# New trial for murder accused

The Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) with headquarters in Trinidad has rejected an application to free a Barbadian national on a murder charge and has ordered the registrar of the High Court in Barbados to fix the trial date for November.

Frank Errol Gibson was charged with the murder of Francine Bolden in January 2002.

With the exception of a 10-month period while he was on bail, Gibson remains incarcerated at Her Majesty's Prison Continued on page 5

## Runaway lottery scam

Jamaica National Security Minister Peter Bunting has warned that thousands of jobs could be lost if the illegal lottery scam operating in the second city of Montego Bay is not brought under control.

In an address to the Montego Bay Chamber of Commerce, Bunting said the persons most likely to be affected are those employed in call centers and the tourism industry.

"Certainly the whole call center is going to be threatened and 10,000 or so jobs. Certainly tourism is going to be at risk as well, people are going to be fearful that they come here and if they run a

# Carib bankers respond to United States Foreign Accounts tax law

Caribbean banks prepare to confront a new U.S. law that requires Caribbean Americans and other citizens who have foreign or so-called offshore bank accounts with more than \$50, 000 to report it to the IRS. New laws due to take effect next year would force the local banks to report their dollar balances and other highly personal information to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in a move U.S. officials say would severely minimize tax evasion.

The new regulations under the Foreign Accounts Tax Compliance Act come into force from the beginning of January and it is

already causing major headaches among governments, bankers and financial regulators as some of the U.S. clauses will clearly affect member states of the Caribbean trade bloc of nations.

So commercial and central bankers have formed a task force to examine the implications of the law and to what extent they could force managers to comply with the law without running into conflict with various country constitutions.

The task force has already held some meetings among itself but more importantly, and this were preparing for a major teleconfer-

#### **Bahamas**

The Bahamas government will continue to implement programs aimed at reducing the opportunities for young Bahamians joining gangs of criminal groups.

This was revealed by National Security Minister Dr. Bernard J Nottage, who told an Anti-Gang Workshop recently that far too many young people see violence as a way to make a statement and that the new policies and procedures will help ensure "that our young people are not crossing the line from law-abiding citizens to budding criminals."

Nottage said "organized gang

crime" is posing a serious threat to the security of citizens within the region"



and "we in the Bahamas are not immune to the impact of gangrelated crimes."

"The presence of the organized gang culture is a serious impediment to regional communities. The gangs are well-organized and sophisticated and are involved in activities such as drug smuggling, human trafficking, gun smuggling and money laundering.

#### Haiti

Hundreds of people in Haiti have protested against the high cost of living and called for the resignation of President Michel Martelly.

In a march through the capital, Port-au-Prince recently, opposition supporters and other demonstrators accused the president of corruption. They also said he had failed to deliver on his promises to alleviate poverty.


Martelly took office last year promising a fresh start for Haiti, devastated by an earthquake in 2010.

Haiti is one of the poorest countries in the western hemisphere. President



Martelly came into power in May 2011, with 68 percent of the vote in a run off.

The former pop star vowed to bridge the gap between Haiti's tragic past with the aspirations of a new generation. But opposition demonstrators say he wasted public money in luxury vehicles and international trips.



#### Jamaica

A Magistrate Court in Jamaica has dismissed one of two counts of perversion of justice against a United States-based televangelist who had been acquitted of carnal abuse and indecent assault

charges in 2011.



New York-based The Messengers for Christ Ministries World Healing Center, had been accused of two counts of perversion of justice related to carnal abuse case.

The prosecution had alleged that, Lewis, an author and ordained minister, had attempted to bribe girls who were involved in the carnal abuse and indecent assault case, for which he was found not guilty by a seven-member jury.

Lewis, who is on J\$300,000 bail, will reappear in court on March 25, 2013 for the trial, which is expected to last three weeks.

#### St. Lucia

A Barbadian national was recently jailed for seven years after he pleaded guilty to gun and illegal drug charges in a St. Lucia, Castries court.

Police said that Irone Bascombe

was arrested along with three other persons, including Lennox Andrew of St. Vincent and the Grenadines. during a police roadblock in the southern town of Vieux Fort recently.

The authorities said all the occupants of the vehicle, including

nationals Pamela Dorville and Wilson Alcide, were charged with being in possession of a control-



led drug, possession with intent to supply, possession of an unlicensed firearm and possession of ammunition after a pistol was found in the vehicle.

Bascombe pleaded guilty to all charges and was jailed for seven years on each charge. However, the sentences will run concurrently.

The charges were dropped against the two other accused.

#### St. Lucia

The St. Lucia government averted a shutdown of the vital tourism industry informing workers that they will not be asked to pay Value Added Tax (VAT) on service charges.

"The government of St. Lucia wishes to reassure workers throughout the hotel industry that the service charge owned by workers will not attract VAT," said the Dr. Kenny Anthony.

National Workers Union (NWU) president Tyronne Maynard said that putting VAT on service charges would have a devastating economic impact on the hotel and tourism workers, who rely on the charge to improve their wages.

But in a statement, the Office of the Prime Minister said



the government is surprised and disappointed by the statement of the NWU and assured workers throughout the hotel industry that the service charge will not attract VAT. Further for purposes of income tax, service charge is not taxable and hotel workers have had significant tax relief from the provision over the years.

The new tax measure (VAT) recently went into effect.

#### St. Maarten

A judge in St. Maarten ordered a Jamaican security guard held as a suspect in the killing of a South Carolina couple who were stabbed to death in their Caribbean vacation home.

Mevshane Johnson recently made his first court appearance since his arrest on suspicion of killing Michael and Thelma King of Mount Pleasant.

#### **Trinidad**

The Trinidad and Tobago government will pump TT\$70 million into the Police Service to increase its fleet of vehicles.

Among the vehicles to be bought are marked and unmarked sedans, marked sport utility vehicles, dog vans, two ambulances and two trucks.

These proposals are contained in the 2012/2013 budget document entitled Stimulating Growth, Generating Prosperity: Public Sector Investment Program 2013 – 2015, which stated that the fleet of the

Police Service will be increased by approximately 200 vehicles.



"The vehicles will be 'fit for pur-

pose' and custom-built to facilitate the continued standardization of the fleet and to allow for improved mobility, as the vehicles will be sturdy enough for police use," the document said.

It said they would facilitate patrols, implementation of the transformation initiative, deploy canine services throughout the country, medical emergency response involving its officers and community policing.

It said the transformation of the Police Service would continue over the medium term (2013 to 2015) at an estimated cost of TT\$50 mil-

# Vincentian anniversary celebrations begin

Vincentians in New York last Sunday began celebrating their country's 33rd anniversary of independence with an ecumenical service of thanksgiving at St. Philip's Episcopal Church in the Bedford-Stuyvesant section of Brooklyn.

Hundreds attended the three-hour service at the church, whose pastor the Venerable Carver Israel, archdeacon of Brooklyn is Vincentian.

Congregrants sang lustily and listened to Bible readings, prayers and preachings by at least a dozen Vincentian clergymen.

The Rev. Hoskins Prescott, assistant priest at St. Leonard's Anglican Church in Bedford-Stuyvesant, Brooklyn, and the Rev. Dillon Burgin, pastor, Bethel United Methodist Church in Crown Heights, Brooklyn, alternated as liturgists.

There were prayers by the clergymen, interspersed with hymns, for the United States (Rev. Derhnin Grant), the government and people of St. Vincent and the Grenadines (Rev. Berkeley Dougan), the youth (Bishop Robert Yearwood) and of thanksgiving (Bishop Kenroy Cuffy).

Addresses were also delivered by United Nations Amb. Camillo Gonsalves; United States Consul General Selmon Walters; and Laverne McDowald-Thompson, president of the umbrella Vincentian organizing group in the U.S., Council of St. Vincent and the Grenadines' Organizations, U.S.A., Inc. (COSAGO), which, organized the church service and subsequent reception in conjunction with the New York Consulate Gen-

"What we need is to get the power of God in St. Vincent and the Grenadines," said the Rev. Dr. Lincoln Creese in his ser-

mon.

"We need Christ back in St. Vincent and the Grenadines – to make St. Vincent and the Grenadines a prosperous land," added the pastor of New Millennium Tabernacle of Praise in Brooklyn.

Rev. Creese also appealed for special assistance for the youth, stating that "the children of St. Vincent and the Grenadines are in desperate help for direction.

"We need your help, we need your support," he preached. "God, we need a deliverance. We want to take back our young boys and girls from drugs and guns."

Rev. Creese, however, added that St. Vincent and the Grenadines is "blessed, and we'll be prosperous."

Gonsalves told the congregation that while independence is a "cherished thing," St. Vincent and the Grenadines' is "always under threat – from poverty, underdevelopment and from other countries."

He, therefore, urged that nationals unite for nationhood, lamenting: "We very rarely speak with one voice."

The U.N. envoy, however, said, even in the face of numerous impediments, the 150-squaremile island-nation can "overcome any struggle," adding: "We have to look out for ourselves."

Chairman Rulx Rosefort recently greeted the packed hall at HAUP'a annual gala at Autun's noting the gains clients have accomplished in these past 37 years: legal status, settled into homes, and having built comfortable lives.

He said, "We are seeing the fruit of all these past efforts by the sheer number of young people who identify themselves as Haitians," proudly adding, "who are seeking and achieving the American dream and are working to give back or to take the community to new heights by getting elected to office or getting involved in public service."

Upbeat Executive Director Elsie Saint-Louis Accilien reminded guests, friends, and colleagues, "Haiti remains a cause for concern as its leaders chart an uneasy path towards nation-

building."

She voiced her deepened commitment both to the community and Haitian people for increasing impact and being ready to respond to natural disasters.

HAUP does not just work with Haitians but all in need of their services that include adult education, health programs, parenting and survival skills, a domestic violence project, and immigrant/refugee assistance with TPS education and assistance.

"Our largest program that includes Haitians and non-Haitians are our services for the developmentally disabled," said Deputy Director Marie Charles, whose competency has allowed Accilien to share the multiple responsibilities of running the growing organization.

"We've also extended our reach this year to an afterschool program for 150 children, mostly of African and Haitian background, at P.S. 241 in Crown Heights."

The program focuses

on academics, part of the STEM-Science, Technology, English and Math-program with a goal to expose children to and develop interest in these subjects that minorities and women traditionally don't go into. The STEM fields have been identified as areas where there will be jobs in the future.

"We anticipate this work will lead to other programs geared to their parents," Charles says, looking toward ESL classes in the future for

credit card, information is skimmed and they might become victims of fraud," Bunting said at the Chamber function organized to address crime in the western parish of St. James.

The National Security minister said there is no specific law in Jamaica that deals directly with scamming, as a result most of those detained for their involvement in the scam are not charged.

In commending the police for clamping down on some of the major players in the illegal activity, Bunting announced that additional security personnel have been deployed to the tourist resort town and the government is considering upgrading nearby police stations.

in Barbados.

In June, the CCJ stayed the matter and ordered that there could not be a fair trial if Gibson was deprived of the services of a forensic odontologist.

An odontologist is a person who studies teeth and their surrounding tissues, along with the prevention and cure of the disease.

The CCJ considered then, that the proper course was to allow the parties to hold discussions in relation to funding of

an odontologist and those negotiations should culminate in the State paying for assistance of an expert.

Gibson was granted bail in the sum of \$10,000.

On Aug. 17, 2012, Gibson filed an application that the murder charge against him be dismissed on the grounds that the state had failed to provide or make any reasonable offer to provide funding to secure an odontologist.

The court ruled that there was no basis for Gibson's claim and asked the registrar of the Barbados High Court to fix a date for his trial.

## Home affairs minister to stay

The Guyana government says it has no intention of removing Minister of Home Affairs Clement Rohee in the wake of calls for him to step down over the recent deadly police shootings in Linden, Agricola and other incidents of police misconduct which escalated into fiery protests recently.

Passions inflamed over what was deemed by Agricola residents as "special treatment" for a police officer charged with the September killing of an Agricola teenager spilled over into a day of fiery protests, looting and armed clashes with authorities.

In a press briefing earlier that day Cabinet Secretary Dr. Roger Luncheon said the government was not prepared to axe Rohee and he told the opposition parties in the words of legendary American boxer Mohammed Ali: Let's get ready to rumble" in response to an ultimatum given by Nigel Hughes, chairman of the Alliance for Change opposition party, to President Donald Ramoutar to replace Rohee.

Angry supporters who had been picketing the court appear-

ance of one of the accused, Constable Terrance Wallace, who is charged with shooting to death 17-year-old Shaquille Grant on Sept. 11, turned their protest on Dr. Luncheon, launching a protest outside his residence after the accused left the courts. Police are still looking for two other cops who are implicated the killing.

The protest escalated and according to police reports, a large number of persons gathered on the roadway and threw

tires and other obstacles across both carriageways of the East Bank Demerara road at Agricola and set them on fire, causing traffic to come to a standstill.

Bricks and bottles were thrown at the police. The unruly crowd, some whom were armed with pieces of wood and cutlasses, blocked the Guyana Fire Service vehicles from getting to the location of the burning tires and other materials despite pleas from the Joint Services personnel.

Police had to use tear smoke to disperse the crowd. A car was also set on fire during the protest.

Thousands of commuters were left stranded on the East Bank public road between Agricola and McDoom after traffic was blocked for more than five hours.

Many motorists and passengers were reportedly robbed of their valuables.

Police managed to clear the streets after the Tactical Services Unit arrived on the scene.

Attorney General and Minister of Legal Affairs Anil Nandlall condemned the actions of the protestors and refuted claims that the protests were as a result of statements made by Luncheon.

## Carib wage inequality

Despite recent gains, the wage gap between men and women in Latin America and the Caribbean still prevails, according to a new Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) study.

The study, entitled "New Century, Old Disparities," compares surveys of representative households in 18 Latin American and Caribbean countries.

The study was released at the "POWER Conference," a highlevel meeting of experts including U.N. Women Executive Director Michelle Bachelet and U.S. Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, who gathered in Lima, Peru, to explore how to achieve gender equality in the labor markets.

The study, which also examines wage differences across ethnic minorities of the region, points out that, although the average gender wage gap decreased from 25 percent to 17 percent between 1992 and 2007, the disparity remains quite high and there is still plenty of work to be done.

According to the household surveys, women hold only 33 percent of the better-paid professional jobs in the region, which include those related to architecture, law or engineering.

In these professions, the study says wage gap between men and women is significantly higher: 58 percent on average.

It says these jobs require quantitative skills, and despite women's progress in education leading men by half a year of education on average—they tend to focus on careers like psychology, teaching or nursing, where those skills are not developed.

"In terms of women's participation in the work force, there has been progress in recent decades, but the wage gap between men and women still prevails," says Hugo Ñopo, an IDB specialist in education and author of the study.

"The process of closing this gap has been very slow because misguided stereotypes and perceptions of the roles of men and women have distorted interactions, not only in the workplace but also at home," he says.

"These stereotypes, which arise even in early childhood, discourage women, thus limiting their access to careers with a better future in the labor market," Ñopo continued.

## Trial video shows panic during Guyana police

The nearly month-long Caribbean-led commission of inquiry into the mid-July fatal police shootings of three Guyana opposition supporters reached an interesting stage this week with the probe team taking statements from organizers of the protest against the government-imposed electricity hike and from persons who were injured from police bullets.

But while lawyers representing the police have done their best to cast doubt as to whether riot police bullets actually killed the three and injured more than 20 at the bauxite-mining town of Linden, video footage tendered to the commission midweek has so far showed thousands of people running helter-skelter immediately after police had sounded the final dispersal warning and after reading an

anti-riot proclamation.

Witnesses have also testified that there was no other armed group on the bridge. and even officers have testified to shooting pellets down on the bridge at protesters to reduce the force with which it hit targets, appearing to confirm that cops had done the shooting that triggered a month of mass protests and a shutdown of the interior.

Linden is about 65 miles south of the city of Georgetown and a town of about 30,000 that voted overwhelmingly for the opposition in last November's general elections.

The footage also showed the wounded being attended to on the bridge across the Demerara River and in one case, the blood-stained body of one of the three men killed as police had tried to clear the bridge that is the lone road link between the

city and the southern interior. This is even as tear gas and pellets were still being fired and as riot police in formation had continued to move in on protesters as they fled to safety.

The footage, however, did not capture police actually shooting at Lindeners as wounded cameraman Vladimir Glassgow testified that he too was forced to run as police pellets and bullets rained down on them and as the dead and wounded fell around him.

Throughout the hearings that have been so far chaired by retired Jamaican Chief Justice Lensey Wolfe, police have maintained that they used only tear gas and buck shot from shotgun rifles but experts have testified that if they had used the Double Zero cartridge on protesters, the results would have been fatal as some defense lawyers suspect.

## **America's Drone Terrorism**

In the United States, the dominant narrative about the use of drones in Pakistan is of a surgically precise and effective tool that makes the U.S. safer by enabling "targeted killing" of terrorists, with minimal downsides or collateral impacts.

This narrative is false.

Those are the understated opening words of a disturbing, though unsurprising, ninemonth study of the Obama administration's official, yet unacknowledged, remote-controlled bombing campaign in the North Waziristan region of Pakistan, near Afghanistan. The report, "Living Under Drones," is a joint effort by the New York University School of Law's Global Justice Clinic and Stanford Law School's International Human Rights and Conflict Resolution Clinic.

The NYU/Stanford report goes beyond reporting estimates of the civilian casualties inflicted by the deadly and illegal U.S. campaign. It also documents the hell the Pakistanis endure under President Barack Obama's policy, which includes a "kill list" from which he personally selects targets. That hell shouldn't be hard to imagine. Picture yourself living in an area routinely visited from the air by pilotless aircraft carrying Hellfire missiles. This policy is hardly calculated to win friends for the United States.

Defenders of the U.S. campaign say that militants in Pakistan threaten American troops in Afghanistan as well as Pakistani civilians. Of course, there is an easy way to protect American troops: bring them home. The 11-year-long Afghan war holds no benefits whatever for the security of the American people. On the contrary, it endangers Americans by creating hostility and promoting recruitment for anti-

American groups.

The official U.S. line is that America's invasion of Afghanistan was intended to eradicate al-Qaeda and the Taliban, who harbored them. Yet the practical effect of the invasion and related policies, including the invasion of Iraq and the bombing in Yemen and Somalia, has been to facilitate the spread of al-Qaeda and like-minded groups.

U.S. policy is a textbook case of precisely how to magnify the very threat that supposedly motivated the policy. The Obama administration now warns of threats from Libya — where the U.S. consulate was attacked and the ambassador killed — and Syria. Thanks to U.S. policy, al-Qaeda in Afghanistan spawned al-Qaeda in Iraq, al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula, and al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb.

If that's success, what would failure look like?

Regarding Pakistani civilians, the report states,

While civilian casualties are rarely acknowledged by the U.S. government, there is significant evidence that U.S. drone strikes have injured and killed civilians.... It is difficult to obtain data on strike casualties because of U.S. efforts to shield the drone program from democratic accountability, compounded by the obstacles to independent investigation of strikes in North Waziristan. The best currently available public aggregate data on drone strikes are provided by The Bureau of Investigative Journalism (TBIJ), an independent journalist organization. TBIJ reports that from June 2004 through mid-September 2012, available data indicate that drone strikes killed 2,562–3,325 people in Pakistan, of whom 474–881 were civilians, including 176 children. TBIJ reports that these strikes also injured an additional 1,228–1,362 individuals.

The Obama administration denies that it has killed civilians, but bear in mind that it considers any male of military age a "militant." This is not to be taken seriously.

The report goes on,

U.S. drone strike policies cause considerable and underaccounted-for harm to the daily lives of ordinary civilians, bevond death and physical injury. Drones hover twentyfour hours a day over communities in northwest Pakistan, striking homes, vehicles, and public spaces without warning. Their presence terrorizes men, women, and children, giving rise to anxiety and psychological trauma among civilian communities. Those living under drones have to face the constant worry that a deadly strike may be fired at any moment, and the knowledge that they are powerless to protect themselves.

It's even worse than it sounds:

The U.S. practice of striking one area multiple times, and evidence that it has killed rescuers, makes both community members and humanitarian workers afraid or unwilling to assist injured victims. Some community members shy away from gathering in groups.

How can Americans tolerate this murder and trauma committed in their name? But don't expect a discussion of this in Monday night's foreign-policy debate. Mitt Romney endorses America's drone terrorism.

## Those 270 Electoral College votes loom large

The way it's shaping up, the presidential election this time around could have us more Electoral College conscious than we've been in a while. In 2008 the dramatic, historic emergence of Barack Obama, coupled with his facing a Republican opponent who rapidly sank to "also ran" level, led to Obama prevailing in unlikely states like North Carolina and running up an impressive Electoral College vote number. This year, at least following the first presidential debate, opinion surveys have been making the race out to be a tight one in which a road map to victory through numbers earned in the Electoral College looms ever more critical.

Truth be told, no way should there be any tight race. The 2012 Republican contender isn't that much different, as a package, from four years ago. Mitt Romney has shown himself to be a vacillating blowhard, absolutely lacking in conviction, ever since this second presidential quest of his began with that bewildering schedule of Republican primaries. It's good that the president has gotten to where he can poke fun at himself about the first debate. Some Obama partisans/sympathizers have had diffi-

culty facing up to and acknowledging a sub-par performance (to put it charitably) by the president. Some, in a bit of a reach, have even suggested it may have been planned strategy. Get a grip, guys! We should all be able to take a cue from the president's admission that he had a bad night.

Of course, starting with Vice President Joe Biden's deft handling of Paul Ryan in their encounter, followed by Obama's powerful comeback in his second go-round with Romney, the Democratic ticket has righted the ship from the heavy listing of the first debate aftermath. But going a long way toward recharting the course of the election will be the extent to which Democrats can reconnect the electorate to those components of what's been sold as the Romney persona that have repeatedly belied the advertising. On the debate stage, the bunch of contradictions that had come to represent the Romney package just disappeared without a trace, as one more time, he rolled out his alter ego bit.

The Democrats' challenge is not an easy one after a reported 60 million plus people watched the first debate, with Romney's sales pitch

of: "This is the genuine article: forget the other stuff." The other stuff, however, isn't all that easy to forget. And there's the odd chance he might even aid the process, so hard is it sometimes to shake what's embedded. As he did, for instance, in the second debate in recounting his Massachusetts experience championing women's right to equal employment opportunity. Immediately, there came word from sources in Massachusetts that Romney's spiel about initiating an effort to find qualified women was all mush - that the names of credentialed women had earlier been independently assembled to be presented to whoever won the gubernatorial election.

Romney can't help it, one gathers – always reaching for over-thetop utterances guaranteed to be worrisome. During one Republican primary debate he famously invited one of his fellow contenders for the nomination to a \$10,000 wager. So what if this helped to magnify the perception that the world of ordinary folk is one very distant from him?

Still, though, the pollsters tell us the presidential contest is in "toss-up" territory again. And how the voting goes in a few key battleground states could be the whole ball game. Expect nothing but a full-court press in states like Ohio, Virginia and Florida. In all three of those states momentum was with Obama going into the first debate. Now they seem to have transitioned to tight races, the plurality either man holds in polls not sufficient to warrant removal of the "tossup" label. Conventional wisdom among the political cognoscenti has been for years that winning Ohio is essential to any Republican's chances of getting into the White House. If that holds true, the president would do well to make sure the small lead he still supposedly enjoys in Ohio remains intact and even gets ramped up to numbers that engender greater confidence among his supporters.

Wisconsin and Iowa are two swing states that seem to have bucked the trend of a troubling slide in the president's numbers following the first debate. Unless things get shaken up pretty radically, Obama appears to have juice enough in Wisconsin and Iowa to put those electoral votes in his column.

On the other side, puppet masters, who not too long ago were into a serious doomsday drill, now pull out all the stops to turn the Romney first-debate boost into presidential pay dirt. Romney still isn't the puppet masters' guy, mark you, they being the usual hard-line conservative suspects. Not very enamored for sure of the reconditioned model Romney has unveiled at the debates. What endears Romney to the puppet masters is one thing: he isn't Obama.

The Romney-Ryan tandem has been under fire for offering a plan for putting the country back on sound economic footing, whose math just doesn't add up. We can be fairly certain that the camp's Electoral College math is letter perfect, though. How best to get to 270, that magical winning number of electoral votes, must be consuming the camp big time. Not that the Obama team doesn't have as much, if not more, of a 270 fixation.



## Affordable health care a one-stop 'SHOP'

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA or ACA) signed into law March 23, 2010, has mandated that each state establish a health insurance (or health benefits) exchange. This new law allows states to create a virtual, hybrid market place for individuals, families and small businesses to shop for health insurance coverage. The goal of this initiative is to significantly reduce the cost of health insurance coverage, provide all individuals with a standard essential health benefits plan, and create a "one-stop-shop" marketplace for millions of uninsured consumers to obtain health coverage.

This - health insurance exchange - will be a predominantly web-based portal for, health insurance quotes, coverage and billing options, premium tax credits, qualified health plans, insurance laws, links to brokers, plus online and telephone call center customer service.

This state run exchange

will actually encompass two health exchanges. 1) Individual Exchange, for individuals and families, 2) Small Business Exchange, for the small business market. Individuals and families that access the exchange will be offered a variety of health plans from which to choose. The single mom applicant will be referred directly to the child health plus Medicaid option. Uninsured intact families and single entrepreneurs can shop competitive pricing among premier health insurance carriers, and may also qualify for federal subsidies and tax credits designed to keep premiums affordable. The unemployed applicant will qualify for the Medicaid health plan option.

Business owners will be referred to the - Small Business Health Options Program - or "SHOP" Exchange. This entity will allow small businesses to competitively shop health plan options in a competitive market environment. The SHOP exchange will consist of an online mar-

ketplace where business owners can comparatively shop for the most cost effective qualified health plans (QHP) for their employees. Data will be securely exchanged electronically between businesses and the exchange, to ease the burden of the application process. Customer service reps are available to assist the small business owners. Tax incentives and cost sharing subsidies are also available for all businesses that qualify.

Under this SHOP exchange model, employers can make defined contributions, and employees will be free to choose from an array of qualified health plans (QHP) that have been benchmarked against the best, State health plans, Government health plans, and private health insurance HMO/ PPO plans. The Affordable Care Act (ACA) also mandates that each QHP (and

individual plan) must offer what is referred to as "Essential Health Benefits." This plan option must include 10 essential benefits; namely, inpatient hospitalization, emergency services, ambulatory services, maternity and newborn care, mental health and substance abuse services. preventative/wellness services, prescription drug plan, pediatric services (including vision and dental care), lab testing services, and chronic disease management.

The ACA is a very comprehensive and complicated law. There are several aspects to this Act; however, in my opinion the small business community is a major driving force behind this health insurance exchange concept. The State exchange will market qualified health plans that will provide everyone with a standardized health insurance product that will include essential health ben-

efits. This in itself is a monumental accomplishment.

Another caveat of the SHOP Exchange provides general insurance agencies and brokers the flexibility to transition into the SHOP program. Small business owners can maintain their relationships with their brokers, because the health exchange recognizes that these relationships are important. It creates a win-win scenario. The health insurance brokers will market and promote the SHOP exchange to other small businesses, and the small businesses can work directly with brokers who are familiar with the SHOP process.

The State run health insurance exchange appears to be a wonderful concept. The ACA has certainly streamlined the health insurance process. But the debate against this legislation continues to rage on. Several issues that have come to the forefront include; State run health exchanges (like New York) will receive federal subsidies and tax credits. States


that op to let the government set up their exchange will not receive a subsidy or tax credit. Without tax credits, individuals and businesses alike will not be able to afford health insurance. Will the ACA support a "pay-for-performance" model and eliminate "fee-for-service?" What long term effects will this Act have on Medicare and Medicaid? These are just a few of the topics that continue to fuel the pro and con rhetoric surrounding Obamacare.

Our health care system was in desperate need of a serious overhaul and President Obama has taken some bold and aggressive steps toward this goal. It's certainly not the end-all, be-all solution, but with some tweaking and bi-partisan support the ACA will transform health care delivery in these United States, and become a leading model for global health care delivery.

Along with the open mic, the event will feature a panel discussion of the upcoming presidential election. There is a suggested contribution of \$10 or the donation or a new backpack.



## Clintons land in Haiti to showcase industrial park

CARACOL, Haiti (AP) — Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton encouraged foreigners to invest in Haiti as she and her husband Bill led a star-studded delegation gathered Monday to inaugurate a new industrial park at the center of U.S. efforts to help the country rebuild after the 2010 earthquake.

Actors Sean Penn and Ben Stiller, fashion designer Donna Karan and British business magnate Richard Branson were among the luminaries at the opening of the new Caracol Industrial Park, which is projected to create thousands of jobs more than 100 miles from the quake-ravaged capital of Port-au-Prince.

Hillary Rodham Clinton told a roomful of investors gathered for a luncheon that she had made Haiti a priority when she became secretary of state.

"We had learned that supporting long-term prosperity in Haiti meant more than providing aid," she said. "It required investments in infrastructure and the economy that would help the Haitian people achieve their own dreams.

"So we shifted our assistance to investments to address some of the biggest challenges facing this country: creating jobs and sustainable economic growth," she added.

Earlier Monday, thousands of Haitians lined the roadway to wave at her motorcade as it

wound its way from the newly renovated airport in the seaside city of Cap-Haitien. Clinton and other U.S. officials, including Labor Secretary Hilda Solis and Sen. Patrick Leahy, a Democrat from Vermont, toured a housing development for industrial park workers supported by the U.S. Agency for International Development.

The secretary of state noted there were three presidents gathered in one room to celebrate the opening: her husband, former U.S. President Bill Clinton, current Haitian President Michel Martelly and his predecessor, Rene Preval.

Bill Clinton, now a U.N. special envoy for Haiti, arrived in Caracol separately from his wife.

The Clintons and their allies hope that the \$300 million industrial facility will transform the northern part of this impoverished country by providing thousands of desperately needed jobs.

But some Haitians say the industrial park does little more than replicate failed efforts from the past and will benefit outsiders more than Haitians. They also worry it will harm some of the few pieces of undamaged environment that still exist in Haiti.

"It's really all-in on this project, and there's a high bar to deliver," said Laurent Dubois, a historian who teaches at Duke University and is author of "Haiti: The Aftershocks of History." "It really needs to deliver in a big

way so that people will think, yeah, this was the right thing to do."

The stakes are high in large part because the Clintons have been so heavily involved.

The Caracol project was in the works before the earthquake but it became a top priority for the Obama administration soon after the disaster under Preval. Hillary Rodham Clinton's chief of staff, Cheryl Mills, has made almost monthly visits to the site on Haiti's northern coast.

In a nod to President Barack Obama who was preparing for the final, foreign policy-focused debate later Monday, the secretary of state said the Obama presidency had made Haiti a central focus of its international development efforts.

The \$124 million put in by the U.S. makes the park Washington's biggest single investment in the aftermath of the quake and it is certain to shape the legacy here of the Clintons, who last visited Haiti together in 1975 on a wedding gift following their

honeymoon in Mexico.

"We've had a deep connection with Haiti ever since," Hillary Rodham Clinton said.

Monday's trip is her third to Haiti since the earthquake, and there have been more than a dozen visits by her husband, who was co-chairman of an earthquake recovery panel before its mandate ended a year ago.



## From flu to whooping cough: **Adults need vaccines too**

While most people are aware of the need to vaccinate children. immunizations for adults are just as important. But unfortunately, adult immunization rates are well below government goals.

According to the American College of Physicians, 40,000 to 50,000 adults die from vaccine preventable diseases each year in

Knowing what vaccines to get and when to get them can be tricky, especially if you have a complicated medical history.

"By talking to your internist, you can assess your vaccination status and find out what steps you need to take to stay healthy," says David L. Bronson, MD, FACP, president, American College of Physicians, a national organization of internal medicine physicians.

Don't wait until it's too late. Be proactive and ask your physician at your next appointment what shots you are due to receive. Here are some recommended immunizations to discuss:

#### **HEALTH**

Flu / Influenza

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that all adults receive the influenza vaccine each year. Despite the wide accessibility of the shot, which is often administered in workplaces and retailers, only 39 percent of adults received the vaccine in the 2011-2012 flu

This season, be sure to protect yourself against the flu. The vaccine is especially important for seniors and those with chronic conditions for whom the flu can be life-threatening. Just be aware that not all forms of the vaccine are recommended for everyone. If you have an immune system disorder or are pregnant, talk with your physician.

Tetanus, Diphtheria & Whooping Cough

According to the CDC, 5 percent


of adults with whooping cough are hospitalized or have complications, including pneumonia and death. Protect yourself against this dangerous disease, as well as diphtheria and tetanus by getting the Tdap vaccination. Follow up with booster tetanus (Td) shots every 10 years.

Tdap vaccination is recommended for nearly all adults, including persons 65 years and older; but is especially important for pregnant women, adults who are in contact with infants, and health care professionals. If you are not sure if you're due, check with your doctor about getting vaccinated.

Measles, Mumps & Rubella



The trio then performed "My Adidas," a song that landed them a \$1.6 million endorsement deal. It is also regarded classic rap.

"After that we became the first nonathletic act to endorse sneakers. Thank you MSG."

Jamaica-born Ewing provided reminiscences of his championship-winning game against Indiana Pacers. He recalled the dunk that clinched the game and how he jumped

on a table, showing off his number 33, and embraced the fans at MSG.

Starks reflected on his May 25, 1993 game against the Chicago Bulls. He could not help laughing through the nostalgia of driving a left-handed tomahawk slam dunk that upset Michael Jordan. Jordan, he said gave him a look that he has not forgotten.

"Everyone plays their best game at the Garden."

Former Governor Cuomo revealed a long kept secret about being signed to a baseball contract by Branch Rickey. According to the threeterm state leader, Rickey offered him more than he paid Mickey Mantle.

Cuomo, a student at St. John's Prep was signed for a whopping \$2,000. The year after baseball, legend Mantle yielded \$1,100.

That revelation merited a hearty chuckle.

Married 58 years, the 52nd governor of the state reminisced about his athletic rendezvous before entering politics. His speech was engaging and nostalgic.

Harking back to a period when unemployment was a full three points higher than the now 7.8 percent national figure; crack, AIDS and HIV he said, were new concerns.



## An introspective tale of female empowerment

"Middle of Nowhere" is a cinematic masterpiece reminiscent of those rare treasures that have managed to capture an authentic slice of African-American life, ala such black classics as "Love Jones" (1997), "The Best Man" (1999), "The Visit" (2000) and "Brown Sugar" (2002). However, this introspective tale of female empowerment simultaneously touches on several universal themes apt to resonate with an audience of any demographic.

The picture was written and directed by rising star Ava DuVernay, this year's winner at the Sundance Film Festival in the Best Director category. The story revolves around Roberta "Ruby" Murray (Emayatzy Corinealdi), a med student who is on the brink of becoming a doctor when her husband, Derek (Omari Hardwick), is sentenced to eight years behind bars for a drug conviction.

Rather than abandon the love of her life, the loyal wife decides to drop out of med school to give her man the emotional and financial support he'll need while in prison. This means she'll have to endure long bus rides just to see him, and also have to pay his legal bills on a nurse's salary.

However, the shame and separation eventually take a toll on the relationship, especially when

Derek has a jailhouse romance and sabotages his chances for an early parole with fresh criminal charges for fighting. Suddenly Ruby finds herself questioning the wisdom of her slavish devotion, and she begins entertaining the advances of a bus driver (David Oyewolo) she'd befriended.

To date or to wait, that is the question? Ruby has a couple of confidants to turn to for advice, but neither proves to be of much help. One is her sister, Ruth (Lorraine Toussaint), a single-mom with a bad track record of her own with men. The other is their embittered mother (Edwina Findley) who can only muster up ineffective, if well-meaning, suggestions like "Hold your head up, please."

So, in the end, it's up to Ruby to decide for herself, but only after lingering interludes of reflection and contemplation. A refreshing alternative to the superfi-

cial mainstream fare that tends to stereotype sisters as either sassy mammies or compliant sex objects.

# Mural Pavilion opens at Harlem Hospital

Under the theme: "Respecting The Past, Embracing The Future," Harlem Hospital Center held a recent ribbon-cutting ceremony for its new six-story Mural Pavilion, located on 136th Street and Lenox Avenue.) a member of the NYC Health and Hospitals Corporation (HHC) and the Generations +/ Northern Manhattan Health Network held its ribbon cutting ceremony New York City

Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg and Deputy Mayor for Health Services Linda I Gibbs were joined by Harlem Hospital Center Executive Director Denise C. Soares, HHC's new Global Ambassador Kasseem "Swizz Beatz" Dean, Congressman Charles B. Rangel, State Sen. Bill Perkins, State Assemb. Keith Wright, Councilwoman Inez Dickens and Manhattan Borough President Scott Stringer for the historic event.

"Harlem Hospital Center is the medical facility of choice for this community and with the opening of the Mural Pavilion, we're giving this community the respect and level of healthcare it deserves," the executive director said.

The \$325 million building with state-of-the-art technology will enhances access to preventive health care, emergency room care and specialty care, and marks the completion of the main construction phase for one of the largest major public hospital modernization projects in the city's history, and one the Harlem community so desperately needed. Services at The Pavilion will also address the community's high rates of asthma, cancer, diabetes, heart disease, HIV/AIDS, and stroke.

The new six-floor, 195, 000-square foot Pavilion connects two major hospital buildings: the Martin Luther King, Jr. Pavilion and the Ron H. Brown Ambulatory Care Pavilion.

#### help from Live Holistic Live healthier

In Latin, the word "doctor" means "to teach," so it's reasonable to expect that doctors should educate people.

Such is the philosophy of Dr. Vincent Adamo at Live Holistic, a new holistic center that opened in July. Of course, our bodies need help from us. We have to be proactive, so that good health is maintained, and Dr. Adamo wants to teach us how to maximize our health and well-being. He says he is the only doctor in Brooklyn who belongs to Maximized Living, an organization that

hands of the people

The nerves supply life to all cells, organs, and systems in the body; therefore, they are also responsible for healing it, says the doctor. Think about the spinal cord.

"Your brain, which sends messages through your spinal cord out to the body, has to function at 100 percent. What happens when your spinal cord is injured?" he asks. "The body shuts down or gets sick."

When the spine is not aligned properly, it presses on nerves, and we experience pain or other "paralysis" in areas of our lives.

"We specialize in spinal correction," says the doctor. To do so, he offers chiropractic adjustments and detox. He also uses an Ionic Cleanse, which is a machine that "pulls pollution from the body via electronic currents," he says. "It excites the cells, allowing them to release toxins."

Dr. Adamo says that patients can see this detoxification while it happens as the feet are kept in water, and toxins



## Hunte praises West Indies



That was the view of West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) President, Dr. Julian Hunte, who showered the regional team with praises, following their "sensational performance," which saw them beat host Sri Lanka by 36 runs at the Premadasa Stadium in Sri Lanka to win the ICC Twenty20 World Cup for the first time.

In the final, West Indies posted 137 for six in 20 overs and dismissed the home team for 101 in 18.4 overs.



The female winner and the journey down south was indeed a thrill for Inelsi Diaz, who is only 18 years of age. She clocked in 18:03.51. The male and overall victor was turned in by Dave Alm, who, however, for the immediate future is concentrating on competing in the upcoming New York City Marathon.

"I don't have a time goal for the marathon," Alm said. My marathon training hasn't been going good. "(During the race) I chased two other runners for the first half of the race (last week), (eventually) caught them, and took over the pace. "We ran on a great course (and had to do it twice around). Lance Fleming, a former runner at Brooklyn's Bishop Loughlin High School, finished behind Alm, who clocked in 16:47.63 to Fleming's 17:19.56. Robert Sweeney finished third in 18:02.

In making his debut, Fleming, a one-time runner at York College faced a great runner in Alm. Fleming didn't have the turnover speed to catch him.

In another event that preceded the feature one was the 5K Fitness Walk whose overall winner belonged to Neville Mitchell, who was timed in 39.41, one place ahead of Carlyle McKetty (40.44) and two ahead of Barrington Campbell (40:45).

Mitchell got in by an invitation to participate in the festivities from Team Jamaica Bickle, and made his initial debut in such a race.

"I worked out and jogged (before competition), but this was my first actual race," said the Bronx resident. "I'm originally from Jamaica and went to Kingston College High School and (then) Bronx High School of Science. I played soccer in both places. I try to stay in shape and I'm in pretty good shape."

The 48-year-old Mitchell is an attorney and is currently running for City Council in the Bronx District 12 during a special election.

The female fitness walk went to Michelle Cooper with a time of 41.45, followed by Nonne Andrews (42.23) and Marjorie Waite (42:49).

Meanwhile, the male mile run for the youth was taken by Elan Fox, who was clocked in 5:15, with runner-up position going to Declan Kearns; (5.17) and third place finisher Shah Raiz, who covered the course in 5:54. The female winner was Kuara Summler, who covered the course in 5.32, with Kaylah Quarshire running a second place time of 5.33, and and Maya Dumpson covering the course in 5.34.

When Fox got hold of the lead, he held on to it right away and stayed in first place. Fox, a student at St. Ann's High School in downtown Brooklyn, where he is on its cross country and track teams, enjoyed running in the event. He enjoyed the way it was organized.

He also competes for the Awesome Track Club.

The top three finishers male and female in each of the races received medals and prizes.





## **Considering a** career change?
