Jamaicans reeling from 'Patty King's' death

The funeral for the late Golden Krust President Lowell Hoathorne is expected to take place in Mount Vernon on Dec. 18, and a memorial for at his flagship Golden Krust store on East Gun Hill Road in the Bronx on Saturday.

VIGILS FOR THE DEAD

Suriname still mourns mass murder of 15 citizens

On Friday, Dec, 8, opposition politicians, surviving relatives, grieving friends and even some officials in government will hold the usual candlelight and other types of vigils in Paramaribo, the capital of Suriname, to mark the 35th anniversary of the execution of 15 of that country's most well-known citizens. The 15 were rounded up at night by soldiers, 22 months after the same group had staged a coup against the then elected government in a bitter row over demands, mostly by junior soldiers, to be represented by a labor union, a development that is unheard of and is highly unusual among its Caribbean neighbors.

The group was taken to a colonial era Dutch fort, interrogated and shot in cold blood, some standing against brick walls. As the city prepares to mark one of the bloodiest events in modern Surinamese history, a military / civilian court which has been conducting criminal trials into the mass murders of 1982, is

stepping up its sentencing of the 25 criminal suspects who were charged with the murders. Back then and still up to today, the military has not been able to furnish any convincing proof that the group was planning a counter coup and plotting with western nations to dispose of military rule. The fort is located right next door to the presidential complex, the official residence of the head of state and a stone's throw from parliament.

At the time, Desi Bouterse, 72. now civilian president serving a second five-year term, was the military strongman in the Dutch-speaking Caribbean trade bloc nation of about 500,000 people. He was the leader of soldiers who decided that they had had enough of the relatively weak and indecisive administration of President Henck Arron so they stormed various government buildings and took control of the levers of state. Democratic elections were not held again until 1987. A political party backed mostly by soldiers and

Hawthorne's death leaves sadness

Brooklyn Council Member Dr. Mathieu Eugene as added his voice to a chorus of shock and sadness across the United States and in the Caribbean over the death of Golden Krust founder and chief executive officer Lowell Hawthorne.

"Mr. Hawthorne was a valued member of the community who used his entrepreneurial and culinary skills to create a standard of excellence that will never be forgotten," said Dr. Eugene, the first Haitian to be elected to New York City Council.

"I want to extend my prayers and deepest sympathies to his family and friends," said Eugene, who represents the 40th Council District in Brooklyn.

Hawthorne, 57, reportedly killed himself on Saturday amid fears the United States federal government were investigating him for evading millions of dollars in taxes.

A family member told New York police detectives that Hawthorne admitted the huge tax debt to some of his relatives, and was "acting funny" and "talking to himself" in the hours before his suicide Saturday, according to the New York Post.

The paper said that, in August, "Hawthorne was slapped with a proposed class-action suit alleging he cheated as many as 100-plus workers at the Golden Crust plant out of overtime pay."

The suit — fairly common in the food service industry — remains pending in Manhattan federal court, the Post said.

The New York Daily News also reported that the owner of the Golden Krust restaurant chain who committed suicide in his Bronx, New York factory was deep in tax debt and was being sued by a former staffer for "thousands in lost wages," according to court records.

Vincy activist's death overshadows gala luncheon

The death of popular Vincentian community activist and United Nations Development Officer Maxwell Haywood overshadowed the gala 8th Annual Luncheon Sunday of the Brooklynbased group VincyCares at El Caribe Country Club in Brooklyn.

Haywood, the long-standing chairman of the Brooklyn-based St. Vincent and the Grenadines Diaspora Committee of New York, Inc., died Wednesday morning after ailing for most of this year. He was 53. He would have turned 54 on Dec. 13, two days before his Home-going Service takes place at St. Gabriel's Episcopal (Anglican) Church, between Nostrand and New York Aves., in Brooklyn.

Haywood died after VincyCares had announced early this year that he would be among four individuals and a group to be honored at its annual grand celebration that usually takes place at the Friends of Crown Heights Educational Center in Brooklyn. The event was held Sunday, for the first time, at El Caribe Country Club.


Haywood's wife, Sherrill-Ann Haywood — an employee at Brooklyn's predominantly Black Medgar Evers College, who had worked closely with him in the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Diaspora Committee of New York, Inc. — accepted the award posthumously in the highly passionate ceremony.

Other honorees comprised veteran Vincentian broadcaster Ferrand "Randy D" Dopwell (Lifetime Achievement Award); Head Master of the St. Vincent Grammar School Curtis King; popular Brooklyn-based Vincentian disc jockey Joseph Caiphas "SupaEyes" Cuffy; the Brooklyn-based Garifuna Indigenous People of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Inc.; and disc jockey Jonell "Yung Hova" Goodluck.

The Rev. Dr. Roxie Irish, a youth minister at Miracle Temple Ministries in the Brownville section of Brooklyn and founder and president of the United Vincie Cultural Group of Brooklyn, inevitably, set the tone for the pall, which was cast over the ceremony, in very terse remarks before delivering the opening prayer.

"In our community, we're mourning, because one of our very special stalwarts transitioned from this life," she said, asking for, and receiving, a minute's silence from patrons in honor of Haywood. "And it's none other but our dear brother, Maxwell Haywood."

Mrs. Haywood's acceptance speech was preceded and followed by standing ovations, and interspersed with selections — by DJ Kemmy "Man Kemmy" Christopher, the 1989 Junior Calypso King in St. Vincent and the Grenadines — from calypsonian Rasum's "Perse-

verance" and Elton John's "Candle in the Wind."

"Thanks for the overwhelming support since Maxwell's passing and all the prayers and well wishes," said Mrs. Haywood, as tears streamed down the cheeks of some patrons, and some used tissue to dry their eyes. "Maxwell was especially happy to receive this particular award because of his respect for Vincycares and the work they do. This year's theme 'Youth development is the path to successful leadership' also resonated with him, because it exemplifies his own life and journey.

"Maxwell, as a youth, was heavily involved in sports, culture, community and political organizations," she added. "He was positively mentored and developed his leadership capacity. This led him to be an effective youth and student leader. In fact, he began his professional career in the United Nations in the Youth Unit.

"So, Maxwell is here with us in the spirit today, and he is well pleased to receive this award from VincyCares," she continued about her late husband, who was also a student leader at Medgar Evers College. "In fact, he had prepared a message from his bedside that he wanted me to share today. He had hoped to watch the live stream today, but that was not to be."

In that speech, Haywood wrote, and Mrs. Haywood read: "Many countries around the world have created visions, programs and policies to promote youth development and development in general. Some of these include study abroad, cultural exchanges and sports program. Without these types of programs, our countries and societies will be poorer socially, politically and environmentally.

"The implication for us in SVG [St. Vincent and the Grenadines] is that we must seek to systematically create such programs for our youth, if we are to develop socially-conscious, global thinkers, who will creatively aid in solving the problems facing the world, region and country," Mrs. Haywood said. "So, VincyCares' current programs for scholarship, and the provision of school supplies and clothing are moves in the right direction.

"The next step must be a venture to impact policy directions to ensure our youth are empowered with the right knowledge and tools that will allow them to develop key leadership skills and to become successful leaders," she added. "This will significantly and positively increase VincyCares' scope and reach as one of the premier organizations in the Diaspora. So, keep the vision alive. One love, Maxwell."

THE NEWS FROM BACK HOME

Caribbean

Britain is providing more financial help to Antigua and Barbuda as well as Dominica to assist in the recovery and long-term reconstruction on the islands following the devastation caused by Hurricanes Irma and Maria.

International Development Secretary Penny Mordaunt who accompanied Prince Charles on his recent visit to the two hurricane ravaged islands, is giving a new £15 mil-

lion package for Antigua and Barbuda and Dominica, which will receive £12 million.



The British govern-

ment official said this is to a further £15 million already allocated to the Overseas Territories.

The support package, which brings the total contribution to £92 million, will include £10 million to help Dominica rebuild critical infrastructure damaged during the hurricanes.

The United Kingdom's contribution to Dominica also includes an additional two million pounds for early recover, building on the five million pounds committed in September.

Mordaunt said that for Antigua and Barbuda, it stands ready to assist with a £3 million fund which will be deployed once the priorities for reconstruction on Barbuda are agreed with the local government.

Antigua

The Antigua and Barbuda government has submitted a proposal to the University of the West Indies (UWI) for the establishment of the university's fourth campus.

A special session was held in Jamai-

ca in October by the UWI Council, chaired by Chancellor, Robert Bermudez, to receive submission from the



Antigua and Barbuda government to establish a campus.

The Council vice-chairman, Professor Sir Hilary Beckles indicated that ongoing conversations with the government had reached maturity and that a proposal was ready.

The vice-chancellor traced the 70-year history of the UWI from its single faculty, single campus status, in 1948 to a tri-campus university with the addition of the St Augustine and Cave Hill campuses in Trinidad and Tobago, and Barbados respectively in the 1960s. The Open Campus was established ten years ago in the last significant restructuring.

Deputy Prime Minister of Antigua and Barbuda, Steady Benjamin, presented his country's case arguing that only a campus producing a diversity of human resources at a much higher

level could attract the investment capital necessary to drive economic growth above the current two to three percent growth per year.

The Council acknowledged the need to examine the Antigua and Barbuda government's proposal and has authorized the vice-chancellor to establish a task force comprising university officials, students and other stakeholders to conduct a feasibility study- examine and evaluate the financial, operational and strategic viability and the sustainability of the establishment of the new campus.

Barbados

Barbados is moving to establish plea bargaining for accused people in a bid

to address the backlog of cases. And a draft bill is now in the Attorney General's Office to take to parliament.



Attorney General

Adriel Brathwaite recalled that the late director of public prosecutions, Charles Leacock, QC, was of the view that many of the accused persons would accept a plea if given the opportunity.

This is one of the areas which was recently discussed when members of the island's judiciary, attorneys and those working in the criminal justice system underwent a two-day training course conducted by officials from the Ministry of Center for State Courts in Sentence Indications Hearing.

Speaking during the opening of the workshop, Brathwaite said Barbados had a situation where more than 50 percent of prison inmates were on remand.

While acknowledging that significant strides were being made to reduce the backlog so far, Braithwaite stressed that additional resources were required if they were to be successful.

While noting that giving persons the option to accept a guilty plea would assist with the backlog in the court system, Chief Justice Sir Marston Gibson said it was not simple as it had to be done to withstand appellate scrutiny.

Jamaica

Jamaica's Commissioner of Police George Quallo has called for divine help of the church in the fight against crime, as the murder rate has sky-rocketed past the 1,400 mark.

Quallo, who was speaking at the recent Jamaica Constabulary Forces'

(JFC) 150th Commonwealth and Memorial Church Service at the Church of the Open Bible, in the St.



Andrew parish, said that as the nation grapples with crime and violence, it is critical that substantive partnerships are secured and sustained to rebuild and maintain safer communities.

"We care calling on the church and

its members to help us to help people to examine the choices they are making. Yours is also a pivotal role in crime prevention and we crave your partnership if we are to be successful in combating and ultimately rid Jamaica of this scourge that plagues us," he told the congregation.

The commissioner also followed similar remarks by National Security Minister Peter Bunting, who recently said it is going to take divine intervention to help solve the crime problem.

As of Nov. 17, 2017 a total of 1, 404 lives have been lost, compared to the 1,137 people who were murdered last year over the same period.

Haiti

The Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) is giving Haiti a US\$65 million grant to help the impoverished Caribbean country improve drinking water and sanitation services in Portau-Prince area, in particular those affected by Hurricane Matthew.

The funds will help improve the sanitary situation in the capital and rural communities by supplying them


with drinking water and sanitation services and enhancing hygiene practices and focus on the needs of the population living

Lord Horatio Nelson statute defaced in Barbados

Apparently having had enough of the talking and calls for its removal, an unknown person or group splashed the Nelson Statue in paint the colours of the national flag to greet Barbadians one day before the 51st anniversary of independence.

Barbados celebrated the day it began the next 50 years as an independent state last Thursday, but those going about their business on Wednesday morning were greeted with the 200-year-old statue defaced with blue and gold paint.

There was also a hand-written sign placed at the bottom of the monument stating, "Lord Nelson will Fall. This racist white supremacist who would rather die than see black persons free, stands proudly in our nation's capital. Nelson must go! Fear not Barbadians have spoken, politicians have failed us."

Government intervened and had it cleaned and restored in

time for the next day 51st anniversary independence observations.


Since 1813 it was there, an imposing monument on an area called Trafalgar Square across the road from Parliament and at the head of Broad Street, the main thoroughfare of Barbados' capital Bridgetown, but following independence in 1966 many Bajans began questioning its relevance to the island's people of over 90 percent Blacks, descendants of slaves.

Many have argued that Vice-Admiral Lord Horatio Nelson statue has no place in an independent Barbados because he did nothing for the island, and supported slavery.

Noted Barbadian historian Trevor Marshall earlier this year stated, "every primary and secondary school child in Barbados now knows that Horatio Nelson fought against William Wilberforce, who spent all of his father's fortune in his campaign to abolish the heinous enslavement of Blacks".

Barbadian scholar Richard Drayton stated days ago that as an active part of the British Navy protecting slave traders, it is fair to say, "he (Nelson) certainly took white supremacy as a natural order to be defended. And posthumously he did play a part in anti-abolition politics: in 1807, at the climax of the debates in Britain about abolishing the trade, a private letter Nelson had sent to the Jamaican planter magnate Simon Taylor in June 1805 was republished by Cobbett in which Nelson had denounced "the damnable and cursed doctrine of Wilberforce and his hypocritical allies."

Another historian and scholar, University of the West Indies Vice-Chancellor Hilary Beckles stated in September, "the 85,000 enslaved Blacks entrapped in Barbados only knew of Nelson as leader of the naval power dedicated to keeping them in slavery. The 15,000 slave owners in Barbados who welcomed Nelson in the Caribbean and celebrated his presence, did so

because their greatest fear was black freedom." Beckles insisted that Nelson was the sworn enemy of Barbados' blacks.

"The enslaved Black com-

munity was not invited, therefore, to be a part of the decision made by enslavers to erect the Nelson monument in Bridgetown in 1813."



civilian counterparts won several seats in that election.

But the days leading up to Friday's observances were marred by the suicide of Ruben Rozendaal. Ruben, 61, slit his own left wrist last week after the court, which had been conducting hearings into the killings had sentenced him to 10 years in prison for his role in the executions.

Rozendaal had warned the country that he might have sacrificed himself if he was sent to jail as all he had done, on orders as a junior rank, was to round up two of the executed, including former sports Minister Andre Kamperveen and take them to the fort for death. Specifically, he argued, that he had never pulled the trigger on any one. The judges never bought his story.

"If I didn't obey maybe I would have been the 16th person who would have been killed," he told the court. It did not buy his story. In all about 20 of the still living group of 25 including Bouterse are before the courts. Some have already been sentenced. Prosecutors say they want to jail Bouterse and five others for 20 years each and set free another 10. Rozendaal had strongly believed that he would have been a free man. The 15 who were executed included four

journalists, academics, clergymen and labor leaders, all prominent citizens at the time

As the years go by and as the court slowly gets to each individual defendant, Surinamese are beginning to sense that the end is near and that some form of closure is forthcoming as every single effort by the state to stop the hearings have failed over the years.

Bouterse had back in 2012 invoked an amnesty law to permanently close the case through parliament. That attempt failed. Last year, the state also had invoked article 148 of the constitution that gives authorities the power to mandate the prosecutor general to stop criminal trials. That failed too as courts had overruled the attempt.

made nostalgic references about the successful Caribbean businessman who arrived in the USA in 1981; opened the first Golden Krust restaurant on East Gun Hill Road in the Bronx in 1989 and established the largest manufacturer of Jamaican patties in America.

"My condolences to the friends, family and employees of Jamaica-born Lowell Hawthorne," Jamaica's Prime Minister Andrew Holness said.

Peter Phillips, Jamaica's Opposition leader of the People's National Party expressed sadness adding that Hawthorne "represented the best of Jamaica in the diaspora."

"Lowell was a true Jamaican patriot. He exemplified hard work, dignity, positive attitude and high standards."

Jamaica has lost a son, ambassador and friend."

Phillips said the businessman left behind a model for success that will serve many generations in the future.

Noting that Hawthorne was a popular personality here, Phillips said he generously supported many programs in his homeland over the years and remained true to the land of his birth.

Many Jamaicans residing in South Florida flocked to social network to verify the validity of the reports.

Tony Blair, chief operating officer of

HiClass Promotion in Fort Lauderdale, echoed statements of disbelief adding that "he was such a nice guy. He had everything to live for."

Hawthorne was regarded as a role model, received numerous awards and acclaimed to being one of Jamaica's success stories as well as a generous philanthropist.

Mayor Bill deBlasio offered consolation to the entire Caribbean community. "We are shocked and saddened by the death of Lowell Hawthorne," Mayor de Blasio tweeted.

"Our prayers are with his family and his loved ones."

And Bronx Borough President recalled the generosity of the entrepreneur whose small idea in the borough expanded to establish national franchises in nine states including Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Texas, Georgia, Florida, New Jersey, Maryland and New York.

He was spotlighted on national television on the popular "Undercover Boss" series which features successful business operators who revisit their companies without knowledge of their employees in order to test the efficiency of the company.





The project will also help strengthen the ability of the Port-au-Price region's Technical Service Centre to improve the company's financial sustainability, as

well as the capabilities of the Regional Drinking Water and Sanitation Agency.

Hurricane Matthew has caused major dam-

age to the drinking water system in the departments Nippes, Sud and Grand 'Anse. Total losses caused to the sector by climate events have been put around US\$20.6 million, including \$14.2 million in damages in rural areas.

Some 60 drinking water facilities have been severely damaged or totally destroyed.

Suriname

Suriname Foreign Minister, Yidiz Pollack-Beighle became the first minister from her country to visit Russia recently where she held bilateral talks with Russian Foreign Minister, Sergey Lavrov.

The Russian Foreign Ministry said in a statement that Beighle's visit is a

milestone in promoting Russia-Suriname interaction, and is indicative of the fact that "our ties with Latin America and the Caribbean region are gradually expanding."

During the talks, the ministers signed several bilateral agreements to "promote political dialogue, interaction in the material sphere and cultural humanitarian exchanges."

The minister said Russia also sees other prospective areas of cooperation including renewable energy sources agriculture, shipbuilding and repair,

adding that there's good potential in exploration, fishing, building a tourist infrastructure.



The Suriname minister also paid a visit to the Kingdom of Morocco. The Morocco — Suriname relationship dates back to "people to people" ties after 1975, when hundreds of thousands of Surinamese migrated to the Netherlands and established relationships with Moroccans there. These ties developed and Moroccans from Holland invested in Suriname.

"He never lost the vision of what the CMU was and could grow to become," said Dr. Fritz Pinnock, executive director of the CMU. "That encouragement drove all of us to the next level," he added. The

CMU will be expanding its curricula and program options with its engineering department, to be launched soon under its newest venture — the \$3M facility, to be named FESTO Didactic Centre, will offer training in the industrial automation and mechatronics.

Implemented in partnership with German company FESTO Didactic, a world leader in industrial automation technology training, the world-class center will focus on areas such as robotics engineering, hydraulics and pneu-

The ACMF is the only entity dedicated to sponsoring scholarships for maritime students in the Caribbean. Acknowledging the indispensability of the maritime industry to Caribbean economies, Dr. Geneive Brown-Metzger, president of the ACMF noted, "there's not been another sector as important to the region's economy since bauxite. With the majority of cruise and cargo lines traversing the Caribbean Sea, and with the expansion of the Panama Canal opening up greater opportunities for the region, maritime has the potential to transform the region."

Reflecting on her childhood dreams while playing in Westbury community Rihanna said that since then her goal was fixed on becoming an entertainer.

"I didn't know how it was going to happen. I know I was hidden away on this little rock Barbados, how would anybody find me but I always knew it would happen. I always focused on the result and that kind of faith. It really was just faith."

Using herself as a motivation for young Barbadians, she encouraged them to harbour the dream because "it is possible."

This pop star who was in 2008 named an honorary Barbados Youth and Cultural Ambassador at age 20, said "I want to encourage, not just the people of Westbury New Road and the Westbury community, but all the people in Barbados, all the young women and young men who have dreams and think that the world is against them".

A community elder, one of those credited with giving guidance to Rihanna in her formative years, Kathy 'Ife' Harris, said at the ceremony, "Rihanna has given hope to the children of this neighbourhood and Barbados, that they can dare to dream, that it doesn't matter where you come from, or your humble beginnings.'







700 Guyanese receive free eyecare, glasses

As part of its 26th medical mission to Guyana, the Queens-based George Subraj Family Foundation said it provided critical eye care to an unprecedented 700 residents, mostly in the rural areas of the country, building upon its decades-long success in providing medical care to the Caribbean Community (CARI-COM) member-nation.

The mission, carried out last month, included several ophthalmologists, who provided free eye care health screenings and handed out reading and prescription eye glasses to 700 residents.

The foundation, begun by the late George Subraj, a Guyanese native who founded the successful real estate firm Zara Realty Holding Corp. in Jamaica, Queens, has sponsored 61 corneal transplants, 34 kidney transplants and eight major heart surgeries, all free, to residents otherwise unable to afford this type of medical care.

The foundation, now led by Tony Subraj, the son of its

Georgetown Public Hospital Corporation (GPHC) and Suddie Regional Hospital on Guyana's Essequibo Coast. The mission's goal was to further expand medical care into the country's poorer rural

"We want to reach as many people as possible and confounder, partnered with the tinue to build on our past suc-

cess," said Tony Subraj, who is also vice president at Zara Realty in Jamaica, Queens.

"In addition to treating serious conditions, our doctors are providing critical preventive care, which will result in better outcomes for patients with early stage illnesses," he added. "We are also helping to train doctors and volunteers in Guyana, so that a healthcare infrastructure can be built that will complement and enhance the vital work the Foundation carries out on these missions."

The foundation said that residents traveled throughout the remote Essequibo Coast area to receive screenings, eyecare, much needed medicine eyedrops, and glasses.

The medical team included ophthalmologists Dr. Celeste Havnes-Hinds from GPHC and Dr. IIeana Agramonte from Suddie Hospital, as well as optometrist Jonelle Duke.

The foundation was also instrumental in successfully procuring one cornea tissue, which was used during this latest medical mission in to

A second eve clinic is planned in another rural area, Leguan, with the goal of reaching another 300 residents, the foundation said. This upcoming mission will be led by George's wife, Gloria Subraj, and her daughter Jasmine Subraj.

The medical missions introduced and funded by the Subrai Foundation beginning in 1992 resulted in the nation of Guyana's first ever kidney transplant in 2008, the foundation said.

It said the government of Guyana supports the surgical missions via the use of medications, medical staff and the public hospital.

Jamaicans tout benefits of national ID database

Jamaica is going through the looking glass, taking advantage of technology and launching a National Identification System (NIDS) in 2018, according to

The NIDS, very similar to a Social Security number system that the United States has had for decades, will be used as a countrywide database to store National Identification Numbers for identifying people in the system and tracking where and who are getting government services, reported the Philadelphia Tribune on Saturday.

"This will spur the growth and development of commerce and economic activity through the provision of a platform of greater security and integrity for public partnerships," the paper quoted Jamaica Prime Minister Andrew Holness as saying.

The Tribune said Holness and his administration feel that the NIDS will enable the government to ensure compliance with tax collection and other critical government functions.

It is seen as strengthening immigration laws, border control and national security," the Tribute also said. Furthermore, the verification system will

authenticate the identity of citizens and other persons who are Jamaican residents and establish a database to generate national identification cards.'

But the Tribune said many Jamaicans are skeptical about the National Identification and Registration Act of 2017, stating that nationals feel "the law will turn them into just another number among the Caribbean island's 2.8 million inhabitants."

"If it ain't broke, don't fix it," the Tribune quoted a Jamaican American who intends to return to the island after retirement.

"Jamaica has been functioning quite well without the formality of a social security system," said Collin D, whose last name was not used. "This is just going to create more red tape that people have to go through to get anything done. I hope they have a seamless plan in place to roll this out and ensure that all Jamaicans benefit from it. It will be very interesting to see the implementation of this NIN [National Identification Number].'

"I understand that the government is trying to improve things" said Garnett Mills, of Philadelphia. "When I hear that every Jamaican will be given a number."





Barbados PM hits back at CCJ

Barbados Prime Minister Freundel Stuart might have picked a fight with the Caribbean Court of Justice when he accused the region's highest court of slandering the island.

With the country having been hit by at least three reprimands in the past two years from the CCJ on delays in its criminal justice system, Stuart Tuesday signalled he has had enough and fell just short of saying that this island is being picked upon.

CCJ had slammed Barbados in 2015 for a civil case that was creeping through the island's court since 1988. In 2016 it spoke of the 'inordinate systemic delay' in a case involving drug dealers.

Also last year CCJ President, Sir Dennis Byron, criticised the frequent adjournments of legal matters in Barbados' magistrates courts that slows the justice system.

Additionally, Barbadians have been complaining about the number of persons charged with serious criminal offences, including murder, walking the streets free because of long

"I do not myself get too overwhelmed by what the Caribbean Court of Justice says. We do not rejoice that there are delays in the system. There are delays, and we have to deal with them," Stuart said on the floor of Parliament.

In reference to the number of times that CCJ judges had reason to scold the island on its judicial delays, which attracted wide media attention he said, "I sometimes think that Barbados is being unnecessary slandered by some of the reports which I see."

The prime minister pointed out that CCJ can make such comments of the Barbados system because this island along with Guyana, Dominica and Belize are the only ones of the 15-member CARICOM grouping to have signed on to this Caribbean court as the jurisdiction of final appeal.

"All the others still go the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, and when you read decisions coming out of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council ... evidence of

delays in getting them to court horrible delays is uncovered in CARICOM countries that have not signed on to the CCJ." Stuart said, adding "but the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council handles that issue of delays much less salaciously than seems to be the case when the issue is being handled here in the Caribbean.'

> He said that matters of delays that are before the British Privy Council "are dealt with in one sentence, two at most, without any administering of rebuke or any holding up of a particular country to ridicule... but a lot more salaciously issues are handled in this region."

The prime minister said that delays in the criminal justice system "is a serious problem for all countries and we have to confront the problem because we all know that justice delayed is justice denied."

He went on to speak of the 'vested interest' of all Barbadians in a properly functioning judicial system, but added, "it is not going to function efficiently if whenever there is evidence that there is delay ... a country is held up to ridicule and the impression is given that the

system is not working."

He assured that the issue is not one on which Barbados can rest on its laurels, "but I am just saying that it is a regional problem and it just happens that those countries that have signed on to the CCJ come under the CCJ spotlight.

"Those that have not signed on to the CCJ come under the spotlight of the Judicial Com-

mittee of the Privy Council that deals with these issues fundamentally differently from how they are handled in the region."

The clearly unhappy prime minister added, "the impression should not be given in any quarter that we hear about delays, or we know about them, and we're doing nothing about

New book highlights Belize's diversity and history




country and those who continue to help make it what it is now.



Haiti Cherie supports education in Haiti

Haiti Cherie, Pride, Love and Commitment attracted a good-looking, tony crowd that mingled in the expansive West 57th space. After a few drinks (thanks to Moet Hennessey), one might even forget you are in Mosafer, a luxury luggage shop. But, the purpose of the evening was very clear.

For seven years, Fabrice Armand has organized an event bringing together young professionals, managers and directors at a ticketed \$75-\$100 with all proceeds going to a Haitian organization.

This year's event honored New York City Parks Commissioner Haitian-American Mitch Silver and Maryse Penatte-Kedar, founder of ProDev, the designated recipient, a foundation in Haiti building high quality education in Haiti.

"If you're looking for a school where children are punished or learn by rote, this is not the school that we support," said Leonie Hermantin, director of ProDev USA, who picked up the award for Penatte-Kendar.

Corporal punishment and

memorization and repetition are long-held conventions in many Haitian schools, which additionally are challenged with lack of funds and poorly trained, low-paid teachers.

"We create space where children get respect and are encouraged to think critically. We offer a place where they can be children and have access to a rich, learning environment,"

she explained.


The foundation's belief is that the key to development in Haiti is education "with a slightly better budget." The first of the ProDev schools operated before the earthquake, and now three ProDev schools — Cite Soleil, Zorange (K-9), and Labadee (K-9) — educate hundreds of children with their child-centered approach.

Class size is limited to 35, technology is part of the curriculum, and children get a hot, healthy meal reads the informative ProDev website. Haiti Cherie has joined the slew of partners that include IDB, Digicel, Partners in Health, and Save the Children. The foundation also is doing post-hurricane work in the south and trains teachers.

This past September, Armand

visited the ProDev school in Cite Soleil school. It was a component activity of the Haiti Food and Spirits trip he organized — five days, 17 visitors attending the festival as well as having other Haiti cultural experiences.

"Volunteering in a part of the trip," he explained of the half-day they spent with the students.

You have much to be thankful for this year.

There's a roof over your head, for beginners. You know where your next meal will come from. You can read, obviously. Running water, electricity, friends, and family, the list goes on. Author Kim Fields (with Todd Gold) counts those happy things, too, and in her new book "Blessed Life," she knows who gets credit.

Born in Harlem with a pedigree in performing — her grandmother was a dancer; her mother, an actress — Kim Fields recalls how much she loved Harlem, but she says she "would not trade growing up in Hollywood," which is where she moved with her mother when Fields was six.

At age eight, as her mother's L.A. star was on the rise, Fields tried out for her first role in a TV ad, later appearing in other commercials. She met Janet Jackson

appearance on "Good Times," as a friend of Jackson 's character.

Shortly after that first quick appearance, Fields was hired for a new spin-off television show, in part because she could roller skate. The show wasn't a hit with audiences at first, but NBC had faith in "The Facts of Life."

"Going through puberty on television was not fun," says Fields but she "handled" things. It helped that her mother kept her grounded; finding a church and connecting with God at age 14 also made a difference.

Those things helped Fields during her trials and lifted her higher when things were good. Friends helped her search for love, introducing her to men and offering support when love went wrong. Professionally, work came and went in large roles and small projects. Fields went to college, worked behind-thescenes in the film industry, fell in love, and got married. When that relationship fell apart, she became depressed and stayed in bed for weeks, asking God if he "still got a plan, right?"


He did. It involved a new love, friendship that led Fields to an a family, more work, new focus, and maturity.

"What I've come to terms with," says Fields, "is that as long as I'm moving forward.... I'm winning at least half the battle."

"Blessed Life" is a bit of fresh air in the star-biography genre.

While so many H'wood memoirs get oversaturated with chummy shouts of Look-Who-I-Know, author Kim Fields' ubiquitous (in star bios) name-dropping feels incidental and totally natural here. Fields (with Todd Gold) doesn't seem to be reaching to impress anyone; rather, her anecdotes are breezy and fun and pretty matter-of-fact, but she's also open to laying out the ups and downs of being a child-star, grown up. Even that is told simply, but with just a little embellishment and a lot of gratitude.

Overall, we take the good, we take the bad, and we get a sense that the best aspects of Fields' TV characters reflected the best of her, too. Most happily, this peek at stardom isn't heavy on the drama and for that, reading "Blessed Life" is something to be thankful for.

Equity: Look at how students from all backgrounds are doing. Is there a big achievement gap between different groups? This helps you understand how schools are serving disadvantaged student groups.

Advanced coursework: To understand the academic rigor of a school, research the advanced courses offered. How many students are enrolling in those courses? What's the average number of advanced courses a student takes at the school? All these details can paint a picture about whether the students are getting the classes

they need for college and beyond.

Discipline and attendance flags: Does the school have high chronic absenteeism? Do they suspend some groups of students far more often than others? This might be a red flag that you should consider.

College readiness: If you have a high school student, you're probably starting to think about the future. If you want to ensure your child's school is preparing them for college, research the high school's SAT-ACT participation and performance.

When the program began in 2012, less than 40 percent of youth in foster care locally were graduating.

"Youth in foster care often need extra time to graduate because of challenges out of their control, and Treehouse sticks with them regardless of how long the journey takes," said Janis Avery, CEO of Treehouse.

How it's done

Based in middle schools and high schools, Graduation Success introduces consistent education focus into the students' lives, often for the first time. Part coach, part parent and frequently part best friend, Education Specialists meet with their students weekly—year in and year out, even during the summer. The students take charge of their own futures by learning to set goals, make plans and advocate for themselves.




Caribbean-style Christmas comes to Canarsie

He probably began developing an empathy for the less fortunate at an early age. That's because he had to drop out of school to work in a factory to support the family after his bankrupt father (Jonathan Pryce) went to a debtors' prison.




The world's fastest man noted, "They seem to always take off at a slow rate. Getting it right will definitely help people.'

UWI vice chancellor: Blame it on IMF

Cricket is not played just on the field, it begins in the community from which players emerge, and the Caribbean environment has been producing individuals who put self before country, said historian Hilary Beckles.

For this reason, the University of the West Indies vicechancellor has laid blame for West Indies cricket being in the doldrums for the past 20 years squarely on polices laid down on societies of the region by the International Monetary Fund, which he contends takes away from the poor and gives to the rich and big business.

He said that much of the decline in quality of players and the absence of their dedication to country and region is to be blamed on a selfish approach by players who put personal enrichment over national interests.

"That is the new mindset, but I do not blame cricketers for this mindset," Beckles said.

Beckles recently used the opportunity of a launch of his book on West Indies cricket to slam the fund for what he

said was the economic destruction its programmes caused in Caribbean societies where IMF policies benefit only the upper class and the corporate sector, while the wretched conditions it created for the masses contributed to the fall of West Indies cricket.

Beckles had authored 13 books on various aspects of Caribbean society before penning the new release. 'Cricket without a Cause: fall and rise of the mighty West Indian Test Cricketers.'

As the title suggests, Beckles' book chronicles the progress and struggles in this game that holds great significance to people of the English-speaking Caribbean.

He explained, "in the book I argued this is an issue of the education, it is not about cricketers.

"It's about why it is that after 50 years of independence we still have half of our citizens trapped in ghettos, living in the most deplorable environments imaginable.

"Almost every country in the Caribbean in the 1990s, in the decade of decline ... was under

an IMF programme in one way or another.

"To one level of intensity or another the IMF had taken over the Caribbean because our economies were all collapsing.

"And these are the societies - the societies that have been cut off by the governments, left to fend for themselves in poverty — these are the communities that are producing the cricketers."

The vice-chancellor said that when the Caribbean young cricketers emerge from these downtrodden societies where the struggle everyday is one for personal existence, "they come with a hardened attitude towards their governments, an indifferent attitude towards their societies, and an aggressive sense of surviving as an individual."

Beckles said that he shared his opinions with IMF Director, Christine Legarde, during a meeting with her in his office in Jamaica earlier this month when she had visited that island for the sixth IMF High Level Caribbean Forum.

The foremost Caribbean aca-

demic said that he told Legarde, "while you are pouring millions and millions of dollars into the governments to stabilise these economies, the beneficiaries of all these IMF programmes are the upper class, the corporate class, the big companies, and the victims of all of your programmes are the working poor people, and these are the people who are the majority.'

Given these conditions he asked Legarde, "so what is the future of democracy of the IMF continues to dominate the Caribbean?"

He told his Monday night audience that in the conversation with the IMF head, "I was concerned about the fact that these young cricketers are coming from these dis-enfranchised communities.'


