday and also a dead-







Author to launch Belize's first writers conference

She's on a mission to reinvent literary history.

Belizean writer and author Joey Garcia is launching her country's first ever writers conference next spring. The Belize Writers Conference is set for April 23–28, 2018 and is going to give 30 writers a chance to a retreat on a resort and receive advice from literary experts about their work. It will be the first time a gathering of such is happening because in the past there were meetups for writers but none bigger summits, said Garcia.

"There have been maybe one or two writing workshops but I did all the research and none has ever been held," she said.

And as a writer she also took notice that other Caribbean countries in the region are well-known for their literature leaving out Belize.

"I think the literary arts have not been as emphasized and celebrated in Belize as other countries," said Garcia.

"It hasn't been pushed in any way although we have talented writers — but we haven't had any celebrated writers."

To change this narrative, the conference will be aimed at bringing writers of all ages — Belizean and non-Belizean who want to share their work and connect with other writers. The five-day getaway will be on a resort on Ambergris Caye — an island off the coast of mainland about 45 minutes from Belize City. The trip prices range from \$1629-2099.

Everyday groups of 10 writers will meet with Carrie Howland from Empire Literary and Kate Johnson of Wolf Literary Services, and get feedback from them about their work. They also get to attend panels about self-marketing and entrepreneurship.

"The goal is to allow the writers the opportunity to have their fiction and nonfiction work critiqued at a professionally level and I'm bringing two pals to look at their manuscripts," said Garcia.

The conference has been a goal of Garcia's for a considerable time. As a writer and educator based in California, she frequently visits Belize and also founded her non-profit Rise Up Belize, to provide impoverished children throughout the country with access to educational programs.

"It's been a dream of mine for 10 years. I was born there and I'm working on raising the advancement of education in Belize," she said.

During the conference guests will even be treated to cultural experiences such as the music and history of the Garifuna people and Mayans, according to Garcia. The fullfledged conference offers voga classes along with developmental workshops — and calming experience for the writers who can benefit from de-stressing

Barbados dollar diminished

All persons living and doing business in Barbados have, begun operating with a dollar that has been unofficially devalued as of Sept. 01.

This is owed to a government decision in its last budget to affix a two percent fee on all transactions involving the use of forthe gamut of activities from purchases of items outside of Barbados and simple remittances to relatives or friends

Finance Minister Chris Sinckler had said in his June 30 budget proposal which Parliament passed days later, "in an effort to signal the need to reduce the demand for consumption goods I propose that, effective July 1, a broadbased foreign exchange commission be charged on all sales of foreign currency at a rate of two percent. This will extend to, inter alia, all wire transfers, credit card transactions, and over the counter sale of foreign cur-

This means that that anyone on the island seeking to use credit, debit and travel cards for international transactions or purchasing foreign cash, bank drafts and wire transfers will have to pay a tax of two percent on the Barbados dollar value of the transaction

Government began applyeign currency, which covers ing this tax on cash, bank drafts and wire transfers since mid-July, but had delayed implementation on credit, debit and travel cards transactions to Sept. because commercial banks needed time to adjust their accounting software.

A further disadvantage to users of Barbados dollars for foreign transactions is that there is no reciprocal arrangement because whenever they receive payment in currency from abroad the foreign money is still exchanged at the equivalent of Bds\$1 to .50 US cents.

In a clarifying statement earlier this week the Barbados Central Bank stated,

is applicable to purchases made while overseas, as well as to items purchased from companies outside of Barbados, e.g. Amazon... the fee will be calculated on the Barbados value of the transaction using the exchange rate on the date that the transaction was processed, not on the date that the bill is paid and will be applied even if customers choose to be billed in Barbados dollars.'

Former prime minster and noted regional economist, Owen Arthur, had said during parliamentary debate on this measure in the budget, that it "is effectively changing the price at which Barbados uses domestic currency to pay for foreign currency and making it necessary for Barbadians to use more domestic currency for foreign exchange. So that is a devaluation."

The thought of devaluation of the Barbados dollar triggers torment in the minds of Barbadians who cherish the fact that since 1975 their currency "the Foreign Exchange Fee has held its trading value sym-

bolizing the nation's economic strength even amidst cyclical challenges.

But now having to pay

Bds\$102 for every 50 US cents of foreign currency spent means nothing else than that the dollar has diminished in value.

Picture-perfect carnival in Brooklyn

For at least the third consecutive year, revelers, masqueraders and millions of spectators converged in picture-perfect weather on Brooklyn's Eastern Parkway on Labor Day for the 50th annual celebration of the West Indian American Day Carnival Parade.

With temperatures at a high of 84 degrees, around 3 pm Monday, the sight, sounds, pageantry, artistry and everything else West Indian exploded along the 3 ½ mile-long parade route that began at Buffalo Avenue and ended at Grand Army Plaza in Brooklyn.

"Madness on the road, split in the middle," she exclaimed, as she gyrated to pulsating Caribbean soca rhythm emanating from humongous boom boxes mounted on a nearby flatbed truck.

As she portrayed Boom Mas's "Empress of the Jewel," Darlene Price, 46, who was born in Guyana to a Guyanese mother and a Trinidadian father, said she was playing mas since 14.



If you don't already have your estate planning documents, now is the time to have them prepared by an estate attorney.

Your estate consists of everything you own. The most commonly known tool used in estate planning is a Last Will and Testament. Trusts are also commonly used, which can be either Revocable or Irrevocable. Both kinds of trusts avoid probate. Properly drafted Irrevocable Trusts can also shield some assets from long-term care expenses such as nursing home care costs (also known as Medicaid planning). Additional estate planning documents include a Power of Attorney and a Living Will or Health-

An estate plan allows you to

appoint someone you trust to manage your assets and make health care decisions for you, if you ever become incapable of doing so, rather than leaving such decisions up to someone you did not select, and may not trust.

Estate planning is the process of addressing issues relating to the management and preservation of your assets during your lifetime, and then, ultimately, the transfer of those assets to your chosen beneficiaries. Many questions and issues are addressed in the estate planning process, including the following:

•If you are incapacitated for any extended period of time, who will pay your bills and manage your assets for you?

•Who will make your health care decisions during any period when you may be unable to make them for yourself?

•If you need long-term care such as a nursing home, how will the cost of your care be paid?

•Do you wish to do any asset protection planning, such as transferring your homestead and other assets into an asset protection trust, sometimes known as a "Medicaid qualifying trust," so that at least some of your assets are protected from long-term



care costs?

•Do you want your heirs/ beneficiaries to receive their inheritances under a Will, which is subject to the oversight of your local Surrogate's Court, or do you want to avoid the Probate process by transferring your assets into a Revocable (Living) Trust? Note: Such a trust avoids probate, but does not give you any asset protection benefits.

•If you own any business interests, what plan do you have in place to transfer ownership and control of those interests to those who will take over the business? For closely held businesses, the use of "discount valuations" for minority interests and marketability discounts can significantly lower estate tax liabilities.

•Do you expect any Will challenges from your heirs, or do you want to disinherit any of your closest heirs? Such circumstances strongly suggest the use of a Living Revocable Trust, to reduce the chance that your directives might be subject to challenge.

•As of April 1, 2017, if you are a New York resident and your taxable estate will be more than \$5,250,000, you will need to give strong considerations to the idea of minimizing or at least reducing possible estate taxes. Such analysis involves the balance between maintaining control of assets versus relinquishing some control in order to reduce the amount of taxes that ultimately must be paid by your estate. Failing to do so can be a very expensive omission.

•In formulating your estate plan, you must select executors, trustees and agents for your Will, trust(s), power of attorney and healthcare proxy documents.

•If you have minor children, you should consider naming a legal guardian to make healthcare and other decisions for your children, in the event that you are unable or unavailable to do so.

Having an efficient estate

plan in place not only ensures that your assets will be managed and distributed according to your wishes and directives, but also alleviates burdens on your family members and reduces the likelihood of disputes. An efficient estate plan can ensure that your surviving spouse is adequately provided for; protect your assets from any creditors to whom your beneficiaries may owe money; and can shield assets from your heir's spouses and divorced spouses. May we all merit living long, happy, and healthy lives. Amen!

Restrained revelry

Heightened J'Ouvert security prevents fatalities, changes atmosphere

By Alexandra Simon

It was the dawn of a new J'Ouvert.

Thousands of revelers gathered in Crown Heights on Sept. 4 for the early-morning parade that unfolded without a fatality after years of deadly violence following the enaction of its strictest security measures yet. But the precautions, which included a significantly increased police presence, resulted in a festival largely unrecognizable to long-time attendees.

"It was dead," said Imani Henry of Equality for Flatbush, an advocacy group that monitors police-community relations at the event. "There were no people and no vendors, and usually for there are a lot of people out."

The beefed-up safety also included pushing the procession's start time from 4 am to 6 am, setting up more floodlights along its route from Grand Army Plaza to Prospect Lefferts Gardens, and installing entry checkpoints with metal detectors — all of which sucked life from the historically spirited celebration, Henry said.

"It created a different energy," he said.

And the heightened







Partisan polemic revisits Mike Brown shooting

"Whose Streets?"
Good (2 stars)
Rated R for ethnic slurs,
mature themes and pervasive profanity

On Aug. 9, 2014, Mike Brown was shot a half-dozen times by police officer Darren Wilson on the streets of Ferguson, Missouri, a predominantly-black suburb of St. Louis. Because several eyewitnesses said the 18-year-old had his hands up at the time, the incident triggered nationwide civil unrest which gave rise to the Black Lives Matter movement.

But Wilson was not even indicted by the grand jury which deemed his testimony credible. He claimed to have pulled the trigger in self defense after Brown had punched him and tried to grab his gun. The legal case divided the country along color lines in the same way as

the O.J. Simpson trial, with African-Americans generally feeling that cops are too quick to shoot young black men, and most whites being inclined to give law enforcement the benefit of the doubt.

Co-directed by Damon Davis and Sabaah Folayan, "Whose Streets?" is an incendiary documentary which revisits the tragedy in partisan fashion, arguing entirely in favor of Brown's innocence while conveniently ignoring the mountain of evidence which ultimately exonerated Wilson. Granted, this provocative polemic might serve as a Black Lives Matter recruiting tool, but it is likely

to be of little value to any truth seeker interested in an impartial investigation.

After all, there was video proof that Brown and Dorian Johnson had robbed a convenience store just three minutes before the encounter with Wilson who was summoned to the scene by a police dis-

patcher. Furthermore, the county, federal and independent autopsies corroborated the cop's story while simultaneously refuting Johnson's claim that his accomplice had been shot in the back and with his hands up. After an exhaustive investigation by the U.S. Department of Justice, even Attorney General Eric Holder concluded that Wilson was innocent.

So, what's dismaying about "Whose Streets?" is how its presentation of a thief as an altar boy flies in the face of Dr. Martin Luther King's appeal that black people be judged not by the color of their skin but by the content of their character. Why make Mike Brown the poster child for the Black Lives Matter movement, when there are so many martyrs far more deserving, like Trayvon Martin, Jordan Davis and Tamir Rice, to name a few?

A soulful cinematic sermon elevating a sinner to sainthood for the sake of an uncritical Amen choir still in denial about the truth of the Mike Brown case!



US will need road results to reach 8th straight competition

SAN PEDRO SULA, Honduras (AP) — Michael Bradley realizes the huge distinction between home games and road matches in international soccer.

week at Red Bull Arena in New Jersey. "You look around here: a beautiful stadium, a field that's in great condition."

occasionally picking up points on the road. The U.S. had lost once in 50 home qualifiers (42 wins, seven ties) since 1985 before defeats to Mexico last November and to Costa Rica on Friday night.

During that same span, the Americans had 19 wins, 15 losses and 16 draws in away qualifiers.

A temperature in the low 90s is expected for the late-afternoon game, which kicks off at 3:36 pm (5:36 pm EDT). High humidity could make it feel like about 110, and rain is possible. The Americans won a night game here 3-2 eight years ago, then wasted a onegoal halftime lead in the afternoon in 2013, wilting during a 2-1 loss to the Catrachos.

Gaining at least a point at Estadio Olímpico Metropolitano has become critical for the Americans, who are third in the North and Central America and the Caribbean with eight points, ahead of Honduras on goal difference. The top three teams qualify for next year's tournament in Russia, and the fourth-place nation goes to a playoff 1998-2006. Qualifying started to get own hands in the last two games."

against Asia's No. 5 finisher.

Mexico (17 points) clinched Friday night and Costa Rica (14) is on the verge of assuring itself a World Cup trip. While Panama (seven points) could move into third with a home win over Trinidad and Tobago on Tuesday, the U.S. hosts the Panamanians next month and could move back ahead.

Goalkeeper Tim Howard said Friday's 2-0 lost to Costa Rica doesn't change the U.S. approach to Hondu-

"I think we would have anticipated us going down there and getting a win," he said.

The U.S. probably will need wins or draws from all three of its remaining games to reach its eighth straight World Cup. The Americans host Panama on Oct. 6 at Orlando, Florida, and conclude the hexagonal four days later at Trinidad, which probably will have been eliminated by then.

After the U.S. opened the final round with losses to Mexico and Costa Rica, the U.S. Soccer Federation fired coach Jurgen Klinsmann and brought back Arena, the American coach from

back on track in March with a 6-0 rout of Honduras at San Jose, California. The U.S. figures to play a bit more defensively on the road.

Arena made three changes to his lineup for the March qualifier at Panama, when his players had three days' rest, and seven for the June match at Mexico City, when there were just two days between games and the U.S. had little time to adjust to altitude.

He will have to make at least one switch Tuesday: forward Jozy Altidore is suspended for yellow card accumu-

Howard was at fault on Costa Rica's first goal Friday and defender Geoff Cameron's poor pass led to the second. With a 25-man roster, Arena has ample maneuvering space.

"We're going to go down there with the mentality to win the game," Bradley said. "We're going to be aggressive. We're going to make sure we've got 11 guys on the field who are ready to give everything, and we will. If at the end of 90 minutes we're in a position where we take one point, then we'll take that and know that everything's still in our


The selectors said that both Gayle and Samuels will be a boost to the young side.

In the midst of virtually every African head of state. numerous Asian and European leaders, Caribbean and South American diplomats and representatives I was able to walk over and dialogue with the likes of Zimbabwe president Robert Mugabe, Libyan leader Muammar Qaddaffi and so many important heads of government.

It remains one of the happiest experiences to recall.

And while jollification reigned, it was difficult to subdue the memories of America's Sept. 11.

Like television's submission of Ethiopia's revelry of a millennium, there was no trace or reverence for the 2001 plight of this nation on Ethiopian television.

For Ethiopians living in Washington D.C and all throughout that country, September 11 means joy, happi-Traditional food, African and ness and the start of a brand

new year.

Reggae music lovers also regard the date as memorable because on Sept. 11, 1987, Peter Tosh was brutally murdered in his Kingston, home.

A collaborator with Bunny Wailer and Robert Nesta Marley to form Bob Marley & The Wailers, Tosh was the second of the three founding members to succumb. Marley died May 11, 1980 from cancer.

That another talent from the trio to comprise the island's most iconic recording group would perish in such a heinous demise, records the date to be one of the worst days in Jamaican history.

Tosh was gunned down in his home after being taunted and terrorized by thieving

Reportedly, the singer, musician and Rastafarian proponent "had returned to his home in Jamaica, when a three-man gang came to his house on motorcycles and demanded money. Tosh replied that he did not have any with him but the gang did not believe him. They stayed at his residence for several hours and tortured him in an attempt to extort money from Tosh. Over the hours, as various Tosh's associates arrived to visit him, they were also taken hostage by the gunmen.

The gunmen became more and more frustrated, especially the chief thug, Dennis "Leppo" Lobban, a man whom Tosh had previously befriended and tried to help find work after a long jail sentence. Tosh insisted he had no money in the house. after which Lobban and the fellow gunmen began opening fire in a reckless manner."

Tosh was shot twice in the head and killed.

The news rocked the nation and ultimately the entire world particularly reggae music aficionados.

Jamaicans Commemorate **Anniversary of Worst** Train Tragedy — Sept. 1 Kendal Crash

Sept. 1, marked the 60th anniversary of the Kendal Crash which occurred at a place in Manchester, Jamaica known as Kendal on Sunday, Sept. 1, 1957.

Recalled as the most tragic train mishap to ever occur anywhere in the world at the time, Olivia Grange, the nation's minister of culture, gender, entertainment and sport announced that beginning this year, September 1 will be observed as the date on which the nation officially commemorates the Kendal Train

St. Anne's Catholic Church in

Kingston also commemorated the Kendal Crash with a memorial Service on Sept. 3.

Many of those who died in the accident were members of the church. They were returning to Kingston following an outing to Montego Bay when the ill-fated accident occurred.

The Kingston bound train with its two diesel engines leading 12 overcrowded wooden coaches, had been transporting approximately 1, 600 people when it ran off the rail at Kendal, resulting in the deaths of 186 people and injury to many

In a press release, the government official said: "Friday, Sept. 1, we will as a nation officially recall the circumstances of the horrendous train accident which claimed close to 200 hundred lives."

Grange said the decision was made after discussions with prominent nationals who vividly recall the tragedy that gripped the passions of the entire nation.

Beverley East, author of the book, "Reaper of Souls" was among the many consultants who enabled serious consideration of an annual tribute to the martyrs. In the book, she used fictional characters to deliver a stirring account of the Kendal Crash.

The New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC) in coordination with Bedford Courts LLC, (the Applicant, is seeking a series of discretionary approvals to facilitate the redevelopment of the historic Bedford Union Armory located at 1555 Bedford Avenue (Block 1274, Lot 1) in the Crown Heights neighborhood of Brooklyn (the "Project Site") into an approximately 542,393 gross square feet (gsf) three-building mixed-use development. Specifically, the redevelopment would result in approximately 390 residential dwelling units (DUs), including approximately 177 affordable DUs; up to 48,997 gsf of office space; up to 18,122 gsf of academic space; approximately 72,252 gsf of community facility space; and a minimum of 118 parking spaces (the "Proposed Development").
