ABLP returns to power in Antigua

The incumbent Antigua and Barbuda Labor Party (ABLP) of Prime Minister Gaston Browne returned to power resoundingly in Wednesday's general elections.

low voter-turn-out poll indicate that the ABLP was poised to win 15 of the 17 seats in the Legislature.

Browne, who called the elections 15 months before they were constitutionally due, had predicted that the ABLP would win all seats.

The main opposition United Progressive Party (UPP), of Harold Lovell, seemed likely to earn no more than one

ing his seat for the second successive election.

The last general elections in Antigua and Barbuda were held in 2014.

According to the Antigua Preliminary results in the and Barbuda Newsroom, one independent candidate and 52 other people were officially nominated to contest the poll.

Attorney-at-law Ralph Francis was the only independent candidate.

The ABLP was the only party to contest all 17 constituencies. The UPP contested 16 while its affiliate, the Barbuda Peoples Movement (BPM), contested one

seat, with Lovell himself los- seat on hurricane-ravaged Barbuda.

The new Democratic National Alliance registered 13 candidates, the Go Green Party two, the Antigua Barbuda True Labor Party two and the Missing Link VOP one, the Newsroom said.

Both Browne and Lovell were sanguine of winning the elections.

"We are confident about not only winning the next general election but literally taking all the seats," Browne had said before the vote.

Lovell had told reporters: "I am confident that the constituents have decided that I should be returned."

Women at the helm across the Caribbean

Justice Paula-Mae Weeks has reportedly settled in nicely into her new role as the first woman to serve as president of Trinidad and Tobago after being sworn as head of state at a well attended public ceremony on Monday.

Almost no section of the republic's society had opposed her nomination last year to replace fellow Judge Anthony Carmona. In fact, the loudest voices of support had come from the main opposition United Congress (UNC) which had incidentally given the country's its first woman prime minister in the form of attorney Kamla Persad-Bissesar.

Persad-Bissessar served a single five-year term as head of government before being booted out of office in 2015 amid swirling accusations about corruption, nepotism and graft during her tenure.

Justice Weekes' inauguration ceremony was broadcast live on both traditional and social media, allowing her to tell the

nation, the island's Caribbean neighbors and the wider world that the time had come to heal a nation grappling with more than 400 mostly gun murders each year, other forms of violent crime, fear, unemployment and serious issues.

"Telling us that Trinidad and Tobago is currently close to the point of no return, crime, corruption, racism, a dismal public service and an ineffective judicial system and other problems are so thick on the ground that we feel all is lost if we are not there already - a failed state however defined," she said, pointing to some of the bucket list of problem besetting the oil and gas-rich nation just north of the South American coast.

But she said "we must trust in time. We will reap the benefits of our efforts. So be a light at your home, instill discipline, model good behavior. You can be a light in your school, pay more attention to the lessons in your home. protect the vulnerable, respect

Pols rip Trump's policies

Mayor Bill de Blasio took the lead Sunday in condemning President Donald Trump's policies at a gala "Women Celebrating Women" Awards ceremony at Tropical Paradise Ballroom on Utica Avenue in Brooklyn.

"To build power, we need leadership," said de Blasio in addressing the sell-out event that comprised a number of New York legislators. "The next few months is a moment of peril, because we know who's in the White House.

"This is the moment, because people are yearning for change," added the mayor at the ceremony organized by the Brooklyn-based Progressive Democrats Political Association (PDPA), headed by the trailblazing, former New York City Councilwoman Jamaican Una S.T.

"Job no. 1 is to make sure Yvette Clarke wins the primary for Congress," he continued. "God will not spare us if we don't work hard. Help Yvette not to be in the lonely group in the House of Representatives. We want Yvette to be in the majority."

Without calling the president's name, Clarke said "45 (the 45th president) has the dignity of calling African and Haitian 's---hole

"No words they throw at us can stop us from rising up," she said. "The battle is on. We're not, by any means, afraid of what's going on right now. It's good versus evil.

"Let's draw the line," added Clarke, representative for the 9th Congressional District in Brooklyn. "There's no grey area. When you go and deport people, that's evil.

Lt. gov., challenger seek votes at women's gala

Rarely do politicians miss the opportunity to convey their messages to a large audience, especially when seeking votes for election or re-election.

So, while most patrons would expect to hear addresses by legislators during last Sunday's gala "Women Celebrating Women Awards" ceremony, at Tropical Paradise Ballroom on Utica Avenue in Brooklyn, they likely did not anticipate that the incumbent New York State Lt. Gov. Kathy Hochul and her fierce challenger, Council Member Jumaane Williams, would speak at the event.

Hochul addressed a captive audience at the ceremony, organized by the Brooklyn-based Progressive Democrats Political Association (PDPA), headed by former New York City Council Member Jamaican Dr. Una S.T. Clarke.

Hochul was the second speaker, delivering her remarks soon after Public Advocate Letitia James gave hers in the five-hour-long program.

Williams, who arrived late, told Caribbean Life, during the event, that he was unaware that Hochul would attend and speak at the gala.

Nonetheless, he said: "I would have loved to be here when she spoke."

Both, however, delivered remarks that seemed to resonate with disparate sections of the audience.

Piggybacking on James's terse tribute to the late Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm, who had represented the then 11th Congressional District in Brooklyn, Hochul said Chisholm, of Caribbean parentage, "may be from Brooklyn, but she spent time in my home town.

"She became a champion of seniors." she said before launching into President Donald Trump's immigration policies.

"I'm a grand-daughter of immigrants," Hochul added. "I'm concerned that the next Una Clarke is being shut out of our country.

"I know what it's like to fight for Yvette (Congresswoman Clarke, Una's daughter)," Hochul continued. "Only 20

percent of women are in Congress. I'm honored to be lieutenant governor. I'm going to keep fighting for you."

She also said she will address "the criminal injustice system" before noting the 100th anniversary of a woman's right to vote.

'You should not continue voter suppression for 2018," she then asserted.

Williams, representative for the 45th Council District in Brooklyn, said, on the other hand, that "we're fighting 'Orange Madness' in New York State.

"They have an interesting guest speaker," he added, clearly alluding to Hochul. "They (Hochul) have not been here much, but I have.

"I have been able to step up and say, 'the emperor has no clothes," continued Williams, disclosing that Brooklyn has had "one of the highest (voter) turnouts" for lieutenant governor.

"We have a lot of work to do," he said. "It's time; let's go."

The OAS said its Permanent Council will hold a special meeting on March 23, at its headquarters in Washington,

Remembrance for Victims of the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade and Slavery under the theme, "Remember Slavery: Triumphs and struggles for freedom and equality in the Americas."

The special meeting will include a panel discussion intended to highlight the personal stories and gains of African descendants in the movement towards freedom and equality in the Americas, the OAS said.

THE NEWS FROM BACK HOME

Antigua

Antigua and Barbuda Prime Minister Prime Minister Gaston Browne announced that his government has decided to appoint a special investigator to look into bribery and money laundering allegations against United Progressive Party (UPP) candidate Dr. McCheseny Emmanuel in the March 21 general elections.

Emanuel has denied the fraudulent

allegations saying the people making the allegations are on a smear campaign because he is likely to defeat his constituency opponent Charles Max Fernandez.



Speaking on local radio, Browne said the authorities in the United States may

have a case against Dr. Emmanuel. He said the Dr. Emmanuel maybe in violation of the laws of Antigua and Barbuda as well.

Browne said that Cabinet has taken a decision to appoint a special investigator to investigate this matter and to turn it over to the director of public prosecutions (DPP) and other law enforcement officers to pursue it. Because there is a prima facie evidence of a bribe and money laundering.

The prime minister also alleged corruption after revealing that the UPP administration allegedly spent more than one million dollars a year for an office for an honorary consul in the **United States:**

Dr. Emmanuel served as Antigua and Barbuda's honorary counsul in New York from 2004 to 2014.

Barbados

The Governor of the Central Bank

of Barbados, Cleviston Havnes, said that initial estimates suggest that economic activity in Barbados expanded



by only one percent in 2017.

He said the current forecasts do not indicate any acceleration of economic growth.

Haynes was at the time addressing the 2018 Week of Excellence Seminar in Barbados.

He said in recent years, the Barbados economy has been characterized by sluggish economic activity, weak public finances, high public sector indebtedness and declining foreign exchange reserves.

The Central Bank governor told the seminar that the island's credit rating has fallen and access to finance for government in both domestic and foreign markets has declined.

Havnes noted that while economic activity has recovered in the past two years, growth remains weak, as evidenced by the bank's initial estimates

that suggest that activity expanded by one percent in 2017.

Cayman Islands

Outgoing Governor of the Cayman Islands, Helen Kilpatrick has called on the British Overseas territory to address the lack of recognition of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) rights.

Kilpatrick, who is due to leave the Cayman Islands shortly, said the Foreign and Commonwealth Office wants

the government to adopt legislation in the territory to prohibit discrimination against the LGBT community, saving that it is time to



recognize same sex partnerships.

She said there is need for legislation, and particularly the recognition of same sex partnerships, is now pressing and "I would urge the government to make progress on this legislation to advance the rights of LGBT members of the Cayman Islands community."

Dominica

The government of Dominica will soon sign an agreement with Cuba for 100 skilled workers, including engineers in the reconstruction of the hurricaneravaged island.

Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit is also appealing to nationals living overseas with such skills to return and assist itself to unnecessary bureaucracy and

in rebuilding the island.

He said five months after Hurricane Maria lashed the island, killing some 30 people and causing widespread damage,

there was still the need for skilled workers to help homeowners put a roof over their heads.



Skerrit said the government is final-

izing an agreement with Cuba where more than 100 skilled workers (men and women) will be brought into Dominica to help fix the homes and reconstruct the country.

He said among the skilled workers are some 30 electricians to help in rewiring of homes across Dominica.

The prime minister also surged nationals with various skills residing overseas to assist, adding that many contractors have said to the government that they are experiencing challenges recruiting skilled workers.

Jamaica

The Jamaica government is seeking to speed up the approval for licenses to be issued to stakeholders in the local marijuana industry.

Industry Minister Karl Samuda said the industry has not progressed as anticipated.

Samuda said many stakeholders were of the view that the approval process was too "cumbersome" and "lends delay and is hoping for some significant changes."

He noted that while two licenses has been approved and the licensees have started production there is a lot more that can be done if some of the bureaucracy is removed.

Samuda, who is also Agriculture Minister, pointed out that one of the challenges being experienced by the sector is the lack of funding, noting that

local financial institutions are unwilling to support any of the industry's activities due to what is deemed



the informal nature of the business.

The minister added that the Cannabis Licensing Authority's role in the industry's overall development is to be strengthened.

St. Kitts

The St. Kitts and Nevis government has denied international media reports that India fugitive billionaire diamond czar Nirav Modi has applied for economic citizenship in the twin-island Federation.

Modi is wanted in connection with the biggest fraud in India history.



In a statement, the government said it has

those in authority. Light can be seen in a community, where people care for their environment and are tolerant of the views, beliefs and practices of others."

Her nomination to the highest position in the country comes just three months after neighboring Barbados also chose a woman judge to become the island's governor general.

Not being a republic like Trinidad, the position in Barbados is for the appointment of a governor general rather than president. That person serves as Queen Elizabeth's representative in Barbados. No such thing applies in Trinidad as it has basically severed ties with Britain, its former colonizer.

In early January, Justice Sandra Mason was sworn in as governor general of Barbados, the second woman to do so after Dame Nita Barrow. She has the distinction of being the first woman admitted to the bar on the island and its first female appeals court judge.

The two will sit at above the political and partisan fray in their respective countries and will join a burgeoning list of distinguished women holding that position. Some are also leaders of the main opposi-

tion parties and could be elected as prime ministers in the coming months.

For example, polls in Barbados are showing that attorney Mia Mottley will more than likely defeat incumbent Prime Minister Freundel Stuart when elections are called before mid year as is constitutionally mandated.

The 30-member parliament has already been dissolved. It is just for Stuart who is running the clock to almost the very last, to call a date as the island economy sags, foreign exchange reserves are at an all time low and as a major sewage problem on the south coast is causing hotels and other businesses millions in lost revenues weekly.

There are several women at the national helm both in the 15-nation CARICOM bloc of nations and the wider Caribbean.

Lucille George-Wout has been governor of Curacao, a Dutch territory since November of last year. In nearby Aruba, Evelyn Wever-Croes is prime minister in Aruba as well as Sharlene Cartwrtight-Robinson in the Turks and Caicos Islands as it tries to recover from that devastating 2017 hurricane season.

As well, Dame Cecile La Grenade is governor general of Grenada, Dame Marguerite Pindling has been governor general of The Bahamas since 2014. Like Mottley of Barbados, Persad-Bissessar of Trinidad is waiting to become prime minister again if her party wins the 2020 general elections. And no one forgets that social worker Portia Simpson-Miller had been the immediate past prime minister of Jamaica, serving at the same time with Persad-Bissessar.

Boosting Caribbean resilience

The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) says despite a massive humanitarian effort over the past six months in the Eastern Caribbean, Cuba and Haiti, there is still much work to be done to rehabilitate water and sanitation and other infrastructure damaged by powerful hurricanes Irma and Maria.

"So long [as] children are in need or in danger, we will continue working tirelessly so that everyone can look to the future with hope," said María Cristina Perceval, regional director of UNICEF for Latin America and the Caribbean on Tuesday, stating that some US\$11.5 million in international donations continue to help the agency's work in the region.

UNICEF said it continues to work on the ground, while, at the same time, it prepares for the arrival of the new hurricane season, with the aim of minimizing potential damage and impact on the most vulnerable areas.

In September 2017, the UN said at least 1.4 million people, including 357,000 children, were affected by the two category 5 hurricanes that wreaked havoc through Anguilla, Antigua and Barbuda, Cuba, Dominica, Haiti, the British Virgin Islands, and Turks and Caicos Islands.

"Following the storms," Perceval said, UNICEF responded immediately, mobilizing supplies and human resources to meet the needs of those affected and save lives."

The agency said it continues to prioritize safe water and hygiene, giving more than 400,000 affected people, including children, access to drinking water and purification tablets — "fundamental actions that save lives and prevents the outbreak and transmission of waterborne diseases, such as cholera and diarrhea."

On protecting children, another of UNICEF's priorities, some 16,000 participated in psychosocial activities and 1,500 people were trained to continue carrying out these programs.

In addition, UNICEF and its partners launched a cash transfer system benefiting more than 4,600 of the most vulnerable families following the hurricanes.

"Along with these emergency response actions," Perceval said "UNICEF and its partners maintain their work in the Caribbean to contribute to an inclusive, equitable and prosperous region that guarantees the provision of quality services and support to children in the areas of education, child protection, social protection and resilience to guarantee the realization of children's rights."

With the next hurricane season in the region officially beginning on June 1, UNICEF said it is working to improve capacities and reduce vulnerability at national and community level.

We need truth in treatment in modern medicine

I recently met with a patient who was diagnosed with throat cancer and metastases to his lungs. He was on a feeding tube and his weight was down to 109 pounds. A surgical procedure that he underwent this past June in an attempt to remove the cancer had permanently robbed him of his speech and his ability to ever eat or taste food again. He spent two months after surgery in a skilled nursing facility sharing a room with a stranger. After 2½ months of being away from his home, he was discharged.

His family contacted my office in September due to his rapid decline and because he had no direction or conversation with the multitude of healthcare providers that he had encountered over the course of his diagnosis, surgery, hospitalization and skilled nursing admissions. Unfortunately, he is just one of thousands of patients who yearly undergo non-beneficial treatments and are left with the physical and emotional scars. What little time he had left, he was now denied the joy of simple things such as tasting his favorite foods.

When I first met this patient whom I will refer to as "Joe" to maintain his privacy, he wrote on a piece of paper, "quality of life." I wonder how many times he verbalized those words to the healthcare providers he trusted before he died on New Year's Eye

Infact, an article published in the Journal of American Medical Association (JAMA) Internal Medicine concluded: "The majority of participants overestimated intervention benefit and underestimated harm. Clinicians should discuss accurate and balanced information about intervention benefits and harms with patients, providing the opportunity to develop realistic expectations and make informed decisions."

The Journal of Palliative Medicine reports: "Seventy-eight percent of patients received at least one form of intensive EOL [end-of-life] care, including 75 percent of those who preferred comfort measures at last documentation."

As a practicing nurse, I know these studies are accurate because I have seen terminally ill patients die in hospital ICUs. These patients were subjected to non-beneficial exams and treatments, which resulted in increased pain, anxiety and needlessly prolonged suffering. I know many other nurses who feel the same way.

In response to this systemic failure, Compassion & Choices, which advocates for patients to have the full range of health-care options, introduced a new initiative last November called "Truth in Treatment." The goal

The West Indian diaspora demands answers from Cricket West Indies or West Indies Cricket Board, or "whatever you'll call yourselves," to borrow former West Indies captain Ramnaresh Sarwan's recent quote, as to why and how we are still struggling amongst cricket's minions to find a place on cricket's biggest stage-the World Cup. This is a debacle in itself, because not only is it unprecedented, but it would have been risible to even think that before.

This prestigious tournament is held every four years, and is cricket's Olympics. We have won the first two editions of the tournament, thanks to the leadership of Clive Lloyd and his team. Hence, our struggle to make the qualifiers is very depressing, indeed.

While other teams such Australia, England, India, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa and Sri Lanka have already secured a place in the tournament, West Indies is still fighting hard to qualify in Zimbabwe, where the home team almost knocked us out of the tournament, after Afghanistan humiliated us. Even Bangladesh, an emerging cricketing nation, has made the World Cup qualifiers before us.

Most West Indians treasure our conquests in this tournament, from its inception. Will that brilliant, match winning 102 by Clive Lloyd in the final against Australia in the inaugural World Cup in 1975, Rohan Kanhai's wonderful supporting knock of 55 with

Lloyd, Alvin Kallicharran's onslaught on Lillee in his spellbinding 10 ball sequence of 4,4,4,4,1,4,6,0,4 (35 runs), Viv Richards spectacular 3 run-outs in the same final, his majestic 138 from 157 balls, consisting of 11 fours, 3 sixes and Collis King's mercurial 86 from 66 balls, 10 fours, 3 sixes in the 1979 final, this time against England, for example, ever be bestowed again to a proud Caribbean nation?

Caribbean nations yearn for such glory, again. After all, although the West Indies "are Third World countries, we belong and are in the first World of Cricket." (Former Jamaican PM, Michael Manley). Cricket is not only a religion in the Caribbean, but it best defines the region in the highest context. Indeed, regional political integration has its genesis in cricket as a unifying and defining force.

We just cannot ignore, nor relinquish that supremacy. In a larger world where we are often treated as underdogs and second class citizens in a global context, allow us to find comfort and solace in our regional strength.

Intrinsic in this endeavor, is our demand that Cricket West Indies President, Dave Cameron, explain his logic and methodology that "the Caribbean side are using the ICC World Cup qualifiers in Zimbabwe to plot their capture of the showpiece in England next year... In going to the tournament, we've been planning on how to win the World Cup, not just qualify...That's the reason we took certain players to ensure that we have the quality and we're [giving] some players experience to be able to win the World Cup," he has told reporters.

Every school child in the Caribbean is smart enough to denounce such an unwise approach and utterances as "counting your chickens before they are hatched." They will tell you that you will achieve nothing when you implement such an egotistical and reckless approach. Some will, understandably, use more colorful language to describe it, which I cannot publish here.

Indeed, the basic defects of Cameron's so called master plan is reflected in the omission of players like Kieron Pollard, Darren and Dwayne Bravo, Sunil Narine and Andre Russell. He may argue that they "opted out," or that amnesty will solve the problem and we will field our strongest team, but his critics will counter that he kept them out, without exploring any avenues to include them at all. After all, in Cameron's world, an Emperor does not have to accommodate lesser mortals. "These players would

The venture was also alluring to new and burgeoning reggae artists who were elusive to commercial labels and their artist and repertoire scouts.

is to bring awareness to the growing number of patients with life-threatening illnesses who are receiving non-beneficial treatments. The program is aimed at moving away from a "one size fits all" approach to healthcare and empowering individuals through educational tools, such as a "Diagnosis Decoder," to help them build trusting, candid relationships with their doctors, ask discerning questions, and use the answers to make fully informed treatment decisions.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has also recognized the importance of end-of-life care decisions. In an effort to facilitate end-of-life care discussions with patients, CMS is now reimbursing physicians to participate in these discussions. While Medicare now reimburses doctors for conducting these discus-

sions, a survey commissioned by the John A. Hartford Foundation, the California Health Care Foundation, and Cambia Health Foundation concluded: "Less than onethird (29 percent) [of physicians] report having had any formal training specifically on talking with patients and their families about end-oflife care."

The responsibility of Truth in Treatment starts with all teaching medical institutions. Without incorporating end-of-life care discussions into the curriculum and limiting physician's exposure to only a "curative" approach to healthcare, they are doing a disservice to the doctors and the patients in which he/she will be entrusted. Without education and understanding, the cycle of non-beneficial treatment will continue and it is the patient and familv who will suffer.

Death is inevitable. Truth is a right. Knowledge is power.

have had to bow down and ask for an apology, I am the king of the West Indies. The West Indies is me, myself and I," Cameron would have explained.

To their credit, veterans Chris Gayle and Marlon Samuels sucked up their pride and were included, but were under great pressure to perform. These players will tell you how WPA's criticisms can devastate a player. Ask Ronnie Sarwan, a class batsman we loved to see bat. Ronnie said he did not know his front foot from his back foot, and will never play for the West Indies again.

Understandably, when great players and captains such as Worrell, Sobers, Kanhai, Lloyd, Richards and Lara scold players, they respect that, but when a dictatorial official who hardly knows how to hold a bat or grip a ball attempts to do the same, he disparages a player.

Cameron's also claims that, "CWI had made player performance the key requirement going forward...I think we need to be very clear about what we are doing... We are about performance and we want to make that very clear across everything that we do, that if we don't perform they are consequences. I wouldn't go as far as to say they will be changes because I know we will qualify."

We cannot forget that Cameron presided over the defeat of the once mighty West Indies that were forced into the qualifiers for the first time in our history after we were ranked ninth in the One-Day International rankings at the Sept. 30 cut-off date last year, while 8 other teams-who will readily admit that they cannot boast of the great players and history the West Indies once ruled the cricketing world-gained automatic qualification. Neither should we compete in the World Cup if we are going to be content with qualifying. Where is your plan to win, and regain our cricket superiority, Mr. Cameron?

Cameron's attempts to preempt the arguments that he is the cause of West Indies demise, when he claims, "the lack of financial support from both government and the corporate sector, had contributed to the decline of West Indies cricket... You just look at the top of the cricket rankings, the globalized nations, and that tells you everything," he contended. "There's financial support, there's corporate support — government and corporate — and that's the reason Cricket West Indies cricket is where it's at today. We were supported by sugar cane, bananas, bauxite and where are those industries today?"

Well, what has changed, Mr. Cameron, when we had those same humble or even less support, and proudly ruled the cricket world? Your argument is fallacious. America, a corporate behemoth, is not the greatest cricket nation, in spite of your theory. Neither is the UAE, Netherlands or Hong Kong. Indeed, we were almost sent packing by Zimbabwe, humiliated by Afghanistan, while countries like Nepal have claimed One-Day Internationalstatus for the first time, surely not corporate, financial or global titans by any stretch of the imagination!

Indeed, you are the common and supervening factor in our cricket's deterioration. Take a leave of absence, let CARICOM grant and implement unconditional amnesty to all players, implement professional responsibility for players, and let's see how our fortunes soar once again.

out of India are promulgating the false claim that Nirav Modi, his wife Ami and his uncle Mehul Choksi have applied for economic citizenship in the twin-island Federation of St. Kits and Nevis."

"The government of St. Kitts and Nevis repudiates this allegation and states on the record that Mr. Modi is not a citizen of St. Kitts and Nevis, and neither his wife and uncle," the statement said.

The India government recently revoked the Indian passport of Modi and an Indian newspaper has claimed he has since moved to the Caribbean island in a bid to evade arrest.

Punjab National Bank (PNB), India's second largest government-owned lender, has said that the quantum of fraud uncovered at one of its Mumbai branches last month is expected to rise to over US204 billion from US\$1.77 billion estimated until now.

Trinidad

The Trinidad and Tobago government and opposition came together in the House of Representatives to pass the

controversial Anti-Gang Bill 2018.

Both members of the government and the opposition voted in favor of the bill, which will now go to the Senate for final approval.

The Anti-Gang Bill 2017 was defeated in Parliament last year after the opposition did not lend its support over the

sunset clause which the opposition wanted two years but the government wanted five years.

The bill was allowed

to return to Parliament after Attorney General Faris-al-Rawi moved the suspension of Standing Order 78 to permit the introduction of the bill.

The Anti-Gang Bill would give the police some help in the fight against criminals.

The bill carries a stiff penalty of 10 years in prison for a first conviction and 20 years for any subsequent conviction.

There are more than 210 gangs in T&T with a membership of more than 2,000 members in Trinidad and Toba-

Barbados government angry at UK press

A report in the British Daily Telegraph newspaper on the distresses afflicting Barbados ranging from economic to environmental health matters, has government politicians up in arms, while the political opposition is expressing shame.

In an article headlined, 'The stench of economic decay is overwhelming Barbados,' the Telegraph's business editor, Julia Bradshaw, warned a week ago that "Barbados stinks. It really does," as she reported on the vexing issue of sewage spilling onto the roads on the island's south coast, resulting in the closure of several establishments and hundreds of thousands of dollars in losses to hoteliers.

The writer claimed that because of the stench tourists were leaving and many who have not yet arrived were cancelling flights.

Among other issues the article addressed are what it described as a 'toxic mix of incompetence and economic mismanagement,' and violence in schools

opposition, Mia Mottley, said the report is "a commentary on Barbados that is so sad that we feel shame."

"When they can talk about the foul stench, it wasn't only the stench on the south coast they were talking about. They were talking about the foul economic stench, corruption in government, indiscipline in our society, the decline of a society and a nation," Mottley said.

"The Democratic Labour Leader of the main political Party [government] in 2018 has

devalued and diminished us, downgraded us as a country to the point where everyone who read that article shook their head in shame and said, 'Lord have Mercy on our people, our country," she added.

But despite a crisis of a broken sewerage system causing sewage spills on the road, into vards and business compounds along with persistent national economic problems. Tourism Minister Richard Sealy was outraged at the report and fired off a note to the British newspaper's editor expressing 'shock and disappointment' at the article, which he said was "viciously crafted with invective, rhetoric and hyperbole."

Sealy said in the letter that the article was "an attempt to denigrate Barbados' reputation, a country which currently ranks number 25 of 180 countries, by Transparency International.'

In a comment that suggests money should influence the newspaper's editorial integrity, Sealy said, "we are confounded that the Telegraph, a long-standing media partner of Barbados, would print such a

scathing article about a partner who spends significant sums in advertising with them annually without doing us the courtesy of making an enquiry. This is a terrible affront and an incredulous situation.'

Sealy's bald attempt at editorial interference might be from the UK.



The Center for Black Literature at Medgar Evers College (CBL), City University of New York says it will hold its 14th National Black Writers Conference (NBWC) from Thursday, March 22 – Sunday, March 25.

The four-day, highly-anticipated event features a Youth Literacy program, an Elder Writers Workshop, and a Tribute and Awards Ceremony honoring some of today's most revered authors, scholars, cultural historians and literary activists.

CBL said the 2018 theme is "Gathering at the Waters: Healing, Legacy and Activism in Black Literature."

Local, regional, and nationally celebrated writers, scholars, literary professionals, students, and the community-at-large will convene over four days to discuss topics related to the conference theme, CBL said.

Caribbean court names new president

A national of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Justice Adrian Saunders has been named as the next president of the Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ).

He will replace Sir Dennis Byron when he steps down later this year.

Byron, a national of St. Kitts and Nevis, was appointed as the CCJ's second president on Sept. 1, 2011.

The tenure of the CCJ president is for a non-renewable term of seven years.

The announcement of Saunders as the next CCJ president was made on the CCJ's official Twitter account last week.

"The CCJ president, Sir Dennis Byron, announced that the next president of the Court will be Mr. Justice Saunders, who is already a judge at the

CCJ." the tweet said.

Saunders, a former acting chief justice of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court, was sworn in as a CCJ judge on April 16, 2005.

Justice Saunders was appointed in 1996 as Judge of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court (ECSC) and in 2003 he was confirmed as a Justice of Appeal of the ECSC.

One year later he was appointed to act as chief justice of that court.

Justice Saunders holds a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of the West Indies (Cave Hill) Barbados in 1975 and Legal Education Certificate of the Hugh Wooding Law School in Trinidad and Tobago in 1977, the CCJ's website stated.

He was called to the bar of the St Vincent and the Grenadines in the same year.

How mom and pop shops stay competitive against big chain stores in Brooklyn

With new Duane Reades and CVSs opening up shop every year, there is a space issue in NYC. Especially in New York, which is known to be a dogeat-dog city, more and more of the smaller stores are finding it harder to stay in business in this changing landscape. Brooklyn specifically has seen major changes in the real estate space, with a prime example being Lake Realty's 1601 Kings Highway in Sheepshead Bay which is currently under construction, that will house tenants such as Modell's Sporting Goods, CVS, and Planet Fitness. 

Barbados loses a round in NCD fight

Barbados government's haste to grab tax revenue, a determination of distributors to sell their product regardless of health consequences, and fluctuation in the Trinidad currency have combined to dull the intended effect of a sin tax on sugary drinks.

With one in five persons afflicted by diabetes in its general population, and that ratio increasing to one out of every two adults above the age of 65, health officials convinced the Barbados government that radical action is needed against non-communicable diseases (NCD), and sugar should be targeted.

This resulted in a 10 percent surtax being slapped on all local and imported sugar-sweetened beverages in 2015.

Lecturer at the University of the West Indies, Professor Alafia Samuels, said that the sugary drinks were singled out because, "the Caribbean has the highest consumption of sugar-sweetened beverages in the world. On average, people in the Caribbean drink two sugar-sweetened beverages per

person per day," and this is the main reason that, "four out of 10 women are obese, and two out of 10 men are obese".

But she said last weekend that the Barbados government's overriding focus on earning the extra revenue was the first factor to soften the desired effect of the sin tax measure.

"Usually when we are going to do something like this, it is a health intervention, and so it would be important to have public education to prepare the public.

"But in reality, in Barbados this intervention was driven more by tax revenue. And so it was announced and implemented quickly without a chance for real public education to take place," said Dr. Samuels, the director of the George Alleyne Chronic Disease Research Centre.

She said that while government has been successfully reaping its revenue over the almost three years, "the industry has absorbed some of that tax, and on the shelf you [consumer] are only actually seeing a six percent tax difference in prices."

Samuels pointed out that this reduces the impact of the price increase, which was intended to discourage consumers from purchasing many sugar-sweetened drinks.

"Obviously it's what the consumer faces when they are going to the checkout register that matters, and the consumer is facing only a six percent difference, and this is going to influence their behaviour."

The impact of that 10 percent, effectively cut to six percent, sin tax has been further reduced by a drop in value of the currency of Trinidad, from where Barbados imports many of its drinks.

"The Trinidad and Tobago dollar has been weakening over time, which means that their products, including their sugar-sweetened, beverages coming into the island are actually more competitively priced.

"It meant that some of those drinks are at a lesser price than they would have been had the Trinidad dollar remained stable," she said of this uncontrollable factor.

Samuels is now calling for that sin tax on sugar-sweetened

drinks to be hiked from 10 percent to 20 percent, but unless it is accompanied by public education on the dangers of over-consumption of sugar, government is convinced not to focus only

on the extra revenue, and beverage distributors are persuaded not to lower the price to ensure sales, the impact of that recommended 50 percent tax increase will be equally blunted.



Using mobile phones

Leading the list of the top distractions behind the wheel are mobile phones. Phones now do more than just place calls, and drivers often cannot pull away from their phones, even when driving. chewing gum at the same time may want to avoid eating while driving. The majority of foods require a person's hands to be taken off of the wheel and their eyes to be diverted from the road. Reaching in the back seat to share some French fries with the kids is also distracting.

Try to eat meals before getting in the car. For those who must snack while en route, take a moment to pull over at a rest area and spend 10 minutes snacking there before resuming the trip.

Reading

Glancing at an advertisement, updating a Facebook status or reading a book are all activities that should be avoided when driving. Even pouring over a traffic map or consulting the digital display of a GPS system can be distracting.







Signs of heart disease

Seminar focus: watching for these symptoms can save a life

Perry Frankel of Advanced Cardiovascular Diagnostics, based in Nassau County, had more than just a table at the

Staff from Frankel's clinic were speaking with seniors about the risks of heart disease and recognizing the signs and symptoms of a silent heart attack as well as conducting on-site health screenings.

"Three-quarters of strokes we can stop by just doing ultrasounds to people who are high

risk such as people with hypertension, diabetes," Frankel said in between consultations at the expo. "Forty-five percent of people who have a heart attack don't know they've had a heart attack-called a silent heart attack-and have triple the risk of dying, according to a big study by the American Heart Association."

Some symptoms of a silent heart attack do not include chest pain. Women, in particular, are at risk of experiencing sleep disturbances, shortness of breath, indigestion, fatigue and anxiety.



Who are you?

Spoken or unspoken, serious or in jest, you get asked that question all the time. Where are you from? Who are your parents? Have you been here before, and what do you do? In "All The Women in My Family Sing," edited by Deborah Santana, the questions stand: who are you and what is your story?

It's a no-brainer: every day you spend in this world is different, socially, than it was last week, last year, in your mother's time. Great-grandma might not even recognize your world — and that's especially so if you are women of color.

Take, for instance, home.

It's a complicated word, to be sure. It means going back to where people love you, where your roots lie, even if your parents spent their lives leaving it. It might be the first place you experienced bullying. Maybe you wonder where "home" is — or you may already be there but you're "just not sure how long [you'll] stay."

On racism: what would you say if, after learning about Rosa Parks, your child asks which water fountain he would've had to choose, had he lived then? Or: what do you do when your school pays homage to the historical figure who stole your ancestors' lands? Also: if you endured racism as a child, will there ever be a time when you've "stopped being eight years old"?

And then there's the matter of identity.

What was it like to be raised in an all-white neighborhood, educated in an almost-all-white school, with mostly-white friends? Many of the authors know — and they honor the elders who taught them through example what it was like to be a woman of color. Still, many write about being the "only": the only Black English teacher, the only Asian student, the only forty-something Latina in the mom-group...


Sometimes, you may "feel

like part of no people and every people." Your hair is curly. Your political beliefs are loud. The next generation is yours to raise, if you choose, and you've got things to tell them. You are beautiful, and you know that "Some scar tissue knits so tight that it shores you up like a bone."

There's something absolutely compelling about the stories in "All the Women in My Family Sing." They're like an addiction.


Read one, and your eyes fly open. Turn to the middle and your heart sinks. Taste one at random and find a kindred spirit, then disagree with another that just doesn't touch you right. That's the appeal of this book: each of the essays in here — written by everyday women as well as those with fame — are short enough to dip into quick, you can easily skip around, and they'll all make you think and think and think.

Yes, "All the Women in My Family Sing" is for women. It's more feminist than not. And yes, men can enjoy it, too, because reading it is like falling into a web of nourishing voices. This is a book to have, no matter who you are.

Trini singer wants to go mainstream

There's a new Caribbean songstress on the block!

And she is trying to maintain the island flavor in mainstream music. Trinidadian singer Arita, recently released her debut single and EP "Lovesick." As a singer, she wants to reintroduce the music industry to its Caribbean influence. She said many artists of Caribbean heritage played a huge part in American music throughout the years — but going mainstream often erased that and now she wants to be one who challenges it.

"I am Caribbean and I'm from Trinidad and I have a love for the blues, soul, and reggae, but I also love my Caribbean music and I want to be that representation for Caribbean people who come into the industry and think they only have to sing the American way," she said Arita. "I want to take Caribbean music and make it mainstream it's always been there but we often fuse it together and I want to keep

my accent in the songs."

Her musical inspirations are Aretha Franklin, Nina Simone, and Heather Headley — who is also of Trinidadian descent. Even though Headley is Caribbean — Arita says many people are not often aware of that because she sings in a standard American accent, which is why speech is a main factor in her artistry because she has experienced the downsides.

ple award-winning producers and some have asked me to sing more 'American,' or say that I need to sound a certain way, but I want to be true to who I am," she said.


This constant encounter has made her diligent about keeping her particular style and why she advocates for Caribbean accents in today's music.

"It's definitely played a role because a lot of producers make you try to sing that way, and a lot of artists end up doing it because they tell them it's faster — but now it's no longer authentic because we are not being us," said Arita. "We have so much to offer but the authenticity is not there."

She cites Jamaican-American deejay Kool Herc as one of the earliest examples of Caribbean influence, and even says that Jamaican reggae singer Beres Hammond nearly sings about the same things popular American artists have sung about.

"I love reggae and it's like soul to me — we just tell our stories in a different accent," she said. "Before Beres Hammond came out, there was Otis Redding and Marvin Gaye and he sings about the same things they did."

Arita said her cross-cultural single "Lovesick," was one of those singles that will take her there.

artform at the Alvin Ailey school in Harlem in 2009. But before it all, she started experiencing symptoms that would lead to a life-changing health crisis.

"I didn't know what was happening and I was already dancing professionally at the time and I started to experience blurry vision," she said. "Next thing I know — I was blind and in the hospital."

After an MRI scan and a full recovery to regaining her sight, Mayers learned she was being diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. The news came as a shock to her and she had just been accepted into the Ailey school. She knew it would be a new challenge to balance her disorder, but figured she would not miss out on the opportunity.

"I knew I would still go and pursue that education, but then I started to deal with numbness on my right side and feeling really tired," said Mayers. "All of

a sudden when it came to choreography, I couldn't grasp basic steps."

One of the most devastating outcomes Mayers encountered while having the disorder was the substantial memory function that she used the most. She said losing that drastically changed how she typically danced.

"Before I exhibited signs of multiple sclerosis, I had photographic memory and I could just see a choreography and mimic that and memorize it," she said. "But I had to relearn how to analyze steps and that was the hardest part because it was like relearning how to dance in a sense — that loss really hurt me."

Since her diagnosis, Mayers said she now has an increased sense of structure in her personal life in order to manage her day-to day life. There are five medications she takes weekly to control her symptoms — one of them is an injection she has to take three times a week and requires refrigeration.

"I have to be way more organized and I have to make a lot of considerations," said Mayers

"Being organized is conducive to my dancing because I also have to come an hour before and give myself more time to prepare."

The 32-year-old said she was living her dream despite having multiple sclerosis, and also teaches Barbadian folk dance classes. One of the disease's symptoms is depression and feelings of sadness that Mayers often experience, but she said balancing was a struggle that was mostly contained. Mayers recommends that other people living with disabilities whether visible or invisible not let it prevent them from at least trying to accomplish something they think will get in the way, adding that the dreams will not always be there.

"Whether you're working at a desk or dancing full time or whatever is passion — your disability will be there regardless of what you do," she said. "If you could attempt do something you love, it'll be easier for you and you're going to be less stressed. You need to have an exit strategy, and I'm going to have multiple sclerosis even if I was working at a desk or whether I'm working as a dancer."



Dallas was also sluggish early after losing in overtime Friday night at Toronto. The Nets took advantage, jumping to an 11-0 lead in the first quarter.

After blowing leads of 14 and 13 in its previous two losses, Brooklyn led by 14 Saturday before the Mavericks recovered late in the second quarter, cutting the lead to 59-56 with 9-2 run to end the half.

Smith gave Dallas its first lead in the third quarter with 8:06 remaining, stripping the ball from Russell and dunking to cap an 8-2 run that put the Mavericks ahead 70-68. Dirk Nowitzki later hit a 3 and Smith followed with a pull-up jumper to put the Mavs up 80-70 with 5:36 left before Brooklyn charged back.

The Nets punched back with Carroll and Hollis-Jefferson combining for 10 straight points, capped by Hollis-Jefferson's jumper with 3:56 left in the third period that evened it at 80 before Smith exited the game.

The Nets wrestled the game away with their stifling defense in the fourth quarter a night after they gave up 34 points to the

Day, night Test scheduled for Kensington Oval

The Oval will now be the venue for the final match of the series.

Sri Lanka toured the Caribbean three times but has never played a Test Queen's Park Oval, Trinidad starting at the Kensington Oval.

Impact of Twenty20 format on West Indies cricket, money

The need for money to ensure survival of the game was the common ground reached in a discussion among former Test greats and Barbados cricket administrators.

The legendary West Indies opening batting pair, Gordon Greenidge and Desmond Haynes, earlier this week departed from the cohesion for which they are known while plundering bowlers the world over, and disagreed publicly on whether Twenty20 cricket is destroying the game.

Their debate Tuesday as members of a panel discussing West Indies cricket and society, got a dose of reality when Barbados Cricket Association President, Conde Riley, pointed out that whether Twenty20 is good for the game or not, administrators and of the island's game and clubs were benefitting handsomely.

Riley said that as of Thursday he will be handing over Bds\$115,000 (Bds\$1 = 50 cents US) to a single club, and similar amounts will go to other organi-

sations whose players are involved in the Twenty20 competitions, Indian Premier League of the Bangladesh Cricket League.

Explaining that the money represents a percentage measured against what is paid to the players, he said, "it is not from their salaries, this is 20 per cent to what they earned".

The specific players whose clubs are benefitting are Dwayne Smith, Carlos Brathwaite, and Jason Holder.

Next year another club is set to benefit from the exploits of Jofra Archer, a Barbados-born player who now lives in England, for which team he is expected to play soon. Archer is also making waves in the Twenty20 leagues in Asia.

That money going to the clubs is the third fraction of a three-way split of a payment representing a form of royalty. The West Indies Board gets a third and the territorial association gets a third.

"So, the reality that we face as administrators is how do we get these guys, who say to you, you know my span in cricket will be to 20 to 35 [years] if I'm lucky. After that who is going to provide for me and my family and so on," Riley interjected into the Haynes and Greenidge debate.

That position partly suited Haynes who favours Twenty20.

"I believe in Twenty20 cricket... I have always felt that

"I am not going to sit here, in no way, just because I played at a time when there was no Twenty20, and say that Twenty20 destroying our cricket."

Haynes added that based on

being with the Barbados Tridents Twenty20 team, "I can tell you from a coach's point of view, Twenty20 has enhanced our fielding, our catching. It might not do a lot for our batting because you got your minuses and you got your plusses."





"Consumers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an
